

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PUT THE PLAN BEFORE THE MAN...

A Message to Fellow Disillusioned Black Americans Before You Decide to Sit Out the Coming Election

s the calendar moves relentlessly toward the second Tuesday in November, it becomes more difficult each day to ignore the reality of the upcoming election for the highest office in the United States. No matter how much most of us would like to.

We've withstood nearly a year of nonstop national media coverage through party primaries complete with candidates of one party described as "seven dwarfs" because of their relative mediocrity. Well, suffice it to say that even Snow White would surely have disowned some of them...

But as if that wasn't enough to serve notice on the American people that 1988 was not going to be a banner year for the political process, the leading candidate of the opposing party spent the bulk of his campaign in the primaries trying to prove to the country that despite nearly eight years as the man "a heartbeat away from the presidency," he was not a "wimp."

In retrospect, watching this spectacle played out before an international audience was sad-sometimes amusing—but most importantly, it was a total turnoff to millions of Americans concerned about the real issues that confront us. Like survival in an economy which has been effectively PR-ed as healthy, when so many of us know better. Like housing and hunger. And access to the education so essential to compete in a society increasingly unwilling to open doors of opportunity for those "on the outskirts of hope." Folks like far too many of us, and our counterparts in the barrios, reservations and depressed farming communities.

These are people who could care less about a dwarf or a wimp. These are people who struggle to feed their families every day, while fighting the despair of drug-ravaged or droughtridden communities. Or closer to home for many of us, people who work in the multi-billion dollar music industry now largely owned and controlled by foreign interests. Not a negative phenomenon in itself, but one which seriously reflects upon just how strong and dominant among the nations of the world Ronald Reagan's America really is these days.

These are the people that Jesse lackson reached out to. And who believed that he could indeed "keep hope alive" in a country that we were supposed to believe was a bastion of "peace and prosperity."

As Jesse criss-crossed the country and defied pollsters and politicos by winning primaries in the most unlikely states and attracting support among Americans who were clearly not among the chronically 'buked and scorned,' the 'Country Preacher' was no longer a colorful supporting actor who consistently stole the show from the stars. He was becoming a legitimate political star himself—one who was singularly capable of arousing emotion among a field of card-carrying bores.

But enough was simply enough. And

Jesse's 'unofficial' campaign for the vice presidential nomination of his party came to an 'official' end in what was surely one of the most insensitive-and politically damaging-blunders in recent history. The fallout continues in the widespread indifference that all of us who shared Jesse Jackson's vision of a more socially responsive America now

In recent weeks, the televised exchanges of pre-packaged questions and canned answers that have been passed off as presidential and vicepresidential debates have done little to restore our faith. Howard Stringer, President of CBS News, candidly acknowledged that neither television nor its audiences were well served by this sham and praised his network's anchor Dan Rather for refusing to be involved.

As the prospect of the perpetuation of government by "Happy Days" hype becomes a sobering reality, we must follow Jesse's lead in taking a stand if not for our candidate of choice, then at least against what we know to be a far more disastrous alternative.

JEFFREY OSBORNE—CAN'T GO BACK ON A PROMISE—A&M—The follow-up to the #1 single "She's On The Left" is proving to possess the same magic, showing dynamite add action on our reporting stations. Using smooth yet exciting lead vocals accompanied by choral background arrangement this mid-tempo selection is bound to grab the hearts of young and adult demographics.

TAJA SEVELLE—POPULAR—PAISLEY PARK/WB—New female vocalist, Taja, continues to rock urban airwaves with her "girlish" sophisticated sound and this Bennett production is no exception. A smooth vocal performance accompanied by a danceable rhythm track makes it an ace for clubs. For young adult demos.

SUE ANN—I'LL GIVE YOU LOVE—MCA—The newest member of the MCA family follows up her debut single with this soft and seductive release. This David and Wayne Lewis (Atlantic Starr) production is a ballad filled with hot and mellow string arrangements, and uses the familiar Lewis Bros. background vocals. A "Quiet Storm" selection for young and adult demos.

ROBERT BROOKINS—WHERE IS THE LOVE—MCA—The Donna Hathaway/Roberta Flack classic is redone here with just enough '80s technology. Brookins, known for his production abilities, lays down this mid-tempo composition with exquisite musical taste. Co-production and singing duties are also assigned to Ms. Stephanie Mills. For adult demos.

ALBUMS

WAS NOT WAS—WHAT UP, DOG?—CHRYSALIS—This LP is one of the most innovative and interesting we've heard. Blending dance/jazz/r&b/pop and new styles of their own, the Was Brothers put this collection of 13 unique cuts on vinyl for everyone to enjoy. Assigned to lead singing duties are Sweet Pea-Atkinson and Sir Harry Bowens. Just a few of the cuts to look out for: The super funky "Walk The Dinosaur" with a smoking sax solo by Larry "Larry-Dog" Williams, the soulful "Somewhere in America There's A Street Named After My Dad," and the upbeat dance cut "Spy In The House Of Love" for teen and young adult demos.

MEET THE RAISINS—SOUNDTRACK ALBUM—ATLANTIC—The "Raisins" are back with a collection of songs from a one hour special that is set to air on T.V. for the fall '88 season. It's a very hip LP using '60s songs and top notch musicians and vocalists (Jeff Lorber, keyboards; Star Search finalist Kareem, vocals and Valerie Day of Nu Shooz) to form a nostalgic and fun to listen to offering. P.D.'s look out for "Signed, Sealed, Delivered I'm Yours" and "Cool Jerk." For young and adult demos.

SURFACE—2ND WAVE—COLUMBIA—This team of songwriters-turned recording group are back with top ten material once again. "I Missed," the first single release from the album, is a laid back track with dance sensibilities. "Closer Than Friends" and "Can We Spend Some Time" are also mellow songs with strong stories. Regina Belle lends a hand on "Hold On To Love," which is delicately arranged for a blend of pop and r&b for adult demos.

M.C. SHAN—BORN TO BE WILD—COLD CHILLIN'/WB—Producer and Hip-Hopper Marley Marl, cuts loose another def street level rap LP. The title cut, "Born To Be Wild," displays Shan's versatile and distinctive style that goes along with only the well-seasoned rhymers. "Go For Yours (Cause I'm Gonna Get Mine)," "Juice Crew Law," and "I Pioneered This" are unquestionably top-rank on the Hip-Hop scene. For teen and young adult demos.



WBMX-FM Becomes WVAZ-FM; Kidd Named New PD



OAK PARK, IL: Barry Mayo, president and general manager of WBMX-FM, the Chicago radio station owned by Broadcasting Partners, Inc., announced on air on Tuesday, October 18, the change of the station's call letters to WVAZ-FM (V—103) and previewed a new format which he characterized as a mix of "dusties and new music, without the heavy beat."

In an earlier announcement, Mayo revealed that negotiations

had been finalized with Tony Kidd to become the station's new program director.

Kidd most recently served as program director of WBEE-FM in Rochester, New York. His radio broadcasting experience inclues WQIK/Jacksonville, Florida, WZZK/Birmingham, Alabama and WLLR/Davenport, Iowa; he was program director at the latter two stations. Kidd's wife Jennifer also works in the broadcasting field.

Said Mayo: "I am very pleased to have Tony Kidd on the staff. He exemplifies all the things I have been looking for in a broadcasting and programming professional. His strong background in both audience and music research makes him an excellent choice to bring WBMX (WVAZ) back to a prominent position in the Chicago marketplace."

At press time, BRE learned that Mayo's group (BPI) had also completed negotiations toward the acquisition of WGIV/Charlotte. Stay tuned for further developments next week.

Personics Debuts in Los Angeles

LOS ANGELES: After five years of research and development, The Personics System, which permits consumers in record stores to create their own personalized cassettes, will debut on October 24 in 25 major Los Angeles record stores. Four major Los Angeles retail chains-Tower, Wherehouse, Music Plus and Musiclandwill have Personics Listening Posts in several of their stores. as the system seeks to be an antidote to the \$4 billion home taping problem, while being, at the same time, a service to consumers who want to personalize their listening.

Personics has also announced that it has reached agreements with several record companies for the release of music. The new agreements mean that music from Capitol, EMI, Warner, Elektra and Atlantic will be joined by music from MCA, Polygram, Enigma Entertainment, Chrysalis, Big Time, Alligator and GRP. This brings the number of labels with music in the Personics System to more than 30.

The Personics System incorporates sophisticated computer technology that gives full copyright protection to artists, record companies and publishers and provides for the compensation of all three each time a song is sold over the system.

All of the selections will appear in MusicMakers that include order forms, instructions to the consumer on how to make the system work, and headphones, so that customers can hear a 15-second sample of every song in the Personics System catalog. There are cur-

Alease Records Conducts Talent Hunt

LOS ANGELES, CA: Independent label Alease Records has organized a 1988 Talent Search aimed at black colleges associated with the United Negro College Fund. Label president/ founder Kenneth Weaver has stated that he is seeking one "supreme group or stand out performer" in any style, R&B, rap or rock.

Weasver say he is focusing on black colleges because "they are a source of talent and yet seem to be ignored by the record industry at large, which prefers to concentrate on the larger, metropolitan areas. I always remember that the Commodores and Lionel Richie were a group of black students from Tuskegee Institute in Alabama."

Alease's talent search extends until April 15 of next year and tapes, biographies and photographs are required from all applicants. Winners will be signed to the label, but Weaver stressed: "I don't want too many acts. I want to be able to devote my full time and energy to all of the talent on my label."

rently over 2,000 songs available—and the system will eventually offer up to 15,000 selections in genres ranging from rock, heavy-metal, reggae and blues.

Customers pay by the song, with prices ranging from \$.50 to \$1.25. There's no extra charge for the cassette itself.

The genesis of the system began in 1983, when Charles Garvin, founder of the company, discovered that high-capacity optical disc data storage could reduce a store's inventory costs by offering an ability to produce records in the stores as the customer demanded them.






Melendez, while Bruesewitz—who is responsible for the national promotion and marketing of 12" single releases on Columbia and Def Jam—reports to Rodriguez.

spoken, ladylike and genteel during an interview with BRE at their West Hollywood hotel, a distinct contrast with the strong, bold and sassy way they turn on the juice on their self-titled debut LP.

Tracks like "Gonna Get Over You" (the LP's fast-charting first single), "Cash," and "I Am A Girl (The Lonely One)" are impressively soulful. These girls do not play. Their potential is serious enough to make you understand why Moore was so impressed when she first saw the girls perform at the Ohio Valley Music Awards—and subsequently had them come to New York for a meeting with her husband Charles Huggins, president/chairman of Hush Productions.

At that meeting, Sweet Obsession sang a cappella versions of three songs for Moore and Huggins: Natalie Cole's "No Plans For the Future," "Take These Chains" (which they co-wrote) and "I Would Never Do You Wrong," a pullout-the-stops soul number written by the girls' parents.

The result? A management deal with Hush Prouctions and, not long thereafter, a label signing with Epic.

(Earlier this year, Sweet Obsession also rocked the house at the 10th Annual R&B Awards held at the Apollo in New York, admirably holding their own on a performance bill that included Keith Sweat, Doug E. Fresh & the Get Fresh Crew and Miki Howard.)

The strong response that the group has received during personal appearances—and now from black/urban radio does not surprise Don Eason, Epic's savvy VP, Black Music Promotion. "In a word, Sweet Obsession is fabulous. As one of our new developing acts, the girls have shown in a short time that they've got what it takes to go to the top-talent, charisma and the ability to connect with audiences in person and with their product," Eason enthused.

Similarly 'obsessed' by the three ladies is Larry Davis, the label's National Director, Black Music Promotion. "I have not been more excited about a new group since I've been in the business.

These lovely and very refined young ladies virtually explode on stage and in the studio. In fact, we've been told that they perform with 'an attitude.' Yet I can't stop them from politely calling me 'Mr. Davis.' They're a refreshing change of pace."

The girls' father, Bobby Green (who co-wrote with his wife three tracks on Sweet Obsessions' LP, including the aforementioned "I Would Never Do You Wrong") said, "My wife and I always pushed and encouraged them, but we never thought it would happen this fast." Added Green, a former professional gospel singer: "I can only say, 'God is in the blessing business."

"We have been excited about Sweet Obsession since day one," said Hush's Charles Huggins. "They have natural talent—the gift to take a song and make it work on every level. They are not just singers. They are excellent songwriters and in this business that is a real bonus.

"We believe this to be the greatest group to come out of Detroit since the early days of Motown," he added, "and we plan to introduce the world to the sweet sounds of Sweet Obsessionwhich translates into making them a #1 group."

Born and raised in Detroit, the girls were musically inspired by the Motown sound, according to Michelle. Prior to their appearance at the Ohio Valley Music Awards, they had performed locally in clubs and submitted tapes to various record companies, but mainly regarded music as a hobby. In order to "have something to fall back on, Michelle and Keena had also enrolled in community college, gearing toward careers in business and pediatrics, respectively; Klmmala graduated from high school this past June.

Despite their practical concerns, music always remained an underlying goal for the Green sisters. In fact, the girls—who composed three of their LP's eight tracks—named themselves Sweet Obsession in recognition of their "love and obsession where music is concerned," said Keena. "In writing songs

and singing, we're into expressing soul, R&B...just feelings, really."

Working with producers such as Chad, Howard King, Brian & Shelly Morgan and Darryl Duncan was hard work, she added, "but it was fun. We enjoyed it because they kinda sat back and told us 'hey, go for it!""

Signed to Hush Productions for the past 10 months. Sweet Obsession is looking forward to joining fellow HP artist Freddie Jackson-Melba Moore's most famous protege—as the opening act on his upcoming USA tour: "We've never met Mr. Jackson," Keena admitted, "but he requested us, so we're excited about that." The group will also perform a song on the soundtrack LP to Lou Gossett Jr.'s Tri-star motion picture, "Iron Eagle II."

Stylish, well-groomed and prettier in person than they are in even their most flattering publicity photos, Sweet Obsession has another passion aside from music: Fashion. Told that their West Hollywood hotel was only a mile or so away from the Beverly Center, a local mecca for clothes-buying enthusiasts, the girls' faces brightened noticeably. "We spend most of our time in the malls," said Michelle with a slightly embarrassed smile. "That's where our money goes."

Hot image and material aside, the Green sisters are—as Larry Davis observed—basically 'old-fashioned girls' with traditional values. Their interests include cooking, sewing, spending time with their family (which includes brothers Tim and Des), and reading the Bible. Acknowledging that the most common question male interviewers ask them is "Do you have boyfriends?," the girls say only that their future plans include marriage one day: "It would be nice to have someone to share our happiness with," Michelle said.

In the meantime, however, the group's focus "is on the music, and all that we want to achieve in this business..." said Klmmala.

'Like winning our own awards!" laughed Keena.

AIR PERSONALITY SPOTLIGHT Barbara Prieto: BRE's Music Director of the Year



Barbara Prieto, WGCI-FM

Barbara Prieto, 24, is responsible for selecting music that draws listeners to WGCI-FM, currently Chicago's Number One Urban station and second to general market WGN, according to the latest ARBitron ratings.

After only 6½ years in radio, Prieto is one of the major radio figures in Chicagoland. "I consider my position in radio a big accomplishment as well as a major challenge, which is what keeps me going. I've been fortunate. I've been through five different departments here, prior to finding my niche in programming in mid-1983," she said.

I had the opportunity to watch Barbara accept her BRE Drummer Award as Music Director of the Year during the executive awards ceremonies at the Conference held last May. During her acceptance speech, Prieto specifically thanked Sonny Taylor, the station's PD, GM Marv Dyson, and the entire WGCI-FM staff for their faith and support. It was indeed a triumphant day for the station as GCI walked away with top honors in three categories.

"I started as an assistant in the sports department," said Barbara. "Later, I transferred to sales where I assisted nine account executives for the next year. Then I moved to traffic and after four or five months, I was promoted to assistant to the VP/Operations Manager. This position made me realize that my niche was in programming."

After working for 15 or 16 months with the stations's Operations Manager, Barbara was offered a position as an assistant to the PD, where her initial duties were mainly secretarial. While she worked the next year-and-a-half in programming, she developed a keen interest in becoming an air personality: "WGCI has always been interested and involved in the development of its employees. The station granted me the opportunity to train for and become an on-air personality, which I did from May of 1985 to February of 1986."

It was during her DI stint that Barbara learned most of what she knows about production: tape splicing and editing, operating the audio control consoles and recording test spots of scripts, commercials and air checks. This gives on-air personalities the opportunity to hear themselves in a simulated broadcast, she explained. All of this was final preparation for the big move: "As I continued assisting the PD, I became a part-time DJ. Working on the air, I realized that I really belonged in a position which was involved with the music itself. In March of 1986 the timing was right. I was promoted to MD.'

After excelling in that key position, Barbara recently became Assistant PD, working directly with Sonny Taylor as the station seeks to maintain its winning ways

At her young age, Barbara Prieto has already solidified her professional mark in life. With her expertise and knowledge of radio, there is no wonder that thousands of listeners have made WGCI-FM the number one Urban and the number two overall leader in Chicago.

Mary White Appointed Sales Manager At KACE/LA

She's petite. She's sharp. And she's packed with years of experience. And now KACE is depending on this sales legend to boost its track record in sales right past the competitors. Chapter.

White maintains close ties with UCLA and helped found the UCLA Black Alumni Association. Today she serves as a board member. A native of Pasco, Washington, White moved to Los Angeles where she graduated from Washington High School and UCLA.

As much as I hate to see people lose their jobs, I must say in all honesty that the move was needed badly. Though the BMX jocks were good, they never really succeeded in establishing an identity for themselves or the station. There is one thing in Chicago that is alive and welland that is personality radio. It lives on white as well as black stations.

By next week, we should be able to clarify the moves made this week by Barry Mayo. One thing for sure—it looks as if the old "Windy City Radio Wars"





Automation: How Does It Apply to Urban Radio?

In writing last week's column on digital studio equipment and future digital radio stations, I got to thinking about the state of today's automation systems.

In these systems, the main sources of audio are reel-to-reel tape, carts or a combination thereof. From a programming perspective, I see no use for a full automation system in urban radio. Some small market radio stations might find it useful for late-night hours, but I feel that radio in general should be a conscious friend for the listener.

Before I get too far, let's step back a few years. My first real experience with automation was at a New England station that was a live country format on the AM side, and completely automated easy listening on the FM side. The AM jock recorded the news once an hour while a record was playing and inserted the news cart into the FM automation system. Needles to say, the FM became a hole in the FM dial and the AM lost numbers simply because the jocks were too busy to be creative on the air.

The next time I stumbled into an automation system was at a station in Phila-

delphia. The system was a full blown I.G.M. (yes, I said I.G.M., not I.B....). IGM was a leading manufacturer of broadcast automation systems—meaning, it was controlled with an I.B.M. card reader. Each I.B.M. card that went through the reader triggered the next event, including cueing the jock.

The studio consisted of a room with a microphone and a little box that looked like a desk calculator. The numbers showing on the box signified the next event. All the jock had to do was say a few words, push a button, and the machine would do the rest of the show. Even the meter readings were taken by, and printed out on, a computer. The system was a maintenance nightmare, and I found it difficult to be creative in such an environment. This was an all cart system; the reel-to-reel machines were used for community affairs shows on weekends. Later we went with a board and turntables using the automation system only to run commercial

Another system I've encountered was in San Diego. There we used the system for playing music. The music tapes were made in-house. At any time the jock had a choice of 4 songs on 4 reel-to-reel machines, and could set the systems to play them in any sequence. The format worked pretty well, but the maintenance of the tapes was overbearing. Each time there was a tape-wreck your format was missing a song or two, and they had to be replaced. Even though the system allowed a clean rotation of about 600

songs, the problems outweighed the benefits and the station went with all carts.

Closing Notes....

The reel-to-reel and cart players are pretty much the same in function and mechanical design, but the controllers have become more high-tech.

"Sentry Systems" has a controller that is in turn controlled by an I.B.M. computer. The Sentury FS-12B can operate full live, fully automated, or live assist, and is satelite compatible. It sells for \$4900 and the I.B.M. computer is extra. When you add the cost of the reel-to-reel machines or cart equipment, you're talking some big bucks. There are other live assist systems available, but still represent a large investment.

What I'm trying to say is, if you're going to make this kind of financial committment, then be darn sure that the system is in the best interest to your format or you could blow your audience away with a station that sounds like a robot.

In my personal experience total automation has never attracted big ratings. However, using such a system to free the jock's time while on the air could pay off for the station. It also cuts down on errors such as wrong commercials, or songs getting played.

In the future, the reel-to-reel and cart machines will be replaced with D.A.T. machines and hard-dics. No matter what the source, the jocks must remain live or radio will lose the label: "Theatre of the Mind."



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

"In my early teens I relocated to Chicago to further my education. I attended Englewood High School where I played drums in the band. Of course, I always knew what I wanted. Music was and still is my first love."

After high school, Green met a Chicago entrepreneur named Argie B. Collins "and he encouraged me to attend the Chicago Conservatory of Music for voice and piano training," said Green. "I stayed in school for about three years, then I started performing in some

of Chicago's hottest night clubs."

By age 22, a polished and professional Green met the talented songwriter/producer team of Jo Armstead and Mel Collins (no relation to Argie B. Collins) at a Chicago nightclub called the Southerland Lounge, located at 4659 S. Drexel. In describing Green's voice, Armstead has been quoted as saying:

"There was a pleading quality that I knew women would just love."

Armstead was right on the money and Green was on his way. Armed with a distinctive baritone voice and a powerful blues-oriented delivery, Green landed an instant major label deal—not an easy thing to do at that time for a Chicagobased artist—thanks to his association with Armstead/Collins.

In 1969 Green hit #1 with the R&B smash "Jealous Kind of Fella." Released on MCA's Uni label and produced by Armstead and Collins, the song had strong female appeal. He followed that

hit, appropriately enough, with "Don't Think I'm A Violent Guy."

It was Russ Regan who signed Green to Uni and the singer calls him "one of the most honorable" executives he's ever met in the business. "Russ wanted me to be treated fair financially and he saw to it that I was. I have a lot of respect for him," said Green.

In 1971 another gentleman by the name of Henry Allen signed Green to Altantic's subsidiary label, Cotillion. It was on that label that Green had the second biggest hit of his career: "Plain and Simple Girl," written by Syl Johnson and arranged by the legendary Donny Hathaway.

In the years to follow, Green recorded for several other labels. He moved to Los Angeles in the early '80s and is currently building a 24 track recording studio in his home. The singer also has turned entrepreneur himself; he operates his own independent record company, Love L.A. Music Company.

"I lived in Chicago for at least 20 years," he told me, "and Chicago is still a great city. I will always feel that way. The people there supported me then...and they still do. I have friends and family located there, so in my heart I'm in both places," he said.

Green, who recently recorded a gospel rap tune, said "I'm open to all creative ideas. One thing I've always tried to do is be original." As for his own favorite musical style, he added, "I do the things that are primary to me and that's ballads. That (approach) is in a class to itself."

The singer is about to record his fourth LP, which may include a re-make of "Jealous Kind of Fella." He remains determined to "keep on building," and added that he feels he's been "blessed."

And as for Garland Green's advice to the rising young stars of the '80s? It's simple and to the point: "Keep your head up. Pay attention to what's around you. Stay drug free. And don't burn out!"

ut of Many One People," Jamaica's motto, was realized recently when record companies, artists and Brooklynites united to stage the biggest benefit concert to date to aid the island which was stricken by Hurricane Gilbert on Sept. 12. The concert was staged at the Klitgord Auditorium in Brooklyn, N.Y.

PolyGram, Epic, Jive, MCA, Virgin, Uni, Capitol, Island, Atlantic and Elektra Records bought tickets and committed artists who performed gratis on a show which featured Melba Moore, Jocelyn Brown, Doug E. Fresh, Shinehead, Onaje Allan Gumbs, Sylvester, WWOR-TV newsman Kelly Wright, Boogie Down Productions, Funk Deluxe, Shelley Thunder, Adja, Chinafrica, The Skinny Boys, James Mtume, KRS-1, Don Baron, The Whiz Kid, the X-Press Band, and Apollo Theatre comedian Terry Hodges. Big Red's Arts & Entertainment editor Don Thomas served as emcee.

The show—which was covered by both "Entertainment Tonight" and Channel 9's 11:00 p.m. news broadcast, was opened by Melba Moore who sang a stirring, a cappella version of "Lift Ev'ry

Voice and Sing," the black national anthem. Moore, one of the first entertainers to donate her time and talent to the event, promoted the benefit on both Channel 9 and radio broadcasts.

Moore earned a standing ovation for her performance at the benefit, and another highlight of the evening was Shinehead's dance-hall rap rendition of the Jamaican national anthem; in fact, Dorothy Bronstorph, vice consulate of Jamaica, stood in salute of her native song.

Gumbs, at home wherever jazz is being played, fit right into the "reggae groove" as he filled in on keyboards with special surprise guests of the night: Third World. The reggae superstars, who live in Jamaica and were on the island when the devastating hurricane hit, shed light on the situation which currently exits in their country.

Jocelyn Brown gave the crowd all she had with two dance selections, while rapper Doug E. Fresh was in top form. Shelley Thunder, a favorite with the crowd, closed the concert with a rollicking routine backed by the Kuff Dancers.

A melange of music styles brightened the evening, ranging from rap and R&B to reggae, soca and calypso. Onstage performances gave patrons their money's worth, while the backstage scene resembled a "family reunion," in the truest sense of the term.


To see so many black artists, publicists, managers, radio personalities, journalists, and publishers—along with controversial figures such as attorney C. Vernon Mason and Rev. Al Sharpton—mingling with consulate officials was an eye-opener for those who claim there is no unity in the black community.
