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

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

With the RIAA suing pretty much anyone and anything in its path, the slow economy hitting the music industry particularly hard and Webcasters being drawn through the ringer before a fair royalty rate could be found, there was certainly more than enough to keep anyone who works in the music industry stressed this year.

But it wasn't all bad news — satellite radio has officially launched and weathered the initial storm, legitimate online music subscription services are finally offering enough of a catalogue to make them worthwhile and several indie labels have received the financing to ensure they can provide great music for years to come.

In hopes that 2003 only gets better, here's a month-by-month look back at what happened in the industry during 2002.

JANUARY

Representative John Convers (D-MI) pushes for deeper investigations and harsher penalties regarding payola in the music industry, stating, "A lot of artists' careers get compromised after they get to the top because of these [payola] transactions. And many more never even get a chance to get near the top. They get squeezed out." • After a long wait and much hype, satellite radio becomes a reality, as XM Satellite Radio officially hits the retail shelves. Over 30,000 people sign up for the subscription service within the

first 60 days, making it the fastest selling audio product in the last 20 years.

FEBRUARY

Arista's L.A. Reid signs a deal with guaranteed hit-makers the Neptunes (Pharrell Williams and Chad Hugo) and their manager, Robert Walker, which will bring their Star Trak Entertainment imprint to

Arista. • CMJ New Music Report turns a new page by putting Island Def Jam's John Rosenfelder on its cover. This marks the first time someone other than an artist has graced the magazine's front page. • Sirius Satellite Radio begins the first phase of its national rollout.

MARCH

EMI Records officially becomes known as Capitol. • MusicNet and pressplay, two of the supposedly "legit" subscription services, come under fire from artists and their managers for not distributing a fair percentage of royalties. • The **Copyright Arbitration Royalty** Panel (CARP) establishes a royalty rate between 0.07 and 0.14 cents per performance for broadcasters who stream online. In addition to the payments, Webcasters will have to make arduously detailed

reports about songs played and listeners receiving the streams.

APRIL

Sirius Satellite Radio announces its 2001 fourth quarter net loss of \$83.6 million. Meanwhile, XM doubles its previous quarter's number of subscribers with 350,000 customers. • Morgan Stanley takes a 47.5 percent stake in V2 Records, directing a reported \$22–29 million into the label. • BMG announces plans to issue "copy managed" promotional CDs in an effort to curb unauthorized duplication. • Napster lays off 30 more employees. •



EMI announces plans to cut 1,800 jobs.

MAY

The International Federation of the Phonographic Industry officially announces a 5 percent drop in value in the music industry worldwide and a 6.5 percent decline in units sold. • National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences

President Michael Greene resigns after 14 years amid investigations of sexual harassment. Greene receives an \$8 million severance package. • AOL Time Warner posts a \$54.2 billion loss — the largest loss in U.S. corporate history.

JUNE

The RIAA promotes Hilary Rosen from President to Chairman/CEO, while Cary Sherman rises from Sr. Executive VP to President. • Bertelsmann announces its intent to buy Napster for \$8 million. • The Librarian of Congress rejects the proposed CARP online royalty rates. • Napster files for Chapter 11 bankruptcy. • Atlantic Records cuts 30 jobs.

JULY

The Reverend Al Sharpton, Johnny Cochran and Michael Jackson form a coalition to investigate the financial exploitation of artists by record labels. • Zomba Music Group exercises its option to allow BMG to purchase its remaining shares by the end of the year. • The Librarian of Congress announces new royalty rates for Webstreamers. • *Billboard* Editor-In-Chief Timothy White passes away at 50. • Listen.com signs a licensing agreement with Universal, making it the only online service with agreements with all five major labels. • Columbia, Palm and Gold Circle all announce layoffs.

AUGUST

Congressmen Howard Berman (D-CA) and Howard Coble (R-NC) propose a bill that would grant copyright holders the ability to disable the PCs of those who participate in filesharing, while giving the RIAA immunity from all state and federal laws. • Beggars Group purchases a 50 percent share of Matador Records. • The RIAA files for a court appeal of the Librarian of Congress' decision on webcasting royalty rates. • DeSoto Records announces plans to slowly shut down the label.



SEPTEMBER

The ironically titled Listen4ever.com shuts down after the RIAA files lawsuits with the company's server. • The RIAA's Web site is hacked



and links to file-sharing sites,
as well as MP3s of an entire
Linkin Park album, are posted.
A Delaware bankruptcy court
blocks the sale of Napster to
Bertelsmann. Napster lays off
its remaining 44 employees.

Sirius Satellite Radio announces major layoffs and initiates a staffing freeze.

OCTOBER

The RIAA announces the launch of an anti-piracy advertising campaign that features artists explaining how downloading music hurts their

careers. • The five major U.S. music distributors (UMVD, BMG, WEA, EMI and Sony), as well as retailers Trans World Entertainment, Tower Records and Musicland Stores, settle an antitrust lawsuit filed by attorney generals in 41 states. The suit charged the defendants with conspiring to inflate the price of CDs, costing consumers millions of dollars. As part of the settlement, the defendants agree to donate 5.5 million CDs (valued at \$75.7 million) to public and nonprofit organizations and give up \$67.38 million in cash to compensate consumers. Courtney Love and Geffen settle their lawsuit, allowing Love out of her contract and giving Geffen the right to offer future Nirvana releases. • Napster founder Shawn Fanning signs a deal with MTV for the rights to make a movie about his life story. • The CMJ Music Marathon descends on New York City. • Hollywood Records downsizes 20 positions.

NOVEMBER

On November 14, the Senate and House of Representatives pass the "Small Webcaster Settlement Act," which, among other things, extends the deadline for the recording industry and small and non-profit Webcasters to sort out royalty payments. • The RIAA wins an all-encompassing preliminary injunction against file-swapping site Aimster.com. • The SEC launches an investigation into Vivendi Universal for alleged financial improprieties under former Chairman Jean-Marie Messier. • Heavy layoffs hit V2 and Kinetic Records.

DECEMBER

Roxio agrees to purchase the remaining assets of Napster for \$5.3 million. • Bertelsmann's purchase of the Zomba Music Group is finalized — for a record-breaking \$2.74 billion.

Additionally, BMG buys out Clive Davis' share in J Records and selects him as chairman for both J and RCA Records. Both labels will operate independently under the newly fashioned RCA Music Group. • CDNow closes its daily music news source, *allstar*, and allows its operations to be taken over by Amazon.com.

A Month-By-Month Guide To The Musical Mayhem And Mirth Of 2002

JANUARY

1980s icon Adam Ant is arrested and faced with charges including criminal damage and assault following an incident in a London pub during which the singer reportedly brandished a fake gun after being barred entry to a private party. The former star is

placed into psychiatric care and eventually sentenced to a year of rehab. • Zac Foley, bassist of British dance/rock combo EMF, dies at the age of 31, after his New Year's celebrations get out of hand. Traces of heroin, cocaine, ecstasy, barbiturates and alcohol are all found in Foley's body. • Legendary singer Peggy Lee, known for such hits as "Fever" and "Is That All There Is?" dies at home in Los Angeles. She was 81.

FEBRUARY

The Strokes cash in at British music weekly NME's Carling Awards, taking home trophies for "Band Of The Year," "Best New Act" and "Album Of The Year" for Is This It. Other notable winners include Basement Jaxx ("Best Dance Act"), Lostprophets ("Best Metal Group"), Ian Brown ("Best Solo Artist") and U2 ("Best Live Act"). • Folk singer Dave Van Ronk passes away on Feb. 10 after a battle with colon cancer. He was 65. An authority on Jazz music, Ronk came to prominence in the 1960s as an early mentor to Bob Dylan.

Country legend Waylon Jennings passes away after a lengthy struggle with diabetes.

MARCH

MTV premieres its new reality TV show, The Osbournes, featuring the daily lives of Ozzy Osbourne and his family. The program will go on to become the biggest on-air success in the network's history, turning the entire Osbourne clan into celebrities. • Randy Castillo, drummer for Ozzy and later, Mötley Crüe, loses his battle with cancer at the age of 51. Weezer sends out an eight-song sampler of music from its upcoming album, Maladroit, much to the chagrin of the band's label. The album won't actually be released until May. • Singer Chris Cornell walks out on Civilian, the band that will go on to become Audioslave after re-forming later in the year. • Unwound calls it quits, citing difficulties in securing tour dates for

extended periods of time as the reason for the split.

APRIL

R.E.M. guitarist Peter Buck is cleared of all charges relating to a bout of bizarre, aggressive behavior aboard a British Airways flight a year earlier. • Alice In Chains singer Layne Staley is found dead at his home in Seattle. A toxicology report reveals that he died from a combination of heroin

and cocaine ingestion.

• TLC star Lisa Lopes is killed in

a fatal car accident in Honduras.

 Frank Tovey, a.k.a. Fad Gadget, passes away from heart failure in London. • Dave Karcich, drummer of popular ska band Spring Heeled Jack and, more recently, Avoid One

Thing, dies three days after suffering a brain aneurysm on April 2. • R. Kelly faces career disaster along with a string of charges related to a videotape that allegedly features the singer having sex with a 14-year-old girl.

MAY

Courtney Love and longtime Hole bandmate Eric Erlandson release a statement officially announcing the end of their band. Love partly blames the breakup on the group's longtime label difficulties. • The Breeders, release Title TK, the band's first album since 1993's Last Splash. Dave Grohl hits the road as the drummer for Queens Of The Stone Age for a North American tour. • After a career lasting nearly four decades, pop diva Cher announces a farewell tour, kicking off in June. • Chris Traynor, formerly of Helmet, officially joins Bush, replacing former guitarist Nigel Pulsford. • Marilyn Manson announces the departure of his band's bassist, Twiggy Ramirez. Tim Skold replaces him. • Legendary songwriter Otis Blackwell passes away following a heart attack at the age of 70.

JUNE

Dee Dee Ramone, bassist for the Ramones, is pronounced dead by paramedics at his California home. Drug paraphernalia, including a syringe, is found at the scene. • John Entwistle, bassist for The Who, dies unexpectedly in his sleep in Las Vegas, just one day before the group is set to begin a major U.S. tour. • Goodie Mob member Khujo has part of his leg amputated following a car accident in Atlanta. • Belle And Sebastian announces the departure of founding member Isobel Campbell from the band.

• Cursive vocalist Tim Kasher undergoes major surgery, involving partial removal of his lung, after experiencing chest pains on the way to a show. Todd Baechle, singer for The Faint, is arrested by Albuquerque police on charges of public nudity after taking to the stage naked during a set by tourmate No Doubt.

JULY

Sharon Osbourne undergoes surgery for colon cancer, and then divulges that the disease has spread to her lymph nodes, leading her to begin chemotherapy. • Travis drummer Neil Primrose requires surgery for multiple fractures to his upper vertebrae following a diving accident in France. • Anti-Pop Consortium breaks up, saying that its members

"have grown in different directions musically and no longer feel the collaboration is artistically viable." • The Strokes back out of a series of dates on tour with Weezer after singer Julian Casablancas suffers a serious knee injury. Jazz bassist Ray Brown, whose

career lasted more than 50 years, passes away in his sleep in Indianapolis. • Alan Lomax, the man who recorded and documented the most significant collection of indigenous music from America to Europe to the Caribbean, dies at age 87.

AUGUST

Widespread Panic guitarist Michael Houser passes away from cancer at his home in Athens, Georgia at the age of 40. • Drowning Pool singer Dave Williams is discovered dead on his band's tour bus, apparently of natural causes. Lionel Hampton, one of the Jazz world's most influential figures, dies of heart failure at 94. • Unwritten Law guitarist Steve Morris is injured by a homemade explosive device left outside his home. • Oasis bandleader Noel Gallagher and bassist Andy Bell are hurt in a head-on car accident in Indianapolis. • Members of Ash suffer injuries as a result of a bus crash on the road with Moby's Area:2 tour. Spiritualized halts plans to begin work on a new album,

after drummer Kevin Bales is diagnosed with leukemia. • Burning Airlines throws in the towel. • 764-Hero also closes the book on its career.

SEPTEMBER

Piebald drops off a series of dates with Dashboard Confessional, following the news that frontman Travis Shettel needs throat surgery. • Singer/songwriter Warren Zevon reveals he has been diagnosed with terminal lung cancer. • Gyda Valtysdóttir, a founding member of Icelandic band Múm, amicably parts ways with the group. • Robyn Hitchcock and his band, the Soft Boys, release Nextdoorland, the first album from the band in more than 20 years. • Ray Manzarek and Robbie Krieger recruit Cult singer Ian Astbury and Police drummer Stewart Copeland to revive the Doors. Rising R&B star Ms. Dynamite takes home Britain's Panasonic Mercury Music Prize. • Soul singer Barry White confirms that

he has been hit by kidney failure and requires a transplant. James Marcel Stinson, of Detroit techno duo Drexciya, dies as the result of a heart complication.

OCTOBER

Run-DMC DJ Jam Master Jay is fatally shot in a Queens, New York recording studio. He was 37. • The Promise Ring announces its decision to split up to a concert crowd. • Murder City Devils spin-off group Dead

Low Tide announces that its short career is already over. **Cee-Lo Green** confirms that his group, Goodie Mob, has also broken up. • Glassjaw postpones a European tour after frontman Daryl Palumbo suffers an attack from Crohn's Disease, a chronic stomach condition.

Blur guitarist Graham Coxon says that he hasn't been involved with the band for months, prior to admitting his departure. Idlewild bassist Bob Fairfoull quits during a European tour. N.E.R.D. wins the second annual Shortlist Prize for its debut album, In Search Of • Nirvana's greatest hits compilation is released, including the rare cut "You Know You're Right." • Filter singer Richard Patrick checks himself into a rehabilitation clinic. • Jets To Brazil nixes its entire U.S. tour, citing an unspecified "sudden illness."

NOVEMBER

The surviving members of Run-DMC officially call an end to the group. • The journals of Kurt Cobain are released for public consumption in replica form. Guns N' Roses fails to perform at the opening show of its long awaited North American tour, leading fans to riot. • Oasis frontman Liam Gallagher is involved in a brawl in Munich, Germany that leaves him with "sustained facial injuries, including several broken teeth." • Joni Mitchell declares that her new

release, the double-disc Travelogue, will be her last. Funk Brothers keyboardist Johnny Griffith dies at the age of 66. • R&B superstar D'Angelo is arrested at his home in Virginia after a woman complained he verbally abused and spat on her at a gas station. • Michael Jackson causes upset by dangling his infant son over a hotel balcony in Berlin.

DECEMBER

Stereolab member Mary Hansen, who was with the group since 1992, is killed in London after being struck by a car while riding her bicycle. She was 36. Australian act Midnight Oil calls it a day after two-and-a-half decades together, in response to singer Peter Garrett announcing his resignation from the group. • Glassjaw frontman Daryl Palumbo suffers yet again from Crohn's Disease, shortly after getting off a plane in London, where, ironically, the band had arrived to begin a string of

rescheduled dates, initially postponed after the singer faced the same problem in October. Moby is attacked and beaten outside a Boston venue by unidentified assailants following one of his performances. After failing to appear at a Philadelphia performance, Guns N' Roses begins rapidly dropping dates from its tour schedule, ultimately canceling all remaining shows without explanation.

ALBUM OF THE YEAR SONIC YOUTH


Murray Street (DGC-Interscope)

Dethroning DJ Shadow's *Private Press* in July, Sonic Youth's *Murray Street* stood at the summit of the Top 200 chart for seven weeks, and the album — appropriately enough, looking at CMJ's year-end chart — spent six of those mid-summer weeks in a snarling dogfight for the peak position with the Flaming Lips. Eventually, head Lip Wayne Coyne and company would send Thurston Moore and his crew packing,


but the writing was already on the wall: Sonic Youth's *Murray Street* was College Radio's album of the year. What makes *Murray Street* so special? Aside from writing a few of the strongest songs in its 21-year career (namely "Rain On Tin," "Disconnection Notice" and opener "The Empty Page"),

Sonic Youth officially added multi-tasker Jim O'Rourke to the band's lineup. His contributions were instantly noticeable; O'Rourke, who also mixed CMJ's No. 5 album of 2002, Wilco's *Yankee Hotel Foxtrot*, brought focus to

Sonic Youth's blissful walls of noise, without treading too hard on the NYC band's celebrated fondness for free-form experimentation. SY's ability to conjure up vast oceans of guitar squalls is thankfully still intact (see the absolutely captivating "Karen Revisited"), but the overall work is refreshingly balanced — and the band's best in years. Factor in the events of 9/11, which temporarily halted the recording of this album at the band's Lower Manhattan studio (on Murray Street, where an engine from one of the hijacked planes landed), and it's easy to understand why College Radio embraced this pivotal recording with such enthusiasm. — Kevin Boyce

FLAMING LIPS

Yoshimi Battles The Pink Robots (Warner Bros.)

Ah, the concept album. Once the territory of excessive rock bands with delusions of grandeur, these days it's pretty much seen as off limits. When the Flaming Lips announced that their new release was not only concept-based, but also that it was going to be called *Yoshimi Battles The Pink Robots*, we couldn't help suspecting that the notorious pranksters were having a laugh at our expense. But this album is far from a joke. *Yoshimi* saw the Lips surpassing everything they've done in the past, while sonically taking us into a technocratic future the likes of which we hadn't seen since Dan The Automator deposited listeners in the world of *Deltron 3030* two years ago. Beginning with the beat-and-acid melody fest of "Fight Test," singer Wayne Coyne and company unveiled a timeframe where evil robots threaten the human way of life; from what follows, it sounds like the band kidnapped DJ Shadow and dragged him into a time machine in an attempt to simultaneously improve on its last opus, *The Soft Bulletin*, and save the world. Mission accomplished — on both fronts. This album may have narrowly missed the No. 1 spot this year, but in terms of sheer accomplishment and scope, no one else even came close to it. — **Doug Levy**

BECK Sea Change

(DGC-Interscope) From the Alterna-anti-hero of "Loser" to the white boy funkster of "Sexx Laws," Beck is no stranger to reinvention. The haunting Sea Change saw him abandoning the playful disco of Midnight Vultures and the Hip-Hop experimentations of Odelay in favor of somber, acoustic guitar-based reflections on lost love. Arguably, it was a gamble for Beck to turn off the sampler, pick up a sixstring and go the introspective route, but it was a bet that paid

off with a seven-week run at the top of CMJ's Top 200 chart. Written to gain closure on a failed relationship, Sea Change is one of 2002's most intriguing records for a multitude of reasons, but most significantly, it serves as an introduction to a new Beck Hansen - one who is maturing and more comfortable in his own skin. In addition to spending a good portion of the year riding high on the CMJ charts, Beck also went out on one of 2002's best tours, with fellow chart-toppers the Flaming Lips acting as his backing band. If the past twelve months are anything to go on, the man still has many surprises up his sleeve. — Brad Filicky



ELVIS COSTELLO

When I Was Cruel (Island) 2002 was a good year for the legendary Elvis Costello; not only was it announced that he'll be inducted into the Rock And Roll Hall Of Fame in 2003, along with artists like The Clash and the Police, but, at 47-yearsold, Costello also released his fifth No. 1 College Radio album, When I Was Cruel. His first collection of new material in seven years — as well as his first No. 1 since 1982's Punch The Clock -When I Was Cruel was a strictly solo endeavor, although it does

have the nice feature of including two of the original Attractions, keyboardist Steve Nieve and drummer Pete Thomas. The result is Costello's edgiest work in recent memory, a love affair between new wave punk and jazz with innumerable highlights. Opener "45" and "Tear Off Your Own Head (It's A Doll Revolution)" rock as hard as anything on This Year's Model, while the seductive "Spooky Girlfriend" finds him spouting lyrics like, "I want a girl to turn my screw/ To wind my watch, to buckle my shoe/ And if she won't, her mother will do," over a slithering bassline. He can be cruel, indeed — but that's exactly what we love about Elvis the most. — Antonia Santangelo/Kevin Boyce

WILCO Yankee Hotel Foxtrot (Nonesuch)

By the time Wilco's Yankee Hotel Foxtrot finally emerged on retail shelves, it had already become one of 2001's most downloaded albums, made its way through a labyrinth of AOL Time Warner red tape and changed everyone's perception as to what a Wilco record should be. What record execs at Reprise considered to be "rough" was really just Jeff Tweedy and friends allowing their minds to experiment and wander further down the avantrock trail, where warped vocals, layers of sullen guitar work and

pansy-assed pop chicks, while truly defining "Women In Rock," it was surely this one. Sleater-Kinney has been producing excellent albums for years, but One Beat is the one that we had been waiting for. Chock-full of powerfully huge tracks, it shattered all preconceived notions of what a rock band should sound like, regardless of the sex of its members. Last summer's depressing transition into fall (and back to school) was made much easier with killer Sleater-Kinney cuts like "Combat Rock," "The Remainder," "Step Aside" and "Light-Rail Coyote." Not to mention that in a year where a number of other female bands, including Sahara Hotnights and the Donnas, truly did rock, S-K still came out on top. - Justin Kleinfeld

Educated in the school of raucous, hypnotic rock by professors like Fugazi, Quicksand and Sonic Youth, the brilliantly named ...And You Will Know Us By The Trail Of Dead gained notoriety for its visceral live shows, often resulting in emergency room visits and trashed instruments. While the group's anarchic stage performances were enough to nab the band plenty of press and a bur-

geoning fan base, it was the complex *Source Tags And Codes*, Trail Of Dead's Interscope debut, that transformed the Austin, Texas-based quartet into a College Radio darling. Ferocious, yet remarkably beautiful in contrast, *Source Tags* runs the gamut from gut-constricting noise, such as on "It Was There That I Saw You," "Homage" and "Days Of Being Wild," to hum-in-your-head-for-days numbers that hone in on melody rather than brute force, like the chilling "Baudelaire" and "Relative Ways." Consequently, the album didn't budge from the CMJ Top 200 chart for nearly five months. This band may leave paths of dead in its wake, but its heavenly racket makes you feel very much alive. — **Ryan Jones/Kevin Boyce**





Kill The Moonlight (Merge)

For the last 10 years, Spoon's chief export has been a sort of moody, angular rock. If it makes you feel better to call what this Austin, Texas outfit does "indie rock," then go right ahead — the size of the label never much mattered to main songwriter Britt Daniel, who has always churned out oddly catchy songs with a unique balance of urgency and craft. Spoon's fourth full-length album, *Kill The Moonlight*, is no exception. If anything, the

album pushed the band's nervy rock songs in different directions by employing starker arrangements than 2000's *Girls Can Tell.* Tracks like "Stay Don't Go," which took its main groove from Daniel's own breathy beatbox grunts, highlight the disc's focus on an insistent, rhythmic pulse more than any dramatic melodic changes, while the lively handclaps and tambourine beat of "The Way We Get By" back up that point. The song's bouncy piano riff is just one reason it was such a CMJ chart (and CMJ office) favorite. — **Steve Ciabattoni**

Maladroit (Geffen) Weezer's fourth full-length found Rivers Cuomo and his bandmates significantly more experienced and adventurous than when they started out - much like students entering their senior year of high school. Having made it through its freshman debut (the "Blue" album), the awkward sophomore phase of Pinkerton and the unforgettable junior-year parties (the "Green" album), Maladroit saw the everpopular group, once revered as the epitome of nerd-dom, shedding its past and reflecting on

careless prefixes bandied about by lazy rock-crits. A North American tour together proved that the boys made up a virile, down-stroking monolith that *lev-eled* the ballyhooed antics of its Interscope pals and Top 10 companions in Trail Of Dead. The thuggish "No One Knows" was the closest thing to stoner metal on MTV since Monster Magnet; plus, there's plenty of heavy-hitting drumming by the guy who played on the Tenacious D record. — **Christopher R. 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THE YEAR IN LOUD ROCK

002... where do we start? There were lots of happenings in our world and we're here to recap some of the major events that shaped 2K2 for Loud Rock!

Loud Rock lost two of its luminaries this spring, namely Megadeth and Fear Factory. In April, Dave Mustaine sadly pulled the plug on his successful post-Metallica thrash band, Megadeth. Mustaine had suffered severe nerve damage to his left arm and decided to bring an end to the band after nearly 20 years of thrash bliss. In semi-related news, another ex-Metallica member, bassist Jason Newsted, helped to resurrect one of the most influential bands in metal history by joining Voivod as a full-time member. The revamped 'Vod will release its latest in March 2003. Another great loss was that of Fear Factory. The cyber-metal band called it a day, and at the time, many thought the split was based on vocalist Burton C. Bell's disenchantment with playing metal. A few months later, it was revealed that internal tension with portly guitarist Dino Cazares was at the root of the split, since the three remaining members of Fear Factory (Bell, drummer Raymond Herrera and bassist Christian Olde Wolbers) have since reformed and are continuing on



without him. Also, rumors of Dark Angel and Vio-Lence (minus Robert Flynn) reunions floated around this year.

Ozzfest, which suffered in recent years due to a serious lack of extreme metal, impressed us in 2002, simply by including

Keegan Boyce, listening to Slayer for the first time.

extremely credible metal bands on the side stage, including Meshuggah, Hatebreed and Down. Those three bands alone along with System Of A Down on the main stage — made Ozzfest 2002 worth the price of admission. Not only did Ozzy Osbourne spice up the metal with his annual summer trek, he gave American pop culture a real shot in the arm thanks to his MTV reality program, *The Osbournes*. The show not only spotlighted the dysfunctional, hysterical Osbourne household (Ozzy cussin' in that charming Cockney accent, Ozzy getting a tongue bath from his dog, daughter Kelly and wife Sharon maxing out the Am Ex), but it also exposed the culture of metal to the masses. *The Osbournes* triumphantly returned for a second season, even as the Double O's missus battled colon cancer.

On the business side of things, Trustkill Records, one the most successful boutique labels in hardcore, partnered up with RED Distribution, ensuring more records in more stores. It's a milestone for Trustkill, which should no doubt propel the label to the same ranks as Victory in the next few years. Speaking of which, Victory Records — the quintessential name in independent hardcore was rumored to have closed a deal with MCA Records, where MCA would acquire a 25 percent stake in Victory and assist in the distribution and promotion of Victory releases - much like MCA distributes and promotes Drive-Thru Records. However, the deal never went through. If anything, it's an indicator that major labels are definitely taking the temperature of the indie label scene. Victory continues to be a force to be reckoned with, as acts like Hatebreed and Thursday graduated to major label deals. Also this year, Roadrunner and IDJMG continued to enjoy their partnership, as Slipknot side project Stone Sour steadily broke wide open.

Furthermore, Century Media continued to promote Nuclear Blast's artists to Loud Rock radio, and the lengthy No. 1 success of **Soilwork**, **Meshuggah** and **In Flames** are testaments that the arrangement is working just fine.

2002 also saw the tragic loss of several members of the Loud Rock family. During Ozzfest, **Drowning Pool**'s affable singer, **Dave Williams**, was found dead in his tour bunk. Some speculated that Williams' hard-living lifestyle was the cause of death, but a coroner's report indicated heart disease took his life early. He was 30. **Death** frontman/**Control Denied** guitarist **Chuck Schuldiner** lost his valiant battle with a rare brain stem tumor, despite numerous experimental treatments and donations made by fans and musicians to help extend his treatments. Also, **Alice In Chains** vocalist **Layne Staley** was found dead of a drug overdose in Seattle. The gravel-throated singer battled addiction for much of his adult life and his dependence on heroin was well chronicled in many of his band's songs, most prominently on 1992's *Dirt*. Rest in peace; you will all be missed somethin' awful.

2002 also saw the return of many major acts. **Guns N' Roses** (or "The **Axl Rose** Sideshow") embarked on an arena tour, but promptly cancelled it after just a handful of shows, including a sold-out Madison Square Garden appearance. **Audioslave** — featuring ex-members of **Rage Against The Machine** and **Soundgarden** — wowed the music world with a debut platter that was heavily influenced by **Black Sabbath** and **Led Zeppelin**.

And finally, some records that just plain rocked our world: Avenged Sevenfold, Sounding The Seventh Trumpet; Bleeding Through, Portrait Of A Goddess; Norma Jean, Bless The Martyr And Kiss The Child; The Crown, Crowned In Terror; Great Deceiver, A Venom Well Designed; Eighteen Visions, Vanity.

Also this year, CMJ Crucial Spins celebrated its second year of existence! **Amy S.** exited CMJ to take a gig at Roadrunner, and then triumphantly returned as Loud Rock Editor in August (while still retaining the Roadrunner job — no, she has no free time at all). Furthermore, CMJ's former Loud Rock Editor, **Kevin Boyce**, was promoted to Managing Editor of the magazine and then became a first-time father roughly eight weeks later (no, he doesn't have any free time either). We're sure Kevin's son, **Keegan Elijah**, will be making the metal fist as soon as his motor skills develop further! Daddy just introduced the boy to **Slayer** and "Etiquette In The Moshpit" will be the title of the first of many father-son lectures that Kevin is planning to deliver to his new son.

It was doubtlessly an exciting year and we can't cover *everything* that happened. So, just make sure you take time out every week in 2003 for your weekly installments of CMJ Loud Rock, where you'll get everything and anything you want to know that's currently impacting the format!

LOUD ROCK ALBUMS OF THE YEAR



HATEBREED

Perseverance (Universal) Hatebreed's *Satisfaction Is The Death Of Desire* (Victory) perfected the art of the two-minute, breakdown-loaded hardcore anthem and it made you want to rip out your neighbor's throat with your teeth and join the local chapter of the Slam Dancer's Union. It took four *very long* years for *Perseverance*

to materialize, thanks to the band's Iron Man touring schedule and a dispute with its former label. Additionally, Hatebreed's success and simplistic savagery presented a whole new set of problems; fans demanded that the band return with a molten megadestructor that was worth the wait. Hatebreed fans were rabidly starved for anything new from the band, so much that the Connecticut crew could have gone to a Mexican restaurant, ate burritos, and farted on the mic and fans would have worshipped it. But Perseverance impacted like a Category-5 hurricane and demolished all doubts; it multiplied the mosh factor and the blue-collar rage of its predecessor tenfold. An Ozzfest side stage stint, the departure of longtime guitarist Lou "Boulder" Richards, and 200,000 copies of Perseverance later, Hatebreed still fucks shit up. When Jamey Hatebreed barked, "I will be heard," Loud Rock radio listened, nailing Perseverance to the top of the 2002 yearend Loud Rock chart.



DOWN

Down II: A Bustle In Your Hedgerow (Elektra)

Somewhere, the substance abusin' members of Down are toking up to celebrate topping the 2002 year-end Crucial Spins list. Down, like Hatebreed, waited several years in between albums, but the band had a different excuse: its members have other full-time

commitments; Philip Anselmo and Rex Brown spent formative years in a little band called Pantera, guitarist Pepper Keenan rocks the C.O.C. hammer and Jimmy Bower plays in eyehategod. *Down II: A Bustle In Your Hedgerow* pulls Anselmo out of the militaristic, drill sergeant bark of Pantera and coaxes his rather adept singing voice to the forefront. *Down II* worships dutifully at the Church Of Black Sabbath — it's a weed-friendly, unfussy affair that rumbles like thunder. The band enjoyed a headlining stint on Ozzfest's side stage this summer (it eschewed the stuffy main stage) and managed to corrode our eardrums the same way the members erode their livers with whiskey and other nefarious substances. *Down II* is pulsating proof that rock 'n' roll ain't noise pollution.

SHADOWS FALL

The Art Of Balance

(Century Media) Shadows Fall is a Loud Rock radio darling; every album from this band has a magnetic attraction to the plum position of No. 1 on the Loud Rock chart. Shadows Fall is a metal missing link — the bridge between Bay Area thrash (á la Metallica, Testament and Exodus),

the scorched earth ferocity and technical prowess of Swedish death metal and the moshable thickness of American metalcore. *The Art Of Balance* retains the distinct features that made 2000's *Of One Blood* a classic, but expands on another element: The album unlocks the rock 'n' roll fire that burns deep inside Shadows Fall. Strip away all the accoutrements and *The Art Of Balance* is a rock 'n' roll album at the core. As a result, it hogged the No. 1 spot on the Loud Rock and Crucial Spins charts for weeks on end. We're charting Shadows Fall's career along the same trajectory as Metallica; *The Art Of Balance* is like *Ride The Lightning* — someday, we're going to get the "Black Album" out of Shadows Fall.

Alive Or Just Breathing (Roadrunner)

What happens when a New England band sows the seeds of Swedish and American metalcore, releases an unfettered metal album on a label celebrated for the glory of its metal past, embarks on a series of summer tours, gets praised

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up the wazoo for its seamless fusion, then loses its ultra-talented singer unexpectedly? You probably think said band would fall apart, as a dream and potential go unrealized. You couldn't be more wrong. Killswitch Engage improved by light years when Blood Has Been Shed singer Howard Jones assumed the lead singer role from the gone-but-not-forgotten Jesse Leach. Despite the drama, *Alive Or Just Breathing* is an emotional, spiritual journey that celebrates thrash and death metal without sounding dated, while injecting it with chunky metalcore. Loud Rock radio rewarded *Breathing* with weeks at the top of both Loud Rock charts and never turned its back on the band. Killswitch also illustrates that despite criticism, Roadrunner is still committed to the genre that is, was, and always will be its lifeblood.


THE YEAR IN REVIEW



IN FLAMES

Reroute To Remain (Nuclear Blast) *Reroute To Remain* was an important album for In Flames. What would the Swedish band do after 2000's untouchable *Clayman*, which made the band many friends in high places? (Tours with Slipknot and Slayer came a'calling.) Would In Flames commercialize its melodic death metal, especially since *Reroute* was its last album

for Nuclear Blast and A&R reps openly professed love for the band? Well, *Reroute To Remain* found the band "remaining" true to its signature sound of Iron Maiden-on-speed, backed by synths and programming. While many diehard Flames fans turned their noses up at the album's "accessible" bend (and this *is* In Flames we're talking about), *Reroute To Remain*'s sweet melody and cranially damaging riffs could've single-handedly sounded the death knell for false metal. The future record label home of the band is still up in the air as of press time; may the best one win the In Flames sweepstakes.



SOILWORK

Natural Born Chaos (Nuclear Blast)

If the year-end Loud Rock charts are any indication, Eurometal is blazing at a fever pitch and it's about to pop! Ever since the genre — defined by plaster-cracking riffs tempered by a keen knack for melody — made its way stateside, fans have come out in droves.

Natural Born Chaos is Soilwork's umpteenth album, but it's the one that called most attention to the band, thanks to that catchierthan-crabs-from-a-two-dollar-hooker chorus of "As We Speak." Paying serious homage to At The Gates and Carcass, and with an obvious love of synths and programming, *Natural Born Chaos* finds Soilwork truly coming into its own, and enjoying its first time as a No. 1 Loud Rock radio band. Soilwork ages like a fine wine and our community will be there, ready to sip, every time the band pops the cork on a new bottle.



SUPERJOINT RITUAL Use Once And Destroy

(Sanctuary)

Philip Anselmo rears his greasy, pot-addled head on the 2002 yearend Loud Rock charts for the second time, and again, it's *not* with Pantera! Anselmo is the self-proclaimed "King of Goddamn Modern Heavy Metal" and we have

to agree with his royal "high"ness. Superjoint Ritual's *Use Once And Destroy* was Anselmo and his cohort Jimmy Bower's way of saluting Black Flag-style punk rock and hardcore. It was as though Anselmo gargled with a vat of bile when recording this filth-encrusted gem, which lodged itself in the No. 1 slot despite some hefty competition. Rot in hell, Presley; Anselmo is The King — the Confederate flag is his cape, the pot leaf is his crown and heavy metal is his dominion on *Use Once And Destroy*.



MESHUGGAH

Nothing (Nuclear Blast) When the Ozzfest 2002 side stage was announced, the name "Meshuggah" situated among a plethora of major label acts stuck out like a mangled thumb. The likes of Meshuggah's walls of noise had not been heard tear-assing outta Ozzfest since Neurosis graced its side stages. It seems Jack

Osbourne's love of the band helped the Swedes case for an American summer, but tried 'n' true metalheads already have a passionate love affair with Meshuggah. *Nothing*'s discordance chafed like an acid drenched slab of pumice that goes down rough, but metal isn't supposed to be smooth or pretty. In 2002, *Nothing*, which owned the No. 1 slot on both Loud Rock and Crucial Spins charts, indicated that the pure, pristine underground can camp out and coexist with the polluted mainstream.



ARCH ENEMY

Wages Of Sin (Century Media) For unbiased metalheads, Arch Enemy carries weight because it features Michael Amott of Carcass on guitar. To the rest of the world, the stunning grace and beautiful looks of frontwoman Angela Gossow are what attracts them to Arch Enemy. However, once Gossow opened her mouth and exorcised demons

through her throat, suddenly, the phrase "Hell hath no fury like a woman scorned" took on a whole new meaning. Fuck chromosomes! On *Wages Of Sin*, Gossow howled with the best of them. Death metal has entered the Ovarian Age, thanks to *Wages Of Sin*. Close your eyes and you won't even be able to guess Gossow's gender. Slay, lady, slay.



SOULFLY

3 (Roadrunner) If there's one thing the year-end chart reflects, it's that Century Media/Nuclear Blast and Roadrunner are the definitive Loud Rock labels, looking at the way their artists dominate the final standings. Soulfly's brain trust Max Cavalera — he needs no introduction, but most of us will always associate him

with the groundbreaking Sepultura — is one of the last remaining bastions of old school Roadrunner glory and his fans will follow him to the ends of the earth. *3* is another worthwhile installment in the Soulfly saga, where Cavalera employs tropical percussion, bass-heavy beats and a low-end cluster of riffs set to his personal, passionate lyrics. Like death and taxes, Soulfly clamping down the No. 1 slot on Loud Rock and Crucial Spins with vice-grip force is a sure thing. So, in a world marked by disorder and chaos, *3* was both a metal comfort and a given.

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"I don't know about other companies, but College Radio is extremely important to Island Def Jam. anuary, 2002 saw the official launch of CMJ Retail's first Top 100 Independent Retail, Major Chain, One Stop and In-store Play charts. It was one of those moments. After months and months of encouraging, cajoling and coercing (ha!) retailers and record labels to support our vision of a new rallying point for raising and addressing retail concerns, a child was finally born.

That night, after we put the finishing touches on our charts (and later shipped them off into the hands of those accounts and labels whose support made that first issue possible), we felt enormous gratitude. Finishing that first issue drove home a point we were absolutely committed to, that ultimately the pages of CMJ Retail didn't belong to us, but to the voice of our independent (and independently minded) retailers and the record labels who still believed those stores played a critical role in breaking artists. As corny as it sounds, and as much as we sigh with relief every time we close out the week's charts and put our weekly issue to bed, we also feel that same sense of gratitude we did with our first issue of the year.

How many of us take the time to read the "Thank You" section in CD liner notes? For some strange reason I always have. I'm taken by the enormous collective effort required by so many people to make an album (let alone market it). I think the sheer force of the behind-thescenes effort, creativity and goodwill to make our favorite records happen is sometimes lost on us. In a conversation I had this week with the head of one of our participating indie coalitions, I got to thanking him for his support. His immediate response was that no real thanks could really go to him, because it was the collective support of individual one-by-one stores that really deserved the thanks and credit. And, of course, he's right (though we thank him for his humble support anyway). Just as it apparently takes a village to raise a record, our first anniversary is marked by the support of individual stores whose individual people made their own singular decisions to raise their voices with us each week.

Collectively, thanks to everyone who so willingly offered to "Speak Out" across all our issues this year. The deluge of responses we get each week to your comments shows your voices are being heard by our readers. Next week, in our 25th Anniversary inaugural issue, new A.I.M.S president, Eric Levin, will "Speak Out" as the new coalition officially kicks off its first year.

Well, it's with mixed feelings that I look back on 2002. It was the year we saw industry sales slide further, but a large number of indie stores hold their own. It was the year Best Buy and their ilk used their label support to drive down the perceived value of hit music, but it's also the year that over 35% of our year-end chart was taken up by excellent indie releases. It was yet another year that we watched the labels engage in public displays of affection for big box retailers, but was also the year that artists and their managers started showing interest in working with us directly. As 2003 looms, I find myself neither half full nor half empty. The one trend I'm seeing that does alarm me is deeper fragmentation of the customer base, with shoppers falling into one of two camps: price or service. I'm having a hard time seeing how the traditional "big boys" of record retailing are going to make it through next year and that makes for a very scary landscape.

It's been a benchmark year for Virgin Megastores, as we celebrated our 10-year anniversary in the United States, as well as opening our 22nd and 23rd stores in Boston and Salt Lake City. While we have unfortunately seen the music industry struggle in 2002, we have also witnessed many companies, like Virgin, diversifying into other areas of entertainment in order to ensure our profitability and growth. Although we will always keep music as our core offering, we feel that the DVD has kept many of us afloat and I believe it will continue to do so over the next 12 months. I also believe, without a doubt, that music will return. As an industry, we need to be far more introspective, questioning all that we do and how we do it. We cannot afford to point fingers at each other within the supply chain, but must seek to tackle the issues we all face with both spirit and creativity. At Virgin, we feel our optimism will carry us into the New Year as we continue to seek new store opportunities. Needless to say, we wish all of you in the industry much success in 2003.

What a year. And we thought 2001 was bad! Sure, last year we dealt with terrorism, but in 2002 the independent music retailers dealt with: co-op advertising dropping by 20%, higher list prices (\$18.97 and higher), internet downloading, CD burning, big box stores luring our customers in with prices \$2 to \$4 under cost, bands doing less in-store promotions, venues demanding a 10%-20% cut to sell at shows and Michigan's family-owned Harmony House downsizing from 44 to two stores. What has 2002 taught us? Survival. If you want to play with the big boys, you have to reinvent yourself. I guarantee that 2003 will see more indie store for sale on eBay and more downsizing at the labels. Indie stores are on the endangered species list for 2003. When an indie store falls in the woods, does anyone hear it?



Birth Announcements

This year Virgin proved their name is achingly ironic by giving birth to not one, but two bouncing baby Megastores. The first was a Beantown baby boy born on a cold February in Boston. A grand opening "store shower" was held with special guests Alien Ant Farm and the New England Patriot Cheerleaders. Virgin birthed a Salt Lake City tot in November, the chain's 23rd child so far. Twenty-three kids? They're like the O.D.B. of record stores!

In 2002, **Park Avenue CDs** gave birth to two beautiful stores. The first, named "Park Ave Junior," was born on the campus of Orlando's University Of Central Florida.
