

Oxley Bill Could Kill LPFM

Rep calls low-power service 'unnecessary'

Ever since rumblings began late last year that FCC Chairman Bill Kennard and his commission would consider initiating low-power FM service, politicians on Capitol Hill have made it clear that it was an unwelcome notion.

Last week, on the final day of the congressional session, Ohio Republican Rep. Mike Oxley introduced the "Radio Broadcasting Preservation Act of 1999," a bill that would prohibit the FCC from establishing rules authorizing the operation of new lowpower FM radio stations. If passed, it will kill Kennard's yearlong much-discussed effort to award 10- to 1,000watt licenses to church, university and community groups, which he believes are underserved by the more than 11,000 licenses currently in existence


The bill - which also states that "any low-power radio licenses issued pursuant to such rules before such date shall be void" - would also to wipe out any LPFM service established by the FCC while Congress is in recess. "Mr. Oxley was concerned that the FCC might act in Congress' absence, and he wanted the FCC to know that



Sinclair/St. Louis Worth \$366.5 Mil.

Appraiser determines value for sale to Emmis

It took five months, one outside appraiser and a fair amount of dispute, but Emmis Communications and Sinclair Broadcast Group have finally settled on a price for Sinclair's radio and TV holdings in St Louis

The final price, \$366.5 million for WRTH-AM, KIHT-FM, KPNT-FM. KXOK-FM. WIL-FM, WVRV-FM and KDNL-TV, was just about what most people had predicted. R&R reported in July that the radio stations would go for about \$30 million each, while the TV station would sell for about \$200 million,

But coming up with a final price was not so easy. From the beginning the sale of Sinclair's St. Louis properties to Emmis was not a deal Sinclair entered into willingly. Former Sinclair top executive Barry

Baker, now President/COO of television broadcaster USA Networks, exercised a clause in his termination contract that gave him an option to purchase the six Sinclair radio stations and one TV station in the St. Louis market. He then sold his right to purchase those stations to Emmis for what the two sides called a "nominal" fee.

Baker's contract with Sinclair called for Sinclair and Emmis to work out a "fair-market value" for the St. Louis stations, something that was easier said than done. First, Sinclair hinted in a press release that it would challenge the sale of the stations in court. Only days after the announcement of the Baker deal with Emmis, Sinclair said it was "evaluating the validity" of Baker's designation of Emmis as a buyer. Sinclair, however, never brought that up again.



In recent years Fromme served as GM of WNJR-AM/Newark, NJ and before that held a variety of domestic and international positions with Metromedia.

Fromme's wife, Bloomberg Financial global marketing executive Fran Sharp, told R&R, "Rick loved

through Fromme's role at Blair. "He was a very unique, thoughtful guy," Barger told R&R. "He authored two books, was very inquisitive and got into just about everything. When computers first came into fashion, he taught himself machine language for Radio Shack's TRS-80s. He was a perpetual student, studying all kinds of disciplines."

Fromme was a Vietnam veteran and spent time working with homeless veterans. He also worked with CASA, a children's rights organization. In addition to Sharp, Fromme is survived by two children.

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AFTRA Temporarily Resolves Westwood One Disputes

Union still talking with CBS about web pay

While CBS and its subsidiaries continue to reap the financial rewards of industry consolidation, some of their unionrepresented employees believe they are not getting their fair share of the profits.

Last week in Chicago on-air reporters at Westwood One's Chicago operation were set to assemble on the La Salle Street Bridge to protest what they claimed was the company's refusal to give annual pay hikes to its employees. The American Federation of Television and Radio Artists called off the march, which had been scheduled for last Thursday (11/18), after Westwood agreed to negotiate a single contract for employees of Shadow Broadcast Services and Metro Networks. AFTRA called Westwood's pledge "a significant act of good faith

AFTRA had earlier filed unfair labor practice charges with the National Labor Relations Board, claiming Westwood's Chicago unit was violating federal labor laws that require employers to negotiate company policy changes - such as wage increases - with the union that represents employees. The charges are still being reviewed by the NLRB.

Westwood said in September, when it completed its merger with Metro, that it would combine the Shadow and Metro operations by spring.

The company also made headway last week with AFTRA's San Francisco local, which tentatively agreed to a three-year contract with WW1 that resolved a dispute over health and retirement benefits.

AFTRA San Francisco local Exec. Director Frank DuCharme told R&R that in earlier talks Westwood had refused to respond to a proposal in which the union agreed to drop its demand that union employees be allowed to participate in the company's 401(k) plan in exchange for the Westwood One's withdrawal of a proposed reduction in health and retirement benefits. As in Chicago, the San Francisco chapter filed charges with the NLRB claiming Shadow was violating federal law in this case by failing to respond to the union's collective bargaining proposals. The new contract, which is expected to be ratified next month, incorporates the proposals. The former contract expired last year.

USARadio.COM Going In 'Reverse'

Network merges with Ansel Project in more to go public

Dallas-based USARadio.COM is entering into a "reverse merger" to expedite its move to the OTC Bulletin Board. The USA Radio Network parent announced last week that it hopes to complete its merger with Ansel Project Inc. - described in a press release as simply a Colorado corporation - by the middle of next month. The combined entities will begin trading on the board early next year under the USARadio.COM name.

A source close to the transaction told R&R that Ansel was set up as a public shell company that sought a private company with which to merge. The source said that this speeds up the process of going public, saving time and paperwork. Some major media companies have used shell vehicles to go public, First Union analyst Bishop Cheen told

R&R, adding that Paxson Communications went public in 1994 through a reverse merger with American Networks Group. Still, Cheen warned, "So many of

the small-cap OTC stocks have crashed and burned this way."

A reverse merger usually involves a private company acquiring majority ownership of a public company in a tax-free stock swap, according to Patrick Pogue, President of Tulsabased financier Hampton, Broadstone & Oliver. Often the private company has few assets or liabilities.

USARadio.COM said that after the deal is finalized it will aggressively seek acquisitions, including radio networks and stations and Internet properties. It added that it will reveal no more information until the acquisition is complete.

CBS Inks \$6 Billion NCAA Contract

CBS' exclusive deal with the NCAA --- signed last week --- includes all / broadcast, cable and satellite rights, as well as Internet, home video, marketing, merchandising and licensing rights. Through its various networks, nearly 1,000 radio stations carry CBS' coverage of NCAA basketball. The new term begins in 2003, after the current eight-year contract expires, and runs through 2014. CBS - which reportedly outbid Fox and Disney's ABC/ESPN to win the agreement - has aired the NCAA championship series since 1982.

MAP: Don't Relax Interference For 1kw LPFMs

edia Access Project says that second- and third-adjacent-channel in-M terference should not be eliminated for 1,000-watt low-power FM stations. However, a technical study it submitted to the FCC suggests that if interference standards are loosened for 10-watt and 100-watt stations, 81 million listeners in the top 60 markets could receive new coverage from LPFM stations. The study also showed that only 1.3 million listeners in those cities would receive any interference. The NAB does not want interference restrictions to be relaxed at all.

Percy Sutton To Repay \$2.3 Million In Loans

nner City Broadcasting Chairman Percy Sutton has agreed to repay \$2.3 million in bank loans within the next 18 months, after a "dissident shareholder" went to the New York attorney general and complained that Sutton's loans from the 1980s were still outstanding, Inner City TV President and spokesman Chuck Sutton told R&R. He said loans were made to the original investors - including the one who complained - until the company could go public, but the AG recently ruled that all loans must be repaid. There is no apparent wrongdoing. Chuck Sutton added that Inner City is working on a variety of scenarios to go public," but has no immediate plans to file an IPO.

Yahoo! Accuses Media Metrix Of Miscounting

nline ratings service Media Metrix says portal giant Yahoo! had 40 million unique visitors in October --- 15 million fewer than the company's own estimate. "We believe that we have lost most of the Yahoo audience on the broadcast side because their meter can't measure it," Yahoo Dir./Research Bruce MacEvoy told R&R. A substantial loss was likely shown on Yahoo Broadcast Services, MacEvoy said, because Media Metrix's measurement software isn't designed for streaming media. A couple of factors have contributed to this sudden rush of union activity in CBS shops, according to AFTRA Asst. National Executive Director Greg Hessinger. "First of all, the employees are well aware that the company is generating record profits," he told **R&R**. "Second, the uncertainty of the industry with consolidation combined with technology has employees concerned about their futures."

AFTRA has historically had positive labor relations with Shadow, Hessinger said. He described Metro, on the other hand, as a "unionbusting" company that was found guilty by a federal judge in Philadelphia earlier this year of firing a reporter and a producer for their union activity.

Nevertheless, Hessinger added, "We are encouraged that Westwood is taking steps to continue its positive relationship with the union following the merger."

Infinity owns 25% of Westwood, which would not comment on the labor negotiations.

is tightening its purse strings when it comes to compensating news reporters, writers and anchors for putting in extra time and effort on content used on the web.

For example, Hessinger said, KYW-AM & TV/Philadelphia wants staffers to take on web duties without additional compensation, or the broadcaster will hire nonunion employees to do the work. Currently, "a lot of work is concentrated in the hands of a few individuals," he said, adding that this should be covered in the existing contract. KYW wouldn't comment on the ongoing talks.

CBS recently signed a contract with AFTRA that allows WBBM-AM/Chicago to reuse any material written for the air on its underconstruction website until November 2000. Last month station reporters and anchors distributed leaflets outside CBS' Chicago headquarters highlighting their concerns about the company's pending merger with Viacom. The union said the deal might mean more web work for WBBM's 24-person unit.

While CBS has been bulking up on web investments in recent years, President/CEO Mel Karmazin has been reluctant to allow streaming of broadcast content on the Internet.

pinch from advertisers who want sites with larger audiences, he added, as well as from investors who feel the audience isn't growing fast enough. Media Metrix assembles panels of users who install software on their computers that records the addresses of pages they visit. Vice Chairman Steve Coffey told the *Wall Street Journal* Monday that "this is the only way to measure people."

CBS-Viacom Divestment Delay Request Doesn't Affect Radio

Viacom said that if the FCC wants the combined CBS-Viacom to divest some TV stations because of the merger, it will need two years to find buyers. But the request does not apply to the 10 or so radio stations that CBS-owned Infinity Broadcasting might divest, a CBS spokesman told **R&R**. Some industry-watchers speculate that CBS might try to get the TV broadcast rules changed during the two-year window, allowing it to sell off fewer stations. The merger would give a combined CBS-Viacom a 41% reach of U.S. TV households, more than the 35% limit currently allowed.

FCC Actions

The FCC has flagged Cumulus Media's purchase of KFQX-FM/Abilene, TX from Powell Meredith not because Cumulus will have too much market share after the deal (26% of ad revenue, according to BIA) but because the transaction would result in Cumulus and Sunburst Media sharing 81% of market share. Cumulus owns four other stations in the market, including KKHR-FM, which it is swapping to Powell in a deal that includes \$300,000 cash.

Similarly, due to American General Media's purchase of KBOX-FM/Santa Maria-Lompoc, CA from Cliff Hunter, AGM and Mondosphere will control more than 70% of that market. AGM is also acquiring KPAT-FM & KRQK-FM in the market in two separate deals.

• The FCC is reviewing the sale of WHCD-FM/Ithaca, NY from Salt City Communications to Clear Channel for \$3 million after four different parties filed comments opposing the deal. Pilot Communications, Radio Corp., Buckley Broadcasting and local resident Gerald Brown were all against the transfer. Brown argues that Clear Channel would have control of too many stations in the combined markets of Ithaca, Syracuse and Utica-Rome, NY. Clear Channel responded that the purchase of WHCD does not put the company over the ownership limit or the ad revenue limit. An FCC official said that the commission is reviewing the case and acknowledged that this case was slightly different from others, because the purchase of WHCD would seem to create a regional market in the Ithaca, Syracuse and Utica-Rome areas, even though those markets are generally considered distinct. Clear Channel owns five stations in Syracuse, six in Utica-Rome and none in Ithaca.

• The FCC will allow applicants to file for new AM frequencies and modifications to existing AMs on Jan. 24-28. If any of the applications are in conflict, the disputes will be resolved through an auction at an as-yet-undetermined date. Stations will also be able to apply for the spectrum freed up by WOWO-AM/Ft. Wayne, IN's change to a class B from class A.

• Meanwhile, the FCC will untangle "daisy chain" frequencies in an auction beginning Mar. 21. Daisy chains involve three or more applications whose proposed coverage areas overlap. The single radio daisy chain consists of WCBM-AM/Baltimore's application to increase its power, which would conflict with WWTL-AM/Walkersville, MD's move to Poolesville, MD, which in turn would conflict with WCHO-AM/Washington Court House, OH's move to Henderson, NC. The FCC is asking for a minimum bid of \$20,000 in the case. In order for Elijah Broadcasting's WWTL to win the auction, it would have to outbid the combined bids of WCHO owner Clear Channel and WCBM Maryland. The Mar. 21 auction will also resolve a long-running dispute over a new FM in Rio Grande, PR, and will put on the block a new AM in Honolulu.

• As a result of a complicated proceeding that began several years ago, the FCC has requested that KVRP/Haskell, TX change its frequency. Hispanic Broadcasting wants to change the city of license for KDOS-FM/Gainesville, TX to Louisville, TX. At the same time, KYXS-FM/Mineral Wells, TX wants to upgrade to a class C1, KHYI-FM/Dallas-Ft. Worth would like to move its transmitter closer to Howe, TX, its city of license, and KJKB-FM/Jacksboro, TX wants to move its transmitter closer to Graham, TX. This configuration would force KVRP-FM/Haskell, TX to change its frequency from 95.5 MHz to 97.1 MHz. The commission has given KVRP until Jan. 11 to explain why it shouldn't have to do so. Bob Hayne, an attorney with the Mass Media Bureau Allocations Branch, told **R&R** that KDOS and the other stations would have to reimburse KVRP for costs associated with the modification. Technical fees for such an endeavor are usually no higher than \$5,000, while advertising/promotion costs may go higher. KVRP would not comment on the case.

Company Moves

Proceeds (after expenses) from Clear Channel Communications' \$900 million 1.5% senior convertible notes offering are expected to be \$886.5 million. Lead managers of the sale are Deutsche Banc Alex. Brown and Salomon Smith Barney.

• Hispanic Broadcasting netted about \$250 million last week from the sale of 3 million shares of class A common stock at \$85, according to underwriter Credit Suisse First Boston. Proceeds from the sale will go toward acquisitions and general corporate purposes. Other underwriters included Deutsche Banc Alex .Brown, Banc of America and Salomon Smith Barney.

• Cumulus Media brought in \$144 million (before underwriter fees) from its sale of 3.7 million shares of class A common stock at \$39. Existing stockholders sold another 1 million shares. Proceeds from the offering will go toward paying off pending deals.

• Holders of Saga stock as of Nov. 30 will be able to trade every four shares for five on Dec. 15, the company's fifth such split in the last seven years. The issue rose 28% Oct. 15 to Nov. 18.

• Gaylord Entertainment Co. announced that the company had a regular quarterly dividend of 20 cents per share. The dividend is payable on Dec. 20 to stockholders of record as of Dec. 6.

Congress Passes FCC, CPB Budgets

The House and Senate last week approved an omnibus package that includes the Commerce and Labor budget bills. These in turn contain the fiscal year 2000 appropriations for the FCC and Corporation for Public Broadcasting, respectively. The commission has requested \$210 million, while CPB asked for \$300 million — \$67 million of

Still, Hessinger said, "I don't think there's a question that he has a 'Net strategy, but he's looking for a way to make it most profitable for his group."

Anchors and reporters at sister station WMAQ-AM/Chicago are

also concerned about their futures, according to AFTRA, particularly in light of CBS' recent announcement that it may divest one Windy City radio outlet due to the Viacom merger. Last week WMAQ employees voted 23-1 for representation by the union.

"AFTRA's first step will be to demand from CBS information about its future plans for this station," said Chicago local Exec. Director Eileen Willenborg.

CBS also declined to comment.

WHO WANTS TO MAKE A MILLIONAIRE

Radio ups the ante with a slew of big-money contests

Last week ABC-TV's Who Wants to Be a Millionaire finally gave

away its first million-dollar check. Ho hum ... in a single week last month, radio created two millionaires! In a pair of birthday-based contests, a WRKS/New York contestant won \$1 million in Film House's "Birthday Game" while KIIS/Los Angeles awarded \$2 million to a single winner in a contest created in-house.

Television's current fascination with highstakes game shows has certainly wheted the American appetite for money --- and plenty of it. And while some radio stations' milliondollar contests came long before Regis Philbin ever asked, "Is that your final answer?" the phenomenal success of the TV show certainly raises the bar for radio if it's going to cut through the media clutter.

"There certainly is something magical about the word million. Who Wants to Win \$75,000 is not really a good title," says Von Freeman, Marketing Director for Clear Channel/Los Angeles. "Even though million may not really mean anything after taxes, the only person the word millionaire doesn't impress is Bill Gates. Back in the '50s The \$64,000 Question was a big deal. Now you have to say millions."

THE COST OF MAKING A MILLIONAIRE

To get a rough idea of how much it would cost to do a million-dollar contest, I created a fictitious contest, "The KR&R Currency Exchange." It's a call-in contest, in which the correct caller would choose a dollar bill, and the last six digits of the serial number would be matched up against a predetermined randomly generated combination of numbers, starting with the last digit. Each number matched would add a "zero" to the winnings. Match the first number, it's \$10. Match three numbers, it's \$1,000. Match all six, win a million.

Prizes of \$1,000 or less would be paid by the station. I wanted American Media & Special Promotions to cover the bigger prizes, so I asked the company's Scott Meach how much that would cost.

"Interesting choice of contests on your part," he replied. "Unique and a little complicated to price. There are many variables — annuity values, contest execution, number of winners involved. The range would be between \$3,500 and \$7,000, depending on the variables.

A hundred shots at making a millionaire. If you play the game four times a day each weekday, the contest lasts for five weeks. Five weeks of big market buzz for \$7,000 or less? I like those odds.



During Freeman's tenure KIIS has made two millionaires: a \$1 million winner last fall and last month's \$2 million winner. "When I got to KIIS, they were doing the birthday game here for the typical \$50,000, \$25,000, \$10,000. I said, 'Look, you've got Rick Dees, the legendary god of all radio. This man needs to be giving away millions.' So that's when we flipped the switch and did the million-dollar birthday game."

FREEMAN

KIIS may have broken the radio giveaway record with its most recent winner, but this week AMFM's WUBT (The Beat)/Chicago was hoping to flat-out demolish it. "I see million-dollar birthday games and milliondollar this and million-dollar that and the Regis Philbin thing," explains WUBT Marketing & Promotion Director Sue Serra. "It's all about a million, and we wanted to raise the bar and take it to the next level. By gosh, I think we did it!"

Coincidentally, The Beat's contest was tied in to a birthday: its own. Over a four-week period the station qualified 125 contestants, all of whom won passes to the station's first birthday party, a post-party concert by The Spinners and The Four Tops and a chance to roll seven dice bearing letters.

The prize for rolling the dice and spelling "The Beat": a cool \$5 million.

"I love that," Freeman admits. "There's a visual to it. I can visualize it, and that's the essence of a good contest."

"The reaction so far has been phenomenal," beams Serra. "Everywhere you go, people are asking, 'Are you really giving away \$5 million? How does that work? I heard about your contest ... tell me about it!' It definitely

BEHIND CUMULUS' UNCLOUDED VISION

How does a radio company start from scratch in 1997 and become one of the largest station owners today? What valuable lessons can a head of this firm offer you?

I spoke with Lew Dickey, co-founder/Vice Chairman of Cumulus Media. With nearly 300 radio stations, Cumulus is the nation's second-largest owner-operator, employing 4,000 people and projecting \$250 million in revenues this year. Dickey says, "Over the next two or three years our goal is to double the size of the company in terms of revenue through internal growth and new acquisitions."

How? "I think the opportunity in radio is tremendous. Deregulation has dramatically changed the radio industry structure so that we can now compete on an equal footing with TV and newspapers. In addition, the powerful combination of radio and the Internet will offer new pools of revenue as we expand the range of services we provide to our advertisers. The Internet adds a visual dimension to radio. For example, any retailer, in conjunction with its ads on the



radio station, can display its goods and services on the Internet. "Also, in virtually every market

newspaper classified advertising, as a pool of revenue, is equal to or greater than the entire radio pool of advertising. Without the visual

aspect of the newspaper, here's a pool of revenue we've never had a shot at before. Yet our reach is two to three times that of newspaper circulation.

"We're in a full-employment economy. Retailers like Home Depot to health care providers like Columbia/HCA have a budget for employee recruitment. This money has gone to the newspapers by default. Now, for the first time, the combination of radio and the Internet presents a viable substitute for newspaper classified advertising to not only post a job, but create demand.

"Rather than just throw it in the newspaper, where everybody 40 to dead is reading it, we can target the specific demographic the employer is looking for and drive that listener to a website where they can submit their resume or even create their resume and distribute it to the prospective employer immediately. Today the big employers, because the competition is so fierce for skilled labor. want to move quickly in the hiring process when they have a hot prospect. The combination of radio and the Internet is far superior to newspaper for targetability, flexibility, efficiency and immediacy."

It's apparent that the Internet is important to Cumulus' and your success. But another crucial step Cumulus took --- which is also essential to you - was clearly defining its goals. For Cumulus, goal definition brought it to "Arbitron-rated markets 51 to 275." Being in this niche has reduced competition from large-market organizations and allowed the company to do a superior job of reaching its listeners for its nearly 82,000 advertisers.

There is an almost mystical power in defining a target and then focusing one's energy upon it. It can build a radio giant in less than three years or become the basis for whatever you'd like to accomplish. When you decide what that is, commit the full force of your will behind it, and be flexible. Like Cumulus, your results could be extraordinary.

Next week: Dickey has some specific advice to help you get ahead in the rapidly consolidating world of radio.





has created curiosity, and people aren't put off by the fact that it's a chance to win \$5 million. One of our concerns was whether we'd be putting people off because there is a chance that we're not going to award that money. People are excited about the chance they have to win the money. I would love for someone to win this money, but you never know. Your odds of winning the lottery are one in 2 million. Our odds are better than playing the lottery."

If nobody wins the \$5 million, one person selected at random gets a "second chance" roll for \$100,000, and regardless of whether any money is given away, one of the 125 contestants will win a drawing for a BMW Z3 roadster. "The important thing in doing these kinds of insured contests is that you buffer it with a tangible prize, whether it be a \$100 bill or concert tickets," Serra says. "They're still getting the concert tickets, and somebody's still going to win that car. I would never, ever do this contest if it was just, 'OK, show up, roll your dice, see ya!""

As Serra mentions, the contest is an insured one, so The Beat pays only a premium, regardless of whether somebody makes a winning roll. This particular contest is insured through American Media & Special Promotions, and according to Director/Marketing Scott Meach, "As a good rule of thumb, premiums generally fall between 1% and 10% of the aggregate value of the prize. That's a pretty wide range, depending on how difficult you want to make it to win."

"It's not beyond affordable," Serra says of her station's contest, declining to disclose an exact figure. "It's something that can be done if you budget appropriately. It's not cost-prohibitive."

"There's not a station in America that can't do some version of this game," Freeman adds.

If you're going to run a million-dollar contest, Freeman can't stress enough the need to make sure the execution is worthy of a million-dollar contest. "The reason Who Wants to Be a Millionaire's ratings are so high is because they've got a big-name talent and they've got a concept - just the name alone is brilliant. It's about show business. The name alone puts enough spin on that program to get everybody watching. It's a brilliant plan.

"The message radio needs to pick up on is that maybe you won't give away a million, but it's not about whether you do it or not. You make a pledge to your listeners — just like they buy a \$1 lottery ticket on Wednesday or Saturday - that there's a chance they might win. That's what people want, and they want to be entertained as well. We're living in a world where you can play for \$40 million every Wednesday and Saturday. The bar has been raised. Giveaways are not about the cash. Giveaways are now about the entertainment value. If they're not fun to listen to, don't do 'em."

Of course, only time and Arbitron will reveal the ratings value of such a promotion, but just on the basis of what the \$5 million contest has done for The Beat's image, Serra is confident that she made the correct choice. "We toyed with the idea of doing \$1,000 a day or giving away trips. We thought, 'Gosh, those are great contests, but we want to do something that's really going to make an impact on this market.' It's not only having an effect on listeners, but on our competitors and clients. We want clients to feel they're advertising on the biggest and best station in this market."

SUCCESS STORIES FROM THE

RADIO FUELS MINI-MART GROV

SITUATION: Waverly Lake ARCO Mini-Mart is a convenience store and gas station located on a major highway in the Lebanon, OR area. During its 20 years in business the store had relied primarily on the advertising of its parent company to meet its marketing needs, along with its strong word-of-mouth reputation. But traffic in the single-location store had been slipping.

OBJECTIVE: ARCO had recently made an agreement to begin serving Boyd's coffee in its affiliated stores and had ordered a special roast of a particular coffee blend. As part of that agreement, Boyd's provided training sessions to store personnel on how to brew the special blend. The results produced favorable comments from customers, and the goal of the campaign was to put that positive word of mouth on the air in the hopes of increasing traffic, sales and name recognition for the store.

CAMPAIGN: The two-month campaign featured eight commercials per week promoting Boyd's coffee at the Waverly Lake Mini-Mart. The 30second commercial also ran during Portland Trailblazers basketball broadcasts.

RESULTS: Waverly Lake Mini-Mart is selling much more coffee and enjoying overall improved sales. Customers are commenting on the ads as well as the coffee, and the Boyd's rep reports that he has added five new coffee accounts in the area since the campaign began.

More than a third (37%) of those who shopped in a convenience store in the past three months earn more than \$50,000 per year, and 28% are college graduates. Seventy-two percent own their own homes, and 40% have children living at home. This group spends an average of 47% of its daily media time with radio.

How To Increase Billing in 2000 **24 New Ways to Improve** the Sales Department

s we move from an acquisition era back to an operational A swe move from an acquisition on one of the stations is era, one thing is for sure: Buying and selling stations is pretty easy, but operating them efficiently (and profitably) is quite another story.

Over the past year, I've flown close to 300,000 miles - speaking to, working with, and observing GMs and Sales Managers in both large and small markets. While some managers are certainly stronger than others, I've first identified the 6 traits that separate these winners from the rest of the pack. Go through the list, and ask yourself which areas even you could improve in. Then, I'll share some hot sales tips, plus management tips that killer managers (just like you) execute every day.

6 Traits of Winning **Sales Departments**

1. Ongoing recruitment, inter-

viewing, and hiring: Do you even have a system? How about the number of sellers - is it enough? Remember, the more well-trained sellers the better. That means that the same station account list gets spread over more people and that each seller must accommodate their own income goals by supplementing their list with more new business.

2. Better inventory management: Inventory management – best defined - is selling every single available commercial unit at the highest rate possible. With 35 possible dayparts a week (7 day/5 daypart combinations) - other than News/Talk stations who can sell their inventory like it was a TV station - make sure you're maximizing high-demand dayparts and moving all of the lesser-demand ones at the same time. Do you (or the staff) even know how?

3. Razor-sharp tracking and accountability: Remember the adage: You can't manage what you don't measure. Begin to inspect average orders, closing ratios, dollars asked for (on paper), number of proposals, specs, etc. For both individual sellers and the staff overall.

4. Super-shrewd sales training: For both individuals and the group overall. Make sure you're making room for 15 minute, structured, individualized one-on-ones with each salesperson and that each group meeting has both a well-thoughtout lesson plan and is part of an overall 13- or 26-week syllabus.

5. Tighter account list management: What system do you have in place that ensures the right people are being called on, actually being asked to buy, for the right amount of money, and with proper frequency?

6. Cutting-edge compensation and incentive programs: You'll attract higher-achieving performers by paying an obscene percentage on the first month of any new order. Also, consider compensating salespeople on a sliding commission scale based on individual goal achievement or by paying 1% extra to all sellers if the station hits its goal.

Have You Focused on Showing the Salespeople how THEY Can Make More Money – Like \$10,000 More This Year?

Just like sellers do to their clients, you need to keep selling "the dream" and those better business principles to the sales staff. Show them what's in it for them. Keep giving benefit statements. Here is my favorite list of 10:

1. Everytime you walk through your prospect's door, you should have two ideas to present, no matter how simple or complex

2. Buy into the fact that every "no" gets you that much closer to a "yes." Divide your average order by five - if you close one in five people you see - and convince yourself every sales call (whether they buy or not) is worth an order one-fifth your average sale.

3. Ask for the order every fifth time your prospect blinks (subconsciously). You'll have better eye contact, and will ask for the order more often.

4. Implement the "left/right" rule. After every presentation, make a quick contact with the business on your left and another to the business on your right.

5. Ask your client how much it would be worth to solve their biggest problem, then make sure you ask for at least that much in your proposal, and remind them they said it was worth it.

6. Practice overcoming objections by lighting a match and overcoming the objection before the flame gets too low that it burns your fingers.

7. Blow up your prospect's logo a 200% increase should do it - and use it on the front cover of their proposal. This will surely arouse their emotions early on and get them into the mood where they'll want to buy something.

8. Never say "no" to a customer. Everything is negotiable.

9. Go to the library and identify last-year's newspaper advertisers. As most business people suffer from "last-year-itus," call them now (before they go another year and spend their advertising money in the newspaper).

10. For an extra 10%, offer your client "fries." Just like fast food restaurants, airlines, furniture stores, and car rental agencies up

their average order, find some "extras" for your clients. Double the schedule from midnight to 6am. offer them sponsorship of "Church Drive" (Sundays 6-10am), or give them a portion of all unsold inventory for an extra \$75-\$95 per week.

The Best Managers Realize That People Are Their **Most Important Asset**

Since you are judged - ultimately - by the results your team accomplishes while you are at the helm, it needs to be a top priority for you to get the absolute highest output out of your staff. Here are some ideas:

• Remember that every staff member has a "hot button" - it's the manager's job to find it (and to keep on hitting it). It's a mistake to assume everybody needs to be managed the same way.

• Spend extra time every day making the newest staff members welcome. Remember what it's like to be new.

• Make sure people are learning something every day. Each team member should be "in training" for the next level up.

• Coax people toward performing at their personal best. Maximize potential.

· Challenge yourself to be the leader each member of the staff is talking about 20 years from now. Why would they want to talk about you? Because you brought something tangible to the table. They realize they became better under your guidance.

· Demonstrate an intense work ethic by your example. You really don't want to expect people to do things that you won't.

. Let people know that when the station wins, it's because of the good people. When the team is losing, it's something you (the manager) have done wrong. It'll show you're humble.

· Ask for input on how management can be better. Consider "management evaluations" on a regular basis

Stuff you dow's Liber

This is the kind of commercial that catches the attention of those TV viewers who haven't been paying attention to the set, because it doesn't sound like a TV commercial. Much like the Federal Express "test pattern" spot that caught viewers off guard during this year's Super Bowl, the lack of spoken words in this KZZP/Phoenix spot — you only hear song snippets — draws your attention to the

screen, because it sounds almost out of place. When you get to the screen, you see the spot's message unfold in a swirl of ethereal visuals. As certain buzzwords from the copy — "hits," "upbeat," etc. — form, then blur to reveal music videos, the spot's text appears in the foreground: "Have you ever wished for a

radio station that played an upbeat mix of familiar new and retro hits without all the stuff you don't like? Okay, wish granted."

The first time they see it, casual viewers are likely to miss the first screen or two of text, adding a curiosity factor that helps the Guerilla Productions spot stand up to (if not encourage) repeat viewings.





The attempt to find a fair-market value for the St. Louis properties was stalled when Sinclair announced in July that it would sell its entire 51-station group. Emmis, which was a prospective buyer for the radio group, eventually lost out to Entercom Communications, which paid \$821 million for the stations, not including St. Louis.

As Sinclair and Emmis failed to find a common ground on the price of the St. Louis properties, the the companies eventually turned to an outside appraiser, as required by the contract. Tom Buono, head of BIA Research, was brought in to determine the value. The appraised value of each individual property was not announced.

Emmis To Divest Stations

Emmis and Sinclair now have to work out a contract for the stations, Emmis Chairman/CEO Jeff Smulyan told **R&R**, and that should be the final stumbling block

Continued from Page 1 from Miami to Honolulu. Network executives at both the national and local levels rave about the positive community reaction Radio Disney has received. However, they have also acknowledged that selling the network presents its own unique challenges.

Those presently charged with steering Radio Disney toward future fortunes insist that everything is surpassing their expectations and that ABC and the Walt Disney Co. are fully committed to seeing the network flourish. This despite the fact that many things there run counterintuitive to normal radio practice: There are no ratings to speak of, weekly music research isn't conducted, and song lyrics are scrutinized for objectionable content.

J.P. Colaco assumed all operational duties for Radio Disney in September when VP/GM Scott Mc-Carthy exited. It's Colaco's first programming opportunity. He says his experience in launching The Disney Store in Canada helped him decide to join the radio network. "This project is of huge importance to Disney," he says. "It's a huge opportunity to impact kids in a new way and in a new medium. It is also a new way to promote what is great about Disney."

One of Radio Disney's main attractions is the big-budget promotions constantly running on-air, for which the network relies heavily on callout research. In January Radio Disney's marketing team moved from Dallas - home of the ABC Radio Networks - to Burbank, CA to be closer to Disney's corporate resources. Among the many achievements of the marketing department is its Disney World Tour. The tour, which includes a stage show by Radio Disney personalities and a performance by a core artist, visited 10 top markets this year.

"Our locals become an active part of the community and do a lot of sponsored events," Colaco says. "Our Boston affiliate did a 98 Degrees concert, and 35,000 people showed up to the free event sponsored by McDonald's. We also did a 'Tide's Dirtiest Kids' promotion with Procter & Gamble in 16 markets. We also do, in the top markets, a promotion called 'Hometown Heroes.'' Sponsorship of several program features is another key revenue stream for the network. One example is the midday *Story-Time Theater*, which is sponsored by Petsmart.

While the world tour doesn't make its way to the smaller Radio Disney markets, Colaco says those cities are not left out. "On a local level, we give them tremendous opportunities to tie in to Disney and have events. A group of DJs can go to their market and host and event or party. With kids, there is a tremendous emotional attachment with the jocks."

One promotion currently underway is the "A to Z Holiday Spree," in which a daily code word corresponds to a particular prize. The winner of the daily contest will get that day's prize and qualify to win all 26 toys. Another recent contest is the "Magic Treasure Hunt," in which four families each win a trip aboard the Disney Cruise Line to Disney's private island in the Bahamas and a shopping spree at The Disney Store. One of those families also wins a Chevy Venture minivan. A 9-year-old Chicago girl just won a week-long Hawaiian vacation, complete with tickets to 'N Sync's New Year's Eve show and a private drum lesson from the band's drummer.

Radio Disney's promotional ties to its corporate parent have been a sore spot for some parents' groups, but Colaco says the network attempts to respect the line between entertainment and advertising. "We watch that very closely and attempt to insure we are not a 24-hour commercial for Disney. When you look at the music component, a very small percentage is Disney music. Our most popular summer promotion was Star Wars, and Ichiban Pokémon was our most popular promotion ever. We received 700,000 calls the week we ran that contest, to win a free trip to Japan. Whatever is hot with kids, whether it's Disney or Nintendo, we want to stay true to that."

Radio Disney OM/PD Robin Jones concurs: "We're just doing what the kids want. In our research groups, we found the No. 1 thing kids want to win is a trip to Walt Disney World. It's not about Disney trying to further its business interests. If that's what a kid wants to win, that's what they'll win."

In A Demo Of Its Own

Now Producer Matt, who produces afternoon hosts Just Plain Mark and Zippy, is manning the phones. "Hi, Radio Disney ... Do you know what our 'secret sound' is?" "Is it frogs?" the Minnesota girl

"Is it frogs?" the Minnesota girl responds. (The correct answer is a swamp.)

"Oooh, you're so close. Think of where frogs live."

"A pond?"

"Oh, no. Think of a dirty pond ..." Matt can't get her to guess the right answer, so Mark and Zippy get the call. After a few minutes of more hints, the girl finally gets it.

"Yeah! I won!" It's no secret that kids are finicky

and express rapid changes in what they think is "cool." Thus, programming a radio station to this cell can be vexing. Radio Disney conducts its fair share of research into listener preferences, but a lot of what it does is a throwback to old-school radio.

Jones explains, "We do research among parents and teachers on what is funny and entertaining, but we also use our gut." And unlike most music stations, Radio Disney does no music callout research: All new adds to the playlist are done by instinct and Mark & Zippy Continued from Page 1

co-host. "The show bombed," Zippy says, so the station paired him with Mark Sutherland, who had done mornings at KTBZ/Houston and nights at WXXL/Orlando. "We became No. 1 in afternoons," Zippy says.

After a stint at crosstown WSHE-FM, which had just debuted a Pop/ Alternative format, the duo joined Radio Disney in mid-'96. "We had to change things and adapt," Zippy comments. "And that's our strength — we've still retained the same thread. We're mischievous, but within parameters. You have to play it safe on a number of issues. You get to meet kids on their level we don't talk down to kids. We let the kids tell us what's funny."

Mark and Zippy have an almost perfect chemistry. "When we walk into this studio, we pretend we're two 12-year-olds," Mark says. "Just yesterday I beat Zippy up and stole his bicycle ... When we made this transition, there were things that were difficult. This is great because you have endless theater-of-the-mind opportunities." Adds Zippy, "In regular radio it might come off as camp or cheese, but it really works here."

The duo now broadcast from a fishbowl studio inside Disneyland, just steps away from Space Mountain. On a recent visit, a steady stream of visitors waited patiently for

autographs, and the two worked simultaneously between records to edit a phone call. When there's a break in the action, Mark and Zippy will leave the studio to mingle with the young fans and their moms. They'll also do the occasional flyaway.

"A lot of times we'll fly a red-eye, get two hours' sleep, go to an event and then fly back out to L.A.," Zippy comments. "We'll be exhausted, but it's so worth it. All these kids want to do is hug and meet you. It's like meeting friends."

"And it's also a celebrity thing," Mark adds. "They're not old enough yet to know we're just jocks."

Interestingly, the duo's five-hour afternoon show gelled from the start, because Radio Disney didn't have an Orlando affiliate for them to hear. "We did what we thought kids' radio was supposed to sound like," Mark says. "Not being able to hear the station kept us different from everyone else."

Now that Mark and Zippy have been doing Children's radio for three years, would either of them return to Alternative, Hot AC or any other adult format?"If we decide ever to go back to regular radio, we will be so much cleaner, tighter and better," Zippy comments. "This show is harder than anything else we've done. The bottom line for kids' radio is that it's radio. We're just two dorky guys doing the same show we'd do for adults, except it's geared toward kids."

Auditorium tests also aren't used, which is understandable when dealing with listeners with short attention spans. "We do have groups of 10 discuss some of the things they like," Jones says. "They can't tell you burn, but they can tell whether they like or dislike a song." The network is also heavily dependent on website requests and calls to the station's tollfree studio line. "We're about to embark on some Internet hook-listening too."

Of the 45 affiliates that air Radio

Disney, all but one — in Cumberland, MD — are located on the AM band. Therefore, getting parents to find Radio Disney for their kids and preventing them from changing the station after a short period of time — has been one of Jones' principal missions since she first became involved with Children's radio in 1991.

The first prototypes of what would become Radio Disney were far different from what airs today. "Some of the initial versions featured



Congress is taking a look at lowpower radio," Oxley representative Peggy Peterson told **R&R** this week. "Some people up here are not happy about LPFM."

Although the proposed law awaits referral to the House Telecommunications Subcommittee for further discussion - which probably won't happen until after President Clinton's State of the Union address on Jan. 27 - it does serve as an alert to Kennard that Congress is monitoring his LPFM activities. "It's free-standing legislation," Peterson added. "We can't tell them, 'Don't act.' but we wanted to let them know that we are watching and that low-

power radio will likely be discussed during the recess.'

The bill has bipartisan support from Republicans Barbara Cubin of Wyoming, Vito Fossella Jr. of New York, Robert Ehrlich of Maryland, Hal Rogers of Kentucky and Cliff Stearns of Florida, as well as New Jersey Democrat Frank Pallone. Although Oxley said Kennard's "desire to provide a public forum for community groups is laudable," he noted that "a multitude of alternatives already exist." In introducing his legislation, Oxley said that low-power service is "ill-advised and unnecessary" and that the LPFM proposal "is inconsistent with sound spectrum management.'

NAB President/CEO Eddie Fritts, who has led an industrywide charge

against the LPFM proposal and has spent hours trying to convince legislators that LPFM would cause great interference to established radio stations, welcomed the bill's introduction. "We strongly support and applaud the bipartisan efforts of Representatives Oxley, Pallone and others to stop the FCC's misguided initiative on low-power radio. The NAB has provided unassailable evidence documenting that millions of listeners will be subjected to additional interference on the radio dial should the FCC proposal become reality."

FCC spokesman David Fiske said the commission would not comment on the pending legislation.

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

Stories Of The Century

Radio news has been a big part of the events that shaped the 20th century

s 1999 winds down and the debate rages about when to celebrate the dawn of the new millennium — January 1, 2000 or 2001 — one indisputable fact is that the new year will mark the turn of the century. And among the events and stories for which the 20th century will long be remembered, it's safe to say that the evolution of broadcast radio news will rank high on anyone's list.

Radio changed the world in the 20th century. It helped to create a national and world community that had never really existed prior to radio's invention and evolution. In fact, one could argue that it

was the evolution of radio as a mass medium that made possible the subsequent evolution of television and even the Internet. The development of commercial radio in the 20th century made the world a smaller place by making it possible for the very first time for millions of listeners to simultaneously share events and happenings around the globe live as they happened.

So as we look ahead to the 21st century and the promise it holds, it seems only fitting to reflect on some of the events and stories that have defined the past century. To that end,

this week I've asked several radio news executives to share their thoughts and opinions about the moments, stories and events of the 20th century that they believe helped to shape the world as we know it today, and how radio played a part in it all.

History-Making Network

Few would argue the historic role that CBS Radio News has played in the evolution of the medium during the past century. The network's roster of noted news reporters and anchors is literally a hall of fame team. with names like Robert Trout, Dou-



glas Edwards, Howard K. Smith, Walter Cronkite and, of course, Edward R. Murrow. Today CBS Radio News is under the watchful eye of VP Radio Harvey Nagler. From Nagler's point of view,

today's information revolution wouldn't have been possible without radio. "I don't think there's any question that radio was the foundation on which the entire information revolution was built," he says. "Radio was the first medium of the 20th century that everyone turned to for information, and that had a tremendous impact on the development of American society and that of the entire world."

As an example of the sort of impact radio had in the early years of the past century, Nagler cites 1938 as a major year. "1938 was the year

Networks Set To Party Like It's 1999!

As the clock strikes midnight on December 31, 1999, all of the major radio news networks, and most local stations, will be geared up for full-scale coverage of an event that happens just once every thousand years. Here's a brief sample of some of the programming being offered to stations by ABC, CBS, CNN and AP Radio.

CBS: The Millennium CBS News Special will be a three-hour program, anchored by CBS Evening News anchor Dan Rather, featuring produced pieces and archival tape from the major stories and events of the 20th century. Also included will be round table discussions with icons of the century from all walks of life, CBS News anchors both past and present discussing their personal memories, and coverage of the 20th century. New Year's Eve and New Year's Day will feature live coverage from key locations across the globe as the year 2000 dawns.

CNN: Live hour-by-hour coverage of celebrations of the new millennium from the network's strategically located correspondents around the world will begin at 10am ET December 31 and continue through 6am ET January 1. The network will also offer a three-hour millennium special hosted by CNN anchor Wolf Blitzer that will be distributed by Westwood One. Hour one will highlight 1999 in review, and the remaining two hours will focus on the century and millennium in review.

AP: AP claims bragging rights to being the largest news-gathering organization in the world, with reporters in national capitals across the globe and state capitals across the U.S. AP Radio plans to do a live break from every populated time zone as each enters the year 2000. AP will have a live reporter standing by at the U.S. government's Y2K Center in Washington to update on any impact the so-called Y2K bug may have domestically, as well as reporters standing by to report on any unusual occurrences around the world via the AP wire and live on AP News Radio. AP is also offering a 30-part series on stories of the century leading up to New Year's Day.

ABC: Fifty-five hours of end-of-the-century coverage begins Thursday, December 30 and runs through Monday, January 3. Continuous programming under the banner of ABC 2000 will be available from 6pm ET Friday, December 31 through 4am ET January 1, featuring the global resources of ABC News. Correspondents will report live from major capitals and locations throughout the world, including Moscow, Bethlehem, Rome, New York, Epcot Center in Orlando and more. Special correspondents will report from other significant locations, including NORAD headquarters in Colorado Springs, the Y2K Preparedness Center in Washington and Pasadena, CA, as tens of thousands gather for the first Tournament of Roses Parade of the new millennium.

Orson Welles broadcast War of the Worlds, and we all know what an impact that had on people," he recalls. "And 1938 was also the year CBS first aired The CBS World News Roundup, which was the first regularly scheduled news broadcast

in which correspondents from around the world were linked by a central anchor based in New York. When you look back on the impact that radio has had in the 20th



century, I think you must look at that particular program as a defining show, because it was the first place where literally millions of Americans got their information about what was going on in the world outside their hometowns."

Nagler believes that the 1930s and '40s were the decades when radio really began to come into its own and demonstrate what a powerful medium it was. "Radio was the key link where all of America got its information about a world war," he says. "Just think about Edward R. Murrow's This Is London, as he broadcast from the rooftops of that city as the Nazis were bombing Great Britain. Or Franklin Roosevelt's "fireside chats," where a president talked directly to all Americans about events going on in the war and the world. It was the immediacy of radio that was able to make it the single medium that linked all nations during that tumultuous time of our history."

The Century's Newest Network

While the major radio networks like CBS, ABC, NBC, Mutual, etc., certainly dominated throughout much of the 20th century, toward the end of it a new kid on the block came along and today stands tall among its network peers. And while CNN became primarily known as a 24-hour cable TV news channel through its groundbreaking coverage of the Gulf War, as the '90s come to an end, CNN Radio News has also taken its place among the major networks heard by millions of listeners daily on radio stations across America.

CNN Radio General Manager **Robert Garcia** tops his list of the events that shaped the last century with the development of the atomic bomb. "The use of the atomic bomb to end World War II and the role it then played as a de-facto peacekeeper through the Cold War — by assuring the mutual destruction of those countries who held the weapon in their arsenals — is certainly one of the most awesome events of the 20th century," Garcia suggests.

"By the same token, it has also been an incredible destabilizing force due to the prospect of rogue governments getting their hands on a technology that could quite literally end life on earth as we know it. So I'd have to say that I believe the development of atomic weaponry is perhaps the biggest event of the 20th century."

Garcia also cites a technological breakthrough that literally lit up the world as one of the century's greatest events. "The development of the electrical power grid gave people everywhere the ability to simply flip a switch and turn on a light," he says. "It's an event that revolutionized the world and our society in so many ways. For the first time we had the ability to stay up later and do things we never before had done, not to mention the whole electrification of society and how important that was as an event that touched everything in our lives.

"From fuel pumps, to the water that comes out of our taps, to the lighting for our homes, offices and factories, to the power for every major transportation system and even the source of power that allowed for the development of both radio and TV over the century — I'd suggest that the development of the power grid is an event that would have to be ranked right up there near the top of the list as something that defined our lives in the past 100 years."

The Century Plus One

AP Radio News Deputy Director/ Managing Editor Brad Kalbfeld gets an allowance of one additional year for his assessment of events that changed life as we know it in the past century. But that one extra year provides a major event that shaped the 20th century. "In 1899, one year prior to the start of the 20th century, Marconi wanted to demonstrate to the world that his wireless invention could be used as a newsgathering tool," says Kalbfeld. "So he asked the Associated Press to set up a receiver on the shoreline in Newfoundland to receive his wireless transmission of the results of the America's Cup race.

"So even before there was radio, back when AP was strictly a newspaper organization, we were in"I don't think there's any question that radio was the foundation on which the entire information revolution was built."

volved in the very first wireless news transmission in history. And although that event predates the 20th century by a few months, it certainly would have to be considered as a major event in the history of the medium during the past 100 years."

Another event that Kalbfeld believes should be included on the century's list of defining moments was the first radio broadcast. "KDKA-AM/Pittsburgh initiated the very first radio broadcast on election night in November of 1920. It was basically a report on the results of the Harding vs. Cox presidential race, and AP provided the station with that election information. We're very proud that the Associated Press was involved in the production of that history-making first radio broadcast of the 20th century."

Kalbfeld cites radio's involvement during World War II as perhaps the medium's most defining time. "Radio really came of age during World War II, when it first blended serious, factual reporting with immediate, live-on-the-scene coverage," he says. "If you look at how any of the media operate today, radio's development of giving the public instant information is really the original model for it all."

The ABC Of Y2K

Chris Berry, VP/ABC Radio News, weighs in with some final thoughts on radio's defining stories and moments of the 20th century. "While many would say that the 1930s and '40s were radio's golden years, I'd like to suggest that right through to the present day we at the networks — as well as stations at the local level — are still producing some of the most compelling radio journalism that listeners have ever heard," enthuses Berry.

"From the Scopes Monkey Trial, which was broadcast live on WGN/ Chicago, through World War II, Korea and Vietnam, to the O.J. Simpson verdict, which was heard live on the radio around the world, as we enter a new millennium, radio is still the medium that best handles breaking news.

"We don't need to set up cameras or microwave links like TV or run paper through a printing press like newspapers. And today, with the evolution of the cellular telephone, radio has been provided with the world's longest microphone cord! More than ever before, radio can go wherever news is breaking anywhere in the world, and instantly a radio reporter is standing there, describing a story for you live as it's unfolding.

"So while it's true that radio has certainly been a part of virtually every major event and story of the past century, I firmly believe it will continue to be a very vital part of the century we are about to enter on January 1, 2000. When major events occur, radio will be there and so will our listeners."

lots of kids' songs done by famous artists. It was more along the line of 'Who's Afraid of the Big-Bad Wolf' by LL Cool J. Once we got the initial response, we found that was not what kids really wanted to hear."

Today pop hits account for 50% of the Radio Disney playlist, while songs from movies and TV programs make up 20%. Oldies account for an additional 20% of the mix, with the remaining 10% devoted to pure children's songs. "Of course, pop music wasn't where it is today when we started," Jones says. "In the early '90s music was getting further down the suggestive line."

Today artists such as 'N Sync, Backstreet Boys, Britney Spears and B*Witched dominate the playlist. Some acts have found an exclusive home at Radio Disney and can attribute their U.S. success solely the network. "The impact on single sales for The Moffatts in Radio Disney markets is unbelievable and can be attributed only to the format," said Capitol Records VP/Marketing Rob Gordon.

Jones adds, "We have been able to show sales in markets where we are the only station playing this band. We were also out on B*Witched, Mandy Moore and Youngstown first. And once we gain the moms, CHR is going to have to notice." So far, CHR has been reluctant to embrace several teen acts due to their limited appeal. Moore's debut single peaked at No. 26 at CHR/Pop earlier this month, while Youngstown's first single peaked at No. 46 in October. B*Witched scored a top 20 CHR/Pop hit earlier this year with "C'est La Vie."

and safer," Jones says. On a recent visit to Radio Disney's Disneyland studios, a visitor noted that Lou Bega's "Mambo No. 5" received several requests, but it was unlikely that it would make it on the air.

At any rate, Jones has no doubt about Radio Disney's effect on future generations of radio listeners. "Their knowledge of music is really impressive. Would you ever think an 8-year-old would know James Brown?"

From a competitive standpoint, Radio Disney executives see other media — not other radio stations — as the network's true rivals. Those children that listen to Radio Disney usually do so for considerable periods of time: According to Statistical Research data, the network's national TSL is just below two hours *a day*. A typical CHR receives about 6:45 of listening per week.

Afternoon co-host Zippy says the key for Radio Disney vs. other media is the high level of interactivity between kids and hosts. "Nickelodeon is a great product, but here is the chance for kids to identify with something. I love *Kenan & Kel*, but kids can't call them up and interact with them. We do a music show, but it's caller-driven."

Turning The Sales Corner

In late September, in a move designed to "consolidate operations," Buz Powers departed as Director/Owned Station Operations for Radio Disney. Mitch Dolan and Mark Steinmetz, co-directors of ABC's O&Os, have added oversight duties for the Radio Disney properties in their respective regions. "We have spent an inordinate amount of time to date learning the Radio Disney process," Steinmetz said. "But I don't think we'll take more time with these stations than with our other stations. ABC possesses some real jewels in its collection, and a lot of those stations have GMs capable of excelling on their own."

For those affiliates not owned by ABC,

lion to build state-of-the-art broadcast studios atop Rockefeller Center and construct four satellites and a national broadcast system with 100 channels of programming. The first of three orbiting satellites is scheduled to be launched Jan. 17. In all, three satellites will be launched over the next nine months, while the fourth will remain on the ground as a backup.

But beyond technology, Margolese promised Sirius would deliver programming never before offered to the warriors of the American roadway. "Sirius will be to radio what cable is to television," proclaimed Margolese. "We will deliver a breadth of programming that has never really been experienced in America."

He was followed by a series of prerecorded promotional announcements from such celebrities as Bill Cosby, Jason Alexander and National Symphony conductor Leonard Slotkin, who lauded the diversity of Sirius' programming. Sirius' 50 commercial-free music channels range from Opera to World Beat, Gospel to Tex-Mex, Broadway's Best to Classic Country. Another 50 channels, which will include advertising of about four units per hour, include programming from NPR, PRI, BBC, C-SPAN, Bloomberg, Speedvision, Outdoor Life and Hispanic Radio Network. Sirius also announced that the Sci-Fi Channel will produce "Sci-Fi Radio" from Sirius' studios. Additional content from the science fiction website will include readings, interviews, music and other entertainment geared toward scifi enthusiasts.

listeners have responded to Radio Disney's presence, but local advertisers have been slow to fill the five hourly local minutes (the network sells the other five minutes). "It's difficult," says Laurie Hardison, a sales executive for AMFM's WYNK-AM/Baton Rouge, LA. "It's taken off as of late, because it's about learning how to niche-sell, and that's coming together." This, says Hardison, in spite of the fact that "every place we go, we are swamped. Having the kids coming up to you at an event is one thing, but the most significant thing is the morns that are coming up and shaking your hand, telling you, 'Thank you for doing this.""

KXTP-AM/Duluth-Superior, MN-WI Sales Manager Chuck Gehlen says, "We've struggled with trying to get our arms around it. The people selling Radio Disney were also out there selling two FMs. In the last month I've taken Radio Disney and given it to one person, and it's turned the corner in just two weeks."

In Waco, TX the struggle has also been bringing more dollars to the AM band. "Radio Disney is a great format, one that we truly haven't done enough with," KWTX-AM GM Michael Oppenheimer confesses. "We pretty much put all of the emphasis on the FMs, because that's where the money is. Saleswise, it's more of a self-induced problem. But one of the nice things I hear is how it's so much of a great radio station for kids to enjoy. Formatically it fits, because Waco is a conservative, family-values town."

Not everyone has been happy with Radio Disney, however. After a two-year run, the format was replaced in Monroe, LA by Talk programming. In July Simmons dropped Radio Disney from KDZZ-AM/ Albuquerque in favor of Adult Standards. The station immediately shot up 0.3-1.6 in the summer Arbitron. Says Bruce Pollack, "When I took over as GM in April, the station had no ratings or revenue. Radio Disney is a format that will never de-

liver ratings. It's a concept sell, and it's too expensive to dedicate a sales force solely to the purpose of selling only Radio Disney. When we dropped the format, we got one phone call — one complaint. When we moved to Adult Standards, we got 100 phone calls."

From the start, it was Pollack's desire to transfer the Radio Disney rights to another broadcaster in Albuquerque move that would have provided a seamless transition. However, he claims Disney executives failed to respond to the station's desire to cancel its contract. When pressed with a deadline, Pollack claims ABC finally responded by contacting its attorneys. "This owner was willing to assume our contract, and Radio Disney would not have missed one day of broadcast. We were even willing to promote the new dial position on our airwayes for a period of time after the transfer. No one gave us the time of day."

The contract itself is a major bone of contention between Pollack and ABC. He claims Disney provides an option to renew, but fails to provide an option for an affiliate to cancel. Another radio executive, who requested anonymity, concurred: "The minute the format comes off the air, 'Disney, Disney, Disney' comes off the air, 'Disney, Disney, Disney' comes off the air. ABC is strong-arming everyone with this Disney stuff. Even on the other ABC formats, they're shoving Mickey Mouse down our throats." ABC has since filed a lawsuit against Simmons over the matter in Albuquerque.

Radio Disney has also witnessed the demise of a once-formidable competitor, Children's Broadcasting Corp.'s "Radio Aahs" format. In 1990 CBC debuted its "Radio Aahs" format, aimed at children 4-9. By the summer of 1997 "Aahs World Radio" aired on 30 stations nationwide, including O&Os in New York, L.A., Chicago and Detroit. It would disappear six months later as a result of a legal battle in which CBC accused ABC of "misappropriation



Radio Disney's original business plan had the network blanketing 70% of the country by next July. Jones says the network hopes to achieve that goal by September 2000. For Jones, "That's beyond my wildest dreams of what we could do."

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
Clive Watch II: War Of Words Continues

he verbal sparring between Arista Records President Clive Davis and BMG Entertainment continued last week. The latest skirmish, which first erupted when word leaked that BMG had plans to appoint LaFace Records cofounder Antonio "L.A." Reid as Davis' replacement, focuses on BMG's desire for Davis to appoint a successor. The N.Y. Post reported Tuesday (11/23) that Davis did name a successor two years ago - Richard Griffiths, now the Londonbased chief of BMG Europe - but "BMG nixed it," sources say. BMG's reply: Davis only wanted Griffiths to run the rock division.

The two sides issued dueling statements last week. Davis - who even took his case to the public by appearing on Good Morning America said he has "no plans whatsoever to retire" and that he "fully intends to live up to [his] contract," which runs through June 30, 2000. Davis said, "At age 66, I am absolutely at the peak of my powers," adding that he "will be weighing BMG's offers to me, which involve both preserving my legacy and, ironically, major support of a new media company that I will be forming."

BMG Entertainment President/CEO Strauss Zelnick countered, "My strong desire is to do right by Clive Davis. I have nothing but the highest regard and deepest respect for Clive and what he has accomplished for Arista and the industry. As CEO I have a responsibility to make decisions based on what's right for the company, and that includes making sure we have an appropriate succession plan in place for Arista. While we generally do not comment on contract negotiations, everyone at BMG - especially me - hopes that


Bean's Talk Stays Planted (Kevin's Too)

Noemi Melendres had filed a motion alleging that her son's high school football rivals were using an ineligible player. Had it been granted (it wasn't), her son's team would have advanced to the playoffs. John Granato and Lance Zierlein apparently found the situation worthy of ridicule, so they conducted a mock interview with Melendres' "husband." Record Industry Forecast 2003

Veronis, Suhler reports healthy record sales, usage

onsumer spending on recorded music will increase at a compounded annual rate of 3.6% in terms of unit sales for the next five years, with the retail value of those net shipments rising 5.5% in tandem to \$17.98 billion, according to media investment bank Veronis, Suhler & Associates.

In the 13th annual edition of its comprehensive "Communications Industry Forecast" study - the best overall guide to media projections in the business - VSA predicts the record industry will rank 17th among the 19 major media sectors it tracks. (Editor's note: VSA combines filmed entertainment, recorded music and interactive, but for the purpose of this article the data has been broken out into the different categories.) In comparison, overall media spending will climb 7.5% annually on average.

In its state of the industry report, VSA says unit sales of CDs - the industry's cash generator - will grow 6.3%, compounded annually, nearly half the rate of the 11.3% rise during 1993-1998. While unit album cassette sales will continue to plummet, VSA sees a bright future for the industry in higher-priced DVD unit sales. The configuration will leap from around 500,000 copies purchased in 1998 to 50 million in 2003, with the retail value soaring from \$12.2 million to \$1.25 billion, making DVDs the No. 2 revenue generator for the industry. That rise, however, will come somewhat at the expense of music videos, where sales will slide from 27.2 million units sold in 1998 to 15.0 million, with the value of those shipments declining from \$508 million to \$352.5 million during the same period.

As for the Internet's impact, VSA says it's still "unclear what role the Internet will play in the [recorded

becoming web-savvy in a relatively short time. VSA Exec. VP James Rutherford comments, "As we enter the new millennium, Americans are simultaneously mastering new communications media while increasing their use of traditional media. As communications media evolve, so has our ability to be engaged on many levels at once. Our own research points to the remarkable conclusion that Americans' capacity to absorb information and entertainment is still increasing, even as it approaches 10 hours a day."

will continue to be a major reason that personal Internet usage will increase. VSA says, "The 74 hours spent online by the average American saved a significant amount of time previously spent shopping, talking on the telephone and searching for information, leaving more time available for leisure activities, including media usage."

As a direct sales channel, VSA says the record industry is "poised for strong growth" when it comes to the 'Net. As a comparison, VSA estimates online book sales more than quadrupled in 1998 to \$687 million vs. \$163 million a year earlier.

The growing userfriendliness of the web, which improves yearly,

Pop Radio Warms Up To Vertical Horizon's 'Everything You Want'

1

If current airplay is any indication, the only direction **RCA Records** rock band Vertical Horizon is going is up, up, up. Crossing over from Alternative and Adult Alternative, the group's new single, "Everything You Want," is poised to enter the Hot AC and CHR/ Pop chart. Two weeks ago the track was No. 41 at Alternative and No. 21 at Adult Alternative.

RER LANUNT

Major-markets stations playing the cut, the second single and title track from Vertical Horizon's RCA debut alopened the doors to the Southwest and Southeast touring circuit. In 1995 the group recruited additional members to its recording lineup and released *Running on Ice*. A year later they released the live disc *Live Stages*. All told, those indie discs sold around 60,000-70,000 copies.

Vertical Horizon's road work paid off in 1997, when RCA Sr. VP/A&R **David Bendeth** stumbled on the group at South By Southwest. He remembers, "You know how every A&R person is

bum, include Alternatives WKRL/ Syracuse, KXRK/Salt Lake City, WMRQ/Hartford, WPLY/Philadelphia and WNNX/Atlanta; Adult Alternatives KENZ/Salt Lake City, WTTS/Indianapolis, WXRV/Boston and KKZN/Dallas; Hot ACs WKIS/ Greensboro, WTMX/Chicago, KZZO/Sacramento, KBBT/Portland and KFMB/San Diego; and CHRs KBKS/Seattle, WNKS/Charlotte, WKZL/Greensboro, WDCG/Raleigh and WXKS/Boston.

Vertical Horizon's genesis was at a Georgetown club, where founding members Keith Kane and Matt Scannell first met in 1991. Upon graduation in 1992 the duo moved to Cape Cod, MA, working at a golf course during the day and playing three times weekly at a local club. At the end of that summer the two used the money saved from their day jobs to record their first album, *There and Back Again*.

After making the record, Kane and Scannell returned to the Georgetown-Washington, DC area and set up shop. Eventually, they hooked up with the now-defunct Jackopierce. That relationship proved invaluable and running around, looking at all the buzz bands? Well, I ended up at this very nonbuzz gig at the Steamboat, and the place was packed with college kids and other folks. It was a very unique mix. Then they broke into the first song, and everyone started singing all the words."

Bendeth met the group after the gig and told them he was very interested. Not surprisingly, MCA, Elektra and a few other labels started courting the group when word leaked about RCA's intent to sign them.

Bendeth continues, "You have to remember, this was about 2 1/2 years ago, and RCA wasn't perceived as a great label for modern rock bands like it is now. I told them I would double or triple any other label's offer, but there was a catch: They had to agree to a development deal and write some more songs before we officially signed them."

When it was time to begin working radio in late summer, RCA opted to lead off with "You Are" at Alternative, Adult Alternative and Rock. Sr. VP/ Promotion **Ron Geslin** comments, "It was very, very important that we go with that song to show radio how talented these guys are as songwriters and to establish the group's credibility."

RCA realized that it had its hands full dropping the single and record from a baby band during a busy third quarter. Geslin continues, "As songwriters, these guys are on par with Matchbox 20 and The Dave Matthews Band. They're that good. They write poppy, rockbased songs that have depth and appeal. It's always difficult for these kinds of groups to break through, but once they do, they become huge. That's why we had to make sure the group had credibility with radio first."

Yet RCA also realized it had something special. Alternative WRAX/Birmingham had begun spinning "Everything You Want," and sales spiked impressively. Also, CHR/Pop WDCG/ Raleigh had started picking up impressive phones and strong early research.

With a firm foundation at Alternative and Adult Alternative, RCA now has its sights set on Pop, and Pop is responding. One big fan is KBKS PD **Mike Preston**. "At first, we went with this one out of passion, because we all loved it. It has that great rock sound like Third Eye Blind and Matchbox 20 that's really 'of the moment' right now and works well. These guys really nailed it with this song."

Vertical Horizon's RCA debut album was released on June 15 and has sold nearly 55,000 copies, according to RCA.

Ready For Takeoff: Maktub

The buzz over the Seattle-based R&B/funk-flavored quartet **Maktub** is beginning to build, thanks to airplay from hometown Adult Alternative **KMTT** (The Mountain). The station has steadily been increasing rotation for the group's song "Just Can't Make It" and has been giving the cut morning and afternoon drive exposure.

The group's **Jasiri Media Group** album, *Subtle Ways*, has sold over 5,000 copies, according to JMG's **David Meinert**. With KMTT firmly on board, JMG has now begun working West Coast radio.

Meinert says, "The reaction from The Mountain has been great. They're sponsoring our next show, and we'll be visiting them live on the air soon. They've been incredibly supportive. So now we're just going to start working stations in Oregon and California and try to get some more airplay. If that works, we'll begin working the East Coast in the new year."

Among the labels expressing interest are Maverick, 550 Music and Epic.

Promotions And Concerts Ring In Holidays

More stations reveal holiday music and promotional plans

WHTZ (Z100)/New York Dir./Marketing & Advertising Theresa Beyer

How, if at all, will you deal with holiday music?

We are running continuous Christmas music from 4am on Dec. 24 until noon on Dec. 25. Then we are running the top 100 songs of 1999 on Dec. 25 (noon-9pm), Dec. 26 (9am-6pm), Dec. 27 (6am-3pm), Dec. 31 (noon-9pm), Jan. 1 (6am-3pm) and Jan. 2 (9am-6pm).

Are you planning any special promotions, concerts, hot toy give-aways or fund-raisers?

One of the biggest things we're doing is the "Jingle Ball," which is just one week before Christmas. And what better place to be than New York City — a Madison Square Garden Christmas. We'll probably donate close to a quarter of a million dollars to local charities. We also auction off front-row seats for various charities. Our auction tickets generally get anywhere from \$12,000 to \$25,000 for a pair. Kind of wacky, but hey!

What are your plans for New Year's Eve 1999? Will you have countdown shows or other special programming?

As far as New Year's Eve music, we'll have the top 100 countdown, which we're actually going to start pretty early to get the jump on everybody else. The AMFM stations that's us, WAXQ (Q104) and WTJM (Jammin' 105) — are the official stations of N.Y.C. 2000, which means that we're the only stations allowed in Times Square on New Year's Eve.

KBAT/Odessa-Midland, TX PD Leo Caro

How, if at all, will you deal with holiday music?

We'll start holiday music the week of Thanksgiving. We'll play contemporary artists doing traditional songs and new stuff like Mariah, Boys II Men, 'N Sync and so on. Usually we start with about one holiday song per shift, then eventually, about 10 days before Christmas, go with about two songs per hour.

Are you planning any special promotions, concerts, hot toy give-aways or fund-raisers?



Lastly, we finish up the holiday season with "VYB's 12 Days of Christmas," with live broadcasts from different businesses every day leading up to Christmas Eve

What are your plans for New Year's Eve 1999? Will you have countdown shows or other special programming?

We're going to put together a top 1,033 songs of the millennium countdown special, and we're also working with some other businesses in town to try to do our own Times Square drop-the-ball event on the streets in Davtona Beach, complete with a Dick Clark look-alike and all the fun and games that go with it.

KHTO/Springfield, MO PD Ray Michaels How, if at all, will you deal with holiday mu-

sic?

Here in the Midwest the Christmas holiday is very much a spiritual event and must be handled with respect. The seasonal music is first introduced on or around the first of December. The rotations increase each week right up to Christmas Day. The final few days before Christmas the songs are played once an hour. The morning of Christmas we run a holiday special, but later that afternoon everyone has had about has much of it as they can stand, and it's back to regular programming.

Are you planning any special promotions, concerts, hot toy giveaways or fund-raisers?

Our big holiday promotion is the Dare to Care CD sampler. The free CD is exchanged for canned food items, which are then handed over to various charity organizations here in southwest Missouri. This year we are pleased to feature the best the format has to offer, with Smash Mouth, TLC, Blessid Union Of Souls, Jennifer Lopez, Madonna, Lit, Santana and many, many more. The promotion begins the day after Thanksgiving and runs right through the first of the year.

The radio station will also hit the air with our

Adopt a Family program. We find several needy families here in Springfield that would not have Christmas celebrations if it weren't for the help of the community. We get everyone involved and supply everything from gifts to the turkey for dinner. It's so rewarding rolling up in the station van and seeing the looks on their faces. We make their dreams come true.

What are your plans for New Year's Eve 1999? Will you have countdown shows or other special programming?

For the year 2000, Hot 106.7 will feature a special edition of our live mix show from a huge club on the city's south side. The fun starts with dinner at 8pm, and the show hits the airwaves at 10pm. The show will be broadcast live to everyone in southwest Missouri. At midnight we have a huge balloon filled with prizes drop, and we toast in the new millennium. The show is the only local countdown show of any kind here in Springfield.

WLVY/Elmira-Corning, NY PD Mike Stobel

How, if at all, will you deal with holiday music?

We'll start the Christmas tunes Nov. 26, the day of Elmira's Christmas parade downtown. We cobroadcast with our local NBC affiliate. We'll start slowly, one holiday song every two hours. Around Dec. 6 we'll up the Christmas music to one per hour, with Mariah's "All I Want for Christmas" in a regular medium rotation. I'm working with our consultant. Ed Lacomb, to see which holiday music is appropriate.

Are you planning any special promotions, concerts, hot toy giveaways or fund-raisers?

We'll have a Breakfast With Santa at our local mall in December that gives toys to 500 underprivileged kids ages zero to 10. Of course, we'll do our annual Christmas cash giveaway, with \$94.30 (our frequency is 94.3) three times every day and \$943 every Thursday, and also \$50 shopping spree gift certificates for the local mall on Thursdays. And if that's not enough, we'll give everyone lots of chances to win Pokémon items.

What are your plans for New Year's Eve

1999? Will you have countdown shows or other special programming?

We're working on a limo, dinner, hotel and pairs of tickets to five lucky winners to see Barenaked Ladies live New Year's Eve in Buffalo, NY.



How, if at all, will you deal with holiday music?

As far as special programming is concerned, we'll start Christmas music about three weeks out with the novelty stuff and start getting more traditional as we get closer. Christmas Eve and Christmas Day it's The 24 Hours of Christmas. Part of it is being supplied by Kris Erik Stevens and The Magic of Christmas and by the Rick Dees Christmas special. The rest is filled in by local jocks.

Another thing we do is try to find out what the hot toys are going to be, and then get some - not to give away on the air, but to donate to the children's wards at the three local hospitals. This is not something that we promote on-air, but it's something we've done for the past five years.

Are you planning any special promotions, concerts, hot toy giveaways or fund-raisers?

For the fourth year in a row we are teaming up with the Salvation Army and the local ABC affiliate for the "Angel Tree." We'll be setting up Christmas trees throughout west Michigan and encouraging our listeners to come by the trees and pick up special tags that list the age and sex of kids who need toys or presents for Christmas. The listener goes out and buys a present for that girl or boy and brings it back to the tree for collection. The week before Christmas we have parties for the kids to distribute the toys. All toys donated stay in west Michigan.

What are your plans for New Year's Eve 1999? Will you have countdown shows or other special programming?

Our big party is actually the day before. Many people who would normally go out on that day have to work because of Y2K, so we're going to party the day before. We'll still have the New Year's Eve party, but almost as an afterthought. We'll be doing the top 103 of 1999 and also the top 103 of the decade, along with the traditional "History of Rock ... On a Roll," a music montage with hooks from every No. 1 song since the beginning of rock history.

KDND/Sacramento PD Steve Weed How, if at all, will you deal with holiday music?

There's not a great wealth of formatically correct holiday songs, but we manage to put together a short list. Typically, we'll hit 'em the day after Thanksgiving for the "official" start of the holiday season, then back off until we get closer to Christmas. The last 10 days we'll ramp up the frequency from one a daypart to one an hour.

What are your plans for New Year's Eve 1999? Will you have countdown shows or other special programming?

Our primary focus will be the Jingle Ball concert on Dec. 19, starring Smash Mouth, LFO, Christina Aguilera and several other bands. Secondary promotions and cash contesting will fill out the rest of the time.

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Urban: The Format That Keeps Giving

More new music releases for Q4 '99 and Q1 2000

S o many record labels, so little space. Last week's New Music Guide contained only a sampling of the many interviews we conducted regarding the new music of the fourth quarter of 1999 and the first quarter of 2000. This week, we complete the task.

As the holiday season creeps up, it's hard to believe that the year 2000 is just around the corner. Though the record labels all but close down for the last two weeks of December, their music release schedules have all been set (though not in stone). In part two of the new Urban music releases, we roll out the last, but certainly not the least, of the information we gathered.

James Boyce, Universal VP/ Promotions, R&B

R&R: What releases do you have forthcoming?

Lil' Wayne, Juvenile, Rakim and the *Essence Men: Soundtrack to Romance* compilation (a joint venture with *Essence* magazine).

R&R: What is the outlook for each of these artists?

Juvenile — another multiplatinum hit; Rakim — gold and better; *Essence* this is more of a build project, because it is a compilation, so that's more of a longterm project than short-term; and Lil' Wayne — again. a multiplatinum project. **R&R:** What do you think of the tech-

nological trends in music?

I think there are some great advances in terms of technology that can aid in what we do on a day-to-day basis, but I would not use that technology as a means to a final decision — it's not the be-all and end-all.

Cynthia Harris, Columbia

R&R: What new releases do you have forthcoming?

Mariah Carey on Nov. 2, Marc Nelson on Nov. 9, Will Smith on Nov. 16, Nas on Nov. 23 and Jagged Edge on Jan. 4. **R&R:** What is the outlook for each of

these artists? We have very high expectations. Marc Nelson is a success story in himself. He's been working his butt off. Marian Darey

has already solc over 100 million albums. Based on the information from our sales team, the kinds of requests they're getting at retail are surpassing the requests they got on her previous album. This should be a really big album for her. We expect big things from the Will Smith project we've got huge launches for both Will and Mariah. Jagged Edge's single, "He Can't Love U," is a favorite with radio. We should see it increase in rotation. I think that's going to be a big one too.

R&R: What do you think of the technological trends in music?

We've been introduced to a whole new technology that didn't exist 10 years ago. I think it will always have an impact on what we do, because the customer will dictate how w = do business. So if that's the way we can get to the customers, then that's what we're going to have to do. We're going to have to be very consumer-

oriented and consumer-driven in order to succeed.

Richard Nash,

Elektra SVP/Promotions R&R: What new releases do you have forthcoming?

Mint Condition, the Light It Up soundtrack — which is a Yab Yum/ Elektra release — Gerald Levert, Beverly (a new artist on Yab Yum), Rah Digga and Gina Thompson.

R&R: What is the outlook for each of these artists?

This is Mint Condition's first release on Elektra and their first release in a few years. The single is already developing very strongly at radio, and our outlook is very positive. We're expecting this to be one of their strongest albums.

Light It Up is a Fox movie, a Tracey and Kenny Edmonds Production. With the early indications that are coming back from the movie, which have been very positive, and with so much of the music on the soundtrack, we anticipate that this will be one of the strongest soundtracks of the year. It's got a number of talented artists like Ja Rule, Master P, DMX, Beanie Sigel, 112, 'N Sync, Amil & Solé and Jon B., so this soundtrack is definitely loaded with platinum-selling artists, and we're expecting it to really get in and perform strongly for us, to be one of the topselling soundtracks.

Gerald Levert has continued to demonstrate and to prove from album to album that he has consistently put together hitoriented material that sells very, very well within his core base. The new artist from the Carolinas, Beverly, is a developing new female. That's a work in progress. We're getting some great feedback, and we're expecting strong numbers from that. There's an incredible street buzz on Rah Digga, out of the Flip Mode Camp. Gina Thompson's first single, "Ya Di Ya," did OK, but the second single really showcases her vocal ability and will expose her as an artist. Of course, we're also working diligently on the Missy Elliott, Silk and Ol' Dirty Bastard projects.

R&R: What do you think of the technological trends in music?

I think it's going to help us go out and capture the consumer and build those consumers into loyal music purchasers. Technology is going to continue to grow, and it's going to be very exciting how we're going to be able to use it to market and develop our new acts.

Rodney Shealey, Epic Records

Group VP/Promotions R&R: What new releases do you have forthcoming?

Amel Larrieux, Ghostface, TQ, So Plush and Cam'ron.

R&R: What is the outlook for each of these artists?

Our intentions are to break our new and developing acts. Arnel's an artist, the former lead singer of Groove Theory. Our goal for her is to create a huge fan base that will be around for five, six or even 10 years. We want to take what Groove Theory did and raise it to the next level.

With Cam'ron, we want to capitalize on the original base that he had. He did almost 700,000 on his first album. We want to establish him back at radio as a street-credible artist, but also as a mainstream artist, because he had a mainstream hit with "Horse & Carriage." Ghostface is Ghostface. Wu-Tang. He's the kind of artist who can move large numbers of units, and it's not really about radio; he's about the street vibe. It's about visibility. He's one of the key members of Wu-Tang.

With TQ, again we want to capitalize on the original base that we've done. We did about 200,000 on his first album. I think his name is known. The marketplaces where he does really well are Louisiana and Texas, all through that area. I think we established him a lot with *Westside*. Some of our artists that are coming out are sophomore projects. We've laid the base, now we have to capitalize on that base.

R&R: What do you think of the technological trends in music?

I think change is inevitable, and it's the only thing that's constant in life. It could be our enemy, it could be our best friend. I plan to progress along with progress; I don't plan to sit back and bitch about it. It's detrimental to us if we don't involve ourselves. I'm not afraid of it, I welcome it — just as long as it doesn't put me out of work.

Sandra Sullivan, Motown

VP/Urban Promotions R&R: What new releases do you have forthcoming?

For the first quarter of 2000 we have Dwayne Wiggins and Erykah Badu. For fourth quarter '99, Brian McKnight and Chico DeBarge.

R&R: What is the outlook for each of these artists?

Brian is already certified platinum. Chico DeBarge we expect to be a platinum album as well. What can'we say? Obviously we think Erykah Badu is going to be quadruple-platinum, if not 5 million. For Dwayne Wiggins, our expectations are at least gold.

R&R: What do you think of the technological trends in music?

I think it's a consumer-friendly environment. I think it's going to work well. All the industry needs to do is get on board and not get left out. This technology is here to stay; it's a part of our future. I don't think it's going to be a negative thing for the industry. Scarface is coming in the first quarter. Rap-A-Lot is back over here now. Also on that label, Willy D. Youngbleed is tentative, and the Three Strikes soundtrack will be released. There's the Thicker Than Water soundtrack, which stars Mack 10 and Fat Joe.

R&R: What is the outlook for each of these artists?

With the Next Friday soundtrack. we'd like to pick up the momentum of what we got on the first Friday soundtrack, and we expect it to be an incredibly successful project. It has numerous artists people are already familiar with and a wide array of fans. For Master P's album, we expect the same success he's achieved. This project has him collaborating with Nas and Jermaine Dupree and the No Limit family. At least another double platinum out of Master P. The 504 Boys has been a long-awaited album. It's the first time these three guys have gotten together and done a whole album, and each is a platinum artist. Ice Cube has an incredible project where he used a variety of producers to come from a different angle. This should be one of the biggest rap albums this year. Scarface is a multiplatinum artist, and we expect that to continue over here at Priority. Lil'

Zane (who was featured on 112's "Anywhere"), we expect to be a huge star, accepted by both males and females. His album should be a super album for us and a great start to Worldwide Entertainment. **R&R:** What do you think of the technological trends in music?

I think it goes with everything else in the millennium. In a lot of ways, I think it makes it a lot easier to locate information. You just have to be innovative and use technology to your advantage. The companies that are slow to make changes will be hurt.

A new artist, Mike E., in early 2000. He's an incredible vocalist. His first song is produced by Teddy Riley. Mike E's a singer/songwriter, and he's going to be the next big thing. And then there's the 12year-old child prodigy Sammie, out of Miami by way of the Freeworld camp (Dallas Austin's label). He's won Showtime at the Apollo three times in a row. And with radio changing — though it will.always be our No. 1 way of getting music to people — other delivery systems are important, because people are not so set in just one way of entertaining themselves or getting their information.

Between the continuous support of Howard Stern, Mancow and many, many other DJs. I think the new Red Peters will far surpass his first album sales. His website has received well over a million hits!

R&R: What do you think of the technological trends in music?

The music/computer wave will continue to open a lot of new doors and most likely close some. That part still needs to be done firsthand.

t's weird. KKBT/L.A. programming assistant Fabian asked me if I was going to the party for Virgin's Kelis on Tuesday (11/9). I said I wasn't invited, and made a mental note to kick Brian Samson's arse. Then I called Brian, who invited me to the function. I didn't know who this artist was, but I was grateful to be invited somewhere. From that moment on, I heard "Kelis this" and "Kelis that" from different industry acquaintances. I wasn't able to make the party, but Kelis did stop by R&R on Thursday (11/11). I didn't get a chance to converse with this very colorful woman, because we were having an editorial meeting around the time she stopped by, but once I got back to my desk, I was thinking that I had to know what all the hoopla was about, so I popped in the single "Caught Out There."

I'm feelin' the message this 19-year-old Harlem native is delivering. With her strong voice and dominating attitude, she is definitely



making a statement. Heavily influenced by her dad, who is a director of Jazzmobile, this graduate of La Guardia High School for Music, Art and the Performing Arts has music in her veins. Backed by her production team, The Neptunes, Kelis storms onto the scene with a single that will have a lot of females chanting and a lot of males watching their backs.

"I hate you so much right now!" yells Kelis. Singing about a relationship gone bad, Kelis says all the words that females in similar situations have either said to their mates - or have wanted to say, but opted for the sugar-in-the-gas-tank therapeutic exercise instead. (Hey, it works. It has a cleansing effect on the spirit.) Sista girl starts off singing about all the things she did for dude, then how she found out dude wasn't solely her man. She talks about how she cared for him when he was sick and even provided an oral massage to a certain body part, and all the while dude was sharing his love (and body part) with someone else! He keeps telling homegirl that he loves her - he swears he loves her - yet there are nights when he doesn't come home. (What is that, love from afar?) Then homegirl sees the other female, and damn! She ain't all that. (Actually, she ain't none of that!)

"Caught Out There" is a woman's song. It's straight to the point, angry and real. The epidemic of infidelity has gone on since the beginning of time, yet Kelis' performance shows a different side to the trauma. No "crying till you can't cry any more" or thoughts of suicide are even insinuated in this song. Kelis is just trying to convince you - the dissed female - to get out of the situation. If your man is "caught out there," leave his arse out there and move on. Peace

Swooping out of the sky with a bright green chronic leaf on his chest, the Black Superman is back on the scene with the most anticipated album of the year, 2001. Regaining Lost Respect

Tracy Lawrence speaks openly about life, love and the pursuit of music

first met **Tracy Lawrence** 10 years ago, when he came through our front door on Music Row, looking for a copy of **R&R**. He had just signed with Atlantic, but had yet to begin showcasing for radio and was still a few months away from releasing his first single.

Since then, Lawrence has become a friend. And I have to admit, I felt a great deal of anguish when he ran afoul of both the law and moral sensibilities several times over the last few years. Those scrapes have been wellreported: Shooting a gun while driving down an interstate highway after another motorist made an obscene gesture. Being interrogated by the police after a couple invited him to witness their rape fantasy outside a hotel. And then there was the physical altercation in Las Vegas between Lawrence and his now ex-wife, Stacy.

About a month ago, before the release of his current single, we sat down for an exclusive, extensive, no-questions-barred conversation about all of the things that have brought a man who was once one of Country's brightest stars to the point of battling for his professional survival. I found him to be at once sincere, contrite, confident and passionate.

R&R: Why are you doing this interview now?

TL: I think people want to know what my state of mind is and where I'm at in my life after all that's gone on the last few years. They need to see that the old Tracy — the guy who was very focused and very passionate about his music, who was very dedicated to being a good role model and an inspiration to other people —

has gotten his life back on track. That's what I want to project to people.

R&R: You've been taking your new music to radio stations around the country. What are PDs and MDs saying to you?

TL: They just want to sit down with me and see where my head is at and see that I've really overcome a lot of obstacles and learned from the things that have happened to me. They really just want to know that I'm OK. They want to look me in the eyes and see that I've gotten my life back together and that I'm healthy. They're interested in hearing the things that I'm writing and in knowing where my mind is at and that I've really gotten myself grounded again. I haven't been put in an uncomfortable situation by anyone thus far.

R&R: What's been the hardest thing about all you've gone through?

TL: To lose the respect of my peers and the people in the industry. The fans don't really know

All they know is what they read in the tabloids. But the true test of an individual is to see how he overcomes the obstacles and gets his life back on track. Hopefully, that will speak louder than any of the mistakes I've made in the past.

R&R: What do you think it will take to regain the respect of your contemporaries and of radio?

TL: Time. And it will be about working hard and establishing myself, letting people know that I want to be a respected part of this indus-

try. There are a lot of misconceptions about me as an artist and as a person. There have been a lot of things that have happened to me over the past several years. I don't want to wallow in them; I don't want to talk about this person or that person. I've made a lot of mistakes. I want to learn from the mistakes I've made and never let them happen again. I want to be a good influence, and I want to be a good role model.

I was very young when my career exploded. I went through lots of ups and downs. You get smothered by the people around you, and you get on the wrong road. You make some bad decisions. You don't know how difficult it is to hold your head up and walk down the streets of Music Row after you've been through some of the things I have.

I don't expect people to just take me back with open arms. I want to be a respected, functioning and integral part of this business. I want to be a working part of this industry, outside of just being an artist. I want to contribute my time and energies to making this a strong industry again.

R&R: Right or wrong, an artist's personal life has an incredible impact on his or her professional life. Have you been as careful with that as you should have been?

TL: It's not the kind of job that you can go home and leave on the doorstep and have a personal life. It's not just a job, it's a life. That's something I've always known. It's just that in the past I haven't wanted there to be a separation. I wanted to be completely consumed by it. I wanted to be a manager. I wanted to run a record label, produce and write.

I was capable of doing all of them to a certain degree, but nobody can handle everything. And I've learned that if I'm going to be happy and have a level demeanor and the patience I need to function effectively and be the artist I want to be, all of these other things don't do anything but add pressure on me.

I can't be the guy making deals and playing hardball with record labels and still be the happy-golucky artist making creative music. The two parts of the brain don't work together that way. Trying to do both limited my songwriting, added frustration to my life and kept me off-balance. All the pressure that comes with that was sometimes overwhelming.

R&R: It sounds like it was hard to keep the two separate.

TL: To me there was no separation between personal and professional. When I went home, I couldn't take the cowboy hat off and be a different guy. Sometimes you can't see the personal issues coming. My problem was that I tried to deal with my personal life and conquer it like it was a business deal. I thought that I could control everything around me. I guess it was a power trip or whatever. I wanted to be able to deal with everything, and you can't deal with matters of the heart like a contract negotiation. I now have a wonderful woman at home, and I'm a much more tender and sensitive person.

R&R: From the first time I met you, I thought you were a very bright, creative guy. But I would hear about some of the things you did and just couldn't figure out how you made such bad decisions. Bright, creative people just don't do some of the things you did.

TL: After evaluating all those things and looking back at all the stupid things I did, I can see now that I was letting anger or hostility build up as things were getting too much for me, and I would explode. I've had to learn how to communicate before I get to that boiling point. I would hold it in and hold it in until I'd just "boom," because I wasn't able to deal with all the pressures.

What I've realized out of all those mistakes is how to identify what those problem areas are. I'm learning how to control that anger and keep it under wraps by removing the elements that cause me frustration in life — like trying to be a businessman at 25 and dealing with guys who have been in this business for 30 years.

I'm learning that the most important thing in life, more so than this career, is to have a family and a home life that are stable and solid and to have somebody to lean on and cry on when I have those bad days, instead of going home and wanting to blame it on somebody else. I've made that more of a priority in my life now. It's given me greater peace, and it's helped me stay level without the extreme mood swings. It took me a long time to learn that. I'd been running wide open, working seven days a week for months and trying to please everybody until I'd just do something stupid.

R&R: You became a big star in a short time. Has being out of the spotlight for the last couple of years been tough?

TL: I've really enjoyed the down time. I've continued to do my road dates, and I've continued to work. It gave me a lot of time to think about the mistakes I've made and about what I've done in my life. I can't really say that I regret a lot of the things that I've done. We all wish that we could go back and change things.

You don't know how difficult it is to have confidence in a relationship because you never know what somebody's after. The one good thing to come from all this is that I've finally found somebody who loves me. I know with all my heart that she loves me for me, because when we became involved. I was at the bottom. I had my legs knocked out from under me. Financially, I've been struggling for a while. I really had to work at getting my life back on track without all the bells and whistles and my name on the marguee.

That's become less important to me. I've found somebody whose relationship I really treasure. We don't fight, and we don't argue. We don't have the distractions and people coming between us like I used to. I don't allow people to get involved with my personal life anymore. I don't let my employees meddle in my personal life. I don't discuss it with them. If she and I have a disagreement about something, we work it out between ourselves. I used to get mad, get on the bus and say, "You won't believe what she did." Then they get you more stirred up, and it just feeds off itself. I've really learned to separate my personal life and my business.

R&R: *I* notice you're wearing a wedding ring.

TL: Yes, but I'm not married. We have made a strong commitment to each other, but I can't put my name on another piece of paper, not right now. When you go through a divorce, something happens. It changes you forever. It takes a piece of you away. But our relationship is very strong. I have complete faith in her, and she does in me. Why do I need a piece of paper to tell me that? We made our bond with each other and with our maker. I don't need some contrived contract to make it what it is.

R&R: Lessons Learned is a very personal album. I'm not sure I'd talk to my best friend about some of the stupid things I've done

in my past, let alone record them and do interviews about it. Why put yourself through this?

TL: Because I love this business, and I love what I do for a living. I'm not just doing it to make money. After all the hits I've had and the financial ups and downs, I could back out of trying to be a star again and just do a few dates and not worry about the pressure or the politics anymore, but I want to be respected by my peers. If I don't get my life back on track and don't regain that, I'm never going to be satisfied with myself.

R&R: So interviews are part of the process of regaining lost respect?

TL: I think so. If I'm going to ask people to give me another chance, I have to be very candid about what I've been through.

R&R: What would you say to those people who've played your music and supported your career through the years? What do you want to get across to them as you seek to regain their respect?

TL: I guess that the hardest lessons one learns in life are the most important. My 30s are going to be some of the most incredible years of my life. I've cut some great music. I'm at a point now where I've got a lot to say. I want to make music that is going to touch people's lives. As tough as things have been, how can you write and sing songs about things if you haven't been through them? It has broadened my perspective and given me a lot more that I can communicate to my fans and the rest of the world.

I believe the Lord doesn't do anything without a purpose. He has to have allowed me to put myself through this for some good reason. He had to believe I'd come out of it and grow to be a better human being, because God has given me the talents, and I don't think he would have done that without a divine purpose.

R&R: Reflecting on some of the things you've done that you've said you're sorry for, do you think you adequately addressed those issues at the time they arose?

TL: I think I did, to the best of my ability. I just think a lot of people weren't ready to hear it. I think it has to be readdressed now.

R&R: You shot a gun from a car on a freeway in Nashville and witnessed a husband-and-wife fake rape scene while you were on the road, but the physical incident with your ex-wife, Stacy, was much more serious. Did you ever consider that, because of those mistakes, all the things you had worked for all those years might be over? TL: Yes. But I really believe in myself as an artist and a singer-songwriter.

R&R: Is this about that? No one has ever questioned your talents as a singer or songwriter, but isn't this about you as a person?

TL: Yes, it is. And you can look at a lot of people in this business who I consider to be living legends, and all of them are very open and candid about the mistakes they've made. They've been able to talk about their mistakes and overcome them. The only way you limit yourself from overcoming adversity in life is to deny it

R&R: How do you feel about this kind of public mea culpa?

TL: If I didn't love this business so much, I wouldn't be doing it. I have that much passion for it. When I came to Nashville, I came here to live the rest of my life. I have no desire to go anywhere else. I was born to make music, no matter how successful it becomes. I have an obligation to myself to do the very best that I can and to achieve as much as I can in my life.

R&R: What are some of the steps you've taken to get to the point of speaking publicly about your past?

TL: Initially I had to accept who I was as a person. I had to get extremely humble and really do a lot of soul-searching and reflecting. I had to learn to like myself again, because I went through several months where I didn't. I was very ashamed of myself and didn't like the person I'd become. I became very reclusive. I had to rebuild my personal life first.

R&R: Did you seek any professional help?

TL: I saw a therapist for a while. I started going to church regularly, reading the Bible and praying a whole lot — trying to wrestle those things to the ground. I went through a lengthy process of rebuilding myself. The first step for me was going back home to Arkansas for several months. I needed to reconnect with the people who really knew who I was. That was a very important step in getting my life together. I had to go home. I wasn't strong enough to do it here.

R&R: There seems to be a very real difference in people's minds between sex, drugs or other problems people get into and violence between a man and a woman. That's something people just don't accept.

TL: I think that's true. But I don't believe it's something that can't be overcome. The situation was made much worse in the press than it was. made was letting myself be put in the position to get provoked to that point. I don't want to blame either side. I did it; I have to accept that. I deeply regret that I hurt her emotionally and physically, and it's something that I never want to allow myself to be in a position to do again. I won't allow it to happen.

R&R: You deal with a lot of women — PDs and MDs who make decisions about playing your music, women at your label who promote your records, etc.

TL: I work with a lot of women. The people who know me know the way I interact with women, how I carry myself, the things that I do. It was a mistake I made, and I've learned my lesson.

It may take a long time for me to sit down one on one with radio people across the country, but we'll deal with it one issue at a time. I believe there isn't anything we can't overcome, because I'm that dedicated to regaining the respect of the industry. It's that important to me.

R&R: I think Lessons Learned is an excellent album. What if, despite that, it's not accepted by programmers because of the past problems in your personal life?

TL: I've put a lot of passion into this album. I really opened myself up and put a lot of my heart and soul into this record. If it's not a huge blockbuster success, I'll cut another record. What else am I going to do? This is what I do for a living. I'll put just as much passion into the next one. And if it doesn't do well, then I'll cut another one, and so on and so forth.

I'm not going to stop. I love music more than anything else. I'm still going to cut my music with just as much passion and dedication if it takes five or 10 years. One way or another I'm going to be playing music somewhere. The best part about it is that I'm happy at home. The rest of it's irrelevant.

R&R: You could have just let the music do the talking.

TL: Hiding behind the music I make isn't going to regain the re-

spect from my peers. It will be a slow process, but this is very important to me. For me to be able to do this and do it the right way, I have to have total conviction about it, be at peace with myself and accept myself totally. I've never been the kind of artist you can hype around. I can't have myself projected to be a person I'm not.

R&R: It sounds like this has been difficult.

TL: It's been very painful. People who I thought really believed in me and knew me have turned their backs on me, but that's all right. I understand, because I will rise up and be a stronger, better human being out of it down the road.

R&R: I'm sure you understand, even though it would be hard for everybody who likes you and wants you to come back, that if there is one more serious mistake, it's probably over for good.

TL: This is not something I can take lightly. If I get another chance and another opportunity, I have to take it very seriously and do it the right way, because I know it is the last shot. It's a very humbling experience.

I've learned my lessons, and I won't let down those who believe in me again. I'll do the very best that I can. Do you know how important that is to a person, to have the belief and the confidence of people around you that when you give your word, they can take it to the bank? It's not about signing a contract or about going in and taking every nickel you can from people or about having a fat bank account; it's about people and having the respect of your peers and the people in the industry who stuck their necks on the line for you. There's nothing more important than being there for people who've been there for you.



With a swift crack of the bat, Mercury artist Shane Minor blasted four pounds of ostrichegg yolk all over the infield (and himself) during a softball game vs. KNCI/Sacramento listeners. 





A Backward Look At A Classic

Rob Durkee's new book chronicles the history of American Top 40

ounds simple enough: Take the most popular songs in the country, play them in reverse order with the most popular one played last, sprinkle in some fun facts and figures about the songs and artists, and tie it all together with a great-sounding host.

Well, Einstein, if you'd come up with that concept about 30 years ago, you might be rolling in dough today.

With under 10 affiliates, a little show called American Top 40 debuted in 1970 on the July 4th weekend, and it has been making an incredible impact ever since. Reports of the show's death in January 1995 proved to be greatly exaggerated, as originator/host Casey Kasem brought it back to life three years later, and it's still going strong for AMFM.

Former AT 40 staffer/first-time author Rob Durkee has gathered many people's recollections of the countdown show for Schirmer Books. Durkee was hired to work on the show in April '89, eight months after Kasem was replaced in the host's chair by Shadoe Stevens.

For the past five years the 53-year-old Durkee has been Oldies Format Coordinator for Premiere Radio's Mediabase Research. His American Top 40: The Countdown of the Century hit stores last month and offers up some interesting details about the show that, as Casey would say, "doesn't stop till we reach the top."

In this interview with Durkee we reflect on a simple yet classic radio gem heard from Baltimore to Bakersfield and from Battle Creek to Baton Rouge.

R&R: How long did the book take to complete?

RD: I did about 100 interviews, and the process lasted about four years. My contract called for 100,000 words, and after adding up everything, I'd written 200,000. I obviously had to do a lot of cutting.

R&R: What aid you want to accomplish? What was your motivation? RD: I tried to write this book for ev-

eryone, not just those in the radio industry. It's something that says a lot about radio.

American Top 40 is an American radio institution. and I wanted to tell the story of what I feel is radio's greatest show. To the best of my knowledge, no other radio show in history has had more lis-**Rob Durkee** teners. I wanted to

illustrate how it went from seven stations in 1970 to 180 stations a year later, and how it became the most popular radio show in the world by the late '70s and early '80s

I worked for the show for most of the Shadoe years and was very lucky to be there for what everybody thought would be the last show ever. It was a party-like atmosphere. Ron Jacobs was one of the very key people involved when the show began. He was there for the first tracking and for what everyone thought would be the last one. During that final tracking Ron suddenly walked into Shadoe's studio to shake his hand. I was very touched by that moment, and it made me want to write a book about the show.

R&R: What was your role at American Top 40?

RD: I was chief statistician and a staff writer. I did interviews and human interest - as well as chart - stories. I was the person who would come up with unique statistics.

R&R: Such as?

RD: Seal is a one-name artist who made it on the chart, and his name is also that of an animal. You'd think that couldn't possibly have happened before, but it did, with Lobo's "Me and You and a Dog Named Boo."

There's also been an instance where both the artist - ABBA - and song title - S.O.S. - are palindromes. Those are the kind of things you come up with.

R&R: What trivia can you tell us about the show's guest hosts?

RD: The list is a real honor roll. From March 1980 through early 1988 Charlie Van Dyke sat in about 31 times --- more than any other substitute host. Mark Elliott guest-hosted five or six times; Gary Owens did it once in 1981; and Wink Martindale guest-hosted in 1975. Joe Cipriano is the only person to have filled in for both Casey and Shadoe.

R&R: In fact, one famous guest host made a profound change in the show's logistics.

RD: When AT 40 began, they tracked

everything at once. Casey would intro a record, and you had to hear the entire record. They didn't know any other way. Dick Clark sat in for Casey one week. When they said what they needed, he told them to edit in the voice tracks. After they'd been doing the show for 18 months, Dick convinced them to stop doing things in real time.

R&R: Who are some of the people you interviewed for the book?

RD: I talked with Casey in July '95, and he was stellar. The fact that he understood what I was trying to do was very important. Everyone opened up their hearts and answered my questions.

R&R: The topic of the infamous "long-distance dead dog dedication" tape must have come up in your interview with Casey. Many people have

heard those outtakes. How does he feel about what he said?

RD: He's extremely philosophical about it. He felt he had to make a tough transition from an up-tempo record to a serious long-distance dedication. He had previously mentioned how difficult this was and got the feeling he was being ignored.

The person who usually planned the show, Matt Wilson, was on vacation that week. Casey has admitted that he lost his temper that day. He doesn't condone what he said, but it happened. He's human, and it hasn't hurt his career.

By the way, the long-distance dedication song he was leading up to was Pointer Sisters' "Dare Me" was the uptempo record that upset him.

R&R: How good-natured is he when people parody his voice?

RD: He liked my imitation.

R&R: There's an incident in the

book involving an early '80s meeting between ABC executives and KIIS/Los Angeles' then VP/GM Wally Clark. What happened there?

RD: They told Wally in so many words that the station was carrying the show, but not running the ads. He said that KIIS was so successful that he couldn't play all the commercials. He said that he'd run half the ads and ABC would still make money, but the network told Wally it was all or nothing.

ABC took Casey off KIIS, leaving the station with four programming hours to fill. Someone suggested that [KIIS morning man] Rick Dees do a countdown show to fill the time.

R&R: That would prove to be a bit of an irony several years later.

RD: Three days before the Nicole Simpson/Ron Goldman murders [summer '94] we were told that AT 40 would be taken off the air in the United States. The show wasn't making money, and ABC replaced it with one that was, a countdown show done by Rick Dees.

R&R: What was the affiliate reaction to the Casey-to-Shadoe transition?

RD: It wasn't fair to compare the two. Casey is the warm-sounding, friendly guy - the communicator. Shadoe is the laid-back, hip, cool guy with a neat sense of humor.

Casey didn't do any counting down from August '88 until the third weekend of '89, when Casey's Top 40 started on Westwood One. He was being paid by ABC to not count down. They wanted to give Shadoe some momentum. In the last half of '88 and the first half of '89 a good number of stations dropped American Top 40 in favor of carrying Casey.

I was told it was very hard to sell American Top 40 to major markets. That was the first exodus of stations, and there were two others. In September '94 Armed Forces Radio dropped the show.

R&R: How and why did Casey get away from ABC?

RD: In late '86 Casey asked to renegotiate his contract. They told him they would talk, but they put him off. Aaron Daniels was the main ABC executive who did the negotiations, and he insists that he doesn't remember putting off Casey. But the bottom line was, that's how Casey felt, and he started shopping around.

He was making about \$1.2 million a year at the time. Norm Pattiz coveted Casey and found out through the grapevine that he was looking. Westwood One was growing, but needed a name person. There was suddenly a Westwood One Henry Gross' "Shannon," and The & offer on the table to Casey for essentially five years and \$15 million. But Casey didn't want to leave ABC. He lowered his demands considerably, and they said no. It was a tough decision, but Casey left because he was wanted by Westwood One. When he kicked off Casey's Top 40, the average listener thought it was still American Top 40.

R&R: What led to Casey's departure from Westwood One?

RD: He discovered that Westwood One was not abiding by a very key term of the contract. Casey's three shows -Casey's Top 40, Casey's Countdown and Casey's Hot 20 - had to generate \$6 million in revenue, and they didn't. Apparently, if that didn't happen, either side could void the whole deal. Casey left and signed with AMFM and brought back AT 40 in March '98.

R&R: What was it like writing for Shadoe?

RD: It was a little difficult for me, but I eventually got it. When American Top 40 died, Shadoe was outspoken in at least two ways. He said his personality was stripped from him. They wouldn't let him use many fancy words. They almost eliminated them entirely. After back-announcing a record, he might make a joke, quip or observation, but it would be edited out.

They also edited Shadoe's natural pauses. The idea was to give the show a quicker pace. One of Shadoe's closest friends said it drove him nuts. Shadoe was quite emphatic about that and the lack of network support, particularly in the last few years he did the show. He's very happy now with his production company. He also thinks it's great that the show is back with Casey as host. In general, I think the record industry feels the same way.

R&R: Did the average listener know the difference between American Top 40 and Casey's Top 40?

RD: Most people don't know that AT 40 died, because they heard Casey do it on Westwood One. It's more a case of the radio industry knowing that the granddaddy of all countdowns is back.

If ABC did nothing with AT 40 for two years after the final January '95 broadcast, the show would go back to Casey and Don Bustany. They'd regain the show's complete rights: In February '97 the ownership of the show went back to Casey and Don, and Casey took advantage of that a year later.

R&R: What thought was given to adding a separate AC version?

RD: I was told there were issues involved in an AC show, like paying Shadoe more money and the expense involving engineers. Shadoe told me he would've been willing to do it, but it just never happened.

A very key factor in the mid-'90s downfall of the show was the failure to give Shadoe an AC version. The cofounder of the show, Don Bustany, said it was bad management. He said their biggest mistake was the failure to sign Casey. He also said they should've had an AC version of the show.







It's Still Cool, It's Still Hot

Interep study proves once again that our listeners are exceptionally upscale and a prime demographic

tellar ratings insure tremendous profitability for many NAC/Smooth Jazz radio stations. But even stations that aren't earning such staggering numbers can pitch the format's highly desirable qualitative and demographic aspects to their clients for lucrative results. This week Interep Research Dir./Mktg. Communications Michelle Skettino outlines her most recent findings.

Skettino, who has crafted the creme de la creme of format studies for Interep over the past six

years, parsed Simmons data based on spring 1999 overall cume for adults 18+. And she's as enthusiastic about NAC/Smooth Jazz as ever. "It continues to rival the traditional upscale format leaders Classical, all-News and News/Talk — and it does so with a median age about seven years younger than the others," Skettino begins. "This is a great sell-

ing point for the format: NAC/ Smooth Jazz is one of the few formats that offers an exceptionally upscale qualitative profile and a prime demographic skew."

Some Changes

However, it seems that NAC/ Smooth Jazz's core has not attracted the younger end as well as it has in the past. "The format does appear to be getting older, but, in my opin-ion, not to its detriment." Skettino says. "In the spring 1997 Simmons report the median age for NAC/ Smooth Jazz was 36.1 years, compared to 40.1 years for 1999. With its core listening in the 35-44 age cell, it is still a very viable format to deliver the upper end of 18-49 buys, the younger end of 35-64 buys and the meat and potatoes of the 25-54 demographic. It's a baby boomer oasis: NAC/SJ has the second-highest concentration of 35-54-year-old consumers of all music formats, second only to Oldies. It is fourth overall, as Talk and Sports sneak into the mix."

The other big change for NAC/ Smooth Jazz appears to be a significant increase in African-American listeners experienced in the last 24 months. "A national comparison of ethnic composition from 1997 shows a 10% increase, from 19% to 29%, among African-American listeners over the past two years and a 10% decrease among white (non-Hispanic) listeners, from 65% to 55%. Of course, NAC/SJ stations in individual markets may skew higher or lower for African-American share of listening," Skettino says.

"The growing diversity within the format is truly something to

panic, Asian and African-American draw, it almost mirrors the image of the nation's metropolitan hubs. Few other formats, if any, can make the same claim. The only format that may even come close is CHR/Rhythmic in some markets, but of course that format has a younger skew and completely different qualitative profile. tive, that speaks for itself

Skettino says NAC/Smooth Jazz's audience demographic composition "continues to offer advertisers one of the most coveted demographic targets in radio. With core listeners positioned in the 35-

44 age group, this format is a demographic leader in all major demo consumer groups, including 18-49, 25-54 and 35-64 demos. The format also offers advertisers ethnically balanced audience delivery reflective of the demographic shifts occurring throughout the nation's metropolitan areas. A prime age skew, ethnic balance and one of the best qualitative profiles in radio are some of the features that have made the NAC/Smooth Jazz format a perennial favorite among a host of advertisers.

Additionally, NAC/Smooth Jazz reflects an almost equal male/ female listening balance: 53% are male, 47% female. When it comes to ethnic diversity, the NAC/SJ format is valuable real estate indeed: Although 55% of its listeners are white, compared to the U.S. population's ethnic balance, the format shows a very high concentration of blacks and Asians, along with listening from Hispanics. According to these percentages, blacks are more than twice as likely as the average adult to listen to NAC/ Smooth Jazz, and Asians also index almost double against the norm. Hispanics index at the national norm

In The Money

How affluent are NAC/Smooth Jazz listeners? "As always, they are well represented in the upperincome brackets," Skettino observes. "With 22% living in households with annual incomes over \$100,000, they are 44% more likely than the average adult to live in these affluent homes. Listeners also index above the norm in educational and professional achievement, which usually accompanies above-average income levels. For instance, listeners are almost twice as likely as the average adult to hold a college degree and 84% more likely to work in a professional occupation.

"The slight majority of NAC/SJ listeners are married. One out of four have never been married, and about one in five is either divorced, separated or widowed. However, only 36% of listeners have children under 18 living at home. Childless households coupled with aboveaverage household incomes imply above-average levels of discretionary income.

Skettino says the research proves that NAC/Smooth Jazz listeners actively pursue the good life and spend lavishly to acquire its amenities. From their ownership of mu-

Something Special In The Air At WJZW

Creative direct mail piece contributes to ratings hike in DC



A highly targeted direct mail campaign can do much to increase a station's ratings, as one mounted recently by WJZW/Washington demonstrates. WJZW PD Kenny King and Point To Point Marketing President Mark Heiden explain

"Just executing the basics isn't always the key to success," says King. "In our constant quest to increase cume, the people of Washington see 'Smooth Jazz 105.9' on television, on the streets and in their mailboxes.

King looked at examples of Point To Point Marketing's past work, including a similar campaign for WNUA/Chicago with American Airlines, to see if they'd be good for his station. "We loved it!" King exclaims. "After we customized the design for 'JZW, we were 10 times more excited - it was a United Airlines envelope with our color logo on the front and simple how-to-play information and a postage-paid registration card inside. We included some compelling travel images, a list of exciting United destinations, and also found room to sell some of the most popular artists at the same time, all with the hope of driving cume and TSL for the station.

"We really liked the fact that the piece looked like actual airline tickets. It was different, but effectively sold the details of the promotion and created a classy image for the station. Then we used our crystal ball to find Arbitron-friendly homes and started licking stamps. We want to make it easy for people to register for our 'Trip A Day' giveaway, so we invited listeners to fax in their names or register as loyal listeners on our website. We're having a tremendous response to the promotion!"

Heiden, who has worked with many leading NAC/SJ stations - including WNUA, WJJZ/Philadelphia and KKSF/San Francisco - on marketing projects, adds, "The difficult thing about marketing the NAC/SJ format is that the artists aren't very visible on TV or in the mainstream press. If a station isn't spending money to extend the Smooth Jazz category, they'll be in trouble.

'The ultimate goal of this campaign, as with others doing Trip A Day, was to put a unique twist on it and make it interesting. Trip A Day is often used as a loss leader for the format. The marketing piece makes it possible for the unaware nonuser to connect with the station."

tual funds to their consumption of fine wines, this audience is an advertiser's dream come true. "Like most consumers with significant discretionary income, NAC/SJ listeners are above-average consumers of luxury products, travel, computers and entertainment. Whether an advertiser is selling a gourmet cup of coffee or a luxury automobile, the NAC/SJ audience is likely to be a potential buyer."

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
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NAC/Smooth Jazz Action



Congratulations to Brian Culbertson on two counts: His "Back in the Day" (Atlantic) goes to No. 1 this week, plus his brandnew track, "Get'n Over You," featuring the passionate vocal of Lori Perry, debuts at 29*.

Joyce Cooling is vigorously in pursuit of the top, as "Callie" (Heads Up) surges to 4* and is second Most Increased with +109 plays. She's followed closely by Bob James' "What's Up" (Warner Bros.), which increases 7-5*.

The week's prime mover is **David Benoit's** "Miles After Dark" (**GRP/VMG**), which catapults 17-11*/Breaker and is top Most Increased with +111 plays. This sultry addition to playlists everywhere is a confirmed hit.

Richard Elliot is off to an impressive start with his track "On the Fly" (**Blue Note**), which earned seven new adds — including those at KWJZ/Seattle and WJZF/Atlanta — and is tied for third Most Increased. Rotation increases (23 plays at WQCD/N.Y. and 16 at KTWV/L.A.) helped propel the track 29-24*.

Garnering 10 new adds in its first week, including KOAI/Dallas, JRN, WJZW/Washington, WNWV/Cleveland and KHIH/Denver, Norman Brown's "Paradise" (Warner Bros.) is Most Added and shows early indications that it may rival the success of "Out 'a Nowhere."

Walter Beasley's "Nice and Easy" (Shanachie) is also exhibiting strong out-ofthe-box interest. It benefits from eight adds, including those at WJZW, KHIH, WLOQ/Orlando and WSJT/Tampa.

Two new tracks that definitely merit your attention are **Brian Bromberg**'s "My Love" (Zebra) — a worthy follow-up to "September," which was one of this year's most valuable tracks — and Joe Sample's artful "The Song Lives On" (GRP/VMG).


Be on the lookout for a new CD from George Michael, Songs From the Last Century (Virgin/Aegean). It contains an unbelievably cool cover of "Roxanne" that is perfectly suited to NAC/SJ. Produced by Phil Ramone, Michael is at the peak of his vocal form here; I can't stop listening to it.



Kenny G "Auld Lang Syne (The Millennium Mix)" Arista

A single has never been reviewed in this space before, but an exception must be made for **Kenny G**'s "Auld Lang Syne" (Arista), which is as powerful a programming tool for the 1999 holidays as anything I've heard. From his new Christmas release, *Faith*, G's

version brings an emotional dimension to the mix by combining historical audio actualities with the perennial New Year's favorite. The voices of Martin Luther King, Winston Churchill, Muhammad Ali, Abbott & Costello, Marilyn Monroe, Bill Clinton and countless others spanning the era of sound recording prove an effective antidote to a track that's so saccharine, your teeth might ache without them. This 20th-century sonic collage will leave listeners breathless.

Instinct Records has built its considerable success by introducing numerous new artists to the NAC/Smooth Jazz scene. but, as Instinct co-President Gerald Helm explains here, the label found several compelling reasons to hook up with the veteran English group of



eral compelling reasons to hook RER'S EXCLUSIVE BAROMETER FOR NEW MUSIC up with the veteran English group **Shakatak**. Their new single, "Lovely Day," is on your desk now.

Shakatak are a four-piece band: Bill Sharpe on keyboards — he cnce did an electronic pop record with Gary Numan — Jill Saward on vocals, Foger Odell on drums and George Anderson on bass. They've had several big hits in Europe and in the U.S. over the past 20 years, including a big

hit with Al Jarreau, "Day by Day," in November 1985.

I became aware of them with their big breakthrough record, Perfect Smile, in 1990. I followed them for several years after that, but what really reminded me of Shakatak was when we did a jazz drum-and-bass record on our electronic side with Jimster, who is Roger Odell's son, Jamie. Putting that project together, I noticed in his bio that he was the son of Shakatak's drummer, and that got me thinking about the band. We got in touch with their U.K. label, Passion Music, and talked to them about putting Shakatak out in the U.S. Their first record for us, *Shine It On*, was composed of tracks

from four of their previous U.K.-only releases. *Magic* is all new material, and we worked very closely with the band — and Bill Sharpe, in particular — on it, even though we licensed it from Passion Music. There is a difference between the European market and the U.S.: The European market is much more open to the soulful, jazzy vocal pop that Shakatak is primarily known for. The instrumentals the band has been known for have been mainly spice tracks on a record rather than the main focus of what they've been doing.

On Magic they delivered the record they put together in the U.K., which was mostly vocals — the few instrumentals were too long and groove-oriented or club-oriented for here. I worked with Bill and Tony Campbell on the instrumentals "Drivin" and "Sundown," in addition to two songs they recorded from scratch for the U.S. only, Boz Scaggs' "Lowdown" and Bill Withers' "Lovely Day."

Shakatak have roots where smooth jazz originally came from — g oove songs, jazzy songs with some pop vocal appeal. They've maintained the mb that a lot of groups are now trying to do. There are lots of guest vocals on records by Boney James and others with soul vocalists to cross them over beyond the NAC market into Urban Contemporary and Quiet Storm. Shakatak actually came from there originally, because the whole history of English jazz has always incorporated the soulful aspects of jazz. That's why acid jazz started in England: Because they always incorporated the funk and rare groove sounds.

Shakatak is the only established band we've ever worked with. We're going for adds on "Lovely Day" on Dec. 6. There's a move away from more programmed sounds to more natural, organic sounds, like live drums. And because radio has moved to streamlining into a more pop sound when it comes to a cover like this one, MDs seem to want more of a jazz element in it.

From Intern To GM, It's A Slam Dunk

evin LeGrett spent the '90s on the fast track of a career he never imagined he'd have. A basketball player in high school and college, his career goal was to go to law school and then, hopefully, become the next Jerry Maguire. That's a far cry from his present role as VP/ GM of Infinity's WCMF & WPXY/Rochester, NY --- despite the fact that "Show me the money" is a popular cry among the majority of radio executives.

LeGrett left a promising career in sports after he was bitten by the ra-

dio bug in 1991 — thanks to a lack of four college credits. His professor suggested he "get an internship to get those four credits and blow off the rest of the year," LeGrett ex-

plains. That internship was at his hometown Rock station, WCMF-FM.

Practice Makes Perfect

"I had the opportunity to work with some great people at WCMF. Stanley Main was OM/PD, and we worked very closely together and developed a great relationship. Stanley said, 'You're the kind of person this business needs; you should look into radio. I don't have a job opening right now, but I guarantee, down the road I will call you.' A week later my internship was almost over, and he called and said he had an opportunity for me to work for a concert promoter, John Scher.'

It was the perfect follow-up to the internship. LeGrett handled marketing and promotion duties for the summer. "I worked with a lot of great bands. I was 21 and having the time of my life," he recalls. "Growing up, I was a huge Eagles fan, and that summer we had a show with Don Henley. I got to spend time with him backstage. That was a lot of fun.'

The summer gig led to a full-time job with the Rochester Broadway Theater League, and over the course of the next year LeGrett developed his radio relationships and marketing expertise. In 1993 he got a call from Main with an offer to return to 'CMF. "He wanted someone with a marketing background and a lot of connections in town. One of WCMF's competitors was going to put Howard Stern on in the morning, and Stanley wanted someone to market The Brother Wease Morning Circus. I jumped at the opportunity."

After six months LeGrett also became Marketing Director for 'CMF sister stations Soft AC WRMM and now-defunct Sports 990 WCMF-AM. Naturally, he spent a significant amount of time working in the sales department, and the following year he went "kicking and screaming" into sales. "I did not want to be a salesperson. I had always equated selling radio as a profession to Herb Tarlek [the sleazy radio sales manager on TV's WKRP in Cincinnatil."

But GM Bob Morgan was persistent and finally convinced LeGrett to move in that direction. "The first couple of months were tough," admits LeGrett. But within eight months he was the No. 1 sales guy, and a year and a half later he was promoted to LSM of WCMF. A short six months after that he added NSM to his title. And soon the printer was called yet again to run another new batch of business cards, as LeGrett became GSM of sister CHR powerhouse WPXY.

He Shoots, He Scores

After a year at 'PXY LeGrett returned to WCMF as GSM and became Director of Sales over all four stations in the cluster. "It was a great job; I loved it," he remembers. Then, in April, GM Bob Morgan exited, and Infinity COO Don Bouloukos arrived and divided the stations into two groups. LeGrett got his dream job, as GM of WCMF & WPXY.

Though the road to the GM job ran directly from sales, LeGrett credits his success to a strong programming background, gained under Main's guidance. "Any time I worked on a marketing or promotional campaign, I worked hand in hand with him, and he taught me a lot of things, concepts such as understanding that the product always comes first. You find a way to reach the clients' goals but, more importantly, you don't hurt the radio station at the same time."

It's a philosophy that still guides LeGrett today. "I came from the programming side, went into sales and fell in love with it because I loved all the marketing and the fact that every day was different." And it was his programming background that made it easy for him to passionately sell the radio station on a consistent basis.

That programming framework is at the heart of his success, though most people seem to forget about programming when it comes to Infinity. "One of the things that always bothers me is that we are typecast as a sales organization. Obviously, we have a great leader in Mel Karmazin, who is a superstar in sales. But Infinity is run by Mel and Dan Mason - who is a programmer — as well as great people like John Gehron, who is one of the greatest PDs in the country."

Put Me In. Coach

While most GMs rise to that position from the sales ranks, LeGrett believes programmers have equal opportunity in upper management if they just go for it. "If you spend your whole life talking about what you can or can't do, you're never going to do anything. If your goal is to be a GM, learn all about sales and marketing and be in the right place at the right time. If you get out there and demonstrate how much

vou care about the station, sooner or later something is going to happen for you."

His athletic background makes it easy for LeGrett to coach and inspire the sports-minded people who work for him, but he concedes that one of the hardest parts of his job is relating to those with no interest in sports or sports analogies. "I'm a complete sports junkie, and basketball is my passion. The key with anyone on my staff, whether they're entry-level or sales or a department head, is to sit down with them and find out what makes them tick. Doing a Knute Rockne speech works once in a while, but you can't do that all the time. It's the individual contact on a daily basis that takes you from being an OK manager to being a great manager.'

A college course in interviewing has proven invaluable in LeGrett's career. It was also one of the most difficult classes for him. "We had to be on camera, and that was something I never wanted to do. But it taught me about how to keep a conversation going and how to look someone in the eye even if the conversation isn't going where you need it to. When you open a sales call, it's just like interviewing somebody. It's the same thing when you're interviewing candidates for PD or marketing director. History courses, especially the history of broadcasting, and marketing courses really proved invaluable too."

Franchise Player

Since his promotion in April LeGrett has been on a mission to completely rebuild WCMF & WPXY: new sales managers and sales management philosophies, new PDs and restructured marketing departments. "I wanted to bring in a new team of people who bought into the system and the mission statement and are now executing it. We're a book into it, and already we have WCMF No. 1 with adults 25-54 and No. 1 in every daypart with men 25-54. And I am proud to say we have 'PXY going from seventh place to third place 12+, and going from sixth place to first place with women 25-54."

As those who have worked their way up through the ranks know. there are unique challenges when one is suddenly supervising those who were once co-workers. Le-

Grett's advice is to stick to the Golden Rule. "The key is to treat people the way you want to be treated, and you've got to set the example. When you're an entrylevel person, you can't be intimidated by a senior-level person. And when you become that senior person's boss, you can never blink, never let somebody see you in a state where you look unpresidential. I use that word all the time with my department heads. No matter how tough the crisis is, you need to have a little John Kennedy in you, where no matter how hot it is in the kitchen, you don't sweat in public."

The glue that keeps those two concepts together is an unbeatable work ethic — and LeGrett's is sec-ond to none — boosted by a healthy dose of dogged determination. "Everyone has learned to respect my work ethic and the fact that I'm going to win. The reason I'll win is that I'll outwork anyone. They'll give up, and I'll win. You have to set the precedent as to why you can advance in front of other people. Say it again and again, and sooner or later they'll believe you. That's the same way I hold meetings: I tell them what I'm going to tell them, then I tell them, and then I tell them what I just told them.'

Positive role models have also played an important part in his career. "I've been very lucky to work with some of the brightest people in the radio industry. I was plucked out of college by Stanley and the GM at the time, Suzanne McDonald. For five years I had the privilege of working with Bob Morgan, who is now President of American Tower. The legendary Steve Dodge taught me a lot about how to treat people, how to make sure that you're always buttoned up and, most importantly, to always go with the basics.'

Over the last three years Le-Grett's greatest source of inspiration has been Don Bouloukos. "He has taught me more than anybody about sales, management and believing in yourself. He will consistently give you feedback and advice while encouraging you to find your own way. And as a 30-year-old guy, that means a lot to me when I am responsible for \$13 million in revenue for my two radio stations.'



OK, so they say rock is making a comeback. Luckily there are some new bands out there to ride the wave, and DDT will be one of the Big Kahunas. DDT are a rock band who incorporate elements of punk, funk and ska into their sound and still rock! You have to give them props, because they certainly do rock on their debut album, Urban Observer (TMC/Elektra/ EEG). WAAF/Boston PD Dave Douglas says reaction is growing for the single, "McDDT."

Urban Observer has been out for almost half a year, but stations like WRIF/Detroit, WAAF/Boston and KXXR/Minneapolis (which just added the single) are beginning to take notice. DDT are somewhere between the aggressive alt-rock Korn types who dominate today and the Red Hot Chili Peppers circa Uplift Mofo Party Plan. DDT have the distinction of releasing the first CD on Elektra's new arm, TMC, which was started by Metallica drummer Lars Ulrich. Ulrich, along with partner Tim Duffy, discovered DDT. Doesn't that say enough?

DDT was formed in 1992 by singer Brian Howes and drummer Bobby James. Along with guitarist Mike McKay and rhythm man Dr. Dave, the group played rock clubs around their home base of Vancouver and built a following.

Surprised In Santa Barbara

□ KJEE is No. 1 12+ ... and deserves it

've spent more than my share of time in smaller-market radio stations over the years, and the unfortunate truth of the matter is that I had built up a certain set of lowered expectations.

Sure, I've seen some professionally run small-market stations (KWTX/Waco, TX comes immediately to mind), but for the most part my experience with small-town radio has been disappointing. This prejudice led me to pretty much only visit and profile successful stations in the top 20 markets. But a funny thing happened recently as I looked over the summer ratings: It finally dawned on me that a significant number of the format's ratings leaders are in markets well below the top 20.

Nowhere was this more evident than in Santa Barbara, where independently owned KJEE finished the summer book ranked No. 1 12+. Clearly, something was happening that required me to re-evaluate my point of view. To help me see what exactly was going on at these successful small-market stations, I packed up my notebook and drove to Santa Barbara.

Trial And Error

One of the reasons I had lower expectations was that smaller-market stations have a reputation for show-

ing very little musical restraint, the feeling being that they have lengthy playlists of severely unfocused and broad music.

A slightly broader music library isn't necessarily a bad thing, since a smaller-market station can sometimes own quite a bit more musical real estate than a station in, say, Seattle. However, many times the


musical breadth is taken to extremes, and a station ends up not with a playlist that embraces a wider demographic target, but a playlist that is simply unfamiliar or full of songs next to each other that appeal to radically different demos or psychographic groups.

With all of this running through my mind. I tuned into KJEE as I was driving into Santa Barbara. To put it mildly, I was amazed at what I heard. The KJEE music mix sounded extremely good. It leaned a little more adult and was slightly more broad than most major-market stations I visit, but that is to be expected with a stand-alone broadcast property in a market like Santa Barbara. It certainly wasn't unfamiliar by any means.



most at a loss when he told me that it wasn't. When I asked about his development as a programmer and where he learned to do what he was doing so well, he modestly replied, "A

Some Things Never Change While I was surprised by the quality of the music programming, other things were exactly as I expected. One of those was the station's production. I'll go into de-

tail on it because it is a very good example of how being in a smaller market is different from being in a larger market.

KJEE's production, while certainly well-done, lacked the refinement and depth that you find in larger markets. I discovered, though, that it should be considered an achievement that the production was as good as it was, considering the workload of the station's production director and the equipment he was using.

It's surprising that so many radio stations owned by large corporations continue to have fairly old broadcasting equipment, like boards and cart machines, in their control rooms. However, none of the stations I have visited ever skimped when it came to production equipment. I can't say that was the case at KJEE

While the station's production room didn't exactly run on four-

tracks and splicing tape, it wasn't state-of-the-art either. That said, it was certainly acceptable. As Production Director Kennedy told me, "It does everything I need it to do." However, the difference is in the time it takes to do things, and, as you will see, time is at a premium for Kennedy.

Kennedy's role at the station is a

perfect example of how bigmarket stations and small-market stations are different. Kennedy not only does almost

all of the production for the station (including the imaging, commercials and promos), he is also the morning show producer. Either one of those jobs is considered a fulltime job at most stations (in fact, many stations have two production people), but at KJEE Kennedy was doing it all himself.

ssentials: Slipknot (Sid Wilson, DJ; Joey Jordison, drums; Paul

Gray, bass; Chris Fehn, percussion; James Root, guitar; Craig Jones, samples; Shawn Crahan, percussion; Mike Thompson, guitar; and Corey Taylor, vocals) may be from the middle of nowhere, but the nine freaks from Des Moines are determined to go somewhere. Their second, self-titled release has almost gone gold, and their new video is selling like hotcakes.

Slipknot formed in late 1995 in their hometown, but every time they tried to get on stage to create a buzz, no one seemed to care. Eventually they found a whole new way to market themselves and make sure that people would pay attention to them. Jordison says, "We never put on the shit we wear to try to get people into us ... After being degraded constantly for trying to play music or do something in Des Moines, it just came to be that we were like an anonymous entity.

So we put on [masks and coveralls], and it just started to turn into this big thing." These clowns weren't joking around. They reinvented themselves, and in 1996 recorded and distributed their debut, Mate. Feed. Kill. Repeat., on their own.

All their efforts paid off when producer Ross Robinson signed the band to Roadrunner. In 1997 Robinson, who is also known for signing Korn to Immortal/Epic, took Slipknot to the Indigo Ranch Studios in L.A. to record their self-titled second release. After recording, the group, who had adopted the numbers 0-8 as their stage names, were immediately scheduled on the Ozzfest tour. They are currently headlining from the Midwest to the East through Dec. 8.

With no airplay until a month ago, the band have almost achieved gold status, selling nearly 350,000 copies of their latest album on their own. They even have a top 5-selling T-shirt at chain record stores, and they have released a home video that is selling equally well.

Despite their masked, violent convict look, new fans are emerging every day, meaning Slipknot has become a radioaccessible band.

Artist POV: Says Joey Jordison, "Our music is so reliant on each other, that if one guy, even the DJ, is gone, it just wouldn't be our songs without him. Without one person, something is really, really missing. Everybody has to be present. Even the littlest things make the songs magical."

t almost every convention, a video camera is taping the event, and behind that camera is Art Vuolo, one of radio's unsung heroes. Over the years Vuolo has become radio's unofficial chronicler, making it his business to record the industry's great moments for prosperity. He estimates that he has 6,000 audio cassettes representing over 10,000 hours of radio broadcasts, plus about 300 hours of video.

Most people don't realize that Vuolo actually has a company, The Radioguide People. It's a concept he developed in his senior year at college, and since 1972 he has published over 100 million guides, which, city by city, make it easy for radio listeners to locate their favorite programming.

How his love of radio began: "It probably goes back to 1960. I was a personal assistant to a gentleman named Jim Shelton. Jim was, at that time, probably the best-known disc jockey in the state of Indiana. He was at WIBC and worked there for 50 years. He never missed a day of work, which I think is a record that will never be broken. I was a listener of his show. He used to broadcast from different car dealers every night, and I would go down and hand him the ETs, the electrical transcriptions.

"He had two turntables, one for the 45s and one for the commercials, which were all on these big 16-inch platters. His show was called *Platter Party*. He could sell Fords one night and Chevys the next with total conviction. I'd take the bus down to wherever he was doing his show after school and help him out.

"My love of radio started when my mom gave me my first crystal radio, one you plugged in your ear and grounded with an alligator clip to an outlet in the wall. I feil asleep every night with that radio stuck in my ear, listening to WIRE in Indianapolis."

Working in radio: "I worked at several stations, mostly after I moved to Michigan. I worked in Jackson, MI, where Jack Parr got his start. I was a board op. I had to learn how to back-time records to hit Mutual News, how to cut out Preparation H commercials because the GM of the station didn't think they were in good taste, stuff like that. They would never let me on the air.

"I didn't get on the air until 1967 in Ann Arbor. I remember being on the air the night the Detroit riots broke out. I had pretaped the show, but I was at the station, running the tape. One of the songs I played was "Eve of Destruction' by Barry McGuire. The show was called *The Sunday Night Music Mart*. It was back in an era when you had nothing on on Sunday night. It was either me or Billy Graham. It is the same station where John Records Landecker got his career started. Radio's Best Friend

"I worked as Promotion Director for WNIC/Detroit when Ed Christian of Saga was running it. I decided I didn't like working for one particular station, and that's when I started my company. It gave me a chance to work with many stations without allegiance to any one."

How he answers when asked what he does for a living: "It's very hard to describe. I kind of live a double life. I have video and *Radioguide*, which are totally different, separate and unique. Basically, I tell people I. publish *Radioguide* for people who travel and want to know what to listen to when they're in a city they're unfamiliar with. Then I find that people who live in a particular city really don't know the stations much better than the people who are visiting."

State of the radio industry: "That is so hard to answer, because it's kind of a love-hate thing. I love the times now; I love the technologies. Look at the equipment today; we have come so far. I love the hot new formats. Believe it or not, I even love the consolidation, because it's good for my business. I like the new things about the business.

"What I hate is the discrimination against talented executives and people over the age of 50. That's because I already kissed my 50th birthday. I think to myself that maybe when Randy Michaels hits 50, it's going to change. So many of my friends over 50 are crying to me that they can't get any good jobs because they're being passed over for people who are much younger and will work for less money. That's my saddest commentary."

On being named "Radio's Best Friend": "I can tell you the exact date: It was May 17, 1985, in **R&R's** Street Talk column, which was written in those days by John Leader. He was congratulating me and my company on getting a really big order for *Radioguide*, sponsored by General Motors. It's amazing how many people know me by that handle. It's quite the moniker. When it was given to me, a number of people said, 'You should make that work to your advantage,' and hopefully I have. The only bad thing is, being radio's best friend means you have to do everything for everybody and then not get paid for it. It can be a curse as well."

Something about him that might surprise our readers: "I was going to try to think of something clever to say, like, 'Let it be exposed that Art Vuolo leads a double life: He's both in radio and in video.' I took those two things and combined them into the video airchecks, which, believe it or not, I'm almost better known for than the *Radioguide*. I'm archiving the industry with videotape. It's a way for me to leave a mark. I'm somebody who likes to think that being nice to people is still in vogue. I try to bust my butt for everybody. The only person I ever screw over is myself."

Career highlight: "I would have to go to 1995, when Ford Motor Co. — the electronics division, at the time called Ford Electronics — bought 10 million *Radioguides*. That was my biggest hit. They sponsored 10 million guides to promote college football on the radio."

Career disappointment: "Losing sponsors because of changes in ownership or personnel. You work with someone at a certain company, then they leave the company, and it's the old 'you go out with the bathwater.' That's how we lost Buick, even though the promotion was tremendously successful. When you sell a company, you're really selling people. People are the company. New, younger blood came in, and they wanted to do it their way. Even if our idea was good, it made no difference; they had their own ideas, and they were going to do it their way." Most influential individual: "So many people have affected my career. There's a friend of mine — I always say that he sits at the right hand of God because he works with Randy and Tom Owens at Clear Channel — Sean Compton. I call him The Boy Wonder. He's only like 25 years old. He knows so much about this business, and I'm better than double his age. It scares me how many sharp people there are out there who are so young and know so much. One of my best friends in the business is Steve Cooper in Indianapolis. He was in my very first video in '78. I got inspired by a tape I saw from Shotgun Tom Kelly of B-100 in San Diego at the 1977 **R&R** Convention in Dallas."

Favorite radio format: "News/Talk and Oldies." Favorite air personality: "Everyone knows that I am most fond of Bob & Tom."

Greatest radio moment caught on tape: "One of the most mesmerizing was in 1985, during a Detroit radio reunion. Some guy was mimicking the late Byron McGregor, doing the blood-and-guts 20/20 news. While the guy was doing it on the air, in walked Byron and his wife, JoJo. Thank God the tape was rolling, because in those days I had a camera that would have taken eight to 10 seconds to warm up, and I never would have caught it. At CRS in Nashville I got the late Minnie Pearl doing a riveting keynote that only I have on tape. Also, the induction at the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame of all the legendary jocks. I was the only one who taped that. It was history."

His funniest moment: "I can't remember which convention it was at, but Randy Michaels got up to the podium and said, I see Art Vuolo here, and he's wearing a really nice-looking suit. I'm just trying to figure out what radio station is giving away suits.' It gets a huge laugh to this day. Everybody is convinced that I buy none of my own clothes, because everything I own has a logo on it. As I'm sitting here, I'm wearing a T-shirt under my sweater from a station in from Indiana, and I'm wearing a sweater with the Lions' and WXYT's logos on it!"

Favorite song: "I love oldies, but I love the oldies that don't get played — the ones by Bobby Rydell or Connie Francis or Fabian, the lost gold that didn't test well for some reason."

Favorite television show: "Frasier."

Favorite book: "The Hits Just Keep on Coming by Ben Fong Torres. There's a new book by Joey Reynolds called Let a Smile Be Your Umbrella and Don't Get a Mouthful of Rain."
