In addition, the diskery explaned that many other connecting problems must be cleared up, such as interstate mailing of records, and the effect of fair irading on stores subject to various OPS ceiling prices. Sometimes the exporter secs his profit disappear as he has, to pay so much more than he had
expected when he buys the coin machine in the open market, Groenteman said. When dealin? Fith local cumtomers, at firm can figure its profit margins almost ote the floor in many cases deliver ever in the expart business. profits are speculative.
