For Anal PDs/MDs, Music Schedulers Are Just A Card File With A Keyboard

"Anyone today who decides to take the easy way out by just scheduling and printing their music logs is gonna get their ass kicked," says Rich Anhorn, MD of adult top 40 KHMN (Mix 96.5) Houston.

A few years ago, a PD or MD making that statement would add that he or she personally spent 45 to 90 minutes a day editing the log that music scheduling software had generated. But Anhorn, like many of his equally anal-retentive peers, may spend three hours a day manually scheduling music, using his music software as little more than a variant of the old-fashioned card-file-box system most broadcasters grew up with—the "radio station in a box."

With the post-Telecom environment keeping PDs and MDs stuck in non-stop meetings, many find it difficult to allocate three hours a day to properly schedule their music. But others feel

the need to be personally involved in every hour of music, using their music computer strictly as a warehouse for stock, while using instinct to custom-balance every quarter hour and fashion a "vibe" for their radio stations, a task many say can't be accomplished by Intel.

That's why Anhorn insists on scheduling each day's music manually, one song at a time. "I don't let the computer make the decisions for me," he says. After all, any music-scheduling system, with its many rules and self-imposed limitations, although flexible, is only as effective as the person operating it. "If someone could design a machine that could feel what I feel, I'd be out of a job," he adds.

"We schedule our music manually, one song at a time," says WPXY Rochester, N.Y. OM Clarke Ingram, who also uses Selector.

"We recommend to our clients that they manually schedule everything but

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

KHYS/KJOJ Houston Flip To Dance

Clear Channel flips jazz KHYS Houston and its simulcast partner KJOJ to rhythmic top 40 under new PD Greg Head, who transfers from the MD slot at R&B duopoly partner KBXX (the Box). The MD is former KTFM San Antonio, Texas, MD Charles Chavez. KHYS, which made an early run at top 40/rhythm-crossover in the late '80s, before the Box signed on, will again be known as Kiss 98.5. Its simulcast partner at 103.3 FM will be known as Kiss Again. The artist then known as Prince's "Kiss" was the record used to stunt. Here's the first hour of the station: **Toni Braxton**, "Un-break My Heart"; **Proyecto Uno**, "El Tiburon"; **Spice Girls**, "Wannabe"; **Angelina**, "Release Me"; **Keith Sweat**, "Twisted"; **Planet Soul**, "Set U Free"; **No Doubt**, "Don't Speak"; **No Mercy**, "Where Do You Go"; **Debbie Deb**, "When I Hear Music"; **Az Yet**, "Last Night"; **Le Click**, "Tonight Is The Night"; **Jocelyn Enriquez**, "Do You Miss Me"; and **Mariah Carey**, "Fantasy."

Head will oversee music at KBXX until his assistant **Shon Howell** can assume the duties. Meanwhile, crosstown top 40 KRBE is using the positioner "the new beat revolution." Finally, another ex-KTFM MD, **Charlie Huero**, returns to his hometown of San Diego as APD of Nationwide's KUPR under **Bruce St. James**.

Evergreen Media president/COO **Jim de Castro** is again serving as GM of modern AC WLUP Chicago, replacing **Doug Sterne**, who transfers to jazz KKSJ San Francisco as GM.

After three years in country, **WKSI** Greensboro, N.C., becomes modern AC "the Point." The only survivors are PD **Chuck Finley** and newsmen **Marty Ryan**. The Point will run jockless for two months while Finley looks for new personalities. **Vallie/Richards** is consulting.

Jacor's AC **KKBH** (the Beach) San Diego switches handles to Mix 102.9. Look for some familiar San Diego calls to return soon.

Former **WBLI** Long Island, N.Y., PD **Stef Ryback** resurfaces as PD at new rival **WLVG**, which is set to hit the air in about three weeks. **Gary Starr** is the president/GM.

Former **KONO** San Antonio PD **Rick Upton**, who resurfaced recently as PD of Spanish-language **KXTN-AM**, oversees that station's flip to **KPOZ** (Positive Radio), planned to be a network operated by Tichenor Media System, which combines "positive-themed" AC with two or three Christian AC cuts an hour; and family-oriented talk at night. **Ed Kerby**, GM of **KDAY** Los Angeles in its hip-hop heyday, is the new GM. **Jay Tope**, morning producer at AC rival **KSMG**, joins for afternoons.

Rhythmic **KBZR** (the New 103.9) Phoenix flips calls to **KPTY**, "Arizona's party station." PD **Rick Thomas** says the old calls went when he realized BZR stood for "below zero ratings."

As reported here last week, rhythmic top 40 **KJMN** (Jam'n 92.1) Denver did indeed sign off in preparation for its flip to Spanish. PD **Mark Feather**, APD **Michael Hayes**, MD **John Dickinson**, and staff are on the street and can be reached at 303-693-7607. Jam'n signed off with "If Tomorrow Never Comes" by **Joosé**, **Wall Of Voodoo's** "Mexican Radio," and **Boyz II Men's** "End Of The Road"—in Spanish.

The L.A. Daily News reports that **WKQI** (Q95.5) Detroit morning guy **Danny Bonaduce** ended up in clutch with Royal Oak, Mich., police last week. He urged two contestants to fake a car accident and an ensuing brawl so realistically that cops rushed six cars to the scene. "Call it stupid radio," said an apologetic Bonaduce, who later hand-delivered 30 lunches to police headquarters. The women were cited for obstructing traffic.

Bob Zuraweste, most recently with the RAB. He replaces **Ron Carter** as GM of AC **KLTH** Kansas City and its duopoly partners.

Ex-WGAY Washington, D.C., PD **Jeff Silver** becomes interim PD at AC **WLHT** Grand Rapids, Mich. He replaces **Steve Dirksen**, now the APD of crosstown **WVIR** (Variety 96.1).

Former **WMMS** Cleveland PD **John Gorman** is the new PD of recent album launch **WYST** (97 Rock) Detroit, replacing **Michael Oakes**.

Top 40 **KNRV** (the Nerve) Killeen, Texas, flips to oldies as **Cool 105.5**. **Chuck White**, last with **WNOE** New Orleans, is the new PD.

OM **Gary James** is upped to GM at **WHYN** Springfield, Mass., replacing the late **Mike Marder**. **Chris Tracy**, who was serving as the unusual combo of chief engineer/PD, is OM.

Modern AC **KYSR** (Star 98.7) L.A. inks ex-**KMEL** San Francisco morning co-host **Lisa Foxx** for morning news, joining **Larry Morgan** and sidekick **Shirley**, and weekends. Here's the rest of Star's current lineup: **Merilee Kelly** (from late crosstown **KSCA**) is in middays; **Gary Thompson** moves from middays to afternoons; and former morning host **Mark Goodman** is in nights, followed by **Bill Alexander**.

N/T **KMPK** L.A. hasn't been an AC for 20 years, but we should note the passing of its legendary calls: It is now known **KTZN** (the Zone). Meanwhile, **WHHH** Indianapolis duopolizes another set of legendary calls, suburban country outlet **WIRE**.

As tipped here several months ago, album **WDDJ** Paducah, Ky., makes its move back to top 40 under new owners Bristol Broadcasting. **T.J. McKay** and **Mark Summer** get PD and MD posts, respectively, from the same at country **WWZD** Tupelo, Miss. Interim PD **Niki Cruze** is again concentrating on mornings.

At top 40/adult **KQIC** Willmar, Minn., PD/p.m. driver **Steve Schug** exits. **Jeff Adams**, PD of co-owned **KWLM-AM**, adds those duties. Schug can be reached at 320-235-7681.

WWKX (Kix 106) Providence, R.I., morning man **Bill Keeler** returns to his hometown, Utica, N.Y., to care for his ailing 6-year-old; he'll do mornings at **WRCK**. Kix PD **Joe Dawson** seeks a replacement; P/T **Bobby Z.** fills in for now.

WWSN Charlotte, N.C., PD **Stacy Cantrell** hires ex-**KQKS** (KS104) Denver stablemate **Josh Goodman**, recently modern **WPLY** (Y100) Philadelphia p.m. driver, for APD/middays.

KZZP Phoenix MD **Dave Cooper** adds APD stripes.

R&B combo **WBHJ/WBHK** Birmingham, Ala., takes **WBHJ** p.m. driver **Rex N. Effect** off-air to focus on his production director duties full-time. MD **Daysha Parker** goes to afternoons. Overnighter **Kori White** moves to middays. Recently arrived P/T **Dwight Stone** (from **WEUP** Huntsville, Ala.) will do overnights.

The Good News About Call-Out Research

As this author launches into his third year at Top 40 Airplay Monitor, one of the surprises of the past two has been how favorably this column has been received by the music industry. Two years ago, I wasn't sure how much candor the industry was willing to accept from its trade paper, so it's been nice to hear from folks on the record side that this column frequently makes it into Wednesday-morning marketing meetings to support one point or another.

Shame it all has to end this week. But after two years, I finally feel the need to weigh in on the call-out research issue. And I'm not sure how many dear industry friends I will have after writing a column in praise of call-out. As long as there's been call-out—about 25 years—record folks have suggested that top 40 PDs rely on it too much. And top 40 PDs have claimed, almost to a person, that they regard it as only one tool in an arsenal of research weapons. (At this point, it would be kind of refreshing if somebody fessed up to slavishly following their weekly call-out, but I'm not expecting that anytime soon.)

Now, a couple of things have to be stated off the top. One is the whole industry can't be accused of slavishly following call-out when relatively few have research, as opposed to a consultant's call-out, networking partners' research, etc. Another is even those PDs who honestly believe that they use call-out only as one of many tools probably give more weight to a pop record that is researching but not selling than they will to a record that sells but doesn't call-out, particularly when it's an R&B crossover in question.

That said, a few positives to call-out are often overlooked in the debate. Among them:

1. If it weren't for call-out, most conservative large-market PDs would probably play fewer records, not more. Some large- and medium-market PDs do a pretty good job of figuring out what the legitimate hits are in their market without call-out. **KHOM** New Orleans' **Bill Thorman** chief among them. Most mainstream PDs, however, would have a hard time finding 40 currents they felt comfortable playing from sales and requests alone—most of what would emerge would be R&B crossovers that, for better or worse, are not a core sound for those PDs. Call-out allows a few more records that would otherwise be dropped early (or never added) to hang around long enough to come home.

2. Those folks who are going to play records that don't sell or generate requests may as well play the right ones. Spend some time with some of the smaller-market stations, where PDs who can't afford research, but who are nervous about anything that's too R&B or too modern, tend to compensate by letting a lot of unproven, nonre- action records through the gate. After a while,

you'll agree that access to call-out would have at least improved their batting average. And it's smaller markets where the format's future remains most at stake these days.

3. Call-out isn't just for records that don't respond to other forms of research. **Toni Braxton's** "You're Making Me High" reacted before it started calling out, but still faced resistance. Now, it's a call-out smash, and most of the PDs who felt it was "too black" six months ago are going back for it. Should they have played it before? Sure. Same goes for "Spiderwebs." But, in the long run, the industry is better for having had those records on as many large-market mainstream top 40s as possible, however they got there. Same goes for the large-market rhythmic top 40s that never would have played "Counting Blue Cars" or "You Were Meant For Me" if all they had were conventional indicators.

Is call-out slowing down the speed at which records work through the system? If call-out is to blame for records that take a year to break, it deserves credit for records that hung around long enough to break after a year. Besides, most call-out smashes have always hung around for a long time; it's just that in the pre-BDS era, there was no way of quantifying that. Sure, "Counting Blue Cars" is getting a lot of recurrent airplay a year later. Then again, perhaps you remember **Steve Winwood's** "Higher Love" coming and going in 12 weeks, but I sure don't, regardless of what the charts might have shown.

I don't know if all PDs who use call-out use it correctly. Nobody seems to have compensated for the fact that 80% of anything that hangs around long enough to become familiar will test eventually. A lot of songs that probably don't deserve to become recurrents end up doing so because the research finally kicks in at the very end of their current lifespan; then again, if those songs are legitimate hits, those titles that got 30 spins a week when they weren't testing probably deserve more than 10 to 12 spins a week once they do. You also can't overlook the fact that there are a lot of immaculately researched radio stations doing badly. Most of those that just aren't in the right format to begin with probably had a format search guiding them there, too.

For those who remain determined to decrease programmers' reliance on call-out, there is a way. Deliver a lot of mainstream pop records that sell and get requests. In 1983-85, a lot of the large-market call-out champions felt pretty good about not having call-out, as they didn't have to go looking for hits. Until "Wannabe," there weren't a lot of records indigenous to mainstream and adult top 40 that could have created a story without call-out. The more exceptions there are, the more comfortable PDs will feel letting their guard down.

Modern Rock, Rhythm-Crossover Top New-Artist Radio Formats In 1996

The time is right to revive one of my old column standbys: a close examination of the process of breaking new artists. I looked at the chart stats for 1996 in the seven formats dealt with by the Airplay Monitors in which Barnestorming appears and came up with a whole raft of stats, which I'll spin out over the next few columns. This edition will deal with the raw facts.

In 1996, 104 new artists were "broken" (defined as making their first-ever chart appearance on one of the seven rock, top 40, and AC Airplay Monitor charts). Another 87 crossed over to a new format for the first time, including nine artists who did a reverse-cross from top 40/rhythm to one or both of the R&B charts.

I'd love to compare these numbers with similar figures from recent years, but since the last year for which I did anything remotely like this was 1989, I don't think the comparison would be relevant. But I can break down the 1996 figures into useful, bite-size chunks. Here's how the formats broke down for the number of new artists broken:

Modern: 33.
Top 40/rhythm: 27.
Mainstream rock: 22.
Triple-A: 13.
Adult top 40: 10.
Top 40/mainstream: 5.
AC: 0.

A few notes on these figures. First, the total adds up to more than 104 because a few artists debuted simultaneously in more than one chart (**Robert Miles** scored a triple debut in mainstream, rhythm, and adult). You'd expect the two leaders to be the most active new-artist breakers, and the shift to a more "active" rock approach reaped some dividends in the rock area. Triple-A didn't debut in Airplay Monitor until shortly after the year began, and a few of its "new" artists (**Keb' Mo'**, **Subdudes**, **Paul Westerberg**) either already charted triple-A elsewhere or would have been format staples if the format had existed. Adult top 40 really came into its own in the second half of the year, edging top 40/mainstream for honors in breaking such artists as **Merril Bainbridge**, **Donna Lewis**, **dc Talk**, and more. AC as a separate format, without hot AC/adult top 40 outlets, also didn't debut as a separate Airplay Monitor format until partway into the year.

And here's how the crossover numbers went by format:

Adult top 40: 21.
Top 40/mainstream: 21.
Top 40/rhythm: 19.
Mainstream rock: 13.
Triple-A: 9.
Modern: 8.
R&B mainstream: 7.
R&B adult: 2.
AC: 0.

Again, the total adds up to more than 87, this time because many artists crossed into more than one format (**the Wallflowers**, for instance, crossed into four after breaking in triple-A). The figures won't exactly stun anyone—top 40 has always cherry-picked songs broken by other formats, so it's natural it would lead. The closer similarity between rock and modern has led to increased crossing between the two formats. The R&B numbers are for, as I mentioned, crossovers from top 40/rhythm.

The big month for new artists was August, when 16 were broken for the first time and seven more crossed. (April equaled that grand total of 23 with 14 new artists and nine crossovers.) December, not surprisingly, was the least active month, with one new artist broken (**the Bloodhound Gang**, if you're keeping score) and five crossing over.

Here's how those figures look broken down by quarters:

First quarter: 25 new, 17 crossed, 42 total.
Second quarter: 28 new, 27 crossed, 55 total.
Third quarter: 30 new, 25 crossed, 55 total.
Fourth quarter: 21 new, 18 crossed, 39 total.

These numbers seem to conform with what you might expect, with the first and fourth quarters lagging behind the second and third (a lot of artists are introduced in the first quarter, but by the time they break somewhere, it's often already into April or beyond).

Expect more material, including month-by-month new-artist scorecards, a look at what crossed from which specific formats, some stats on how well all those new artists did after they debuted, a label new-artist-breaking scorecard, and maybe more down the road. And by then it'll be time to take a look at the first quarter (if not the second).

currents, using the computer to spot problems in rotation and sound balance," says consultant Guy Zapoleon.

Lee Cagle, MD of rhythmic top 40 KQKS (KS107.5) Denver, admits the "day scheduler" feature of his system is covered with cobwebs. He begins by manually laying out his powers, followed by the new music (Cs), then the Bs. "After that I go back and fill in the holes, based on the sound in my head," he says.

"With rotations tighter today than even five years ago, and with more artists having multiple titles in the currents, I have to pay closer attention than ever before," adds Cagle. "If I let the computer do it, I'd wind up with a ton of unscheduled positions." He admits that being anal is time consuming, "but my music flow is now 10 times better than letting the computer do it all, then . . . cleaning up after it. I love Selector, but I use it primarily as a referee, to let me know when I might be ready to do something wrong."

"One of the first PDs I worked for knew only two commands in Selector: schedule and print," says WNKS (Kiss 95.1) Charlotte, N.C., PD Brian Bridgman, who had to endure eight rock records or six female artists back-to-back before he figured out how to play the game. He, too, spends three hours a day programming song-by-song. "I got a crash course in music flow [from] Steve Perun at KIIS [Los Angeles]," says Bridgman, who recalls Perun drawing arrows and notes all over his freshly printed music logs, all in the name of better music flow.

"Scheduling music is an art form. That's where a great MD comes in, especially one who has the time to do it all by hand," says KRBE Houston PD John Peake. "As with all computer-based music-scheduling systems, you can impose all the rules you want, but many times the station sound still won't turn out the way you heard it in your head."

"A computer can obviously place two songs back-to-back on paper after they pass every single rule set up by the system, but sometimes your gut will tell you they just don't work," adds Peake.

SO YOUNG, SO ANAL

It's generally agreed by all of this week's participants that an anal-retentive personality is essential for any successful MD. KRBE MD Jay Michaels is keeper of the music, to the point that, says Peake, if a jock needs an extra record at, say, 3 a.m., he or she must call Michaels at home to get his blessing. Michaels has his home laptop linked to the station's computer, enabling him to schedule at home, away from outside distractions, then print the music logs back at the radio station.

KS107.5's Cagle is tightly tethered to his station for all musical decisions. "I always have my pager handy," he says. "I have 'em trained by now; no one will change a thing unless they talk to me first."

Anhorn begins creating the vibe for KHMx Monday mornings, when he visually balances out his categories, ensuring his power records are in place and spending extra time on his critical B category, where the new meets the old—former powers on their way down to recurrent rubbing elbows with newer records headed for power rotation.

Also on Monday, Anhorn lays out all his powers for the entire week. He then sets the Bs but allows himself a bit more flexibility. "My main concern is not playing currents in the same position as before," he says. "I'm anal about how the music feels, which our jocks will testify to. Every song on the log is vital—I don't want to hear too much of something or too little of something else—that's my job, not the computer's job. I'm an off-air MD, so I'm able to devote three hours in the morning and three hours each afternoon doing two days' music."

"I can see immediately if we need a pop or a rock record at a certain point in the hour," he adds. "We tend to go through musical cycles, like alternative or an abundance of female artists. The rules keep changing; I have to stay on top of those changes."

MAKING TIME TO TAKE TIME

"When I was an MD, my sole job was to make sure the station was on target musically; it was dif-

icult to look away when I became PD," says Bridgman, who recalls a certain MD bragging that he could finish a day's music log in a half hour. "I don't care if it's 2010; even with improved technology, if you want ratings, you have to put in the time."

Someone once told Bridgman that the amount of time spent preparing a music log is commensurate with a station's time spent listening. "If that's true, then I guess I should be spending six more hours a day on the logs," he says.

In a crowded marketplace, your music mix is the only thing that really separates you from the other stations, Bridgman says. "We look for familiarity, tempo, and era, but my biggest priority is appeal. We toggle back and forth between 18-24 appeal records and 25-34 appeal records, leaning more 18-24 at night, so as to equally satisfy our younger and older listeners. I don't feel a computer is capable of making those decisions for me," he says, although, he adds, "I've seen some PDs who want the computer to do everything for them."

WBBM (B96) Chicago MD Erik Bradley may not be as anal as PDs who schedule song-by-song, but he cares as deeply. "Because we rotate our powers at 1:20 to 1:45, and they're our biggest testers, I lay those down manually," he says. "Then I'll hit F2, the day scheduler, and let it handle the rest of the day." He'll then manually edit on screen.

"I can't conceive of scheduling everything manually. That would be a nightmare for me," says WZYP Huntsville, Ala., PD Marc Summers, who also has an air shift. "I've given my system the bare minimum of rules. I let it schedule as much music as possible, then I go back and change about 40% to 50% of it." He adds that he spends no more than two hours a day on music. "I'd rather let the machine at least put the stuff in place and handle the grunt work, like daypart protection. If I have to go back in and gut an entire hour, I'd rather do that than manually schedule the whole day."

Summers was sitting in front of Selector as he spoke. "Sunday at noon, the computer has laid down Sophie B. Hawkins' 'As I Lay Me Down,' Jon Secada's 'Just Another Day,' Madonna's 'Don't Cry For Me Argentina' dance mix, and Seal, 'Kiss From A Rose,'" he says. While all those songs passed through the screening system, and the computer sees no problems, this is where Summers starts editing: "Yes, they're all strong songs, but that's not the real essence of this station," he says. "Where's the stuff like Hootie, the pop/rock balance?"

EVERY SEGUE IS SACRED?

Bridgman, like most PDs, used to think that every segue had to be perfect, but he now admits his prime directive is to play hit records and create a unique station "feel." Besides, he says, there aren't always enough records in the pipeline to create that perfect segue, a concept that the audience knows nothing about. "They don't know I just played two dance records back-to-back," he says. "They just know they liked the last two songs they heard."

So do PDs overthink things? Cagle says, "you have to care almost too much. I consider every segue important. I compare an hour of music to looking at a painting. You know you like it, but you might not know exactly what causes you to like it. Listeners may not notice every segue, but they'll notice an hour of music, which is a series of segues."

As important as the music is, everyone he spoke to readily admits it's easy to become obsessed with it and risk second-guessing yourself into a corner. Time was, not too long ago, conventional wisdom dictated you programmed your computer to avoid playing two female artists back-to-back. "Today," says Bridgman, "we're lucky if we can find one decent male record to fit in an hour of music."

Bottom line, says Bridgman: "How do you tell a computer it's 5 o'clock on Friday afternoon and I just wanna jam?" "The way I look at it," says Cagle, "it's not the station's music—it's my music; it's an extension of me."

MONITOR PROFILE

Meyer's Cat Digs Up Number Two Showing In Top 40-Starved Lexington

It only took 19½ years, but Jill Meyer finally left the relative safety of WDJX Louisville, Ky., last May to accept her first PD gig at start-up top 40 WLKT (the Cat) in nearby Lexington, Ky., propelling the previously vacant frequency from nothing to 9.9 12-plus in its first full Arbitron book this past fall.

After several format and call-letter changes at WDJX, Meyer says the light finally blinked on in her head. "Newport Communications offered me the chance to program a brand-new station, and it hit me that the time was right to do it . . . not that I'm slow or anything," she jokes.

On accepting the challenge, Meyer was faced with two semi-frightening prospects: one, doing the job, and two, moving the mountain of junk she'd accumulated in working 20 years in the same place.

"I'd learned so much about programming from [former WDJX PD] Chris Shebel," she says. "I came up through the business during a time when I was always told that a woman couldn't be a PD, although I knew that wasn't true. Chris was the first one to tell me that a

but we got our feet back on the ground quickly and got back to work. We never got cocky about the numbers; believe me, I can hear all those guns pointed and cocked."

Mike Donovan of Vallie/Richards Consulting did extensive research early in the project. Meyer says that the station was more rhythmic at the outset than it is today, having leaned a bit more mainstream under the slogan "music for all people," although, Meyer adds, "we'll still act quicker on a rhythm or dance track than on the rock or modern rock stuff."

Here's a sample 3 p.m. hour on the Cat: Coolio, "Gangsta's Paradise"; La Bouche, "Sweet Dreams"; No Mercy, "Please Don't Go"; Soul Asylum, "Runaway Train"; Cardigans, "Lovefool"; Gina G, "Ooh, Aah . . . Just A Little Bit"; Ini Kamoze, "Here Comes The Hotstepper"; Sheryl Crow, "Everyday Is A Winding Road"; Livin' Joy, "Don't Stop Movin'"; Merrill Bainbridge, "Mouth"; Keith Sweat, "Nobody"; Le Click, "Tonight Is The Night"; and Jade, "Every Day Of The Week."

Morning co-host Beth Bradley is a Lexington native who worked with Meyer at Regent Broadcasting's Louisville country sister WHKW (the Hawk) as morning sidekick. Co-host Jason Phillips hails from WLRS Louisville. Meyer handles middays, followed by her "right arm," Shane Collins, also from WDJX by way of WHKW. Former WDJX overnight jock Chris Goodman is in nights. Promotions director Hope Hudson is a former administrative assistant. "She's never done this before, but she was eager to learn, so we gave her a shot."

Jacor purchased the Regent stations in Louisville last year and is in the process of buying the Cat from Newport. Meyer will soon be related to crosstown cohorts Dennis Dillon at modern WXZZ (Z103) and Tony Tillford of rock WKQQ. "These guys have been sweethearts since day one," says Meyer. "We know each other through local concerts and have been out to dinner together a bunch of times, even after the book came out," she says.

The handcrafted aspect of the Cat extends to its down-home, grass-roots marketing campaign, which consisted of little more than shaking hands and kissing babies. "We did do a little TV during the book," admits Meyer of the homemade spot, produced at the local TV station. "Mostly, we've relied on old-fashioned word-of-mouth. It's amazing how many people are calling in, coming to our remotes, following us around, wanting to know where we're going to be next," she says.

Another possible secret to the Cat's success: no adult supervision. Although the station has three salespeople on site, GM Chris Baker and GSM Mark Tyree are based in sister station WLRS, about an hour away (20 minutes if you drive with Meyer) and visit at least once a week.

Although the station has finally graduated to real studios, there's no production studio yet. All production is still being done in Louisville and sent to Lexington via ISDN.

"I even have a real office with two actual pictures on the wall," says Meyer, who still talks to Shebel weekly. "I've had to wean myself from calling him as often as I did in the beginning when I was having these panic attacks."

"In my heart, top 40 radio has never gone out of fashion," says Meyer. "Your success depends a lot on what you do with the music you're handed, your promotions, and your outlook on life, which has a direct effect on how you're perceived. When I interviewed for this job, they asked me what I liked to do for fun. I told them everything I do is fun; if it stops being fun, I'll stop doing it."

woman could and should be programming."

The Cat was born in May 1996, kicking off an eight-month experience Meyer compares to "going to summer camp." After leaving the comparatively luxurious facilities of WDJX, Meyer found herself playing all the station's music off VCR tapes running from the transmitter site. Staffers later moved into offices (no studios) with next-to-no furniture. "We literally ran the station off of a cafeteria table, a small control board, three CD players, and a computer," she says.

While many new stations run promos full of construction sound effects, announcing "We're building a new radio station," the Cat treated listeners to the actual sounds of hammering, drilling, and sawing while a station was being constructed. "Each time we got a new piece of equipment, even a stapler, it became an on-air event," says Meyer, who quickly realized that the Cat summer camp had an immediate bonding effect, both internally with staffers, and externally, as demonstrated by the truckloads of new listeners in a market that was apparently starved for top 40 since the former WLAP had flipped to hot AC WMXL in '92. (Country WWYC made a brief run at the format afterward.) "There was a hole big enough to drive three trucks through," says Meyer. "Everywhere we went, the usual listener comments ranged from 'Thank you!' to 'We've needed this station for so long.'"

The Cat's debut makes it No. 2 to heritage country WVLLK. The station chalked up a No. 2 ranking with 18-34 persons and tied for No. 2 in persons 18-49. "We celebrated for about a week," says Meyer. "We enjoyed the moment,






