PROPOSAL FOR A PHONO RECORD ARMISTICE

THE CASH BOX believes and has so published some issues back, after a survey among leading phonograph operators, that the music operator is IN THE MIDDLE regarding the arguments now going on for the making of records. He has been placed ON THE SPOT because he has no national organization to defend him in such matters. He is, as we stated just a few weeks ago on these pages, a loose muscled giant that hasn't as yet even become acquainted with the great power he wields. We, at THE CASH BOX, therefore believe that the time has now arrived when this situation is becoming unbearable to the automatic music operator. It is definitely beginning to affect his business - his income - his livlihood. He is working hard to continue in business as best he can while enduring the agonies of a record ban which never should have been forced upon him. At our own expense, we do not ask for anyone else to share the cost with us, we have employed a prominent attorney in New York City, have presented our idea for a proposal for an ARMISTICE for the automatic music operator - and are prepared to carry this further - directly to Mr. James C. Petrillo of Local 802, American Federation of Musicians and to the record manufacturers - to see whether this simple, yet practical proposal can be worked out with Mr. Petrillo and the record companies.

We propose: that because there is no argument on record between the automatic music operator and the musician; because both of these respect each other for what they have done for each other; because of the fact that both of these feel that each one is suffering from this present record situation that the following plan be adopted:

> THAT RECORDS BE MANUFACTURED EXCLUSIVELY FOR USE IN COIN OPERATED PHONO-GRAPHS PENDING THE SOLUTION TO THE PROBLEMS NOW EXISTENT BETWEEN THE RECORD MANUFACTURERS AND THE AMERICAN FEDERATION OF MUSICIANS. THAT SUCH AN ARMISTICE CAN BE MADE COMPLETELY WORKABLE BETWEEN THE AUTOMATIC MUSIC OPERATORS, THE AMERICAN FEDERATION OF MUSICIANS (LOCAL 802) AND THE RECORD MANUFACTURERS WITHOUT ANY NECESSITY FOR ANY INVOLVED AND FURTHER ARGUMENTS.

We further believe that such an armistice would prove tremendously helpful to the general morale of our armed forces for then they would be hearing their favorite music thru the automatic phonographs located in their camps and in the vicinity of their camps. We further believe that, tho this may somewhat affect the radio stations, we are strictly, and completely and exclusively concerned with automatic phonographs and that if this does affect the radio stations it may even prove helpful in bringing about a more rapid solution to the entire problem.

We want to present the above to Mr. James C. Petrillo at Local 802, American Federation of Musicians. We will do this at our own expense and include the expense of our attorney who is helping to advise us in this matter for we feel that every single automatic music operator IS WITH US in our attempt to arrive at a solution whereby records will once again be manufactured for sale to automatic music operators.

We further believe that Mr. James C. Petrillo is definitely not there to harm the automatic music operator. He is endeavoring to obtain what his organization feels they are rightfully entitled to. We feel that we have been placed IN THE MIDDLE of an argument for the manufacture of records between the record companies and the American Federation of Musicians which is hurting our business. It is beginning to make itself felt more each day. Operators need records. They don't want any quarrels which are definitely not of their own making. They respect the rights of the musicians as well as the record manufacturers. But, they just don't want to be PUT ON THE SPOT in an argument of this kind.

WE WANT TO HEAR FROM YOU! We want your opinions and we want them FAST. We intend to see and place this matter before Mr. James C. Petrillo and ask Mr. Petrillo to see if our proposal can be worked out to a satisfactory solution speedily. We want records to again be manufactured for coin operated phonographs. Whatever the record manufacturers and the American Federation of Musicians have to fight about - let them fight about it until the cows come home. We are interested solely in the coin operated phonograph and are asking that records be made exclusively and only for that instrument so that it may continue as popular as ever and bring a sensible return to the operator who has invested his money, his time, his effort and his energy in it to REMAIN IN BUSINESS. YOUR ANSWERS BY LETTER OR WIRE - IN VOLUME - MAY HELP BRING SPEEDY RESULTS! SHOW THIS TO ALL THE MUSIC OPERATORS YOU KNOW - HAVE THEM READ IT AND WRITE OR WIRE US IMMEDIATELY!

Gentlemen:

I have discussed at length with your editor, Bill Gersh, his suggestion for an interim solution of the problems confronting the automatic music operators as a result of the current ban on the making of recordings. I believe that Mr. Gersh's suggestion that the American Federation of Musicians (Local 802) relax its ban on the making of records so as to permit the manufacture of records to be used exclusively by automatic music operators is one that can be worked out from the legal and practical standpoints by both the American Federation of Musicians and the recording companies.

Mr. Gorsh's plan is particularly appealing in that it will bring about a supply of records for the thousands of automatic music machines now being used for the entertainment of those serving in the armed forces of our country.

In accordance with my retainer, I am holding myself ready to engage in whatever conferences may be necessary with the officials of Local 802 of the American Federation of Musicians and the recording companies to bring about the adoption of Mr. Gersh's plan.



"The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

RETAILERS WILL NEED COINGAMES For sometime now we have been writing that as the retailer faces greater curtailment and shortages he will be forced to seek other, outside means for sustaining his business. The first he usually turns to are coingames for he realizes that these not only keep his customers in his place of business but that they also produce the necessary revenue to make up for the loss he faces in his regular lines. Because of this demand on the part of the retail mer-chant we find that law enforcement agencies everywhere have relaxed restrictions. Coingames are beginning to appear in spots today

where they were most severely censured only a few months ago. This is due to the adamant stand of many retail business men.

Just the other day, to give greater emphasis to our prediction, came the report of an address by George T. Bryant, Chief of the Trade Relations Branch, Retail Trade Service Division, OPA, at the meeting of the National Dry Goods Association Bryant advised the merchants, "Clean house, Trim your sails. Get ready to weather the storm and avoid the mad, last minute rush for dwindling supplies." (This also bears out our statements in our 1942 Market Report). He also declared, "We want to see everything done to make the retail business survive".

All this simply means to the cointrade that because of restrictions and rationing on the retailers, and further because of the fact that all divisions of the government are interested in doing everything possible to keep the retailer in business (for he is the backbone of the American distribution system) coingames will prove of tremendous importance to the retailer in helping him to continue in business and the legalities usually contended with by coinmen will be found to be more or less relaxed as more and more retail merchants get up on their hind legs and advise the authorities in their communities that coin operated machines are an absolute necessity for their continuance in business.

PRICE PROBLEM

Once again the increased prices of equipment have become a chief topic of conversation. For weeks and weeks we have written about price increases. It's only natural for prices to go up when supplies diminish and demand grows. (Just ask your wife what she is now paying at the grocer, butcher and baker. Don't kid yourself - inflation is here.) Demand for equipment grows greater every day as more and more territory opens. The intelligent coinman realizes that under present conditions, with play growing greater, and machines wearing out, and demand zooming (with hoarding of machines increasing) that prices are far above normal (and as predicted in our New Year Special Issue) will reach even a higher peak by Spring. Actually there is no price problem, as such. As in all industry, the natural force of economics has made itself felt. We can only hope that more and still more equipment will enter the market from outlying terri-tory (being pulled in because of gas and tire rationing) so that prices will become more or less stabilized and not so much subject to inflationary hysteria. (It's all up to you.)

REVENUE RUMBLES

Some issues ago we stated that as rationing became more severe we would again begin to hear revenue numbles from various states which might prove volcanic in effect to the cointrade. This past week the press in New York State reported that Governor Dewey was seeking revenue from every possible source to insure the state's financial condition. We also note that Governor Holland of Florida is wondering how he's going to keep the public schools open and pay the state's old age pensions, too. (Because of the severe-ly high taxes placed on racing, Florida tracks have been forced to close. Race tracks are not portable - like coingames.) This search for state revenue, of which these are only the first rumbles, will no doubt become national in scope and can be used as a wedge by coinmen to open much territory. Eventually, the search for revenue will dig into the coin machines field. (This has already happened this past week where a bill was presented to the New York State Legislature to tax coingames.) Why not get ahead of the first loud mouthed politico in your state and propose such taxation (based on the Federal government's tax method) and on a fair basis, and thereby "take the bull by the horns" as the expression goes? Not only can this be construed as a patriotic gesture but may even prove a preventive for even greater taxation.

"PAT-ON-THE-BACK" DEPT.

We're just as human as the next fellow and therefore just as subject to the vanities and foibles of this earthly existence. So when we get a letter like the following from Ed. Ravreby of Owl Mint Machine Company, Boston, Mass. we like to see it in print for

all to read. "Congratulations." Writes Ed, "You have succeeded in putting across that extra bit of enthusiasm and optimism so sorely needed in cur industry. By your splendid and most dynamic initiative and ingenuity, by your timely news items relating to our business and appearing weekly in your most valuable medium, you have injected such a spirit of optimism in our trade that soon you will have to incorporate all your ideas into a weekly magazine. One has only to watch the growth of The Cash Box to understand 'the great comeback to life' of those of our former leaders who laid down their tools, emblematic of our industry. Once again they are advertising thru your medium, The Cash Box. Keep up the good work and I predict - The Cash Box will be the leading coin machine trade magazine."

COOPERATION VITAL

This is the time for true cooperation among the members of this industry. This is the time to lay aside petty personal jealousies and dislikes which are obstacles in the path of true cooperation. Cooperation now is vital, Vital because it affects you personally. It affects your business, your livlihood, your family, your future. Vital, because if you will cooperate with your fellow coinman now you will assure yourself continued, profitable operation. If you have extra equipment you are not using, let the rest of the trade know about it. And don't, please don't try to profiteer. This is one sure way toward wild, hysterical, inflationary prices. Take a decent profit. No one in his right mind will resent that. But don't try to hold up your fellow coinman because you know that equipment is hard to get. The same is true of parts and supplies. You will personally feel better, deep down where it counts, by such cooperative action NOW.

STURDY EQUIPMENT

At this time, it behooves us, that we can all give thanks to the foresight of most of our manufacturers. The greater majority of the equipment they produced continues to give marvelously efficient service. The most of these machines probably could not be termed "true, beautiful, modern design" in the artistic understanding of what is meant by "modern design", they were so sturdily constructed that they have lasted for years and will outlast the war. Some of the punching bags still getting terrific bangings in arcades are much more than 20 years old. Scales found here and there are over 40 years old. Phonos and phono mechanisms (even of the modern type) date back to '35. Vendors date away back. There are even some of the very first pin games still running in the smaller towns and still bringing home the old bacon. And as for slots, consoles counter games, etc., some are truly ancient. Again we say - let's give thanks to the coin machine manufacturers for sturdy equipment. By golly, we sure need it now.

1. "HALL OF FAME" FOR COIN MACHINES

There's a "Hall of Fame" for just about everything these days. But, no "Hall of Fame" for coin machines. Why can't we get together on such an enterprise? Let's pick about 50 men who have been in the industry for more than 15 years and allow these men to come together (or work by mail or anyway they please) once a year and vote for a machine or two that they believe belongs in the "Coin Machines Hall of Fame". Certainly that first Bell produced by Charley Fey of San Francisco should have received such honor long, long ago. Some of the Scales that have been produced, too. What about the cigarette machines? The first console? The first paytable? Certainly the music machines - all the way from the automatic harp up to the present super-dooper-dooper instrument. And pin games - my gosh a lot can sure be said for those. And don't forget the guns. And the other arcade equipment. (As you read this there's no doubt that you have already picked out a dozen machines you believe belong in the "Coin Machines Hall of Fame"). Send in your suggestions . Here's something to take your mind off those danged-danged taxes.

SHOWMANSHIP

We have always believed that "showmanship" is really the basis for all success. A showman is the kind of man, in our belief, who can start an arcade or operation any where in the country, and everything else being equal, will soon lead the parade in that certain territory. Showmanship, it seems to us, is a natural attribute. Yet, it can also be developed by keen study of showman tactics. For your continued good welfare, let's review some famous showman tactics. Take the salesman (and very successful, too) we used to know (when traveling salesmen were a part of the American scene) who used to pass out a shiny, brand new penny at each call he made. It got so his customers began to call him, "The copper man".And that's just what he wanted. He was a copper salesman. (Remember John D. Rockefeller and the reams of newspaper publicity he received with his shiny, new dimes?) Do you recall Liggett's first stunt when he opened his very first little drug store?

Well, in the dead of night (prior to opening day) he painted bloody, red footprints leading into his store. He was arrested the next day because of the huge crowds blocking the sidewalk in front of his place who had followed these footprints to his door and jammed his store in an effort to learn just what sort of gruesome murder had been committed. And you must admit that Liggett built a business.

We could probably go on for many, many, pages telling you more about these famous showmanship stunts. Study showmanship. It's great for business.

# PETRILLO PEACE PROPOSAL

In our last week's issue we printed our plan for an armistice to be arranged between James C. Petrillo's Local 802, American Federation of Musicians and the Record Manufacturers in behalf of the Automatic Music Operators. We advised you that, entirely at our own expense, we had retained a prominent New York attorney (Joseph J. Einhorn, 21 East 40th Street, New York) and also published his letter to us wherein he wrote: "I believe that Mr. Gersh's suggestion that the American Federation of Musicians (Local 802) relax its ban on the making of records so as to permit the manufacture of records to be used exclusively by automatic music operators is one that can be worked out from the legal and practical standpoints by both the American Federation of Musicians and the Record Manufacturers."

We asked you to immediately write or wire us your opinions, suggestions and agreement so that we could use these letters and wires to your complete advantage. We intend to bring this matter to the attention of James C. Petrillo within the next few days. We therefore ask you to display this announcement prominently in your place of business — call it to the attention of every music operator you know — get him to write or wire us. The more letters the more wires — the better our chances.

If you haven't the copy of last week's front page of "The Cash Box" around we repeat here the proposal we printed for a phono record armistice:

### THAT RECORDS BE MANUFACTURED EXCLUSIVELY FOR USE IN COIN OPERATED PHONOGRAPHS PEND-ING THE SOLUTION TO THE PROBLEMS NOW EXISTENT BETWEEN THE RECORD MANUFACTURERS AND THE AMERICAN FEDERATION OF MUSICIANS.

We believe that such an agreement can be made completely workable between the Automatic Music Operators, the AFM and the Record Manufacturers. We further believe that such an agreement would prove tremendously helpful to the general morale of our Armed Forces for then they would be hearing their favorite music from the automatic phonos located in and near their camps.

We published some issues ago in "The Cash Box," after a survey among leading automatic music operators, that these men definitely believe they have been placed "in the middle" of this argument between the Record Manufacturer and the AFM. These men have no argument with the musician and he has no argument with them. Both have been extremely helpful to each other. Yet both are now severely suffering because of this record ban. We are not interested in whatever the problems are between the Radio Stations and the AFM. We want to keep automatic phonos going at top speed at a time when their morale building influence is so necessary. (We hear that Pittsburgh's Radio Stations settled with the AFM on their own.) We believe that the Automatic Music Operator can do the same. "The Cash Box" is solely, completely and exclusively interested in the continued good welfare of the Automatic Music Industry.

Again we urge you (before we present our proposal to James C. Petrillo of Local 802, American Federation of Musicians) to have every Automatic Music Man you know — Write or wire...
