Hundt, a senior partner in the law firm of Latham & Watkins, is a litigator with extensive antitrust experience. His communications law work has centered largely on wireless cable, cellu-

In a statement announcing the impending nomination, Clinton said that experience makes Hundt an ideal choice to head the FCC. "Telecommunications innovations are constantly changing the way we as Americans communicate with each other and the world. With his years of experience, I am confident Reed Hundt will do an excellent job steering the FCC through the challenges it will face over the next five years.

White House Ties

Hundt, 45, has known Clinton since their days at Yale Law School. He served as advisor to the Clinton campaign and was a member of the President's transition team. He is also close to Vice President Al Gore. The two were classmates at Washington's exclusive St. Albans High School; Hundt has been an economic policy advisor to Gore since 1984.

Prior to joining Latham & Watkins, Hundt served a 1974-75 stint as a law clerk to Chief Judge Harrison Winter of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit.

Hundt was born in Ann Arbor, MI. He is married to Elizabeth Ann Katz and has three children

If confirmed by the Senate, Hundt will take the FCC reins from Commissioner James Quello, who has served as interim Chairman since shortly after HUNDT/See Page 28

RAB: Radio Revenues Up 8% In May

Radio revenues were up 8% in May, according to the RAB. Local revenues were up a strong 10%, while national spot sales managed only a 1% gain.

"While it's still too soon to say everything's smooth sailing since we're still seeing some wide fluctuations on a marketto-market basis, it's evident that overall, radio is putting in a strong performance," said RAB President Gary Fries. He also noted that "the local marketplace is the foundation on which that strength rests."

Local revenues were up in every region of the country for May. The Southwest led with a gain of 13%, followed by the East (12%), the Southwest (11%), the West (8%), and the Midwest (7%).

National revenues were up in all regions except the East, which suffered an 11% setback. The Southwest was up 13%,

while the Southeast, Midwest, and West all had gains of 4%.

Year-To-Date Up

For the first five months of 1993, total radio revenues were up 8% over the January-May period last year. Local revenues were up 9%, while national revenues gained 5%.

Local year-to-date revenues were up 15% in the Southwest, 13% in the Southeast, 9% in the East. 8% in the Midwest, and 6% in the West.

National '93 revenues were flat in the East, but up in all other regions: 10% in the Midwest, 7% in the West, 6% in the Southwest, and 3% in the Southeast

RAB's calculations are based on a pool of more than 100 markets, as reported by the accounting firms of Miller, Kaplan, Arase & Co. and Hungerford, Aldrin, Nichols & Carter.

In a news release that calls for the industry to stop "bashing" Arbitron on its proposed expansion of ratings periods, Interep Chair-man **Ralph Guild** noted, "We are calling for a truce between the radio broadcasting industry and Arbitron. A truce does not mean an end to negotiation, but it does mean an end to a public display of the issues until private negotiations have been exhausted.

*Laundry List Of Negative Things'

Interep Exec. VP/Director of Research Marla Pirner added, "Even if Arbitron does have some blemishes that keep it from being perfect, let's remember that it is radio's dominant and de facto ratings service. Arbitron's critics have succeeded in giving radio's competitors a laundry list of negative things to say about the way radio is measured today."

Pirner said she has scheduled forums on July 26 in New York, August 9 in Atlanta or Dallas, August 30 in Chicago, and September 2 in Los Angeles, during which Interep clients will be able to query Arbitron officials on the proposed survey changes

Pirner, a member of the Arbitron Advisory Council, has expressed support for the changes.

Supreme Court Backs Lottery Ad Limits

Describing the measure as legitimate and effective support for state policy, the U.S. Supreme Court last week ruled 7-2 that the federal government may restrict broadcast advertising for state-run lotteries.

Ruling in the case of United States vs. Edge Broadcasting Co., the high court upheld a federal law barring stations licensed in nonlottery states from airing ads for lot-

The case began when Edge's WMYK/Moyock, NC — which draws 92% of its audience from Southeastern Virginia — went to federal court seeking the right to carry Virginia Lottery ads. North Carolina does not operate a lottery.

Earlier Rulings Overturned

Both a federal district court and a federal appeals court had ruled the ban — as applied to WMYK unconstitutional because it did little to advance the federal government's interest in supporting North Carolina's gambling policy. Those courts noted that North Carolinians living within WMYK's coverage area are already inundated with Virginia Lottery ads from Virginia newspapers and broadcast outlets.

But in a decision written by Justice Byron White, the Supreme Court majority said applying the ban to WMYK represented a "reasonable" way for the federal government to support North Carolina's nonlottery policy without infringing on Virginia's ability to promote its game.

Noting that WMYK accounts for 11% of all radio listening in nine

North Carolina counties, White's opinion also dismissed the suggestion that barring lottery ads from WMYK was ineffective.

Appeals Court Decision Muddies Waters On Security Interest

Reversal allows IRS to claim first lien on proceeds from sale of station license

A federal appeals court has reversed a lower court decision and allowed the IRS to claim a first priority lien on proceeds from the sale of a radio station's FCC license. However, the decision is so narrow that it does little to resolve the question of when, if ever, a lien is permitted on an actual license.

Nona Ostrove, the attorney for the bankruptcy trustee, told R&R the appeals court ruling would not be appealed. She said the only question was how to distribute money from the \$300,000 station sale, which will all go to the IRS under the ruling. But Ostrove noted that the ruling applied only to license liens by the IRS, adding, "I don't think it's a precedent for private lenders."

Kaye, Scholer, Fierman, Hays & Handler Washington Office Managing Partner Jason Shrinsky, a communications attorney who's fought against any change in the FCC policy prohibiting license liens, agreed that the case didn't set any precedent for bank liens. Nevertheless, he called the appeals court decision "bad law."

Shrinsky also charged that the ruling "creates havoc" by asserting IRS authority over the functions of another government agency. "It's as if the FCC started issuing tax rulings on what the tax law is."

halls. Officials for both sides emphasize that the content of the NAB and RTNDA meetings would not be affected by the proposed merger.

"It would be unacceptable to both sides to merge our convention pro-grams," said RTNDA President David Bartlett.

Bartlett also said a joint NAB-RTNDA exhibit hall would be more attractive to exhibitors, who would see more traffic while eliminating the travel, set-up, and registration costs of attending two events.

"There would be a critical mass that neither the NAB or RTNDA [exhibit hall] is likely to achieve on its own.

Revenue Boost

The trade groups expect that the merged hall would boost the slumping revenues at their respective shows. Bartlett said RTNDA's convention revenue has been flat in recent years. According to NAB Exec. VP John Abel. Radio Show exhibit space has shrunk from 40,000 square feet in 1990 to roughly 31,000 in 1992. Attendance is also down.

The groups acknowledged that holding joint events will limit the number of locations where they can gather. However, Abel said that is of little concern to NAB, which is looking to limit the Radio Show rotation to just two or three cities, including New Orleans and Los Angeles.

Both the Radio Show and RTNDA convention will be held in Los Angeles in 1994. If an agreement is concluded between the two groups, that could be their first joint event.

This also could be the first in a series of such deals for NAB. According to an NAB staffer, the group is talking to other industry groups about possible joint meetings. However, the staffer declined to identify those organizations.

Fox Heads Radio Board

n the tightest election in memory, KVEN & KHAY/Ventura, CA owner Robert Fox last week edged out Cromwell Group President Bud Walters to become Chairman of the NAB Radio Board.

The board deadlocked through four ballots before giving Fox the nod in an 18-16 vote. WKYS/Washington President/GM Skip Finley was elected Vice-Chairman of the Radio Board in an uncontested race.

Fox said his priorities include pressing the FCC to suspend new FM allocations and reconsider its allocation criteria in order to ease what the NAB sees as oversaturation on the band. Other matters he expects to occupy his attention are satellite-delivered DAB, which NAB believes would devastate local broadcasters; pending federal legislation that mandates health warning labels on broadcast alcohol ads; and campaign reform legislation that would force broadcasters to sell Senate candidates airtime at a deep discount.

Fox said his razor-thin election margin does not represent any deep divisions within the board. "This is a small group that is very collegial. The board is united.

NAB Antes Up \$50.000 For DAB Tests

n other action at last week's meeting, the Radio Board approved \$50,000 to cover its share of the costs for testing of in-band/on-channel DAB systems by the National Radio Systems Committee. The tests are scheduled for October at NASA's Lewis Research Center in Cleveland

As expected, only two entrants told NRSC that they'll be submitting systems for testing - the USA Digital Radio partnership (Gannett, Group W, and CBS) and Amati Communications-AT&T/Bell Labs.

The Radio Board also adopted a revised "NAB Plan For Implementing DAB," focusing even more strongly on in-band/on-channel as "the best possible option for broadcasters." The plan also strongly opposes any FCC licensing of satellite DAB.

Broadcasting Partners Closes WYNY Buy

roadcasting Partners Inc. took over operations of WYNY/New York last Friday (6/25) after closing its \$50 million purchase from Westwood One Inc. WW1 said it used the cash to retire approximately \$12.7 million in senior subordinated debentures and to reduce its revolving credit facility from nearly \$56.6 million to about \$20.3 million.

The WYNY sale completed WW1's divestiture of its radio station group. Since the beginning of this year, sales of assets not related to its core network business have reduced WW1's long-term debt by nearly \$94 million. WW1 still has its one remaining non-network major asset on the sale block - R&R.

In other financial and regulatory news:

 Broker Gary Stevens is shopping the SpaceCom Group's KOSO/ Modesto, CA; KTHT/Fresno; KQEO & KMGA/Albuquerque; KLBB/Minneapolis; and KQEU/Olympia, WA. Separate buyers are likely, but the total price tag could run north of \$7 million.

• Now that Broadcasting Partners is buying WCKZ (see Transactions, Page 6), attention in Charlotte turns to WAQQ. The receiver for the former Adams station has been taking bids, but isn't expected to strike a deal for another month or so. Speculation centers on Jefferson-Pilot and Pyramid as likely duopoly buyers. However, Jefferson-Pilot would need a TV-radio crossownership waiver from the FCC.

• The FCC has given a green light to the \$300 million Shamrock-Malrite merger and approved TV-radio crossownership waivers in Los Angeles (for Shamrock's Roy Disney) and Cleveland (for Malrite's Milt Maltz).

· Children's Broadcasting Corporation said it had acquired the secured debt of Marsh Broadcasting Corporation (face value \$7.2 million) for \$2.9 million and would try to acquire four of the six Marsh stations through a pending bankruptcy court liquidation. If the plan works, the kids net will pick up AM O&Os in Dallas-Ft. Worth, Kansas City, Houston, and Milwaukee


• An FCC administrative law judge has delayed a pretrial conference on license renewals for KBER/Ogden, UT and KQOL/Spanish Fork, UT so the stations can seek minority buyers for distress sales. The license renewals were designated for hearing because of allegations that KBER licensee C. Devine Media Inc. and KQOL licensee Street Stryder operated the two Salt Lake City market FMs under common ownership in pre-duopoly days.

. The Senate last week passed a budget bill that would allow broadcasters and others to amortize only 75% of the value of intangible assets in acquisitions. The House version allows a 100% writeoff. The measure is headed to a conference committee to work out differences.

 Orlando competitors WDIZ and WXXL have announced a national marketing agreement through which Major Market will rep both stations. Also, Taylor Communications National Sales Director Frank Celebre will head the joint national sales effort for Shamrock Communications AOR WDIZ, as well as Taylor CHR WXXL



Price Communications (AMEX: PR) reported second-quarter revenues of \$6.1 million compared to \$12.9 million a year earlier (prior to emerging from Chapter 11 bankruptcy reorganization on December 30, 1992). The company claimed a net loss of \$1,2 million (10 cents pershare) versus a loss of \$11 million the previous year (share comparison not applicable)

The First Major Study for Radio.

You've heard that the 18-29 post-baby boomers-the so-called "Generation X" – will be 62 million strong by the year 2000. By the year 2010, some marketers expect them to have overtaken baby boomers as the primary market for every important product category. You've been told many of them are feeling ignored or misunderstood by marketers in many ways. Perhaps you've read that they won't be satisfied with the types of programming on radio stations today anymore than the baby boomers liked "beautiful music." Are these things true? If so, they add up to quite a potential threat to some radio operators...opportunities for others.







What Do Nonverbal Messages Mean?

Deople don't always speak the truth, but if you're sensitive to their nonverbal cues, you'll be better equipped to determine their real meanings whether they want you to or not.

Writing in Dubuque, IA-based Wm. C. Brown Communications, Mark Hickson and Don Stacks present the following five facts to help you comprehend the language of nonverbal expression:

Women not only are better at reading nonverbal signals, they transmit them better than men do especially facial ones.

If a person says one thing but nonverbally reveals another, most adults perceive the unconscious communication as more accurate.

Individuals with low self-esteem tend to make more eye contact when hearing negative messages than when hearing positive messages. The opposite is true of those with high self-esteem.

Eye pupils generally become smaller during the fabrication of a lie, then dilate while the lie is being told.

Eye contact, facial expressions. and appearance are the three nonverbal cues an interviewer remembers most about a job applicant.







Hoof-In-Mouth Epidemic At Poe Convention

oiceover mogul Mark Driscoll sent his voice over the mike before his brain engaged at the Bobby Poe Convention last Saturday (6/26). Addressing a programming panel about the woes of the CHR format, he said, "There are a couple of stations up there saying they're CHR stations ... and you know what you are ... coon stations.'

The remark provoked angry comments from attendees at the session and prompted panelists in the following session to write "fuck Driscoll" and "bite this, Driscoll" on their name cards. Driscoll - scheduled to introduce confab host Bobby Poe at that evening's award banquet - was asked to leave the convention. Poe told ST: "I did Mark a favor by asking him to leave."

Driscoll faxed an apology to the industry, stating: "The use of the word 'coon' was indeed tasteless. I meant not to offend anyone or to cause any person to feel uncomfortable in any way. It was unprofessional, thoughtless, and I hope that any person that may have been offended will understand what happened and may even find it in your heart to pardon my error. As a member of the 'human race,' | make this appeal to you, my peers, to accept my deepest apology."

And The Hits Keep Comin'

Earlier, at the Poe's VP/Promo panel, Interscope VP/Promo Billy Brill opened mouth, inserted feet, and vented his frustration with stations refusing to play rap: "The white kids are buying it; the black kids are stealing it." He quickly followed with the disclaimer "that's a joke," and later told ST: "It was a tongue-in-cheek comment, nothing more, and that was the reaction from those present."

And . . . during the award ceremony, co-MC WMTX/Tampa OM/PD Mason Dixon made some disparaging remarks about crosstown competitors WFLZ (Power Pig) and its staffers while the Piggies were accepting an award for Large Market Station of the Year.

That exchange in turn gave rise to a toeto-toe barroom tete-a-tete between Dixon and Power Pig PD B.J. Harris. 'MTX MD Rico Blanco and Power Pig afternooner Bubba The Love Sponge played heroes, intervening before the brew ha-ha's turned into a brouhaha





D illy Joel wrote all 10 songs on his 15th album, River Of Dreams," which was produced by Danny Kortchmar (Don Henley, Spinal Tap). Color Me Badd make a guest appearance on the track "All About Soul," and former Mountain guitarist Lesley West lends his chops to "No Man's Land.

The title track goes to CHR and "No Man's Land" goes to AOR - on July 26. The Columbia LP hits stores August 17. PBS-TV will air a documentary on Joel in late fall.

Mellencamp Deals 'Human Wheels'


John Mellencamp produced his 12th album, "Human Wheels," with Mike Wanchic (his guitar player), Malcolm Burn (Iggy Pop), and David Leonard. The disc is dedicated to the hand's late keyboardist/accordionist. John Cascella, who contributed to a few of the LP's tracks before his death.

Mercury will have the 10-track set in stores on September 7. "What If I Came Knocking" ships to AOR next week. The title track comes to AOR and CHR in mid-August.

McDonald Returns

Sensory 'Debravation'

Several producers worked on Deborah Harry's "Debravation," including former Blondie guitarist/current Harry spouse Chris Stein, Anne Dudley (ex-Art Of Noise), Jon Astley, and Andy Paley. Harry adds vocals to R.E.M.'s remake of "My Last Date (With You)" (aka Floyd Cramer's "Last Date") and covers Lee Andrews & The Hearts' "Tear Drops." (The last two are CD bonus tracks.)

Noted cyberpunk author William Gibson wrote lyrics for the song "Dog Star Girl." Emphasis tracks include "Rain," "Communion," and the Arthur Baker-produced "I Can See Clearly," the last of which ships to radio July 20. The Sire/Reprise LP will be in stores August 24.

Bad Brains' Major Bow

Bad Brains, who first burst on the scene with their mix of reggae and hardcore in 1977, finally make their major-label bow on Epic with "Rise." Beau Hill (Warrant, Ratt, Winger) produced the 12-track set. Among the key tracks are "Free," "Unidentified," and the title track. The last two go to radio next week. The full set arrives August 3.

"The 1993 MTV Video Music Awards" will air at 8pm (ET/PT) September 2. The event's 10th anniversary is marked by a return to L.A.'s Universal Amphitheatre and the addition of an R&B category. The host and finalists will be announced July 14.

Kiss That Video

Peter Gabriel has turned a video into an amusement park ride, and is taking two traveling simulator theaters on his tour with him so fans can experience his new "Mindblender" video for "Kiss video for "Kiss That Frog." The Crystal Pepsi Rock Motion Theatres, which are housed in 75-foot trailers, feature 18 seats that move as the video (directed by Brett Leonard ["The Lawnmower Man'']) plays on a 9x16-foot screen.

Quiet Riot Returns

Three of Quiet Riot's original members reunited to make "Terrified," which singer Kevin DuBrow co-produced with Ricky Delena. Among the Moonstone Records album's tracks: an acoustic version of the Small Faces' "Itchycoo Park." That cut and "Loaded Gun" will go to radio shortly after the LP's July 6 release.

Morgan's Pirates

Former Rationals frontman Scott Morgan is about to release "Scots Pirates," a 15-track set from his band of the same name. Featuring ex-Stooges member Scott Asheton, the LP sports a cover of the Rolling Stones' "Empty Heart" and Morgan's last single, "16 With A Bullet," as a bonus track. Ann Arbor, MI-based Schoolkids Records will release this July 6.

discreditation will not deter them from acting on the results of the experiment once they are released later this summer.

"We're disappointed in the decision, but we still feel we were doing the right thing," noted Arbitron VP/Communications Thom Mocarsky. "All the stations in Atlanta got together in the effort to improve response rates, and no station tried to take advantage and skirt the rules."

No Prediction

Mocarsky said detailed results, including persons-using-radio and daypart figures, will become available in late August following the release of top-line results July 22. He would not predict what Arbitron plans to do with the figures once

they've been digested. "I can't speculate on what's go ing to happen until we see what we've got. It's possible that we might see increased response rates but lower listening levels - or viceversa. We'll just have to see and go from there.'

Atlanta broadcasters did not take kindly to the EMRC decision. "It's unfortunate they decided to do that," noted WAOK & WVEE/Atlanta VP/GM Rick Mack. "We only had one goal and that was to improve the product. Response rates have been going down dramatically, book after book, and Atlanta traditionally has been below the national average. We have to do something. We have to make a better product."

Counterproductive Move

Jefferson-Pilot Radio Division President Clarke Brown said, "It's a very counterproductive move. I don't think these guys understand radio . . . there are only three radio members – as opposed to 11 TV members – on their board. I get the feeling their noses were out of joint because they weren't consulted beforehand and they're looking desperately to justify their existence. How this can buy us anything other than better radio response is a mystery to me."

Mack said he could not predict what the practical effect of the loss of accreditation of the survey will have on business. Brown suggested that some agencies will use the information to grind radio rates down further.

Both managers said they were pleased with the experiment, which ended this week (6/30), and both said that all stations stayed within established guidelines. Mack noted, "What I'm most excited about is that, for the first time, we had 100% cooperation from the Atlanta broadcasters and we worked together with one goal . to improve ratings research here.

"If there is an immediate connection between advertising and demand, and the federal regulation decreases advertising, it stands to reason that the policy of decreasing demand for gambling is corre-spondingly advanced," White wrote. "Accordingly, the Government may be said to advance its purpose by substantially reducing lottery advertising, even where it is not wholly eradicated."

The majority also stated that permitting WMYK to carry Virginia Lottery ads simply because it's located near the border could prompt stations located deeper inside North Carolina to demand the same right, thus rendering the law totally ineffective: "Because the approach Edge advocates has no logical stopping point once state boundaries are ignored, this process might be repeated until the policy of supporting North Carolina's ban on lotteries would be seriously eroded. We are unwilling to start down that road."

Too Extreme?

In a dissenting opinion, Justices John Paul Stevens and Harry Blackmun maintained the federal government's interest in supporting nonlottery states is not compelling enough to justify the "draconian" measure of limiting free speech.

In their opinion, "The United States has selected the most intrusive and dangerous form of regulation possible – a ban on truthful information regarding a lawful activity, imposed for the purpose of manipulating, through ignorance, the consumer choices of some of its citizens. Unless justified by a truly substantial governmental interest, this extreme and extremely paternalistic measure surely cannot withstand scrutiny under the First Amendment."

NAB Associate General Counsel Steven Bookshester called the ruling "disappointing" but said he was somewhat encouraged by the justices' split vote. He speculated that White's impending retirement could change the voting dynamic on similar cases the court might hear in the future.

Bookshester said it's difficult to know how this decision might effect the outcome of a pending case in which a federal district court ruled that two Nevada television stations may carry casino gambling ads even though their signals reach into California, which does not permit such activity. The federal government is appealing that ruling.

There's a new sound on weeknights at WJMO (Jammin' 92)/Cleveland - it's called "Channel X." OM/PD Keith Clark launched the 7pm-midnight experiment last month (6/14).

He explains, "[MD] Don Jackson, [Asst. PD] Jim Randall, [night personality] Tim Virgin, and I were talking about radio and the old days of Top 40. We were talking about variety, and wondering if there was a way to recapture CHR's greatness, but with a twist.

Target: 'Generation X'

"We began studying 'Generation X' and found subcategories of rock, pop, and soul that would mix together by the standards of what today's teens and young adults are into," explains Clark. "We decided it was too aggressive as a full format just yet, but that it would work as nighttime block programming.

"We've blended hip-hop, pop Urban crossovers, and New Rock crossovers. No other station is offering all of these styles of active music together, although they can



Rock-Solid Community Relationships

Two stations demonstrate dedication to serving the public interest

Although some stations have dropped news and public affairs from their agendas in the years following deregulation, many broadcasters are still aware of the need of a strong public service image. While our society's technology has advanced in leaps and bounds, its ability to deal with problems has moved along at a snail's pace at best.

Radio, more than any other medium, still plays a vital role in addressing the community's needs. This week, I take a look at two stations with strong commitments to their respective cities to get some insight into their community efforts and fundraising activities.

Angels Of The City

KLOS/Los Angeles Director/ Community Relations Nelkane Benton notes that her station "is one of the few stations in Los Angeles with an office that does nothing but reach out to the community's needs. We're always looking for the right things for the station to get involved with. We don't do it for license renewal - we do it because it's the right thing to do. The entire company is committed to strong public relations." But Benton notes there's a fine line between getting involved and overdoing it. Here are a few key points she recommends you consider when balancing charity work in the station's agenda:

Make sure the GM, station personnel, and airstaff are committed.
Don't overdo your fundraiser

and awareness campaigns — listeners will start to tune out. • Spread out fundraisers quar-

terly – pacing and timing are important.

• Most promotions are self-explanatory, but set them up right so you don't get bogged down in repetition. The whole idea is to make fundraising fun as opposed to just saying, 'Give me your money.' The hook is to use things people buy anyway. – Nelkane Benton

• The talent should have fun with events but still feel compassion and express the need well so fans will support it.

Benton describes a number of the station's charitable activities:

Thanksgiving Food Bank — "The money raised goes to various food banks throughout Southern California. We've done it for seven years and raised an average of \$250,000 per year. Each dollar raised has the purchasing power of \$20 worth of food. Additionally, we give 20% of the proceeds to companion organizations. This year we're going to give to the food banks in New Mexico for the Navajo Nation."

KLOS Blood Drive — "It started 11 years ago when the **Red Cross** was looking for blood donations. Since then, we've collected over 26,000 pints of blood — it's the largest blood drive in the country, according to the Red Cross. It's a weeklong event in August. We station talent in several parts of the county to help make donating more accessible. We give out limited edition T-shirts to everyone who donates."

KLOS Scholarship Fund -- "This was born out of a need that became apparent when we were having our Christmas tree sale. Originally, tree proceeds went to Toys For Teens. The recipients were orphans who were very dedicated to their studies and got good grades. But when they graduated high school, they were pretty much on their own with no support system to help them get to college. So we implemented a scholarship program to support these orphaned teens' efforts to get a higher education. We started a year and a half ago and have raised \$160,000. It's something we're very proud of. One of the students will even be interning here with us. Now that we have the Scholarship Fund, proceeds from the tree sale are split between it and Toys For Teens."

"Mark & Brian" Rockwear (a line of apparel centered around morning men Mark Thompson and Brian Phelps) — "The beneficiaries are Heal The Bay, the Sherman Oaks Burn Center, Ronald McDonald House, and our scholarship fund. Rockwear items are baseball, football, and basketball jerseys. Listeners order shirts via phone, and there are also some order forms in locations like McDonalds."

KLOS Library Fund — "The \$211 million L.A. Central Library [which was destroyed by fire in 1986] is reopening in August. Our fundraising efforts will be recognized in the 'KLOS Story Theater,' which is part of the Children's Literature department. It's an off-air fundraiser. We're coming out with Mark & Brian bronze bookends replicas of them along the lines of a Beethoven/Bach sculpture. There will be 955 numbered collectors' sets at \$100 per set."

Benton stresses that there's no market exclusivity on humanity. "I hope other stations do some of these things. There's no ownership on these ideas and I'd like to see good things happen in other communities. The whole idea is to make fundraising fun as opposed to just saying, 'Give me your money.' The hook is to use things people buy anyway."

Raleigh Good Guys

WRDU/Raleigh is another station that's involved in a number of activities aimed at helping improve the community. Director/ Creative Services Ron O'Brien spotlights a number of the station's programs:

Earth Buddies — "It started out as a partnership between us and Budweiser. It's all about recycling. We offer premiums for the first 106 people who recycle 10 pounds or more of whatever we're doing at the moment — cans, newspapers, etc. We let anyone in the community have access to our recycling bins, trucks, and tractor-trailers. We have an Earth Buddies concert

every year -10,000 Maniacs are playing this year and we expect 15-20,000 people to attend, with ticket proceeds going to earthminded charities. Naturally, we have recycling bins on location. It's done tremendous good for the community."

Some of WRDU's other community-conscious promotions are:

The All-Request Thanksgiving — "This is for the Food Bank of North Carolina. They already get a lot of food donations, but they don't have a lot of money for distribution and operation. We've done the All-Request Thanksgiving for nine years and raised close to \$100,000. Listeners pay us to play their requests. Every year we play 'Alice's Restaurant' two or three times a day for \$1500-\$2500 per play. We average about \$10,000 per year."

Walk For Hope — "It benefits a local mental illness foundation. We

like to be involved with it because all the money stays here. Last year was the fourth Walk For Hope and the first time-we got involved with it. We raised \$92,000. Listeners get sponsors to pay for each mile walked. Prizes range from free dinners to trips to various locations, including Bermuda."

Rock & Roll Lawn Party — "By the time May rolls around, people have been cooped up all winter and are dying to get out. So we do this event at the North Carolina Museum Of Art. We throw a party on their grounds, get a band to play, and tie in with a beer distributor. The proceeds help offset [the museum's] expenses and bring in exhibits. It's very successful. We drew 7000 listeners and raised \$20,000 this year."

Christmas Fund — "This is a morning show event. Listeners can call, fax, or write with the name of a family or person who's in need. We do it case by case. If a family needs \$150 to pay the power bill, we'll cover that. If they need \$600 to fly home and see their dying dad, we cover that. It's solicited by friends and co-workers to ensure that we get sincere entries. We give out \$5000-\$7000."

One charity caveat from O'Brien: Look for the organizations that do the most good. "A report in a local paper talked about some companies that hide under nonprofit names. While they may do some good, their administrative costs are very high. In some instances, the charity received less than 2%, and the average was 20-30%. I stay away from those.

"We look for unique opportunities to help our community on a local level within the frame of our rock and roll attitude. We keep that edge to keep the listeners involved, thus ensuring a great response."

Music Clocks — A Sign O' The Times

There are many different theories on how to structure station clocks. Three New Rock programmers provide samples of their regular music clocks and discuss how each is set.

Close To The Edit


"We use four to five different daytime clocks with spot breaks at :30 and :45," notes XTRA-FM (91X)/San Diego PD/MD Mike Halloran. "Each hour contains six to seven currents, three to four recurrents, and about three golds. These rotate every hour, so the same clock won't ever be in the same place as the previous day.

"The daytime clocks have slight variations in the amount of gold versus recurrents during certain times of day. One hour might have an extra gold instead of a recurrent. Every time we play a current during the day, we follow it with something ultra-familiar. Our current percentages are 40%-50% in morning drive, 50%-60% throughout the rest of the day, and 70%-80% by nighttime." Comparing his programming

Comparing his programming clocks to a deck of cards, Halloran says, "The computer deals the hours. Then you must take the 13 cards from each hour and move them around. My kings, queens, and aces are my recurrent songs. I use the editing feature to [obtain] a

comfortable flow during the hour. The clock has no set pattern, but I won't change the categories.

"We're probably more anal-retentive about editing than anything else. We tend to move gold, old core, and spice tracks around much more than other stations. For example, we don't want to go from a **Depeche Mode** track into an old **Duran Duran** song that has the same feel to it. We try to avoid clumping the soundalike artists together.

"After editing the clocks, I'm amazed at how different they look from what the computer spit out. It's rare that I *don't* change an hour. The only things we don't move are the currents; they're front-announced out of our spot breaks and back-announced at the top and bottom of the hour."

Avoiding Predictability

WZRH (The Zephyr)/New Orleans PD Kenny Vest uses seven different clocks with three stopsets each hour (:20, :35, and :50). "We don't want to sound predictable," he says. "We have two different clocks featuring five to six cur-

rents, four to six golds, and two recurrents which rotate every other hour during middays, afternoons, overnights, and weekends.

NEW ROCK

"For example, the difference between the clocks might be a current medium-rotation song at :50 instead of at :20. Our current lightrotation song might be in the first quarter-hour instead of at the end of the hour.

"There are some hours when we'll run the legal ID and start with a current. In these cases, we frontsell it coming out of the :50 break. For example, 'We'll kick off the next hour with new **Terence Trent D'Arby**; right now it's the **Red Hot** Chili **Peppers** on 106.7 the Zephyr.'

"We play more gold in the morning to [attract] the upper-demo listeners who want to hear music while driving to work. This market is filled with talk. The CHR plays only three or four songs per hour; the AOR has Howard Stern, who plays no music; and the Classic Rock has a satellite morning show which plays only three or four songs per hour.

"When the listeners who don't want to hear talk come to us, we


want to play familiar songs. As the day progresses, we become more current-intensive – four to five in mornings, six in middays, six to seven in afternoons, and seven to eight at night."

Easy As A-B-C

Like Vest, recent New Rock convert WWDX (The Edge)/Lansing PD Greg St. James utilizes seven regular programming clocks in a 24-hour period: two for AM drive, three during the day, one at night, and one for overnights. "Our day clocks rotate in an A-B-C way, so the music comes up in different positions in the hour. Within each day clock, the currents are positioned differently with the gold.

"For example, version three starts with a gold, followed by a billboard for one or two currents coming up in the hour, into a frontsell for a heavy. Version two starts with a gold from a different category, then billboards a medium instead of a heavy. Version one starts with a heavy followed by a gold. We shift from approximately 55%-65% gold during mornings, middays, and afternoons to 55% current by nighttime. I swap my sec-






ondary gold for more currents.

"We always billboard what's coming up going into a stopset and front-sell it again coming out of the break. We want to make sure the currents get sold on both the front and back. My theory is to make radio easy for the consumer. We break twice an hour - at :30 and :43. If I'm going to lose a quarter hour, I'd rather it be the third quarter-hour to preserve 45 minutes of sweep time. It allows us to pick up three quarter-hours."

AC STAND-ALONES

The Loneliest Guys In Town

Our format's competitive clashes have never been more intense, as three or more flavors of AC battle it out in many markets. But Columbus is one noteworthy exception: WSNY (Sunny 95) enjoys the luxury of having the format all to itself.

"Six years ago, there was no obvious format redundancy here," reflects PD Don Hallett. "Today there are two Gold stations, three Country stations, and four different forms of Rock. If you happen to be the only station in a particular for-mat, you'll probably do very well."

Overcoming Challenges

Sunny easily fought off its last direct format foe, WXMX (now WRVF). The newcomer debuted four summers ago but lasted only two years before flipping to Coun-'We were on top of our hill and try. fortified ourselves for many years," Hallett boasts. "[WXMX] tried the soft Research Group and 'Mix' approaches - and both died.

"They had marketing dollars and a fairly decent airstaff, but

didn't have a high-profile morning show. At first, their 'more music style was a little intimidating because we didn't know what they might do with it.'

Considering the nationwide trend of B/EZs evolving to AC, crosstown B/EZ WBNS-FM also posed a potential threat, but it flipped to Gold instead. "WBNS-FM wasn't tearing up the market, but had a decent share. It would have been a definite possibility for them to become an Ultrasoft AC. But if such a hole existed, I'm sure 'BNS-FM would've gone after it. We're always prepared for these situations.

Ducking Goofy Tunes

Among contemporary stations, adult CHR WNCI sounds the most like 'SNY. But Hallett ignores most Hot AC product and, at the opposite end of the spectrum, maintains, "I don't play '60s music because Gold WCOL-FM and WBNS-FM are slamming it. We have a unique current playlist and fill out the rest of our music with recurrents and

'70s/'80s gold. We make sure our '70s music isn't 'goofy gold.''

While acknowledging music's importance, Hallett stresses, "It's not going to get us to the top rung of the ladder. One thing we've done right is outpromote everybody in town. Many other ACs are soft, mellow, and don't want to promote Sunny can't work that way. We're very active and can't afford not to promote. 





WDIA & WHRK/Memphis — Serving The Community

Since I last wrote about WDIA & WHRK/Memphis (R&R 2/12/93), the combo has strengthened its commitment to help those less fortunate.

During all of last March, the combo broadcast live from an apartment unit in the Hurt Village Housing Projects. Established in 1952, Hurt Village has been plagued with crime; the average annual income per household is \$2430.

According to VP/GM Rick Caffey, "The Memphis City Police Department and Free The Children – an organization committed to breaking the cycle of poverty in Hurt Village – asked us to run a PSA or stage a free concert in that area to give the residents a sense of hope.

"OM Bobby O'Jay came up with the wild idea of taking our stations into the projects for an entire month, and it was just crazy enough for us to do. It allowed us to bring all of Memphis into Hurt Village and Hurt Village into all of Memphis. We dubbed the event 'Operation Give-Back' to help bring attention to the plight of those who live in the projects." WDIA broadcast from the projects weekdays 6am-6pm and Saturdays 6am-11pm; its sister broadcast weekdays 5:30am-10am and 6pm-11pm. "Black radio is the most power-

ful communication vehicle for networking and mobilizing the African-American community," Caffey adds. "We've already lost too many of our people to murder, drugs, and alcohol. We're attempting to bring back that sense of community pride and responsibility. Black radio is the most powerful communication vehicle for networking and mobilizing the African-American community.

Providing Role Models

"After being in the projects every day, we found that most of the residents had no concept of having a job. There were no examples of black males going to work daily — no positive male role models. So the people would watch us broadcast and see our people working. They would ask questions about our jobs, our families, where we lived, and how we were able to get these things. Remember: They haven't seen shopping malls or video stores; all they've seen are liquor stores. dents to bring us their used magazines — specifically *Essence*, *Ebony*, and *Black Enterprise* — so the people of Hurt Village could see positive black images. This has given us a greater appreciation for what we have and do. The project residents not only educated us, they also brought our staff much closer together.

"We also asked Memphis resi-

"We helped put Hurt Village on the map not by showcasing crime and poverty, but by drawing attention to good people who just needed a little help. We introduced a number of real heroes who deserve credit for the positive things they're doing. For example, we were able to spotlight a resident named Ms. Williams, whose six kids all maintain a B average in school. She's been able to keep them all away from drugs.

"Furthermore, we hired 19-yearold resident **Derrick White** — who dropped out of college due to lack of parental support and money as an intern during our stay at Hurt Village and gave him the opportunity to tell his story. As a result, he got even more local exposure through TV and print media. In

fact, he later was featured in a *New York Times* article, [which prompted readers to send] money for his college education."

Incidentally, WDIA & WHRK paid for a wedding ceremony, reception, and limousines for four Hurt Village couples. Both stations received letters of appreciation and support from a number of local Memphis organizations.

"Our exposure of the Hurt Village residents demonstrates the power that Black radio has in doing truly significant things. It shows that we can see, address, and help solve problems, not just pay lip service."

The Furor Over Crossover

Mailbag bulges with responses to Mullins column

n the 10 years I've been at **R&R**, no piece by an outside contributor has generated as much mail or as many calls as the May 7 "Perspectives" column written by **Pollack** Mullins Nashville President/COO **Moon Mullins**.

In his article ("The Ghost Of Country Past Revisited"), Mullins cites Country listener research that shows "a large segment of listeners complaining about country records starting to sound too 'pop' or 'rock." He cautions that attempts to create crossover music "eventually produces the same old formulaic, noncountry pop pablum of the past." He warns against letting artists drive the format, suggesting instead that we "continue to expose the new acts that record good, traditionalist country songs."

I wanted to provide a forum for the input I've received, because his call to action - "When a country record crosses over in a market we consult, we recommend that our stations drop those songs from the library because they are no longer our 'exclusive property'" - has the potential to profoundly change the way an entire industry does business.

No matter which side you're on, this issue is of utmost importance to every person making music decisions. It cuts to the very essence of your station's sound.

And because, incredibly, *all* of the calls and letters have disagreed – most of them vehemently – with Mullins's assertions, I'll provide another forum in a few weeks for those who agree. Please reach me with your thoughts.

<u>CHUCK HOWARD</u> Reject One-Dimensional Sound

What do artists of the '50s and '60s such as Jerry Lee Lewis, Jim Reeves, Patsy Cline, Eddy Arnold, Bob Wills, Conway Twitty, Elvis, and Roy Orbison have in common? According to Moon Mullins, Country radio should have never played these acts. Fortunately, consultants were not around when Country was at its greatest — or there would be no tradition of all different types of unique acts.

Many of the roots of today's country music spring from the varying styles of the aforementioned artists — from the rock of Elvis to the ballads of Patsy Cline and Jim Reeves to the jazz of Bob Wills. These artists burst onto the music scene with the excitement of something totally different.

Moon is correct in his analysis that the acts in the **R&R** Top 10 of 1985 are all "pop country." But he misses the fact that they all sound alike. Moon wants to fill today's charts with one sound genre, traditional — just as the 1985 chart he analyzes was filled with one sound, pop.

It is here that he seems to contradict himself, thus missing the point of his own analysis. If today's charts are to be filled with only a traditional sound, it is blatantly obvious that they will become as one-dimensional as the sound of 1985's Top 10, and we will probably see another Mullins article calling for a return to the "traditional pop" sound of 1985.

We need to continue to break new acts with new sounds, new boundaries, and new ideas while remaining true to country's roots and at the same time remembering the diversity of country's roots. Record companies and consultants alike should adhere to the old adage, "If it ain't broke, don't fix it."

Country radio for the first time has the ability to create its own unique mega-superstars in the form of artists such as **Garth Brooks**, **Reba McEntire**, and **Brooks & Dunn**, who will bring Country radio a larger audience in the same way **Michael Jackson** and **Diana Ross** did for the R&B/**Motown** sound, in the same way the **Beatles** did for the British pop sound, and in the same way Elvis did for the American rockabilly sound.

Music is designed to change, yet as it changes, it learns from its past and incorporates the best of the past with its newer ideas to create an ever-evolving sound. Let's allow the other formats to continue to narrow their sound and lose their listeners, and keep country music on its course of ever-increasing market share and popularity. How many times must we shoot prosperity in the foot before we can no longer walk?

Today's Acts True To Their Roots

It is likely that artists like Garth Brooks, Wynonna, Mary-Chapin Carpenter, and Trisha Yearwood do much more good than harm to Country radio.

While they do not, for the most part, fit into anyone's definition of "traditional," it can be reasonably argued that the sensibilities that inform their music are true to Country's roots. They, among others, have as much to do with the resurgent popularity of the music as the new traditionalists. More power to them. There's plenty of room

And, while some may seek to enforce the narrowest definition of country music, its devotees have apparently decided to embrace a variety of artists and styles. Country music is not all tight jeans and twang. Its practitioners and listeners are capable of as high a degree of sophistication as those in any other realm of popular music.

If we do not accept that reality, then we condescend to an audience that deserves our best, and we condemn the music to the museums. Variety is the spice of life and the food of growth. A steady diet of the same thing over and over isn't healthy,

Diversity Is Where The Action Is

The current state of country music and the future of the industry for the next several years is enormously optimistic and benefitting in a huge way from the diversity of styles now being heard on winning Country music radio stations.

The basic premise that there's a parallel between the Urban Cowboy days and today's Hot Country music is incorrect. In the late '70s and early '80s, Country was just sort of "over there" doing its thing in a pretty average way, when a hot movie with a Country theme and a few great songs burst on the scene. This led to a handful of country-pop songs making it onto AC playlists. Period. End of story. Country was not particularly hot when Urban Cowboy hit. It spiked for a bit and ended up even "less hot" when the phenomenon cooled.

In complete contrast to the Urban Cowboy phase, many of America's most exciting performers, writers, and producers gravitated to Nashville just at the time the core of the new Nashville traditionalists were finding their voice. The locals got a huge shot of confidence when they saw the popularity of Randy Travis explode way beyond traditional Country audiences.

The addition of the newcomers in the mix creates an exciting melting pot of pure creativity. The mix of cocky, young Nashville traditionalists and cutting-edge pop/ rock players and writers is what is fueling today's Country playlists. Country music is the single most exciting thing going on in American entertainment. It is uniquely American, and it is "where the action is."

With regard to sales, the single biggest difference between the Country albums of the '70s and early '80s and those of today is the depth of product after the single.

Today's hit albums are 10-12 great tracks — not two singles and eight-10 throwaways. The labels are investing hard cash in the pursuit of quality, and buying the CD has become a good deal.

It is a small issue blown into a gigantic myth that the guys in ties at the record companies *tell* their artists and creative people what to do. The executives are great at many things. But telling artists what kind of records to make isn't among them. Aspiring performers and writers are taught to find their own unique voices and develop the craft necessary to express them.

Those whose unique vision entertains large numbers of people get signed by the labels, and the collective output of these creative people shapes where music is going. Radio stations and record companies market the music to the public, but the creative people are the true keepers of the flame. By my reckoning, there have

been only two significant cross-

over hits so far – Restless Heart's "When She Cries" and Mary-Chapin Carpenter's "Passionate Kisses." The biggest name in the business, Garth Brooks, hasn't had a crossover hit. Sure, there have been some titles that got some play in some markets. But crossover hits from Country in 1993 is simply not an issue that demands any action from anyone – especially Country programmers.

I'd love to compete against a station that dumps its best and widest-appeal records because they got so popular that some other station started playing them, too. Imagine Miller Beer dumping its very popular Lite brand just because Bud Light comes along.

The real issue probably has less to do with forcing crossovers and more to do with the large number of great records that fall between CHR, AC, and Country. They have a CHR or AC feel, but they are also clearly country. You could also say these songs have a country feel, but they are also clearly rock or AC. In 1993, the public hears them as country songs. In 1973, the public heard them as pop songs. Country is so lucky to be wide enough to include all these sounds. Don't fight it – enjoy it!

Affiliates often ask us, "When will Country cool off?" While that may be inevitable, there's still some great news here: Country radio's reaped huge benefits from the influx of new listeners who never listened to the format before. They were attracted by the music, and so far it's held their interest quite nicely. In the process, hundreds of great Country songs have become a permanent



As the popularity of Country's club scene continues to grow, so does the demand for more dance music. Nashville labels have been busy creating new, extended mixes of some popular tunes. Here are a few fresh off the boards

• Mercury/Nashville is counting on the thriving club scene to help break new act Twister Alley, whose debut single, "Dance," is due in August. The song is an upbeat tune which naturally lends itself to a club mix, says the label's VP/Marketing, Steve Miller. A pro-CD containing both the extended mix and radio version is being mailed to 500 clubs nationwide. Accompanying the CD is a "twister survival kit," which contains a map to locate Twister Alley, facts about twisters, a description of the band, and pertinent bio information

The label is releasing the song to clubs weeks ahead of radio to create some awareness and excitement, much like it did with Billy Ray Cyrus's "Achy Breaky Heart." The main difference with Twister Alley, however, is that no dance has been especially created for the song. A video complementing the song was shipped to outlets last week and will be given to regional and syndicated video shows.

• Atlantic/Nashville will introduce the world to the "John Michael Schottisch" in a few weeks. The new dance accompanies John Michael Montgomery's latest single, "Beer And Bones." A special dance mix will be sent to hundreds of clubs across the country in the next few weeks, along with an accompanying dance mix video and instructions. The video, which demonstrates the new dance, was shot in Montgomery's hometown of Lexington, KY by Scene Three's Marc Ball.

• Among the dance mixes currently heard in clubs nationwide: Alan Jackson's "Chattahoochee," Pam Tillis's "Cleopatra, Queen Of Denial," Confederate Railroad's "Trashy Women," Matthews, Wright & King's "I Got A Love," and the Gibson/Miller Band's "Texas Tattoo."

About Mr. **Mullins**'s suggestion that records should be dropped from Country stations if they "cross over," he implies that the very act of crossing over is evidence that the music isn't really country. Since the format to which Country artists cross over most often is AC, I assume this is the phenomenon to which he is referring.

But AC is a demographic, not a musical style. Just as people who want to hear songs that are structurally similar to the ones they grew up with have flocked to Country radio, so have many listeners opted for AC, the form of contemporary radio that is most reminiscent of the early FM Rock stations. Its stations draw material from any genre of music that satisfies the needs of their listeners. They cull the most popular songs from all formats, and this broad exposure for the "best of" country music can ultimately do only good things for Country radio.

There are millions of new listeners behind Country's renaissance, and to undo this stunning success that has taken so long to build would be foolish. It can't possibly be of any real consequence if there's no pedal steel on a record or if the singer doesn't have a drawl. Ultimately, it's all water from the same well. In the meantime, the fans have spoken. More power to them, too.

part of their musical heritage – songs that will never be played on CHR or AC stations. For the rest of their lives, when these new listeners want these songs, they'll come to us.

Finally, I resent anyone telling young programmers not to play the hits because they don't sound

the way some people think they should sound. And I resent anyone suggesting that hugely popular songs that have sold millions and consistently test through the roof are mere "pop pablum." The people know what they like.
