# An Island of Thought

hris Blackwell has always marched to a different drum and whatever he heard proved in the long run to be magic—thanks to his farsightedness. Way back when he was a one-man operation, keeping his stock in the back of his blue Mini-Cooper, he believed in the music whether it



was in a rock band called the Spencer Davis Group or his greatest discovery, Bob Marley, the reggae legend.

Marley's success gave Island a world market; Chris helped Chrysalis get off the ground and he believed in a tiny L.A. rap label called Delicious Vinyl.

He moved into movies, producing "Kiss of the Spiderwoman" and "The Trip to Bountiful." He launched three sister labels: Mango, for Third World music; Antilles, for jazz and fusion; and Fourth & Broadway for dance and black music.

He still sees things differently. In a time when others seem to be either dissolving or re-thinking their Black Music Departments, Island Records establishes a new division: The Black Music Division "to make a serious and dedicated commitment to R&B and rap."

It would seem that John Barbis, Island's president and CEO shares Chris's foresight—he's hired Hiriam Hicks, to run the newly-formed division (see story page 7).





"We are excited that Andre chose us to provide him with the services he needs for his label," Paul Leighton, pres/CEO of Tribe said.

#### No Limit At Priority

Oakland, CA-based No Limit Records has signed a distribution deal with Priority Records. Among the acts involved are Master P, who most recently sold more than 100,000 units in seven weeks of his current LP, 99 Ways To Die, and MIA X, due out in August. No Limit's first release through Priority will be True, the debut album from T.R.U., featuring Master P. The project is slated for a July 25 release.

#### Blue Thumb Relaunched

New GRP Recording Company president Tommy LiPuma has just relaunched Blue Thumb, the avant-garde label he helped found, along with partners Bob Krasnow, Don Graham and later Sal Licata, in the late '60s.

The label released Dr. John's new album, Afterglow, last month. The relaunch was also highlighted by the release of a special compilation package featuring 33-tracks released during Blue Thumb's heyday, All Day Thumb Sucker Revisited. Among the original Blue Thumb artists included in this package are: Leon Russell, The Pointer Sisters, Dave Mason, and Ike & Tina Turner.

Additional new Blue Thumb artists include: Jonatha Brooke and the Story, blues-rock guitarist Robben Ford, and vocalists Phil Perry and Maysa.

#### **Still Dangerous**

The 10th Circuit Court of Appeals in Denver, Colorado, has upheld the jury's verdict rejecting Crystal Cartier's copyright infringement claim against Michael Jackson and Sony Music.

According to Jackson's Los Angeles attorney Eve Wagner, in February '94, a Denver jury had reached a verdict in favor of Jackson, after three hours of deliberation. The Denver trial was the third copyright case against Jackson and he has won all three.

# WGOK Goes Gospel And Gets New Sister Station

On July 3 WGOK-AM in Mobile, Alabama, went to an all gospel



format while launching a new 50,000-watt station, WYOK-FM. According to Irene Ware, general manager for both stations and program director for WGOK, "This is a real power venture. We're

ecstatic. We've been aspiring for 20something years for a FM station." At WGOK, Ware will be working Chuck Booth, who handles sales, Felicia Albritton, operation manager, and Dorothy "Jo" Stanley, traffic.

Mad Hatter, who will continue to work with Ware on WGOK programming, is program director of WYOK.



"We're Black music intensive covering all spectrums of the Black musical experience, including African, Blues, gospel, mainstream R&B, rap, Caribbean," says Hatter, who will con-

tinue to host two shows. Hatter can be heard Monday through Friday, 5-10 a.m. on his "Mad In The Morning" show, which features three hours of mainstream R&B and two hours of Blues. On Sunday, he hosts "Mad's Private Stock," on which he plays West African, Caribbean, Soca, reggae, 6 p.m.-10 p.m. The WYOK

lineup is Monday through Friday: 10 a.m.-12 p.m., Sunny Love with mainstream R&B; 12-1 p.m., Blues and R&B; 2-6 p.m., afternoon drive with D Dwayne featuring high-energy R&B; 6-10 p.m., Sweetness does an hour of bass, an hour of hip hop and two hours of slow jams; 10 p.m.-3 a.m, Miss Nellie's House Of Blues; 3-5 a.m., Morning Devotion featuring all gospel. On Saturday, from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m., WYOK plays Blues; from 6 p.m. to Midnight, it's hip hop/bass; and from then until 6 a.m. the station features gospel. Besides Mad Hatter's Sunday show, there's also eight hours of gospel, a public affairs slot, and Miss Nellie's House of Blues, 10 p.m. to 3 a.m. "We have the whole works," says Hatter, "it's the flavor format with all phases of the Black experience."

# **New Acts Dominate RIAA Certs**

Debut acts dominated the Recording Industry Association of America's certification roundup for June, starting with new Rowdy/Arista recording artist Monica who has already garnered a gold single for her debut release, "Don't Take It Personal." The song has

only been out since April. Subway, Biv 10/Motown's latest group, always earned a gold certification for their debut single, "This Lil' Game We Play," a song released last November. Da Brat was given gold with "Give It 2 You," her March Work/Columbia release. Completing the single gold releases are Boyz II Men with their Motown cut "Water Runs Dry," an April release.

**Daniel Savage** has been appointed vp, mktg for Lava Records and will be based at the Atlantic



These four acts are: The Snakes who are a duo of cousins, Trife and Larceny; 666, comprised of Little Caesar, Chico, and Nino Brown; Klepto; and Little Kim. The Junior M.A.F.I.A.'s lead-of single, "Player's Anthem," was produced by Clark Kent and features Little Caesar, Little Kim and B.I.G. droppin' verses. Jody Watley's first release on her Bellmark-distributed Avitone label is a mix of styles and sexy soulful sounds. Her deep vocal range combined with probing lyrics make for engaging music. Affection shows why this Grammy-winning singer and music producer cannot be defined by the music she sings or the clothes she wears. All of the songs on the album were at least co-written by Watley except for "Pride And Joy." The first single, "Affection," is a smooth groove that was written by Watley along with the Derrick Edmonson who also produced the album. The entire CD is consistent in sound and is by far the best solo work to come from Jody Watley. Songs to listen for include "The Beat Don't Stop," "Together," "The Way," "Stay" and a jazzy version of her classic "Lookin' For A New Love." 
**Keith Martin**—"Moment In Time"—Ruffhouse/Columbia—Keith Martin has released his newest single, "Moment In Time," from his debut album, It's Long Overdue. We got our first taste of Martin's talent with the smash hit "Never Find Someone Like You." Now, this newest release, co-produced by John Hall (Hall & Oates), is a beautifully written love song with touching and melancholy lyrics. But what makes "Moment In Time" a pleasure to listen to is the soft melodic voice of this gifted singer. Demos: 25+.

#### ALBUMS



D'Angelo—Brown Sugar—EMI—D'Angelo is a 21-year-old self-taught musician whose musical career was heavily influenced by the sounds of Prince and Marvin Gaye. He wrote, produced, composed, arranged, and performed every track on Brown Sugar, his debut album, with the exception of the Smokey Robinson classic "Cruisin'." D'Angelo's sound is reminiscent of the early '70s and '80s while his compositions explore love and lust in our post-modern times. Every track on the album is smooth and consistent with the standard he set with his smash single "Brown Sugar," one of the most original songs to hit the airwaves in years. Other tracks to check out include "S%\*t, Damn, Motherf\*#\$@r," which is an expression of murder and sorrow and "Lady," cowritten by D'Angelo and Raphael Saadiq who also plays bass on this track.

This ballad is a beautiful tribute to the Black woman. D'Angelo's debut is an impressive one that is sure to be popular with fans of all types of music. Demos: All.



Tony Thompson—Sexsational—Giant—After three successful albums with the group Hi-Five, Tony Thompson releases his solo debut Sexsational. The cuts are a little more mature than what the public is used to hearing from Thompson; many of which deal with sex. Overall, the album is about relationships between young men and women. Must-listen to tracks include "Make Me Sweat," which was produced by Al B. Sure! and Maurice Pearl; "Slave," produced by Devante Swing of Jodeci; and "My Cherie Amour," a remake of the '69 Stevie Wonder classic. The first single, "I Wanna Love Like That," was written for Thompson by Babyface and there's a remix with extra production work by Teddy Riley. This CD serves as a showcase for Thompson's vocal talents and has no difficulty living up to its title. Demos: R&B Fans.

**UNV**—Universal Nubian Voices—Maverick/Warner Bros.—The quartet that dropped the smash hit "Something's Going On" last year is back with their second album, Universal Nubian Voices. On this LP, brothers John and Shawn Powe, John Clay and Demetrius Peete pour their hearts out on touching ballads and mid-tempo grooves. The album opens with the tender version of "So In Love With You" and closes with the urban re-mix of the beautiful ballad that fans have dubbed the wedding song. Other heart-touching love songs to look out for are "One More Try" and "How Can You Walk Away." "Peach Cobbler" is a jazzy surprise while "Bone" and "Bring Your Body To Me" are the more uptempo tunes to groove to. It's been a while since we've heard from UNV, but after enjoying this album the wait was well worth it. Demos: All.

Mega Banton—100,000,000 Mega Watts—Relativity/Palm Tree—This 20-year-old from Portmore, Jamaica, is setting the stage for another "Mega" hit with his latest release 100,000,000 Mega Watts. The album was produced by Salaam Remi and legendary Jamaican producer Jack Scorpio. Banton has a hard, heavy lyrical flow that can ride any rhythm. The songs Mega writes reflect his society and provide and uplifting diversion to the harsh reality of it. Some songs to look for of his new CD include "Money First," "Shadow," "Dem Yo Enemy," and the "Glamorous" remix. Mega Banton should prepare himself for the attention these tracks are going to generate around the world. Demos: Reggae/Dancehall Fans.

Femi Kuti—Femi Kuti—Tabu/Motown—Femi Kuti's self-titled debut album is best described as serious soul music. The album features entirely live instrumentation, from the bass guitar riffs to the unpredictable drum rhythms. Femi Kuti is filled with energetic music that allows the listener to become a part of the experience. His style is entrenched in the tradition of African music. Be sure to listen to the following cuts: "Frustrations," "Stubborn Problem," and "No Shame." American audiences are sure to enjoy the music that the people of Africa have enjoyed for years. Demos: All.




# Sophisticated Surefire Soul

When making a toast on an extraordinary occasion, the sophisticated raconteur either calls for the most perfect of champagnes or finest vintage wines. When proposing a toast to one of the finest groups ever to step on stage, it's time for cristal by the magnum—the Whispers deserve it. In their self-effacing way, they might say there is nothing sophisticated about what they do...it is, after all, "straight up R&B."

Perhaps, but to carry it off for nearly 30 years takes sophistication and savvy. You've got



the approach is—that ethic black groups learned while they earned their way up and down the charts. That work standard—not really written down anywhere, includes "Respect the people on your stage and in your audience. Do your show right, get the people on their feet and give them what they paid their money for. Make them want to come back and see you."

This foursome from back in the day, Wallace and Walter Scott, Nicholas Caldwell and Leaveil Degree, has watched other groups come and go during those years. Maybe it was a trend of the moment, maybe the music wasn't up to par,

perhaps the acts failed to really pay attention to that unspoken code of Black performers. But what is saddest from their point of view, is they've watched the music change into something, as Black men, that they are not proud of. "We are in crisis as a people," says Wallace, known as Scotty, very intently. "And the music made today is both reflective of that and contributory to it."

In a tonal quality nearly indistinguishable, his very identical twin brother, Walt, picks up the conversation's thread. "It makes me mad. I don't like the idea of these young prothers thinking it's cool to disrespect women, carry a gun and die for nothing. When we first started out, such concepts would have never be heard on the radio—all that

hatred, self-denigration and violence. What happened to the decency factor?"

Nicholas says, "Back in those days, if there was a song with a message it in, it wasn't filled with profanity and death-threats. Mostly the music was to make you feel good, dance a little, make romance a little and be happy"

This album, executive-produced by Caldwell, is about romance and the happiness and other emotions it brings. Leaveil says, "We called it *A Toast To The Ladies* because women should be appreciated and love should be celebrated. It also pays tribute to what brought us this far—women, love, romance."

Helping make the celebration happen are young producers including Magic (of Magic Muzik Prods), Ralph Hawkins and Derrick "Doc" Pearson, Kevin Guillaume, Gordon Jones and John Benton, and Rickey "Freeze" Smith Hitmakers Laney Stewart, Kuk Harrell, Paul Minor also contributed to the album, along the The Whisper's longtime musical director Grady Wilkins and Caldwell.

The Whispers third album for Capitol provides the perfect setting for the trademark, matchless harmonies and delivers a set of soaring, sensual, make-you-

wanna-hold-somebody love ballads, including the first single, "Make Sweet Love To Me," the title track and two jazzy numbers "Pissed Off (Baby Come Back)" and "My Funny Valentine." But just because they've been singing for all those years, don't think they can't hold their own with a slammin' beat. Check out "Every Little Thing You Do," the infection "Better Watch Your Heart," and the hip-hop flavored "You're Driving Me Crazy." This album will make you feel good.

Certainly the Whispers have made music that has made a lot of people happy for a long time. The group was formed in the mid-Sixties when the twins, Nicholas, Marcus Hutson and Gordy Harmon were doo-wopping around Watts, dreaming of stardom. They got their first shot at the dream when they were fresh out of high school. Signed to L.A.'s Dore


Records, they cut "It Only Hurts For A While," and their career really took off in '69, when they signed to Chess/Janus. Early hits included '70s "Seems Like I












Gotta Do Wrong," "I Only Meant to Wet My Feet," ('72) and "Mother For My Children." ('74).

Remembering those early days, Scotty says, "It was harder then to get a chance



In '71, Leaveil replaced Gordy Harmon and The Whispers became the debut act on the newly formed Soul Train label. The hits kept running down the track, "One For The Money," and "Make It With You;" then after a label name change from Soul Train to Solar,

they had "Olivia (Lost and Turned Out)" and their first gold single, "And The Beat Goes On." Fans were getting accustomed to The Whispers sound and for extra-good measure, they heard them each week performing the "Soul Train" theme.

From '80-'85, their hot streak just kept getting hotter "Lady," "It's A Love Thing," "In The Raw," "Keep On Lovin' Me," and "Contagious," were the singles and there were three gold albums---The Christmas Album, Love Is Where You Find It and Love For Love. There were also two platinum albums, The Whispers and Imagination.

"Rock Steady" came in '87 and is notable for giving the now successful producers, L.A. and Babyface, their first chart smash. The single was an international hit for the group and helped propel the album *Just Gets Better With Time* to almost double platinum sales.

In addition to spending time in the studio making all these albums, the group was on the road putting those people in the seats and making them get up and applaud. Good for record sales, that old work ethic.

They signed with Capitol in '90 and hit the charts with the gold album More Of The Night. Their 17th studio album generated two singles with "Innocent," and "My Heart, Your Heart."

The twins cut a duet album in '93, My Brothers Keeper and scored another hit with "I Wanna Know Your Name." In '94, they were running in and out of the studio and

on and off stages like crazy. They completed two albums, the current release and *Christmas Moments*, which was released in time for Christmas and happily appreciated by the fans who remembered the '80 Christmas album.

Of course that's the kind of extraordinary achievement that makes this group so special. There are only a handful of acts out there who can compare an album they made 15 or 20 years ago to one they've just released. Happily for The Whispers, like the finest of wines, like the most cherished vintage, the stand up well in the comparison. Ladies and Gentlemen, A Toast to the Whispers. Hip, hip, hooray.







#### Queen of Underground Dance

"Cartoons of sound from the underground," is how WBAI's **Jeanne Hopper** describes the psychedelic mix of underground dance music on her show, "The Liquid Sound Lounge." A combination of acid jazz, deep house and cuttingedge spoken word, Hopper has been a champion of the underground dance and club scene over the tri-state FM band, one of the few that regularly pumps underground dance music.

"I wanted to do something to attract a young audience," says Hopper. "There's a new, radical generation coming up and I wanted to create a home for them, as opposed to what's perpetuated by the mainstream media."

Although the show is less than two years old, Hopper has developed an intensely loyal following and has attracted various luminaries into her sonic collage, including George Clinton, Roy Ayers, Carleen Andersen, The Last Poets, Donald Byrd, Reg. E Gaines, Brooklyn Funk Essentials, Little Louie Vega, and others. "Liquid Sound Lounge" also provides a showcase for underground artists such as Giant Step, Tracie Morris, The Groove Collective, Martha Cinader, Verbal Abuse from Jackie 60 and Ava Chin.

Hopper's show has allowed her to branch out into live performance and record production. "Poetry's always been around," she says. "People want to talk and be intimate about what they're revealing. There's so much B.S. on TV. The intimacy of people to people is kind of lost."



#### A Total Experience

**Total,** a trio of young women, have mounted a full scale assault on the charts with their smash gold hit, "Can't You See," off the *New Jersey Drive* soundtrack. The three, Kima, Keisha, and Pam, are all distinct individuals, but compliment each other in bringing forth "the Total sound."

"We're total opposites of each other," says Kima. "We're all totally different from each other, in our personality, in our sounds, in our backgrounds." Pam interjects, "But we weren't put together. We were a group a long time before we got our deal. We're like sisters, loving each other for a while now."

Each of these ladies hail from New Jersey. Pam and Kima knew each other from high school. Keisha hooked up with them five years ago. They all paid their dues doing gigs in the Bronx and New Rochelle, working with some local producers and doing a home demo. Their break came when a friend, Cathy Dukes, introduced them to Sybil Pennix, the manager credited with developing the image for Mary J. Blige. After some grooming, she took them to Bad Boy CEO Sean "Puffy" Combs for an on-the-spot audition.

"Our interview with Puffy was so spur of the moment," Keisha laughs, "that we had to rehearse in the elevator at the Hit Factory on the way up to see him. We sang for him, but he didn't let on that he was all that impressed." However, Combs was so taken by them, he asked Pennix not to let anyone else sign them until he had a chance. After putting them on, he also gave them the name, Total. "Total is really made up of three lead singers and each one can hold her own," says Combs. "But they have an incredible rapport with each other in the studio, which comes across in their music."

They have since appeared on **Erick Sermon**'s "Hittin' Switches," and **Notorious B.I.G.**'s "Juicy," and "One More Chance," but "Can't You See" has thrust them into the forefront of R&B music. Pam describes "the Total sound" as "soulhiphopghettofunk. When you hear our music, you can't help but feel the attitude within us." Keisha adds," We have three distinct flavors that naturally flow together." It's just a vibe."

Luke Update

On the heels of filing for bankruptcy protection for his record label, **Luke** (aka Luther Campbell) has now filed personal bankruptcy. Luke made the move last week in an effort to starve off creditors from laying claim to his properties, including some prime real estate in Miami Lakes. Campbell's problems began late last year when one of his former artists, **M.C. Shy** (aka Peter Jones) won a royalties case against Campbell and Luke Records. Shy was awarded more than \$1.5 million in back royalties, interest and damages.

After a judge denied a request to use sales from H-Town's latest album as collateral instead of posting a nearly \$2 million bond, Campbell filed for bankruptcy for the label. Jones' attorney then placed a lien on one of Campbell's properties when the notorious nasty lyric man himself failed to cough up the loot. Purchased in '93 for \$120,000, Luke's land is in one of Miami's better neighborhoods and has increased in value, according to some estimates.

Although there have been cutbacks at Luke Records, the label continues to operate. Two of its current products, **H-Town** and **Lorenzo**, are selling nationwide, with H-Town's album in BRE's Top Ten and Lorenzo's, partially produced by **Keith Sweat**, also climbing the charts. Luke keeps plugging. "I don't worry about it," he says. "I have value. You can take everything, but you can't take my mind. My creativity will always be there."


#### **Radio Ratings In**
