



PERFECT DISASTER Heaven Scent (Fire, P.O. Box 800, Rockville Centre, NY 11571-0800/516-764-6200)

"I'm not known for being optimistic." Phil Parfitt's opening lyric on the Perfect Disaster's fourth LP, Heaven Scent, sets an immediate tone for the album, though the comment is just as quickly negated when he exclaims "there's hope in the hope department" a few verses later. The songs on Heaven Scent fluctuate between upbeat rockers like "Rise" and "Takin' Over," which both recall the melodies and lyrical attention of fellow English band the Jazz Butcher, and dreamy ballads, like "Wires" and "Little Sister," which embody a spirit and direction reminscent of the Velvet Underground and Spacemen 3. The three rockers on the album prove the Perfect Disaster's mastery of a hook-laden pop tune, though the band really excels on the more subtle tracks. On these, Parfitt's Lou Reed-ish, talky way of singing radiates a controlled and expressive presence, tapping into a dark mood common to us all. Bassist Jo Wiggs, who now plays with the Breeders and Ultra Vivid Scene, adds sultry backing vocals on a few of the slower tracks, reinforcing the songs' dark glow. Parfitt and guitarist Dan Cross manage to sew the album's two moods together so seamlessly that the complexities in life end up making a little sense, or at the very least, they assure us that we're not alone in our confusion.

NAKED CITY Torture Garden (Shimmy-Disc, JAF Box 1187, New York, NY 10116/212-334-4134)

For the second in John Zorn's shortcuts through the backyard of 20th century American musics, all the orchestrated lightning flashes of last year's foray make a return, only there's more of them, and they take up even less time. Constructing elements of chaos with the logic and minutely detailed coordination of a clock mechanism, the band employs six instruments (including voice) with the utmost efficiency and maximum concentration, everyone playing as though they were ambidextrous octopi. The most predominant forces are the chameleon-like sax playing of Zorn and the Cuisinart vocals of Yamatsuka Eye, although all instruments manage to dissect and reinterpret the usual melange of hardcore, metal, jazz and splashes of country and blues. More compressed and therefore more intense than Naked City's debut, most of the new compositions straddle territory between science fiction jazz and thrash annihilation, every note on every song dispelling information with neatness and eyeblinking speed-Zorn composes as though the intended audience had computer chips for brains. Each of the 21 tracks has its own distinct purpose, and in the thimble of time allotted, each musical mission is executed cleanly and perfectly, leaving it up to the listener to choose his/her own minute of edification.


CHICKASAW MUDD PUPPIES 8 Track Stomp (Wing/Mercury, c/o PolyGram, 825 Eighth Ave., New York, NY 10019)

Just in case you haven't yet made their fond acquaintance, the Chickasaw Mudd Puppies are that two-man medicine minstrel show that've been kicking up dust down in Athens, GA, for the past couple of years. There's nothing slick or refined about these Pupps (their debut, White Dirt, came packaged in a burlap bag, fer mercy's sake), and they root their feet firmly in the Georgia clay and stretch their necks out under the hot red sun; they aren't the least afraid to stoop down 'n splatter their blue overalls with dark delta mud picked up from many prodigal wanderings and riverside tumblings. Produced by the unlikely but likable production duo of Willie Dixon and Michael Stipe (imagine the discussions those two could have about herbalism, roadside stops to eat at in Mississippi and the proper tuning of a rake), one might expect that big-city touring to support

White Dirt could result in a city-slicker urbanization of the Chicaksaw chigger-under-the-collar hick-blues formula. However, it turns out the bright lights, women and wine didn't go to their heads at all, and their rootsy picking, washboard tickling, jug-hooting stomp remains as undiluted and thick as fresh biscuit batter. Throw this in the ol' 8-track deck and click the program switch to raw blues shouts and field hollers like "Jam-balaya," "Moving So Fast," "Omaha," "Superior" and "Wasp."

H.P. ZINKER Beyond It All (Fire, P.O. Box 800, Rockville Centre, NY 11571-0800/516-764-6200)

With it being 14 years or so since dye-headed kids shrugged off their Sabbath/Zep/Queen etc. listening past, the music of H.P. Zinker sums up today's underground attitude toward rock history, and my, how times do change. From formative years spent pawing through metal and punk record bins with equal discrimination and taste. the amalgam that the members of Zinker produce on their semi-debut LP (... And There Was Light wasn't quite long enough) rests under no single umbrella, so therefore you won't get bored. The three's weighty instrumental proficiency and feisty personal spirit balances twin pretenses of '70s prog-rock artistic statement and '80s selfabsorbed weirdness, getting away with lengthy instrumental breaks and fantastically introspective lyrics as primary song components. Where H.P. Zinker's M.O. would have anyone of less skill/luck laughed out of town, Hans Platzgummer, Frank Puempel (the two of whom, armed with a drum machine, started the band in Austria) and David Wasik (who joined after the band moved to America and developed a sound that dictated real flesh and blood on percussion) actually make bombastic, overwrought, Valhalla-esque, guitarworshiping extremity sound positively refreshing and not at all indulgent. Top Cuts: "Me And My Misery," "Sometimes I Just Don't Feel Like Talking" and "I Don't Know What's Going On."

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
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
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HOLLOW MEN Cresta (Arista, 6 W. 57th St., New York, NY 10019)— Perhaps the last thing you need is yet another British indie rock band that's gone dance (on a major label, no less!). Yet, this quintet—four from Leeds, one from Manchester—makes a full-fledged musical and lyrical statement that transcends those nasty trends. First and foremost is lead voice David Ashmore, whose warble might best be described as "melodic nasal"—on the introspective, spacier tunes, his singing weaves into the music's very fabric, even though at times it sounds like his vox is wafting from across the room. Second and almost as important is the razor-sharp hooks created by the rest of the band (Choque, rhythm guitar; Brian E. Roberts, lead guitar; Jonny Cragg, drums; Howi Taylor, bass) on the amazingly catchy "Pantera Rosa" and the jazzy "Beautiful "Pantera Rosa" and the jazzy "Beautiful Sun"—and those aren't even the singles! Speaking of which, "The Moon's A Balloon" is a trippy (see the album cover acid tab-alikes) stream of consciousness, while the first U.S. single, "November Comes," sports both a sing-along chorus and a wild mix of clanging auitar and techno-house. mix of clanging guitar and techno-house, sort of like an Edge/808 State collab in heaven. Though the band definitely won't admit it, there is a similar drugged/dance tendency that could go over well segued to—gulp!—some of those Mancunian sounds, but we're sure most people will recognize the sheer beauty the Hollows create all by their lonesome selves. Play "Don't Slow Down," "Barefoot Parade," "Misunderstood" and the aforementioned tracks.



SOME VELVET SIDEWALK Appetite For Extinction (K/Communion, c/o Skyclad, 6 Valley Brook Road, Middlesex, NJ 08846/201-968-

0073)—The two halves of Some Velvet Sidewalk are Robert Christie and Al Larsen, and together they make music that is at once skeletal in presentation and full in ar-tistic expression. Christie and Larsen's songs deal with love, art and growing pains, all set against a backdrop of the sidewalks and grey weather of their home in Eugene, Oregon. The simplicity of the music—the only three sounds present are drums, guitars and vocals—places more emphasis on the lyrics and the urgency with which they're expressed. The album's title is as blatantly mocking as the musical stance; like

labelmate and pals Beat Happening (BH's and K Records' Calvin Johnson produced the record), Some Velvet Sidewalk keeps things simple, ignoring the bass guitar and keeping their six-string emanations raw and keeping their six-string emanations raw and biting. Sometimes they even explore some of the enveloping guitar waves of Teenage Fanclub ("Sidewalkin""), but in a much reduced form. The sting of the music is immediate and gripping—those off-key vocals will either make you want to cry or throw the record across the room. With lyrics like "I'm sticking down things with Elmer's glue/ For I must communicate with you" (from "Crayons"), you know it's as simple as that and as complicated as that. Decide for yourself, but in the meantime play the yourself, but in the meantime play the whole first side plus "Moment" and "20,000 Leagues Under The Sea."




MARCUS ROBERTS Alone With Three Giants (Novus, c/o RCA, 1133 Ave. Of The Americas, New York, NY 10032)—To those more skeptical of the critics' sweeping praise of Roberts' earlier efforts (The Truth Is Spoken Here or Deep In The Shed), Spoken Here or Deep In The Shed), it may seem improbable that a young pianist could come along and be touted for saving all of jazz music from a fusionary abyss of hi-tech sterility that swamped the field during the early '80s—this will answer all arguments as to the young pianist's merits. While his larger ensemble work sweeps listeners off their feet with rich, Elliatonian arrangements and a deep Elligtonian arrangements and a deep, swaying sense of blues and swing, when seated alone at the piano, Roberts paints evocative, eloquent portraits of three jazz titans—Jelly Roll Morton, Duke Ellington and Thelonious Monk. Leaping from Morton's deep piano blues, Roberts delves into the rich melodic complexity of the Duke, examining it from inside out, and then moves on to the leaping, striding sounds of Monk with equal aplomb. In his capable and with equal aplomb. In his capable and broad-reaching hands, the three giants are lovingly rendered and respectfully articulated: Morton's "Jungle Blues" transcends its original form entirely, Ellington's "Prelude To A Kiss" leaps out of the keyboard of Roberts' Steinway grand; while Monk's "Panonica" resembles nothing else but the grace and beauty of the exotic butterfly for which it was named. It's quiet, delicate, and serene—you have to sit down and and serene—you have to sit down and really listen to it deeply—but extracting a quiet hour from your day to do so could be one of the most rewarding listening experiences you'll ever get. Quite simply, this is a record that will be brought up in any serious discussion of the art of jazz piano from this point forward.

BASTRO Sing The Troubled Beast (Homestead, P.O. Box 800, Rockville Centre, NY 11571-0800/516-764-6200)—For their third record in about as many years, Bastro regurgitates the meat 'n potatoes ingredients of a time-bastro honored method of indie practice, and by no means has the beast bellowed its troubled last. Like the Volcano Suns or any of Flour's projects, the Louisville threesome use heavy, clanging guitars and vocals that range from doleful to bellicose, making it

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


all the more poignant when sunbeams of melody burst out from the gruff-sounding surface. From a ferocious, but hasty-sounding, debut EP to the unfurling maturation of last year's LP, the band has kept on the conservative side for this record, sticking mostly to what they know best (steamtrain rhythm, snowballing song structure), screaming through rough and tumble tunes, David Grubbs only occasionally relaxing into carefee noodling. Bastro's attention rests on the tug of war between terse vocals and a guitar that threatens to break away from the stampeding structure, and while they don't come up with enough new instrumental feats for a whole CD's attention span, they have enough tough, gristly tunes to maintain their status as prime proponents of guitar apoplectics. Cuts: "Krakow, Illinois," "Recidivist" and "Jefferson-In-Drag."




VARIOUS ARTISTS Rutles Highway Revisited (A Tribute To The Rutles) (Shimmy-Disc, JAF Box 1187, New York, NY 10116/212-334-4134)— No, this isn't a parody issue. True, an indie

No, this isn't a parody issue. True, an indie band could probably pay rent by doing just a few of the 500 tribute albums released annually. And who more deserving of tribute than the Rutles—Neil Innes' tribute/parody of the Beatles. Granted, Innes is no Paul McCartney (Innes is much taller), but when the songs are taken out of the Rutles parody context and are performed by such non-Beatlesque performers as Paleface, Shonen Knife, Jellyfish Kiss, Bongwater and others, they're fleshed out into more than just pop novelties. In fact, the Syd Straw and Marc Ribot version of "I Must Be In Love" is a downright heartfelt, helluva song, and Uncle Wiggly's "It's Looking Good," sounds like the best of today's low budget pop, and is clearly one of the album's finest. The originals are so catchy it's hard to mess them up. Peter Stampfel & The Bottlecaps' fine and jolly trip through "Ouch" has a 45 rpm sound even on 33—nothing peps up a song quite like a banjo. King Missile and Dogbowl's quirkiness owe much to the Rutles' wit and pay their respects well with covers of "Doubleback Alley" and "Another Day." Denying the shamless quality of this 20-song tribute album, one is surprised how decent (and fun) the songs actually are. We can only hope in the coming months for tribute albums to Spinal Tap, Spike Jones, the Banana Splits and a Rutles reunion tour.




VARIOUS ARTISTS Beets—A Collection Of Jazz Songs (Elemental, c/o Ralph, 109 Minna St. #391, San Francisco, CA 94105)—Beets is the second installment of the "Fruits Of The Underground Series" (the first one was Potatoes, a collection of folk music), brought to us by our friends at Ralph Records/Elemental Music. The idea behind this compilation is simple and very imaginative: Have a host of artists (jazz and otherwise) record pieces that showcase their interpretations and/or memories of jazz. Don't expect to hear the Marsalis Brothers teaming up with Connick, Jr., for instance. The tone of this compilation is one of experimentation and widening of what jazz can encompass; as that, this is a most triumphant release. Fred Frith's opening track "Boots" is a Jim Hall-meets-the Art Bears tune, proving once again what a tremendous improviser Frith is. Some other highlights include Sun Ra's "Egyptian Fantasy" with his whole band swinging and grooving (this should have been the sound-track for Johnny Quest!); the Rova Saxophone Quartet; the Machete Ensemble of San Francisco featuring trombone virtuoso Steve Turre playing conch shells; Tom Cora alongside his downtown New York pals Christian Marclay and Bobby Previte creating a soulful cacophony; Anthony Braxton and Gino Robair; a tune courtesy of Eric Drew Feldman; and probably the best cut on this CD, (the late) Snakefinger doing his own "Reptology."



DREAM ACADEMY A Different Kind Of Weather (Reprise, 3300 Warner Blvd., Burbank, CA 91505)—

We were first introduced to this trio in 1985, when a conspicuous little tune called "Life In A Northern Town" took over the airwaves. Now we come to the Dream Academy's third record (their first since 1987) and find more of the lush and inspired melodicism that first piqued our interest then, and makes us want to listen still. Once again, David Gilmour's production robustly captures the rich layers of sound created by the keyboards, winds and various samples. The echo treatment of Nick Laird-Clowes' vocals gives the songs that added intense chill, especially on "Waterloo," which is filled with a tempered imagery that makes your mind wander. The first single, a cover of John Lennon's "Love," shows yet another dimension of this band, as one of the experimenter. Mixing a house beat under the Lennon classic, adding some chants from '70s punk rocker Poly Styrene (X-Ray Spex) and the dreamy chant from Lennon's "#9 Dream," Dream Academy creates a new kind of dance track, one that doesn't use its beats purely for dance's sake, but to relate the view that love really is all you need. A Different Kind Of Weather balances these potent and delicate ideas together to give this distinctive band yet another creative platform to artfully express their thoughts. Also check out: "Lucy September," "Gaby Says," "Twelve-Eight Angel" and "Forest Fire."



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

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THEE HEADCOATS Beach Bums Must Die/THEE MIGHTY CAESARS Surely They Were The Sons Of God (Crypt, P.O. Box 9151, Morris-town, NJ 07960/201-475-7163) Billy Childish has got to be the hardest working man in show bizness. With thee very recent Headcoats LP on Sub Pop still in suave new release bins everywhere, Childish and Co. waste not a minute and blow out their "fifth fucking LP" (label description) of punk-rot, as gloriously lo-fi and meaty, beaty, big and bouncy as we've come to expect. "If you're gonna have your musical existence ground there base your musical existence around three chords, then at least choose the right ones," said Papa Childish to a young Billy, and that he unquestionably has, getting more mileage and giving more pleasure out of the opening riff of "I Can't Explain" than any combo on either side of the Atlantic. Beach Bums Must Die doesn't have quite the bite of Heavens To Murga-troyd..., but trash tunes like "Young-blood," "A Town Called Squaresville," "Headcoats On Backwards" and "Pow Wow'' are way too hip to be square. Childish's other mates, Thee Mighty Caesars, have released enough records in a short period of time (four years) to warrant a second volume of Ceasars greatest hits (volume uno was **English Punk Rock Explosion**, also on Crypt). Even less gussied-up than Thee Headcoats, the Ceasars are about as far removed from the "post-modern" generation as you can get, spitting out two-minute monochrome buckets of slop as easily as you can change the channel. If you don't get these in the mail gratis, don't be a log—call or write Crypt and cough up the dough.

MEN & VOLTS Cheer Up (50,000...000 Wotts, 5721 SE Loguno Ave., Stuort, FL 34997/ 407-283-6195)—With seven albums and a strong reputation behind them, the various members of Men & Volts have joined together again to produce yet another powerful album. The building blocks of the Volts' sound are the taut

songwriting skills of bandleader Phil Kaplan and longtime Volt-cohort David Greenberger (known for putting out the poetry zine Duplex Planet), the swaggering vocal interplay between the voices of Martha Foley and Kaplan, and a tightly structured but stirring delivery. The songs are knit together closely, providing something to bop your head to despite the pain they often discuss. The contrived yet creative style of the songs and the expressive hear-tache present in Kaplan's voice recall the sincerity and humor of Warren Zevon, though the overall feel of **Cheer Up** is pointedly individual. Kaplan and Foley's voices together have a country twang that underscores the album's quirky, sensitive mood. The songs discuss such daily bummers as bad moods and cigarette addiction, but somehow manage to wind up with a good attitude. We don't know if attempting to structure the madness of the world can make you forget how intrusive and befud-dling it can be, but Men & Volts are sure gonna try to make you **Cheer Up**. Good places to start: "Big Bad Mood," "Hell Hath No Fury Like A Woman Scorned," ""Cause It's Good" and "Meet Me At The Rip.

DRIVIN' N' CRYIN' Fly Me
Courageous (Island, 14 E. 4th St.,
New York, NY 10012)—With three
records under their belt, a lineup that is
finally all together, and many distractions
out of the way, Atlanta's Drivin' N' Cryin'
plugged in the juice, turned up the amps
and cranked out some aggressive rock
'n roll for their fourth outing. Fly Me
Courageous finds this quartet finally
putting together a powerful, fully focused
album, while satisfying those sweaty primal
instincts and those heady think-about-it sensibilities. Gone are the acoustic asides, but
not lost are the folk philosophies from
which this band's music spawns—see vocalist Kevn Kinney's solo album, MacDaugol
Blues, from last year, an acoustic work
that highlighted his strong and intelligent
songwriting ability. Producer Geoff
Workman (Cars, Motley Crue) has captured



the band's live toughness without sacrificing the softer elements—the elements that make Drivin' N' Cryin' an intriguing and convincing band. Flip down the goggles, wrap the scarf around your neck and take off with the title track, "The Innocent," "Around The Block Again," "Together" and "Look What You've Done To Your Brother."



FOR AGAINST In The Marshes (10" EP) (Independent Project, 544 Mateo St., Las Angeles, CA 90013)—The first in this label's Archive Series, to also include 10" releases from Savage Republic and Fourwaycross, is a collection of demo tapes from Lincoln, NE's For Against. Recorded in 1986 when their debut LP Echelans was released, this collection adds another dimension to the dark, brooding music that this trio brought to life, albeit a short life that was unfortunately not heard by as many people as it should have been. In The Marshes is rough and explorative with a Joy Division-like bass feel, an introspective voice and an urgency that transcends many atmospheric and emotional levels. In other words, a post-script that will send us back into our record libraries to dust off their two fine albums.



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REPLACEMENTS Don't Sell Or Buy, It's Crap (EP) (Reprise, 3300
Warner Blvd., Burbank, CA
91510)—As sort of this year's updated equivalent to 1989's limited-edition, promoonly Inconcerated live EP (which already has been extravely bestleaged), this has been extensively bootlegged), this similar single, with an A-side culled from All Shook Down, also boasts the expected non-LP bonuses (boni?—as Robert Plant might say, "Does anybody out there remember Latin?"), a couple of fuzzed-out outtakes that bristle with electric energy outtakes that bristle with electric energy and aggression—but note the near-perfect pop of Tommy Stinson's "Satellite" or the difficult interpretation of Bob Dylan's "Like A Rolling Stone," renamed "Like A Rolling Pin." If the acoustic flavor of All Shook Down left you a little lukewarm, turn "Kissin' In Action" or "Ought To Get Love" up—the "Mats may not have rocked Love" up—the 'Mats may not have rocked this hard and raw since the last time Bob zipped himself into a nurse's uniform and teetered onstage. It's good—don't buy it or sell it. Get it while you can.

DIGITAL UNDERGROUND "Same Song" (12") (Tommy Boy, 1747 First Ave., New York, NY 10128/212-722-2211)—Droppin' yet another Bay Area Bomb is Digital Underground, with an advance 12" from their upcoming six-song EP appropriately called This Is An EP Release. "Same Song" is a cranking bass-thumper that lifts Parliament's

'Theme From The Black Hole,'' slowing it down to the heavy-footed depths of "Humpty Dance" and "Doowutchyalike." Unlike the mega-hit "Humpty," the whole crew has at it, with Shock-G, Money-B, Tupac and Schmoovy joining Master Hump on a hilarious romp. The heavier B, "Nut-tin' Nis Funky," drops even more bass in your face.

MARK ARM The Freewheelin' Mark Arm (7") (Sub Pop, P.O. Box 20645, Seattle, WA 98102/206-441-8441)—Breaking away from the shackles of Mudhoney, Arm has discovered the roots of his humanity. Arm looks to his early influences and modernizes the univer-early musical statements of the two masters. sal musical statements of the two masters. Bob Dylan and Bo Diddley. This single wraps together the quintessence of Mark Arm: the voice, the superfuzz, the man. Now Arm has truly begun his lonely musical trek across the American way of life, only to be lost in the undertow of evil forces that destine all great artists to a life of pain and suffering.

LISA SUCKDOG "Kill Ralph Records" (7") (Ralph, 109 Minna Street #391, San Francisco, CA 94105)—And now the queen of the mini-opera has joined the ranks of Residents, Henry Kaiser and Snakefinger, with her tribute to the Bay Area label that pioneered eclectic music meant for the strange and imaginative. Parallel with other Ralph releases, this single has special packaging-side B is etched by Tim and Mike Biskup with a tribute to the death of Ralph. Suckdog is an evil nymph who whispers dark messages through backwards masking and satanic secrets that taunt the listener into irrepressible violence against anything named Ralph—so beware, this single is not for the squeamish.

EASY Castle Train (EP) (Blast First, 262 Mott St., Room 324, New York, NY 10012/212-941-9560)— Easy has to be the most melodic, easy band to listen to on Blast First, which has been the British home to Sonic Youth, Butthole Surfers, Dinosaur Jr. and the Lunachicks

Like Ride and the Stone Roses, these Swedes aren't afraid to dream and write songs that describe their pleasant visions, though the white noise displays of the former are absent. "Castle Train" grooves along innocently, with vocals as sweet as those of a pre-"Loaded" Bobby Gillespie (of Primal Scream) and a bouncy riff that will carry you into the clouds. If the other three tracks included here are any indica-tion, Magic Castle, the debut LP, is sure to be a great pop collection.

WEIRD PAUL "Sucking Chest Wound" (7") (Pop Bus, 5891 Darlington Road, Pittsburgh, PA 15217/412-422-3983)—Weird Paul Petroskey and his buddy Manny Theiner mix everthing that is silly about Beat Happening with everything that is serious about Happy Flowers into a catchy slab with a beautiful four-color sleeve. The hands-down beautiful four-color sleeve. The hands-down standout is the title track, where Paul sounds like Big Bird as he repeats three lines of lyrics along with a simple melody that reaches out to grab you on the first listen. "I Stole A Bunsen Burner," about the trials of a kleptomaniac in chemistry class, is inventive, playful, weirdo pop that makes you smile as you tap your feet. Then there is the opus "Dueling Magical Musical where the guitars sound more like Jaminators, those new-fangled pretend guitars that were so popular among the young crowd this season.

TAD "Jinx" (7") (Sub Pop, P.O. Box 20645, Seattle, WA 98102/206-441-8441)—Mud spewing from fiery hot mag wheels, the monster truck rally is coming to your favorite stadium in middle America. Tad is the Bigfoot that will smash in the derby of twisted and gnarled metal. Produced by Butch Vig, "Jinx" (along with the "Jack Pepsi" 7") is a preview to the upcoming Sub Pop LP, 8 Way Santa. The heavy sensation of his wrenching vocals gives way to the quitars way Santa. The heavy sensation of his wrenching vocals gives way to the guitars as they pummel the earth, shaking underfoot. A non-LP treat, "Pig Iron" produced by Jack Endino, is an interesting juxtaposition not unlike the opposing productions of Endino and Steve Fisk on the Screaming Trees double 7". Endino's production refines the sound, but doesn't lessen the power, just redirects the nunch. power, just redirects the punch.

regions where the Residents' eyeballs make their homes, Stuart stumbles valiantly on through his own paths of sound, exploring his own personal universe aided only by a faithful sidekick in his trusty Fostex fourtrack tape deck. Hacking with a splicing razor through the dense jungle growth of unreeled tape that covers this landscape, Stuart has preserved and stitched together the fragments of his voyage into what can only be described as the most categorically unclassifiable demo tape ever made. Like most busy and industrious hometapers, Stuart regales us in his liner notes with all the minute technical details of how he created his mini masterpiece, but what's really important here are the noodly sounds and sampling that slice through his music like those multi-axed Once-ler contraptions hacking through Truffula trees in The Lorax. Like a more industrial, urban, gratingly sampled version of the flowery, noodly world of Biota, or the record that Sebadoh might make if they suddenly signed a contract with Wax Trax Records, One For Juanita is an odyssey unlike any other

Mixing the bluesy twang of their kissing cousins, like the Chickasaw Mudd Puppies and distantly inbred relatives like the Flat Duo Jets, **ENORMOUS RICHARD** (c/o

Rich, 7353 Tulane Ave., University City, MO 63130/314-533-2963) boasts a hearty dose of bluesy country twang and tongue-in-cheek, good-ole pickin' and grinnin' fun, like if Mojo Nixon fell clear off the Louisiana Hayride and landed plum on his head. It all breathes with an exuberant haystack-hiding, mischievous boyish charm, like they know they shouldn't be saying or doing the things they're saying and doing, and they know they'll get their mouths washed out with soap for it, but that's not washed out with soap for it, but that's not about to stop 'em at all from having their fun. Our picks and grins: "I'm Not Religion," "I Feel Crummy," "Dogs With Their Heads Out The Windows" and "Steve Pick, Music Critic."... BABYLON PINK's debut EP, Long Weekend (Wave Seven, P.O. Box 234, Northfield, MN 55057/507-663-0397), is a glorious excursion through the rougher, more hell-bent cursion through the rougher, more hell-bent side of Midwest guitar-propelled antics, the six songs possessing enough get up and go, and a fervent belief in the redemptive potential of speed and volume to overlook jits or Poster Children, the band wields a love for motor-rumbling rock as a main weapon, infusing such tunes as "Strange Stuff" and "Killing Time" with contagious evuberance. any wetness behind their ears. ROLAND KIRK "Rahsaan": The Complete Mercury Recordings Of Roland Kirk (Mercury, clo PolyGram, 825 Eighth Ave., New York, NY 10019)—Thunnnkkk. That's the sound of jaw hitting floor when this monster of a box set was found in a X-mas stocking. Yes, this 11-CD set is bound to set you back around \$150, but so will that combination espresso/pasta maker, and not only is this infinitely more rewarding, but it looks just as prestigious on your countertop, with Kirk's mouth stuffed to the gorge with three horns, cheeks fully puffed and menacing dark shades in place. Roland Kirk may not have been the first or only musician to play several instruments simultaneously, but he did so for the sake of creativity and not showmanship (though it does look cool as hell). His complete mastery of his instruments—tenor sax, manzello (variant of the B-flat soprano) and stritch (modified Eflat alto), all three of which he played at once; flute (maybe the craziest ever played); and siren—puts him in a universe all his own. Equally at home with straightahead Ellingtonian melodicism or with white-noise freakouts rivaling any free-jazz of the '60s, Kirk is a rare breed, an artist who's confident and secure enough in his abilities (upstaging Kirk just can't be done) to lead a group forcefully while assembling and pushing to extremes as skilled a group of players as imaginable, among them Roy Haynes, Elvin Jones, Tubby Hayes, Hank Jones, Jaki Byard and Neils Pedersen. The four years Kirk spent with Mercury (1961-1965) resulted in his most stunning recorded work, and it's all here, beautifully packaged and exhaustively annotated. Go ahead, splurge. You'll be swept away.

BONZO DOG BAND The Best Of The Bonzo Dog Band (Rhino, 2225 Colorado Ave., Santa Monica, CA 90404/213-828-1980)—Originally called the Bonzo Dog Dada (later "DooDah") Band, this unique outfit was formed in 1965 (inevitably at an English art school) intending to parody the music of the '20s and '30s. Whether the Bonzos initiated it or merely caught a rising swell is subject to question, but with the onset of psychedelia came a brief revival of British vaudeville music (best exemplified by the Kinks but also present on Sgt. Pepper, Between The Buttons and especially the Small Faces' Ogden's Nut Gone Flake), at which the Bonzos beat them all. Spoofing everything from jazz to Iullabies to Rogers And Hammerstein (as well as rockabilly and the Beatles), they combined a staggering the Beatles), they combined a staggering songwriting/instrumental versatility with perhaps the funniest lyrics in rock history (featuring a bizarre preoccupation with clothing that resulted in "Shirt" and no less than two songs about trousers, including the original "Trouser Press"). Quintessentially British, their humour had a huge influence on Monty Python's Flying Circus, for which Bonzo's Neil Innes wrote many songs (he also co-masterminded The Rutles—a brilliant 1978 spoof on the Beatles legend—with Python's Python's

Eric Idle), and is on a par with Masterpiece Theatre's best comedies. Although their Theatre's best comedies. Although their music loses its effect if you don't listen intently to the lyrics, the following cuts are only a morsel of the Bonzo's pioneering brilliance: "I'm Bored," "Rockaliser Baby," "Ali-Baba's Camel," "Hunting Tigers Out In 'Indiah," "Beautiful Zelda," "The Bride Stripped Bare" and "Mr. Apollo" (both of which cound like The Maye) and especially which sound like The Move) and especially the hilarious "Tent."

RESIDENTS Stranger Than Supper (UWEB Special Products, c/o Ralph, 109 Minna St. #391, San Francisco, CA 94105)—There's more to the Residents' illustrious 18-year career than meets the, er, eye. Compare the similarly skewed moods of 1971's "Something Devilish" with its follower, "Teddy Bear," and it's hard to believe that the two were recorded nearly 18 years apart. With the deletion of the Magic Band and Frank Zap-pa's dissolution of the Mothers Of Invention at the dawn of the '80s, the Residents have stood undisputed for the better part of a decade as simply the weirdest band in the land. While concrete information about the group is still as scarce to come by as it must have been 18 years ago (our favorite quack Residential explanation: the band hails from the North Pole, where their immense ocular orbs are an evolutionary adaptation to scarce arctic light), it's been a little easier to keep tabs on the group's enigratic activities in recent years by closely monitoring their fan club of sorts, affectionately known as Uncle Willie's Eyeball Buddies (UWEB for short). This compilation, culled laboriously from the archives of the aforementioned Uncle Willie, doesn't just span the odds and ends of the Rez's '80s fan club members-only CD label (four releases to date), but also looks ahead to future releases by the specialized Uncle Willie organization, giving the otherwise uninitiated a compact and long-overdue snap assessment of the value and heritage of one of the world's most singularly intriguing bands. Joining UWEB costs \$15 a year, and you'll get all sorta goodies like newsletters, a free CD and a neat-o button as well: Write to 35 Montana St., San Francisco, CA 94112. Uncle Willie wants you!

TEARDROP EXPLODES Pigno/ VARIOUS ARTISTS The Zoo: Uncaged 1978-82 (Document, United House, North Road, Islington, London, N7 9DP, U.K.)—In the dour postpunk England of 1978-80, Liverpool meant what Manchester means today. meant what Manchester means today. Although the scene only produced two truly legendary bands (Echo & The Bunnymen and arch-rivals the Teardrop Explodes), its alums have resurfaced with surprising frequency in outfits as diverse as Sisters Of Mercy, Mission U.K., Siouxsie & The Banshees, Dead Or Alive, Lightning Seeds, K.L.F. and Frankie Goes To Hollywood. The scene's figurehead label was Zoo Records (run somewhat cluelessly by David Balfe and Bill Drummond), and nearly every song and Bill Drummond), and nearly every song ever released on the label is included on Uncaged; likewise, all of the Teardrops' pre-Killmanjaro material is collected on Piano (five cuts are on both LPs). Since the discs are sequenced chronologically, both start off so weakly that you wonder what all the fuss was about, but the side twos are staggering. Early versions of Echo and the Teardrops' more legendary songs

resent them in a totally new light, and Plana unearths two amazing rarities.
More obscure acts like Those Naughty Lumps (who weigh in with the hilarious "Ig-gy Pop's Jacket") and Lori & The Chameleons deliver charming novelty songs, but only the Wild Swans' two cuts are on a par with its more famous labelmates. While both of these albums are geared more toward collectors than the casual fan, they present even further proof of this scene's widespread influence— Morrissey and the Inspiral Carpets being just two obvious examples.






NBA Goes Postmodern?: As well as ruling the top of the CMJ Top 150 since November 23, 1990, the **Charlatans UK** has also been getting airplay at Madison Square Garden in New York before the second-half tipoff of Knicks games and during Rangers hockey games as well. "The Only One I Know"s organ-filled intro seems to be getting fans fired up almost as well as "Baby Elephant Walk." Whether baseball organists will catch on to the trend is still in doubt—tune in in April.

Under A Snow Drift: The new year is here, but CMJ reporters still haven't come to roost in full force. There were only 185 Top 35 reports this issue, almost half of the usual number during peak periods of the year (October, February). So, again there's a tendency for older records to gain in the absence of new releases.

Battle For #1: Though the **Red Hot + Blue** compilation has reached the top spot on Progressive Retail (as well as in the West regional), it remains relatively far behind the Charlatans UK, with **Sisters Of Mercy** (4-3) and **Lush** (5-4) both showing the potential to gain the crown with school coming back soon. The **Happy Mondays** (14-5) are looking strong, too, with a #4 in the East and their cut, "Kinky Afro," moving up 11-3 on Top Cuts (Elektra: Puhleeeze do a remix of "God's Cop" for the next single). The **Trash Can Sinatras** seem to be finally losing steam (8-7), and **Buffalo Tom** (10-8) and the **Cocteau Twins** (13-10) both make mild comebacks after going down last issue.

Breaking Through: Sire's rush on the domestic release of **Ride**'s latest LP seems to have paid off, as the band grabs the #1 Breakthrough with a #32 debut. Also bowing in are Beggars-RCA's **Daniel Ash** trailer single (#36), SBK's **Jesus Jones**' import single (#57) from the forthcoming **Doubt** LP, Island's **Drivin' N' Cryin'** (#75), Roughneck-Fire's **Anastasia Screamed** (#97), Homestead's **Verlaines** (#112) and **Bastro** (#115), and Elektra's **Brand Nubian** (#132).

The Deluge To Come: Late January/early February should bring many good chart tidings for the following LPs: Daniel Ash, Pop Will Eat Itself, Chickasaw Mudd Puppies, Dream Academy, Front 242, Divinyls, KLF, Sting, Perfect Disaster, Chagall Guevara and Mouth Music.


ON THE CHART

The first chart of the new year reveals a power struggle at the top of the chart, with Chrysalis' **Red Hot + Blue** finally usurping the #1 spot from **The Cure** (down 1-3), and WB's Jane's Addiction following in its steamy purple wake, up 3-2. There's three new entries in the Top 10: 4AD-Reprise's Lush (12-7), Island's Pogues (11-9) and Geffen's Peter Gabriel collection (19-10)

Industrial dance discs are faring quite well on the charts these days, with notable upward movement from TVT's Nine Inch Nails (33-18), upped by the "Sin" CD5; Wax Trax's KMFDM (34-22); Epic's Front 242 CD5 (61-25), with an LP out at the end of the month; and Wax Trax's Front Line Assembly (40-33). Wax Trax's KMFDM/My Life With The Thrill Kill Kult split single has also been a hot item.

The two highest new entries this week are Reprise's Chris Isaak (#27), who's finally been discovered by commercial radio since his inclusion on the soundtrack to David Lynch's Wild At Heart and Karen Glauber's ecstatic ravings. Ride's first real full-length album, Nowhere, on Sire-Reprise surpasses the Smile EP combo (double EP?), debuting at #28 and garnering the #2 In-Store play spot.

Other new entries to keep an eye on include Communion-Skyclad's fantastic Velvet Underground tribute album, **Heaven & Hell** (#42), Island's Drivin' N' Cryin' (#43), Drag City's Royal Trux (#54), and Shimmy-Disc's way-out Rutles tribute, Rutles Highway Revisited (#55). JACKPOT!



HANK WILLIAMS The Original Singles Collection...Plus (Polydor, c/o PolyGram, 825 Eighth Ave., New York, NY 10019)—The recent flood of exquisitely packaged box sets, repackaged historical recordings, has been joined by this welcome three-disc compilation—84 tracks from the man that changed the face of country music. Every single Williams ever recorded is included, along with several previously unreleased recordings, the most interesting of those being a 1942 version of "I'm Not Coming Home Anymore," taken from the only acetate of this track known to exist, and presented in all its surface noise-laden glory. Presented in chronological order to display the artistic growth during Williams' brief career, the songs here are timeless. On the surface they're simple, yet they contain incisive lyrics that span a tremendous range of human emotion, all done with the raw hillbilly feel that defines country music. Hank's use of electric guitar and lap steel in conjunction with the traditional acoustic guitar, bass and fiddle was an innovation at the time of these recordings; now it's just the way it's done. So many of these songs are truly classics: "Hey, Good Lookin" "Jambalaya," "Cold, Cold Heart," "You Win Again," "Honky Tonkin'," "Your Cheatin' Heart." It's difficult to fathom that Williams' recording career only lasted a little more than six years. The Original Singles Collection...Plus is a requirement for any fan of ciassic American music.



BLOOD ORANGES Corn River (ESD, 530 N. Third St., Minneapolis, MN 55401/612-375-9188)—Yeah, the name of this band won't clue you in on the bluegrass/folk-inflected music contained on Corn River, but that's usually half the fun of discovering new and exciting music—you never know what's going to come out of your speakers when you slap that disc in the player. Formed in Boston during 1987, Blood Oranges is influenced from a variety

of genres, infusing more traditional folk stylings with the energy of punk, surprisingly retaining the melodic side of the music while playing as hard as they can. Mandolin player/singer Jim Ryan leads the way with a deep, warm voice and a rather odd instrument: a custom-made mandolin with five thick strings, instead of the usual four pair, that allows him to pick out the fastest twang you've heard in years. Bassist Cheri Knight and guitarist Mark Spencer lend some sweet harmonies, especially on the traditional "Shady Groove" and the stomping original "High On A Mountaintop." Be sure to check out the high stepping "Incinerator," the smart twin leads on "Baby Down" and the dark, brooding "Western Man." There are quite a few bands mining this roots rock territory these days, but none play with the exuberance and chops of the Blood Oranges.

MIKE AULDRIDGE Treasures Untold (Sugar HIII, P.O. Box 4040, Duke Statlon, Durham, NC 277061 919-489-4349)—Known as an innovator on the dobro through his work with the Seldom Scene, as a solo performer (this is his eighth solo record) and as a session player with Emmylou Harris, James Taylor and Linda Ronstadt, Mike Auldridge has his roots in the traditional sounds of the '30s, '40s and '50s. On Treasures Untold he's joined by Tony Rice and Doc Watson for a tribute to those times, inspired by Auldridge's earliest musical influence: his uncle, Ellsworth Cozzins, who played pedal steel with Jimmie Rodgers. The LP is a wonderful melange of styles that displays not only the remarkable musical prowess of some world-class players having a great time with some true country standards ("Walking The Floor Over You," "Deep Water," "Tuck Away My Lonesome Blues"); it also displays their profound love for all types of country music. Auldridge's picking is a joy throughout, the instrumental "Raisin' The Dickins" features a standout performance by Ricky Simpkins on fiddle and Rice's vocal on Earnest Tubb's "Are You Waiting Just For Me" is a perfect fit, as close to bluegrass heaven as you're likely to get.

FILL 'ER UP

From that current hotbed of country sounds, Brooklyn, New Yawk, comes an interesting package of 7" releases from those wild-eyed purveyors of "Rig Rock," Diesel Only (100 N. 6th St., Brooklyn, NY 11211/212-674-0044). With the idea that the current lack of vinyl releases hurts jukebox operators the most, these could become real truck stop favorites, bypassing the usual routes of acceptance and going for the market they're intended for in the first place. The best of the lot is the WORLD FAMOUS BLUE JAYS. "Do It For Hank"—Jr., that is—is a raving guitar romp produced by Eric Ambel of Del-Lords fame. Vocalist Jeremy Tepper growls his way through 3:17 of the most fun you'll hear on wax this year. COURTNEY & WESTERN is a co-ed group led by vivacious singer Courtney Lee Adams. "Hungry Like A Man" is a straight-ahead country rocker with lots of ringing guitar. The production here is a bit sloppy and this band may benefit from someone else's knob-twiddling next time. Led by multi-instrumentalist songwriters Joe Flood and George Bacon, MUMBO GUMBO is reminiscent, at least on this single, of Dan Hicks And His Hot Licks. Here they offer up the funky ditty


"Miss Fabulous" with a pleasing mix of accordion, mandolin and fiddle adding to the stew. Last, but certainly not least, on the stack is Philadelphia's GO TO BLAZES. Having previously released an album on Skyclad, their debut for Diesel Only is an obscure Johnny Paycheck tune, "(And I'll Be) Hating You," that's a sultry ballad laden with a moving vocal and a sweet pedal steel part.

HOW BLUE CAN YOU GET

Once again, there's a ton of blues releases to catch up on. Sometimes, I think this column could be all blues, all the time. Rounder (1 Camp St., Cambridge, MA 02140/617-354-0700) has started Bullseye Blues, a new all-blues label, by releasing new recordings from two legends CHAM-PION JACK DUPREE and CHARLES BROWN. Dupree's Back Home In New Orleans is a celebration of his return to his hometown, for 1990's Jazz & Heritage Festival, after nearly 40 years in Europe. He may be nearing 80, but he's playing the piano and singing with as much vitality as any performer alive today, a true master of the blues. Give a listen to: "When I'm Drinkin'," "I Don't Know," "My Woman Left Me" and the remarkable story of "Freedom." Brown's "All My Life" is an exquisite representation of the soulful style of one of R&B's early giants who somehow fell on hard times. But Charles is back in a big way with a silky smooth set of ballads and easy rockin' blues, ably assisted by Dr. John on a few tracks and the unusually fine production touch of Ron Levy. Highlights include the boppin' "Bad New Orleans is a celebration of his Levy. Highlights include the boppin' "Bad Bad Whiskey," the New Orleans-style funk of "That's A Pretty Good Love" and the sultry "Early In The Morning."...The CHRIS CAIN BAND is a fave blues outfit in the Bay Area, and by listening to the swinging grooves and hot guitar licks on Cuttin' Loose (Blind Pig, P.O. Box 2344, San Francisco, CA 94126/415-526-0373), it's easy to see why. Vocally Cain recalls a young B.B. King, instrumentally his guitar playing is tasteful without overdoing it; his band, featuring the wailing sax of Noel Catura, adds just the right amount of spice to give these blues an updated feel without blanding out. Check out "Just Ain't My Plan," "Tippin' At Taylor's" and "Turn It Loose" for a rockin' good time... Also new from Blind Pig is Heart Attack, the debut from LITTLE MIKE AND THE TOR-NADOES. These guys may be from New York City, but they can blow Chicago style as well as anyone from the Windy City. Surely the fact that they've worked with luminaries like Pinetop Perkins, Paul Butterfield and Hubert Sumlin, all who make apin the Bay Area, and by listening to the field and Hubert Sumlin, all who make ap-pearances here, has positively affected their views on the blues. Little Mike Markowitz whips up a storm with his harmonica and the Tornadoes follow with a mighty blast of their own on originals like "Nothin' But The Blues," "Don't Like To Get In Trouble" and the title track.

ICE CUBE Kill At Will (EP) (Priority, 6430 Sunset Blvd., Hollywood, CA 90028/213-467-0151)—Since his departure/falling-out with N.W.A. and the release of his brilliant LP, AmeriKKKa's Most Wanted, Ice Cube has established himself as one of the hardest and most prolific rappers within the last year. The true-to-life descriptions of the inner-cities through the use of his, at times, rather rambunctious tongue, has had the spotlight shifted in his direction as major media sources (Rolling Stone, CBS News) have probed into his world, looking for answers to the questions he poses in his music. With the new year Ice Cube is showing no signs of letting up as he furthers his investigation of inner-city violence on his EP Kill At Will. Featuring five blistering new tracks and two remixes ("Endangered Species," "Get Off My Dick..."), the Cube hones his edge and comes across more forceful than ever. With the Lench Mob's Sir Jinx doing the remixes instead of the Bomb Squad, songs like "Endangered Species" take on a new life with a deep funky bass line that smooths out the rhythm while "Get Off My Dick And Tell Yo Bitch To Come Here" rides the same basic rhythm but is spiced with background samples and sound effects. New cuts from Cube include the creative "Jackin" For Beats," with Ice Cube rapping around popular beats like Public Enemy's "Welcome To The Terrordome," Digital Underground's "Humpty Dance," D-Nice's "Call Me D-Nice" along with beats from EPMD, X Clan and L.L. Cool J. On the serious side, there's "The Product," which is a hard-driving story of a struggling kid from the ghetto that sends a message about youths being the products of their social background. The most somber mo-ment comes on "Dead Homiez" as Cube's mellow rhyming over a groove similar to "Who's The Mack?" paints a gripping tale of a victim of street violence. Topping off the EP is "JD's Gaffilin' (Part 2)" and Ice Cube's shout-outs on "I Gotta Say What's Up!!!" over music from Sir Jinx and Isaac Hayes. For those who questioned Cube's ability or were unclear about his message, this EP should easily dissolve all inquires, and his fans will see a deeper and more mature side to Ice Cube.






WHAT I HEARD IN 1990

If 1989 opened the floodgates, 1990 was the deluge. There was plenty of flotsam (those near-misses and miscalculations) and jetsam (leftovers and such that the companies tossed overboard to the scurrying rats), and many a fine rare treasure as well. Rather than a greatest hits of world music list, I wanted to sort of ramble through the year, area by area, and make some notes.

AFRICA



The profusion of Paris-recorded pop continued, with notable misses and hits. Among the hits were Malian singer KASSE MADY, whose album Fode (Stern's) was a model of what Afro fusion is all about. The irresistible YOUSSOU N'DOUR also returned to the airwaves with Set (Virgin) and proved himself again in control of the West Africa/Paris continuum. Shanachie recently put out SONA DIABATE's latest record, making the first American release of the transcendant guitar sounds of Sona and brother Sekou "Diamond Fingers" Diabate. There was also the equally stunning solo guitar playing of BOUBACAR TRAORE (Stern's), a gentle, melodic player from Mali. What was missing was ALI FARKA TOURE's newest, The River, which is hung up in some business ozone or other. Further north, the sounds of Cairo are madcap if Yalla—Hitlist Egypt (Mango) is any indication. Possibly one of the most beautiful recordings of the year was by New York-based Ugandan SAMITE (Shanachie). The gentle strings and percusion on this album were perfect.

sion on this album were perfect.
Southern Africa still kept the lead for releases and re-releases. Notable were the many MAHLATHINI albums, with the MAHOTELLA QUEENS and without.
LADYSMITH BLACK MAMBAZO

(Warner Bros.) proved they could do some solid crossover without selling out, and pitted their vocal talents with the Winans and Bootsy Collins, in a fusion that was surprisingly fresh. Zimbabwe's **BHUNDU BOYS** (Mango) produced their 1990 record in Harare, a good move for them, and returned to a more African, less international sound.

THE AMERICAS

Still at the top of my list for North American releases is RARE AIR (Green Linnet). This Canadian group proved that fusion was a word that still has some meaning. For American artists, the recent album from ROBIN HOLCOMB holds my heart for best all-around everything. Early in 1990, Arhoolie put out Beau Solo, a collection of tunes by MICHAEL DOUCET, Cajun archivist, revivalist and one hell of a fiddler. There was a deluge of music from Brazil this year, most of it back catalog stuff from the vaults of the majors, and most of it dismal. The exceptions? TOM ZE (WB), TICO DA COSTA (Music Of The World), MARIA METHANIA (Verve-PG), GILBERTO GIL's Eterno Deus Mu Danca (Tropical Storm), MARGARETH MENEZES (Mango) and Ryko's pair of compilations from Brazil. From elsewhere in South America, most impressive was Arawi, an album that brought new contemporary music from Bolivia. My favorite Caribbean cruises had to be aboard the British flagship of Neil Fraser, a.k.a. the MAD PRO-FESSOR, whose crazy backward dubs of

As we turn over a new leaf with the first new reports taken in '91, we find ol' Youssou has been overrun, his title usurped by crowds of fezz-sporting Mustaphas, who overtake the top of our chart with their riot-inciting fusion of crazy world styles and beats. Mackabe continues to climb, as do newcomers Copacetic. But look out—several reggae heavyweights like Bunny Wailer, Mad Professor, Tools And The Maytals and Gregory Isaacs could be gaining on the top soon—stay tuned.

Perhaps the most important entry on our chart is that of Fela's 0.0.0.0. album. Apparently programmers are realizing that what the man has to say (not to mention the hypnotic grooves he says it with) are well worth a spin even though both of the album's tracks clock in at well over 25 minutes. If there was one record out there that we felt truly deserved and needed to be heard, Fela's newest just might be it. See you next week! (WORLD MUSIC REPORTS PRINTED AFTER TOP 35 REPORTS)

some of Jamaica's biggest stars were one of the heights of the listening year. Both RAS and ROIR are responsible for letting him out!

EUROPE

Hannibal gave us two great releases by the Hungarian group MUSZIKAS featuring the stunning vocals of Marta Sebestyn.

3 MUSTAPHAS 3 had two releases on Ryko this year, with some mostly serious stuff, brilliant subtle parodies and some out-and-out whack. "Forward in all directions" is a credo we should all heed! The joining of JUNE TABOR and the OYSTER BAND (Ryko) had its moments, but was below the potential indicated by their individual talents. The DEIGHTON FAMILY's (Philo-Rounder) hybrid of Memphis, olde England and Mollucca was a pleasant and delightful excursion. GIPSY KINGS and KETAMA both managed to prove the possibilities and limitations of flamenco fusion, bowing to the smoother style of the restaurant or dance club instead of the rough-hewn street sound of the genuine article.

ASIA

Asian music is the least capable of westernizing (that is, placing in 4/4 danceteria time) and as a result has been the least available in the U.S. With such a huge proportion of the world's population living on this continent, it is sad to see. A few releases showed the potential for both cross-

ing over, and for introducing the music as it is to new listeners. Among those who chose to fuse, no more perfect voices appeared than NAJMA AHKTAR (Shanachie) and SHEILA CHANDRA (MNW (Sweden)). Both proved decisively that Europe and southern Asia have a lot to offer each other. Less daring, but no less beautiful was the uniting of Pol Brennan and the Chinese band Shung Tian with the GUO BROTHERS, on an album of richness and subtlety. SIMON SHAHEEN introduced us to the world class classical world music of MOHAMED ABDEL WAHAB (Axiom), and the Sufi tradition was brought west by recordings of both the SABRI BROTHERS and NUSRAT FATEH ALI KHAN (RealWorld). My last Jackpot! of '90 was the drum music of Korea interpreted by SAMULNORI, a release by CMP Records of Germany and New York.

Lastly, a special note to some of the smallest purveyors of the world's music, whose dedication and tight budgets have made some of the best produced, and least heard, music. Without them, the trends would never have developed. Music Of The World. ROIR. Stern's (London and NY). Original Music. Globestyle. World Circuit. And a special award to all the radio stations in the U.S. who decided to let the rest of the world speak on America's airwaves.

JACKPOT!



DAVE HOLLAND QUARTET Extensions (ECM, c/o PolyGram, 825 Eighth Ave., New York, NY

10019)—Quietly, without affectation, the composer and contrabassist Dave Holland has fashioned a quartet that extols togetherness over technique. That is not to say, however, that alto saxist Steve Cole man (whose work I prefer as a sideman), guitarist Kevin Eubanks and drummer Mar-vin ''Smitty'' Smith find the leader's ensem-ble structures inhibiting. With his own groups since his pivotal association with Miles Davis in the late '60s, Holland has proven himself (especially on his three previous quintet offerings for ECM) to be a player's composer: His two originals on **Extensions**, along with the two each from Coleman and Eubanks, are open, loose and evolving, never rambling or atonal; the boundary markers, such as they are, are audible only to the musicians. During six tunes spanning 59 minutes, the four players exhibit subtlety and poise as they weave in and out of the ensemble fabric Leadership becomes a moot point with this foursome because individual ego is supplanted by ensemble expressiveness. Coleman and Eubanks, who record as leaders on a regular basis, have never sounded better, and Holland comes across as a placid British counterpart, one generation removed, to Charles Mingus. Dynamic, often hypnotic, multidimensional **Extensions** is the sort of CD that one is hard-pressed to shelve after one hearing.

KEN AGAIN

If its first release is any indication, then Ken Music (301 W. 57th St., Suite 26A, New York, NY 10019), the label run by Ken Fujiwara, has a promising future as a straightahead label. Besides the superb New York Hardball effort from trombonist Conrad Herwig (Jackpot! Nov. 23), Ken has come out with a tasty CD by pianist Ted Rosenthal. On the 64-minute New Tunes, New Traditions, he plays five of his own things along with five pieces by Thelonius Monk, including the seldomplayed "Hackensack" and "San Francisco Holiday (Worry Later)." Rosenthal, you may recall, walked away with the \$10,000 first prize in 1988 at the second-annual Thelonius Monk International Piano Competition. On five numbers, the young pianist is flanked by the estimable bassist Ron Carter and drummer Billy Higgins; the other five are quartet settings with the addition of trumpeter Tom Harrell. In addition to the new outings by Herwig and Rosenthal, Ken Music has licensed strong pieces from the Toshiko Akioshi Orchestra (Wishing Piece, 1986) and pianist Norman Simmons (I'm The Blues, a quintet outing from the pianist's Milliac company with Clifford Jordan and Jimmy Owens on the front line). Soon to come from Ken Music are quartet sides from altoist in Snidero (Storm Rising) and pianist Salvatore Bonafede (Ac-

Shakin', featuring boneman Grover Mitchell and his All-Star Orchestra, will be followed by quintet offerings from Jazz Messenger trumpeter Brian Lynch, bassist Ron McClure (Descendants, with Harrell and John Scofield) and Herwig (Every Breath). For company promotion director, Ken Music has wisely tabbed Gust Tsilis, a New Yorker whose experience as a talent booker (at Visiones in Manhattan, a crucial outlet for New Jazz), performer (vibist with his own group and that of Arthur Blythe), recording artist (Pale Fire for Enja) and producer (Intergalactic Maiden Ballet, also for Enja) makes him an invaluable, handson addition to the fold. Tsilis' debut recording for Ken Music, Possibilities, will feature eight originals penned by the leader and performed by a tight-knit unit of Billy Hart, Anthony Cox and Pete Madsen. Expect it some time this winter.

ODDS 'N' ENDS

The audiophile Chesky label (P.O. Box 1268, Radio City Station, New York, NY 10101) will issue a new recording from the **PHIL WOODS** octet, which he calls his Little Big Band, in January. Among the selections on this CD from the veteran altoist, who is teamed with his regular rhythm section plus hornmen Nick Brignola (baritone), Tom Harrell (trumpet) and Hal Crook (trombone), will be a dedication to altoist Gene Quill, Woods' erstwhile recording partner... On the basis of his new CD, **Go Graove** (GM Recordings, 167 Dudley Road, Newton Center, MA 02159), **MICHAEL BOCIAN** is a guitarist on the move, a player who aspires to a Metheny-esque fluidity (without too many gadgets) within a boppish approach; fittingly, he refuses to shelve the Great American Songbook. Bocian's quartet, with the free-style drummer Rashied Ali, was booked into Visiones in Manhattan for two nights in December. The president of GM Recordings, by the way, is Gunther Schuller, the eminent arranger, composer and theoreti-

cian (principally of Third Stream music), and the breadth of his label's offerings reflects his insights into, and proficiency with, vir-tually the entire spectrum of European and Afro-American classical musics. By all means write to the folks at GM for a free catalogue. . . If the criminally neglected, albeit supremely talented, pianist- composer SHIRLEY HORN doesn't break through to mass acceptance with her soon-to-be-issued You Don't Forget Me (Verve, c/o PolyGram, 825 Eighth Ave., New York 10019), then there's no hope for Western Civilization. Playing the piano and singing at the same time is no easy feat, but Horn pulls it off with winging aplomb, thanks to supple accompaniment from trio mates Charles Abeles (bass) and Steve Williams (drums). And then there are her soloists—a mainstream wet dream: Wynton and Bran-ford Marsalis, Buck Hill, Toot Thielemans and Miles Davis. Yes, Miles Davis—blowing mainstream trumpet for the first time in eons. You Won't Forget Me is a musthear. Come March, Horn is slated to make her RCA/Novus debut with a tribute to Sarah Vaughan and Carmen McRae,

Paul Ashby should get together with Iggy Pop and go on a nationwide "Rock The Vote" tour. They could dress in their best tweeds, gesturing grandly off train cabooses as volunteers circulate through the attendant throng, registering the multitude to vote for Alan Dershowitz or Nat Hentoff for President of the U.S.A. While there is certainly some sentimental appeal to his inverted Nixonian "silent majority" argument (that the majority of Americans share his views, and that if their rate of turnout at the polls could match that of their opponents, then these views would rule the land), I think the sad fact is that people who share Paul's (and my) views are probably already demonstrating a higher rate of voter turnout than our opponents. Then no matter how many of us leave work early on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, a numerically insignificant philosophical minority will never have "more control over the people in control." Especially when there is truly nobody to vote for. I'm not saying that there is no reason to vote. Voting is an exercise that is good for the individual in that it provides evidence that majorities are not unanimous. But let's not fall victim to "power to the people" intoxication, and pretend that voting actually provides anything as powerful as "control." And more importantly, let's not place too much stock in the will of majorities. If people would only care half as much about music and sports as they do about voting, this lesson would be self evident. Remember, Vanilla Ice is selling millions of records even as you read this, while Half Japanese may never sell 10,000. If one is to concede that his/her personal taste in music—however grounded it may be in common sense and taste—is ridiculously out of step with the majority, why not face the music when it comes to one's political views?

Quick! Jimmy D.! Name three songs off the new NEIL YOUNG record! Gotcha! Jimmy apparently believes that all of college radio was serviced with Ragged Glory. Hopefully, all of you who did not receive it until three weeks after its release (if at all) will take the time to whine to Jimmy, either on the phone or these pages. When Jimmy says Reprise's "contemporary music department's prime directive is to establish and develop NEW bands to the first logical level of visibility" I wonder just what the heck he means, since the Replacements (and Depeche Mode and the B-52s) have been pretty visible for quite a few years now, but apparently remain high priorities for his department. As far as Jimmy's intimidating "strongarm" (his word, not mine) techniques, I wonder about the tactless letter he sent to select stations telling them to report Depeche Mode so they would get the #1 record they so richly deserved. My last Dialogue about Reprise was perhaps a bit wordy; this is what was intended: A remarkable Neil Young record came out and it seems like Reprise's link to college radio didn't give a shit. TEENAGE RIOT IN CHICAGO

A mob scene that ended with a police raid and several arrests occurred immediately following a
Sonic Youth/Public Enemy gig at the Aragon Ballroom in Chicago on December 29, 1990 (see Live Wire for details of the show.) A group of people protesting military action in the Persian Gulf staged a demonstration which coincided with the show's end, but the large group of ple seemed to be too much for local law enforcement, who arrived on the scene in full force, with 50 to 100 police, according to Rich Menning of Atomic Records in Milwaukee. Eighteen people were arrested for yelling obscenities and inciting the crowd into mob action, and four people carrying video cameras, all of whom had permission to tape the gig, had their tapes ruined. Menning, one of the four video-tapers, had his camera confiscated and later returned badly damaged. Menning's case against the police with respect to his camera is likely to be taken on by the ACLU. Police said that the violence began when a group of protesters began throwing bottles and other objects into the street, though Menning and other witnesses said that it was the police's

mishandling of the crowd which incited the disturbance. Also of note: Chuck D again said, during the group's performance, that the show would be Public Enemy's last one ever.

TEENAGE RIOT, PART II

After the fire marshall shut down a show by **Bad Religion** at the Classic Theater in North Hollywood, CA, saying that the venue was overcrowded, a riot broke out during which over 300 concert-goers pulled up chairs bolted to the floor, set a small fire in a restroom, and broke windows and doors in neighboring buildings, causing an estimated \$20,000 damage. Four people were arrested for vandalism, and two police officers and several fans were injured. A Bad Religion gig scheduled for the Whiskey A-Go-Go for the next night was postponed until February 1, when the band will perform at the much larger Hollywood Palladium.

It has to do primarily with the fact that most of the MDs and PDs don't qualify even for record librarians, ignore too many facts about music or just about anything else, try to get jobs in the music industry by kissing ass to reps, and think that the record trades such as CMJ, Rockpool or Hard Report (to mention a few) are the key to new music. For the ones that are clueless musically but are willing to improve, the

best solution (and a good beginning) is to check out a few music fan-zines. We are so fortunate in this country to have more fanzines than loony asylums (no wonder all of you are out there loose writing CMJ Dialogues). Anyway, the point is that there are many 'zines covering alternative music, so don't limit your information by just reading music

They are irresponsible to their audience in the highest degree, and nothing seems to stand in front of their personal gain. Let alone the fact that they are so stupid to believe that just because they are the 50th MD to play this record they'll get a job at that label. Especially when they talk to college reps—usually people who don't hire or make any important decisions in the company. the company

Let me tell you, baby, the only way to get a job in the music industry is with hard and good work, competence, luck, and most importantly, by knowing the right person up there. I know so many people who got jobs without ever playing the stuff of the label that hired them. Without even being MDs or station management for chrissake.

Finally, for the ones who already play alternative stuff and seem to have a clue there is always room for improvement; no matter how extensive service you get, you should always go by the thought that there's got to be something out there, and it's your responsibility to discover it. Whether you will or not is a different story, but as long as you try you are bound to find a lot.

Live Wire

SONIC YOUTH/
PUBLIC ENEMY Aragon Ballroom, Chicago, December 29

While the concept of mixing rap and rock on one bill has been kicked around for some time (to no avail for the most part), someone somewhere finally made it happen. The show took place in the Aragon, an oasis of style in a necessarily seedy part of town. The huge ballroom shook to the jagged guitar excess of Sonic Youth, with the foursome pounding out a steady set (culled mainly from Goo and Day-dream Nation) that might have lacked in the usual longish feedback improvisations; but the band made up for it in spades with tight, focused wails of Lower East Side angst that seemed to translate well even to the North Side of Chicago. While many of the rap aficionados didn't seem to "get it," the more rambunctious youths in the audience were flail-ing themselves silly, though a few hundred seats were put in at the front to keep the slamming and stage-diving to a minimum. After an hour intermission, with beer bucket lids flying through the air from the castle-tower balconies (you had to be there), Public Enemy stormed the stage with Terminator X spinning a death-dirge rumble that segued nicely from the Sonic Youth set. Two \$1W soldiers came marching out and then Chuck D ran out, spit-ting out "Welcome To The Terrordome" with renewed fury. Halfway through the song, Flavor clocked in with a typically wacky outfit, a new head of mini-dreads and trademark "boyeeee"s. While the intensity of the music was at first matched by Chuck and Flav's energetic dancing, rapping and preaching, Chuck's mild flu got the best of him and things slowed down a bit in the middle. The inevitable anti-war rhetoric went over well with the crowd (later, an anti-war protest drew dozens of police cars to the area outside of the venue with a few arrests), but Chuck D's assertion that PE brought people of different races and backgrounds together, rather than separating them with racist precepts as propogated in the press, was the most convincing argument of the night—the mix in the audience was proof enough. PE's 90-minute

assault climaxed with a crazy concoction of "Brothers Gonna Work It Out," "Fight The Power," "911 Is A Joke" and "Don't Believe The Hype," with loads of improvisational raps. Many people might argue that the performance might have been watered down with long speeches, but there isn't a rock band leader around who could keep the atten-tion and backing of a crowd like Chuck and Flavor did that night. The SY/PE bill was only supposed to be a three-date experiment, but judging by the large audience and amazing show, the idea should spread quickly.

AZAILIA SNAIL/ KING MISSILE

Wetlands, New York City, January 2 Walking into the Wetlands, one sees where all of the politically correct New York flower children go. The entire club was filled with go. The entire club was filled with trippy lights and there was a decorated Volkswagon bus parked inside, doubling as a "Save The Earth" T-shirt vendor. A perfect setting for Azailia Snail's light, embracing, mystical songs that mix folk, country and feedback. Azailia Snail has an interesting combination of instruments: acoustic guitar; electric guitar, which was played much like a lap which was played much like a lap steel; and a wooden xylophone to keep rhythm. Then King Missile entered with a surprisingly rockin' set laced with the famed spokenword pieces of John S. Hall. Yes, they performed "Jesus Was Way Cool" and "Take Stuff From Work," which were quite enjoyable yet, these songs as perjoyable yet, these songs as per-formed live should be appreciated for the music as well as for the humor. In particular, the wild guitar work of Dave Rick and the heavy, bizarre keyboards/ bass of Chris Xefos transform the lyrics into complete pieces that are performed passionately, and most of all are fun. After the show, certain phrases seemed to ring through our ears, much like after listening to **Mystical Shit**: "My heart is like a flower/Just waiting for someone to come along and pollinate it," "You split my head open with a pick axe/But I love you" and "Rock and roll will never die...look at Guns N' Roses, need I say more?"


