Say a prayer for one of our bravest warriors. Say a prayer for Scotty Andrews. By any standards known to man, this brother fought a gallant fight. The V-103 staff took pro-

gramming signals from their

leader right down to his last days. But few who knew him would have expected any-thing less of him. Only this time, he practically rewrote the book on being a Black Radio Professional.

Last week, like many other industry colleagues who loved and respected this man, I met with Scotty in his home. As I kneeled by his bedside, we prayed to-gether and talked of many thinas.

When I complimented him on his most recent increase in the Arbitrends ratings, he spoke enthusiastically about taking on a new urban station in the market. In the midst of the excruciating pain he was experiencing at the time, Scotty's competi-tive spirit took charge and his will to win his radio battle allowed him to transcend - mentally, at least the debilitation of his physical illness.

When I shook his hand, the grip was still firm. As I stroked his wet brow and

said goodbye, I did not want to believe that it would be for the last time. The image of this man seated on a panel at the conference last summer - sharing his enormous store of radio knowledge with his peers - was still too vivid in my mind.

Yes, Black Radio - we have lost one of the greatest warriors that ever played the game of radio program-

ming. It's unfortunate that great programmers in the south never seem to gain the notoriety and respect that their counterparts in other areas of the country receive.

But Brother Scotty Andrews came the closest to being an exception. He has students everywhere. Case in point: Lee Michaels.

So let Scotty Andrews' will to win in the face of death itself be an inspiration to all of us to win in the face of mere adversity. He could have no greater legacy.

Prior to his death last year, Faulkner had taught broadcasting at Morgan State College in Baltimore. "And it brought tears to my eyes at his funeral," recalls Baker, "when the mini-ster asked if any of his students would stand - and half the people in atten-

SECOND ANNUAL MUSIC BUSINESS SYMPOSIUM SET FOR MAY 2 - 4 IN L.A.

Los Angeles: More than 23 open and closed door sessions will be offered during the three-day Music Business Symposium, set for May 2-4 at the Ambassador Hotel here.

This major undertaking, according to event officials, is meant to attract a wide-range of music industry professionals - from music publishers and songwriters to record company executives and retailers.

Put on by BAM Magazine and MBS Productions under the direction of MBS president William Gladstone, the Symposium's keynote speaker is slated to be Arista Records president Clive Davis.

Producer/trendsetter Malcolm McClaren is expected to address a special closed door session with A&R representatives from major and independent labels.

Also scheduled during the Sunday sessions is a panel on independent promotion, although no topic or panelists had initially been named "due to recent controversies" involving indie promotion. Recently named to participate are Raplh Tashjian, Isgro Entertainment; Steve Meyer, MCA; and Lenny Bronstein, Heavy Lenny Promotions.

Registration costs for the three day event, which will also feature exibits, is \$205.

INDIE LABELS HOLD ANNUAL CONVENTION

Chicago: The National Association of Independent Record Distributors and Manufacturers (NAIRD) will hold its 11th annual convention on May 1-4 at the Americana Congress Hotel. The NAIRD convention is the only national music industry convention to specialize in new independent labels.

This year's convention will feature a keynote speech by Jerry Wexler (partner in Atlantic Records and producer of such artists as Aretha Franklin and Big Joe Turner), ten panel discussions, evening performances and an awards dinner.


One panel highlight will include insights from record promotion man Dave Clark on NAIRD's "The Panel of Legends."

WARNER COMMUNICATIONS,INC. REPORTS PROFIT GAINS

New York: Warner Communications Inc. (WCI) has reported a first quarter net income of \$30.463,000, a 42% gain over earnings of \$21,451,000 in the first quarter of 1985, and earnings per share of \$.44 compared to \$.31 per share last year.

Steven J. Ross, Chairman and Chief Executive Officer, said: "WCI's Filmed Entertainment and Recorded Music divisions reported record first quarter earnings as the company continued to exhibit the strong momentum that characterized our performance in 1985."

According to Ross, WCI's Recorded Music division reported operating income of \$31.4 million, a gain over 1985's previous high of \$30.2 million.

ARBITRON ANNOUNCES NEW RADIO DIARY

New York: A new diary that eliminates the need to write "am" and "pm" when entering listening will be distributed to radio diarykeepers starting June 26, with Arbitron's summer survey, according to Marshall Snyder, Arbitron's vice president and general manager, Product and Research Services.

Said Snyder: "The "ary is the most reliable to dof obtaining radio ...tening. This new daypart diary enhances the already proven system by clarifying any confusion diarykeepers may have relating to time of day."

In the new diary, each day is divided into four broad dayparts - early morning (5 am to 10 am), midday (10 am to 3 pm), late afternoon (3 pm to 7 pm) and night (7 pm to 5 am). This eliminates the need for diarykeepers to indicate "am" or "pm" next to each instance of radio listening.

The remainder of the Arbitron radio diary, which requests a station's call letters (or program name or dial setting) and place of listening for each day of a one-week period, remains the same.

In testing the new diary, it was found that "the overall rate of diarykeeper accuracy improved significantly while listening levels were unaffected, Snyder said.

CHARLES "SCOTTY" ANDREWS 1941~1986

When the life of Charles "Scotty" Andrews ebbed to a close at Northside Hospital in Atlanta at 4:45 a.m. on Saturday, April 19, the out-pouring of love and sense of loss felt by industry-wide friends and colleagues across the country were only symbolic of the impact of this man whose superb talents as a broadcast professional were surpassed only by his genuine concern for others. A man who, at 44, left us far too soon with too much more to contribute.

In an outstanding career in radio which spanned more than two decades, Scotty Andrews chalked up a national reputation as a programmer whose unerring in-stincts made him a consistent and decisive winner.

Nowhere was that ability demonstrated more impres-sively than at WVEE-FM (V-103), where Scotty took over as Program Manager in 1978 after having been an on-air personality. Under his now legendary programming helm, V-103 achieved a distinctively formatted sound that insured black/urban market dominance in Atlanta that was not seriously challenged was not seriously challenged until recently. In charge to the very end, he was pre-paring strategies to take on the new urban competitor when he finally had to concede in one of the very few battles in life that he could not win could not win.

Scotty Andrews' journey to the top of the broadcasting profession began in the small town of Douglas, GA. After graduating from George Washington Carver High School there in 1960, he served in the United States Navy where he participated in Armed Forces Radio and Television aboard the USS Forrestal.

Upon his discharge from the service, Scotty took on commercial radio in 1966 as an on-air announcer at WHIH in Norfolk, VA, where he also served as Program Director. Emerging as a formidable radio talent in that market, in 1969 he was voted "Announcer of the

Year" in Virginia. Returning to his native Georgia in 1970, he joined WIGO as a staff announcer and production supervisor. In 1971, he was promoted to program director and thereby served notice that

Scotty Andrews was a force to be reckoned with as a key architect of urban sound on the Atlanta airwaves. When Scotty moved across town to V-103, the rest - as the saying goes - is history. Or legend, to be more accurate.

On the Thursday before he succumbed, he named Ray Boyd, who worked closely with him for four years, as his first Asst. PD. But even as he prepared for the continuity of programming at the station, Scotty - the consummate professional was clearly calling the shots with a brilliance that lingered even as his strength failed.

A highly respected and widely honored broadcaster, in 1983 he was certified as one of the top 100 announ-

cers in the country. But it was Scotty Andrews' activities beyond the mike that distinguished him from many others who are merely proficient in their broad-cast skills. He firmly believed that along with the enormous exposure to the black community that a toprated station enjoys goes a certain level of responsibility to that community. And he did not fall short. From active participation in the NAACP and the ACT-So Project to frequent speaking appearances before schools and college audiences, he was always there when needed. A living symbol of the what the role of a caring and concerned communicator could and should be.

When services were held for Charles "Scotty" Andrews last Tuesday afternoon at the Zion Hill Baptist Church, he was no stranger to the congregation or to to the congregation or to those who were present in body or spirit to pay tri-bute to a man who touched so many lives so deeply. He is survived by his wife

Eunice, daughter Andrea, and son Scott.

ELROY SMITH. V.P. OF PROGRAMMING WILD-AM/BOSTON: **GROWING ON THE JOB**



It's not unusual for broadcast interns to have on-air assignments during their student tenure.

But it's more unusual for a major market station to allow an intern to create a block of programming.

That's what happened to Elroy Smith of WILD-AM in Boston.

"When I was an intern," he recalled for BRE recently, "the program director, then (Steve Crumbley), said he wanted to start a Caribbean music program. Because I'm from Bermuda, I was elected. "Well," he continued.

"they don't play a lot of Caribbean music in Bermuda. I knew next to nothing about

it. "I had four days to prepare for this show, so I went to people in the large West Indian community here and asked them about the music. I even ended up using some of their records."

Well, the show was ulti-mately a success. Listeners supported Smith and he continued to draw from the community to develop the show's popularity.

That was 1980-81. Smith then graduated from nearby Emerson College and moved from a part-timer to a fulltime midday jock. A year later (get this!) he was upped to program director upon Crumbley's departure.

By now it was 1982 - and Smith admitted that it was also "panic city. "I didn't know anything

about programming. Nothing," he said. "I was put on trial for three months by the owner (Ken Nash) and for three months, every time I saw him around the station I thought I'd get the final

word. "He finally told me," Smith continued, "that 'well, we dropped in the

According to Smith, the combination of staff coop-eration from the sales, news, promotion and programming departments helped him move the station ahead.

Smith added that WILD music director Angelea Thomas, along with the on-air staff, helped him develop insights to programming. Program director Melissa Clark also pointed out com-munity activities that he was able to take advantage of in the overall programming picture.

WILD has been inviting a diverse crop of guest DJs to the studio mike in recent months, including Boston Mayor Ray Flynn, Massachu-setts Gov. Michael Dukakis, Celtics stars Robert Parish and Dennis Johnson and recording artists Morris Day, New Edition and Lou Rawls.

That ongoing promotion, coupled with what Smith says is a solid urban/R&B format that only mixes pop hits that fit, improved the stations numbers from 1.6 to 2.5 in the most recent Arbitron book for Boston.

"And for a day time station in this market," he said, "that's pretty good." Smith feels that tight-

ening the playlist and putting solid jocks on-air have helped WILD capture an audience beyond the core demographic.

He also was confident that the station's air talent was capable of moving to a general market station and that this ability to project that quality served to capture a larger audience share.

But it is still weekend programming, such as the Sunday morning gospel block, the "heavy mix' for teens, the Caribbean program and the two hour oldies block all on Saturdays - that remains a solid core to the WILD programming approach.

Smith, vice president of smith, vice president of programming since February, 1986, said that Nash gave him the responsibility be-cause he wanted to delegate more free time to explore other programming.

Being delegated new and unusual duties is nothing new for Smith, who said of his earlier trials by fire, "I can laugh about it now."



Washington Update

Group to Urge Banks to Lend to Black Media...

Few major banks and insurance companies have ever made a loan to a Black-owned company seeking to purchase or build a broadcast station. One possible solution: Get the banks to sign pledges of fair treatment of Blacks seeking such loans, and followup with monitoring and with training and sensitizing meetings of bank executives.

This is the route being pursued by the Committee on Minority Telecommunications Financing. Formed after an informal meeting of 13 major Black broadcast station owners in Dallas on April 13. the blue-ribbon group will quietly seek the sup-port of the FCC, NAB and major lenders for a fair practices code. Early endorsers of the Committee's activity: the National Association of Black-Owned Broadcasters (NABOB), at whose meeting the Committee was organized, and the National Black Media Coalition (NBMC).

NABOB Meeting Discusses Advertiser Discrimination...

Convening in Dallas just before the National Association of Broadcasters convention, NABOB's annual meeting focused largely on strategies to sell radio airtime to a reluctant advertising community.

community. Leaders from advertising, broadcasting and government spoke about how Black station owners can work together to tell the story of Black media to advertisers. Among the speakers: Phil Roberts (Masla Radio); Michelle Garner (Burrell Advertising); Larry Irving (Office of Congressman Mickey Leland); Bill Dilday (WJTV-TV, Jackson, Mississippi); Phil Newmark (Hillier, Newmark, Wechsler & Howard); and Joel Martin (J.P. Martin & Associates).

Several speakers pointed to the practice of advertisers who send "buy" orders to their agencies marked "no Black" or "no ethnic." One such order was distributed to the audience of 50 station owners. None seemed surprised.

Most speakers agreed that Congress will do nothing, and the FCC can and will do nothing to alleviate advertiser discrimination. What the speakers thought would work: Research showing the advantages of using Black media, and legal activities such as NBMC's petition to the FCC.

NABOB Announces Music Industry Committee... By David Honig

While Black artists account for about a third of the revenue being generated by the recording industry, NABOB has found that many record companies don't promote those artists on Blackowned stations. Therefore, NABOB has established the Music Industry Committee to meet with CEOs of major record companies to tell the story of Black-owned radio and to encourage greater promotional efforts by the recording shops. Members of the committee include: Tom Lewis, Chairman (Inter Urban Broadcasting); Pierre Sutton (Inner City Broadcasting); Gene Jackson (Unity Broadcasting/NBN); Jim Hutchinson (Inter Urban Broadcasting); and Jim Winston (Executive Director, NABOB).

Payola Investigations Heat

Federal scrutiny of "play for pay" at radio stations is going forward in Congress and in the federal courts. A federal grand jury has subpoenaed executives of CBS, MCA and Capitol/EMI, asking them to turn over records of dealings with independent promoters.

Reports in the <u>Wall Street</u> <u>Journal</u> and the <u>Philadelphia</u> <u>Inquirer</u> have drawn attention to the influence of organized crime in payola. Senator Albert Gore of Tennessee is conducting his own investigation to determine if the federal law prohibiting payola needs strengthening. (See BRE April 18, 1986.)

That law, Section 508 of the Communications Act (47 U.S.C. 508 for those who want to look it up) should be familiar to all DJs, PDs and Music Directors. It is basically a <u>disclosure</u> statute. The bottom line: If a record company gives up something of value to get a record played, it's OK if you tell the public, on the air, before playing the record.

Put another way, the record promoter can give you money, a gift, an "escort" or any legal drug - but you face up to a \$10,000 fine or a year in jail if you don't announce what you got over the air.

BRE's advice to the wise: Don't take the good stuff and you won't have to worry about Section 508. If it looks too good to be true (and if you're offered something you wouldn't have been offered if you didn't have the power to decide what gets played), it is too good to be true. Tell the PD or the GM. By doing so, you'll *Continued on page 28*



GMA Dove Awards (and its predominately white organization) of not being accurate in the selection process for black nominees nor has the GMA been fair, they feel in presenting only two awards in the black gospel category.

For many, this oversight has made the Dove Awards less than indicative of what's going on in black gospel. And yet, if this is true, blacks certainly did seem to be boundantly visible - both on and off the screen - at this year's telecast!

Off-screen, Los Angeles. Mayor Tom Bradley (gubernatorial candidate for the state of California) spoke at the GMA's Songwriters Awards held earlier in the week.

On-screen, blacks were in an array of roles at the Doves. Edwin Hawkins and Deleon presented the Black Traditional Album of the Year award to Shirley Caesar. FCC "AM Improvement" Plan Bad News for Black Radio.... Under pressure from AM

broadcasters threatened by the mass exodus of audiences to FM in the past ten years, the FCC has come to the rescue with a package of technical and political proposals aimed at resuscitating the AM broadcast band. AM improvement is a sub-

ject dear to the heart of Black media. Two-thirds of Black-owned stations are AMs, as are the bulk of Black-programmed stations. Most Black AM stations are high frequency (right side of the dial), directional, lower power facilities. Whites didn't want these stations, so Blacks got the "opportunity" to own them.

What can be done about AM. which went from 70% of the audience to 30% of the audience in only 12 years' time?


sell interference rights is really somewhat innova-tive. The one decision the FCC refuses to make which could really make a differ-ence: Selecting an AM stereo standard.

With Kahn and C-Quam still competing and still mutually incompatible, except on very expensive receivers, the public still hears mono sound while the FCC burbles about letting the "market-place" decide. It can't, and the FCC won't.

Instead, the Commission is thinking about getting rid of the duopoly rule - and thus letting one owner monopolize radio in a small town by owning several radio stations there.

An equally harmful proposal - allowing an AM-FM combination to program the same music all the time, regardless of market size - has already been adopted. The public hardly gets the widest range of program choices if a station owner can economize in this way.

Watch BRE to see whether AM improvement means more for Black radio, or just more for incumbent radio station owners.



SENATE PLANS PAYOLA PROBE

Washington Claiming that payola is "alive and and worse than ever," in the record industry, Sen. Albert Gore Jr. (D-Tenn.) announced at a recent press conference that a congressional investigation is underway that will focus on alleged illicit practices used to promote records.

In what may evolve into the biggest probe of payola since the 1950s, the Senate joins federal, California and New York law enforcement agencies in the effort to curb allegations of organized crime influence in the \$4-billion-a-year recording industry.

According to Gore, staff investigators for the Senate Permanent Subcommittee on Investigations will interview record company and radio station executives, promoters and disc jockeys.

Because of the difficulty involved in proving payola allegations, it may take years before Mafia involvement in the record business can be fully determined, according to law enforcement sources.

Suspected organized crime infiltration into the sale of "cut-out," or out-of-date records will be focused on in addition to the alleged practice of "kickbacks" from promoters to record executives.

Gore, who investigated the "new payola" a few years ago as a member of the House Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations, is married to Tipper Gore. She and the wives of other prominent politicians formed the Parents' Music Resource Center, a group whose efforts to make consumers aware of explicit song lyrics generated an ongoing record labeling controversy and subsequent congressional hearings.

In a related development, Sugar Hill Records, the small New Jersey-based label specializing in black rap music, is also being investigated by two of the federal grand juries due to its connection to alleged organized crime figure Salvatore Pisello.


FCC APPROVES WHAT-WWDB SETTLEMENT

Philadelphia: A major hurdle in FCC approval of the sale of WHAT and WWDB here was removed in an amended settlement agreement that drops payments of over \$860,000 to various co-petitioners, including the National Black Media Coalition.

The Commission approved the agreement and renewed the licenses of the two stations. Further approval of the sales must now be obtained from the Mass Media Bureau.

Under the amended pact, Banks Broadcasting will sell WHAT to Main Line Communications for \$625,000 while coowned Independence Broadcasting will sell WWWB to Ragan Henry's NewSystems for \$5,985,000. American Minority Communications will also receive \$200,000 from NewSystems for "dismissing its competing applications for both stations."

PECK OUT AT ELEKTRA

It was learned at press time that Los Angeles-based Primus Robinson has been named to fill the Special Markets post at the label. Further details next week.

DON KING OPENS NEW ENTERTAINMENT FIRM

Hollywood: Don King has opened DKSEN (Don King Sports & Entertainment Network) Entertainment Complex that has been staffed with handpicked personnel to "produce, fund or discover new talent and embellish talent that's already here but not being used properly," according to the promoter. To accomplish those goals,


To accomplish those goals, King has signed a deal with Triad for representation. He also plans to produce a heavyweight boxing series



and a 4-6 hour miniseries entitled "Cassius Clay/Muhammad Ali," a dramatization of Ali's life, to be aired on HBO.

BILLIE HOLIDAY HAS HER DAY ON THE HOLLYWOOD WALK

Los Angeles: A woman named Eleanora Fagan McKay, known the world over as Billie Holiday, "Lady Day" to those who knew her best, finally received a long-overdue symbol of recognition in Hollywood.

On April 7, the day she would have been 71, the Tinseltown Chamber of Commerce, along with city officials and some coveted names in the jazz and blues music worlds, gathered with citizens for the unveiling of her star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame.

The woman who is credited with influencing a whole generation of jazz singers was honored after a concerted effort mounted by Los Angeles TIMES jazz critic Leonard Feather raised sufficient revenue for the establishment of the star, placed near the intersection of Vine and Selma in Hollywood.

Alvin Stoller, J.J. Wiggins, Sr., Red Calender, Jimmy Rowles, and his daughter Stacey all performed musical reminders of the songs she made popular during the ceremonies, which attrqcted a diverse group of jazz lovers, particularly Holiday fans. Jimmy Grant, honorary may-

GOSPEL MUSIC WORKSHOP BOARD MEETING HELD IN LAS VEGAS

Last month, the 19th Annual Board Meeting of the Gospel Music Workshop of America was held at the Aladdin Hotel in Las Vegas. President and founder of the organization is Reverend James Cleveland - a premier figure in the world of black gospel music.

The gathering focused on meetings and elections in preparation for the Gospel Music Workshop (popularly called "The James Cleveland Workshop) to be held August 12-17 in Miami.

More than 25,000 are expected to attend the event, which is the largest convention for black gospel music in the world. It brings together black gospel announcers, artists, record company executives, various auxiliaries and youthoriented groups throughout the country - culminating in the presentation of the highly prestigious and coveted "Excellence Awards."

(It is interesting to note that these are considered the most authentic and accurate awards presented for outstanding black gospel music by the industry's peers.)

For BRE readers, perhaps the most intriguing part of the past session was the Gospel Announcers Guild Meeting, where gospel announcers and record company executives have an opportunity to interface directly with each other.

In view of developing trends in the industry, these meetings have taken on added importance. They consist of manufacturers' presentations, servicing areas and provide an occasion for a thorough discussion of the directions and concerns of Guild members.

High on their agenda this year was the rise of gospel music and its industry-wide implications. The explosion of contemporary crossover hits and the new-found foothold of secular companies in the gospel music marketplace have made dialogue between representatives of all facets of the gospel community crucial at this time.

Al Hobbs, Chairman of the Gospel Announcers Guild and General Manager of WTLC in Indianapolis, eloquently addressed the issue of the gospel explosion when he told the group: "Gospel music is changing and we are changing with it. There are many who have been with the Workshop since its inception

and their sacrifices have blazed the trail for others to enjoy the fruits of their labors."

Hobbs continued: "Groups like the Winans, Tramaine and Andrae Crouch are able to enjoy lucrative careers in gospel music today. This is the dawn of a new era in gospel music."

GOSPEL ARTIST PROFILE: DARYL COLEY

Daryl Coley is clearly one of the most accomplished gospel artists to come around in a long, long time. Often described as a "Gospel Al Jarreau," Daryl vocally bends and turns notes running up and down the musical scale with extraordinary flexibility.

The first time this reporter witnessed Daryl in action at a West Angeles Church fundraiser here in Los Angeles, I was as astounded by his vocal prowess as the crowd. He sang one song with the West Angeles Choir and received the ultimate compliment for his ministry in music from Dionne Warwick (who was also singing gospel for the event). Ms. Warwick was so moved that she stood up, shouted hallelujah, shook her head and saluted him by throwing a handkerchief.

Things were clearly no different at the Gospel Announcers Luncheon during the Gospel Music Workshop Board Meeting in Las Vegas, which Plumbline Records hosted at the Aladdin Hotel's Club Rouge. Performing at this showcase for the label's top artists, Daryl did what he does best: moved the audience to their feet with responses of joy and praise. How does he do it? Through his God-given talent for

How does he do it? Through his God-given talent for mixing superb musical techniques, a flair for jazz, and versatility in both contemporary and traditional gospel markets.

No stranger to gospel circles and audiences, the native Californian has received acclaim for his work with the famed Hawkins family in Oakland.

Ironically, with all of those years of credits and accolades, Daryl had not done an album of his own. That is, not until Dr. Kenneth Green (founder and president of Plumbline Gospel Records and Filmworks, International) and veteran A&R director Gentry McCreary brought Coley to their label to embark upon his now skyrocketing solo career

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KELLY ISLEY 1937-1986

The death of Kelly Isley, co-founder of the stellar R&B/Rock group the Isley Brothers, has left an "unfillable void," according to close friends and asso-ciates of the late member of

clates of the late member of that family unit. Called "the father figure of the Isley Brothers," Kel-ly died at the age of 48 of a heart attack at his Al-pine, NJ, home on March 31. He was born on Christmas

Day, 1937, in Cincinnati, and given the name O'Kelly -which he later shortened when he and his brothers Ronnie and Rudolph decided to embark on a successful recording career that spans three decades.

Long regarded as one of the most important groups on the black music scene, the Isley Brothers' early chain of smash hits include "Shout Pts. 1 & 2," "Twist and Shout" and the Grammy-win-ning "It's Your Thing."

Even more significant was the Isley Brothers' formation of their own label, T-Neck Records, a fairly revo-Neck Records, a fairly revo-lutionary venture for a black group to even attempt back in the mid-'60s - and Kelly, known as the businessman of the group, played a pivotal role in the label's creation and doublogment development.


A devoted family man, Kelly, along with Ronnie and Rudolph, financed the col-lege educations of their younger brothers Ernie, Marvin and brother-in-law Christopher Jasper. The three majored in music at C.W. Post College in Hemp-stead, NY, and they grad-uated with B.F.A. degrees. The addition of the young-

er brothers to the group in 1969 meant that the Isley Brothers could fully deliver on a self-contained sound

on a self-contained sound that yielded such hits as "Pop That Thing," "Harvest For the World," "Fight the Power," "For the Love Of You" and "Don't Say Good-night (It's Time For Love)." Survived by his brothers, his mother Sallye, his 21-year-old twin sons Frank and Doug, and his longtime com-panion Helen, Kelly's body is entombed at the George Washington Memorial Park in Paramus, NJ.

Paramus, NJ. The following are comments from some of his associates in the record world who came to regard Kelly Isley as a friend.

Tom Draper (VP/Black Music Marketing, Warner Bros.):



"Kelly's untimely passing has been a big shock and a tremendous loss. "He was the spokesman for

the group, from a business standpoint. But I was great-ly impressed with how these three black men could work so closely for so many years and be of one mind. It was great to see that.

It's too premature to pre-dict what direction the group will go in now. But I have the utmost respect for the Isley Brothers and I'm sure that, spiritually, Kel-ly will always continue to be a part of them.

Benny Medina (National Di-rector of Black A&R, Warner Bros.): "I spent quite a bit of time with Kelly in the week before he died. I realized how intelligent he was about the record business and how involved he was in the creation of T-Neck Records.

"We'd had discussions on how the music business had changed and I'd looked forward to gaining a lot of knowledge from his insights. He was a major contributor to the Isley Brothers and his loss will be felt."

Pat Thomas (Publicist, War-ner Bros.): "Kelly was so winning, so charming. He could win your heart with his gentle personality. He was the eldest brother and the backbone of the Isley Brothers.

"He really loved his brothers and that was the big thing with him: Family. They always came first with him and his death leaves a big void that can never be filled."

Vaughn Harper (Radio Per-sonality, WBLS): "I'd known Kelly for over nine years. He was the godfather to my little girl. He was the most real superstar you would ever want to meet. He tried to enrich the lives of oth-ers, and he did that with ers, and he did that with just his presence.

"Everyone in the Isley Brothers played an equal role, but Kelly was the leader. He was the magnet that everything revolved around. "Kelly cared about his

people and he cared about his family, above all. If you were a friend of his, you became family to him. "There is no way you'll be able to fill his shoes. Kelly was a hell of a friend. And a hell of a man.'

Upon seeing the group (consisting of Kelly's two younger brothers and brother-in-law), I found myself unable to express my feelings. But their faces clearly showed the grief they were experiencing.

In the time-honored entertainment tradition, the decision was made to go on with the show. When the group announced the loss of their family member from the stage, the whole stadium seemed to be encircled by shock waves.

Although the show was not formally dedicated to Kelly, you could sense it in their delivery of each song. The performance was one of their best...

As for Luther, he need not ever bother with such elaborate staging again. He proved beyond a doubt with his peformance in the round that the elegant trappings were a waste of money. What the audience seemed to love and want was pure Luther without the frills.

The stage in the round gave the impression of a heavyweight championship fight (no offense to the newly slimmed down super-star). As Luther appeared and walked through an aisle lined with security guards, the audience chanted "Luther! Luther! Luther!" in thunderous unison.

It brought to mind the image of Muhammad Ali entering the ring to do battle. And so goes the Luther concert - another triumph for a man who truly has the voice of America.

STARPOINT opened the show and delightfully surprised many of the fans with their strong, moving and truly exciting showmanship. With one more hit record, they should soon take their place as a starring act. (And they're probably "restless" (And

to do it!) The show was billed by insiders as "The Russell Brothers Show." Representing all of the artists in the lineup were CARTER RUSSELL of Elektra and CLIFFORD "KIPPY" RUSSELL of CBS.

Speaking of Elektra, rumor has it that one of the problems that may have cost GREG PECK his job involved a short promotion stop here recently by the label's talented songstress, ANITA BAKER. As reported in this column last week, she was present at the Taste Disco for WBMX Night.

We hear that the flap arose because Ms. Baker was very annoyed that she appeared at what she consid-ered a "strip joint." I would like to set the record straight on that issue.

No, Ms. Baker, the Taste is not a strip joint and the entertainment featured that night was designed only to provide a fun-filled evening for the ladies. The performers have been seen on Donahue and many more TV shows doing just what they do best.

In the years that they have provided entertainment at Taste for WBMX Night, no artist has ever complained about the show. Nor has there ever been an incident during one of their performances.

NBMC Report

What has made Black radio a healthier, viable, ,and quality medium has been its service to the community. By setting examples and providing information to its loyal audience it has established a meaningful relationship to the community it serves. One of the results or rewards of its service are youth pro-grams like Pyramid Communications Inc., (PCI) an independent non-profit media corporation operated and controlled by young people ages 4-25.

The organization is open youth of all racial, religious and ethnic origins. However, special em-phasis is placed on minority youth. Founder and director Derrick Gibbs-Johnson founded the organization to give young minorities an opportunty to participate in communications.

Johnson began his broadcasting a career when

he was 10. He produced, reported and hosted numerous radio and television programs including the United Negro College Fund Telethon, Jerry Lewis Telethon and the Easter Seals Telethon. Among his many awards include the "Golden Mike" award, and 133 other awards for the production of his highly acclaimed "Teen Talk" radio program. Those acknowledgements were climaxed by the recent "Derrick Gibbs-Johnson Day," proclaimed by Mayor Marion Barry of Washington, D.C. PCI was created to develop

and conduct communications training and programming which enables youth to pur-sue the field of communications as a development experience, avocation or career.

According to Johnson, interview sessions for entrance into the youth program is frequently overcrowded: "We sometimes have over 300 people wanting to participate." Unfortunately no more than 30 people are selected to participate in PCI per session due to limited resources to conduct training and the necessity to provide individualized instruction to all participants.

Housed in the Capital Children's Museum in Washington, D.C., the commu-nications group has access to a million dollar radio station, of which a number of programs are produced and aired on local radio stations in the metropolitan Washington, D.C. area.

The most popular program produced by Pyramid members is "All The Way," a weekly half hour teen radio maga-zine show. Joy Robinson (9), a host for the program whose stage name is "Miss Joy," has interviewed celebrities ranging from Doug E. Fresh to Diana Ross. As one of the more popular hosts she receives approximately 400 letters a week from admiring fans.

At the end of the program,

according to Johnson, Pyramid volunteers know how to

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





JAMES JORDAN P.D.,M.D.,WNHC NEW HAVEN: WAGING THE DAVID& GOLIATH BATTLE

You must feel as though you're the Hoboken Knights playing the New York Yankees in a pact with the Grim Reaper.

But for James Jordan, music and program director at New Haven's metro-based station WNHC-AM, having to compete with New York radio signals from WBLS and WRKS is a challenge addressed.

is a challenge addressed. "Our feeling is," Jordan told BRE recently, "If you want to hear it, and if it has something to do with black music, we'll have to play it."

What that permits Jordan and WNHC to do is be an outlet for eclectic sound.

Jordan said that while local record retail stores, listener research and other local sources are often used to help develop the play list, "we have to be up on their (WBLS and WRKS) playlists and new entries too, because they beam into our markets.

"We keep an eye on what they play," he said, adding, "But we let the listeners know who we are."

And what is WHNC-AM?

Jordan, a New Haven, CTnative said, "We consider ourselves a complement of urban, R&B and "Quiet Storm" - all formats like that.

"We have a 'Whisper Softly' show from 8 pm to midnight Monday through Friday which was inspired by the 'Quiet Storm' format.

"It's rated number one in the New Haven metro book of ARBitron for its day-part," Jordan said.

He added that while the station doesn't make a concerted effort to reach a teen audience, "for 11 hours - from Saturday night at 7 pm to 6 am Sunday morning we have what we call 'Dance Party,' where we include rap music and other cuts that, well, fit into a 'Dance Party' mode."

Jordan said that the Big NBMC

operate audio and video consoles, audio tape recorders, microphones and other media equipment.

NBMC endorses PCI and congratulates it for its innovative and inspirational program. Pluria Marshall, chairman of NBMC, says "I am especially proud of Pyramid's contribution to the Apple's reach into the New Haven market, coupled with the local CHR station's heavy rotation of black oriented product, makes competition for listeners keen.

"We're knonw as the exclusive urban station in town where you can get free albums and tickets to major shows in the area," Jordan explained. "It's nice that people listen to Kiss (WRKS), but instead of offering them tickets to a show in New Jersey, we can offer them the freebies to the New Haven Coliseum."

While the station's playlist consists largely of acts like Cherrelle with Alexander O'Neal, Janet Jackson, L.L. Cool J, the Rose Brothers, Prince, Stevie Wonder, the Isley Brothers, Starpoint, etc., Jordan said, "We don't like to be the last to add a record - add after it's hot.

"Arista (Records) held a party where Whitney Houston performed, even before her first single hit," Jordan recalled. "I knew then that she was going to be big. I didn't have to wait for the record to gain radio adds."

The University of New Haven graduate, coming from a background in record retailing, started his career in radio at New Haven station WYBC 10 years ago, where he was on the airwaves for a year and then promoted to music director and program honcho.

He was there four years total before moving to WNHC. After one year, he moved into his current role, one he's handled, in addition to afternoon mike chores, for the past five years.

"I really enjoy being the music director more than program director," Jordan admitted, adding, "I feel like I know music, have an ear for it.

ear for it. "When you're program director," he continued, "you become a problem solver. "'PD' should stand for

"'PD' should stand for 'Problem solver," he said.



AL GREEN BRINGS GOSPEL TO WILTERN THEATRE

Who ever said going to church couldn't be a blast? In view of Rev. Al Green's frequently arduous performance at the Wiltern Theatre in Los Angeles recently, even the most steadfast heathen would repent while under the spell of this former R&B matinee idol.

Still rightly considered a premier soul singer, Green croons with the smooth delivery of a legend like Sam Cooke, and is capable of the kind of vocal gymnastics that the best gospel singers are judged by.

But then Green's Memphisbased R&B is still the foundation of his current gospel repertoire, which this evening included songs from his current A&M Records LP, <u>He</u> <u>Is the Light</u>, plus several standards like "Amazing Grace" and refurbished versions of old hits like "How Do You Mend A Broken Heart" and "Let's Stay Together."

Backed by a six-piece band and three background singers, Green romped around the stage - joyously singing, preaching and tossing out roses to women who consistently rushed the stage.

Unfortunately, two paranoid bodyguards shadowed the singer's every move, rudely shooing fans away and creating a tremendous distraction.

Rev. Al should take a lesson from Prince who, when he appeared at the Universal Amphitheatre recently, showed up with bodyguards who could sing and dance! These guys employed by Green didn't even show any signs of natural rhythm...

Nevertheless, Green proved once again that pure rhythm and blues has never strayed far away from the church probably since that's where it was derived from in the first place.

Green's only flaw at the Wiltern was that he chose not to include classic treasures like "Love and Happiness" and "Take Me to the River," two compositions that (with a bit of reworking) would fit snugly into his sanctified songbag.



Another A&M artist, Tramaine, opened the show with a long set of soul-based gospel that spotlighted her strengths as a singer. More important though, Tramaine (Hawkins) has recorded "Fall Down (Spirit of Love)," a propulsive dance single with gospel lyrics that has cracked the dance charts.

Tramaine has a voice to be reckoned with. However, due to her shortage of really memorable material, she should have edited her set down to 45 minutes and not stretched it out to what was an anti-climatic hour and a half.
