### "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

## ARE THE MANUFACTURERS READY TO PRODUCE?



One of the most prominent and interesting topics of conversation today, wherever coinmen meet, is whether the coin machines manufacturers are all geared and ready for production of new, post-war equipment? As is well known to all who read the financial pages of any newspaper these days, roll-backs and cut-backs of present war materials orders have already begun to greatly affect the production of many of the larger producers. These industrialists have come out boldly and openly and requested that they now be allowed to sell materials for domestic production purposes.

#### PRODUCE NOW

Others have gone even further. Many have stated that this is the time to get under way with domestic production so that there won't be any too great period of transition from war to domestic production, possibly creating mass unemployment. Government agencies as well as leading industrialists and a large number of business men are now calling for some sort of percentage of production to be turned over to domestic requirements. In this coin machines business there is no doubt that should this come to pass it will have a serious and instantaneous effect and it is therefore gaining the uppermost attention of all those in this industry at this time.

#### PRICE DROP

Most large operators have already cut their routes down to the bone. They have concentrated their equipment within the most economical and efficient operating area. By so doing they have been able to, in most instances, place away the cash which they received for the sale of the machines as a financial reserve for the post-war era. They have been going ahead even with the lack of manpower and conducting their routes as efficiently as they possibly can; bringing in better returns than they have ever before enjoyed. But now many of these men are worried about the effect of a sudden cessation of European hostilities and therefore a sudden return of domestic production by the factories in this industry which would drop the prices of their present equipment to unheard of low levels.

#### SELL OR NOT

These men are convinced of the fact that once it appears that the war is near its finish prices will begin to drop hysterically. Buyers will become scarce. Sellers will return to lead the business field again. All this is causing many now engaged in this industry sleepless nights. They are wondering whether they should sell now, while they can still obtain unusually good prices for their equipment, or wait out the puzzling interval until some definite decision is made by government agencies and industrialists now engaged in long winded conversations regarding this problem of when to return, at least partially to domestic production.

#### SECRETARY OF COMMERCE SAYS

For example, Jesse Jones, Secretary of Commerce, stated this past week, "It is possible that this most disrupting of all wars will end suddenly. There will be no time to plan calmly and intelligently for a smooth transition from a war to a peacetime economy." He continues, "But what about the thousands of smaller business firms without any affiliation with any groups and lacking adequate managerial skill to plan for their futures? What is happening to that basically American characteristic private initiative, the quality which impels men to broaden their vision and take risks?" And as Mr. Jones further explains, "Small businesses numbering about 2,750,000 individual concerns and employing 8,000,000 workers must be stable and prosperous for the good of the entire economy."

#### FAR SIGHTED POLICY

The Secretary's far sighted policies are well known to all American business men. He has consistently attempted to bring home to the nation the necessity that small business exterprise must continue on a profitable basis. He has many, many times in the past pointed out that small business makes big business what it is and that each is inter-dependent on the other. Thereby thru the Secretary's efforts it is the general belief that the small business man will not be neglected when the return to domestic production comes about. And this, as the Secretary infers, may be very, very soon, because of the war ending suddenly.

#### NOTED FINANCIAL WRITER SAYS

J. G. Forrest, noted financial writer, writing in The New York Times this past week stated in a review of business for the past year, "Now that the present conflict has surpassed in length World War I, each new victory or conference of leaders serves to highlight a problem which is bound to increase in importance as 1944 progresses. Already there are indications that reconversion of industrial plants from war production to normal operation has entered its intial stage. The War Production Board is reported to be giving careful consideration to such developments with a view to formulating detailed plans for the partial reconversion of industry upon the downfall of Germany.

#### SALES ACTION UP

Such statements naturally cause concern among many of the members of this indus-They now want to know whether the coin machines manufacturers are geared to entry. ter into instant production of equipment as are many of the larger industrial plants in the nation at this time. There is no doubt that when the larger industrialists return to domestic operation that the smaller plants, which are dependent upon them for sub-contracts, will close down and necessarily have to reconvert to normal production of former equipment. This is therefore a very much discussed problem these days. It is probably the reason why sales have suddenly shown new life and this business is beginning to again show greater action as 1944 opens than for the past 3 or 4 months of 1943. There is no doubt that this action will become even more pronounced as the weeks go by and victories are reported from the European front.

#### AUTO INDUSTRY SPEAKS

Also interesting in this regard is the statement of Ward M. Canaday, president of Willys-Overland Motors, Inc., in speaking of the auto industry this past week, "I believe the (auto) industry should be permitted to start plans and preparations now to build a limited number of new automobiles on the day the war in Europe ends, rather than delay this preparation for conversion until Japan is defeated. Such a move need not imply any let-up in necessary war production; it is a logical first step in the post-war planning required to return auto plants to peacetime operation without creating mass production. If we leave the job of conversion until the last shot is fired in this global conflict, we are certain to create a sudden economic dislocation as well as a serious breakdown in civilian transportation. Many persons are predicting a period of mass unemployment directly following the termination of the war, but in my judgment we need not accept this condition; we can take decisive steps now to cushion the nation's changeover from a war to a peacetime economy."

#### ARE WE READY?

It is even further interesting to note how all these statements regarding a partial return to domestic production barraged down on the press, and naturally the politicos in Washington in one concerted wave this past week. This is the cumulative result of year end statements by most of the larger industrialists who have been saying these same things for sometime now. How they affect this industry is quite simple to understand. In the first place they have the effect of hastening all members of this business to a more rapid reconversion of their present set-up and speeding up of any plans which they now have for the post-war era. Furthermore, they have already started sales of machines going at a faster clip than in many previous months. They have also tended to bring about wonderment on the part of most members of this trade as to whether the manufacturers of the equipment in this industry are prepared to fill the breach when they find their war materials contracts suddenly rolled back on them. And, most important, everyone wants to know just how soon all this is going to happen.

#### CANADA ALLOWS PRODUCTION

Also upsetting to American coinmen was the notice that came out of Toronto last week, wherein the Canadian government has granted permission for the manufacture of many products relative to this field, such as vending machines, games, gambling devices, scoreboards, novelties of all kinds, etc. There is no doubt that a great many Canadians are going to jump at this opportunity to get into the swing of the coin machines business. It is well known to all in this industry that prices now being asked in Canada for pins and other machines, many of these far past six years old, tremen-dously exceed the prices being quoted in this country. This lifting of the ban on release of coin equipment will ease this situation. It will also clear away much future export from this country. Many distributors and jobbers had planned to rush used machines into Canada when new equipment was again being produced. Now much of this used equipment which was planned for sale in Canada may remain here.

#### PREPARE NOW

The concensus is that the trade should properly prepare itself for a sudden production surprise by concentrating its present routes. By setting up a much better com-mission basis ratio to the locations, preferably the 70%-30% basis which The Cash Box has been urging for sometime now. And to also instantly and intelligently get into action on its post-war plans. To check and re-check all present necessary equipment. To carefully concentrate its routes. To be prepared for instant expansion moves. To figure its promotional plans for tomorrow. To prepare showrooms, offices, warehouses and repair departments. To guide itself conservatively and carefully. To build that most necessary financial reserve. To be prepared to act fast for time is getting short.

## "WHAT ABOUT THE TAX?"

It was extremely interesting to visit one of the noted and outstanding arcade cities in the country this past week. This city is famed for its all year 'round ocean frontage attractions. Arcade operators here have established a notional reputation for their versatility and showmanship.

In this city one of every three arcade owners asked, "What about the tax?" Yet it seems that not one of these gentlemen is devoting any of his time helping to cure the tax situation. And this brings us back to the point that The Cash Box brought out some months ago. It has become almost impossible for the average man in this business today to do anything at all about a great many of the national problems that face him even the he is most sincerely interested in effecting some sort of cure for those problems.

Lack of national organization. Lack of help in his own business these days so that he just hasn't the time to devote to problems of such nature. Lack of even local organization, in many cases, where he can start the ball to rolling. Lack of the proper and necessary facilities to work with, or even complete understanding of what has to be done, and how he should proceed to accomplish the desired result. These, and many other problems face him, and hold him back from earnest effort.

These arcade men are most naturally interested in getting a more equitable tax method established. As they explain, "We feel that we are being unfairly taxed by the present method of paying \$10. per machine in advance for the entire year. We should be allowed the method of payment which you suggested whereby we can go to our local post office or some other agency and purchase stamps or cards to be attached to the machines in 3 month denominations featuring a different color for each quarteryearly period. In that way, if we feel that our summer season is all we want to remain open, we can purchase the required number of 3 month stamps we need for this period and close for the other 9 months of the year. If we believe there is a possibility that we can continue on thru the Fall, Winter and Spring seasons we shall be more than happy to purchase stamps for each 3 month period as we go along." The problem which therefore presents itself is what to do about getting some one certain committee or agency or outstanding personage to arrange for placing such a tax plan into action with the proper Federal authorities.

At the present time, any attempted lowering of taxes would be a most difficult, if not altogether impossible, procedure. It would be best to continue on ahead with one thought at a time and obtain the greatest results by the shortest and most direct methods. If a more clear interpretation of the arcade tax methods can be arranged, this is bound to not only benefit the arcade owners, but will also benefit the operators of the same type of machines. By obtaining the proper interpretation and agrees ment from the Federal authorities regarding the 3 month tax stamp units to be placed on the machines themselves, the arcade owners as well as the operators have won the greatest part of their tax battle.

Every single one of the arcade men in the nation must be brought back of this plan. The most logical procedure would be to arrange thru some progressive and enterprising arcade owners to obtain the signatures of all other arcade owners in each territory and thereby gain the complete cooperation of all these men in obtaining the necessary revisions which will get them the proper sort of tax arrangement.

If one or two men in each territory will meet and phone, wire or write the other arcade men, they will have started the ball to rolling. A large gathering of arcade men can easily be arranged. The gathering can then decide upon the arcade tax problem on a complete and national basis. The average arcade owner is happy to pay the tax. But he wants this yearly tax broken down into quarter-yearly units so that he can proceed with greater ease of mind and not be forced to do something which may prove unprofitable. If he has enjoyed a successful Summer season and if he feels the Fall and Winter may prove unprofitable there is no reason for him being forced to continue beyond this one 3 month tax period. Laws are not written to force financialloss upon industry.

"What about the tax?" Simply that certain leading men in the arcade field must make up their minds to call together all others, whether competitors or friends, and urge these men to band themselves together for this one and sole purpose of curing this present inequitable tax situation. This can be done. (It was done in the matter of the OPA when The Cash Box called the men together at the First Wartime Conference.) The Cash Box will be more than happy to help call together the arcade owners if given the complete support and cooperation of the leading arcade men from coast to coast. The rest is up to you.

Prices continue to be very widely divergent these days. Someone on the West Coast may feel a certain machine worth \$150.00 whereas someone on the East Coast may think it worth but \$75.00. Of course, condition, serial, appearance, demand, territory, quantity, etc., must all be taken into consideration. The Confidential Price Lists report each quotation exactly as it is made and depend on the subscriber to make average price adjustment to fit the peculiarities of his own territory. of his own territory.
