





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NEWS TO US

lSSUE 890 After three years of beats, rhymes, life and muppet love, New York-based indie-hip-hop stalwart Third Earth is closing its funky, funky doors. The ever-hard-working Third Earth—home to Jean Grae, Dujeous, Oddjobs, the Others and a re-issued Juggaknots—was run by the unbowed Kimani Rogers, who released records on Third Earth with Masterminds and the muppetastic Roosevelt Franklin.



In a post on the official Third Earth webpage, Kimani said, "After nearly three years, trying to trudge along on a shoe-string budget, calling in as many favors as I could and trying to save the music world one song at a time, the brilliant failure that was Third Earth Music is coming to an end. There's only so many times that you can get metaphorically kicked in the gonads until it's time to take a seat on the bench. 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

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ALOHA

Here Comes Everyone (Polyvinyl)

Here Comes Everyone is the overdue calm to follow Aloha's 2002 post-rock monsoon, Sugar. The band relinquishes its trademark sprawling bombast and shimmering avant-indie cacophony for vocal-driven melodies, jazzy sways and gentle cascades. Aloha also leans less on the quirky time signatures and dreamy atmospherics that defined their previous releases, presenting a more refined pop. Aloha's once ubiquitous vibraphone gives way to mellotron, marimba, vibraphone and harpsichord; each tone color remaining distinct as opposed to the dense sonic layering.

eatbelt enthusiast Ralph Nader didn't capture much of the independent vote in the national presidential election, but independent thinkers can take solace in the fact that college and non-commercial radio presented a clear mandate this week (I'm trying to find some voting results that comfort me, folks. Just go with me on this one). With an impressive 536 stations voting, er, reporting, eight of the top 10 records are pure indies and three of the five biggest debuts and movers are selfgoverning as well. Maybe there is a progressive movement in this country, it's just happening on the audio level. Anti has always been one of our favorite labels for their commitment to artists and for their realization that the art of the song is not dead. Building on established artists has been a good move, let's see if new signings will fare as well as Elliott Smith (1-1), Tom Waits (2-2), Nick Cave (5-14) and the fast-moving Neko Case (38-193). This is not to say that the majors aren't making some good choices of late, too. Columbia's Cake takes the, er... um, cake at No. 10 and WEAaided Futureheads (28-188) is one of the better newcomers of the year, impressing many who saw their opening slot for Franz Ferdinand earlier this year. Luna (43-D) may be waning after a dozen years together, but their strong chart debut indicates their farewell tour will be well supported. Audio innovators Anticon (apparently, the label is strongly against "con") win big with Dosh (74-79), who takes the top spot on RPM this week as well. Like your music a bit heavier and more epic? Ipecac, another one of our favorite labels, bring you Isis (116-D), who are sending shockwaves on the radio chart and Loud Rock, where they debuted at No. 17. Zogby had predicted them at No. 18, so Ipecac is pleased.





Q&A WITH MIX MASTER MIKE INTERVIEW BY OWEN STROCK

Mix Master Mike knows how to make an entrance. Like a prizefighter primed to cold cock some fool, he made his way to the center of Madison Square Garden, holding a record like a title belt, bobbing and weaving for the cameras. And a heavyweight on the turntables he was, warping minds as he warped and bent the records, dropping needles to make beats, sticking and moving his fader with lightning jabs. As the tour DJ for the Beastie Boys, member of the world-renowned Invisibl Skratch Piklz, and pioneer of turntablism as art, Mike has proven the "master" in his name is not for show. But this incredible showman is more than just a dope disc jockey, as aptly displayed in his latest producer showcase, *Bangzilla* (Scratch-Immortal). This bass-heavy adventure into the mind of a man with far too many records is ample evidence that Mike is sharper than ever on the cut.

What was the worst mishap that's ever happened to you at a show?

Once at a small club, I caught the speaker on fire. The monitors were too loud. I was in such a zone that I didn't realize it. There was a smell coming out from the floor. My speaker was on fire. So they had to break out the extinguishers and stuff like that. This was like five months after that Rhode Island thing happened, and that club burned down. So everybody was kind of freaked out. But most people were entertained.

Did you go back to performing after it was over?

Oh definitely. I performed without a monitor, and just went at it.

Have you ever had your records stolen on tour?

No, that never happened. My roadies are topnotch guys. I did do a show in Utah for the Sundance Film Festival, and my records never came out of the belt. That was just a fucking total nightmare. I had the show that night, so I

had to go to the club, get on the microphone and tell everybody, "Yo, my records didn't show up."

How do you feel about CDJ-1000s and other digital turntable technology?

Really amazing invention. Really dope. Really amazing for the studio, but not for live purposes, no. I don't dig them for live purposes. I like to keep it traditional, and keep it hip-hop. I just use them in the studio.

Do you have any issues with DJs who use them?

No, not at all. To each his own. Whatever serves your purpose. Some DJs use it because they want to play their custom beats, and so they'll bring that along, but I prefer to press up vinyl of my custom beats, and then play them live.

You have access to short run pressings?

I have this dude **David** Cheppa, who hooks me up with vinyl, like next day service. Pretty costly, but it's worth it when you're doing live concerts.

Do you think DJing has reached some of its technical limitations, or do you think there are worlds more to explore?


Both, really. I think there's more stuff you can explore and do. I mean a lot of the tricks have become so technical that you're not able to enjoy it if you're listening to it on a CD, as compared to when you watch it live. But there's endless boundaries when you're producing a track.

Any inspiring words for aspiring DJs?

If this is really what you want to do full time, just get into the study of music. Don't just get caught up just listening to the breakbeat and scratch records. Get out there and listen to a lot of shit. Listen to jazz, blues, funk...

...Bangzilla?

Yeah, and listen to Bangzilla.



n September, Tempe's beloved indieretailer Stinkweeds expanded their music operation 20 minutes north—adding a second location in the valley of the sun. Stinkweeds owner Kimber Lanning (who also heads diverse indie-retail coalition Arizona Chain Reaction and Phoenix's Modified Arts Space) picked the new central Phoenix location based on its "community area," a spacious courtyard (for outside instores and signings), its exterior green 1950s tile and its proximity to local high schools and Arizona State University.

Since her average customer's median age shot up about 10 years, Lanning has expanded her jazz and blues selections, and plans to feature live blues performances on Sundays. "A lot of people are coming in that haven't in 15 years," Lanning says. "They have in their mind, 'That's that punk rock store, that's that store for kids.' And they come in and go, 'Oh my God, I didn't expect to find a Cannonball Adderley box set!""

However, some things never change. Lanning still steers clear of the majors (save staples like Radiohead and Coldplay), and still gets bummed when the indies don't go all the way.

"Interpol. New album. One-hundred and twenty-five copies the first week. We didn't even get a play copy," she says. "Are you guys there? Oh, I'm sorry, how many did Target sell?"

Lanning's determination and steadfast independence has gotten her many "Best Of Phoenix" picks in local arts weekly *New Times* and droves of loyal Stinkweeds shoppers. After all, the motto of Lanning's pro-indie-retailer collective, Arizona Chain Reaction, is "Think independently, shop locally."

Q&A with Kimber Lanning, owner, Stinkweeds

How do you help people discover your new Phoenix location?

Word of mouth has always been my number one thing. There's a small monthly paper called the *Midtown Messenger* that goes through the historic neighborhood that I just popped in the middle of; I've been doing ads there. I'm also doing a campaign in a gay and lesbian paper, *Echo*. I'm doing ads in our giant weekly [*New Times*]; I have a quarter page full-color ad every week, probably forever. With two stores, I'll be able to afford it. The press has been very nice to me. We got full write-ups in almost every publication out here. For high school, I'm doing tons of fliers.

What's your most effective program?

I've got 75 listening posts, and everybody who works for me just works their ass off to try to listen to as much as they can. I encourage them to follow people's buying patterns. I have a customer, literally, who's been coming in here since the beginning—17 years. He can still

walk in the door and I can say, "You know the new Kings Of Convenience? You're going to love this record." And he doesn't even want to play it, he just plops his credit card down. He doesn't even bat an eye, because he knows I'm not going to mess with him. He emails me back, and says, "I love this band!"

Has Stinkweeds broken any artists?

When that first My Morning Jacket record was just on Darla, we probably sold a hundred of them. When they came here, they were like, "Oh, my God." They played and it sold out. They were like, "How did you guys ever hear of us?" I went to the show and there were like three people I didn't know [laughs].

What's your most memorable in-store?

Elliott Smith played here years ago, that's a touching moment. Somebody requested a song, and he got through maybe a verse and a chorus, and he goes, "I hate that song, it sounds like the fucking Eagles. I'm never going to play that again." Then he took a swig of beer and started into something else.

What's the most musically significant thing to happen in your life?

The '81 L.A. punk explosion was probably the first thing to make me pay attention. It got to me socially, not just musically. Anything from X to the Adolescents to even the first Bad Religion record. We used to drive out to L.A. all the time, to go see shows and buy records. When I opened my store, it was a mix between Zed's Records, which in its heyday was the best hardcore shop in history, and the Pooh-Bah Record Shop, which is a little house that was converted into a record store.

Gossow clamps her jaws down on these covers with deep bite.

There's less rapping, and there's more rage as well... evidenced in a cover of Body Count's "There Goes The Neighborhood."
