PHANTOM PLANET

Phantom Planet (Epic)

Look out the proverbial window, and you'll find the sunny vocals, clean guitars, poppy melodies and huge sing-along choruses of Phantom Planet's last album, *The Guest*, heaped up where they've been tossed. Distortion now rules on *Phantom Planet*, both

on guitars and vocals, while the rhythm section — most notably the bass — has been distinctly brought up front. But just when you think they've discarded everything you once loved (along with drummer Jason Schwartman, recently departed to pursue acting full-time), the Planeteers reveal that, despite the major stylistic change, they're better than ever. Producer Dave Fridmann, known for more ethereal work with the likes of the Flaming Lips and Mercury Rev, shows himself to be equally skilled at crafting a raw rock sound here; and if there's one thing that's *not* different, it's that the songs are still catchier than hell. One spin of a frenetic track like "Making A Killing" or lead single "Big Brat" will leave it hopelessly stuck in your head. Even better, instead of singing

along, now you can *shout* along to Phantom Planet. — **Doug Levy**

Talkie Walkie (Astralwerks) For a band known as a major player on the electronic music scene, Air certainly uses an awful lot of... banjo. To be fair, 1) the instrument is most prominently featured on a sci-fi space romp ("Alpha Beta Gaga") and a robot love song ("Biological"), and 2) it sounds great. The French duo has taken

a more back-to-basics approach with *Talkie Walkie*, leaning once again in large part toward sparser, more lullaby-like songwriting, with the most notable difference being that the two (Nicolas Godin and JB Dunckel, but mostly the latter) handle all the vocals themselves this time. In a way, the group has been teasing us in the two years since its last album, *10,000 Hz Legend* — offering up background music to a spoken word performance (last year's *City Reading*) and a single new song for a film (*Lost In Translation*'s "Alone In Kyoto," which also quietly closes out this disc). Whether it was justified in doing so, however, can be answered quite simply,

with just a few deep, satisfying breaths of this fresh Air. — **Doug Levy**

eing that most brothers and sisters are at each other's throats growing up, it's not all that surprising that few of them see spending hours-upon-hours making music together as a worthwhile occupation. Bruce and Erica Driscoll, however, are a notable exception. Not only do the siblings have a beautiful relationship, but they also make beautiful music together. The lush cinescapes of the pair's music are as diverse and exotic sounding as their international upbringing — and with good reason.

"We were raised between Michigan and Brazil, so we grew up listening to Brazilian music, like Jobim and Caetano Veloso," explains Erica. "I also remember Simon And Garfunkel, John Denver and the Carpenters being played a lot when we were kids; but I was *really* inspired to start a band when I fell in love with the Smiths and the Pet Shop Boys in high school."

Bruce. "We got a lot of industry attention, but we started to realize that it wasn't exactly the band we wanted it to be. We did most of the writing but, stylistically, we were moving further and further away from what came naturally. So, eventually, we decided to put that to bed and start something completely new."

Blending downbeat, jazzy European pop with Latin influences, the duo went on to craft an evocative sound that is at once its own, while also reminiscent of a number of other languorously effective acts — some of whom the two take a number of their cues from. It was, therefore, extremely flattering when **Ivy's Andy Chase** not only approved of their work, but also wanted to be a part of it.

"We got the call from Andy, saying that he and **Dominique** [**Durand**, Ivy vocalist] hadn't stopped listening to our demos since the package arrived," remembers Erica. "We were just writing and recording music that we loved, so the fact that someone who's



had a major influence on us loves it too is the biggest compliment."

As a result, Astaire traveled out to NYC to record with Chase, where the group laid down three songs, all set to feature on its upcoming debut album. The disc will also include eight other recently-recorded dreamy, bittersweet offerings that the group has been distributing to a lucky few on CD-R — proof that, even on its own, Astaire can produce a fully realized widescreen musical vision.

"We're very self-sufficient," affirms Bruce. "We don't have a lot of outside support or funding. And we're not just a band; we're a production team. We enjoy collaborating with other artists and producers, but it's nice not having to depend on someone else."

Even so, Astaire is an act that *you* can depend on to deliver great music, and to receive a lot more attention in the coming year. — **Doug Levy**

DIGITAL MUSIC SITES PUSH INTO MAINSTREAM



hile many of us spend the beginning weeks of 2004 recovering from too much spiked eggnog, holiday cookies and New Year's late-night debauchery, the wild world of digital music continues to march steadfastly onward. The format's popularity continues to grow in leaps and bounds, with millions of free giveaways about to be unleashed in order to lure in new customers. Plus, there's been yet another high-profile entry into the Web store market that could reach out to consumers who may never find iTunes by themselves.

This year will see plenty of digital music giveaways by big, third parties like beverage manufacturers, airlines, credit card and fast food companies. For example, Miller Brewing

CD BAB Period Ending 1/3/2004 Company is joining with Napster's parent company, Roxio, to give away thousands of Napster-branded MP3 players and downloads starting this summer. Perhaps most impressive, however, are the 100 million downloads to be given away by iTunes (four times more than the company has sold to date) as part of a Super Bowl promotion that will swing into action this February. Promotions such as these will expand the sites' exposure well beyond digital and musical early-adopters, reaching into the bigger mainstream market of consumers that might not otherwise know about them. In fact, Apple CEO Steve Jobs has stated that the iTunes promotion "will go down in history as igniting the legal downloading market."

stores prove that they can draw customers, more and more companies will attempt to cash in on the craze. The latest to offer a digital music service is none other than retail behemoth Wal-Mart Stores, Inc. The world's biggest company is already featuring digital downloads on its Web site, www.walmart.com, as part of a "testing phase." The site is offering around 200,000 tracks and collecting customer feedback, in order to make any necessary modifications before officially launching the download service with expanded choices sometime in the spring of 2004. The company will follow its business model of undercutting other stores, by selling individual song downloads for 88 cents each, or whole albums for as little as \$8.80. However, just like at regular Wal-Mart stores, only edited albums are available from the company's site, and album art has been censored, as well.



nynics have prophesized the demise of Jazz for more than 30 years. But, as we enter 2004, there's plenty of proof that that old prediction is far from true. Below is an unscientific but broad survey of some of the most important, interesting, or otherwise notable releases that are heading our way in the first quarter of the year. Release dates have been included whenever possible, but are subject to change.

Two Trumpeters Trumpeting, One Pianist Playing

Mercurial trumpeter Dave Douglas continues to keep us guessing about what will be next — the guy has like 12 bands! With *Strange Liberation* (1/27), Douglas returns with the quintet (which includes **Chris Potter** and **Uri Caine**) that made *The Infinite*, augmenting it with guitarist **Bill Frisell**. Caine and Frisell's individual sounds each have a lot to do with the overall feel of the album, and each receives plenty of solo time, as well. • Leave it to **Wynton Marsalis** to name his album *The* *Magic Hour* (3/9) — confidence has never been an issue with this one. Marsalis's first album for Blue Note, and his first Jazz studio album since 1999, The Magic Hour sees him leading a young supporting trio through an eight-song program of originals. • Pianist Brad Mehldau appears on the new Joel Frahm album, but Mehldau also has a new disc with his own trio coming out, dubbed Anything Goes (2/24). While 2002's Largo dove into the Beatles, Radiohead and Antonio Carlos Jobim, this one takes a more traditional Jazz tack, covering such classics as "Get Happy," "Nearness Of You" and "I've Grown Accustomed To Your Face." Watch for a feature on Mehldau in Issue 853 of CMJ New Music Report.

Legends Making Music

Legendary saxophonist James Moody makes his debut for the revamped Savoy label with *Homage* (1/27). The album mixes compositions from other Jazz giants (Horace Silver, Herbie Hancock, Chick Corea) with a couple of tunes from Moody himself and some Charlie Parker

younger folks - pretty, in a straight-ahead sort of way. • Also on Savoy, singer Andy Bey returns with American Songs (1/27), his first new album since 2001's Tuesdays In Chinatown. The music is as dark, moody and exquisite as Bey's sensual baritone, making this a fantastic 10-song effort of standards uniquely interpreted by one of the most important singers working today. • The timeless timekeeper Roy Haynes seems to be in a sort of stasis — the drummer looks and acts much as he did when he played with Charlie Parker more than 50 years ago. Fountain Of Youth (2/24), to be released on Dreyfus, finds Haynes leading a hot young quartet through a live session of tunes by Pat Metheny, Thelonious Monk, Irving Berlin and others.

Sophomore Slump?

Will the **Bad Plus** suffer a sophomore slump with *Give* (3/9)? Hell, no! The chemistry that made 2003's *These Are The Vistas* such a hit with Jazz and non-Jazz fans alike is still intact — the band even brought back engineer Tchad Blake to helm the new session. Covers include versions of Black Sabbath's "Iron Man," the Pixies' "Velouria" and Ornette Coleman's "Street Woman." Fans who have caught the band live over the last few months will no doubt also recognize such excellent new originals as "Dirty Blonde" and "Do Your Sums – Die Like A Dog – Play For Home." • Norah Jones obviously knows something about media saturation, as well, after winning a pile of Grammys and appearing in magazines that rarely touch an artist with a record on a Jazz label. *Feels Like Home* modern Latin Jazz on Ochimini (1/20), his fifth album for Cubop, which sees him joined by a hot cast of West Coast players for one slammin' dance party. • Representing NYC, South Bronx native **Ray Vega** follows up 2002's *Pa Lante* with *Squeeze, Squeeze* (2/3) on Palmetto. • Steel drummer **Andy Narell** has carved out quite a niche as a solo artist and as co-leader of the **Caribbean Jazz Project**. He returns with a steel pan orchestra on *The Passage* (March), which comes out on Heads Up. responsible for combining Jazz, funk, soul and disco, literally inventing the Acid Jazz and groove sound back in the '70s. Ayers has now opened up his private stock of tapes for *Virgin Ubiquity*, the first of many collections of unreleased material to come out on Rapster. • Noted organist Wayne Horvitz and drummer Tucker Martine have a new project called Mylab, which features several notable guests. Even though the self-titled album (2/3) is all over the map, there's a distinct psychedelic edge to its grooves.

(2/10) is another singer-songwriterly effort, and while it probably won't get as much airtime on Jazz stations, Jazz-heads can dig into her cover of **Duke Ellington**'s "Melancholia."

Artists About To Hit

Takashi Matsunaga makes his Blue Note debut with a trio effort entitled Storm Zone (2/10). This 17-year-old Japanese pianist will scare the crap out of fans of straight-ahead piano, as he rolls together the prodigious chops of a Jacky Terrasson, Bill Evans' delicate melody, and bits of Keith Jarrett's tumbling rhythms. Having written all nine tunes here, Matsunaga has a talent that seems to know no boundaries. • Voted a rising star in Downbeat's 2003 critics' poll, Bay Area guitarist Mimi Fox plays it straight-forward, down 'n' dirty, and awfully pretty. She's The Woman (3/23), on Favored Nation, is Fox's third album. A must for fans of Joe Pass and Grant Green.

Latin And Other Ethnic Fusions

Cuban conga legend **Francisco Aguabella** covers everything from old rumba to

Rapper/producer El-P heads up his own extremely hip Def Jux Hip-Hop label, but he sets it aside for a bit to work with Thirsty Ear's Blue Series Continuum people on High Water (Mark) (2/17). The disc's eight tracks are everything fans could hope for - poignant Jazz interludes give way to programmed Hip-Hop grooves, while instrumental improvisations are woven into rich tapestries of sound. Most of the voices heard here are slices of studio banter, but the music speaks volumes on its own. • Pianist Craig Taborn is the future of Jazz, matching intellect and ambition, the acoustic and the electronic. On Junk Magic (3/23), his second Thirsty Ear release, Taborn is joined by the dynamic duo of the Bad Plus's Dave King and violinist Mat Maneri.

Groove

The groove doesn't get any deeper than when the mighty **Roy Ayers** is playing. He could just as easily have fit into the "Legends" section, as the vibraphonist is


The Brooklyn free-jazz party combo Gold Sparkle Trio teams up with Windy City kingpin Ken Vandermark for Brooklyn Cantos (January). Filled with hard-hitting rhythms and soaring saxophone work from both Charles Waters and Vandermark, this one won't disappoint those looking for a jolt of energy. • The Chicago Underground has dazzled us with great music coming in different sized packages (ranging from duo to orchestra). Slon (1/27) features a trio and comes out on cool Chicago label Thrill Jockey. Up to the group's usual high standards, the music is a haunting combination of cutting-edge electronic sounds and live improvisation that never tries to cram too much into a given moment. • Drummer Chad Taylor also has a band, called Sticks And Stones, which will see its second album come out on Thrill Jockey. The trio has a more organic sound, and features bassist Josh Abrams and impressive reedwoman Matana Roberts. Without the electronics, Taylor has room to shine, playing with a dexterity we didn't see when he first arrived on the scene. **NMR**




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



hen John Vanderslice first rose to prominence in the mid-'90s, fronting the experimental, psychedelic pop band MK Ultra, he was hailed for the use of artsy noise, brainy guitar flourishes and poetic nuance. But it wasn't until Vanderslice's first solo album, *Mass Suicide Occult Figurines*, was released in 2000 that his true brilliance shone through. A perfectly disjointed pop album, the disc even caused a minor media sensation with the song "Bill Gates Must Die," complete with a made-up lawsuit and Vanderslice's claims of being pushed around by Microsoft goons. Four years later, he's preparing to open his *Cellar Door* — the singer-songwriter's fourth solo LP takes a beautifully intimate and alarmingly honest look at both his family and his fears.

What's your life like when you're not on tour?

Usually I'm recording, if there are days open in the studio. I'm always dabbling in stuff or working on songs in the studio. When I'm off tour, I really need to reset my loner vibe. I love being around people, but I just need to be in my apartment for a while. I have a really mellow life here. I do the same thing every day. I'll eat a burrito every day, have some tea for breakfast and some granola. It doesn't change. There's no variation, and I love that. I like it when everything is very "wash, rinse and repeat."

You're a pretty big Hip-Hop fan. Would you ever let the Neptunes produce one of your records?

Oh, man. Fuck, that'd be awesome. Yeah, I really like their stuff. I like their approach a lot. I listen to that **Justin Timberlake** record all the time. It's a pretty sick record, man. [Laughs] I listen to anything. I'm completely un-snobby about what I like. The **Neptunes** are the shit. I like **Timbaland** a lot, too. I would say that Hip-Hop comprises at least 20–30 percent of what I listen to. The new **Aceyalone** record and **Devin The Dude** are really good. I have a really high tolerance for commercial rap. I love that there are these totally silly singles — like **Clipse's** "Grindin." I *love* that shit. I eat it up. There's also a lot of great non-radio-style stuff, like **Prince Paul**, **El-P**, **Aesop Rock** and some of the Anticon stuff. There's just a lot of invention in Hip-Hop.

Cellar Door seems much more personal than your past records. Is there any reason?

Well, I did two concept records in a row, and I just decided that I had to write about my life again. Some stuff happened in my life that I wanted to sing about in kind of an oblique way. It was really nice to be more first-person again, for sure. I think that I'm going to keep doing that, even though my family and other people get really upset with me [laughs]. People get mad at you and you have to be really careful, but I think that, right now, I'm in the mode of

wanting to sing about my life a little bit. I've always moved stuff around, though. It's probably much like a novelist writing about himself, but it's kind of shifted over a bit. I mean, the story is basically true, but he might have moved it over 10 degrees or so. There are a lot of songs that are directly personal and autobiographical.

You sing about your family a lot, and it's not very flattering. What were their reactions to the record?

It's not a flattering record, and my family is really complicated, like anyone else's. There are definitely some feelings about all of that stuff. But, as it is with a lot of families, there's a lot that's not said. It's really weird. I have a long history of writing about really crazy subjects — like bombing a post office or killing **Bill Gates** or working at a methamphetamine lab — but a lot of times it's like the boy who cried wolf, and people are like, "Well, here we go again." But there has got to be something about me, the family, my mom, etc. I've definitely gotten comments from my family, but they're cool and it's just a complicated situation.

The album does end on an uplifting note. Surviving a lightning bolt?

Well, waking up in a summer field surrounded by the sun. It's lovely imagery.

Yeah, I'm a very optimistic person, and that song ["June July"] is like a letter to my brother, who wasn't very healthy in his life at that point. The idea of the song, for me, was that you can transcend and be reborn after a devastating and miserable experience. The song is really specific. A lightning bolt hits him, and he wakes up as a survivor. That has got to be a very freeing thing. Like in *Moby Dick*, there's a point where he goes out on a raft to try to spear a whale. The raft gets flipped over, and he envisions his own death. He's so sure that he's going to die, that when he's recovered and is back on the ship, he realizes that the rest of his life is just a blank check, because he should've died and he didn't. It's a freeing moment for him, and that's what I wanted to get at for my brother. He's better now [laughs].

ICED EARTH The Glorious Burden (SPV)

Iced Earth has always been a bright spot in the often-laughable power metal universe. That's because band mastermind Jon Schaffer has a vision and a concept that's smarter than your average power metal man. Iced Earth got an added boost of cred when it replaced departing vocalist Matthew Barlow with none other than Tim "Ripper" Owens —

who previously took over for Rob Halford in Judas Priest, only to be ousted by Halford's return in 2003. Schaffer has said that, in the past, he actually wrote Iced Earth music with Ripper in mind, so it makes sense that the singer is a perfect fit on *The Glorious Burden*, an album built around famous battles in history. Helping the group to sound like a totally different and rejuvenated band, Owens sings with a pitch that reaches even further than his predecessor's; while he often sounds like someone tried to rip his nuts off, the vocalist hits the highest of octaves on "Valley Forge," 9/11 tribute "When The Eagle Cries" and "The Reckoning." But while the addition of the new singer has shifted the sound of Iced Earth, there are still plenty of the kinds of noodly guitar solos and lush instrumental arrangements that will make you want to ride a galloping steed into battle. Warning: Do not play *The Glorious Burden* in the presence of glass valuables, because they *will* shatter.

Don't Explain (Palmetto) Having first played together while attending the same high school, there's probably little need for saxophonist Joel Frahm and pianist Brad Mehldau to explain anything to each other at this point. Nevertheless, Mehldau's career has quickly taken

him to the upper echelon of working pianists, while Frahm developed at a slower rate and can be found backing such folks as Jane Monheit, Jim Cifelli and Matt Wilson. Here, on a fairly adventurous program filled mostly with Jazz classics, the two play with a light, springy touch, particularly on "Get Happy" and the first of two versions of "Round Midnight," while elsewhere, the edges are smoothed over for a fluid version of the Beatles' "Mother Nature's Son." Through it all, the duo shines both together and separately, with imaginative choices and fine harmonic interplay.

FRED HESS QUARTET The Long And Short Of It (Tapestry)

Denver saxophonist Fred Hess has put out a number of excellent albums over the last few years, including three in 2003. On his first of 2004, Hess heads an impressive quartet that also includes trumpeter Ron Miles, bassist Ken Filiano and drummer Matt Wilson. The playing is adventurous without getting screechy, often working at a mid-pace tempo with plenty of lyricism from Miles and Hess. Wilson is his usual polyrhythmic self, playing with authority and humor, most notably on "The Clef's Go To The Big City." Among other highlights is the jaunty "Happened Yesterday." While the tunes range from a relatively brief two to a full eight minutes in length, there's a nice flow between them, showcasing both Hess's strong compositional voice and his well-honed aesthetic.

While reedist Assif Tsahar, violinist Mat Maneri and drummer Jim Black all live in New York City and stay busy both locally and internationally, it's rare that you'll ever find the three of them playing together. No matter, as each one's well defined personality is nicely meshed through group improvisation into an impressive whole on Jam. Not that there aren't any surprises - these guys can kick up quite a racket on their own, especially the cataclysmic Black, but here they opt for a slow-burning approach with lots of coloration, static textures and open spaces. It's a dark, moody environ, where the patient are rewarded with an explosive finale.





MICHEL DE HEY MDH01 (Trust the DJ) Trust The DJ Records commenced operation in 2000 as a Web-based record label, and soon became the home for an eclectic mix of DJs, including Carl Cox, Pete Tong, Tim Westwood, Goldie and Rob Da Bank. To commemorate its 50th release, the label called on the ever-reliable Gilles Peterson to mix together a selection of the most up front eclectic electronica. Like his popular BBC radio show, "Worldwide," Peterson's Eclectic Sessions mix cuts through a wide range of music, enveloping soul, R&B, house and Hip-Hop. The disc's standout track, however, is

NOHA's "Balkan Hot Step," a song that's 50 percent early-Disney cartoon music and 50 percent rockin' Bar Mitzvah jam — meaning you probably haven't heard anything like it before.

Also out is the TTDJ debut from Michel De Hey, one of Holland's most substantial techno DJs. Simply one of the best, most banging techno mixes to make it out in a long time, the disc starts off like a shot, courtesy of Heiko Laux's remix of Samuel L. Session's "Tribe Cutz." Afterward, De Hey avoids any lulls, and keeps it going with tracks including Secret Cinema's "Clubtakes" and Smith And Selway's "Move (Adam Beyer And Lenk Remix)." Things get downright crazy with Luke Slater's sinister remix of Egyptian Empire's "The Horn," before it all ends with two of 2003's most popular tracks — Alexander Kowalski's "Belo Horizonte" and Paul Jackson's "The Push."

While the song is a pure peak-time production that has recently been played out in sets around the world, the remainder of the album is really best served to only the hardest and most dedicated of techno fans. With over 100 productions and remixes under his belt, Chris Liebing is one of the genre's most prolific artists, and his views of politics and life certainly live through this music.



HART OF THE MATTER

e wary of bold statements, they will dominate music news headlines in 2004. The tendency to celebrate, exaggerate and take credit for the industry's "enhanced" Q4 performance will bear down with enormous pressure on those whose jobs depend on some sustainable good news this year.

Responsibility for even just "better" news will have many suitors in '04, but let's not be too hasty. Like... here's *hasty*: "Lawsuits have had a profound impact on awareness and fewer people are downloading. And that's good news" (recent announcement by Mitch Bainwol, RIAA Chairman). Jury is still *sooo* out on this one. I know a lot of parents who are stressed out... but not too many kids (no matter what the Pew Internet And American Life Project studies show, not many surveys successfully get their participants to cop to illegal activity).

In short, just because we have seen a cumulative slowing in the rate of decreased sales this year over last, it doesn't mean the RIAA's suit of 12 year olds, or any other single gesture made by an interest group or large corporation, has saved the day. An improved '03 Q4 announcement is good news. But because two headlines appear in the same newspaper, don't mean theys married. "Credit by association" can be as dubious as "guilt" by the same.

So, in the words of Winston Wolf, "lets not all go suckin' each others' dicks quite yet."

Like those deer-in-headlight snapshots of celebrities asked to sling their arm around adoring fans and mug for the camera like they've found a new best friend, there are those who spend their way into PR photo-ops with today's latest headlines.

Let's give credit where credit's due—to the troops: the field staff, distro reps and execs who don't just talk to execs; the retailers who, day in and day out, take chances on artists and work their promotions one-by-one; to their employees who deal directly with customers and who, when it counts, sell as powerfully as any single on radio or video on cable could. Let's give credit to the college kids spinning records earlier than anyone else; to fanzines and, frankly, rags like CMJ and our competitors who cover records because we love them and want our people to love them too. Let's give credit to local promoters, local radio and local people walking into local stores to buy. Every transaction is singular. Every record... one at a time.

Most importantly, let's give credit where it's most due... to the artist

who, often in spite of this machine, makes the music that makes our jobs and lives vital.

Not to downplay recent rays of fiscal hope. In three years, I haven't heard from so many retailers who seem pleasantly encouraged, if not upbeat about this latest upward trend. That being said, Carl Singmaster's announcement about the closing of one of indie retail's greatest, Manifest Discs And Tapes, does keep us sober. Glad that if Carl *had* to leave, he could leave on top and on his own terms. Sad that the game, as it's currently played, couldn't hold him. (More about Carl and Manifest's impact in the coming weeks). For now, let's just take Leonard Cohen's lead and:

Ring the bells that still can ring Forget your perfect offering There's [still] a crack in everything That's how the light gets in...

Light seems to be coming in. Throughout January and February, CMJ has dedicated itself to the banner-waving cause of Elbow and their new release *Cast Of Thousands* (V2). Gorgeous—the first great album of 2004. Check it out now.

President, ear X-tacy, Louisville, KY I was hoping to start the New Year on a happier note, but on New Year's Eve, word came down from Carl Singmaster, owner of Manifest Discs And Tapes, that he was pulling the plug on his stores after 19 years of business. As Carl so eloquently put it in his press release, "This is not a bankruptcy. It is a business decision to not further invest

I had the pleasure to first meet Carl when the CIMS organization was first formed. Although I had almost 20 years of music retail experience at the time, I quickly learned just how much I *didn't* know. Carl is more than a wealth of musical knowledge, a serious music fanatic; he's also a brilliant, and I do mean *brilliant*, savvy businessman. His modesty aside, Carl knows *his* business, as well as *my* business (and probably *yours*) better than you. If Carl Singmaster says it's time to no longer invest in music retail, it's for good reason.

This is not a lame-ass chain-store closing. This is a *vital* part of *independent* music retail that no longer sees the value in fighting the industry's way of conducting business. Manifest is going out on top: a top 50 account of most music distributors, the largest *independent* music retailer in the Carolinas and a perennial winner of "Best CD Store" in reader polls in its local markets.

Amen.

I can't tell you how much wisdom I've gotten from Carl over the years (but *he* probably could). I *do* know that one reason ear X-tacy is still in business, continuing to grow and continuing to thrive, is because of the friendship, the business wisdom, the "*zings*" and the musical passion that Carl Singmaster has shared with me over the years.

I owe you a lot, Carl. We all do.

MANIFEST MANIFESTO: MANIFEST NO MO'

Manifest Discs And Tapes, the chain of five independent retail stores that have become a North and South Carolina institution, is closing its doors during the first quarter of 2004. After starting up as a 750-square foot store on a dilapidated Columbia, South Carolina block in 1985, the mighty Manifest grew to a seven-headed indie retail beast, with a septet of beloved stores throughout the land of Tar Heels and palmettos.

After a promising-yet-oft-bleak year in indie retail came to a close, with the bittersweet taste of "Milkshake" still in our mouths, Manifest announced on January 2 that they were pulling a Jay-Z: getting out of the game while still on top.

"The practices and policies of the music copyright owners have made it increasingly difficult for Manifest to gain new customers and retain old ones," said the Manifest press release. "Thus, faced with a number of lease renewal decisions, this is the appropriate time for Manifest to exit the business of music retail. It is anticipated that all Manifest locations will close with the exception of Charleston, South Carolina, which is likely to be run under new ownership. Approximately 70 jobs will be lost.

"This is not a bankruptcy. It is a business decision to not further invest in music retail. Every legitimate financial obligation, including all trade credit obligations, shall be fully honored.

"Manifest founder and president Carl Singmaster expresses, 'I am eternally grateful to all of the wonderful and talented employees who worked with me to grow Manifest, to the many dedicated people at the labels and vendors who have served us so well, and to my fellow retailers, most especially those in the Coalition of Independent Music Stores, who all became not only my peers, but best friends too.

decided to stop offering singles to the public in an attempt to force consumers to buy [more expensive] full-length CDs,'" Singmaster says. "This was followed by a series of price increases and then music fans—understandably outraged—discovered they could get the songs they wanted free on the Internet.

"I'm a music fan and an entrepreneur and I look for opportunity in everything," Singmaster says. "From the very first day labels offered legal music on the Internet, I applied to be licensed-and I offered to pay the same cost per song as eMusic, Steve Jobs or anybody else-to buy these songs and burn them on CDs to sell to our customers and keep our retail stores fresh and exciting. These doors were all slammed in my face. Now, with more music being offered exclusively through Internet sites such as iTunes and mass merchants such as Best Buy, Manifest was cast as an also-ran in the eyes of its customers instead of the ultimate music source it had been in the past. And that is why we are closing."



hen the world is running down-in this case, like the ever-effacing landscape of independent music retail in Detroit-Street Corner Music makes the best of what's still around. "It's left a little hole, and we're trying to fill that," says Mike Rome, who co-owns the store with partner Chris Flanagan. "We're trying to appeal to the older crowd who's trying to be hip." Located close to the Motor City, in nearby Beverly Hills, Street Corner has been a near-D-Town staple for 11 years. Primarily selling classic rock, soul and gospel, Street Corner has seen its new release sales go up in tandem with the closing of area stores. "We sell a lot more of people like Sting or Rod Stewart... and Kid Rock is doing better than we used to do with it," says Rome.

While Street Corner's target demo is generally older than their DMRC brethren, the coalition has been integral in helping Street Corner expand into buying more new releases and obtaining co-op advertising. But although the Corner is a proud DMRC member, Rome still thinks of his store as the "black sheep" of the family. "I hate to stereotype them," says Rome "but those guys are all the same kind of rock store."

Despite the increasing retail erosion, Street Corner continues to thrive-by October 2003, sales were up by 20 percent from 2002. Since the store sells primarily catalog titles,

it's starting to come full circle: "Eventually the kids want the classic soul because somebody sampled it," Rome says.

Q&A with Mike Rome. co-owner, Street Corner Music

What local press affects sales most?

The Detroit Free Press. On Sundays they have full-page music reviews and charts. They cover whatever's hot locally.



Hey, Street Corner, go back to the other side of 13 Mile!

What radio station affects sales most?

On WDET public radio, the jazz DJ is Ed Love-he plugs us whenever he can. On Kiss FM [WDMK/Mt. Clemens], they play a lot of classic soul, there's a guy named Mason In The Morning. You get the DJs to shop here, you cut them a little deal and they go on the air and they plug it. Also, smooth jazz station WVMV.

Do you have in-stores?

LINCS

No, because we're in a strip mall and the neighbors complain. We had Will Downing

here about a month ago. A lot of ladies showed up for that one. We kind of broke Kem here. We sold 1,000 copies when he was just selling them out of his basement. Then he got picked up by Motown and we sold another thousand. That's far and above the biggest seller of all time for us, selling 2,000 copies. He used to deliver them himself.

What is your most effective program? I would say listening stations.

What other programs do you offer? Are any of them discretionary?

Anything else would be through the DMRC lines: their added giveaway type stuff. Tshirts, posters and samplers with the purchase of a CD.

What display materials work best for you?

The banners that hang from the ceiling. We have a collection of those we've kept since day one and have been building on it.

What records are your current and alltime favorites?

Sly Stone, "Thank You (Falettinme Be Mice Elf Agin)" and currently the new Rickie Lee Jones album [Evening Of My Best Day].

What's the first record you bought and where?

The Monkees' Greatest Hits. I think it was probably a mail order off the back of a cereal box or something [laughs].

What's the best concert you've attended?

Recently, the Jack Johnson/Ben Harper show last summer was great.
