



JAZZ PASSENGERS Live At The Knitting Factory (Knitting Factory Works, 47 E. Houston St., New York, NY 10012/212-219-3006)

If you took away the pastel cover art you'd swear that this CD belongs in the familiar orange and black cover of a reissue of an old Impulse! title from the late '60s, or a bold black and white sleeve from a classic Blue Note date—it shares that same feeling of timelessness and quality, and it's every darn bit as good. The music of the Jazz Passengers (previously hinted at on the live Knitting Factory compilations) explores whole new realms where others merely refine the map. While many jazz ensembles merely invoke or re-articulate the music of their predecessors, the Passengers continue to explore deeper and better-hidden corners of jazz, exploring each new area with boldness and confidence. Recorded in the intimate confines of the Knitting Factory, the Passengers are so confident and at home in front of the crowd that it manifests itself in bold, loose and superlative playing of the highest degree. The group sails the same improvisatory seas as Pharoah Sanders' classic '60s and early '70s ensembles, explores the same interstellar spaces as Sun Ra at his most extraterrestrial, yet is grounded in the realities of the strictest of modern jazz discipline. The Jazz Passengers have slowly and quietly become some of the boldest and brightest practitioners of modern jazz around.

G.W. McLENNAN Watershed (Beggars Banquet, c/o RCA, 1133 Ave. of the Americas, New York, NY 10036)

As half of the main songwriting team for the Go Betweens, G.W. McLennan established himself as a lyricist extraordinaire. As half of Jack Frost, with Steve Kilbey of The Church, he further established his poetic personality. Now, his first solo album graces us about a dozen years after we first heard his melodic blessings, and it is indeed grand, emotional and sweeping, with a melan-cholic sense of hope, humor and faith. McLennan's achingly heartfelt melodicism gives new standards to the term singer/songwriter—his vivid imagery is painted in such an easy and refined manner that the complexity of the music plays second fiddle to the sheer beauty and charm of the gently strummed tunes themselves. Set in a mostly minimalist acoustic setting, these songs radiate with direct passions aimed toward and shared with the listener, all with a wealth of irony, intelligence and understanding. Joined by Go-Between alum Amanda Brown on violin, oboe and some backing vocals, as well as a slew of familiar Australian musicians, **Watershed**, like former mate Robert Forster's solo outing earlier in the year, shows McLennan in perhaps the greatest songwriting form of his career, and hopefully the commercial success that eluded the Go-Betweens will happily find him now. Start with: the addictive "Easy Come, Easy Go," "When Word Gets Around," "Black Mule," "Haven't I Been A Fool" and "Sally's Revolution.

LEADERS OF THE NEW SCHOOL Future Without A Past... (Elektra, 75 Rockefeller Plaza, New York, NY 10019)

While some rap groups are busy sampling, cursing and boasting, Uniondale, Long (Strong) Island's Leaders Of The New School blazes a new hip-hop path built around education and fun, speaking out against ignorance while avoiding self-righteousness. Capturing an adolescent charm on songs centered around high school and hanging out, LONS uses its knowledge as wit and wisdom instead of merely following Afrocentric footsteps, offering a debut that is pure fun to listen to while still showing the much-needed importance of education. The group takes its soundbed from a wide variety of sources (swing, jazz, soul, reggae, rock and more), keeping the sound fresh as you don't find yourself naming that sample in three notes; the new-school rhymes showcase both freestyle jams and structured choruses with many voices adding to the loose at-mosphere. Led by the manic Charlie Brown (his yelps on "Case Of The P.T.A." were inspired by his pet parrot!), and sharing MC duties with Dinco D. and Busta Rhyme, the LONS lays down some fierce beats but never loses the playfulness in its rhymes. Songs like "Home Room" and "Lunch Time" take you back to those wonderful sounds of high school, while "Case Of The P.T.A." and "Teacher Don't Teach Us Nonsense" deal with the problems of the educational system. Also check out "Pinnochio Theory," "Sobb Story," "Trains, Planes And Automobiles" and "My Ding-A-Ling.

EASY Magic Seed (Blast First/Mute, c/o Elektra, 75 Rockefeller Plaza, New York, NY 10019)

Easy draws on the recent explosion of British pop bands, which all focus on the craft of the song in a '60s garage/pop vein, like the House Of Love, pre-''Loaded'' Primal Scream, etc. Easy has conjured up its fair share of jangle, sweet-boy vocals and irresistible hooks, so what makes them special? Aside from being Swedish rather than English, the band fashions songs of elegant structure and evocative depth. The vocals are never too sugary, the guitars never jangle like sleigh bells, and the lyrics escape that fey innocence emulated by so many bands. Though its music remains decidedly in the fold of English pop, Easy has no dreamy forays into cottony realms. Musically, Easy is more akin to the difficult pop of the Wedding Present, minus the Albini production. than any other English band, as its songs cover an array of emotions and sonic textures. Released last year in the U.K., the Easy debut album Magic Seed has finally been planted on American soil, so start your garden with these: "He Brings The Honey," "Cloud Chamber," "Sunny Day," "Between John & Yoko" and "#25."

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

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MOVING TARGETS Fall (Taang!, P.O. Box 51, Auburndale, MA 02166/617-876-2411)—With their third LP in 10 years, scene icons Moving Targets are down to one original member (guitarist Kenny Chambers) and now rival Yes, or at least the Lemonheads, for their ratio of tumultuous lineup changes to recorded output—said shifts having little definitive impact on the "progression" of the band's sound. The Targets' new fourman band uses the same modus operandi that has had people fussing about their Burma/Huskers similarity when the latter was still a hardcore band—windmilling guitars grumble and tilt at slick postmodern rock and cynical rock geriatrics alike, vocals ringing through just as raffish and rumpled. While the mountains of guitar crunch and skyward melodies are old hat by now Chambers simply has more gutstrings tied to his guitar than other emo-rousers, and he isn't afraid to write darn pretty solos,

with long, high notes on tiptoe. Some songs like "Can You Blame Me?" and "Overated" reach uncliched peaks of punk-rock emotion, choppy riffs loosening into inspirational stanzas and urging us to lose our dignity and air-guitar along. Ardently oldfashioned and guilelessly writing punk hymns to save the world, the Targets write new classics ("Fumble," "Fake [t") rather than build upon old ones, and they're just as commanding in their fuzzy furor as they were in 1986.



BARKMARKET Vegas Throat (Triple X, P.O. Box 862529, Los Angeles, CA 90086-2529/213-221-2204)—As






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


eminently believable. Good reason to cringe: Sardy's dismissive, spastic yelp repeated at the end of "Pencil"—"All I get from you is a reason to leave." It's delivered without his mouth; Sardy's all throat. **Vegas Throat**, he brags. The throat and the band have grown in leaps. Last year's **The Easy Listening Record** was a ballsy, overlooked blast, taking all sorts of risks, as the band occasionally struggled to keep up with its forays into dance beats and the blues. But this time around, Barkmarket opted for a more consistent approach, perhaps echoing Big Black a bit, but finally realizing a noise all their own. Sardy's wit cuts, and it's particularly own. Sardy's wit cuts, and it's particularly nasty when Mark Ribot adds lead guitar and Syd Straw screams along on "The Patsy." Start there, but don't miss the singsongy "Poverty," a ridiculous cover of the O'Jays' 70s soul gem "Back Stabbers" or the perfect "Grinder." If Sardy's ire gets hard to swallow, don't fear, because his throat will shove the songs down yours.

IVO PAPASOV AND HIS ORCHES-TRA Balkanology (Hannibal, c/a Rykodisc, Pickering Wharf, Bldg. C-3G, Salem, MA 01970/508-744-7678)—Sure, it's a little bit of a specialist taste—Balkan wedding music ain't exactly a household commodity here, at least last time we flipped through the bins at J&R Music World. So you may not have heard of tvo Papasov, the bearded madman of the Balkans, undisputed jigmaster supreme,



the Coltrane of the kopanitsa, the king of the clarinet. Folks have been heeding his Pied Piper call for close to 30 years, and he's been virtually unchallenged since the '70s as Bulgaria's most in-demand musician. Bulgarian wedding music (the term describes a whole genre, not just the place it's played) is sort of a Balkan equivalent to rai, zydeco or even rock 'n roll—it's electric, high-energy music made for dancing, and almost exclusively the domain of young people on festive occasions. And while this music isn't just played at nuptials, you still kinda have to wonder about **Balkanology**'s June release date—one of the shrewder marketing moves of this or any summer.
You may kiss the bride: "Ivo's Ruchenitsa,"
"Mominsko Horo" or the Bulgarian ska
beats of "Mladeshki Dance."



GARY PANTER/JAY COTTON One Hell Soundwich/RAYMOND PETTIBON AND SUPER SESSION Torches & Soundtracks (Blast First, 262 Mott St., Room 324, New York, NY 10012/212-941-9560)— These are the two latest volumes in the visual artist/picture-disc series—both feature the artists' own compositions exclusively, which are vaguely in the rock realm, and while gatefolds are not in order this time, the color booklets are as worthy of perusal as the music itself. While the Panter/Cotton record allots one side to each artist, there's

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
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


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sive, pranks-prone Phil Milstein, from the big-band swing of "Let's Make Lust" to the chipmunks singing "God Save The Queen" chipmunks singing "God Save The Queen" to the four-part insomniac symphony "Durchfall Frum Der Colahaus," a profile emerges of a compulsive, nutty, tapefiddling inventor. Panter's five tunes rattle down worm trails between Devo and Renaldo And The Loaf, the vintage early '80s electronic warpedness of "Fountain" and "Tornado To The Tater" unsurprising considering the status of helper Phil Culp as president of the Residents fan club (the Residents themselves assist on the latter track). Pettibon, who's been associated with the hipster extremist clique since the scene's the hipster extremist clique since the scene's initial squawkings, demonstrates in his booklet why this decade-long trendiness has little contaminatory effect on viewing his work. Logically enough, the Super Session goes knocking about icons in a raucously dissonant fashion, Pettibon's vocals complementing outright S. Youthisms ("Mr. Wagstaff"), hilarious time-capsule observations ("Losers, Boozers, Heroes," "Grace Jam") and an elegant interpretation of Coltrane's "Love Supreme."




GREG OSBY Man-Talk For Moderns Vol. X (Blue Note, c/o Capital, 1750 N. Vine St., Hollywood, CA 90028)—If you haven't familiarized yourself with the music and the alto saxophone playing of Greg Osby, move on it fast. This talented young alto turk delivers a program ranging from the in-your-face funky stew of "Cad'Lack Back" and "Man-Talk" (featured on **Certain Damage**

Vol. 35) to buoyant ballads "Like So... Man-Talk For Moderns Vol. X contains some hefty powerplay by Osby and bassist Lonnie Plaxico, percussionist Steve Moss and the depth and eloquence of pianist Ed Simon. This renegade and fierce ensemble is able to bridge the gap of radio-ready and adventurous tunes with tons of flow and coherent development "Black Moon," an homage to pianist Geri Allen, features some inspired flute-playing by another young giant, Gary Thomas. The closer, "2th (Twooth)," is probably the most devilish of all the tunes, an ultra-funky crazed-tempo composition, where Osby weaves and tumbles his deceptively ami-cable horn sound to full effect. Man-Talk For Moderns Vol. X is a refreshing and most welcome alternative in jazz today.



HAMMERBOX Hammerbox (C/Z, 1407 E. Madison #41, Seattle, WA 98122/206-441-0875)-For the muchvaunted debut from this Seattle four-piece, it's evident from the first swooping guitar chord that while they most assuredly rock, they do so in a fashion distinctly more refined, and less '60s garage-inclined, than their photogenically tressed brethren and sistren. The booming, well-projected front presence belongs to the hard-to-miss vocals of Carrie Alre, and it's evident that her of Carrie Akre, and it's evident that her furiously belted emotings are the heart and soul of the band. Her range is unfurled in all its glory on practically every cut, putting more dramatic intonation into every verse than most singers do to the National Anthem. The band takes a coolly sophisticated

approach to tension-and-release bombastics, sometimes building subtly like Springhouse, sometimes erecting stately atmosheres a la Echo & The Bunnymen, and more often emulating Das Damen's rapidly shifting structures and the crashing-through of Fugazi. While some of the songs strive too high for the band's still-growing sense of dynamics and restraint, "Bred," "Ask Why" and "Voice" reverberate with starkly commanding musicianship and pulse-livening songwriting.

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
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

C&W lament (Anne Richmond Boston's "Speed Of Sound"). About the only linking of the tracks are the upside-down perceptiveness and playfulness of the lyrics—a somber treatment simply isn't possible when reciting "Flying mammal bat/Seldom if ever walk/Never wore a hat/Have hoarse squak [sic]." The happiest marriages of music and lyric-are when the group replicates the same wonder and tickled contentment fundamental in every word Brookings penned.



HEAD CANDY Starcaster (Link, 121 W. 27th St., Suite 401, New York, NY 10001/212-924-2929)—lowa has long been a fertile breeding ground for driving pop bands. With guitarists Mike Sangster and Doug Roberson coming from two such bands, the Hollowmen and the Dangtrippers respectively, Head Candy is poised to carry on the tradition. Sangster's vocals oscillate between an uneasy tension and a mellow smoothness in much the same way that Head Candy's songs reflect both a world-weary callousness and a vulnerable sweetness. Witness the brash groove of the opening cut "Soul Grinder" segued into catchy riffs embedded in "In The Night Kitchen." Starcaster's uncomplicated production gives it an even mesh, comprised of grinding guitars and fuzzy vocals vibrating over a firm rhythm section. Every sound falls neatly into place without being jelled into a sticky gloss, creating a stead-fast sound throughout. Start with the aforementioned two cuts, and move along to the

frail melodies and lyrics of "Part Of The Earth," the sinister jangle of "Watching The Sun's Trail," the jagged melodies of "Rocket Transfer Warehouse" and the delicate instrumental "Invitation To A Beheading."

SON SEALS Living In The Danger Zone (Alligator, P.O. Box 60234, Chicago, IL 60660/312-973-7736)—Son Seals plays the blues with surety and authenticity, and Living In The Danger Zone is one of those ever-rarer commodities, the solid and good-rockin' blues album that holds its weight even in the imposing shadow of the last 50 years of recorded history in the genre. His powerful, pinching guitar lines can sting like a scornful remark or sweet talk like an apologetic lover, running the gamut of blues emotions without ever falling into the twin pitfalls of overused cliches or feigned sincerity. Sometimes Seals peppers up the blues with humor




and saucy sax lines ("Frigidaire Woman"), jovial organ fills (courtesy of Sid Wingfield) or a soulfully Stax-ish rhythm section. Still, however far he may roam, Son Seals always comes back to the basics to let us know he's got the blues, and got 'em bad, like on "Arkansas Woman" and the majestic gospel of "My Life," featuring moaning harmonica from Sugar Blue.




VARIOUS ARTISTS Knitting Factory Tours Europe 1991 (Knitting Fac-tory Works, 47 E. Houston St., New York, NY 10012/212-219-3006)—In the wake of their Live At The **Knitting Factory** series on A&M, the tiny celebrated club on Houston Street has expanded its parameters still further, by putting together package tours of prominent Factory performers, and recording the results digitally as they tour America and Europe. The photo of grueling U.S. Army training on the cover pretty much personifies what life on the road in Europe can be to an unsigned, unknown American band, but thanks to these Knitting Factory package tours, it's a lot easier for these bands and performers to get much-needed ex-posure in front of forward thinking, adven-turous European jazz audiences. That these edge artists like James "Blood" Ulmer or Gary Lucas are so well-received in Europe while still struggling in obscurity over here is just another disheartening reflection on our sad state of musical affairs; but to start us on the road toward doing something about it, try playing the seldom-recorded Ulmer's excellent tracks (has he ever put on a bad performance?), Samm Bennett and Chunk, Gary Lucas' solo guitar rantings (especially recommended) or the Thomas Chapin Trio.

ROBIN EUBANKS Karma (JMT, c/o PolyGram, 825 Eighth Ave., New York, NY 10019)—On his new release







for the German-based JMT label, Robin Eubanks interweaves his torrentially funky and circuitous trombone signature into a varied spectrum of styles. **Karma** starts off with a rap attack from Eubanks himself. plus stellar assistance/contribution from M-Basers Greg Osby (alto), Lonnie Plaxico (electric bass), "Smitty" Smith (drums) and brother Kevin Eubanks (guitar). A cast of musicians of this caliber (Branford Marsalis, Cassandra Wilson and Dave Holland are also featured in Karma) is pretty much a stylistic statement in itself. Exploring a wide scope of musical statements, Robin Eubanks seems never to lose sight of musicality. His attempt is most successful, and the show-ofhands from his friends makes this a joyful occasion. On "Maybe Next Time," probably the album's most melodic statement, you'll find some enchanting playing by bassist Dave Holland and the tasteful percussive work of Mino Cinelu. Robin Eubanks' seductive and swooning playing demands to be heard and stands as a promise of even greater things to come.



MICHAEL McDERMOTT 620 W. Surf (Giant, c/o Reprise, 3300 Warner Blvd., Burbank, CA 91505)—Michael McDermott is writing songs for an era that didn't grow up in the '50s, but certainly watched all of its reruns when they were in high school—the generation that is slowly waking out of its sleepyheaded views of the world. (Place comparison to the early '60s here.) McDermott's songs are literate and, at his best, he sounds like a well-polished, early Springsteen and an articulate early Dylan. Dylan's influence is also felt in McDermott's pension for folksy harmonica and the symbolism and storytelling in his lyrics. McDermott's flexible voice ranges from the whispering of "Death In The Autumn Air" to the roar of the second half of "Mr. Simmons" Arkansas Christmas Blues." Though the dreadful cover makes him look like an antiseptic new-age guitar player, his songs are certainly much more than dinner music. McDermott is a bold, poetic, political writer. Wake up to: "A Wall I Must Climb," "Shadow Of The Capitol," "Trembling Hour" and the 10-minute "Your Silence I Will Always Admire For Its Being."



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
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
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

VARIOUS ARTISTS Love & Napalm Vol. 2 (Trance Syndicate, P.O. Box 49771, Austin, TX 78765/512-454-3265)—This is the second edition of a series that is blasting this label and the Texas noise rock scene into orbit, crackling with fireworks for all to view. First, Drain implodes like the Bastards stringing bondage gear on Ofra Haza and forcing her to sing songs of worship to a satanic insect cult. The installment from the Pain Teens furthers their steps away from tape-loops and noise, as they get down to some major rockin' similar to their L&N Vol. 1 installment. Crust pushes its sonic dissonance and pathological reflections into your tear ducts, and Ed Hall flows out of your pores. Now you too can discover the definition of grimypop (grim'-ee-pawhp).



BILL DIREEN AND THE BUILDERS
"Alien" (7") (Hecuba, P.O. Box
16411, San Francisco, CA 94116)—
Bill Direen has released several fine albums,

has been to the U.S. twice, and has had about as much attention in his whole career as one of the Chills' more obscure ex-bass players. Anyhoo, "Alien" is both creepy and sympathetic, with one foot dragging on the beat, '50s sci-fi organ (by Chris Knox, who's also on backing vocal) and a high-frequency keening vocal that gets more demented as the guitars come crashing in to take Mr. Direen away. "Skulls" also has to take Mr. Direen away. "Skulls" also has a fine grasp of adorable NZ melodies, key

boards that remind us of the Crazy World Of Arthur Brown and an off-the-rocker sensibility to keep the suspense flowing.



VERTIGO "Rub" (7") (Amphetamine Reptile, 2541 Nicollet Ave. S., Minneapolis, MN 55404/612-**872-0646)**—Manly mayhem from some of MinneNoPlace's least subdued; four songs rock on a pretty steady '78 punk beat, but this measure of restraint doesn't stay a) the vocals from having a tone of soon-to-be-exacted revenge, b) the guitar going on a hellride as madcap as, say, mid-period Meatmen and c) a general distaste for togetherness, with a subsequent adrenaline buzz from such early punk artifacts of the **Where Birdmen Flew** or **S.F. Underground** comps. "Rub" and "Murder By Guitar" especially are hearty, straightforward bashings, with brevity the better part of besteries. better part of brutality.

H.P. ZINKER The Sunshine CD (EP) (Roughneck, clo Fire, P.O. Box 800, Rockville Centre, NY 11571-0800/516-764-6200)—H.P. Zinker, the one-part American, two-parts Austrian powerhaus performs a slight re-rendering of what was already a mighty cut from their LP, Beyand It All, comphing it up with a Hammond organ for that Sabbath touch, and besides an actually credible, somewhat

Page-y cover of Dave Brubeck's ''Take Five,'' they include two B-sides from their old single, "I Don't Know What's Going On."

VARIOUS ARTISTS Dope-Guns-'N'-Fucking In The Streets Volume Six (7" EP) (Amphetamine Reptile, 2541 Nicollet Ave. S., Minneapolis, MN 55404/612-872-0646)—From the AmRep Who's Who of what's turgid and tumultuous among indie rock's heavier set, this volume features red-needled rampage in its larval form—most of these bands have only one previous single to their name, and one none at all. Highest score in the kamikaze amplifier sweeps goes to Casus Belli, whose "Telemarketing" has the surging, cathartic power and brute random destructiveness of the Merrill Lynch bull mowing down ticker-tape-heads on Wall Street. Jonestown is also a gnashing maw of intemperance and inchaote structure on "Short Time Left," with Hammerhead's "Gremlin Stomp" an instrumental rough going down a rocky and painful hillside.

ED HALL ''Deth'' (7'') (Trance Syndicate, P.O. Box 49771, Austin, TX **78765/512-454-3265)**—Once upon a time, everyone was really into long hair, long tongues, loud guitars and stepping on baby chicks (or at least the concept of that kind of stage theatrics)—a time called the '70s. People who were then rocking to Simmons at the Coliseum have now become big rock stars, like the members of Ed Hall. The title track strikes at the ever-encompassing influence of Kiss' "Beth," and "Witless Tilt" smashes a bass-heavy pounding, with deadpan execution and metallic guitar.

TOHO-EHIO "Uglify" (7") (Rat Lady, c/o Trance Syndicate, P.O. Box 49771, Austin, TX 78765/512-454-3265)—Toho-Ehio is a brand new malevolent creator from Houston, named after the director of the Godzilla movies, of course. The band doesn't fare too well on its somewhat tame B-side, but the A is a force of electromagnetic rhythm and a Sisyphean avalanche of guitar, the whole song swaying its huge fuzzy bulk back and forth in a kind of deep slow-metal trance

Kane/Lush/Meat Whiplash etc. dissonant whitewash, flawlessly formulaic and disdaining any sonic strategy that hasn't originated from Old Blighty in the past five years. This MD foursome's first demo merits a wave of the bonnet merely by their neat and tidy facsimile of a half-dozen Brit noisepop in-novators. Black Tambourine's rolling waves of bass, their exquisite, feathery layers of feedback chime and chomp, and Pam's blase, tra-la-la girly vocals, make no individual variation from the sturdy original recipe. "Waft" is the term that wraps them up wholesale, duplicating the angel-food atmosphere, and just a pack of musical Betty Crockers, their songs turn out per-fectly pleasurable every time. For a debut effort, the band is precociously skilled in the art of studio enhancements, creating an aura of heaven and hell on "Black Car,"
"We Can't Be Friends," "By Tommorrow"
and their cover of Love's "Can't Explain."

Yeah, we readily admit we've got a soft spot in our Futures hearts for radio station compilations, and **Norfolk '91** is no exception (c/o WODU, Room 200, Webb

Center, Old Dominion University, Norfolk, VA 23529/904-683-3441). Though suffering slightly from being on the low-fi end, enough of the music gets through to justify the rather grainy spots: There's funky/

thrashy Ant Man Bee, the grunge duo Nipple and a dozen other unsigned hopefuls. Unfortunately, Norfolk seems to suffer the fate of too many scenes out there—too much emulation and not enough innova-tion. It seems that every town has its resident Siouxsie band, a resident U2, Chili Peppers, etc., and far too few bands ac-tually generating real creativity. Which of these bands will outgrow their youthful fixa-tions is anybody's guess, but keep your eyes on Norfolk as a budding music mecca not to be overlooked... Possibly the weirdest thing heard on this page since Sonic Mandala or Snow Bud And The Flower People (quite heady praise indeed), YELLOW TANG is a three-piece improviation. isational outfit from New York (110 Suffolk St., New York, NY 10002) making the strangest, most challenging sounds we've heard in eons—and believe us, that's quite a compliment coming from these jaded sets of ears. A skewed crossbreeding between Primus, Borbetomagus, Jandek and John Zorn's Naked City, its freeform, rambling spew makes most of the Knitting Factory's wildest, most out-there stuff seem positively tame. Play this at high volume, and you may lose your center of gravity, your sense of time and your sense of self—but if you like to be challenged at every twist and turn, you certainly won't lose interest.

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

Greatest Upward Chart Movement





Billions And Billions Served: We hope all you New Music Seminar Bazaar people make it by the lovely CMJ booth to say hi, howahya. To all the college radio geeks who are going because they think they'll score a job there: Get a life! You're better off waiting tables somewhere; the pay is better and there's no payola.

Sioux City: For the second consecutive week, Siouxsie & The Banshees holds down the top spot, this time by a larger margin over Primus. Siouxsie scores #1s in all the regions, making her the third artist to pull off that trick this year (Charlatans UK did it February 1 and R.E.M. on April 5). She also has a stranglehold on both the Audience Response chart (almost 2-1 margin over #2 Primus) and the Top Cuts (almost 4-1 margin over #2 Anthrax). Expect a long stay at the top for she and the 'Shees. Otherwise, things are relatively quiet near the top with Primus and Fishbone holding down 2 and 3, with Chapterhouse (10-4; #5 Adventure Pick) and Smashing Pumpkins (7-5; #3 South and West) joining the Top 5. Electronic finally cracks the Top 10 (11-10), and look for House Of Love (19-12), My Life With The Thrill Kill Kult (25-14; see below) and perhaps De La Soul or Anthrax to go Top 10 soon.

WHY ARE THESE GREAT RECORDS PEAKING?: Pere Ubu (16-16), Richard Thompson (24-23), Young Fresh Fellows (23-21), The KLF (26-31) and Codeine (43-49) all deserve better fates. Do something about it.

Fitting Debut: Arista scores the #1 Breakthrough with New Zealand's **Straitjacket Fits** (#50 debut), which also grabs the #2 Adventure Pick behind London-PLG's **Meat Puppets** single. Other death-defying debuts include Atlantic's **Fat Lady Sings** (#53), Capitol's **Crowded House** (#63) and **Bonnie Raitt** (#99), CORE's **Jet Black Factory** (#101) and Homestead's **Daniel Johnston** (#116) and **Love Child** (#123).



News From A Loud World



Now here's a band we'd like to see: ke-T and Body Count guitorist Ernie C doin' da hang with % of Slayer at the L.A. "Clash Of The Titans" show.

YOU GODDAMN KIDS!

In an alarming repeat of a scene in the same building almost three years earlier, on June 28th, Slayer fans once again laid waste to the Madison Square Garden building in New York City. Unruly fans rushed the stage, destroyed dozens of seats and clashed with building security during perhaps the scariest set from a heavy metal band we've had the pleasure to witnessduring "Seasons In The Abyss," no less than six seat cushions were airborne at any given moment, and fireworks were exploding approximately every fifteen seconds. Following that song, security threatened to end the show, but vocalist Tom Araya gave the crowd a long lecture—"You guys learned nothing from the Felt Forum, you're only ruining it for yourselves, -that at least put a leash on the firework fanatics. Earlier sets from Alice In Chains and Megadeth passed without serious incident, although Chuck D. and Flavor Flav of Public Enemy joined Anthrax onstage for "Bring The Noise." In September, 1988, Slayer headlined the Felt Forum (downstairs from the Garden proper) and were forced to cut their set short due to similar audience behaviour—fireworks, a veritable hailstorm of seat cushions (some of which were on firel), and damage to the ceiling. Anyone out for similar fun at Slayer shows should note: A) The band-not the promoter or the record company or the venue—has to pay for all damages, and B) Slayer is running out of places to play.

PERCY DON'T PLAY DAT

Scotching rumors of a Led Zeppelin reunion concert to be held at Giants

Stadium in New Jersey, guitarist Jimmy Page said, "John Paul Jones and I have been asking Robert (Plant) to consider a tour for some time now, but he's adamant that he won't do it. Yes, I'd like to do a Zeppelin tour; so would Jonesy. But obviously, without Robert it won't happen." What will happen is the previously reported, yet-unnamed collaboration between Page and former Whitesnake vocalist David Coverdale (one rumor names Jones and Jason Bonham as the band's rhythm section; another pegs Heart/ex-Montrose drummer Denny Carmassi and Bad English bassist Richie Phillips). The band is slated to enter the studio by the end of this summer to begin work on an album scheduled for spring release, with a tour to follow next summer the outfit reportedly will be performing old Zeppelin songs. One Geffen exec told the LA. Times, "David Coverdale is an improvement on Robert Plant. Once you hear him do a Led Zeppelin song [Haven't we already?-ed.], there won't be any debate about it." ARGHIII is incredulous, to say the very least...

BLACKY BLASTS OFF

Following the completion of their forthcoming LP, Angel Rat, Voivod bassist Jean-Yves "Blacky" Theriault left the band. The split was amicable; the band will replace him for touring purposes only (with a fellow Quebequois, no doubt), and guitarist Piggy will handle future basswork in the studio.

BUM RUSH THE GUNS

Guns N' Roses, America's most newsworthy band, continues to keep their press agents hard at

work as their tour winds its wasted way across the land. At the Nassau Coliseum in Long Island, the band went onstage almost two and a half hours after Skid Row's opening set, and then Axl proceeded to harangue the band's record company, Coliseum security, several publications and reporters and even some of the audience: "How many of you bought 'November Rain' on bootleg? Well, fuck you too! You're not supposed to have that yet!" Axl blamed his tardiness on a Rolling Stone photo shoot (which it turned out was actually completed the night before), altho' rumor had it that he had a serious case of stage fright. Later, in Charlotte, NC on June 23rd, he said "This'll be the last Guns N' Roses show you'll ever see," but two nights later the band played the longest set of the tour in Greensborol And in Baltimore, Axl jumped into the crowd in the middle of "Civil War," to "defend" an audience member who was reportedly being roughed up by a security guard. The band also demanded the withdrawal of the latest edition of the Hard N' Heavy

two albums. Black left the band before they signed with PolyGram, but the Guns recorded the songs evidently without acknowledging his contribution. Black is currently fronting a band called Black Cherry.

POISON SQUELCHES SPLIT RUMORS

Amid rumors of inter-band fistfights and split rumors, Poison cancelled the remainder of their tour after bassist Bobby Dahl broke his hand, reportedly by accidentally slamming it in a car door-"You would figure after eleven and a half months of raising hell and trashing around onstage, I could have found a more dramatic way to break my hand," he said. Although many figured it was another fistfight, vocalist Brett Michaels said, "After a year of being on the road, I'd be lying to say there have not been a few scuffles here and there among the band members. Listen, we all have our occasional run-ins, but everyone in this band has been friends for a long time—and we plan to stay that way. We've been out on the road for eleven months,

video magazine, which featured 25 minutes of live Guns footage filmed at the Rock In Rio festival earlier this year, including two songs from the new LP, which is scheduled for an August 20th release.

BUM RUSH THE OTHER GUNS

Former L.A. Guns member Paul Black has won considerable back royalties from the band after successfully claiming his songwriting contribution to eight songs included on the band's first so we're going to take a break and come back next summer."

GET WELL SOON, ERIC

Best recovery wishes to Kiss drummer Eric Carr, who is currently undergoing chemotherapy treatments at a cancer institute in New York City. Carr will appear in Kiss' video for "God Gave Rock N' Roll To You," from Bill & Ted's Bogus Journey, and will take part in the recording of the band's next LP

OH YEAH! GUESS WHAT...

On June 8th, a couple got married at the "Clash Of The Titans" show at the Five Seasons Center in Cedar Rapids, IA. The ceremony was broadcast over the house P.A. and was slotted third on the bill, between Anthrax and Megadeth... Napalm Death drummer Mick Harris is sitting out the band's stint on the "New Titans On The Block" tour, since his girlfriend is in the family way (congrats!) and he completed a three-month U.S. tour with the band only last month. He's replaced for the tour by Danny Herrera, a friend of N.D. guitarist Jesse Pintado... Miami's Saigon Kick were removed from the opening slot of the King's X tour after an incident at a show in Philadelphia on June 16th, where an early closing time forced both bands to perform shortened sets. Reportedly, the Kick tried to sneak two extra songs into set; King's X's tour manager allowed one song but pulled the plug on the second, and was physically threatened by members of Saigon Kick and their crew. (Reports of Kick singer Matt

Kramer exposing himself onstage may have played a role as well.) King's X is continuing the tour with The Lost in support... The insane cover artwork on the Skid Row album was painted by none other than David Bierk-Sebastian Bach's dadl Also, Sebastian has formed his own production company called Get Off My Bach, whose first signing is the Brood... Epic will finally be releasing the two Japan-only Quiet Riot albums that feature legendary guitarist Randy Rhoads. The albums were recorded in the mid-'70s and have never been widely available Stateside... Enuff Z'nuff and Nelson are touring together, and reportedly both bands are closing their sets with a cover of Cheap Trick's "Surrender"... After a typically brutal three-hour set from Wrathchild America, Baltimore club Hammerjack's reportedly has submitted a video tape of the show to the U.S. Olympic Committee as a petition to include stage diving as an officially sanctioned Olympic sport!... Shortly after the band's European tour, White Lion bassist James Lomenzo and drummer Greg D'Angelo left the band—the two reportedly plan to stay together, and W.L. vocalist Mike Tramp and guitarist Vito Bratta plan to find replacements soon...The Throbs are no longer with DGC Records... Watch for The Scream, featuring former Racer X bassist John Alderelti and guitarist Bruce Bourillet, due on Hollywood Records on July 23rd... Blood Feast are writing material for their next LP, tentatively titled Dead Children Sing. They plan to record at Morrisound with Scott Burns... U.F.O. has reformed yet again, this time featuring original members Phil Mogg and Pete Way with ex-Grand Slam guitarist Laurence Archer and ex-Wild Horses drum-mer Clive Edwards. The band is currently recording a new LP with producer Kit Woolven... Sacred Reich's new single includes a cover of Fear's "Let's Have A War" and a new original-watch for it soon on Hollywood... The Rollins Band, currently on the "Lollapalooza" tour, has signed with Imago and plan to release an album in January... Tesla has completed their new LP. Psychotic Supper, which is due in stores on September 10th and is said to be "extremely heavy" .. Thunder replaces Extreme on the David Lee Roth/Cinderella tour on July 31 ... To the surprise of almost no one, Sabbat has broken up... Finally, the Red Hot Chili Peppers have this to say about their new album: "We are here to make a record for anyone of those not so bugged by the crazy barrage of the communications of nothing that they can still hear. E'VE BEEN TOGETHER FOR about five years, two months, five days, six hours and four minutes. We're from Eureka in Northern California "

What's Eureka like?

"The smell of broccoli," Mr. Bungle drummer Danny Heifetz answers without missing a beat. "There's pulp mills there that smell like broccoli. I'm not the best one to ask about this because I've only lived there for five years, but one out every six people that lives there are complete zombie freaks who never sleep. They just walk around all night—it's an unexplained phenomenon. It's just in peoples' blood, they just do it, they can't help it. I don't think they really like it. They don't seem to enjoy it."

Uh, where is Eureka, exactly?

"It's six miles south of Alaska, 300 miles north of San Francisco...

Downtown Eureka actually is exactly the same latitude as the Statue

Of Liberty. That's no joke, 'cause in Arcada, which is the town I used
to live in, my street was the same latitude as 185th Street, and Eureka
is just a couple of miles south of there. And that's no fib."

As you can see, answers don't come easy in the world of Mr. Bungle, but their witty imagination is as limitless as the world of influences dabbled on their Warner Bros. debut LP, and thus makes for an entertaining and enlightening conversation regardless. Mr. Bungle—also featuring vocalist Vlad Dracula (a.k.a Mike Patton), bassist Trevor Dunn, guitarist Trey Spruance, alto saxist Theo Lengyel and tenor saxist/keyboardist Bear McKinnon—formed in the aforementioned broccoli fumage as a speed-metalcore outfit before evolving through "an attempted ska phase and a bunch of other hoaxes to our present and current hoax stage." The band released a series of demos—most notably 1989's OU818—before Vlad temporarily left to do an album and a tour with Faith No More that surprised everyone by going platinum and consuming the better part of two years.

Asked exactly what a band does when its singer is also a full-time member of a fully-occupied band, Danny replied, "Get a job, do volunteer work for the lumberjack society. Pretty much, we used that time to write—it didn't really put us in a fix or anything. We did have to wait, but we've had the last six months or so to work on the

record. As far as the tour goes, that may be a little different—I'm sure we'll get a tour, but it's not going to be one of those body-draining tours, it'll probably be short. It'll be good for us, and we won't kill ourselves. In the time off, we tend to take a long time writing and we already came up with some other things. Not complete songs, but like a pile of riffs in the kitchen that we'll pull out, piece together and throw away."

Vlad returned this year with a major label contract in one hand and mad jazz scientist John Zorn in the other, allowing Bungle to record an album that makes The Real Thing—and most other Western forms of music, for that matter—s

Western forms of music, for that matter—seem commercial. Their Zorn-mixed self-titled debut is a juvenile trip into classic Americana (complete with a three-ring psycho circus and Chester the molester pomography) that jumps from grungecore to cartoon funk to avant-jazz in a brilliantly arranged stylistic hailstorm. Yet for all the insanity, the band holds the songs in check with arrangements that hit as much on the mark as the crystal-clear production.

And it sounds nothing like Faith No More. In fact, anyone making a connection between the two would cause the Bungle boyz to "break down in tears," Danny sobs, modestly describing the album as "unbelievably great" and "the best damn thing I ever smelled. It's kind of like an old laundromat that's been closed down for about four years and was tumed into an aquarium."

Something that smells that sweet and foul doesn't come as easy as Danny might lead on. What influences might inhabit this sonic swill? "I don't know what everyone else's are... We all pretty much have our own influences. I'm not going to answer that. Personally, I don't really have any."

So you don't listen to any music.



"No."
Why?
"Actually I listen to a lot, but I quickly forget it."
Why?

The drummer crumbles like a stale cookie under a fat cop's heel. "It's not my fault! I can't help it! Why you gotta hassle me, man?! Personally, I'd have to

say Cambodian muzak is probably my favorite next to New Mexican funk, which isn't actually funk music at all. It's mostly orchestrations.

"We have that Eureka sound. Pretty much, the band writes the material together. Usually somebody will come in with an idea, riffs or whatever, and we'll manipulate the crap out of it, blindfold and gag the one who came up with it, and steal the song. Actually, whoever ended up not writing the song ended up writing the song, while the original composer lies tied, gagged and choking for air in the comer... But he usually appreciates

it in the end."

I don't know whether or not anyone would appreciate that kind of treatment, or even if that remotely answers where their bizzare concepts come from, but one thing is clear: through all the manic chaos, Mr. Bungle jells into its own complete entity. While most of this can be attributed to an extremely tight band with a clear focus on what they want to accomplish, part of the credit must go to Zorn, whose multi-flavored jazzcore band/project, Naked City, inhabits the same side of the brain as Bungle.

"He's the seventh member," Danny elates about working with Zorn. "He's amazing. He was there for the mix-down and the mastering; he wasn't there for the recording, but we were constantly on the phone with him and we'd send him rough mixes and he would give us ideas. It was nice having a real musician who understood what we wanted to do; he gave us room and he didn't pull any executive crap on us like 'This really wouldn't work with a commercial crowd.' He's not minded that way."

So how do you feel about being on Warner Bros.?

"Man, me and Bugs together!" chuckles Danny. "It's great! Now

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

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

MORBID ANGEL Blessed Are The Sick (Earache-Relativity, 187-07 Henderson Ave., Hollis, NY 11423/718-217-3600)—If there was ever a band that deserved to be locked away in a padded cell, I'd say Morbid Angel would beat 'um to the door and swallow the key. With their '89 debut, this Florida-based band abolished speed rules and (lyrically) crushed the holy priest with enough vengeance to make Venom look like Catholic school girls, but structured all their chaotic noise into the first Earache release that could be interpreted by the average Joe Metal. Here, Morbid Angel have established themselves as the ultimate evil band, and while that alone doesn't qualify any band for a Grammy, they ply their craft with more conviction than any other band currently defiling sacred grounds. While the second half of this album contains mostly classic material from their aborted Abominations LP and their Thy Kingdom Come demo, side one shows the progression of the band, and especially the vocal improvements of David Vincent. While the speedy stuff got this band to where they are today, surprisingly enough, the slow, grindish work is just as—if not more—effective. However, this natural progression isn't too far removed from traditional Morbid sound, and does give the band oodles of room for growth in future releases. Tracks worthy of Absu Mummu Yiamat, Jimi Hendrix and John
Candy include: "Fall From Grace," "Blessed
Are The Sick/Leading The Rats," "Thy
Kingdom Come," "Abominations" and
"Ancient Ones." (KS)



BELIEVER Sanity Obscure (RC-Roadracer, 225 Lafayette St. #407, New York, NY 10012/212-219-0077)—Pennsylvania's Believer have the distinction of being "The World's First Christian Death Metal Band" (it sez here), although I probably wouldn't place them in either category. Neither preachy nor gutteral, their style of technical brute thrash is more accessible than most death metal (but still heavy as lead), and political and social topics are covered in the lyrics as well as the subtler religious undertones (I wouldn't consider King's X or Trouble to be "Christian Rock" either). Believer has previously released material on the R.E.X. label and on Roadracer's At Death's Door compilation, but with their first proper world-wide release, Sanity Obscure, they now seem ready to compete with top thrashers. Musically, obvious influences tag on the likes of Destruction and Nuclear Assault (John Connelly-esque vocals), but their thrash hybrid is as clever as it is technical. Production-wise, Doug Mann lays down the hammer with crisp guitar work and a natural drum sound with solid kicks and cymbal work. And although the possibilities of "thrash metal" have been just about exhausted, Believer stretch the genre for all its worth, including an operatic piece ("Dies Irae (Day Of Wrath)") and a U2 cover ("Like A Song"), earning their place as one of the most interesting bands of the genre to emerge since Sepultura. Also praise "Nonpoint," "Stop The Madness," and the title track. (KS)



TERRORIZER World Downfall (Earache Relativity, address above—This album is the end product of an eight-hour recording session in a sixteen track studio that cost \$1,400, and the final outcome includes just one kick drum and no lead guitar! As bonebasically brilliant as their savage primitivity may be, L.A.'s Terrorizer possess the speed and power of a chainsaw with the grace of a pavement saw—one that's rapidly overheating. All the corrosive basics for grind alchemy are employed at a spillover agitation level, the band pushing an extra mile out of standard intestinal-tract growl; and to ensure that last epidermal layer is scraped clean, there's more clamped-down, non-generic death riffage than the entire catalogue of most of this genre's record labels. To clear up any wrongfully-conceived "side-project" rumor, Terrorizer was formed in '88 and featured an all-Latin line-up current Napalm Death guitarist Jesse Pintado, current Morbid Angel drummer Pete Sandoval, current Nausea vocalist Oscar Garcia and last-minute help from Morbid Angel bassist Dave "Vinnie" Vincent—until one by one, the members were lured away by other brethren in brutality; however, the band still exists and indeed may tour and record a follow-up LP. Although this album is almost two years old, its domestic release should give anyone their needed dose of classic grind. Bring "After World Obliteration," "Fear Of Napalm," "Corporation Pull-in," "Dead Shall Rise" and the title track to the latest apocalypse. (KS/DO/JA)

VAN HALEN For Unlawful Carnal Knowledge (Warner Bros., 3300 Warner Blvd., Burbank, CA 91510/818-846-9090)—Considering the fact that one man has been responsible for advancing guitar innovation, bringing a virtuosity of incredible precision and ecstacy to an otherwise sloppy style, and incorporating it all into such influential songs, then we say ol' Edward Van should get a percentage from most of the heavy rock music written in the past ten years. The band has been an easy target ever since Mr. Bad Motor Scooter joined, but what people don't understand is that this is Edward's band, and his writing and playing always shine through, no matter who's singing. But all said and done, it's been three years since these guys have crossed the airwaves, and once again the touch and magic of Edward are still intact: chordal harmonics, tapping, whammy bar twisting, virtuosity and most importantly,

blazing songwriting and arrangements. With all of his patented techniques (and, except for one song, no keyboards!), F.U.C.K. almost takes them back to the early days of harder, more free-wheeling playing and writing. Knowing that regression only handcuffs creativity, Van Halen combines his early style of driving guitar work with his more recent pop sensibility. Another chapter in this beyond-legendary guitarist's book has been etched into the history books: open to "Poundcake," "Pleasure Dome," "Spanked" and "The Dream Is Over." (RI)

JOHN CONNELLY'S THEORY Back To Basics (Relativity, address above)—John Connelly: the man, the myth, the squalling lead throat of Nuclear Assault. Okay, so N.A. is a "thrash band," but a stronger indication of the band's individual talents comes in the form of their solo projects: from Glenn Evans' C.I.A. to

Danny Lilker's Brutal Truth to John Connelly's Theory, not a one of 'um sounds anything like N.A., and anyone who's expecting another Game Over here has gotta nuther thang comin'. Although this album is chock fulla John's brutal crunch chords and node-bustin' adenoidal vocals, he and the Theory stray just about as far from the beaten track as possible while still remaining cohesive: there's weird tempos, an acoustic interlude that sounds kinda like Jethro Tull, all kinds of inside jokes, and even a cover of Argent's (!) "Hold Your Head Up." Although the album (and John's voice) sometimes oversteps its ambition, Back To Basics shows a whole other side of JC's talent. Plug "Aggressive," "Hardwire," "Back From The Past" and "Joe's Tune," which actually sounds kinda like Iron MaidenI (JA)

ANTHRAX Attack Of The Killer B's (Megaforce-Island, 210 Bridge Plaza Dr., Manalapan, NJ 07726/908-972-3456)-"O.K., first off, this is NOT the new Anthrax album: it's the longest EP ever!", this disc's liner notes take great pains to point out. Like most clearing-outthe-studio-closet releases, this eleven track/45minute slab contains live tracks, covers, outtakes and LOTS of silly originals. As you probably already know, the centerpiece of this release is "Bring The Noise," probably the firstever cover version of a rap song by a "metal" band, and possibly the best fusion of the two genres thus far-P.E.'s Chuck D and Flavor Flav sound just as lethal rapping over crunch chords as they do over hardcore beats. Although the remaining eleven tracks pale beside that classic moment (what wouldn't?), there's plenty here to keep fans happy: bruising live versions of "Keep It In The Family" and "Belly Of The Beast," covers of Kiss ("Parasite") and S.O.D. ("Milk"), and the hilarious "N.F.B." In the eight years since America's most politically correct "metal" band spewed forth their first release, they've remained relevant and important by constantly expanding and refining their thang—this "EP" is no exception, and makes the band's next LP seem that much more promising. (JA)

MEGADETH Maximum Megadeth (Capitol, 1750 N. Vine St., Hollywood, CA 90028/213-462-6252)—Dis here promo-only eight-track "greatest hits"-type CD collects most of the best tracks from Megadeth's last three albums and features two previously unreleased live versions recorded in London last October: altho' we never thought Megadeth (or anyone) should cover "Anarchy In The U.K.," the band rips up a storm on "Hangar 18"—only one thing that makes this cool sampler essential for fans. (JA)

JET CIRCUS Step On It (Word, c/o Epic, P.O. Box 4450, New York, NY 10101-4450/212-445-4321)—Even though drum machines have been used and abused for a good many years now, the mere word causes such panic in rock circles that most bands seem to avoid them. Well, the Swedish-born duo Jet Circus come at you with an assertive use of this technological wonder, laying down some of the tastiest drum licks with a variety of instrumental and vocal punches. Lead vocalist Terry Haw sings (and even raps a little) with such ease and agility that most birds would listen in silence or simply head south, and Ez Gomer pulls out a punchy and fresh bass sound that mixes ever-so-edgily with the crispy drum lines. Of course, a round of applause must go out to drum programmer Little George, for bringing an interesting and emotional life into a machine. Strong writing, arranging and an amazing vocalist make this band a force to contend with in the future. Program "Victory Dance," "Rockin' Horse" and "Jet Blue." (RJ)



VARIOUS ARTISTS Love & Napalm Vol. 2 (EP) (Trance Syndicate, P.O. Box 49771, Austin, TX 78765)—From the label run by the Butthole

Surfers' King Koffee comes yet another seething four-song slab of acid-drenched sonic ultraviolence. Drain's lava-flow guitars nearly drown out all of the other sounds on "Martyrs Road," but somewhere off in the distance there's a pulsating rhythm and woman wailing from beyond the next dimension. Faster, raunchier and more shrill are the Pain Teens, who bleat a quasi-punk anthem in a cement mixer of sound. On the flip, Crust bodily grafts a French-language lesson onto bass-heavy Big Black-styled riffage, and Ed Hall's nail-biting, menacing "Daisy Pusher" is actually the catchiest cut here. Like Vol. 1 and everything else we've heard on the label, this is challenging and disturbing loud rock. (JA)

PEARL JAM Alive (EP) (Epic Associated, P.O. Box 4450, New York, NY 10101-4450/212-445-4321)—Adding yet another title to their portfolios, ex-Green River/Mother Love Bone/ Temple Of The Dog guitarist and bassist Stone Gossard and Jeff Ament emerge with their third release (and band) in the past year. Let's get one thing out of the way once and for all: no less than 4/5 of Pearl Jam played on the Temple Of The Dog LP, so in many ways this is Pearl Jam's second release, and anyone who snarls, "Oh, they sound just like Temple" can just take a flying leap, because this was recorded a mere two months after that album. ANYWAY, yes, the early '70s rootsy mood of the Temple LP is continued on this three-track EP, embellishing on some of the album's sonic possibilities while showing their own mettle in the songwriting department (the title track is the best). That said, of all the Beatles songs they could have covered, why they chose the limp "I've Got A Feeling" surpasseth all understanding. (JA)

only if we can collect a bunch of free stuff..." More seriously, he says, "It was weirdweren't expecting to be on something this big. We did know for the past six or eight months that it would be some division of Warners, but it was kind of a shock to find out that it would actually be on Warner Bros. They've been unbelievably lenient with us-ridiculously so. With the music, nobody gave us any problems. Nobody even came into the studio.

Are you happy with the album? "I haven't heard it yet so I don't know." (Here we go again.) "I mean, I haven't heard it in a month or so. Actually, I hate it right now. It has potential to hate. It's like anything, if you hear it enough times you're going to hate it. It's not just stuff from the demo, there's like four new tunes and two pre-demo tracks—"Carousel" and "Egg" made the evolution over the past four years and went through some adaptations.

"We're generally happy with the way things

came out. I mean, there are a thousand things I'd like to change, but Zom took what were seemingly hacked versions of songs and melted them into a very... I don't know, I don't want to put any adjectives in here, cause I don't know any, but he knew exactly what we wanted in

certain spots. It's pretty produced, there's a lot of stuff we're gonna have to work on to get it all to work live, and we're in the process of doing that. We bought a sampler!"

Which brings us to a topic the band is most noted for: a live show that is musical yet very theatrical. The band wears masks onstage, but when asked about the props Bungle uses in their gigs, Danny responds, "Steel pin balls. Mostly just hard objects to throw at the crowd—and of course the other prop would be trash can lids to protect themselves with. We bring about a hundred. We only have about 150 balls, so if you're in the front, you'll definitely want to have a can within reach. And also paper airplanes with plastic explosives on the tips."

One might wonder why a band so musically adept would lyrically regress into a cesspool of pomo slime so crude that even Larry Flint would sniff before touching it. Personally, I think they like to razz everyone off, but I couldn't help but ask if they're sex addicts?

"I don't know. We all have VCRs and pomo's the cheapest thing around," froths the hormonally overloaded skin-beater. "How were we to know that X means `sex'? We just thought it meant 'good.' We just thought it was some kind of rating scale, you know, like stars: one X is good, two is pretty good, three is really good. Turned out there was a lot of sex going on in those

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

MARISA MONTE Mais (World Pacific/

Blue Note, c/o Capitol, 1750 N. Vine St., Hollywood, CA 90028)— Marisa Monte's first American release only makes you wonder why it took so long. She is one of the best of Brazil's new generation of singers. Her warm, earthy voice can be smooth and sensual or tense and biting. It's expressive and emotional, which is a necessity when you're dealing with a language barrier; there are no walls here. What adds to the beauty of her voice is the success of the production on **Mais**. Arto Lindsay has assembled an international brigade of funk, folk, rock and jazz: Nana Vasconcelos, Marc Ribot, John Zorn, Melvin Gibbs, Ryuichi Sakamoto, Brazilian guitarist Perinho Santana and saxist Marty Erlich In true Brazilian style, genre takes a back seat to feel, and the ideas run through folk, rock and pop dance grooves like so many tributaries to the Amazon. They all come together to let the song live on its own terms. Sakamoto's synths are the most tasteful I've ever heard them, even managing to do a sitar sample without being trite. Ribot's guitars form the backbone of many of the cuts, from the backbone of many of the cuts, from theromantic samba of "I Still Remember" to the gritty funk of "Go Back to Your Home." Other rivers to swim: the gentle guitar and percussion of "Butterfly," the slap and fuzz of "Everything Halfway" and the uptempo heat of "A Night to Bod" Utelike Total Halfway'' and the uptempo heat of ''A Night In Bed.'' Unlike most great Brazilian pop recordings, this one never slips into saccharine sobriety. The music is intox-icating, clean, live (rarely is a sampled drum to be found!) and intense—a perfect match for the lead instrument, the voice and charm of Marisa Monte.

DOROTHY MASUKA Pata Pata (Mango, 14 E. 4th St., New York, NY 10012)—In the late '30s, American jazz and blues were pouring into southern Africa (and the rest of the world) via rec-ords and radio. In South Africa, it fused with local folk music and current popular styles and became known as marabi, a smooth mix of Zulu and swing that became the foundation for the work of artists like Miriam Makeba and Hugh Masakela a decade later. One of their contemporaries was Dorothy Masuka, singer and later songwriter, who chose to stay in Africa after many other artists chose to migrate to Europe and America to escape the then new laws of separation and extreme repression, The Population Registration Act of 1950 (apartheid). Born in Bulawayo to Zim babwean and Zambian parents, Masuka became a fixture on the music scene through the '60s, disappearing in the '70s in the midst of the popular revolution to overthrow white-ruled Rhodesia and restore Zimbabwe. So much for the history les-One of the queens of marabi is back, and she is as warm and welcome as ever. What's different about **Pata Pata** is the subtle blend of marabi and Zim. While it never gets as frantic as chimurenga or jit, there is a ripple of Shona on many of these cuts that gives them a distinctive groove. Fans of Makeba will understand the grooves and love the smooth, jazzy voice. There are eight new songs and seven extra mixes, which work really well. The dub mix

BEAT! WORKS!

People have come to the music of other cultures from many directions. My own in-troduction was via South African jive, sent to me because a friend heard in it a similarity to the old-time stringband music I played in a band in the early '70s. Others were introduced via reggae, some through the jazz of Masakela or Dizzy, and later, from the pop music of Simon and Gabriel Each has made fans of a variety of styles and approaches, from overblown Afro-Parisian pop to field recordings of drums and bows. A new label has taken a new tack: the music of the world for the newest generation. Earth Beatl is a new division of Music For Little People (Box 1460, Redway, CA 95560/800-346-4445), a company that sells recordings, instruments and books to teach kids about music. The new "world" music label seems a natural outgrowth. Its catalog includes African, Brazilian and Caribbean music so far, both by American bands and local artists. The best of the local music is the best of Rio Carnaval: Sambo Enredo and Batucada. These

recordings from the '70s exemplify the real sound of carnaval, featuring the year's winning songs from competitions among the samba schools of Rio's neighborhoods and favelas. These are recordings of songs that were allowed the privilege of being per-formed for carnaval, with all the rhythm and life intact. Scattered through the album are also batacuda, the drum "street samare also batacuda, the drum "street sambas" of The Bateria Nota Io. Other artists on Earth Beat! include west African drummer Obo Addy, Middle Eastern band Jazayer and the Californian Afro-Cuban band Machete Ensemble . . . Britain's Earthworks Records is now being distributed in the U.S. by Cardiac (1790 Broadway, New York, NY 10019/212-977-8020). They have new releases to offer: a collection of THOMAS MAPFUMO's post-revolution hits called **Shumba**; **Guitar Paradises Of East Africa**; more township jive from South Africa; and an outstanding record of New York/Cuban artist **HENRY FIOL**, music from his 1980s albums on the Corazon label. I'll have more details next week after I've had time to listen to them all!

I leave you with a paraphrase of words of wisdom that were uttered over one too many beers at Viva Zapata's bar, spoken in complete frustration, and therefore honest and true: "Bullets, not ballots!" It may come to that. Peace.

KENNY BARRON Quickstep (Enja, c/o Mesa/Bluemoon, 209 E. Alameda Ave., Burbank, CA 91502/818-841-8585)/KENNY BARRON QUARTET Invitation (Criss Cross (Holland), clo Rounder, 1 Camp St., Cambridge, MA 02140/617-354-0700)/
KENNY BARRON Live At Maybeck Recital Hall, Vol. 10 (Concord, P.O. Box 845, Concord, CA 94522/415-682-6770)—The word ubiquitous precedes Kenny Barron's name so often in cedes Kenny Barron's name so often in print that a jazz neophyte—or, for that matter, a person with a limited vocabu lary—might assume it's a legal part of the pianist's name. Barron is ubiquitous, as in everpresent, everywhere. The most in-demand live pianist in and around Gotham (John Hicks is a close second) is featured on three more splendid recordings that command the attention of even the most committed stay-at-home jazz aficionados. Three other Barron CDs—The Only One (Reservoir), Sunset To Dawn (1973, Muse) and Rhythm-A-Ning (duet with Hicks, Candid)—have been highlighted previously in this column. Quickstep (DDD, 61-minutes), recorded this past February at Van Gelder's, is Barron's third Enja offering with his working quintet of John Stubblefield (tenor), Eddie Henderson (trumpet), David Williams (bass) and Victor Lewis (drums). For bop hard ("Once Upon A Time") or soft ("Until Then"), **Quickstep** is as good as it gets—an alternately energized and enchanting date from five confi-dent, eminently talented players who are so secure in their abilities, so versatile and trusting of one another, that group cohesion precludes any gratuitous grandstanding. Moreover, because **Quickstep** boasts compositional input from Stubblefield and Lewis (who contributed so heavily to Bobby Watson's Post-Motown Bop for Blue Note that he earned co-star billing), each of whom chipped in two originals to go with the leader's deuce, the listener is treated to an almost magical hour of solos from—and interaction among—five jazzmen of the first rank. Glorious. Barron's Invitation, a December 1990 session also cut at Van Gelder Studios, finds Barron alongside bassist Williams and drummer Lewis Nash, augmented up front by the rich, deep-bodied tenor of the sure-fingered Ralph Moore. The pianist, who penned three of Moore. The pianist, who penned three of the eight selections, extracts new meaning from perennials ("Invitation" and "An Afternoon In Paris") and, drawing from his experience in the '80s quartet Sphere, spelunks his way through the craggy passages of Thelonious Monk's "Blue Monk" with a sixth sense. Barron, sans accompanient, is left to his own multifarious devices on live left to his own multifarious devices on Live At Maybeck Recital Hall, an eight-tune program with three originals (including the Powell-powered "Bud-Like") and a handful of newly roasted chestnuts.

IN THE MAINSTREAM

Pianist KEVIN HAY5 brings a clear-eyed precocity and a wide-open conception to **Sweetear** (SteepleChase, Denmark, c/o Rick Ballard Imports, P.O. Box 5063, Berkeley, CA 94705). This strong neobop outing, for which the 23-year-old pianist/leader composed two of the eight numbers, owes as much to Miles Davis' 1966-67 quintet corpus (E.S.P., Sorcerer, Nefertiti) as to the hard-bop canon of the lazz Macropaers being policinal to an the Jazz Messengers being polished so en-thusiastically by Hays' neoclassical peers, Winard and Philip Harper, in whose band he works and on whose new recording Artistry (Verve/PG), he can be heard Displaying a firm, sure-handed attack, Hays is as unhurried on ballads (his own title track, in particular) as he is gracefully precise on faster numbers. On the calypsoish "Fun," from the Miles Davis **Direc**tions twofer (now out-of-print), Hays jabs notes, in gleeful tandem with a repetitive bass figure, before launching into a logical, beautifully modulated solo. There's nothing tentative or unsteady about Hays' pianistry, a state of affairs attributable, in large part, to the experience and comradely esprit (especially on theme statements not employing the standard two-horn voicings) of his sidekicks: trumpeter Eddie Henderson, alto saxist Vincent Herring (who chips in a lovely ballad of his own, "Almost Always"), bassist James Genus and drummer Joe Chambers. Sweetear is worth tracking down (specialty jazz shops should be able to get it); come to think of it, it'll sound splendid in a set comprising music from Herring's Evidence album (Landmark), the Harper Brothers' Artistry and the renascent trumpeter Henderson's Think On Me (SteepleChase) . . . Delmark (4243 N. Lincoln Ave., Chicago, IL 60618) has issued its first CD in a series that will return to circulation all the small-group sides

and 1957. **Jump Time**, the first Smith title, is a rollickin' 20-tune, 58-minute collection of jumpin' blues and richly toned ballads (including "Because Of You," which sold a quarter-million copies during its heyday). STANLEY COWELL's Close To You Alone, recorded last year in Tokyo with bassist Cecil McBee and drummer Ronnie Burrage, features two tunes from each of his rhythm mates, along with a recasting of his best-known work, the oft-recorded "Equipoise." RONNIE MATHEWS—master of mood, sultan of swing (check his work with Max Roach and Dexter Gordon for validation)—illuminates the Dark Before Dawn with torchbearers Ray Drummond (bass) and Billy Higgins (drums). Mathews' savvy song selection ("The End Of A Love Affair" and "You Leave Me Breathless," to name two) is matched by his assured execution and tensile swing.

KULT Sexplosion! (Wax Trax, 1659 N. Damen Ave., Chicago, IL 60647/312-252-1000)—On Sexplosion!, Mr. Groovie Mann and Mr. Buzz McCoy rehash and regurgitate trends where disco balls, glitter, neon lights and the fever of the beat transformed people into hedonis-tic, dancing fools. They pay homage to the '70s disco boom with an underlying theme and feel, while their own style of dance, which is always full of wildly emotional mayhem and pelvis-pumping excitement, is mayhem and pelvis-pumping excitement, is still at the forefront. Their pounding beats and trinkets of electronic ornaments instantly fill a room, while their stirring and expressive sample injections and distorted vocals play with sexuality, from the kinky and provocative ("Leathersex") to the expressive ("Dream Baby"). Most ingenious about **Sexplosion!** are the brilliant musical loops and samples which don't musical loops and samples which don't musical loops and samples which don't cloud or suffocate the groove, but add a penetrating and colorful sensation, notably on the early '70s dramatics woven into "The International Sin Set," and their sampling of pieces of James Bond's Thunderball soundtrack on "Mood No. 6" and "Sexplosion." Groove On, Assume The Motion On: "A Martini Built For 2" and "Princess Of The Queens (The Lost General "Princess Of The Queens (The Lost Generation)," featuring disco queen Shawn Christopher on vocals.

PETE ROCK AND C.L. SMOOTH All Souled Out (EP) (Elektra, 75 Rockefeller Plaza, New York, NY 10019)—Stirring up interested ears with the release of their first single, "Good Life," the Mount Vernon, NY, duo of DJ Pete Rock and the smooth-flowing rhymer C.L. Smooth lay down musically stimulating tracks full of pure scratching wizardry from Pete Rock, thick basslines and a variety of tempos. The rawness of the MC/DJ combo scintillates on tracks like "Go With The Flow," which sticks mainly to short and light sampling, sticks mainly to short and light sampling, while they artfully create more involved and musical cuts like "Mecca & The Soul Brother" and the title track, "All Souled Out," which sounds like something Main Source left off their LP, with organ and sax loops and fast-paced raps.

1981 and 1982

College Radio Brainstorm, the predecessor of CMJ Music Marathon, began in 1981 with 100 delegates interacting for a day at the New York Sheraton Hotel. It expanded to **College and Progressive Radio Brainstorm** and 200 delegates in 1982. Resembling a "think tank" more than a formal meeting, these conferences underscored the importance of communication in what was then the fragmented, confused world of college radio and alternative music.

Renamed CMJ Music Marathon, the CMJ convention spread its wings and grew into a larger forum. Todd Rundgren appeared as keynote speaker. The first CMJ New Music Awards—an event honoring the year's most innovative and challenging music—was an '83 highlight, James Brown hosted the ceremonies and X and ing music—was an Bo nigninghi. Samuel T-Bone Burnett appeared in performance.

1984

CMJ Music Marathan grew to two full days. Peter Wolf (ex-J. Geils Band) delivered the keynote, and attendees enjoyed panels such as "Rock Radio As A Progressive Force," "Alternative Media Networking" and "Independent Label Survival and Expansion." There were special live performances by the Nails, the Red Hot Chili Peppers and the dB's. Johnny Clegg, Johnny Lydon and Flea (Red Hot Chili Peppers) participated in the first legendary "Artist Encounter & Free-For-All."

College Day, an intensive workshop emphasizing the great potential of college radio as a force to break new artists, debuted at MM85. College Day's intimate ambiance encouraged all who attended to join in the discussion. Keynote addresses by Laurie Anderson and Bob Guccione Jr., as well as performances by The Damned, Smithereens, Dead Milkmen and Robyn Hitchcock, made this convention a memorable one. Highlights of the '85 New Music Awards included performances by R.E.M. and Stanley Jordan.

Metal Marathon emerged as its own mini-convention at MM86, with special panels concentrating on hard rock, a keynote from metal monster Ronnie James Dio, and many steaming showcases. MM86 boasted 29 panels, a keynote by Jeff Ayeroff (Managing Director, Virgin Records) and a special Halloween costume ball featuring Shriekback. Peter Gabriel attended and walked off with a majority of the 1986 New Music Awards, in a show that was hosted by Ron Reagan, Jr. and the ever-gracious Sandra Bernhard. Joe Strummer accepted an award for Big Audio Dynamite, Bobby McFerron made his Awards television debut, Lou Reed won a Lifetime Achievement Award and Steve Earle performed.

1987

MM87 was notable for its split focus: "Discovery" (day one) included panels on demos, artist management and surviving as an independent label; "Development & Marketing" panels (day two) included discussions on A&R, music publishing and overseas licensing. Keynotes by the late activist Abbie Hoffman and Billy Bragg, Sinead O'Connor's U.S. debut at the "Artist Encounter & Free-For-All," and special performances by the Red Hot Chili Peppers, Cabaret Voltaire and the reunited Pere Ubu (their first show in six years) made MM87 a convention to remember.

Billy Bragg returned for an acoustic performance with Weddings, Parties & Anything at College Day, which doubled in size yet retained the intimacy necessary for a productive, interactive workshop. Attendees at **Music Marathon** enjoyed a keynote by Michelle Shocked, a **Metal Marathon** keynote by Z-Rock's Lee Abrams and a press conference with Siouxsie & The Banshees.

MM89 offered four keynote addresses: Bruce Dickinson (**Metal Marathon**), Vernon Reid (Living Colour), Ice-T and a rap keynote by George Clinton. CMJ's commitment to all musical genres was clear, with live performances from rap and jazz to reggae and country. MM showcases spread to over 30 of the hottest New York clubs as MM89 took over NYC. The '89 **New Music Awards** featured performances by Soundgarden, Dirty Dozen Brass Band, Red Hot Chili Peppers, Lou Reed, Neville Bros., NRBQ, Big Daddy Kane, Nancy Griffith and Ofra Haza.

1990

Censorship was the central theme of MM90, with keynote speeches by Eric Bogosian, Censorship was the central theme of MM7, with keyfole speeches by Lite Bogostan, KRS-One (Boogie Down Productions) and Lemmy Kilmister (Motorhead), an inspired address at College Day by Henry Rollins, a highly focused "Freedom Of Speech: Shhh... Big Brother Is Listening" panel and a special appearance by Jello Biafra. Registration rose to over 4000, almost splitting the gills of the Vista Hotel and sinking the World Trade Center.

TEENAGE FANCLUB **DROPS MATATOR FOR DGC**

DGC Records has signed Scotland's **Teenage Fanclub**. There is some question as to whether the band properly ful-filled their contractual obligation to their previous U.S. label Matador Records (the band is signed to Creation Records in the U.K.). Neither Geffen Records nor the band's lawyer were available for comment; Matador and its legal representative declined comment as well. Reportedly, the band has recorded two different records: one, a "brilliant" guitar-pop record that is sure to be the one DGC will release; and the second, a grungy, all-instrumental LP made up primarily of covers that Matador may or may not be releasing. Stay tuned here for further developments and a more detailed accounting.

SIR MIX-A-LOT GETS NASTY

On June 18, Sir MIx-A-Lot filed a suit against Nastymix Records, claiming that the label infringed upon his copyrights; he was also seeking royalties due him as a result of the use of his material. Sir Mix-A-Lot is also seeking an injunction forbidding Nastymix from any further use of his recordings, the return of all masters in the label's possession and the establishment of a temporary receiver to collect and hold all income made through use of the artist's recordings. On the other side of the coin, on June 19 Nastymix filed a breach-of-con-tract suit against Sir Mix-A-Lot, claiming that the artist failed to deliver a third album to the label, not to mention six subsequent albums, as required in the con-tract. Furthermore, Sir Mix-A-Lot has entered into another recording agreement with Def American Records, which Nastymix claims is causing damage to their reputation and is interfering with their business affairs. Nastymix is seeking to have the guidelines of the contract played out, or alter-natively, to receive damages for the alleged breach of the contract. Nastymix released two albums by the rapper, Swass and Seminar, which were certified platinum and gold respectively.

IMMIGRATION COULD CUT BAND VISAS BY 2/3

U.S. Immigration may begin imposing new, more stringent immigration laws which would severely limit the number of foreign performers granted visas. The new federal laws, which will be decided upon in August, would limit the number of foreign entertainers to 25,000 per year, roughly one-third of the number currently admitted. The law would affect both superstars and upand-coming bands equally.

MUTE SLIPS INTO PLASTEX

Mute Records has announced its newfound association with Cabaret Voltaire's custom label, Plastex Records. Mute will now be releasing the future out-put of Cabaret Voltaire in the U.S., as well as the many individual projects of the two band-members **Richard Kirk** and Stephen Maillinder. Slated for an August release will be a new single by Cabaret Voltaire called "Colours," followed shortly by a five-song mini-album of the same name.

EMI TAKIN' IT TO THE STREETS

EMI Records has announced the formation of Slammin' Records, a label created to reach the "street/ underground rap music market.'
The label will be distributed by
indie distributor Quark, Inc. The
first release on Slammin' will be
a 12" by The Jaz called "A
Groove." Groove.

SONY BEGINS IM-MEDIATE REISSUES

Sony Music Special Projects has begun a reissue series featuring recordings made for the '60s English label Immediate Records, which was founded by Rolling Stones manager Andrew Loog Oldham at the age of 21. The reissues make recordings by several influential artists available on CD in the U.S. for the first time. These artists include: Fleet-wood Mac, Rod Stewart, Small Faces, The Nice, Humble Pie, Eric Clapton, Jimmy Page, John Mayall and Jeff Beck, Also reissued will be rare early recordings by members of **Led Zeppelin**, the Velvet Underground, Emer-son, Lake & Palmer, Bad-finger, 10CC and others.

RHINO THROWS A SHINDIG!

Rhino Home Video has scheduled its second release in the series of videos from the historic prime-time ABC-TV rock 'n roll series Shindig!. In celebration of Shindig!'s 25th anniversary, three new compilations from the planned 12-volume set are slated to ap-Party, featuring cuts from the Kingsmen, the Sir Douglas Quintet and the Isley Brothers; Motor City Magic, with classic Motown cuts from Marvin Gaye, Mary Wells, Smokey Robinson And The Miracles and the Supremes; and Jackie Wilson, with 13 per-formances by Jackie Wilson, the only live performance tape released by the late R&B star.

FELDER POMUS **ENTERTAINMENT BOWS**

MIND OVER MATTERS

Fractal Format Radio

"You've got to understand that radio is a business..."

he next person who tells me that will get a poke in the eye at the least (or a boxed ear?). When people complain about commercial (and often non-commercial) radio's pointless and self-imposed limitations, sooner or later someone dusts off that cliche. It's little more than a poor excuse, explained away by gigabytes of demographics that ask the wrong questions to begin with. In some countries, the equivalent would be "You've got to understand that radio maintains the social order." Which definition is scarier?

Personally, I think radio's an artform. A radio show's like a sculpture. Bottom line definition? Radio is a technology for transmitting information

Bottom line definition? Radio is a technology for transmitting information

by modulating electromagnetism.

But what kind of information? In the wake of the Gulf War, a couple of NPR stations dumped their locally produced music shows in favor of all-news formats, and other stations nationwide are eyeballing the results. This scares me.

Why? Because led (and fed) by mass media, we leap hysterically from one week's "big story" to the next with the attention span of a stressed-out 2-year-old. During the war, we all tuned in for a teaspoon of rumor, repetition and speculation—many voices but essentially a single source. That kind of news is like a diet of junk food. We need more diversity, not more people saying the same thing.

Music, explicitly or not, can be more informative than news, certainly more meaningful. It can make global connections where the rest of the media builds borders. You can blow a bagpipe from Scotland to Iran, slide a steel guitar from Nashville to Nigeria to India and Hawaii. Dance to a frenzied accordion from Baton Rouge to Brazil, or to the latest step in Manchester or Macedonia. Bridge decades or leap continents with a segue. You can get straight to the soul of another culture, or rediscover the soul of your own.

Juxtapositions are synergetic. The whole is greater than the sum of the parts, and every different way the parts can go together tells a different story. And it's invigorating to listen to, challenging and provocative. And a hell of a lot of fun!

a hell of a lot of tun!

I love music, but what most radio offers is repetition and nostalgia. What's this month's "hottest" sound? Take your pick—it's probably an echo these days of the '60s and '70s. And most commercial radio doesn't even know it's an echo, behaving as if time stands still—it runs faster and faster to frantically stay in the same place. In the Civil War, they called "nostalgia" what we now call "shell shock" or "post-traumatic stress syndrome"; still seems apt to me. And endless repetition

amounts to brainwashing.

There aren't many borders in Night Land (my program on KCRW).

Neither national borders nor those between musical genres are very portant to me. They're landmarks at best; historical markers glimpsed from the window as we speed by—stereo blasting—on Night Land Highway One, puzzling over a map we might be holding upside down. It's a wild ride into possibly unknown territory, on a two-lane road with chaos on the right and on the left, er... chaos. Mixing music and metaphors all the way!

Electromagnetism, the root of radio, is a basic form of the universe, and Life is a constant dance with Chaos. FM and TV broadcasts are on their way into deep space (my first programs ought to be reaching Sirius this week), the somewhat incoherent babble of an infant civilization. TOP Winds Skibins Coordinated by Andy Skibins

JULIAN COPE The Marquee, New York City, June 26

With Peggy Suicide spearheading one of the great career resurrections in recent memory, the Most Rev. St. Julian Cope of Tamworth held court at a club packed with adoring fans—and without an opening act, to boot. The jungle-gym mic stand, short hair and leather chic of previous tours have all been abandoned, replaced by a quasi-Shakespearian sort of "Iggy In Wonderland" look that added yet another dimension to his alternatingly aggressive, effete and/or autistic stage presence. Actually, stage presence is something of an understatement here, because Cope is one of those rare performers who doesn't even need to do much of anything to enrapture a crowd. He played guitar through most of the set, and at times he would just stare silently at the audience with a wry smirk on his face that apparently spoke volumes to the crowd. Augmented by an excellent backing trio (and the occasional unobtrusive backing tape), Cope opened the set with a quiet, austere "Pristeen and proceeded to reel off about 10 songs from the new LP-a risky way to start any set, but it worked pretty brilliantly. As the nearly two-hour-long set wore on, Cope gradually got wilder, prancing around the stage and giving Prince serious competition in the microphone-as-phallic-symbol stakes, until the show climaxed with an insane version of "Reynard The Fox" that found Julian hurtling,

writhing and contorting himself all over the stage.


KICKING GIANT/COURTNEY LOVE/SUGARTIME/FLYING SAUCER The Knitting Factory, New York City, June 19

The bass guitar (or lack thereof) was the focus of this show. Local duo Kicking Giant eschews the bass, preferring to stick to the pared-down sound of Tae's intriguing guitar wailings and strained vocals, bolstered by Rachel's simple drumming patterns and occasional backup vox. Rock 'n roll without bass is no longer a revolutionary concept, but there is promise in the energy between the duo. Courtney Love, the only non-NYC band of the night, calls the bass a four-letter word as well, but takes a folkier tack on the guitar/voice/drums idea. Lois Maffeo's beautifully pure voice didn't shine quite as clearly as on the band's two singles, but her straightforward delivery and simple yet urgent tunes carried the set along just fine. Drummer Pat Malley creates a warm rhythm by using brushes instead of sticks. By contrast, Sugartime is a band propelled by the thick melodies woven by bassist Jason Asnes (formerly of Nice Strong Arm). And finally, Flying Saucer finished off the evening by showing off Yasmin's facility with both the bass guitar and the six-stringer, now making them a part-time bass-less band. Our favorite songs featured both Yasmin and guitarist Jeff on vocals, bantering back and forth.


