

THE FIRST WORD

MAGAZINES: It is with great sadness that we report that the currently available 10th Anniversary, April Issue of Trouser Press is their last. So, now, what's a music fan to do? Here are some alternatives of note. We've mentioned Matter before, but it's -right now it is one of the best consumer music magazines in America. An uncompromising editorial stance is matched by a slick professional look and it's lots of fun to boot, plus they've got Steve Albini, who writes (rants) some of the harshest stuff around. It sometimes seems he won't stop until everybody in America hates his guts. (Matter, 624 Davis St., Evanston, IL 60201. Send \$1.50 for a sample.) If you're looking for info on independent labels, those in the know read Op. Every month or so they publish a magazine with hundreds of record reviews (indies only) and articles revolving around the theme of a certain letter of the alphabet. They're up to V—who knows what'll happen when they finish. We're hoping they'll start all over again. (Op, c/o Lost Music Network, P.O. Box 2391, Olympia, WA 98507. \$2.) Hardcore fans should turn to Maximum Rock 'N' Roll. Lots of ads, interviews, scene reports and reviews. Good reading, and often genuinely insightful. (Maximum Rock 'N' Roll, P.O. Box 288, Berkeley, CA 94701.) The best idea of all, of course, is to start one yourself—these mags all started that way. Everyone can always use a good new music magazine.

Imagine if you can our surprise last week when we tuned in to WCBS-FM (New York's "golden oldies" station) and heard English Beat's "Tears Of A Clown," Pigbag's "Papa's Got A Brand New Pigbag" and Siouxsie And The Banshees' "Spellbound," among others. It turns out it was all part of a "British Blast" segment of their "Hall Of Fame" series of specials, broadcast nightly 9-10PM. What's remarkable is that they chronicled in detail the development of both British invasions, mixing hits from each era—indeed it was one of the best such programs we've heard. Equally remarkable—these songs did not seem at all out of place when announced by WCBS' ultra-compressed DJ sound. Which once again goes to show that a hit is a hit is a hit-if only given the chance.

FOLK NEWS: Steeleye Span's East coast tour starts off in Buffalo April 23, and includes dates in Boston, Washington, D.C. (at Adam's April 28 & 29 and May 1 & 2), Philadelphia and a three night stand at New York's Bottom Line May 4, 5 and 6. The band returns to the U.S. in August for a series of Midwest and West coast dates. Shanachie Records will be reissuing the group's classic **Below The S**alt LP to coincide with the East coast tour. . . The 1984 Fairport Convention Reunion is set for August 10-11 in Cropredy, England. Appearing with the Fairports will be **Steeleye Span**, the **Battlefield Band** and other leading lights of the British folk scene. For details contact Woodworm Records, P.O. Box 37, Banbury, Oxon, England. . . **De Danann** will be recording a live album at San Francisco's great American Music Hall. . . Hot new releases from Green Linnet are Touchstone's Jealousy and Passage by the Tannahill Weavers. . . Coming soon from Flying Fish are Robin Flower's First Dibs and new LPs by Jane Sapp, Steve Lyon and the Cache Valley Drifters. . .June Tabor's Abyssinians, Planxty's Words And Music, and Silly Wizard's beautiful Kiss The Tears Away are the latest from Shanachie. . .Newfoundland folk rockers Figgy Duff have a lovely new album out on Boot. (Courtesy Ken Roseman, Folk Editor, CMJ Progressive Media)

Island Records has signed a deal with Britain's foremost Heavy Metal label, Bronze Records. U.S. operations will be headed up by Richard Bron. Jim Sotet will be the label's Vice President of Promotion. The first release will be in May, an LP from Bronz titled Taken By Storm.

RECORD NEWS: X is recording a version of the Troggs' "Wild Thing". . . Look for the Alarm on American Bandstand in April. . . Our thanks to everyone who helped hook us up with the **Red Hot Chili Peppers**. They are truly hot—look for an LP on Enigma/EMI in May. They've also signed the **Plugz**; no release date set. . . Warner Bros. has signed **Scritti Politti**, and will release the single "Wood Beez (Pray Like Aretha Franklin)" ASAP. Also coming from WB: Soft Cell's This Last Night In Sodom LP, The Cure's The Top LP, an Echo & the Bunnymen LP, a Carla Bley LP featuring near-God Hiram Bullock (of the David Letterman show band), a new Pat Metheny LP, Rejoicing, and Chicago 17. ..Arista will be releasing Danse Society stateside. Is Daryl Hall helping on Elvis Costello's next LP? Yup. ..Elektra will release the next McCoy Tyner LP in April, his first in three years. ..Huw Gower, former guitarist with the beloved Records ("Starry Eyes," "Teenarama") has an EP (Guitarophilia) out on X-Disque Records, 175 Fifth Avenue, New York, NY 10010.

- JACKPOT! SINGLES, TRACKS, ETC.

 * PSYCHEDELIC FURS "Ghost In You" (12") (Columbia, 51 W. 52nd Street, New York, NY 10019)—Yet another breakthrough for the quintessential new wave band. Ethereal and grand yet simple and eloquent, "Ghost In You" is simply gorgeous—a passionate pop song sung poignantly by Richard Butler and produced to perfection by Keith Forsey. A pop/rock radio natural that will disappoint only purists and hook the rest of us hard.
- ★ NONA HENDRYX "I Sweat" (12" and LP cut) (RCA, 1133 Ave. Of The Americas, New York, NY 10036)—This one's got it all—an intense beat, vocal hooks and enough effects to keep the dance floor and radio hot. As on the last LP, Material lends a hand, both playing and co-producing. They are more restrained this time, making the new LP more straightforward, accessible, and (unfortunately) less exciting than Nona was. But "I Sweat" puts it all together. Run for this one.
- AFRIKA BAMBAATAA & SOULSONIC FORCE "Renegades Of Funk" (12") (Tommy Boy, 1747 First Ave., New York, NY 10128)—Bam and the Soulsonic Force have taken two cents (it could add up to a dollar bill y'all) from influences ranging from James Brown to George Clinton and the Universal Zulu Nation to Kraftwerk and put it all together over a ready-steady, heavy-handed electronic bottom. Also check out the liner thanks to their fraternal funksters. See how many you can spot. . .

JENNY BURTON "Rock Steady" (7") (Atlantic, 75 Rockefeller Plaza, New York, NY 10019)—An unlikely choice for a cover to be sure, but Jenny Burton and producer/arranger/performer John Robie have done up the Bad Company hit nicely, giving it a percolating synth backdrop and a smooth, aching, soulful, female vocal. A real attention grabber.

NEW JAZZ RELEASES: Palo Alto Records has released 4 LPs under the guidance of Dr. Herb Wong and Lee Townsend. Amber Skies is bassist David Friesen's collaboration with such upper tier virtuosos as Chick Corea, Joe Henderson and Airto, striking an inventive balance between outgoing dynamics and heartfelt introspection. Brother John is drummer Elvis Jones' record date with his session band comprised of reedman Pat LaBarbera, ex-Coltrane bassist Reggie Workman and pianist Kenny Kirkland. The foursome subtly blends over forty years of jazz into this one work. European guitarist Dusan Bogdanovic shines as he leads a quartet of Charlle Haden, James Newton and Tony Jones on the oft enchanting Early To Rise. And master of the ivories Larry Vuckovich teams with vocalist Jon Hendricks on Cast Your Fate for some high-spirited piano rolls and soulful scats. Jazz aficionados will thrill to these new releases. Video Views

*Jackpot! *.

MADONNA "Borderline" (Sire) directed by Mary Lambert—Audio's love angst is translated palpably into video as Madonna lets her emotions run the gamut from childlike (in the intro's chiming, etheral, slo-mo romp) to satisfied, yearning and spiteful. The v/c's format, alternating between color (the boyfriend who rejects her) and b/w (the mature photographer who in admiring her himself gets rejected) establishes its own vital rhythm. But the clip's strongest point is the images Madonna creates of herself: whether she's sipping soda and chewing gum, or kicking at the lamppost in frustration, Madonna is all mascara-framed eyes and Monroe lips. In the end, her character shows her up as a spoiled brat recklessly spraypainting the photographer's sportscar. But somehow when a package winds up looking as sleek, graceful, nonchalant and French as this, the viewer forgives all.

GO-GO'S "Head Over Heels" (I.R.S.) directed by Doug Martin—When the lens zooms from right to left focusing on each lady, the viewer can't help thinking that, given the Go-Go's relatively long absence from the scene, the powers that be decided that the audience needed an identification refresher course. Actually, this strategy does not work against the group's impact; rather, it emphasizes-and charmingly-how in female rock 'n' roll the line between "girl" and "woman" is blurred indeed. Tinges of nervousness mark some performances, which may explain the spontaneous yet bonding eye contacts, especially between drummer Gina Schock and lead vocalist Belinda Carlisle. The biggest explosion, however, comes from Kathy Valentine, whose walking bassline gets visually translated into an ambulatory slow motion segment. More than that, though, she's bound to give Cyndi Lauper's "Gracie Allen of Rock" image a run for its money—as the "Shirley MacLaine of Punk." Totally oblivious to her own sparks, Valentine makes the male-venerated knock-knee'd stance her own.

ECHO & THE BUNNYMEN "The Killing Moon" (Sire) directed by Brian Griffin and Echo & the Bunnymen—In the yin yang scheme of things the moon is cold and female (read: bitch). The wonder of this clip is the moon, photographed from an underwater perspective, which wanes into a sliver and goes flesh-tone evoking a woman's back. To watch snow fall, icicles manifest in stalactite formation, and then observe the woman take off her heavy cape as the weather begins to mesh with her mood, is a chilly implication indeed. Still, the celestial crescent ending suggests optimism, as new moons often do. The v/c's only distraction is the clothesline with the gossamer pieces: it conjures up Stevie Nicks costumes getting aired out.

NINA HAGEN "New York, New York" (Columbia) directed by Juliana Knepler—Leave it to this German to capture the big city's ennui as Nina Hagen gets more wilted after each disco replication. Her eye makeup looks like a car grille, she pouts like a fish, and the NY Convention Bureau would consider her a big liability. But I bet she could get rid of a sea of cockroaches.

MADNESS "The Sun And The Rain" (Geffen) directed by Dave Robinson--The rainy outdoor set recalls Gene Kelly but the indoor set (the auditory canal is about as indoor as one can get), with red-garbed, hat-umbrella'd Madness in form, is pure, sperm-vintage Woody Allen. Take notes.

JUMP 'N' THE SADDLE BAND "The Curly Shuffle" (Atlantic) edited by Steve Price—Bet you didn't know that the guys did break dancing and the Highland Schottishe as rev-up preludes to their "fight or flight" crises. Michael Jackson may have already had a look at this one.

BOBBY'S BLUE BAND Real Time/Bar Time (LP) (Hot Fudge Records, Box 14, Cedar Falls, IA 50613)—What was the last band you saw from IOWA? Bobby's Blue Band plays barroom boogies of all sorts—with the rhythm section favoring a rockabilly beat and swing timing (a la Commander Cody). Side A (Real Time) is a studio recording while side B (Bar Time) was captured live at the Crow's Nest in Iowa City. Bar Time's best is the L.A. Express-styled "Some Bunk Funk" featuring Bunky Marlow's chock full o' soul saxophone and Jeff Peterson's raging lead guitar. Our Real Time favorite is "The Last Goodbye" a cryin' Blues led by the double lead of Bunky's soprano sax and Peterson's guitar. Iowa tears it up. Thanks to Bob Dorr of KUNI for this one.

PSYCHOBUD Psychobud (EP) (Ear Movie Records, Box 5040, Santa Monica, CA 90405)—"Sighs" kicks off side 1 with an undulating synth pattern built around a persistent rhythm that slowly unveils its punch while the synth riff moves from the forefront to the background. Psychobud never overuses the synthesizer (three cheers on that alone)—employing it to enhance tunes with sparse phrases and sweeps as on "Still Hungry" (an insistent reminder fo the world's hunger problem and the most danceable tune on the disc). "Dwindle Down" is an urgent rocker with rolling bass lines and drum bursts uner razor-sharp axe chords and runs—again with spotted use of the synth. Also try "Here's Our Correspondent." Though the vocals here are unpolished, occasionally abrasive and angry, they manage to work within the feel and scope of the songs. An exciting debut.

I usually feel a sense of trepidation before embarking on this peculiar ritual, but this time I am really looking forward to getting out and playing. Be ready to dance but remember to keep your heart's ears open.

By the way, we just finished a video (what?) of "Sweet Jane." The general dismay I feel toward video rock, which I have expressed in interviews and written about in greater detail, has not changed. If anything, it has increased as the medium seems to become more and more pathetic—if I see another leather clad woman pouting from behind

the medium seems to become more and more pathetic—it! see another leather clad woman pouting from behind the bars of a cage I will be tempted to simply put out a contract on all the grim-faced consultants who market music like dog food. So how come I'm making one, right?

A second reason is that someone has to at least try to make some change for the better. God knows it's hard enough to avoid all the visual cliches that have been levelled on us. I won't let this record fade away just because it doesn't have a song about dead people on it—it's been too much work and it's too good to be ignored. If you can't dig it, that's okay, but if you only listened to the songs once, then listen again. If you didn't listen at all, and I mean really listen, then please do. That's why I made the record—I mean, it's your names I wrote. . . You're all in there somewhere. Thanks.



PARTING SHOTS...My term as Music Director of WBGU-FM ends this week (a successor had not been chosen at press time), with graduation just six weeks away signalling the termination of my covert research here on the youth of Middle America. Special thanks to all the record company and independent promotion folks who have recognized WBGU-FM and the viability of our trendsetting "Rural Contemporary" format.....Even from this somewhat removed vantage point the widespread changes in the music industry during the last year and a half are entirely obvious. The video revolution, while certifying the much-heralded impotency of many album rock stations, seems to be effectively masking some more widespread and serious ills as well. The video backlash has begun, even here, and when the novelty of videoized music wears off nationwide recording artists will be once again faced with building and sustaining their careers through the power of their music. At this point in time, though, the artists themselves seem considerably more committed to perfecting their video imagery than their oral efforts (or as one cynical DJ said to me last week, "If they all want to be TV stars why don't they stop making records and get the hell off the airwaves!!!"\to..I fear the porism resulting from the few mega-success stories of '83 blind us to the reality of our present situation. In the words of Harvey Leeds from the first CMJ convention, "There's zip artist loyality out there." Indeed, zip artist was all power. With few exceptions, the bulk fo contemporary pop music, the trendy and the unhip alike, is entirely bland and disposable, even the hits. We're back to the '50s now with hit-only radio and teen-dominated consumption patterns (MICHAEL 14, DURAN DURAN, the POLICE, NEN AT MORK, CULTURE CULB, etc.). We blame the lack of depth and quality of today's music and beneficially and the expectations of the public at large. We have to think beyond short-term victories, to cultivat

Hello, my name is Mike Jackowski and I am the General Manager for WBKX/Radio:X. This is my fourth year of school and my third of involvement in college radio. Since entering college I have seen a dynamic and incredible change in the attitudes of young people. When I first started college there was a feeling of hopelessness that permeated the country, and artists and young people alike lived in a gloomy atmosphere that was created by many factors in our society. All of the powerfully negative music was screaming out about the situation that we thought could not be corrected. I think we have that out of our systems now and are beginning to believe in ourselves, as music now conveys the fact that we are not doomed. Just as the feeling of hopelessness was created, so can a feeling of positive action take its place. The young people coming up will be the most talented and creative ever. 

DIRE STRAITS Aichemy (Warner Bros., 3300 Warner Blvd., Burbank, CA 91510proves beyond doubt that Dire Straits is a band—not just a product of the studio and Mark Knopfler's imagination. No overdubs, no re-recordings—so what you hear is what really happened. . . live in concert. We all know Knopfler can play brilliant guitar, but here he reaches for, and achieves, remarkable heights. The tracks are, for the most part, the same arrangements as on the studio LPs, with some extra solos thrown in. So take your pick, your favorite studio tracks will probably be your favorites here. Ours are "Romeo And Juliet," "Sultans Of Swing," "Telegraph Road" and "Tunnel Of Love

R.E.M. Reckoning (I.R.S., c/o A&M, 595 Madison Ave., New York, NY 10022)brings the next installment in the R.E.M. success story: **Reckening**. Their debut LP, **Marmar**, employed the studio to help mold a distinctive sound out of a myriad of influences. **Reckening** is more a record of a rock 'n' roll *band* than a studio record—it's more natural and less produced, sounding more like R.E.M. does live. The songs are simpler, with more personal lyrics (though often still hard to make out) and therefore the rewards are different: although Minimore personal syntos (intogrirotes stiminal to make out) and treated the lewiss are dimensional more many and treated to the lewiss are dimensional moving nevertheless. Our favorites are "Pretty Persuasion," "Rockville" (exhibiting more than a bit of their Southern roots—just wonderful), "Second Guessing" (a good choice for rock radio), "Little America," "South Central Rain" (a natural single) and "Camera." A reckoning? Hardly—just another fine LP which promises even more great things from the group. We are just beginning to see R.E.M. develop, and we look forward to the long exciting road

THE MEAT PUPPETS The Meat Puppets II (SST, P.O. Box 1, Lawndale, CA 90260)—The Meat Puppets have tamed their wild horses enough to give us a chance to get on and ride with them—oh, they're -oh, they're still capable of blazing and thrashing about (check out "Split Myself In Two" and "New Gods"), but they've rechannelled that loco-motive energy into C&W-tinged ballads and poems. The results are refreshingly challenging and enjoyable. There are three great instrumentals: "Magic Toy Missing" is a hillbilly shuffle; "Aurora Borealis" is a slower, loosely structured "jam"; and "I'm A Mindless Idiot" has the thicker twang of a countrified picker. But it's the lyrics and vocal treatment that make the record a standout. There is more than a hint of Violent Femme Gordan Gano on the two slower numbers "Oh Me" and "Plateau," and some high-pitched hootin' on "Lake Of Fire." The guitar work of Curt Kirkland is sensational and the bass (courtesy of brother Chris) and drums fill out this talented trio in just the right places. Also try the airy, somersaulting feel of "We're Here." The Meat Puppets are indeed here—and we should all be happy for that.

TOMMY KEENE Places That Are Gone (Dolphin, P.O. Box 8744, Durham, NC 27707)perfect spring record—clean, crisp pop songs that sparkle with life, highlighted by jangly guitars and Keene's appealing Tom Petty-ish whine. What seperates Keene from the pack is a healthy unpretentiousness—Keene having a great time, and wants you to know it and have one too. His songs are chock full of hooks yet don't lack depth; check out the title track, "Back To Zero Now" and "Nothing Happened Yesterday." A rare find indeed.

STEVE TIBBETTS Safe Journey (ECM, c/o Warner, address above)— Tibbetts' second LP YR was a surprise college radio hit, ultimately leading to his ECM contract. But his debut for the label, Northern Song, was a disappointment—light, acoustic music without the percussive edge of his earlier work. Safe Journey is a return to form for the remarkable artist—the wild percussion is up front and the quitars bite—a fusion of atmospheric jazz, avant-garde rock and African percussion styles which soar and surprise. Worthy of play on jazz and progressive rock stations. Top cuts: "Test," "Vision," "Mission" and "Going Somewhere."

VARIOUS ARTISTS Made In France (Cachalot, 611 Broadway, New York, NY 10012)simply marvelous anthology of the French contemporary rock scene compiled by Eric DuFaure, the same man who brought us Dantschland. Dantschland a few years back. The 12 tracks span the gamut frm Bernard Lavilliers' atmospheric electronic dance number "Idees Noires" to the million selling rap smash "Chacun Fait C'qui Lui Plait" by Chagrin D'Amour to the chilling vocal performance of KaS Product's "Pussy X" to "Rock Amadour," a jumpy ditty from accordionist Gerard Blanchard to the electro harmonic folk of Taxi Girl's "Quelqu'un Comme Toi" to the African/Eastern influences of Sapho's "Tam-Tam" to the Joy Division/Roxy tinges of the seminal new wave band Marquis de Sade's "Wanda's Loving Boy." Whew! It's all superb and deserving of major radio attention. Also includes a lyric sheet with French and English translations. Accolades to the Cachalot crew in their attempt to expose American ears to the world's music

ICICLE WORKS Icicle Works (Arista, 6 W. 57th St., New York, NY 10019)—This latest British import deserves the words of praise that have preceded it. Icicle Works is very British, but in just that certain way that is so popular these days, and should meet with success. Its sound falls somewhere between the slickness of British synth outfits (yet there are hardly any to be found here) and the newest crop of guitar bands. It's an appealing mixture, best exemplified in "Whisper To A Scream (Birds Fly)"—sort of "I Ran" crossed with "In A Big Country." it packs the same wallon each of those tracks did. SLADE Keep Your Hands Off My Power Supply (CBS Associated, 51 West 52nd Street, New York, NY 10019)—Mindless rock and roll with the kind of sophomoric appeal that make us wish that, for a moment at least, we could be headbanging, black tee-shirted teenagers again. Slade's brand of rock has an anthonic fool that make it there is invitable. anthemic feel that makes it almost irresistible—if you could just cut your mind loose and feel the power of the drums and guitars. Sigh. . . Top cuts: "Run Runaway" (Thin Lizzy revisited), "My Oh My" (a big British hit and a terrific drinking song) and "Can't Tame A Hurricane.

PIXIES Doolittle (4AD, c/o Elektra, 75 Rockefeller Plaza, New York, NY 10019)—The Pixies are cooler than death. While the hooks here are not as immediately jostling as "Gigantic" or "Where Is My Mind" from last year's Surfer Rosa LP, they're every bit as dangerous and lethal once they work their way into your veins. Cuts like "Wave Of Mutilation," "Gouge Away" or "Here Comes Your Man" don't immediately leap out of the speakers and box you on the ears, but the hooks and how they are layered and built up (as in the deft use of strings and crunching guitar on "Monkey Gone To Heaven" or the slow escalation of "Mr. Grieves") reveal a level of craft and thought that goes light years beyond mere quirkiness. Black Francis' trademark yelping and panting are as prominent as ever (few other than he could ever come up with pixilations like "All around, the vampires feed/And I bleed" or "Slicing up eyeballs/Oh ho ho ho"), while the gargantuan throbbing basslines and chilling harmonies of the infamous Mrs. John Murphy propel Black Francis' monster riffs along with unbridled fury. Other straight-razor, shower scene from *Psych*o cuts include "Silver," "#13 Baby," and the curious surf riffs of "Here Comes Your Man."

ADRIAN BELEW Mr. Music Head (Atlantic, 75 Rockefeller Plaza, New York, NY 10019)—Just as Clint Eastwood is Dirty Harry, Adrian Belew is Mr. Music Head. Known for his experimental musings in the African, avant-garde and animal kingdom departments, as well as daredevil guitar antics and an odd, artsy rhythmic sense (he enjoys toying with loopy tape manipulation), Belew has increasingly honed his structural pop chops without sacrificing any of his creative quirkiness. Mr. Music Head is Belew's most instantly likeable record, one where art and pop walk hand in hand. It's all there—the elephant noise guitars, the clipped yet funky (and sometimes decidedly techo-bubblegum) rhythms ("One Of These Days"), the sweeping, curvy, Rundgren-Byrne-McCartney-like pop melodies (the piano on "Bad Days") and bright vocal harmonies—and it fits together beautifully. Belew bends our ear by tossing unexpected (although we should expect 'em by now) surprises into the mix, just a little something to throw the most near-perfect pop moment slightly askew. "Oh Daddy" (featured on the new Certain Damage), a back-and-forth Q&A between Belew and his daughter, is cute, clever and catchy and should yield Belew his first legit radio hit, while "Coconuts," "Bumbity Bump" and "1967" are mandatory accessories for the full Mr. Music Head experience.

SCREAMING TREES Buzz Factory (SST, P.O. Box 1, Lawndale, CA 90260)—With a hazy vigor, the Trees sail into previously unmapped worlds on their fourth release, their first without the color green on the cover. The well-loved Sherwood Forest aura of this band's sound is as apparent as ever (the foursome lives in woodsy and spacious Washington), but this time they've grabbed the reins of their chariot of distortion with a know-how that'll stun any and all detractors into submission. With each release they've developed a sturdier, daydream-provoking brand of prismic psychedelia, and here their wizard's cloak fits snugly throughout the entire LP, never faltering or slipping into mundane reality. Gary Lee Conner's exuberant pedal stomping jets the songs into blissfully high altitudes, joined mid-flight by brother Van's pinwheeling bass and Mark Lanegan's ozone-tripping vocals, with the compositions burning an indelibly distinct style into the Loud Guitar Band Scrapbook. This 40-minute ride down a stream of altered conciousness is easily the definitive Screaming Trees tome, and though all tracks will give you a headrush, especially mindblowing are "Flower Web," "Where The Twain Shall Meet" and "Windows."

LOVE AND ROCKETS Love And Rockets (RCA, 1133 Ave. of the Americas, New York, NY 10036)—Love And Rockets could be the Leonard Zeligs of rock. Much like the chameleonlike protagonist of Woody Allen's movie, they started out on their latest "Motorcycle" 12" (most of which is included here) by essentially revving the same song through all of its gears, changing in a blink from glitter rockers into acid house garb into Pink Floyd and back into Love And Rockets again. Here, starting with an opening salvo of wild '50s-style trash rockabilly stomp that even sounds like it's being squawked out of vintage speakers, they twist and turn, alternately moving from light to dark, through shades of Bauhaus, Tones On Tail, and David Jay's solo works, with all sorts of sinister stops along the way (see the eerie introspection of "The Teardrop Collector"). Much of the rest of the album absolutely sparkles with that classic Love And Rockets 12-string acoustic sound, where guitars are layered on top of each other in the same way that David Jay and Daniel Ash structure their vocals. While nods in the direction of early Bowie and T. Rex are virtually inescapable, after four albums and four years Love And Rockets has finally put its past and influences to rest, emerging with an album and a sound that is as singular as it is diverse. Top cuts: "So Alive," "No Big Deal," "Bound For Hell," "**** (Jungle Law)."







BAND OF SUSANS Love Agenda (Blast First, c/o Restless, 11264 Playa Court, P.O. Box 3628, Culver City, CA 90231-3628)—Downtown N.Y.C.'s Band Of Susans is one of the few bands we can think of that deserves to be on the covers of both Guitar Player and Chemical Imbalance. Like Sonic Youth, the band members have played in the guitar orchestras of Rhys Chatham or Glenn Branca, and like the Youth Of Today, they're applying feisty tunings, textures and chord progressions to a decidedly non-jazz, dare we say "experimental" pop songwriting style. (While comparisons between the two bands are somewhat inevitable, Band Of Susans is much less abrasive or confrontational than the Youth.) Of course, the guitars are the first thing you notice about the band—a monstrous, monolithic, glorious, ringing din that sounds loud no matter where your volume knob is set. Their third release finds the band making major progress in the songwriting department: "The Pursuit Of Happiness," "It's Locked Away," "Because Of You" and especially the single "Hard Light," are the most accessible—but not at all obvious—tracks they've ever done. It all makes for a surprisingly consistent, varied and enjoyable LP—hail the first true guitar heroes of the '90s!

URGE OVERKILL Jesus Urge Superstar (Touch And Go, P.O. Box 25520, Chicago, IL 60625)—With their first foot-long vinyl sacrament since that holy Homestead EP eons ago, Urge Overkill vaults into exalted and near-orchestral planes of sound, a great leap forward which should take nearly everyone by surprise. Sprawled within these grooves lies the beating heart of a majestic guitar band scattering chords to the winds, as fuzzy and clangy as any other long-toiling band recently "discovered" as part of some long-haired, sincere American movement by press on both sides of the Atlantic. The sweet, blustering extrapolations of melody tossed about between the vocalist, guitars and rhythm section tumble and coast on one high-voltage level throughout, with an equally vast dose of six-chord inspiration that separates Urge from other high fuzz pretenders. Comparisons to Soul Asylum's wide-open-spaces melodic evangelism and sour mash purr vocals and also to the rhythmic fray of Volcano Suns are apt, though over and beyond the similarities is a certain wide-eyed, faraway air that Urge Overkill manages to capture without anyone else's aid. Keeping their hearts on their sleeves and their fists in your face, Urge Overkill comes off like giant-slayers on "God Flintstone," "Last Train To Heaven," "The Polaroid Doll," "Head On" (from last summer's 7") and "Crown Of Laffs."

GODFATHERS More Songs About Love And Hate (Epic, 51 W. 52nd St., New York, NY 10019)—As the title suggests, the Godfathers' third album is another collection of songs based on political and social acrimony, a blueprint that has given the band much success so far and which should carry them even further. While there are no true anthems here like "This Damn Nation" or "Birth, School, Work, Death," we do see the Godfathers showcasing a bit more of their varied influences, both from classic '60s bands (producer Vic Maile has worked with bands like the Kinks and The Who) and more contemporary compatriots—"Pretty Girl" sounds like something from The Jam's Setting Sons album, while "Life Has Passed Us By" recalls "Grimly Fiendish" by The Damned. Their twang has also become more distinct, especially on "I'm Lost And Then I'm Found" and "Walking, Talking Johnny Cash Blues," the latter of which was originally recorded in Nashville. This record is full of the band's trademark guitar bashing and the controlled anger of Peter Coyne's vocals, above the always propulsive rhythm section—an incredibly satisfying live band, the Godfathers have delivered another powerful LP. Also try "She Gives Me Love" and "Halfway Paralyzed."

MARCIA BALL Gatorhythms (Rounder, One Camp St., Cambridge, MA 02140)—Marcia Ball is best known for her rolling, Austin-meets-New Orleans piano style (like a cross between Jerry Lee Lewis and Professor Longhair), and she provides plenty o' reasons to lace up those high-heeled sneakers ("La Ti Da," "Mobile"). But Gatorhythms is her best waxing to date not simply because she knows how to have a good time, but because of the ballads ("The Power Of Love," "Find Another Fool"), two-steps ("Daddy Said") and bluesy waltzes ("You'll Come Around") she's writing. Marcia penned seven of the ten tunes here where on past albums she wrote two or three, showing growth and the confidence to be her own talent—she also co-produced this record, a first for her. It shows in her vocal performances too, as she sounds as red hot here as she does on stage. As usual, Marcia surrounds herself with a commendable crew, including a horn section that knows how to cook on high and simmer down low. Marcia's friends Angela Strehli and Lou Ann Barton drop in the background vocals, too. Get rhythm.

SOULED AMERICAN Flubber (Rough Trade, 326 Sixth St., San Francisco, CA 94103)—If the Cowboy Junkies were really cowboy junkies they'd probably have made a record that sounds a lot like Souled American's Flubber. This Chicago band turned many a head with last year's impressive debut Fe, spinning a web of earthy backbeat rhythms and funk-laden grooves that landed them somewhere in the Beefheart/Meat Puppets/Dead zone. Here somebody's either slipped them a mickey, left them out in the sun too long, or just added molasses to the mix, 'cause Flubber moves slower than slo-mo. Lead singer Chris Grigoroff wails like Ionesome deputy Droopalong out on the dusty range, his voice (like Camper David Lowery on 'ludes) carrying a decidedly western quality, while the mostly acoustic music casts unsettling, stuporous shadows and textures over a rickety, bluesy, shufflin'-n-skifflin' slow boogie that sounds like the Violent Femmes doing Neil Young serenades or the Meat Puppets doing Velvets ballads. Flubber works best when those influences subtly play off each other. It's a drowsy hoedown where the "Mar'boro Man" gets roasted and all anyone really wants is a good "Cupa Cowfee."

DESSAU Exercise In Tension (Carlyle, 1217 16th Ave. South, Nashville, TN 37212/615-327-8129)—Turn on a pummeling drum machine, churn out a thumping bass, let fly a searing riff-a-rama, and yell like someone's dumped a vat of sulfuric acid into your eyes and then you, too, can be Dessau, a Nashville trio that's got the industrial scene down cold. A few screeching samples here, Al Jourgensen of Ministry producing there, all wrapped up with a Joy Division cover that does more than cover. Two clements of the Dessau sound put them ahead of the industrial-strength pack: John Elliot's snarl (at its sneering best on "Isolat: n) and a hint of melodicism that's submerged just enough to keep its subtlety. Most of the tracks have an introspective quality, but songs like "No Way" recall the danceability of, say, Front Line Assembly. While radio raves already came down for the first single, this LP is sure to be spun quite a few times by the same people who ate the latest Ministry LP for breakfast with a side dish of Front 242. Songs to base recurring nightmares on: "Never Change," "Principal Tension" and "Shovel."

MARSHMALLOW OVERCOAT Try On... (Get Hip, c/o Skyclad, 6 Valley Brook Dr., Middlesex, NJ 08846)—Marshmallow Overcoat tumbles into a world of paisley cumulus and hiphuggers, and keeps the psychedelic dosage at an evenly pleasurable level on their first LP after several years of singles. This four-piece-with-lots-of-helpers (two members claim the Farfisa as their chief instrumental contribution) dives headlong and unabashedly into the trashcan beatings of the mid-'60s with candor and high spirits that provide perk amidst the fuzz and Farfisa. Debra Dicky and Randy Love organ-ize the jerkin', swimmin' tunes into a go-go-crazy taffy pull, the bright-sounding keyboards providing a sweet balance to the bad-trip fuzz and yowls of Mike Panico's guitars. Like other East Coast "neo" outfits (Vipers, Cheepskates), the Overcoat rely on graceful, almost quaint, '60s structure to weave their magic; unlike many Midwest/West Coast groups who add an additional sense of raw punk revisionism, this is an undiluted flashback, and it works because their sense of gaudy, wide-eyed innocence is just as true and appealing as it was 25 years ago. Marshmallow Overcoat runs rings around a time-honored formula, and these songs swing enough to get the hula-hoop out of anyone's closet: "Echoes In Time," "When It's Dark," "Suddenly Sunday" and "Tomorrow Today."

MISSING FOUNDATION Demise/Humanity (Humanity, 155 W. 68th St., New York, NY 10023)—If you have ever been to New York, you know who Missing Foundation are. Their familiar, enigmatic "upside-down martini glass" logo seems to be spraypainted everywhere—on subways, monuments, buildings, statues, cars, curbs, even people's clothes. In New York itself, MF is so notorious they were the subject of a three-part Geraldo-style documentary on local TV last year. Musically, Missing Foundation sounds very literally like New York; this is the sound of things falling apart—drills, sirens, explosions, assorted screaming, and an awful metallic scraping and clanking like some horrible subway accident on a hot summer day during rush hour. The roots behind MF's sonic assault lay somewhere in the industrial music of Einsturzende Neubauten and early Swans (they light instruments on fire, beat on dumpsters, girders and other large metal objects, and they can lay down a stomping brownshirt rhythm that would make Laibach proud), but beneath all the hysteria and metallic gouging lies an ingenious and adventurous grasp of structure few "industrial" bands have. Missing Foundation are the kings of New York Noise, the lone-wolf terrors of the concrete jungle.





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POI DOG PONDERING Circle Around The Sun (EP) (Texas Hotel, 712 Wilshire Blvd. #151, Santa Monica, CA 90401)—A classic case of a great band getting its due is developing in Poi Dog Pondering, the huge Austin-via-Honolulu combo that's been turning heads and ears with its name and its sound. The loose grouping (on the sleeve the line-up says "for this record") that is Poi Dog Pondering mixes traditional rock instrumentals on an equal level with an odd assortment of horns and percussion and strings and whatnot (5 gallon oil tin, frying pan) into a bubbling whole where those spices, which normally add flavor, are the core of the affair. Somehow the melange of melodics falls together into a pleasant, accessible whole, an elegant sound that's both utterly different and ingratiating enough to sound immediately familiar. Their ability to tread that line so gracefully has caught the ears of many big labels, and we're expecting a signing announcement shortly, so this will likely be their last record for Texas Hotel. Get 'em while they're hot

CONCRETE BLONDE Free (I.R.S., 100 Universal City Plaza, Bldg., 422, Universal City, CA 91608)—The Los Angeles trio that gave us "Still In Hollywood" in 1987 has become a quartet (adding bassist Alan Bloch) on their second album, which picks up right where their eponymous debut left off. Working off the varied influences that are the core of this band, Free establishes Concrete Blonde at the front of the L.A. scene. Johnette Napolitano proves that she could muscle out her lyrics with the best of 'em, coming across like a powerful blend of Grace Slick and early Heart ("Help Me," "Run Run Run"), while also being able to show the deep, heartfelt emotion of the ballads ("Little Conversations"). Guitarist James Andrew Mankey pumps out plenty of hotheaded power chords between the scorching solos, but drummer Harry Rushakoff is the real foundation, pounding out the beat with the ferocity of a man possessed (check out "It's Only Money"). All these pieces fit together, molding into something not so puzzling. Besides those cuts mentioned, also check out the first single "God Is A Bullet" (a timely comment on the firearms problem), "Happy Birthday" and "Carry Me Away.

WALKABOUTS Cataract (Sub Pup, P.O. Box 20645, Seattle, WA 98102)—Last year's gorgeous first LP See Beautiful Rattlesnake Gardens found the Walkabouts facilely lumped in with R.E.M., Downy Mildew, Glass Eye and others who had a boho-acoustic sound. God knows which inappropriate members of the new folk cash-in will be summoned up this time (we'd mention the Triffids if we weren't above that sort of thing), but it's not their fault that this Seattle quartet had to put out a record in the midst of a saturation of sincero-strummers. Gently intrusive, often bell-like electric guitars strike outlines against heather-and-thistle acoustic melodies that sometimes keep a dignified pace and at others hunker down and cut a near-ruthless but never bombastic path. The Walkabouts' sound is intricate, somewhat broody and lush, and Carla Torgerson's vocals and violin have the straightbacked stridency that's long been a desired quality of folkies, but there's also an absence of pretense and a preponderance of snap, verve and electricity that sways this band into its own ballroom (located somewhere in the English countryside, no doubt). With only their second LP, the Walkabouts have a purity of tone and a wild, subtle beauty that should sustain them for many an album to come. Top cuts: "Home As Found," "Whereabouts Unknown," "Drille Terriers" and "Goodbye (To All That)."

SKID ROPER AND THE WHIRLIN' SPURS Trails Plowed Under (Triple X, 6715 Hollywood Blvd., Suite #284, Hollywood, CA 90028/213-871-2395)—Everyone knows Skid Roper as Mojo Nixon's silent sidekick, the man who bangs out the rockin' rhythms on his washboard-on-a-stick while Mojo gets his working. Skid steps out from behind his kit (and without any rock 'n' roll or pop star aspirations) to show the world he's got a love for authentic, roots-oriented, countrified music on his first record as a front man. Skid gets down to business and back to basics on this labor of love, a boot-tappin', melodic affair where he does his best talking with his electric gee-tar. While Skid does share some lead vocal duties with the purdy-voiced Jayne Robson, matching the twangy feel of those old records he grew up on is his main concern, and Skid nails it. (He's said that the biggest thrill of making Mojo's latest record in Memphis was getting the opportunity to play a '58 Les Paul that was used on early Sun sessions.) At times his musical attempts are a tad too earnest, commonplace or misguided ("Paint It Black")—he'd be a lot better off if he just went out there and had fun with it, as he does on most of side two with "Gotta Ride," "Slow Poke," the cowboy-surf instrumental "Up On The Edge" and the honkin', rockin' finale "Go Head On." Round 'em up, Skid.

STRAITJACKET FITS Hall (Flying Nun, P.O. Box 677, Auckland, New Zealand)—A quartet from Dunedin, New Zealand (that's where the Chills and The Clean are from), the Fits have been around for three years, and this is their first full-length LP. Swooshing in on the watercolor strokes of the more pastoral NZ bands, the Straitjacket Fits bends the sound of earlier groups like the Verlaines or Gordons into lazy and luxurious heights, making a big, happy butterfly of a record. Blending tinkling guitars that tend to dip treacherously low in that sneaky Flying Nun way with Shayne Carter's vocals planting the melodies on an evenly melodic keel, Straitjacket Fits emerges as perhaps one of the most tranquil Flying Nun bands, and we mean that in a good way. The Fits' arrangements stay aloft most of the time, but Carter's and Andrew Brough's guitars play around the spaces left between David Wood's bass and John Collie's drums in such a cunning manner that the songs never stray too far into the clouds. One of the better new groups to pop loose from a musical community that's slowly beginning to receive the attention it's long merited, the Straitjacket Fits connect best with "Dead Heat," "So Long, Marianne" (a Leonard Cohen cover), "Life In One Chord" (from their debut EP) and the title track.

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
