THE TAX PROBLEM



Very gradually, it seems, the industry is coming around to the belief that the tax problem, Federal and local, is something for serious consideration now and not after the war is over. The reason for this is because more and more men are now beginning to think about and plan for the post-war era. Almost everyone is convinced that the post-war era will be one of the most prosperous in the history of this industry. Therefore the path for this era must be cleared of any obstructions which would prevent the growth of this business. Any expansion which this industry can

make during the coming post-war years can be most completely hindered by taxes of such a nature as to stifle its growth and development.

There is no doubt that everyone is more than willing to pay as much in taxes as they possibly can at this time. As much as our government needs for the successful conduct of this gigantic, global war. The more taxes paid now the less to pay later. The more taxes paid today the surer that the materials of war our fighting men need will reach them faster. The more taxes paid the more patriotic this and all other industry and every human that comprises this nation. But only for taxation that is the result of logical consideration of this or any industry. Taxation that is equitable to industry so as not to obstruct future development and growth. Especially when industry will be called upon to make the most supreme effort to re-employ approximately 10,000,000 men and women who will be gradually released from the armed forces when the war is won. (They are now being released at the rate of 70,000 per month.)

Another and most important factor for this industry, especially at this time, is to establish complete quiet about its present tax actions. Open publication of the tax plans of this industry, regardless of how fair we may think them, will only raise the ire of certain publicity seeking politicos. To see any tax angles about this business in print, in open publication, is to invite trouble. The best that those who are at work on this industry's tax problems can do at this time is to prevent any publicity of their actions reaching such sources wherein the news becomes general - by just picking up a flashy covered paper at a newstand.

At this time there are two known national attempts at more equitable taxation. One is that of the A.O.L.A.C. (Associated Operators of Los Angeles County, Inc.) headed by Samuel "Curley" Robinson. The other is that of the Arcade Owners Association (A.O.A.). Both groups have found that the simple, logical and direct approach to Washington on their problems did not obtain the results for which they had hoped. Therefore each of these organizations has subsided to the methods best known to Washington's politicos and hope by these methods to eventually get the legislative action which will give them the proper cure.

A.O.L.A.C. is striving to get one part of the pin game Federal license brought down from \$100.00 per year (where awards are made for free plays) to \$25.00 per year. They are also attempting to get the license placed on the machine itself and not in the name of the location owner. They are also trying to get a \$10.00 per year Federal license for the ordinary 1¢ counter games instead of the present \$50.00 per year. This latter job is a really tough one, to say the least. Somehow A.O.L.A.C. will have to reconcile the tax makers to the fact that a 1¢ counter game with reels is most entirely different from a small 1¢ slot featuring the same type of reels. Just how this will be accomplished is a problem. We most desperately hope that they will be successful in this venture for there are many thousands of counter games that can be placed into instant operation should this tax be brought down to \$10. per year. And this will also assure the continued manufacture of these profitable little machines for the post-war era.

We have, in the past, heaped much praise upon "Curley" Robinson for his efforts in this direction. The least that can be said for him at this time is that he is still trying, still fighting, still going ahead, and is most sincere in his efforts and in his belief that he will eventually come out the victor. We do not believe that these taxes are going to be withdrawn when the war is over. This is something that this industry must also take into consideration at this time. It is well to remember that

when the public are at last out of this inflated wage scale period they will not have the money nor the inclination to spend what they are spending at this time. Not for some many months to come while industry re-converts back to its former products. At the same time it is also well to remember that no new games will be built for about a year at least after the war is over. All this must be taken into consideration for it adds onto the present taxation problem.

There is the general hope thruout the industry that when this business does start back into normal production after the war is long over that it will produce a new type of product which, because of the fact that it will be so new and different, will not be classified along with the present crop of products being taxed; and that for sometime to come no taxes will be placed on such equipment. This is a fallacy. The local legislatures are not overlooking any possible taxation bets. Even if entirely new and different products appear on the market, and even if for some months these products do escape the attention of the tax makers, they will eventually, if they are of any value, reach a point of such prominence that they will be subject to the whims and fancies of the taxing bodies, both local and Federal, and will eventually be taxed. The pin game is a pertinent example. For years these machines continued to grow in popularity until the industry itself came to the conclusion that the saturation point as far as location expansion was concerned, had been reached. No sooner was this point near its fulfilment than local taxes began to come into effect. Local taxation at first - and then Federal.

This same is gradually becoming true of the phonos which have reached their point of greatest prominence during this war! The survey which was presented here some issues back showed that approximately 84% of those now engaged in this industry had something or other to do with automatic music equipment. Such a large percentage completely dominates any industry for anyone type of product. This fact has hit the limelight; because of it taxation has begun to probe about in the juke box field. Petrillo recognized the prominence of the juke box and now gets his share from the new recordings being made. Because of the publicity accorded him and also other factors various cities are becoming more or less juke box tax excited. An article many months ago appeared in Business Week Magazine which was taken from an open publication in this industry and attracted a terrific amount of attention to the automatic music field. This problem of an open publication advising all and sundry about this industry must be cured. This is a highly specialized field and one that likes to go about as quietly as possible in its inner workings. The very fact that this business is going thru certain development stages makes it almost imperative that it do so with as much quietude as possible.

A week ago we wrote about the Arcade Owners Assn. and their attempts to obtain equitable taxation. They have presented a logical and entirely fitting case of inequitable and misinterpreted tax procedure to Washington. They have shown that the seasonal arcade, the arcade that is only open during the few short summer months, is paying the same tax as the arcade that is open all year around. This is entirely unfair. Furthermore a great many other problems have also arisen in this field. A sale of an arcade, even if this arcade had just purchased licenses only a few weeks ago, suddenly finds that the new buyer must buy licenses from the Federal government all over again. This surely is inequitable. And there are also many other such instances which makes the tax problem in this industry one that must be cured.

The Cash Box, as our readers know, has presented the tax problem time and time again. We have tried to explain it clearly and concisely. We pointed out the various ills that would arise from this problem when new games once again begin to roll onto the market and when the turnover purchasing of these games requires that the trade be unfettered from heavy taxation. We have urged this industry to go down to a 30% - 70% commission basis with its locations. Present day overhead is eating up much more than the 20% increase the trade would gain even on this new commission basis. Such an arrangement would prepare this industry for the future, post-war era. The industry would then be better able to take care of tax and overhead problems when the new machines come fast and furiously if only 30% commission is being paid locations. Yet this is only one part of the greater problem.

Lobbyists may help. We find that some of these have great achievements to their credit. Lawyers are fine, too, for their legal talent is most necessary to get the required understanding from legislators. But, the main spring, the thing that makes all these others tick, is the will of the layman behind all these professionals to get them into and keep them in action. "Curley" Robinson advises us that only 3% of his large, national mailing list came thru to help his organization when they went to Washington this past September on the tax problem. He, too, has learned that there are only a very small percentage of men who look sufficiently far enough ahead in this (or any other) industry to seek to do good for all the industry.

This industry, at this time, has been compared to the condition in which the motion picture industry found itself some years back. This now most noted, profitable and prominent motion picture industry was actually black-balled, chased out, hampered and ridiculed, but successfully fought its way up from all this castigation to the present stage it now occupies in every community. This industry is without any doubt on the way up, too. It has begun to win greater understanding in a great many of its divisions. The process, tho, has been very, very gradual. But the equipment of the future may be just what this industry was intended for and perhaps then we shall at last see it reach its rightful stage.

In the motion picture industry, too, there were only a few far-sighted individuals who fought for greater understanding and recognition. Just the same as is now happening in the coin operated machines industry today. These few fighters who will not give up are the men who will be long, long forgotten, but, who will be the ones who have the courage to take on so unthankful a task and win the eventual position of respect that this industry needs to continue onward and upward.

The major problem at this time is the problem of equitable taxation. This must be settled. It can and will become an accepted part of the overhead of each individual firm in this industry. But this problem must be so settled that everytime a legislature meets the men in this industry will not have to leave their businesses and be called up to fight their way clear again. This requires some sort of a national body to be created to watch out for any taxes being imposed upon this industry which might prove confiscatory or hindering to the development and growth of the industry. Many weeks ago The Cash Box urged the creation of a "Tax Council" composed of men from all of the 48 states plus legal and executive advisors. This is imperative. We do therefore hope that such a "Tax Council" will be created. This can prove to be the ounce of prevention so necessary to the cure.

The "Tax Council" can get started immediately. All that it requires is for the leading men in each state to call a meeting of every single coinman in the state. At this meeting all local (city, county and state) taxes be openly discussed. Each state to then pick three of its leading men, and these three to become the delegates to the "National Tax Council". A national meeting can then be easily and rapidly arranged and The Cash Box will be more than happy to call it once all the local "Tax Councils" are known. All the 48 states will have their men present for the appointment of an "executive board" as well as for an "outside advisor".

While this industry is so highly concentrated, its leaders can start the "National Tax Council". This is a most opportune moment. Later, when the war is over, and when all become completely engrossed in their plans for the future, and with new blood and new machines entering into the field, few if any will be able to take on such work. But if the local tax councils are already in operation, it will just be = matter of entering new members (as they enter the industry) to each council so that the mecessary monies can be obtained to continue the work of watching local as well as national legislation which may cause confiscatory taxation.
