PDs Say Labels Get An 'Ample Payback' On Station Shows

Labels have long bemoaned the resources that go into station concerts and a lack of follow-up support for bands. But with the spring concert season in full swing, stations say labels are overlooking, and sometimes failing to take advantage of, the support that bands get before a station show. And while only a few of the PDs we spoke to believe they have any sort of post-show obligation, most say bands are getting ample payback for their stage time, to say nothing of the bands they pay outright to appear.

KNRK Portland, Ore., PD Mark Hamilton says, "There seems to be a prevailing attitude from labels that they're doing the station a favor... One way to look at it is as a real opportunity for a tremendous amount of exposure for a band."

KRXQ Sacramento, Calif., station manager Curtiss Johnson says, "On all the shows I've done, I've probably gone above and beyond." Aside from tying in concerts with local Tower stores, Johnson "pre-produces specific song intros for the artists," he says. "It's a 10- to 15-second mini-commercial beforehand... We encourage all the artists to do interviews, and then we post those on our Web site, transcribed with audioclips."

WKQX (Q101) Chicago PD Dave Richards laments that before the show, "it's so often just about spins, when it could be so much more... We want the band to appear at our autograph booth and do photos and on-air interviews, [and] we want them on the morning show the Friday before the concert. We've got a nightly TV show

that we'd love having bands be part of, and we've seen bands pop on the basis of appearing on our show." There's also Webcasting of the show, which, he says, is key for a modern rocker with an active, Web-surfing audience. "We offer all these to be taken advantage of, as well as just the spins," he says.

KROX (101X) Austin, Texas, PD Sara Trexler supplies bios on all the acts to her staff, "so the jocks can make the bands more familiar," she says. "We do it more informally and conversationally. We try to have the bands on the station and have phoners ahead of time."

The station has to help create an image around the band leading up to the show. "You want the band to have as many tracks on the radio leading up to the show as possible," Trexler says. "Most of these bands, even if they sold a million CDs, are still nameless and faceless. They still don't connect with the audience. Even with Fuel, which is pretty big and has good cred, I don't think our listeners connect [them with] all three of the songs yet."


At WZTA Miami, VP of programming Gregg Steele says, "We've got partners in the marketplace" that a band playing his show can tap into. When it comes to what his station puts up for a band to play his show, "sometimes it's spins. Sometimes it's financial. Sometimes it's multiple layers of promotional involvement that you wouldn't otherwise have," he says, citing "Web-site stuff [and] tying in with retailers on our end, as opposed to the label end."

Beyond the growing trend of having to pay for bands, Steele says that he's done labels favors. "There are times

AOL Leads Latest Webcast Charge; Folger Exits Zone; Holly Doubles Up

America Online is making its play to compete on the Web audio front. It's purchased Spinner Networks and Nullsoft in a \$400 million stock deal. This is intended to bring AOL subscribers the ability to play and record music over the Internet. Spinner.com operates an Internet jukebox service, and Nullsoft is the developer of MP3. With the announcement of this deal, AOL confirms it's developing music services for high-speed access with live and Internet-only sports and radio broadcasts and downloadable music.

DMX, the digital satellite service that pioneered cable radio, has inked an agreement with Lycos to provide the Web portal with 30 channels of music programming for Lycos Radio Network.

NBG Radio Network launches seekradio.com, an Internet portal linking users to audio and radio resource Web sites. Targeting a June 14 launch, the site promises links to Internet-radio sites, online programming, and Webcasts.

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After Hiatus, Alice In Chains Gets 'Born Again'

For the most part, this year's Memorial Day weekend programming had its usual impact on the charts, with current airplay down and fewer bullets across the board. The mainstream airplay chart has 13 bulleted songs, active rock has 14, heritage rock 11, and triple-A airplay only five. The only two charts not adversely affected are modern airplay, which had 19 bulleted records (with four of those being debuts), and the triple-A audience list, which had nine bullets—perhaps owing to the influence of major-market stations on the panel.

With Layne Staley on what seems to be an interminable hiatus, creative output from Alice In Chains has been halted for some time—even 1996's "Unplugged" was acoustic versions of previously released songs. But this week, the group's first new track since late '95, "Get Born Again" (Columbia), is the top entry on both the mainstream and modern charts. Alice In Chains has become the third act in three weeks to notch the active rock airplay triple crown of Airpower/Greatest Gainer/Most New Stations honors, as it debuts at No. 15 with "Get Born Again." The track reaches No. 13 on the mainstream audience chart and enters the companion airplay chart at No. 17. It's the 17th time the group has charted at mainstream rock since "Man In The Box" hit in April 1991; the group has had nine top 10s, including its only No. 1, "No Excuses." The group's "Again" reached the top 10 in July 1996, its last appearance on both charts. At modern, the band has had two top 10 tracks, "No Excuses" (No. 3 in '94) and "Heaven Beside You" (No. 6 in '96), and charted only nine tracks, more than half of what the act has accomplished at mainstream.

Def Leppard's "Promises" (Mercury) becomes the third track to reach the top of the heritage rock chart in just two weeks, as a 40% airplay increase fuels a 9-1 jump, earning the track Greatest Gainer and Most New Stations honors for the second straight week. A 77% increase on the mainstream rock airplay chart results in a 18-5 leap and Airpower honors. It's also the 11th top five track at mainstream rock for the band. "Promises" marks the group's 25th appearance on that chart.

Tom Petty & the Heartbreakers reach the top of the triple-A airplay chart this week with "Room At The Top" (Warner Bros.), despite a 6% decrease in spins, most likely due to holiday programming. Airplay Monitor policy is to award songs a bullet in their first week at No. 1 regardless of a decrease in spins or length of time on the chart.

PERSONNEL: Former head of Geffen Promotion Bob Catania joins Giant Records for the same... Dave Allen, formerly president of World Domination Records and member of Gang Of Four and Shriekback, starts Twenty 14 Records, a label based in Los Angeles that will be distributed by Koch International. Christopher The Minister will be head of promotion with A&R duties. He was formerly national promotion director for Red Ant.

STATIONS: Due to technical difficulties, XETRA-FM (91X) San Diego is temporarily removed from the modern panel.

NEW FRONTIERS

Billboard Bulletin reports that Universal Music Group and BMG Entertainment are teaming with AT&T and Matsushita for a new digital distribution technology, Electronic Media Distribution. They're talking about digitally delivering product by the end of the year, cover-

ing such formats as Internet-delivered music, DVDs, audio CDs, and set-top boxes.

The Electronic Media Distribution system is expected to conform with the Secure Digital Music Initiative (SDMI).

In other SDMI news, the major labels are expected to announce their official support for the technology June 15.

Broadcast.com has inked a five-year agreement with Level 3 Communications to use the latter's fiber-optic Internet Protocol network to allow for greater bandwidth in the transmission of video and digital streaming. Level 3 gets access to Broadcast.com's content.

Three Senators Seek To Clip FCC's Wings

FCC Chair **Bill Kennard** may have received a more cordial welcome on Capitol Hill at a May 26 Senate hearing, but at the same time three high-level Republicans were looking to clip the FCC's wings. Senators **John McCain**, R-Ariz.; **Orrin Hatch**, R-Utah; and **John Ashcroft**, R-Mo., introduced a bill that would streamline the government's merger review. The Telecom Merger Review Act mandates that if either the Department of Justice or the Federal Trade Commission has reviewed a proposed merger and found no need to intervene, the FCC must remain hands-off. If the FCC does get involved, it would have only 60 days to complete the review. The senators' complaint is that the FCC typically re-reviews proposed mergers, even after DOJ or FTC approval, adding months to the process and millions of dollars in costs.

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The commissioners defended the process, arguing that their reviews supplement, and do not overlap, DOJ scrutiny. During most of the hearing, radio issues were overshadowed by long distance and the Internet, although Sen. **Byron Dorgan**, D-N.D., asked the FCC to explain what its decency standard is and how it is set. Dorgan also asked Kennard to list the words not allowed on the radio. "I'm not sure that would be appropriate," responded a flustered Kennard.

Elsewhere, the FCC has flagged Capstar's purchase of CP **KBED** (102.9 FM) Shreveport, La., from Port City Communications, citing concentration concerns.

CAPITAL: WW1 BUYS METRO NETS

Westwood One, which already owns traffic and news provider Shadow Broadcasting, will soon have a lock on the business with its \$900

million purchase of Metro Networks, which has more than 2,000 radio and TV clients in six countries. Metro's president, **Charles Bortnick**, will become president/COO of the combined operations of Metro and Shadow.

Meanwhile, WW1's parent, CBS, is expanding its outdoor division, while Chancellor Media is taking steps to exit the business. CBS/Infinity is paying \$8.3 billion for Outdoor Systems, which combined with TDI creates the largest outdoor media company in the world. Outdoor Systems owns 112,000 display faces in 150 markets in the U.S., Canada, and Mexico. It also owns 125,000 subway displays in New York.

But Chancellor CEO **Tom Hicks** says his company is taking a significant step toward becoming a radio-only corporation, with the sale of its billboard business to Lamar Advertising, which will pay Chancellor \$1.6 billion in stock and cash for 42,500 billboards. As part of the deal, Chancellor will continue to own a 30% stake in Lamar for at least the next year. The DOJ must approve both deals, and both companies say its review should be completed by fall.

INSIDE THE SEC FILINGS

Public companies must eventually show their hand, and Capstar is no different. In its recently released annual report to the Securities and Exchange Commission, Capstar reveals the outcome of several lawsuits filed against it. One suit, brought by Cardinal Communications over the sale of sports **KTCK** Dallas, was settled with Capstar writing a check for \$2.9 million. Another centers on Capstar's purchase of Triathlon Broadcasting. The action, brought by former Triathlon shareholders, alleges Capstar helped Triathlon cut a deal that would favor Triathlon senior officers over rank-and-file shareholders.

The SEC filing also reveals pay for top officers. CEO **Steve Hicks** is given a base annual salary of \$577,500, with a guaranteed 5% pay increase each year, a benefit afforded no other Capstar employee. Most others make roughly \$300,000 and are subject to bonuses.

Citadel has also recently released its annual report, showing CEO **Larry Wilson** made \$358,000 in 1998, with another \$214,000 in bonuses. Like Hicks', Wilson's contract has a built-in 5% raise clause.

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Station Concerts Top Outdoor Fun, 'Powers II'

Station concerts reclaimed the Topical Barometer crown, which it will likely hold throughout the summer, well ahead of summer movies—specifically, the "Austin Powers" sequel—and outdoor activities.

While modern rock KXTE (Extreme) Las Vegas and top 40 WPXY Rochester, N.Y., are tying in "Austin Powers II" ticket giveaways with grand-prize trips to London, where winners will catch a big concert, top 40 CKIK Calgary, Alberta, will host a **Shagadelic Shindig** at a local club immediately after the premiere. The club will be decked out with a full retro theme, complete with go-go dancers, etc. Says **Michael Godfrey**, "It'll be groovy, eh?"

On Memorial Day weekend, adult top 40 KHMx (Mix 96.5) Houston gave away videos of "Saving Private Ryan," while country WQYK Tampa, Fla., ran the oldies standby, the **Top 500 Songs of All-Time** weekend. "We ran ads in The Tampa Tribune asking people to send us their top 10 and had a grand prize of \$1,000 for those who voted," says **Mike Cullotta**. "The response was great."

amusement parks. Country WBEE Rochester toasts a local theme park's opening day by taking 20 lucky winners to the park (before it opens to the public) to test-drive the rides. "We'll do call-ins and really make a 'scream' on the roller coasters," **Stephanie Hogerman** says. "On the same day, our morning co-host will head for the water park for sprinkler games and the dunk tank."

PROMO TOPIC OF THE WEEK: THE STATIONS THAT SWAG YOU

In radio, swag, like diamonds, are forever. T-shirts and hats are the most prevalent swag, but items range from lip balm, key chains, and water bottles to refrigerator magnets, bubbles in mini-champagne bottles for New Year's Eve, boxer shorts, polo shirts, tank tops, jogging suits, Halloween candy, and radios that can only be tuned to your station. Most irreverent swag came courtesy of **Jason Gani** when he worked at **WBHT** (Hot 97) Wilkes-Barre, Pa. "We gave away 'Leprecondoms' to 'keep your little fellow safe when he's searching for that pot of gold.'" Most of the stuff is sold for profit, although many stations sell special items for charity or just to cover their cost. Prices for the usual stuff average \$10 for T-shirts and \$14 for hats. **Garret Doll** at country **KYGO** Denver is trying to get labels to sponsor their hats by embroidering artists' names or signatures on them. Others cited several ways to make the swag special:

- WBEE's Hogerman suggests using quality cottons or 50/50 fabrics. "Things printed on white last longer. Pigment-dyed fabrics fade. Use colored ink, not colored shirts, to give away. They cost less, too!"
- "Add excitement to your logo," WPXY's **Tristano Korlou** says. "If it's cool looking, people will want to wear it and show it off."
- Country **KEEY** Minneapolis' **Diana Buckmann** changes T-shirt designs every year and creates limited-edition swag for special events. "Our commemorative state fair T-shirt, featuring a country lineup, always sells out," she says.

"The Phantom Menace," "Austin Powers II," "Notting Hill," "Wild Wild West," "The Mummy," "Tarzan," "Big Daddy"

Obviously, the "Phantom Menace" buzz has cooled considerably, and some stations are playing on its backlash. Yet several are still getting considerable mileage with creative contests. Album rock **KEGL** (the Eagle) Dallas duct-taped a male intern, dressed as Princess Leia, to a telephone pole and gave out clues to where "she" was. Everyone who found "her" won movie tickets. **Loren Condron** offers clever remarks on "why a duct" tape.

Country **KSON** San Diego toyed with the idea of giving tickets to people who'd be the least likely to see "The Phantom Menace." "Being cold-hearted radio geeks, we first considered sending homeless people and then getting their critiques," **Greg Frey** says. "Hilarious, but misguided. Instead, we stationed morning producer **Doug Sterling** at a central location and asked listeners to drive by and donate money to buy tickets. We raised enough in one morning to buy 200 tickets, which we gave to two local youth groups."

Top 40 **KKRZ** (Z100) Portland, Ore., will send one lucky winner to Tunisia, where the movie's **Tatooine** scenes were shot. Qualifiers get a "Star Wars" leather jacket, with the winner going to a resort in Africa, "not in the middle of the desert!" says **Wendi "Force-ter"**. A definite top 10 staple this summer will be

QUICK HITS

The mystery music montage is alive and well at R&B **WJTT** (Power 94) Chattanooga, Tenn., whose **Power Mystery Music Sweeps** are quick snippets of five songs. Whoever names the artist and title of each song wins cash. Better yet, the pot increases by \$100 every time someone guesses wrong. Rumor has it that **Wayne Collins** even changed his name to **Benjamins**.

KEGI's Condron also keeps us abreast of the station's **Topless Summer**. Caller No. 9 who hears the "topless tune of the day" can win a topless trip for two to Mazatlan, Mexico, and qualifies to win a topless Jeep Wrangler.

Tristano Korlou describes WPXY's **Hairiest Man Contest**: "In the summer, more and more guys walk around with no shirts on," he waxes eloquently as he gets it off his chest. "Our morning show encourages lady listeners to send in pictures of their hairy men. The pictures will then be put on the 98PXV Web site. The one that receives the most votes will win a pair of VIPs to our Summer Jam concert, plus a free wax job. All entries receive movie premiere passes to see the ultimate hairy man, 'Austin Powers: The Spy Who Shagged Me.'"

when a band is packaged with a couple of other bands."

Trexler explains another tough situation when setting up her station show's lineup. "Sometimes you end up with bands that the promoter puts on because he or she owes favors." That may place bands on your stage that are not wholly appropriate for the station. "You don't want the band to go on the stage and badmouth your radio station," says Trexler, so she'll spin the band leading up to the show, at least.

Spins and all the other support a station brings to the table are imperative to a festival's success. "What you pull out of it is equal to what you put in," says Steele. "If you don't make a song familiar enough or important enough for your audience to see this band at your festival, you may as well put a local band on the bill."

At the end of the day, there's still the show itself. KXXR (93X) Minneapolis co-hosts a two-day festival with sister KZMZ. KXXR PD Wade Linder says that for a developing act, playing in front of 34,000 "consumers" has a value unto itself. "They want to sell records?" he asks. "We're giving up-and-coming bands a chance to play in front of more people than all their previous shows combined."

Hamilton says, "A lot of the festivals have a B-stage, [where] a lot of these up-and-coming bands would have never gotten to play in front of audiences this size."

Linder and Hamilton both say that when a band commits to a show, it has bought into a huge promotion package. "You're going to be in a hell of a lot of promos, [worth] far more than the band's getting paid. Radio stations do a very good job of pounding these things. You hear the band's name and hooks of the band over and over again," says Hamilton. "We do posters and fliers. What else do they want?"

DO THEY HAVE TO LET IT LINGER?

Universal's Steve Leeds suggested in Rock Airplay Monitor's recent mainstream rock special that once a station accepts a band for its show, it is a partner in developing that band beyond the station show. That argument implies that once the band has appeared on a station's stage, it is an extension of the station's brand and therefore worth long-term attention. Programmers we spoke with were split on this issue.

KNRK's Hamilton says a band playing a station show "is getting as much exposure and benefits out of [the show] as the station is. . . . The station doesn't necessarily need to be held hostage to play everything by that band from here on."

Q101's Richards says it's hard to make promises too far into the future on any band. "I don't ever want to put a band on a show that I don't want to support," he says. "[but] music tastes and styles change so quickly that the bands that were huge five years ago are no longer huge."

The bigger and more immediate problem is when labels expect something after the show. "A lot of it is done under [the] assumption," Richards says, that when the label comes to the programmer after the fact and says, "So and so played your show a month and a half ago, and we're going for this third single," it will get spins.

Richards would rather have that discussion on post-show expectations before a band commits to a show. "Let me hear single No. 2 or No. 3," says Richards. "If we're partners, let's share the marketing plan. . . . That goes a long way farther than [a label asking,] 'Are you going to be there?'"

WZTA's Steele says, "Some stations make those deals pretty concrete when they're acquiring artists for shows. We're not as hard and fast." But if a band is "good enough to want [for] your festival, we certainly want to endorse them to our and the audience's benefit."

Ultimately, though, Steele agrees with Richards. Post-show spins are not owed to a label "unless it's spelled out that way in the agreement to get the band."

But KRXX's Johnson says he books acts for his shows with an ear toward further support. "There's a lot of people sitting in my chair that may not necessarily agree with that," Johnson says. "But when I book shows, I always try to book a lineup that makes sense for the station—bands I feel comfortable supporting."

Johnson says, "If the label is spending the money to bring the band in, there is a sense of obliga-

tion. If as a programmer it's something you don't feel comfortable with, then don't book that act."

KXXR's Linder says, "The record first has to be good enough for 93X to play, then we invite them to Edgefest."

Playing a station show can make an act part of that station's heritage, says Johnson. "They played our event, the audience knows them. If it comes down to two records on my desk and one of them has done a show, all things being equal, then I'm going to give the band that played for us [the slot] just because of the pure fact of extra exposure it's had in the market."

But Steele and Johnson agree that at the end of the day, they have to get ratings. "There are times when the next record isn't right for the station," says Johnson, and the label agenda has to take a back seat.

KROX's Trexler will try to support a concert artist, within reason. "Soul Coughing is cool for 101X, imagewise. I will always look for places to put those records. Collective Soul really rocks sometimes, and sometimes does some real pop songs," she says. "The band has got to come up with records that are right for us."

She adds, "There aren't any hard-and-fast rules. A lot of times the record companies will act like [we're] married for now and forevermore. That ain't the case. Look at the evolution this station's gone through. Anything more toward the pop vein is going to have a hard time."

Trexler says that with the trend toward paying for bands growing, "when you're buying the bands and supporting [them] leading up, the label has less cachet to say, 'You owe us.'"

Then there's the situation when a station may not be spinning an act's third single but is still playing the first two after the show. While the station may not be conforming to the label's agenda, Trexler says, "if you're still playing the other two tracks, you're exposing the band."

And a station might have wider latitude of what's acceptable on the air before a show. "So if the third song is not strong, but you play it early because they're on the bill, it shouldn't be shocking if they get dropped after the show if it doesn't sound sonically where the station is," says Trexler.

HOW LABELS CAN BE PROACTIVE

Programmers agree that labels are missing opportunities to stretch market exposure of a band playing a station show. Trexler says planning ahead is useful. If she's got a show coming up in four months and the label waits until a month before the show to commit its artist, especially a baby band, "they're going to get five weeks of spins at maybe 20 spins a week," she says, "but if they can get a commitment four months ahead of time," she has more time to build up the band. "They'll get 500 spins. That's what the savvy labels do."

The problem that that can bring a station, counters Q101's Richards, "[is] sometimes you sign a band two months before your show, and it's no longer a priority by the time the show comes around, and the band is forgotten by the record company. At every festival I've ever done, the label has ditched [some act]."

But even when the band is committed in less than a four-month window, KNRK's Hamilton says, there's a lot labels can do to leverage the station's promotional profile. "I don't think labels do a very good job of following through once the band has committed to a show," he says.

Hamilton suggests that the label get the band to do liners before being asked by the station. "Be creative," says Hamilton, offering examples, such as "Looking forward to seeing you in Portland on Aug. 8" or "This is Gavin from Bush; call now to win tickets" for the upcoming show.

Sending packages to each jock at a station is another way to get the buzz inside the station to come out of the speakers, says Hamilton. He suggests including a bio, CDs—maybe the band's entire catalog—a T-shirt, and tchotchkes. That way, says Hamilton, "when they talk about the show, they're going to talk about that band."

As more shows crop up, bands go from station show to station show. That too, is an opportunity, says Hamilton. "Have the label's regional rep fax an update of the wacky stories of what's been happening on the road. Send those stories out so the band gets more pre-press in advance of the show," he says.

MONITOR PROFILE

Consultant Jacobs Sees Localism As Radio's Savior Against Challenge Of Net

If Fred Jacobs could offer the programmers of 1999 one word of advice, it would be "localism." While national morning shows and the rise of the Internet might seem to be minimizing the importance of market-to-market differences, Jacobs, who is approaching the 16th anniversary of his Jacobs Media consultancy, sees the concept of a national programming template as the obsolete one.

In a post-consolidation environment, Jacobs says, "a lot of the traditional format boundary lines that we love to employ are pretty much non-existent. What is active rock in Detroit is going to be different than active rock in Philadelphia or Sacramento, Calif. What dictates how these stations sound has less to do with industry trends or music trends and much more to do with cluster partners or competitive issues. That's why it's hard to talk about active or classic rock or even alternative as a homogenous format anymore, because so much of what is affecting stations has little to do with traditional format guidelines."

Rock especially is easily fragmented, according to Jacobs. "Rock can be sliced and diced in a variety of ways depending on, again, your cluster strategy and who you're competing against," he says. "You'd never go into a market and become the second jazz or oldies station or even the second country station. . . . But nobody thinks twice about, 'Hey, let's slide in "classic rock that really rocks,"' because rock is perceived to be this highly fragmentable format."

Those market specifics have changed his job as well. "In the early days, it was much more of a cookie-cutter process where consultants had their lists and their liners and their specials and features, and it was sort of a 'one size fits all' kind of relationship. The real struggle and challenge now [is to] walk into each of these markets and custom tailor a sound for the individual situation."

"There used to be format bellwether [stations] out there where you could pull a monitor [and say] 'Hey, wow. Look at them, they're playing this, and we aren't' or 'Their ratings are here and ours aren't.' We've strongly discouraged our clients from doing that kind of thing."

Jacobs also discourages PDs from following playlists of stations "that you know nothing about, except by reputation, and attempting to draw conclusions from that process. If you don't understand the back story in that market, what has led up to the competitive situation being the way it is, [and] if you're not privy to the research that's being done there. . . . looking at an individual monitor can be even dangerous in terms of trying to apply something to your own situation."

Asked about another type of cloning, the sudden spurt of R&B oldies outlets, Jacobs says that these moves to the format du jour are "indicative of the whole media world out there and not specific to radio," citing the shorter life span of new TV shows. "Now you can be cancelled after two mediocre episodes. . . . What you're seeing out there is a shorter envelope of success. You have to make it bigger, quicker, and if not, [you might say,] 'Hey, we're going to go ahead and

make the move here'. . . . Everybody's lives now are being measured on a quarter-to-quarter basis, because we're all tied in to the success of these companies on Wall Street."

That bottom-line pressure has led to greater automation in radio and, with it, concerns about losing both localism and the training ground for new talent. But Jacobs thinks those concerns may be misguided.

He says the "lack of localism" rap is unfounded when "you can listen to stations that are totally live 24 hours a day, and they're not very local. . . . Whether it's an automated system or some guy sitting in front of a microphone is secondary to what they're being instructed to talk about. For stations that aren't local except when they read the weather, it's probably a pretty good time. . . . to start thinking about local content here and [whether we're] reflecting what our listeners who live right here are thinking."

As far as new talent, Jacobs says the issue isn't one of no place to train but no one to train. "For the past 15 years or so, radio has just not geared any of its programming toward young people, teens. Once 25-54 became the mantra, what you started seeing happening in a big way was a complete exodus from youth programming," says Jacobs. During that time the Internet captured teens' imagination. "They have now found another place to go to be entertained, and it's certainly not over on the radio side, because we just offer so pathetically little for them. . . . That's a big-time industry problem that's going to just get bigger and bigger as time goes by, because they're just not going to come to radio when they're 25. They actually have other musical entertainment options to go to, whether it's MP3 or Internet radio or any of those kinds of things. I would think many teens today are more comfortable in front of their PCs than they are turning on a radio."

Jacobs sees the Web as the next frontier worthy of stations' resources. He emphasizes at-work listening, now being courted by VH1 at Work, Yahoo!'s streaming stations, and even the radio buttons on Microsoft's browser. "The whole focus here is moving toward listening to music over the Net while you're working," he says. "If your audience is online and you're not, you're probably falling dangerously behind."

Tim Davis is now in charge of Web issues at Jacobs Media, and Jacobs says the Web is "going to be as big a part of the consulting that we do as advising stations on what music to play or who should be on the air."

He advises stations to create Net departments. "Web sites need to be programmed, marketed, and sold. The question is, Can it be done by the same people who are selling, programming, and marketing the rest of the station, or is it going to require new people? We think it's going to require new people. The revenue potential is there. The one thing that radio has that barnesandnoble.com doesn't have is cume," he says. "We can drive people to the Net; it's a tremendous tool if we can figure out a way to manage it and sell it."

While the Web is global, Jacobs insists that it's localism that will win out for radio. "People are going to go around and sample, but hopefully, they're going to come back to the local radio station, because it offers things that you can't get from a digitally delivered satellite service or from some station 2,000 miles away or even music that you program yourself," he says. A local station "tells [listeners] things they can do at night, things that are going on around town, traffic and weather conditions, what the local sports teams are up to—just part of what makes New York or Detroit or Chicago or St. Louis or Yakima, Wash., interesting places to live. . . . [Localism is] going to be radio's salvation, too, if radio makes the right moves and reflects the local community well." **MARC SCHIFFMAN**



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
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
