

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

Cool To Be You

(Fat Wreck Chords)

Since pop-punk songs about girls and not fitting in are dizzyingly popular at the moment, the time sure is ripe for a new Descendents album. After more than seven years of dormancy, the California band has delivered Cool To Be You, a collection of, ah yes, catchy

pop-punk songs about girls and not fitting in, and stuff. The Descendents have been producing trad melodic punk of enviable quality with their current line-up since 1979, and Cool is no exception—punk at its finest, fast and catchy with gooey singalong melodies and lyrics that head straight to the heart of any 15-year-old with isolation issues. The title track and "Mass Nerder" dissect the intricacies of being cool and uncool, and thusly are candy for the pubescent, but there's something for the older crowd in tracks like "Merican," which focuses on conflicting feelings about being an American in these heady days. Cool could be a perfect introduction for kids just discovering punk,

but will appeal just as completely to veterans of the genre, or anyone who's ever felt heartbroken, left out or discontent. - Kristin Schall

EAGLES OF DEATH METAL

Peace Love Death Metal

(AntAcidAudio-Rekords/Rekords)

Channeling the sprit of Gene "The Beast" Simmons, fulltime Queen Josh Homme has finally made it clear which Stone Age he's been referring to... arena rock! Assuming the nom-du-rock of J Devil Huge,

Homme handles guitar, drum and vocal duties for Eagles Of Death Metal's debut LP, Peace Love Death Metal, accompanied by members of Eleven, Millionaire and Distiller Brody Dalle on various cuts. "So Easy" stands out as a rawker any KISS Army soldier could dig, Homme's falsetto harmonies fitting right in with rousing, chugging guitars and shit-kicking drums that smack of something off Destroyer. A fitting cover of Stealers Wheel's "Stuck In The Middle With You" shows Homme's taut guitar rocking harder than the first QOTSA disc, and "Already Died" is the closest you'll get to his more recent work, the guitars sliding up and down under patented trippy Homme lyrics

like "I feel like you've already died." Perhaps the desert heat has fried Homme's brain, but it seems to have only made him rock harder.



DECAHEDRON

Disconnection Imminent (Lovitt)

Anyone who openly wept at the 1999 breakup of D.C. punk band Frodus will shed tears of joy over Decahedron, a reunion of drummer Jason Hamacher and singer/guitarist Shelby Cinca, with the addition of Roadside

Monument bassist Johnathon Ford (who recently took over the bass slot vacated by Fugazi's Joe Lally). The band's debut LP, Disconnection_Imminent, sounds wholly connected already as each song transitions into the next, creating a smooth flow that skips from experimental tracks to almost radio-ready ones and back again. Genres collide throughout the record, crossbreeding and standing aside one another. "Lt. Col" and "Not These Homes" have fantastic guitar and basslines, while "Module 1" and "Dislocation" express a more industrial, beat-driven feel. But focus should also be put on the band's message, with Cinca's politically aware lyrics showing off his abilities as a writer, vocalist and communicator. More than anything,


Decahedron reassures us that D.C. punk is still willing to take on D.C. politics.

ELF POWER

Walking With The Beggar Boys (Orange Twin)

You'd be hard-pressed to find a review of Athens, Georgia's Elf Power that doesn't mention an association with the Elephant 6 collective and its lo-fi-minded aesthetic. Which makes it worth noting that Walking With The Beggar Boys, the band's seventh LP (count-

ing the 2002 covers album Nothing's Going To Happen), has quite a lot of fidelity to speak of. Recorded at home in Athens with producer Andy Baker, the record is clean and direct in production, songwriting and lyrics—a much straighter pop record than one might expect. The change could be due to a line-up shift, with the Olivia Tremor Control's Eric Harris joining on guitar and former Gland Craig McQuiston on bass. But there is still some scruff: Singer Andrew Rieger's laid-back voice and the off-kilter backing vocals of his bandmates and guests retain the Elf personality. Rieger's songwriting goes from trad indie-pop to electronics-laced indie-pop and fuzzed-out indie-pop with equal success. It's quite a change, but the band

FINLEY QUAYE

Much More Than Much Love (Epic)

Finley Quaye may be Tricky's uncle, but the music he makes comes from a very different place than Tricky's dark, apocalyptic vision. Quaye's is a sunny mix of trip-hop's bright side, Cali singer/songwriter fare and inspirational reggae, and his new album, *Much More Than*

Much Love, certainly delivers what fans have come to know and love about him. The sparkling melodies of "Beautiful Nature," upbeat guitars of "Dice" (co-written and sung with Beth Orton) and the reggae splash of "Pearls Of Wisdom" all add up to an album that's concise and lyrically honest, much like his 1997 debut LP, Maverick A Strike, which garnered heaps of attention from critics and fans alike. Much More Than Much Love is equally deserving of praise, from intricate production that bears comparison to Brian Wilson's lushness, to clever songwriting that Quaye makes sound easy. But where Quaye really excels is in creating a mood, and Much More Than Much Love

could easily become the soundtrack to a warm, breezy springtime.

MADVILLAIN

Madvillainy (Stones Throw)
Two of the most sweated figures in underground hip-hop—
effortlessly cadenced marblemouth fantastic damager MF
Doom and blunted blue noter
Madlib—join evil forces to create a record that allows room for
both of their iconoclastic voices
to maintain their defining luster.
Like pot-laced chocolate getting

mixed with pot-laced peanut butter, "America's Most Blunted" (their words, not ours—and also the album highlight), do as they do best; Madlib excavating post-Axelrod rare funk and looping it into something between headnodder and quirk, MF Doom doing his avant-Kool-G-Rap rewind-that-shit rhymebook blender bender. For fans of either, there are no surprises here—with the exception of a noisier bent, loading Madlib's troubled funk with wheezing accordions ("Accordion"), cartoony flicker ("Raid" featuring Medaphor), broken Casio ("Shadows Of Tomorrow"), nasty tambourine ("Figaro") and God knows what. The entire thing has a muffled vibe somewhere between drunken basement four-tracker experiments, meticulous science experiment and

apocalypse... no matter what, these mad scientists are up to good, and that's damn good.

LANSING-DREIDEN

The Incomplete Triangle (Kemado/Palm)

When is a band not a band? Well, in the case of N.Y. via Miami's Lansing-Dreiden (named for two post-war artist-writers—Bauhaus was already taken, you see), it's when it traffics in much more than just music: They define

themselves as "a company that sees no distinction between art and commerce—or anything else." This mantra/mission statement allows the collective to pursue a number of artistic endeavors: literature, film, artwork and music (often at the same time). Whereas black and white is the favored palette for its other medium, LD's musical self breaks out a few more (still muted) colors. Tracks like "An Uncut Diamond" and the ominous "The Missing Message" recall the part of the '80s that was dark and daring, where goth, punk and nervy pop occupied the same space. "The Eternal Life" packs echo, pop and rock in a sort of BRMC way, where the dance-y synth rhythms and slashing guitars of "Glass Corridor" hint that LD's artistic

aim is to craft a subversive pop hit. Like the novelty T-shirt says: "Fuck Dance. Let's Art."

SEACHANGE

Lay Of The Land (Matador) If you look deep into the mists of the past, say all the way back to the early '90s, you'll find that once upon a time, bands were actually capable of *versatility*—the seemingly lost art of doing more than one thing. Seachange remember it and take it to heart on their full-length debut, *Lay Of The Land*, a 12-track tour of all

that was great about '90s art-/alt-rock. Lay Of The Land is varied territory: Opener "Anglokana" wells up from a long silence into hypnotic guitars, a light bass drum pulse and Malkmussy pitch flirtations, before bursting into noise via some peculiar editing and building to a fever pitch; the mournful violin of "The Nightwatch" could easily fit on any latter-period Nick Cave record; and the furious "Forty Nights" blows your speakers like some lost Stooges recording. There's a few bones in here for the current crop of indie rockers: "News From Nowhere" and "Glitterball" both contain the I-can-only-strum-in-this-pattern guitar revived by bands like the Stills, but put across more personality than that band is capable of.

Alternately chaotic and controlled, beautiful and grating, *Lay Of The Land* is a difficult record to classify—exactly what indie needed.

onfusion, change, contrast. Jonah Matranga, a k a Onelinedrawing, has dealt with them his whole career. Over the last five years, he's built a grassroots fanbase from his website (www.onelinedrawing.com) and, working closely with indie Jade Tree, has cultivated a career as a self-sustaining artist. And yet, his first group, emocore pioneers Far, were signed with major Epic, and he has recently inked a deal with Atlantic subsidiary Velvet Hammer for his new ensemble, Gratitude. These corporate opposites balance out in a subtly refined yin and yang, wherein Onelinedrawing serves as Matranga's outlet to cope with the confusion and complexities in his life. The Volunteers, Onelinedrawing's second release for Jade Tree, is Matranga's most honest album to date. Each of the songs examines the life decisions we all make. Apparently he made some good choices, revealing that with The Volunteers, it's the first time he's ever felt at peace after finishing a record.

Does *The Volunteers* have a theme?

Songs are these funny things where they definitely are about something, but simultaneously, whatever's going on in your life ends up contextualizing them. That's an interesting thing about art in general. I think the record is about choosing, and about the fact that a choice can be political, religious, personal, romantic, financial or whatever. It's about taking responsibility for the fact that we all have to choose how we're going to behave. I suppose if you want to get really heady about it, I'm always thinking about the strange paradox of cause and effect, grand design and one's own self-determining choice. I think we're all fated for things, but at the same time I think we all choose everything. It's one of the more brilliant and central paradoxes to our lives. But it's not a concept album! [laughs] It really isn't.

You're just there to capture the zeitgeist, or whatever's going on around you at that time?

Yeah, exactly. If you ever get confused or think you've ever figured out the Truth—like truth with a capital 't', then I think you're on a lot of crack. It absolutely is about zeitgeist and collective unconscious. Whether it's [Carl] Jung or [Joseph] Campbell, everyone's got ideas for how stuff might work. Though, with every really genius person I've ever met, the first thing they'll say is, "I have no idea what I'm talking about, but here's a couple ideas." The people who say, "I've got it figured out and you need to follow me..." that's scary. I think that's implicit, ironically, in why it's so impor-

tant, whether politically, socially or emotionally, that we make our own choices.

Making the right choices is often the hardest part.

This record is a lot about, "Hey, you know what? I'm a mess. Everyone in the room that's a mess, raise your hand." It's sort of me raising my hand. "Over It" is about that; "Livin' Small" is about that; "Superhero" is about confusion regarding other people; "A Ghost" is specifically a story about someone who chooses not to have responsibility and learns what a bad an idea that is. "Stay" is just about devotion, and saying what you want to say; "We Had A Deal" is about *utter* confusion—it's just about that disappointment when you don't reach your ideals, and when no one reaches your ideals.

before for commercials, but I just never did it and I never thought about it twice. If a skate video wanted to use it, I did it and I didn't have to think about it twice. This was the first one that—in a million ways—was really hard, both by how much money is involved and how big and weird the company is. I don't know what's going to happen, or if it ever will air [in the US] to tell you the truth, but it's been a strange and cool process making the decision.

Your music has made it so you don't have to work a typical day job, right?

Yeah, but music can be a typical day job. There are people who work a more normal schedule than me that I'm sure are just as fulfilled, if not more than me. There are just as many people who are bored. A musician that's bored needs to stop doing that, and do what they want to

Are your songs political?

I don't think I write political songs, per se. I think that every issue is pretty much the same thing. If you decide because you're Republican, vegetarian, or straight edge-that you've got something figured out that other people don't-I think you've missed the boat on a far larger truth, which is that none of us have it figured out. I've got a song on The Volunteers ["Livin' Small"] that makes fun of people who sell songs to soda commercials. I cherish that to tell you the truth, because the song isn't really about that. The song is actually about being confused. To be an artist in commerce is just like trying to be a spiritual person in a secular world. To me, "Livin' Small" or whatever, if there's a way to do that, has everything to do with humility and just letting go.

So what was it like to license a song, "Lukewarm" [with New End Original, an anagram for Onelinedrawing], for a Coca-Cola commercial?

It's so funny. The irony of that situation is that most artists never would have discussed it. All that really happened with the commercial is that it showed for a few weeks in Australia, New Zealand and Thailand. If I never discussed it, we wouldn't be talking about it. The reason I'm really happy I discussed it is, whether it happens or not, now, is super OK with me. People have wanted to use my songs

do. Maybe they want to do data entry. Everyone's different. That's the one thing about art, especially being a rock 'n' roll performer; I think people acquaint it with independence and freedom and creativity. I don't think the act of picking up a guitar and singing a song inherently has any more creativity than the act of building a table or filing a report. I'm actually going this weekend with my friend Darren Doane, who's a video director, and we're going to make a video for every song on The Volunteers. We'll also film a living room show down there, and basically make a DVD that's sort of based around The Volunteers, but it's really just to have fun and make something. It's what you put into it.


Your music, especially on *The Volunteers*, sounds therapeutic. Like, you're working through it.

Literally. Therapy has such a stupid characterization, right now. Especially music as therapy with sincerity as such a commodity, but that's why I do it. Not for anyone else. All these ideas just come out, but in a real world way they have seemed to really help me. I feel like in some way I make my own antibiotics or something. I don't want anyone thinking I'm writing music because I can help other people or heal them. I'm sure I've battled with messiah complexes as much as anyone, but all we've got is ourselves in the end. **NMR**




TV ON THE RADIO #2 DEBUT

guitarist Ernest Ranglin share a
lot of history, coming up together in Jamaica more than 50 years
ago. They went their separate
ways but have played on number

of Ranglin albums together since (1996's *Below The Bassline* is highly recommended), and have become particularly adept at mixing reggae rhythms with jazz's approach to soloing and arrangements. Here, Alexander's jazzy comps and leads often jump (his melodica playing deserves praise as well), while Ranglin's clean tone and sinuous playing effortlessly compliment as they work through the music together in a sextet setting. Fans of reggae will likely be thrilled with the band's versions of such classics as "Israelites," "Pressure Drop" (featuring Toots Hibbert) and "Redemption Song," but there's enough jazz musicianship on *Rocksteady* to leave few doubts about these players' interests or ability.

MIMI FOX

She's The Woman (Favored Nations)

San Francisco-based guitarist Mimi Fox's star is on the rise these days with a flurry of good press. Here on *She's The Woman*, the flagship release from Steve Vai's Favored Nations Cool imprint and Fox's sixth album, she works through a broad sample of jazz material that ranges from blues to bop to balladry. Fox has a strong sense of melody (never something to be underestimated), and it comes through in her writing and interpretations, but particularly on her solos, most adeptly illustrated on the tender solo rendition of "Darn That Dream." Even though it's an original, "Buddy's Blues" is a groovy tip of the hat to funky jazz-guitar great Grant Green with its soulful mid-tempo, blues-based runs. If there's weakness here, it's the general politeness of the arrangements of her backing band—it'd be nice to see her get a little dirty—but there's more than enough to enjoy.

SOULFLY

Prophecy (Roadrunner)
Feels like just yesterday that guitarist/vocalist Max Cavalera left
Sepultura following *Roots*, the
Brazilian metal institution's most
commercially and critically influential album. But time indeed
does fly—the new *Prophecy* is
Soulfly's fourth album. While
countless metalheads pray with-

out prejudice for a Max/Sepultura reunion, Mad Max continues the charge with Soulfly, which, honestly, shouldn't disappoint: Prophecy fashions many Sepultura-like moments, including "Execution Style," which recalls Chaos AD's "Territory," while the title track and "Mars" hearken back to Soulfly's blood-raw, boarangry self-titled album. Ultimately, despite its revolving cast of members—longtime bassist Marcello D. Rapp and guitarist Mikey Doling are gone, former Megadeth bassist Dave Ellefson and former Primer 55 guitarist Bobby Burns each contributing half the bass tracks, while ex-Ill Nino guitarist Mark Rizzo takes over as axe man—this record is the most pulled-together in the band's catalogue. Cavalera traveled to Serbia, played medieval instruments and incorporated Serbian gypsy music into the songs, and as a result, the tracks on Prophecy have worldly textures and a distinct vibe that furthers Soulfly's status as a fluid musical tribe. Leave it to Max Cavalera to continue to force music and culture to collide in the most unorthodox way.



The Sound Of The Fourth Season (Cocoon) With timeless hits like "Harlequin" and "An Accident In Paradise," charismatic German DJ Sven Vath became one of the most well-respected dance artists of the '90s. Vath's Harthouse family of labels, club

The Omen (the premiere venue for German clubbing until its closure in 1998) and his records also boosted his stature. However, like Moby, Vath's timing was off, and despite a wealth of great material and skill, he seemingly hid away as the rest of the dance music industry took off. (You'll remember that Moby was a much-accomplished underground electronic artist who released an unfortunate punk record just as dance music blew up.) The 2004 incarnation of Sven Vath finds the DJ with a colorful palette of styles that goes far beyond his past trance, house and techno endeavors. His latest CD, The Sound Of The Fourth Season, is inspired by the fresh vibe of his Cocoon label and the sister club nights that have become one of the most talked-about brands in the business. The first CD has a fashionable electro sound where the borderline pop of Codec & Flexor's "Black Diamond" clashes with LFO's "Freak" and T.Raumschmiere's hornhonkin' "Monstertruckdriver." Meanwhile, the second disc explores the left-field side of Vath's brain with challenging tracks like L'usine's "Push," D'ntel's "The Dream Of Evan And Chan" and Ricardo Villalobos' much talked about "Easy Lee." Additional standouts include Alter Ego's remix of Primal Scream's "Autobahn 66" and "I Need Ya" from Lopazz featuring Alex Cortex. Sven Vath invites a new generation of clubbers into his Cocoon with one hell of a set.



ALL HAIL TALI: THE PRINCESS OF DN'B

f you've been up to date with your records in the fast-moving drum 'n' bass genre then you're quite familiar with newcomer MC Tali's fantastic 2003 anthem, "High Hopes." Truth be told, the name of this single couldn't be more accurate as Tali's recently released debut LP, Lyric On My Lip, was one of this year's most anticipated. Produced by Mercury Prize winner Roni Size with added contributions from fellow Full Cycle producers Krust, Die and Clipz, the record matches Tali's irresistibly soulful vocals with drum 'n' bass, jazz, hip-hop and R&B. Look for Lyric to drop domestically in June and for Tali to hit the road with Size's crew later this year.



HART OF THE MATTER

lot of response to the remarks made here praising Modest Mouse's upcoming full-length Good News For People Who Love Bad News. We're nothing if not passionate here, and this album, well, has inspired us. With the recent success of bands soaked in indie rock ethos—Postal Service, Death Cab For Cutie, the Shins—the climate feels right for Good News to spread farther and wider than it perhaps would have even two years ago. Sony's willingness to keep working with the band is a testament to their hope and vision that the market would soon be ripe if the Mouse could just deliver—and the Good News is they have.

Last week, this column opened with an appeal: "So I want to get your opinion on something..." That request is the underlying call of every column we've done to date. I appreciate how often you all are willing to take us up on it too—your weekly comments, shows of solidarity and even disagreements mean a lot and contribute to the spirit of why we at CMJ do what we do. Whether you're at a label, distro, in management, on college radio, behind the counter or on stage, the purpose of this section is to offer a perspective.

We don't pretend to always get it right. And the column regarding Modest Mouse (*CMJ New Music Report*, issue no. 855) was one of those times.

Although *Good News* was given a thorough praising there, I must admit in retrospect that the column cast an unfair shadow on the efforts of a group of people at Sony Music who have worked very hard to set this one up right. Accordingly, a retraction is due. Here's where I got it wrong: As many of you know, in order to lube the market and feed demand from both fans and retailers, Sony shipped out 1,000 free promo singles to retail three weeks in advance of the now-commercially-available 7". I characterized the scarcity of the original singles as a Sony "miscalculation" of market demand for the Mouse. As it turns out, the evidence just doesn't back that criticism up—that was my own miscalculation.

Take a look at what's gone on since: Ship goals are way up; the band's completed a video with Chris Mills (Interpol, Vendetta Red); they've sold out almost every one of their eight upcoming SoCal shows (which follow a must-see La Zona Rosa performance at SXSW); they've seen "Float On" added by major commercial stations like WFNX/Boston, KROQ/L.A., KITS/San Francisco and KNDD/Seattle; they've been invited to appear on *Craig Kilborn*; and *Good News* has received nothing but praise by everyone from *Rolling Stone*, *Filter*, *Entertainment Weekly*, *Spin*, *AP*, *Blender* and, well of course, *CMJ* (they have the April cover of *CMJ New Music Monthly*).

In addition, after the first run of the "Float On" 7" disappeared at retail as quickly as they arrived, Sony not only pressed up a new run for commercial release (released March 9), but since singer Isaac Brock had




never been super keen on the mastering or artwork for *The Moon And Antartica*, Epic/Sony anteed up and released the "Expanded Edition"—remastered, new artwork and with four never-before-released bonus tracks (also March 9).

Certainly not the signs of a label that has miscalculated its band's audience. To quote a recent column here that many of you responded to: "Let's give credit where credit's due—to the troops: the field staff, distro reps who don't just talk to execs; to the retailers who take chances on artists and work their promotions one-by-one; to their employees who deal directly with customers... and to local folks walking into local stores. Every transaction is singular. Every record... one at a time."


If the Sony characterization were one I felt passionately about, you'd see a fevered defense here, but this time I just got it wrong. So let me give credit where credit's due—to the crew at Sony for giving us the *Good News* (even if it's *For People Who Love Bad News*). All apologies—we're looking forward to April 6.





CAT'S IS KING OF THE HILL

"It was a textbook in-store," says **Scott "Perk" Perkins**, vice-president of retail for Tennesseean chain Cat's Music And Pop Tunes... although when *a whopping 600 people* show up, that would make for an incredibly hefty "textbook" indeed!

Local roots-rockers Ingram Hill showed up at the Memphis Cat's/Pop store to perform an hour-long set, do overtime with an immense autograph signing and allow fans to enjoy the succulent nectar of Memphis... pizza and Pepsi provided by local radio station WMBZ! Cat's has been selling a consignment version of Ingram's recent Hollywood Records-backed *June's Picture Show* for a year, and is responsible for an enormous chunk of their indie retail sales.

While Cat's have never had a disaster in-store, not all of them have been as monumental and blissful as the Ingrams. "We had Joan Jett in the early '80s. We didn't know tricks about crowd control... and she basically got mobbed," Perk says. "And Georgia Satellites. They came in and they were assholes. I just went back in my office and did paperwork!"

Of course, the cats at Cat's have had many more store-bursting successes than you can count, the highlights being a *Shout At The Devil*-era Mötley Crüe in-store that required six or eight uniformed cops to control the enormous crowd; and, the record-breaking Saliva in-store where over *1,000 kids* showed up—and the salivating masses had to be turned away at the door!

"In-stores are something we're constantly asking labels for," Perk says. "It's something that we pride ourselves in. We're able to handle a good in-store."

AVRIL GOES MALL AROUND THE WORLD

After destabilizing communities, impeding independent business and basically being big, blocky architectural nightmares; the shopping mall has one more notch to add to its Biggest-Box belt: *they are ground zero for Avril Lavigne fans*! Like wallet-chained moths to a flame on a Cinnabon, their cackling resonates from the peaks of the highest Hot Topic to the valleys of Gadzooks... Us CMJ staffers with suburban backgrounds still have acid flashbacks about it!

Well Avril (and her close, personal friends AOL and Broadband) is giving something back! Dubbed "Avril Live And By Surprise," the punky popper is doing a 21-city tour of *shopping malls* in metro areas. It's just like Tiffany, but... um, OK, it's just like Tiffany. No word on if she will pose for *Playboy* in 10 years.

If these "in-mall appearances" weren't enough to horn in on indie retail's in-store action, a Wal-Mart in Boston had an autograph session with music and/or TV star **Jessica Simpson**. After a half hour after she arrived, cops cut the event short, arresting four teens—one of them for *assault and battery*! How would you have liked to seen that fight? "I'm the bigger pussy!" "No, *I'm* the bigger pussy!"

oHo is the kind of place where people don't usually stay that long, a lot of coming and going," says Ira Barouch about the Manhattan neighborhood where his store, Rocks In Your Head, has stayed put since 1978. "People stay for a few years and then they're on their way to somewhere else." Persistence and unwavering ideals have kept Rocks In Your Head prospering in one of the most difficult business communities in America. "People come in here, they realize that this store is kind of vintage," says Barouch, "it's not one of these modern stores that kind of seem antiseptic."

And while a Manhattan zip code has meant financial disaster to many, the location-location-location axiom has worked wonders for Rocks, garnering them many high-profile shoppers. "Ric Ocasek comes in here, he's an A&R guy now," says Barouch. "One of the bands we recommended to him was the Stratford 4... he ended up signing them to his label." Other occasional shoppers include Patti Smith, Michael Stipe and Ray Davies, all folks in tune with Rocks' dedication to music. "We've been really proud of keeping a commitment to good music," he says. "I think the store has a certain spirit that people pick up on; that's what keeps us going."


Q&A with Ira Barouch, owner, Rocks In Your Head

What local press affects sales most?

I'd say *The New York Times* and then *The Village Voice*. Maybe *Time Out New York*. We try to do things more through word-of-mouth.

What radio station affects sales most?

College radio, if anything. WFMU or something like that. Other radio, as you know, is pretty bad here in New York.



Hot rocks!

Do you have in-stores?

We haven't had one recently. It's difficult to do, especially for a store like this. Most bands want to crank it up. Yo La Tengo did an instore back when they were first starting, which was acoustic. One of the best in-stores we've ever had was a greeting by [Our Band Could Be Your Life author] Michael Azerrad. He did an in-store and a signing.

What is your most effective program?

LINCS

We're not that modern. Obviously a very effective sales thing is what the staff likes and plays. We're selling a lot of All Night Radio,

probably more than other stores, because the staff really likes it. **Ambulance Ltd.** is another band that we really like.

What types of non-traditional promotions have worked best?

We now have a New York section, so bands like the **Walkmen** or the **Yeah Yeah Yeahs** or the **Liars** are put into that category.

What display materials work best for you? We have a new release display, and I'd say that probably works.

What records are your current and all-time favorites?

Since I'm in my 50s I generally go back to the classic era of rock in the '60s. My favorite **Beatles** album is probably *Revolver* or **Dylan**'s *Highway 61 Revisited*. Right now my favorite new band is **Ambulance Ltd.**, but I also like **My Morning Jacket** and **Essex Green**.

What's the best concert you've attended?

One of my favorites had to have been seeing The Band at my college. I went to Harper College in Binghamton, and I knew people, so I was sitting right in the front row. This was probably 1970 and it was when their second album just came out.

What's the first record you bought and where?

I didn't have a record player until I was in college. Maybe one of the first singles I bought, in the late '50s, was probably a Paul Anka record. I didn't get a record player again until 1968.
