



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

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Arp In Light (SMALLTOWN SUPERSOUND)



The debut album from San Francisco's multinational musician Alexis Georgopoulos (under the moniker Arp) pulses its way through each elongated electronic track—the album's most

epic song, "Odyssey (For Bas Jan Ader)," rounds out at nearly 16 minutes—despite seeming, at times, ambient and gelatinous. Dreamy hypnosis is Georgopoulos' specialty, and his weapons of choice are a four-track deck, analog synthesizers, pulse machines, flute, piano and pedals. In the midst of the whole cosmic meeting of cool psychedelia and spiritual light pop, Arp takes a brief pause to examine the chaotic nature of the synthy sublime on "Fireflies On The Water." It all moves along like a score to a future-retro '80s film.

Black Swans

Change! (LA SOCIÉTÉ EXPÉDITIONNAIRE!)



Jerry DeCicca has the sort of voice that was born to bellow bluesy laments behind dark and dour mountain folk. The Black Swans' latest is a worthwhile challenger to Bob Egan's crown as the

awesomely depressing king of the indie musical universe. The sparse and twangy guitars that dance around moody violins and barely-there percussion conjure a tone that fits somewhere between Dylan's laid back *New Morning* period and Springsteen's gripping acoustic excursions. This makes sense, however, given that *Change!* was mastered by Rob LoVerde, who's polished record edges for both of those seminal songwriters. And while this Swans' dive is no masterpiece per se, it holds you from its first graceful fade-in to its final mournful string. KH

Hoarse Lords (LOVEPUMP UNITED)




Being a band of spazzcore kooks who admit to jam band proclivities, it follows that the debut full-length from this Oakland-based band initially pierces ears with synth-scratching-guitar

throb but eventually feels as if Beck were writing tunes for the Locust. Fuzzed vox, sludge-funk beats, a few acoustic forays and a spooky lyrical bent belie some of the gutter pound that permeates. Psychedelic music now comes from folks who were pumped with drugs by their parents long before any decision to drop out of society was made. Add in the fact that the inclination to make music disturbingly scrunchy is now a first step towards songwriting rather than a latter resort, and you get this kind of spacey skronk—though it is usually not this effective. ED

Neighbor Singing (HOMETAPES)



If Brad Laner's incredibly disparate career has been marked by one characteristic, it's restlessness, both creatively and physically. Over the past quartercentury this 41-year-old

native Californian has shuffled through styles and bands at a dizzying clip, founding or collaborating with, by a loose count, some two dozen outfits. It stands to reason, then, that his first offering under his given name would act as a collective statement of sorts, culling and mashing all the various elements and sounds he's picked up over the years. Although his most sonically expansive effort to date, it's also his most accessible. He sounds here like the left-coast boy he really is, spinning sunny pop sundries out of his ever-innovative guitar playing and gauzy production.

Lightspeed Champion Galaxy Of The Lost (00MINO)



The enormity of British pop history is inescapable, making it tempting to assume that today's Brit-influenced artists are oversaturated. But don't dismiss Lightspeed Champion (Test Icicle's

Dev Hynes) for such a sin. True, nothing on *Galaxy Of The Lost* is remotely new or innovative; Hynes' slightly high-pitched, nasally vocals indifferently list woe after woe with a shrug (reminiscent of Damon Albarn). But when that indifference is matched by instrumental jousting, Lightspeed Champion hits the mark. Lush tracks like "Waiting Game," buried in layers of mandolin, lap-steel and guitars, can be addictive. And an odd departure, a cover of "Xanadu," rounds off a solid summary of the last 40 years of Britpop history. Hynes doesn't copy or run from his influences, just reinterprets them. Jo

Outside the confines of his experimental noise troupe, Parts And Labor's BJ Warshaw proves to be surprisingly adept at writing actual hooks on his solo project's debut. Though the expected

electronic effects and drones abound, this affair is unpredictably intimate and comparably stripped down. Album opener "Right" marries incessantly chugging guitars to soulful vocals for a result that wouldn't sound out of place on a TV On The Radio disc. "Alive And Well" builds impassioned folktronica out of scratchy loops and a delicate acoustic guitar vamp. Warshaw proves to be a magician with a synthesizer, and his shimmering melodies, swathed in layers of effects and anchored by steady, powerful percussion, are all the more potent for their mystery. **R**



skateboard shoes, the Pack are still young men and rhyme accordingly. References center on girls, money and hitting the club, all while checking the mirror. Young L is behind the boards again with catchy minimal production that blends laid back snap music with Bay Area energy. "Gimme Racks" is an ode to cash money with a beat that Lil' Jon would likely approve of and "Rock N Roll" samples Freddie Jackson's "Rock Me Tonight (For Old Times Sake)" before dropping a snare roll à la Three 6 Mafia. It's all shoes and booze for this Based crew. EY

When Dracula Thinks "Look At Me" (SOUTHERN)



Though this heady, 14-song blast of violent Casiocore (as Trencher have dubbed their keyboard-led brand of spazz-metal) is this British trio's debut, it follows their sophomore effort (Lips) to our shores'

shelves. For those that liked the winking, gross-out aesthetic, epileptic thrashing and nodule-ridden screams of Lips, Dracula will feel somewhat familiar, though it manages to be even shorter—the whole thing careens by in less than 18 minutes-and more abrasive than its "predecessor." Playing without the expected guitars, Trencher uses sludgy bass riffs and franticly astringent keyboards to propel their songs forward. And because the whole thing is suffused with theatrically gory humor, there is something winningly original about their brutal sound. RR

and hear. The songs are intertwined with Rice's accented paranoia. "I noticed that the more down I am, the better at what it is I do," he says, heading into "Grey Room," which quickly summarizes Rice's appeal in a nutshell. While his music may err on the side of melodrama, it's Rice's ready acknowledgement of his hyperboles that keep them authentic. Accompanied by just a guitar and female vocalist Lisa Hannigan-who has since left the band-Rice keeps his performance simple, letting the tears sing instead of fall. RD

The enduringly influential pianist Carla Bley has recruited Sardinian trumpeter and flugelhorn player Paolo Fresu to round out her Lost Chords ensemble, which consists of saxophonist Andv

Sheppard, drummer Billy Drummond and bassist Steve Swallow. On the album, which is loosely composed around the number five, Bley's melodiously bifurcate playing takes a back seat to the exceptional interplay between Sheppard and Fresu on the bulk of the songs, most notably on "Liver Of Life," her first composition written for two horns. Listen closely for Swallow's rolling bass lines throughout, which act as the rail this machine glides on. But the fact that, at 71, Bley continues to innovate while still sounding timeless is this record's greatest accomplishment, KK

It's pretty clear by now that Bob Marley's children inherited their father's talent for making relevant music. On Radio, Ky-Mani Marley infuses the classic reggae of his father with southern hip-hop.

dancehall and ragga. Instead of the turbulent trails of '70s Jamaica, it's the urban streets of modern Miami that wind through this record. A thumping bass combined with Marley's no-nonsense lyrics ("My papa was a legend, but let me tell you something about me, I was raised up poor") create a gritty setting on "Ghetto Soldier." "Hustler" is a melting pot of dancehall grooves and urban beats capped off with Marley's intense voice. Where his siblings tend to stick with their father's traditional style, Ky-Mani makes songs that are more suited for modern moods. TD

The main goal of Tom Middleton's debut solo album seems to be creating a hypnotic journey through sound. After co-producing (under the name Schizophrenia) the classic Aphex Twin

EP, Analogue Bubblebath, and working with Mark Pritchard on a number of projects (most notability, Jedi Knights), this classically trained pianist and cellist exposes his own personal style on Lifetracks. The result is a spiritually soothing, smooth blend of mellow electronica. The ambient aquatic sounds may seem boring to some, but will be hailed by others. Technically speaking though, the album is flawless. Seamlessly flowing from one song to another, the layered piano, keyboard and string arrangements skim effortlessly across a constant, at times pulsating, beat. MG

THE BUCKS STOP HERE?

OR A LONG TIME, when you wanted to buy music, it was simple enough: dig through bins at the record store, fork over some cash and walk out with a tangible albumartwork and all. But now, how much people pay for music and how they acquire it is changing. New options and partnerships between music companies and websites have exploded in the past few years, resulting in a bevy of buying options and prices for consumers. A number of them have come and gone already as the template for 21st century music distribution is still worked out. As disgruntled artists release music without the aid of record labels, fans struggle to support their favorite bands without breaking the bank and both online and traditional retailers scramble to attract customers, the perceived value of music is more ambiguous than ever.

As has been well reported, Radiohead dropped a bomb on the music industry by allowing fans to pay whatever price they wanted for their seventh LP, In Rainbows. They weren't the first to do so, though—Prince gave away three million copies of Planet Earth earlier this year and Juliana Hatfield similarly implemented an honor system in 2006. But Radiohead's unconventional decision certainly garnered the most intrigue. Some listeners gave the album a trial run and paid what they could afford for the download, while diehard fans pre-ordered an \$80 box set that included a bonus CD, vinyl, a lyric booklet and album

The Value Of Music In A Mercurial Industry

Despite the ongoing trial and error of music pricing, there's no debating that consumers have had seemingly unlimited access to music with no uniform, standardized price—for worse at first glance, but perhaps for the better over the long haul. "I think the argument could be made that people are listening to more music than ever—CDs, online, satellite radio," says Brian Lucas, a spokesperson for Best Buy. "Music has a snowball effect. It gets you excited again and you want more."

And more is increasingly available. Zune uses Microsoft's universal point system for online purchases, and Lala.com offers a free subscription service where customers pay for music only when they want to transfer it to MP3 players or buy an actual CD. A subscription to Napster starts at \$9.95 per month, while thirty downloads at eMusic begins at \$9.99. Controversial P2P file-sharing programs like Morpheus and BitTorrent offer free downloads—some legal, some not—where users can get an artist's entire discography in mere minutes. The problem isn't finding outlets for music consumption, it's sifting through the morass to find the highest quality, most consistent, efficient and abundant provider.


artwork. Either way, retailers like Lala.com are closely monitoring customer response to the band's experiment. "The really interesting part about that is it's a great way to get into Radiohead," says Bill Nguyen, cofounder of the company. "What this tells [us] is people want flexibility. [Lala.com] is trying to create a Chinese menu where we let consumers create bundles of what they want and make it wide open in terms of what they have access to."

Other bands, like Nine Inch Nails, are following suit. Earlier this year, lead singer Trent Reznor was outraged to see inflated prices for the group's CDs and DVDs in an Australian record store. He publicly blamed his label, Interscope, for the increase and called its executives "thieves." Too bad Reznor hadn't walked into Atlanta's Criminal Records store. Despite the manufacturer's suggested retail price that most labels implement (about 40 percent), Criminal Records has always marked up all CDs only 30 percent, an equation that has seemingly satisfied all. "We've never changed our formula," says owner Eric Levin. "It's my job as a good retailer to find the best price I can on the coolest stuff. We're commiserating when customers say 'That's too expensive."


While some companies declined to reveal their pricing strategies, others determined cost from past experience. "We were sitting in our apartment at college and thought 'What would get us to buy music?'" says Josh Boltuch, co-founder of newly arrived online retailer, AmieStreet.com. They offer a flexible model that introduces songs for free that increase in price as they increase in popularity (i.e. number of downloads), topping off at 98 cents. "We grew up with Napster and P2P networks. iTunes was all that was around. There was obviously a market failure when everyone else was stealing music."

And there's always the option of heading down to your local record shop and purchasing albums the old fashioned way. "I'm very, very confident that not everyone wants to download. It's collectablity. physicality, the joy of a shelf full of items," says Levin. "I don't think that's an old fogie notion. I like to hang art on my wall, and have LPs on my shelf." He calls major retailers like Target and Wal-Mart boring environments (hence Criminal Records also sells comic books, toys and owns the coffee shop next door). But Best Buy's Lucas agrees that people still appreciate something you can hold onto. "There's definitely a switch going on, but it's not everyone, especially people who are collectors," says Lucas. "They want the liner notes, the packaging."

Nevertheless, CD sales have rapidly declined in the past few years as online providers develop new ways to engage consumers. "At the end of the day we have to ask what customers want, what they understand," says Scott Erickson, senior director of project management at Zune. He calls their point pricing system practical and especially handy for international users who want to avoid confusing currency conversions every time they buy music online. Boltuch defends AmieStreet's incremental model by explaining, "It's not because we like math, but because we wanted the price of a song to mean something. The point of songs starting free is to encourage people to discover music. When they find a good song, they tell their friends about it." AmieStreet also offers a recommendation system, something not all providers have implemented yet. These innovations may also be the long-desired way to assuage major label concerns that flat pricing (à la iTunes' system) saps the extra profit that hugely popular artists traditionally provided. "The joy is discovering music," says Boltuch. "There are millions of places you can get it, but it's when you don't know what you want that music is really worth something. That's how it becomes of value."







How does the Street Syndicate differ from other street teams?

The Street Syndicate is completely independent from record label or artist street teams—this enables us to help artists on both major and indie labels as well as other projects like movies, tours, comedians, books and more. Our team is a hand-selected group of people (who we call Synners) that are interviewed, trained and get paid for every project they help. We want our team to think of themselves more as marketing representatives as opposed to a conventional "street teamer."

What does each project entail?

Every project is different, which is what makes it so fun for us and so useful to our clients. No artist or project has the

same needs, so why try to treat them like cogs in the system? In general though, each Synner will be asked to hand out promotional materials after specifically targeted concerts, put up posters in venues before an artist's set, make displays on college campuses, put up posters in record stores and other lifestyle-oriented stores, and give store clerks copies of records and DVDs for in-store play. Every Synner submits an extensive wrap-up report and photos

to document their campaign, which we then send over to our clients so they can use the feedback to improve the campaign.

In what markets is the Street Syndicate most effective?

We have Synners nationwide, except for in Hawaii and Alaska (shipping charges can be a real pain to get there!). Like most teams, we are strongest in the major markets, like New York City, Los Angeles, Chicago, Philadelphia, Boston, Atlanta and Austin, but we also have a really strong presence in most secondary markets, too. Often record labels and other companies come to us specifically looking for help in those smaller markets because the company's own team can't cover them and we can!

What qualifies someone to be a Street Synner?

A Synner needs to love music and the entertainment industry in general and want to learn about new artists and products. They need to be very driven and very responsible as well as observant and well-spoken. Every Synner has to fill out a detailed application before they

> even are granted a phone interview. If they pass the interview, then we'll try them out on a project or two to see how they do. We don't give paychecks to slackers, so we only want the best on our team!

What was your favorite moment as a street teamer?

Before I worked in the office to help manage the team, I was a Synner in both Wilkes-Barre, PA and New York City. I had a lot of great projects, but walking in the Christmas parade in New York City behind the Strawberry Shortcake float was my favorite by far! I got to give Strawberry Shortcake stickers to little kids

watching the parade. You think kids outside of a Taking Back Sunday show are stoked for stickers until you see the pure excitement of a four-year-old getting a free sticker at a Christmas parade. I thought I was going to be mobbed by them! It was GREAT!

What have you done as a station to facilitate the building of your new broadcast tower?

[It] has taken about five years, from start to finish, of planning to get the tower up. What began as a brainstorm between several staff members turned into a non-stop project. Station staff sought the help of community members for guidance, and members of RLC were helped by an Executive Committee from the community and the Piscataway Board of Education, since Piscataway High School is the station's licensee. The executive staff of the station worked to plan a fundraiser to raise money for the tower and went about designing the technical specifications of it. The station was allocated \$34,500 from both the Livingston College and Piscataway Board Of Education. But the most important part of raising funds was the Tower Of Tomorrow Marathon. For 36 hours, the staff of RLC [and parent station WVPH of Piscataway High School] broadcast live from the Woodbridge Center Mall in an effort to raise the money for the new transmitter. The event raised \$20,000 and really got the station on its way towards completing the project. The last two years since the marathon have been sant liguring out contracts. construction and spending all the


tower built. The transmitter finally went up at the end of this past August, and on October 6, 90.3 The Core went live with the Tower Of Tomorrow.

How will this change RLC's

broadcast power?
Though the station is going down to 100 watts from 200, the transmitter is now ten times higher than it was before! It's [more than] 250 feet in the air! As height is everything in radio, we are now broadcasting throughout the center of New Jersey, from Princeton to Rahway to the Jersey Shore. The station's signal is 85 percent stronger and has the potential to reach over a million people a day in central Jersey.

What have you done to raise awareness of the new tower?

On and off the air we promoted the event. We had members of the community, supporters and members of the station come to a banquet where we flipped the switch on the new transmitter. We were joined by the Piscataway Board Of Education Superintendent, Dean Of Livingston Campus and NPR's Soterios Johnson (at WNYC). On the website and through fliers, we raised awareness around all Rutgers. On-air announcements, a day of stunting that promoted the event and having every DJ tell the listeners about the dinner raised awareness as best we could. Now that it's on, DJs are still encouraged to let listeners know that we are stronger than ever, and can be heard throughout the state wider than ever before.





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
