There is no doubt anymore that this grand and great sportsmanlike coin operated machines industry is the industry that can be counted upon everytime by the Government of the United States for the ultimate in support of every venture wherein the equipment of this industry can aid the war effort. The Second Wartime Conference opened the path. Now the men have taken it upon themselves to keep this path open. And to open it even wider they are going all out - away out of their way. Every dime we take in we feel is another dime that we can spend to help the men in this business, Every pat on the back we receive is only further encouragement for us to go ahead.

When we opened our Second Wartime Conference there were many black brows in Chicago because some of these people believed we were "blowing the works". They slept fitfully and awoke each morning fearfully and glanced hurriedly at the headlines in their daily papers. Not to be called "slot machine racketeers" because, God knows, we just aren't any such thing.

But, as you all know, it is this kind of scoffer - the kind of man who says he "knows it all" and tells you in advance what he "thinks" he knows - who drags us down and even knocks down our opportunities. By golly, let's get tough with some of these guys. Let's go all out and win the kind of recognition that we have always needed to give us that additional boost to take this industry out of the minds of the people as anything but another great American, and truly American industry, that is working for the general betterment of all concerned with this grandest nation in all of the world's history.

Let us, then, like the Americans that we are, prove that the pioneer spirit of our forefathers is still in us and that we feel that our greatest and grandest and finest times lie ahead of us, and not behind us. And if this sort of scoffer must remain a member of our industry let's push him down to the very slimy depths where he belongs openly and publicly. So that we can, all of us, go ahead - the way that we want to with our heads up - and pride in ourselves - because we are members of an industry that has done, is doing, and will continue to do, good for all this nation - everytime - anytime.

"SURVIVAL OF THE FITTEST"

For many years "survival of the fittest" seems to have been the creed of many engaged in this industry. Run a few ads in your local newspapers and thereby advise all the people in your city that you are donating the proceeds from your machines for a day or two days or a week or whatever you desire to Army and Navy relief. (Just see what that gets you.)

This is the opportunity you have long sought. This is what will win for you the commendation and respect from your community that you have always wanted. And which you most definitely need to assure yourself continuance in your community as a respected business. This is but one of those things that comes along once in a lifetime and which helps you to help yourself over any shaky bumps which may be in the offing for you.

By winning the respect of the people in your community you also gain the prestige that is necessary for your future welfare in that community. If the average retailer can give up part of his revenue to Army and Navy relief and other causes you, too, as a good business man should be able to see your way clear to such action for your own betterment in your community where you are now operating and hope to continue to do business for many, many years to come.
