




MICHAEL JACKSON SMOOTH CRIMINAL EPIC

### SINGLES

THE FOUR TOPS—IF EVER A LOVE THERE WAS—ARISTA—This veteran supergroup teams up with the first lady of soul, Aretha, to bring this beautiful and soulful ballad to life. Produced by Jerry Knight and Aaron Zigman, and utilizing the exclusive talent of Kenny G. for soloing duties, this down-beat and sexy single is a shoo-in for top ten charting and crossover action. Adult demos.

**KENNY G—SILHOUETTE—ARISTA—**The debut single off the new LP of the same name, "Silhouette" spotlights Kenny as he gracefully puts his tenor sax trademark on this Blues instrumental release. Written and produced by "G," this new offering will no doubt climb the charts as quickly if not faster than his top ten smash single "Songbird." For young and adult demos.

CHAKA KHAN—IT'S MY PARTY—WARNER BROTHERS—Chaka graciously invites everyone to join in and party to this smoking new cut off her LP C.K. On this upbeat single produced by Russ Titleman, mixed by Gary Wright and written by Womack and Womack, Ms. Khan sounds better than ever (is that possible?) and makes you want to get up and dance along. A sure bet to zoom up the charts with lightning speed. For young and adult demos.

**TEDDY PENDERGRASS—LOVE IS THE POWER—ELEKTRA—**Teddy powers ahead with his new release off the *Joy* LP. Using choral background vocals and a singing sax solo, he creates a seductive, down-beat cut with the distinctive, earthy sound that has become his trademark. Adult demos.




STARPOINT—HOT TO THE TOUCH—ELEKTRA—This Baltimore-based group releases its ninth LP in as many years and it's the classiest to date. Sharing production chores are long-time Starpoint producer Lionel Job, Bernard Edwards (Chic/Power Station/Jody Watley), Ernesto Phillips and the group. The result: some very hip Pop/R&B music cuts including the hot new single "Say You Will" and the funky title cut. For young adult demos.

TOM SCOTT—FLASHPOINT—GRP—Tom Scott brings out some of the funkiest sax sounds around on this new release. Using hot session musicians (Dean Parks and Michael Landau on guitars; Vinnie Colaiuta on drums; Neil Stubenhauson on electric bass; and Michael Fisher on percussion) Scott creates a Pop/Jazz Fusion LP that will rock the airwaves loose. Look out for the upbeat cut "Down to the Wire" with a tasty guitar solo by Michael Landau and "Get A Grip" with the slapping bass sound of Neil Stubenhaus carrying the rhythm parts. For adult and young adult demos.

MARTIKA—MARTIKA—COLUMBIA—Cuban-American Martika breaks out on the Dance/Club scene with her hot debut LP. Produced by Michael Jay (Five Star, Miami Sound Machine, Stephanie Mills), this LP has more than top ten potential on Urban airwaves and it's a must for clubs. Watch for the 12" single "More Than You Know" remixed by the master Jellybean. For young adult demos.

**LEE RITENOUR—FESTIVAL—GRP—**On his latest LP, Ritenour continues to reveal his fascination with Brazilian music. His second all-acoustic LP in the South American mode (the first was *Rio*, released nine years ago), Lee shows his musical prowess on cuts like the upbeat Samba selection, "Latin Lovers," with acoustic guitar help and lead vocals by Brazilian artist Joao Bosco; "Rio Sol" and "NY/Brazil," featuring the funk/slap bass sounds of Marcus Miller; and "Humana," with the hot sax of Ernie Watts. A very classy, smooth LP for Jazz and Jazz Fusion buffs.

#### **HERMAN PEARSON** KBWH/Omaha, NE

MICHAEL JACKSON "SMOOTH CRIMINAL"

Jackson is back with another out-of-the-box smash. Great beat and a great club song as well. (Check out the newlyreleased video!) When I think he's done his best, another smash hit appears. Top of the chart for both Urban and Pop. Teens and young adult demographics.

#### **DONNA ALLEN** "HEAVEN ON EARTH"

Allen is back and she's hot. This jam should go the distance for her. Hot phones.

#### FREDDIE JACKSON "HEY LOVER"



### YBPC Award Balloting Underway

IRVING, TX: Awards balloting for the Young Black Programmers Coalition 11th Annual Meeting was kicked off at the national chapter's recent meeting in New Orleans. The awards banquet will be held Nov. 12th at the Westin Galleria Hotel in Houston. "Best of the Year" award categories include: AM Programmer, AM Music Director, Promotion Person, Public Service Director, New Artist, Record Company, Station, Street/Club Announcer, General Manager and Humanitarian. In addition to these categories, three individuals will be cited for outstanding support of the YBPC.

Unlike past YBPC awards presentations, only the individuals with the highest votes will be announced at this year's event. "We did this to cut the time involved—both on counting ballots and to expedite the awards program," said Dee Roquemore, co-chairman of the awards committee.

Last year's recipients included Joe Bullard, AM PD of the Year; Brute Bailey/WDJY, FM PD Director of the Year; and Mike Austin, Promotions Person of the Year.

### WOL-AM Owner Wins Award

HOUSTON: Catherine L. Hughes, owner of radio station WOL-AM/Washington, DC, is the recipient of the 1988 KOOL Achiever Award in the Communications category.

Pluria Marshall, chairman of the National Black Media Coaltion, presented her with a \$10,000 award for sponsor Brown & Williamson Tobacco Corporation. The money will be donated to a non-profit, community service organization of Hughes' choice.

### FCC To Review License Renewal

WASHINGTON: The National Association of Broadcasters has asked the Federal Communications Commission to modify its license renewal process to eliminate the potential for abuse. NAB has also asked the agency to adopt a clearly defined policy with respect to the comparative renewal proceedings."

"For too long, those filing competing applications and petitions to deny have been extracting payment in some form from broadcasters in order to drop their challenges," said NAB joint board chairman Wallace Jorgenson. "It is time for the Commission to step in."

Widespread abuse of the FCC process has been substantiated by a survey of stations that have undergone license renewals or transfers of ownership since January 1, 1985. Data was collected from over 900 stations on a confidential basis by the accounting firm of Peat Marwick Main & Co.

The study shows that over half of the actual and threatened challenges were accompanied by requests for redress.

Over the past 20 years, Anderson has held a variety of prominent positions at major record labels, most recently serving as senior vice president of marketing for the Epic/ Portrait, CBS Associated Labels of CBS Records. He has been involved with developing acts such as Gloria Estefan & Miami Sound Machine, Cherrelle, Alexander O'Neal and Tony Terry, as well as a roster of established artists—including Michael Jackson and Luther Vandross.

"There's so much talent out there and so few qualified and knowledgeable people to represent it," Anderson said, adding that his company is "dedicated to the discovery and development of new artists possessing both genuine ability and broad-based commercial appeal.

"There's no better feeling than being a part of breaking new acts and giving them the personal attention that can pave the way to success," Anderson told BRE. "And that's what I'm all about."


Whitney Houston, Oprah Winfrey, Natalie Cole, Julio Iglesias, and The Winans are among the personalities who will appear on the telethon this year.

#### Carl Maduri Forms Oceana Records

LOS ANGELES: Carl Maduri, whose credits include having produced Wild Cherry's "Play That Funky Music" and Maureen McGovern's Academy Award-winning "The Morning After," has formed Hollywood, Floridabased Oceana Records, to be distributed by Atco Records division of Atlantic Recording Corp.

The label's first release will be an LP and single entitled "Heaven On Earth," by r&b/pop artist Donna Allen. Subsequent releases will follow by r&b singer Nicole, although Maduri describes Oceana as a label "encompassing all types of product. And I believe that Florida is going to be a market where the record business will really start exploding. We're here with a first class operation already in place."

One of Oceana's label executives is Timmy Thomas, recently named vp of promotion. As a recording artist, Thomas earned a five million seller with his single "Why Can't We Live Together?," before heading promotion at TK Records in the late '70s.



y age 13 he was a teen idol in his homeland of South Africa on the strength of his captivating, Pop-flavored covers of American 'golden oldies' tunes. In 1986 his debut LP for Jive/RCA Records, Introducing Jonathan Butler, became a Top 10 jazz record, and his follow-up self-titled double LP included one track, "Lies," that was nominated for a Grammy in the Best R&B single category.

His current release, More Than Friends, reveals even more dimensions of this talented 27-year-old. He shows a decided flair for the funk on the LP's first single "There's One Born Every Minute (I'm A Sucker For You)" and on the tough 'n' ready Teddy Riley-produced "She's Hot (Burning Up)," a textbook example of the aggressive, urban-styled powers of Hip Hop.

Butler, a born again Christian who once led his own evangelical ministry, also teams with gospel great Vanessa Bell Armstrong on the sweetly uplifting "True Love Never Fails."

Butler's ability to cover a broad range of styles is no surprise to Richard B. Smith, RCA's vice president, black music promotion.

"Jonathan is a superlative," said Smith.
"He is a singer-songwriter of the first magnitude, and a guitarist of deep expression and great virtuosity. I'm sure that listening to his current LP will provide you with musical confirmation of my enthusiasm."

In a telephone interview from London, Butler stated that working on the LP "was a lotta fun, I can tell you. It was a challenge because songs I'd done in the and I enjoyed it because Teddy is so spontaneous. Coming up with new ideas is what I wanted to do on this record." On the other hand, the 'major hit potential' of the new LP is a subject that Butler modestly sidesteps.

"Every track on the record feels wonderful to me," he acknowledged, "and it is a very personal record because my music reflects what's happening in my life. But I leave it to the record company to worry about 'hits.' I never think about 'hits' or 'my market' or radio formats.

"What I do comes from my heart. If I had to pressure myself with thoughts of making the Top 40, something natural would be lost."

Butler credits his "family and friends" with inspiring his music. On the other hand, His manager, Mike Noble of the London-based Running Dog Management Company, said: "Representing Jonathan as a songwriter would be enough incentive for any management company. To additionally be involved in his career as a singer, guitarist and entertainer helps keep me inspired 365 days of the year!"

Barry Weiss, vice president marketing/operations, Jive Records, describes Butler as "an artist that all artists strive to be—soulful, earnest, hardworking, deep, substantial and committed to his craft. He's one of the most unique and special artists on the Jive roster, a man of great spiritual convictions—both to his family and to his work.

"We see him representing a modern day return to great songwriting, singing, playing, and music in general," Weiss said Than Friends were chosen from over 50 new songs that he and Skinner penned together.

"I've heard of composers agonizing for months over one song, but I'd choose another profession if it took me that long! Before I called you, I wrote a song in about 20 minutes," he estimated, adding: "I admit that it's better to write a few quality songs than hundreds of stupid ones."

Butler's tunes are of such high calibre that they've been recorded by artists such as Al Jarreau, George Benson, Billy Ocean, The Pointer Sisters, Regina Belle and Tom Jones. One of Butler's personal favorites is the aforementioned "True Love Never Fails."

"If I'm feeling low, that song always cheers me. Vanessa sings with me so beautifully on it," said Butler who, while recording, had to tell her "I don't know what to sing, where to go!" because Armstrong came up with so many aweinspiring vocal runs. "She brought something out of me that I didn't know was there. Add that to the fact that we both share a love of Christ." Butler's long-range plans include recording Gospel-oriented music: "I'm doing what I need to do now so that one day I can do more of what I want to do."

Having toured last year with Whitney Houston, the singer looks forward to January, the month his tour in support of *More Than Friends* is scheduled to start. It particularly pleases him that American audiences are so receptive to his music.

"I don't even listen to the radio much in London because the music that gets played here is not what I'm doing. I get

past made me seem much older than I am. I'm young and this is a young man's LP."

Butler, who was able to leave South Africa's repressive environment for good in 1984, and now regards England as his homebase, added: "I'm truly happy. Every day that I wake I feel grateful. It's as if I'm beginning to live again."

The singer-guitarist, whose songwriting partner is Jolyon Skinner, first met Teddy Riley when the young, hitproducing funkmeister was in London to work with another Jive/RCA star, Kool Moe Dee, on his How Ya Like Me Now? LP. "We talked, played a little pool, but that was it. When the record company suggested that we work together, my answer was 'I'd love to do it!'

"We worked for two days on the track,

Butler seems to be in that category of composers like Stevie Wonder, Prince, and Luther Vandross who seem so consumed by music and the sheer pleasure of creating it, that the possibility of their ever running out of song ideas seems unthinkable.

The idea is unthinkable to Butler too: "When I was just a kid growing up in the ghetto, Stevie Wonder was someone I'd look at and think, 'I want to be like him.' Music flows from him, and God has blessed me to where writing music is something that comes easily for me

"I started recording at 12, and I've made 30 LPs since then...that's hundreds of songs right there." In preparation for his 1987 double LP Butler wrote "40 or 50 songs," and the 12 tracks on *More* 

letters from Americans telling me how my music makes them feel, and I consider that a blessing.

"Why my wife and I have resisted the temptation to move to America is something I don't know the answer to," he said. "We love London but sometimes I feel like I'm missing something by not living in America." A family man and proud of it, Butler avoids "hanging out in the pubs and doing the club scene. I'm not living with blinders on. It's just that I'm not as 'reckless' as I once was."

Butler is also inspired by remaining mindful of "where I came from," he said

said.
"How I'm living now is like a dream, and I know that God has a plan for me. Music has brought me so much joy. This is all I want to do until the day I die."

WJYL-FM 101 signed on the Louisville airwaves in 1984. At that time, WJYL was Louisville's only FM Urban radio station and four years later it still holds that position.

WJYL is a communityoriented station and will retain that posture because of its commitment to "Pride and Progress" in their great city.

WJYL sponsors and supports several community events and issues including: the Kentucky Derby Festival, KFC Shootout, Gospelfest, the Louisville Urban League, Metro Parks. Clothe-A-Child, Latchkey Alliance, ACES, Champions Against Drugs, YWCA, Ft. Knox Family Day, Calif. Cooler

#### **METRO AREA PROFILE**

The Louisville Metropolitan area encompasses seven counties: Jefferson, Bullitt, Oldham and Shelby in Kentucky, plus Clark, Floyd and Harrison Counties in Indiana. There are 787,000 residents living in these seven counties and a black population of 117,845. An extraordinary 93% or 109,698 of these black residents live in only one of these seven counties: Jefferson.

The four top radio stations in Louisville are WAMZ/Country, WHAS/Adult Contemporary, WQMF/Rock and WJYL/Urban.

In June of 1984, Inter-Urban Broadcastina purchased WZZX from Publicast Communications. WZZX, then a Countryformatted station, went to an Easy Listening format between 1982 and 1984. At the time of the sale WZZX was a Top 40 station. The call letters were changed to WJYL and the format was gradually shifted to Urban Contemporary.

In December of 1987 the station was sold to present owners Louisville Radio Limited Partnership. WJYL is its only Urban station. Paul Fink, VP & GM of WJYL, is also GM of the Partnership's station WLMX in Chattanooga,







# The Joy of R&B Reissues

**Billy Stewart One More Time MCA-Chess** 



Sugarpie Desanto **Down in the Basement MCA-Chess** 



A double LP of Billy Stewart! Who is Billy Stewart (?), you might rightfully ask. Well, he was one of those seminal influences on the urban music scene who came and went (1937-1970) before most people knew he was even here; all he did was leave a musical legacy that is still being referred to by the current crop of commercial vocalists

(whether they know it or not).

The Washington, DC-born Stewart occasionally worked with Marvin Gaye during their teen years. He was also a member of the Stewart Gospel Singers, his mother's group, and a protege (during the mid-'50s) of Bo Diddley'swhich is how he came to record for the latter's label, Chess, in the first place. The work here thoroughly represents Stewart's Chess years, from his 1956 "Billy's Blues (Part II)" to his "I'm In Love," 1969. "Fat Boy" and "Motormouth" were but two of Stewart's more prominent nicknames. He was called the former by virtue of his size. But the reasons for the latter handle are best explained by listening to him sing tunes like "Sugar and Spice" and "Strange Feeling," where his rapid-fire word doubling technique is shown to good effect. But Stewart's reading of standards brought him his widest exposure. Such tunes as "Secret Love" and Gershwin's "Summertime," his all-time seller (into the R&B and Pop Chart Top 10, summer '66) were his most popular vehicles. Had the young vocalist not met an untimely end in a North Carolina auto accident, no telling how far he would have gone in the music biz.

Again, the MCA-Chess series has scored, this time with a sassy set of sides by a singer little known outside her Bay Area-Windy City sphere of influence and performance. Born Umpeylia Marsema Balinton, it's no wonder this unheralded R&B royal allowed herself a new moniker! Desanto favors such queens of the genre as Ruth Brown, Laverne Baker and Dinah Washington, while presaging the likes of Millie Jackson, Denise LaSalle, and Jeannie Cheatham (Desanto's 1964 "Slip-In Mules" and Cheatham's 1986 "Meet Me With Your Black Drawers On" are more than distant relatives). Cuts such as "Mama Didn't Raise No Fool" and "Do I Make Myself Clear?" are the kind of funky musical statements that soul sisters-especially those who sing for a living-have been making for many decades before femlib was a glint in Gloria Steinam's eye. Desanto, a cynosure of what the man was talking about when he coined the phrase "hot little number," is as at home on "In the Basement," a Blues-bottomed duet done here with Etta James, as she is on her own previously unreleased "She's Got Everything." Desanto not only sings a song, she makes a statement.

#### **Curtis Mayfield** Live In Europe Curtom

Curtis Mayfield-storyteller, philosopher, lover, singer-composer extraordinaire—has struck again. This time at various points in Europe. Live. And the music, most of it performed many times before, is as fresh as ever. The opening


cut, "Ice-9" performed by a Chicagobased rhythm section of the same name, features the percussion power of master conga drummer Master Henry Gibson. After that, it's all the meister singer in his familiar role—that hauntingly delicate voice always threatening to explode with megaton force. Curtis, the king, is "Back to the World" and "It's Alright/ Amen," 'cause he loves a "Gypsy Woman" and "Freddie's Dead," 'cause of the "Pusherman." He tells us "We've Gotta Have Peace," but he knows "We've Only Just Begun," so "People Get Ready" to "Move On Up," 'cause "If There's a Hell Below," we don't want to be there "When Seasons Change." Yeah, this is a masterful monologue, as well as a fun double LP.


**Various Artists** The Best of Chess Vocal Groups



Now that the redoubtable Chess catalog is in the hands of MCA, we can expect to see (and hear) much of the world's greatest R&B music on a regular basis. Curiously, though, the work here is a bit uneven in presentation. Some of the sides--"Long Lonely Nights" by Lee Andrews & The Hearts, The Pastels' "Been So Long," "Blue Velvet" by the Moonglows and The Dells' "Oh What a Night"—are immortal. However, other selections chosen for this album are hardly the best possible pieces from the respective artists' repertoires. For example, (Harvey and) The Moonglows' "In My Diary," on this LP, in no way ranks with their "Sincerely," "Most of All" or "Ten Commandments of Love." There are a few other debateable choices in this "Best Vocal" collection but, overall, this waxed compendium, like its sister releases, goes a long way toward filling the holes either in a personal collection or that of a radio station airing to an Oldies audience.

### ED TOWNSEND: Artist/Producer/Composer Extraordinaire





"You see, Spider," he said, "Horace Heidt was very similar to what Ed McMahon and 'Star Search' are today. He was always searching for new talent." Townsend's first shot at stardom happened right in the midst of the Korean War: "I thought it was a bit unusual, but (Heidt's representatives) were serious and asked if I would be interested in joining the orchestra.

"A couple of days later I received a

dispatch from the Commanding General of the 1st Marine Division. I was taken out of combat and introduced personally to Horace Heidt. He regularly featured amateurs and I won talent contests he sponsored nine straight times. I was then made a permanent part of the show."

When Townsend completed his active duty assignment and came back to the States, there was a plane ticket and a \$1,000 check from Heidt waiting for him. "I came to California and lived at his ranch. And that was the beginning of my career," he said.

While living on the Coast, Townsend met Nat "King" Cole and he wrote a song for the velvet-toned superstar called "That's the Way the Ball Bounces." Cole, in turn, sent Townsend to Capitol Records where he was signed

to a recording contract.

In 1958, Townsend had his first million seller, "For Your Love," a song that still generates huge royalty checks for the artist. In later years, he became known as the ace producer who wrote huge hits for other artists including "Let's Get It On" (Marvin Gaye), "The Love Of My Man" (Theola Kilgore), "Finally Got Myself Together (The Impressions), "Foolish Fool" (Dionne Warwick), and "If You Want It" (The Main Ingredient).

Townsend has also penned material for Brook Benton, Maxine Brown, The Shirelles, Gloria Lynn, Chuck Jackson...and the list goes on. Even years back when he was still a Memphis high school student contemplating a career in law, Townsend's musical ability was discovered when he wrote a commercial for Stewart's Mayonnaise.

"At that time," he recalled, "getting paid \$400 for fifteen minutes worth of work seemed like that was the thing to do!" Still residing in Los Angeles, Townsend has two sons (Michael and David) living here also. In fact, last year David Townsend wrote, produced and sang on his first big hit, "Happy," by Columbia Records recording group Surface.

Townsend and his sons communicate on a daily basis and are a close-knit unit. "The business has been very good to me in many ways," he said. "I was able to retain the publishing on a lot of the songs that I wrote. And on the songs where I don't have all the publishing, at least I retained a percentage."

The savvy Townsend made sound investments in copyrights and Marvin Gaye was one of the artists who fought by his side in the battle-for-publishing that does occur in the record industry. Towsend points to no-nonsense men like Al Bell of the Gordy company as the type of leader that young songwriter/producers coming into the business today should look up to and emulate.

As for Townsend himself, he is happily at work on his next hit!

# RON ELLISON

# Developing an 'Identifiable Image' at Polydor

hicago-born Ron Ellison, Polydor/Wing Records' Vice-President of R&B Promotion & Artist Relations, got an impressive start in the music business: "After I graduated from Roosevelt University, majoring in music theory and sight singing, I began playing percussion and keyboards at Chess Records' studios. In fact, I grew up with Maurice White (of EW&F) and we spent many years in those studios playing on records

After a stint on tour with The Impressions, Ron completed his musical 'education': "In 1972, I joined Warner Brothers Records as a local merchandiser putting posters in stores and that's when my industry career began," he recalls. "To begin with, I did miss playing music, although I don't miss it as much now as I used to when I made that transition. There's no question that you get a real charge when you see people enjoying what you do. But I think that through the years, I've found a way in the business part of this industry to get as excited as I was when I was a musician, by working with other people and helping them to be successful."

A three-year stint as local promotion

man, then midwest regional promotion manager, gave the young executive an opportunity to assist Warners in breaking into the black music arena. "We had Ashford & Simpson, Bootsy and Tower of Power among others. But 1976 was really our banner year, the year we really broke loose with r&b at Warners." Ellison continued with the company until 1978, working with acts like George Benson and Al Jarreau as they established themselves in the marketplace.

"I started at PolyGram in '78 as national promotion director for Mercury Records, based in Chicago. We had The Bar-Kays, ConFunkShun, The Gap Band and one of the very first rap records with Kurtis Blow," Ron recalls.

He was reunited with childhood friend Maurice White in 1980 when he moved to California and joined the ARC label: "It was great to be working with Maurice again and during that two years when I was senior vice-president at the company, we did pretty well with Earth, Wind & Fire, Deniece Williams, The Emotions, Weather Report and D.J. Rogers.'

In 1983, Ron decided to step out on his own to form an independent promotion company: "I had some great clients-I worked with CBS, PolyGram, Warners, Elektra, A&M, Atlantic. I did pretty well until some people in the business started misusing the privileges and that caused a problem for everyone involved because it really put a stigma on indie promotion."

Ron returned to Warners as Vice-President of Promotion at the beginning of 1986 and ended his tenure there at the end of 1987, during which time the company enjoyed considerable success with Atlantic Starr ("a No.1 across-theboard with "Always") and Club

At the beginning of this year, he accepted a new challenge: "I became director of promotion for the black music division at PolyGram, based in Los Angeles. I'd talked with (executives) Wayman Jones and Bob Jameson so I knew what developments were planned in terms of the company's reorganization, that the labels were going to be split up so that we could really take advantage of the amount of product we had coming through."

Ron feels that with the creation of Polydor and Mercury as distinct entities,

"we can establish the labels all the way from the studio to the consumer. Not only do artists have images, so do record labels and we want both Polydor and Mercury to have strong, identifiable images with the public. By making this move, the entire company should have a greater market share because I know some really good records didn't get a chance to get established when we were working with just the one label."

With a roster that includes The Reddings, The Commodores, Rene Moore, Deon Estus, Carl Anderson, Junior, Channel Two, Marlena Shaw, Walter Beasley and Wing artists such as Vanessa Williams and Tony!Toni!Tone, Ron is naturally excited about his immediate prospects for success with Polydor, noting that the company is actively seeking "new talent-not just 'run of the mill' artists."

Ron adds that his own enthusiasm stems from the challenges that lie ahead: "Part of the reason I took this on was because I wanted to make this company run like a well-oiled machine. I want Polydor to stand next to all of its competitors and be respected as much as any other label in the marketplace. Of course, there's friendly rivalry with Wayman and his team at Mercury—I want to win but I also want our sister label to win too. Besides, some very good friends of mine work over there, people for whom I have a lot of respect."

He explains that when the reorganization began, "Wayman and I sat down and looked at the staff as it was: Bob Jameson and Dick Asher both told us that in the initial stages of the change, they didn't want anyone to be hurt or to lose their jobs as a result of what the company was doing. We came up with an even split among the people we had in the field. It was not an easy thing to do because we had a lot of good people."

Ron went to the marketplace to hire the additional ten staff he needed: "I did some very close screening to get the best people I could find and I'm extremely excited because we have a team of 70% industry veterans and 30% rookies. I think it's very important for us as executives to look at new, fresh blood, people who have the potential to be good record people, then hire those people and take the time to train them properly, especially in the early stages of their careers."

ith the recent reorganization of PolyGram Records into two distinct labels— Polydor and Mercury— Wayman Jones, Vice-President of Promotion & Artist Relations, Black/ Urban Music for Mercury Records, finds himself with a number of exciting new challenges: "Now we'll be able to really concentrate on high level product and do a good promotion and marketing job; we'll be able to work our product much more effectively. We had a lot of releases when everything was under one label sometimes I had 16 or 17 singles out at one time and that was just too much.

"Now, with the two labels, we can develop more of a market share. Since we're both part of the same overall family (with PolyGram), there will be that friendly, competitive rivalry but we want both Mercury and Polydor to succeed in a major way. Naturally," smiles Wayman, "we want to be slightly ahead!"

Wayman says his original career plans didn't call for work in the music industry: "I was going to Temple University and I planned a degree in medical studies but while I was still in school, I started working with a record distributor—a one-stop—in Philly and being in the business sounded exciting to me."

Leaving the business to become a paralegal with Amtrak/Conrail for a year, Wayman smiles: "It was unbelievably boring and since I had a brother at a record distributor in Philly, I started working there, at Schwartz Brothers. I did promotion and some of the labels I handled included Motown, Arista, Prelude, T.K. and Malaco. As the company got more and more into video, I went to work with RCA doing promotion."


In 1979, Wayman began the first of a couple of stints with PolyGram. "I started out working with Bob Frost and Sonny Taylor as a regional promotion man for Polydor covering Baltimore, Washington D.C., Virginia and Philly. I did that for about a year-and-a-half until the label merged with Mercury. At the time, we had acts like Gloria Gaynor, Roy Ayers, Peaches & Herb and The Fatback Band but I'd say we were primarily a dance music label."

A four-year stint with Arista Records (1981-85) "is where I learned the most because I was dealing with major markets and some really nice artists, like Angela Bofill, Norman Connors and Ray

Parker Jr. There was a lot of what I'd call 'performance pressure,' especially since I was dealing with practically the entire Northeast region including New York. I was really into the music but I learned just how hard-nosed the business could be."

Pursuing his earlier career ambitions once more, Wayman decided he wanted to go back to medical school. "Harold Childs and Rowena Harris offered me a job at PolyGram but I told them I only wanted a small market, like Philadelphia. But when I got to the company, I found out that the deal wasn't that—there had been a real miscommunication and it was really a regional situation."

Finally resolving that "I wasn't going to complete my medical studies," Wayman began his present tenure with the company, starting out as Regional Promotion Manager covering New York, Connecticut, Philadelphia and Boston, under national promotion chief, Leroy Little. When Little left, Wayman took over his responsibilities, altered just months ago with the reorganization of the company.

"We've been setting up systems that will work administratively and of course, reorganizing the staff," Wayman notes.

"We divided the roster with Mercury having mostly East Coast-based acts: we have Angela Winbush, Kool & The Gang, Kurtis Blow, The Bar-Kays, artists from Atlanta Artists such as Cameo and Cashflow and from Tin Pan Apple, The Fat Boys." With the splitting of personnel, Wayman has hired six new staff members to bring his total promotion staff to 12: "With 20 acts to work instead of 40, it's a whole lot nicer. I have a group of people who'll go the extra yard and there's a real team type of work ethic here."

Acknowledging members of the company's staff such as Tony Prendatt ("a great a&r guy who has spent a lot of time and effort building the company's artistic foundation"), Joe Lewis (National Singles Director), Wilson Lindsey (National Field Director), Beverly Paige (Publicity Director) and his assistant Zsa Zsa Wright ("I couldn't make it for a day without her!"), Wayman is confident about Mercury's future: "This company has had such a strong presence in the rock and pop arenas that it may have discouraged black artists but we're really developing in the urban area and we want to attract even more strong talent."

TAKE 6—GOLD MINE—REPRISE/WB—This seems to be the year for Top Ten a capella songs ("Don't Worry, Be Happy") and this gem is no exception. A multi-talented sextet, Take 6, mixes Jazz and Gospel to form a six-part harmony that will blow your mind. For adult demos.

ICE-T—I'M YOUR PUSHER—SIRE/WB—Ice-T slams home the first single off the *Power* LP with an updated version of Curtis Mayfield's "Pusher Man." Complete with an anti-drug PSA, Ice raps his way through the streets of L.A. preaching this hip "stay straight" cut with an up-to-date message. For young adult demos.

YAZZ AND THE PLASTIC POPULATION—THE ONLY WAY'S UP—ELEKTRA—Already a #1 U.K. smash hit, this sizzling 12" single is ready for the same attention in the U.S. The House-Disco dance trak was produced by the cool London DJ team of Jonathan Moore and Matt Block (aka COLDCUT) and will blow the roof off Dance/Club arenas. For teen and young adult demos.

STANLEY CLARKE—FUNNY HOW TIME FLIES (WHEN YOU'RE HAVING FUN)—PORTRAIT/CBS—Stanley is certainly having fun talking the language he knows best—bass guitar. Arranged and produced by Clarke and Byron Miller, the R&B and Jazz-flavored cut uses flowing horn and guitar tracks that complement and harmonize with his incredible bass work to form this exciting selection. For adult demos.

N.W.A.—GANGSTA GANGSTA—RUTHLESS/PRIORITY—These six Compton homeboys lay down a dope rap spiked with outspoken views on a variety of social issues. Using the boom bottom and scratchin', with super production by Dr. Dre and D.J. Yella, this cut should walk it down. For teen and young adults.

MARC "MARCO" ANTHONY—REBEL—BLUEDOG/SUTRA—Twenty-year-old "Marco" puts his songwriting and vocal talent to the test on this new 12" single. They *both* pass with flying colors. Dance/ Club mixing along with hot vocals form an Urban-flavored selection that should garner heavy rotation on Club and Urban formats. For teen and young adult demos.

NEW CHOICE—FUNNY FEELING—KING JAY/WB—New Choice blasts off with this smokin' new Dance/Club single off their LP At Last. Using top-notch production techniques by Khayree, hot drum and rhythm tracks and groovin' house mixes, this is a hole-in-one for Urban and Club playlists. Give a good listen to the "It Ain't Funny" 12" in remix. For young adult demos.

INNER CITY—BIG FUN—VIRGIN—Already a smash hit in the clubs, Inner City creates a Dance cut with a new sound enhanced vocally by Paris. Shining recording and House mixing makes this top ten material for Urban airwaves. Teen and young adult demos.

THE DREAM FEATURING BOB BALDWIN—A LONG WAY TO GO—JAZZ MALACO—Keyboardist Bob Baldwin has written songs for top recording artists like Deniece Williams, Kool & The Gang and Tom Browne. 

TELEX—LOONEY TUNES—ATLANTIC—This hot trio from Belgium invades the U.S. with their new debut LP on this label. Using cool rhythms, sound effects and electronic synth/pop music, they create a dazzling array of tunes targeted for clubs and Urban airwaves. Look out for the first single "Temporary Chicken," a funky tongue-in-cheek cut and the danceable upbeat "Spike Jones," with unique vocal overdubs. For young adult demos.

KASSAV'—VINI POU—COLUMBIA—With their first American release and debut LP on Columbia, Kassav' creates an unusual and fun-to-listen-to Dance LP in the Euro-Western Pop mode. Blending African rhythms with Caribbean carnival sounds, they create a style that is known as Zouk music. Its infectious party feel is heard on cuts like "Sye' Bwa" and "Flash." For adult demos and unique music lovers.

RUSH HOUR—BUMPER TO BUMPER—GALA—This five-piece band made up of some of Chicago's finest session musicians gets down to business on their funky debut LP. 



#### **BOOTSY COLLINS:** A TRUE **FUNK HERO**

onsidered one of the true funk heroes of the '70s. Bootsy Collins has returned to the music scene with an appropriately-titled Columbia Records LP, What's Bootsy Doin'?. With a mixture of hard funk and slow jams, James Brown's former bass man comes back slammin'.

#### •Bootsy, where va heen?

"From 1980 until I did my last record (in 1983), I didn't want to be out here the way I had been. My funk was being used against me. I had to be this character Bootsy all the time and although I was glad it happened when it did, I just didn't want all the intensity of being 'on' all the time. So I went back to Cincinnati and worked around little groups here and there. I also played with folks

like George (Clinton), Keith Richards, Afrika Bambaataa. Herbie Hancock, Trouble Funk, Malcolm McLaren and Micowave."

#### •Preparing this LP

"I've been working on this record for about five years now! Originally, I was doing it for Warner Brothers and that didn't work out. Then I was doing it for Arista and that didn't work out either, so here I am at Columbia. The material on the LP is a combination of songs, some new, some I began writing back in '83 and updated. It's been a process putting this LP together. I felt like a pack rat in a cheese factory!"

#### •Being in the *spotlight*

"I wasn't ready for it when it happened. I'd come off the road and I couldn't go to the shopping centers, or go get groceries without people saying 'hey, Bootsy,' When I went home, there'd be a crowd of kids on the porch all the time. Now I've got a handle on it and I've learned how to be Bootsy on stage and leave it behind."

#### •Early days with Jame**s** Brown

'I really got started with James—I was just 15 years old. I was playing as a session guy at King Records' studios in Cincinnati on Brewster Avenue and one time, one of James' musicians didn't make it—and it happened to be the bass player and that was it! I played on records like 'Sex Machine,' 'Licking Stick' and 'Say It Loud, I'm Black And I'm Proud.' It was incredible working with The Godfather."

#### STANLEY JORDAN: HE'S AN ORIGINAL

uitarist extraordinaire and Grammy nominee Stanley Jordan has been winning over audiences with his distinctive style and tasteful musicianship. His new EMI LP. Flying Home—produced by R&B/Pop producer Preston Glass, and featuring material by such luminaries as Larry Graham, Maurice White and Philip Bailey-reflects Stanley's desire to explore new musical territory.

•'Flying Home'

This is the type of music I've always wanted to do. It's my favorite LP to date because it combines the fun of Rock, Pop, Jazz and R&B with the serious discipline of Classical Music. With tracks like 'Stairway To Heaven'

(the Led Zeppelin classic) and 'Street Talk,' I feel Flying Home is an LP that can appeal to Urban Contemporary, 'Quiet Storm,' Pop and Adult Contemporary listeners, as well as Jazz fans."

•The "Jazz" Tag

"What I like about Jazz is that it's special, it's a multistylistic type of music and an original art form. When somebody says I'm a Jazz artist, I don't get offended. I'm proud to be associated with the music. I want people to know that I'm aspiring to be a multi-stylist, and that allows me to reflect the diversity of what I can do."

#### On the Road

"On this current tour, I'm working with a band for the first time, whereas I had been



performing as a soloist. Being on the bill with Kenny G. makes for a really good combination. I've been playing before between 5,000 and

25,000 people and I'm introducing a lot of people to music they haven't heard before, which helps to break up all the categorizations."

# LUTHER VANDROSS/ANITA BAKER at The Capitol Centre, Washington, D.C.

Put two superstars like Luther and Anita together on one bill and you'd have a hard time not having an incredible evening of entertainment. And that's just what these two talented artists offered in Washington D.C. on the third date of their much-publicized tour so aptly entitled "The Heat."

Since Anita Baker captivated music lovers with her *Rapture* LP, the Detroit songstress has impressed audiences with her distinctive vocal style. Utilizing a tighter musical group than on previous tours, Anita succeeded in reaffirming her ascendancy as a premiere stylist through a selection of songs from both her megaselling LP and her new collection, *Giving You The Best That I've Got.* 

The audience's familiarity with and enthusiastic response to such stalwart Baker tunes as "Been So Long," "You Bring Me Joy," "Sweet Love" and "No One In The World" helped pave the way for three highlights from her new LP, the magnificently moody "Good Love," the emotive "Lead Me Into Love" (performed with some stunning vocal work from the group Perri) and the new LP's joyful title track. To call Anita's performance "tasty" would be to understate its impact: she has gained a good deal of stage presence since her initial outings in 1986 and clearly her jazz-tinged vocalizing (demonstrated so adeptly on

"Been So Long") sounds as fresh as ever.

It's a sign of Luther Vandross' immense popularity that all he has to do is walk on stage and he receives a well-deserved standing ovation. If anyone has any question about who is the premier black male vocalist of our time, that question gets resolved as soon as Luther performs his vocal magic on cuts like "So Amazing" or "A House Is Not A Home," which has now become a Vandross classic.

Kicking off with "Never Too Much," his first major smash from 1981, Luther delved into his new LP for some of the evening's highlights: his powerful version of "Love Won't Let Me Wait" elicited, not surprisingly, a good deal of response from the female members of the packed auditorium. "For You To Love" is yet another standout from the LP but it's Luther's current smash, "Any Love" that proved a real winner, complete with an opening musical ad-lib from The Beatles' classic, "Eleanor Rigby."

As always, "Superstar" (another staple in the Vandross repertoire) was performed with soulful intensity while Luther kept the groove up with "Come Back," "She Won't Talk To Me" (both from the new LP) and "Stop To Love." A scintillating performance and the perfect end to a fabulous night of music.





### KENNY G Live At The Universal Amphitheater

Kenny G and band showed L.A. what good music is all about last Saturday and Sunday at Universal City. Accompanied by a band of top-notch musicians (Bruce Carter, drums; Robert Damper, keyboards; Vail Johnson, bass; Andre Montague, vocals and keyboards; Ron Powell, percussion; and John Raymond, guitar) Mr. "G" played a series of serious jams to round out a musical night to remember. Kenny's technique on sax is unbelievable. From holding one note for almost 5 min. nonstop to lightning fast 64th note solos, he held the audience captive for almost two hours. There's also a very up and humorous side to

this artist. He jokes with band members and the crowd with light hearted gimmicks and creates a strong charismatic bond with them. Highlights of the show were the sax and bass solos on "Against Doctors Orders," defiantly written by Kenny when he broke his hand, a 20 minute walk through the audience while still playing his sax, a 15 minute sizzling version of his smash hit "Songbird" screaming percussions and drum solos, and a spectacular surprise appearance at the end of the show by Smokey Robinson to sing the song "We've saved the best for last." They most certainly did....




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

Some of you know him from the group Instant Funk, and some know him from his last LP entitled In The Land Of Making Love. The LP that was released last October is jamming on urban stations in NY, MD and Jersey. Well, your mixologist was recently informed of some good news. Elijah Jones, vocalist/songwriter/producer, is currently in a Los Angeles recording facility cutting new material! #### LAVINE HUDSON: COMMITTED TO THE GOSPEL

ailed as "Britain's Aretha Franklin," Virgin Records' Lavine Hudson may indeed be the first authentic British black Gospel singer. After having studied Gospel music in this country, the young vocalist returned to London to make Intervention, a debut LP that reflects Lavine's commitment to inspirational music...

#### •Her background

"I grew up singing in church in London. My father's a minister, so I started out singing at an early age. I was involved with community choirs (like The London Community Gospel Choir) and The Harmonizers, who were one of the first black Gospel groups in the U.K. After I came to the States in 1983, I studied at the Berklee College of Music



and performed with some great artists like The Clark Sisters."

•Staying true to her art

"I won't say it was easy getting a record deal because

record companies wanted to me do what they wanted. I had a lot of offers to do Pop or R&B: I did a lot of live concerts in the U.K. after I came back from the States in 1985, but I told everyone I'd rather do nothing than record music that wasn't what I wanted to say. Virgin was the only company that offered me complete artistic control to do Gospel music."

#### •Gospel in Britain

"There's very little Gospel music here. Some people have started out doing it and then went on to secular music. Even though people like The Clark Sisters have been coming to the U.K. on a regular basis, I didn't hear artists like Vanessa Bell Armstrong until I came to the States. I'd like to help establish gospel music in Europe. I really think there's a market for the music here."

#### L'TRIMM: RAP'S NEWEST FEMALE STARS

female rappers now challenging some of their male counterparts for top chart honors, the latest duo to hit the airwaves is Miamibased L'Trimm, Guided by legendary record executive Henry Stone, Tigra and Bunny D. are making their mark via "Cars With The Boom" (their follow-up to the well-received single "Grab It") from their debut LP on Atlantic Records, also titled Grab It.

#### Hooking up

"We met in high school in Miami about three years ago and we've been best friends ever since. We were just visiting a friend who was working at Hot Productions' studios and the producers (Larry Davis, Joe Stone and Paul Klein) who were there



asked if we could rap. We said 'yes' and that's how 'Grab It' happened."

•Dealing with success "Making that first record

came out of nowhere. We didn't plan it so it's been like a Cinderella story. We thought this would be so glamorous—making records and all—but we've found out it's a lot of hard work. But we're having a great time. We've been on a promotional tour of the country, everywhere from Hawaii to New York Çity, meeting people."

#### •The songs on the LP

"We wrote all the lyrics and basically they're very 'fun' kind of tunes. The songs are about being teenagers, and the subjects teenagers deal with—boys, love and cars! We haven't dealt with that whole competitive thing that some rappers do. We feel there's enough room for everybody. We like a lot of the other female rappers: J.J. Fad, M.C. Lyte, Salt-N-Pepa. Everyone has a different style."



Mr. T and Vanity


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
