Landscape Changes, But Spin Remains The Same At NAB

It's the end of the world as we know it. But broadcasters feel fine. That was the message at this year's fall National Assn. of Broadcasters Radio Show, held Oct. 14-17 in Seattle. Despite repeated predictions of a coming recession and concerns about radio's post-consolidation spot load, as well as the presence of Internet radio listening and digital satellite audio on the horizon, panelists representing current ownership were surprisingly upbeat, rarely suggesting that any radical change in the landscape was about to take place.

At his Oct. 15 keynote address, Jacor Communications chairman Sam Zell told his audience that he expected a recession to take place in early 1999. The downturn, he said, would "prove how much more powerful" the broadcast industry was than during the early-'90s recession. "I think

[Wall Street] is going to be surprised at how well you do," said the chairman of the recently merged broadcast giant.

His remarks were echoed later that day at the group heads panel, where Chancellor Media president/CEO Jeff Marcus suggested that a recession "could become a self-fulfilling prophecy" but added that "if we see it, we could prove once and for all that radio is recession-proof" and show "the power of super-duopoly." By that time, Cumulus Media executive vice chairman Lew Dickey had already suggested that radio's recent stock-price fluctuations were the result of a "temporary liquidity crisis" affecting all stocks and not based on industry performance.

And despite the fact that this year's NAB had been preceded by major announcements by both digital satellite audio providers, CD Radio and XM Satellite Broadcasting (whose Lee Abrams predicted having 43



KACD Becomes 'World-Class' Rocker

The speculation is over, and, as expected, dance KACD/KBCD (Groove Radio) Los Angeles is now triple-A "Channel 103.1," billing itself as "world-class rock," an amalgam of "contemporary and heritage rock artists and eclectic genres, including alternative, classic, and acoustic blues." The first song on Channel 103.1 was Ziggy Marley & the Melody Makers' "People Get Ready." KBCO Denver PD Dave Benson oversaw the launch and is programming for now. Handling the music is former KSCA Los Angeles MD Nicole Sandler.

Capitol senior director of promotion Brian Corona and senior national director of adult formats Nick Bedding have been listening to Channel 103.1. "It's great to hear Susan Tedeschi on the air and Bonnie Raitt on the air," says Bedding. "They're also trying in some great reggae. It's perfect."

Corona adds, "There's a lot of songs that you know but haven't heard for a while [that] sound fresh . . . Last night, I heard a deep Del Amitri cut. It was so good." Corona says that while other stations do play some of that music, there hasn't been one station that consistently delivered it to the listener. He says it's great to be able to hear triple-A chart hits that have not previously been played in the market since KSCA's triple-A days.


BUSINESS: NEW Y100 PARTNERS



Kiss' 'Psycho-Circus' Hits Mainstream Top

FIRST KISS: Kiss gets its first No. 1 record at mainstream rock with "Psycho-Circus" (Mercury). It's also the song with the most mainstream stations spinning it this issue, 100 of the panel's 111 reporters. The band has charted 14 times since 1984 but only cracked the top 10 for the first time when "Jungle" peaked at No. 8 in November '97.

Lenny Kravitz spends his third week atop the rock audience chart with "Fly Away" (Virgin). The song passes the 26 million mark in total listeners. While sitting at No. 3 for a third week at mainstream rock, "Fly Away" would be the No. 1 track if the chart used the gross impressions methodology used for the rock audience chart. The top of the heritage chart would also look different this week using gross impressions, putting John Mellencamp's "Your Life Is Now" (Columbia) at No. 1 by a slim margin over Jonny Lang's "Still Rainin'" (A&M).

The Goo Goo Dolls' "Slide" is in the No. 1 spot at modern rock, earmarking them as the only act in the past two years to have had successive singles reach the top slot in that format. **Oasis** had back-to-back No. 1's when "Champagne Supernova" succeeded "Wonderwall" in April '96. The Goo Goo Dolls' return to the top comes 13 weeks after "Iris" ended its five-week stay at No. 1.

Third Eye Blind's "Jumper" (Elektra) is the third track from the band's debut album to reach the top 10 on the modern adult chart. "Seini-Charmed Life" hit No. 1 in June 1997, and "How's It Gonna Be" peaked at No. 4 in February of this year.

Effective this issue, KXPK Denver is removed from the triple-A panel due to a format change. There are now 22 triple-A reporters.

PERSONNEL FILE: Starting next week, former Epic senior VP of promotion John Boulos joins Warner Bros. in a senior promotion capacity . . . Razor & Tie national director of promotion Liz Opoka heads to Koch Records as senior director of promotion and artist development . . . Promo vet Tony Chalmers exits Capitol's Boston regional post after 20 years with the label. Reach him at 508-881-5244. Chicago regional Mike Justin adds St. Louis and Minneapolis duties, while Kansas City, Nebraska, and Iowa responsibilities will be added to the label's vacant Denver regional position. Capitol also adds Chuck Swaney for Detroit-based regional responsibilities, effective Oct. 26; Swaney was the Work Group's local promo manager for the Great Lakes region.

ARTIST MONITOR: Look for Motley Crue to perform on two World Wrestling Federation cable shows on the USA Network in support of Oct. 27's release of the band's "Greatest Hits" album. The group will perform its current single, "Bitter Pill" (Motley/Beyond), on "Sunday Night Heat" 7 p.m. EST Oct. 25. The next night on "RAW Is WAR" at 9 p.m. EST, the band will play "Wild Side."

Triple-A KFOG San Francisco night jock Linda McInnes exits.

Modern WKQX (Q101) Chicago picks up two weekenders: Phil Grosch joins from modern WFBZ La Crosse and Mikki Gray is in from nights at modern KDGE Dallas.

Album CILQ (Q107) Toronto P/T Joanne Wilder gets the afternoon slot last held by Shirley McQueen.

WXVY Baltimore midday Jo Jo Moral-

es, who has also been doing weekends at WXRK (K-Rock) New York, crosses the street in the Big Apple for weekends at WHTZ (Z100).



MONITOR PROFILE

WFBQ's Tom Griswold, Half Of Morning Duo, On Syndication, Radio's Future

Tom Griswold has spent the past 18 years as half of the Bob and Tom morning show. The pair started at current home album WFBQ Indianapolis 15 years ago, with their recent years dedicated to building a successful network of Bob and Tom affiliates, now including album WRX in their biggest market, Chicago.

Five years ago, when the pair's contract came up, Griswold says, "we just felt that we couldn't justify turning down the kind of offers we were getting unless there was a way to make it better here. And the way to do that was to create a network. We started very small, with three affiliates, and now we're approaching 70."

Griswold admits a fully syndicated morning show "is a new ball game . . . It's a tough nut to crack, because a lot of people are used to hearing a lot of local stuff in the morning. This is a slightly different animal."

One of the first things that changed with syndication was how to choose topics. "The best analogy would be we had to become a little bit more like USA Today," says Griswold. "We're still talking about all the hot buttons; we're not

"We just turned down another thing yesterday. It's not what we do," says Griswold. "Doing the show five days a week—and we're on five hours-plus a day—takes everything out of me. There's so much in preparation to do this. You've got to keep up with the paper . . . You've got to record bits. And if I had to stick myself in front of a TV camera, even for 30 minutes, I don't know what I'd do."

Even the writing is different. "I think in terms of theater of the mind. I think very nonvisually," says Griswold. As for one Indianapolis jock who has gone on to TV stardom, Griswold says, "Letterman's great gift [is] in the great Ernie Kovacs tradition. The skits and stuff they do are so telegenic. It's so TV funny. That's a different sport. We're doing radio. I know how to make radio skits funny. With sound effects, we can take you to the moon and back in 30 seconds. On TV, you [need] props and sets, and it wouldn't be as funny. The best part of this is it doesn't ruin your life. If you go on TV, all of a sudden everyone's stalking you."

The two have documented some of their best work on 23 CDs to date. Expanding the network has meant a wider consumer base, which they reach through their 800-BUYTHIS number and retailers in affiliate markets. "Just on that number alone we've sold more than \$1 million worth of them," says Griswold. "We've given away over \$4 million to charity in the last several years. They're the largest-selling radio albums of anyplace."

Griswold says these are not merely bits pulled from the air. "We do original songs. We have a digital 24-track studio down the street that we use all the time. We use real horns and singers and go all out. So they're big productions, not just snippets of our radio show."

The same retinue becomes the Bob and Tom road show. Their market visits are more concerts in their own right than a quick hello as MC for local station concerts. Recent gigs in St. Louis and Fort Wayne, Ind., packed houses of 2,500 and 8,000, respectively.

Griswold has translated his CD-making experience into a healthy side business, serving as producer on several comedy albums. His most recent act, Rodney Carrington, has been a guest on the show, and Griswold has produced some of Carrington's songs for the Bob and Tom CD series. "We're on in Nashville, and a couple of the execs from Mercury Records heard Rodney, really liked him . . . and ended up signing him to a record deal. They were primarily doing his live stand-up," he says. "When his record was ready to go, Mercury president Luke Lewis called me up and said, 'We really like what you did with these songs for your charity albums. Can you do them for Rodney for his album?'"

Griswold recalls growing up with comedy albums from Allen Sherman, Bill Cosby, and Firesign Theatre. And though he's had some success with the genre, he thinks the Steve Martin releases of the late '70s were the last of the mega-successful comedy albums. "The problem is a lot of them aren't radio-friendly. If you have a song on them or something that's going to get some radio play, it's going to get a lot of attention. I guess the best example of that would be Jeff Foxworthy. They just took a bunch of Jeff's stand-up and built a song around it."

Griswold is the first to predict that "overnight, radio is about to become a board-op position . . . Literally half of American radio is going to be off of a satellite in five years." So how does a consolidating industry develop new talent with the traditional training grounds rapidly disappearing? "Instead of the overnight guy waltzing in and doing mornings, it's like the guy that was helping the morning show, the producers—they're starting to do it now. It's almost like the best training for doing it is doing it."

talking about the local hot buttons nationally. We can do that when we do local breaks. And our affiliates, similarly, when they do local breaks, can talk about whatever's happening locally . . . There really is a global village, if you will; there's certainly a national village that everybody pays attention to. It's not just people in Washington talking about Monica Lewinsky."

They also made a presentational transition. "We used to be a traditional classic rock or album rock morning show. At first, we'd play eight songs an hour and then seven, then five, then maybe two, and now none. So, that was a change. We have a lot of space to fill. That was big," he says. "We beefed up our news and sports and made sure that we had more comedy pieces ready to go . . . We didn't have any trouble filling the space. We were a little nervous the first couple of days, and then we realized we were doing fine."

One of the first things he learned early on, he says, was that "every famous person out there has a relative that lives somewhere. Anybody you talk about that's well-known or in the news, you're bound to be talking to their cousin, brother, best friend, mother. And if you say something unfair or mean about them, they're probably going to track you down. Obviously, if you're out in L.A. and you're talking about movie stars, you know that they could be listening . . . but you kind of have this perception when you go in, 'Oh, here we are in the middle of nowhere. We're talking about these people. They're not going to hear about it . . . Then the phone rings, and you realize you're talking to Don Johnson's mother . . . It actually makes you weigh what you say with a little more care."

He also keeps in mind that when broadcasting to 70 markets, "one of the things you've got to really watch out for is sports." A pissed-off fan of a rival team might be even more rabid than Don Johnson's mother.

Like other morning talent, Bob and Tom have had offers to expand their franchise to TV.

million subscribers by 2005), the group heads' take on the prospect of digital satellite audio and the advent of greater Internet listening varied little from opinions expressed in previous years. "We just believe radio is fundamentally a local business," said Dickey. He was seconded by Marcus, who noted that his family had already subscribed to cable radio and was fascinated by it "for one day," and by Citadel Communications chairman Larry Wilson, who noted, "I'd rather be on my side of that deal than the poor fool on the other."

Clear Channel president/COO Mark Mays sounded one of the few dissents, saying that there would be more competition for radio, regardless of what form it took. "We shouldn't say, 'Hey, this is something that's going to go away,'" he asserted. And Chancellor's Marcus suggested that the FCC look into preventing Webcasters from operating beyond their local market.

Marcus' remarks preceded the unveiling of an Arbitron/Edison Media Research Internet listening study that suggested that Internet listening (and digital satellite radio) represented a larger issue for conventional local broadcasters than previously realized. Those broadcasters would "almost certainly see erosion" as the result of new media, said Arbitron's Pierre Boudard, reeling off stats that 13% of those already online say they're spending less time with radio, that one-third of the audience would choose an out-of-town signal on the Internet over a local broadcaster, and that 56% of the survey's respondents (chosen from diary keepers and online audio listeners) had said they would be somewhat or very interested in subscribing to satellite audio.

That was the bad news. The good news was that 35% of the same respondents said they were spending less time with TV as a result of the Internet; that a majority said they would listen to their current favorite station on the Internet, if it were available; and that radio stations were doing a good job of driving people to their Web sites. The study also cited considerable respondent interest in using a station's World Wide Web site to glean more info about a station's sponsors or even to buy products online.

Not surprisingly, modern rock listeners were both at the forefront of existing Internet listening and those most receptive to the prospect of subscription satellite radio.

Several days before the study's unveiling, Arbitron had already announced that it would team with Motorola's RadioWave.com to track Internet radio listening. The Arbitron study suggested that broadcasters look at acquiring not just conventional signals but also Netcasters and that they look at using Internet audio to serve the uncovered format niches in their own market.

GET THE LOAD OUT

Beyond the impact of new media, spot load was clearly a hot-button topic at the Radio Show. While Clear Channel's Mays thought radio's current inventory was comparable to that of three years ago, Cumulus' Dickey countered, "We could be our own worst enemy . . . Too much inventory, and we'll see TSL drop." And Emmis senior VP of programming Rick Cummings wryly noted at a separate session, "[The maximum stop-set length] used to be the time it took me to drive from home to work in the morning. Well, we went past that a year ago."

At the classic rock format session, panelists were divided on the impact of spot load. KZOK Seattle PD Carey Curelop thought spot load was not an issue because every spot load in a market had increased, not just that of a single station. Curelop said research showed that people had fewer and fewer problems with commercial clutter. It's "less of an irritant than it used to be," he said. But Westwood One Radio's Jeff Gonzer predicted, "One day, someone will think of doing 10 spots an hour, and everyone will follow."

DIVERSE OPINIONS ON DIVERSITY

Even before FCC Chairman Bill Kennard spoke at an Oct. 16 breakfast, a gauntlet had been thrown down by FCC Commissioner

Harold Furchtgott-Roth, who told attendees at the Oct. 15 financial breakfast that he opposed any attempt by the FCC to clamp down on broadcast consolidation, saying, "Congress made these decisions. The FCC has no power to second-guess Congress . . . The U.S. has some of the best antitrust agencies in the world. They can and will continue to enforce antitrust concerns. I just don't know what we can add." He was seconded that morning by Citadel CEO Larry Wilson, who said, "We've spent over a million dollars on antitrust issues with the Department of Justice, and I think it's a travesty to have to go through the same kind of thing with the FCC."

That didn't stop Kennard from expressing concern that small broadcasters were being "squeezed out" by consolidation and promising that the FCC will re-examine all its broadcast ownership rules with an eye on protecting diversity. Kennard also promised to continue to pursue Equal Employment Opportunity rules, to replace the ones struck down by an appeals court. He said, "We also know that there are some broadcasters among your ranks that will not do the right thing" of their own volition. Asked about an attempted revival of the minority tax certificate, Kennard said the FCC was "working with the Justice Department" in hopes of making it easier for major groups to sell stations to minority owners.

This year's NAB was filled with dire statistics on the state of minority ownership. At an early panel, WSKQ/WPAT New York VP/GM Carey Davis stated that minority ownership had gone from 3% to 1% since the elimination of the tax certificate, "and that's really sad." But at the group heads panel, moderator and Secret Communications head Frank Wood suggested that today's publicly held broadcasters have an ownership "diversity that you can't see: the shareholders." Similarly, Clear Channel's Mays contended that local PDs and GMs "own that property in their minds" and serve as a diverse group of owners, as if each actually held the license. "The commission doesn't give us enough credit" for that, said Mays. Then again, the day before, Katz Radio Group president Stu Olds had quoted American Urban Radio Networks' Skip Finley as saying that there were only 50 African-American GMs of R&B stations and only two at general-market stations.

ROCK PANEL RECAP

Modern rock's broad and not-always-cohesive coalition was an issue at that format's session. Modern WRAX Birmingham, Ala., PD Dave Rossi said that he targets across gender lines. "We're a modern AC disguised as an alternative," he said. "In order to be successful in alternative you can't draw from only one pool."

Modern WKQX Chicago PD Alex Luke added, "Our station attracts older female modern AC tastes mixed with young men who want alternative. We're seeing a real split with our listeners."

Luke is also seeing "a profound lessening of interest in music from the '80s in the past year. Our listeners aren't going to sit through the 'Safety Dance' to get to the Foo Fighters. We're having to stay young. I can't say that we're going to play any '80s music over the next 12 months."

Another format that's keeping itself young is active rock. At that format panel, KRXQ Sacramento, Calif., PD Curtiss Johnson said, "You have to follow your demo. We're always bringing in new audience and always shedding pieces of the upper end. We bring in new music, which some in your upper end don't get or want."

With the growing talk about the Extreme format, Johnson said that he felt KRXQ had already cornered that image in the market and was armed against a possible CBS assault in Sacramento. "To dull the blade of CBS initiating the Extreme format in the market," the station did a lifestyle promotion, stressing KRXQ as "your extreme soundtrack," said Johnson.

With so much talk about spot load, classic

New Radicals' Radical New Agenda

Gregg Alexander says New Radicals' debut single, "You Get What You Give" (MCA) is "meant to be a shameless embrace of what we need in such a cynical, fucked-up world, what we need in our hearts to survive through to the other side of whatever it is we're going through at the end of this millennium."

Alexander, who produced, wrote, and arranged the band's debut set, "Maybe You've Been Brainwashed Too," often comes off as a utopian dreamer, but he doesn't mind at all. "That's the thing that's interesting about society right now," says the animated singer. "It's against the law to be idealistic or to be a dreamer, but it's OK to be cynical and to be really negative or to do one of a hundred acceptable modes of behavior in our society."

Born into a modest working-class family in the immodest Grosse Pointe suburb of Detroit, Alexander grew up influenced by the Motor City's diverse radio programming, with the likes of DJ Electrifying Mojo preaching fervent polemic between George Clinton records. "There was a lot of subtext to it. It was exciting. It was interesting to see the dichotomy between the white rock'n'roll working-class groups and what their message was and what they were feeling and the soul and spirit and emotion that was coming out of the R&B radio station," he says. "But it was confusing hearing all of these different voices and emotions and hearing what was at the heart of each of them." He became interested in a grab bag of assorted singles by such artists as Sly & the Family Stone, MC5, Andy Williams, Chic ("50 times more rock'n'roll than all these fake punk bands"), the Everly Brothers, and Iggy Pop.

At the age of 16, amid a family being led by a mother who had a penchant for switching religions frequently, Alexander decided to "hop on the Ferris wheel and not get off" and left home for "an endless weekend that wasn't necessarily all fun-filled." It was a real-life learning experience—sleeping on beaches in California, busking with a guitar in London and New York, and staying in youth hostels in Europe.

What he came back with from his travels were the ideals for New Radicals, which he says are "about a movement on one hand toward, and on the other hand away from, things that are human and real. The whole computer age and all the options—eight types of cruise control—create a situation where everyone is cynical about all the real things in the world, but they're not as cynical about all the machinery taking over the world. Everybody just accepts what's put on their plates these days: 'Oh, that's just the way it is.' He would like to see more accountability and change, starting with the individual. "That's my sole reason for making music."

Whether the public will embrace Alexander's romantic visions remains to be seen. "It's about re-climbing inside of what's going on around us. It's not about thinking that we can just create a bubble because we have a VCR or can rent three movies a week and can go to a shopping mall and hang out and essentially be separate from the reality that's going on around us. We need to have a sense of refocusing all that stuff." Or, as another tunesmith once asked, "What's so funny about peace, love, and understanding?"

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rock WXCD Chicago PD Bill Gamble, moderator of the classic rock panel, turned the session's attention to the production director, and especially the station image production director. KZOK Seattle PD Carey Curelop put imaging talent second only to the morning show, while Roberts put them neck and neck. Westwood One's Gonzer dissented, saying, "Too much production makes a station too cluttered."

But a general agreement held that stations these days need to have separate commercial and imaging production departments and especially different voices. Gamble said that when the same voice is trying to sell an audience the benefit of a station and sell a car in the same

break, the station risks having its message devalued by having it associated with a "commercial."

Gamble next asked GMs in the audience if their production people were paid in the top percentages of a station's payroll, alongside morning talent. When few if any hands went up, Curelop said, "There's the problem."

With more and more spots meaning a heavier reliance on the production department, Gamble said that it becomes imperative that stations make sure they have the best commercial production talent locked down under contract. "Don't just give it to the overnight jock to voice a spot . . . We need to spend on creative imaging and commercial production."





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
