

"The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

HAS POST-WAR MANUFACTURE STARTED? For many months The Cash Box has given great credit to the coin ma-

chines revempers. It earnestly believes that they have been responsible for maintaining a tremendous number of locations thruout the country which the trade would otherwise have had to forsake due to lack of equipment, or because machines having worn out, there was actually nothing which could be used to keep the play at a profitable pitch. It has been, and continues to be the belief of The Cash Box, that because of this fact the revamper should be given all-out, full credit by all this industry for the work that he has done and is do-

ing. In the past few weeks the number of revampers has increased to such an extent that it is now generally believed that this may be considered as the beginning of the new post-war coin machines manufacturing era.

The revamper knows what the trade needs and wants right now. He has been able to keep pace with developments at a time when the larger manufactories could not continue. He has been and is in a position to know what new ideas have jumped play and just what will continue to increase play. He has worked against a great many hardships. Each time the trade discovered just what game he was using for revamping purposes, the price of that game zoomed. He has therefore been forced many times to increase his price to make allowance for such an inflationary movement. But even with all this against him. With the necessity for obtaining used materials from the old games and making them work perfectly. Actually rebuilding new cabinets. Changing the play action. Adding a new twist here and there. Working with those few new materials which he could obtain. He has done all this with brilliant ingeniousness so as to continue a production line. This has won him the respect and praise of the trade.

Look back down the line and note why the belief is now so general that the revamper has actually started the post-war manufacturing era. At the present time there are three bowling alleys in production. There are two guns being made and a rifle range in production. There are just about a dozen revampers in the pinball field. There are about four or five in the arcade field. Every Wurlitzer and Seeburg distributor has been using old mechanisms, reconditioning them, and placing them in brand new cabinets and have, many of them, also continued to revamp some of the older phonos, too. Nor are these two great lines of distributors alone in this effort. There are probably more than two dozen men in the music machines business from coast to coast who are also engaged in revamping phonos. Tho they haven't made any effort to publicize this fact in the past, they are now gradually coming to the front as they find that the trade is more than ever interested in what they are doing.

Two new conversions for Panorams into peek shows have come about. These have attracted a great deal of attention for they have shot the Panorams into a money-making class such as they never before enjoyed. They have put them in arcades and the arcades, working them on the old and proven peek principle, have proven them tremendously profitable. And speaking of arcades, practically every enterprising arcade owner is an ultra-ingenious revamper in his own right. Many arcade men are also helping out others thruout the country. It is really a shame that these men, too, haven't come to the fore and publicized themselves in this regard.

Revamping one-balls at this time is the major business of four or five firms. Each one of these has won a great following. We also hear of some others here and there but from what we can gather they are revamping for their own personal needs and not as a general business. These men should make themselves better known to all the trade, Consoles are also being revamped. And to discuss the revamping of slots would take too many hundreds of printed words. There are about a dozen well known firms in this division of the field and each one is as busy as a bee trying to fill orders.

This speedy action these past few weeks has suddenly awakened the more progressive coinmen. There is no doubt that this general belief which is now current, that the present tremendously increased crop of revampers are already the post-war manufacturers, can be accepted as fact. This industry is once again in speed action and is fast going ahead. It is already in the post-war era. It has already begun to gain the momentum which dozens predicted for it the moment the first signs of the post-war era appeared.

THE CASH BOX

For sometime now The Cash Box has been presenting suggestions, ideas, surveys, etc., all carefully prepared as guides for the post-war era which this industry looks forward to so eagerly. The pep and speed which has suddenly activated the industry. The return of many former members of the trade sprouting forth with new and larger showrooms. The entrance of new blood here and there thruout the country on a parttime operating basis while retaining present war plant jobs. The sudden boom in what everyone calls the "revamp field" and which is being translated today to meanthe new post-war manufacturing era. The knowledge that many manufacturers are conducting surveys and seeking new ideas and merchandising plans and learning who leads in all sections of the country. All this leads to the conclusion that the post-war era is already here and that post-war manufacture is under way.

Routes are suddenly being tightened up. Many are already beginning to confine their interests to one certain division of the field. Others are knocking at the doors of the more noted manufacturers seeking immediate distribution contracts. The trade is awakening to the fact that there may be a great many sudden surprises in store for it. None want to be caught short. And even more interesting is the fact that this sudden awakening is best exemplified by the larger space advertising now appearing in The Cash Box by leaders everywhere. The post-war era, it can be factually stated, is definitely well under way for this industry.

DEPOSIT GRABBERS" Since the complete expose of the methods of the "deposit grabbers" in The Cash Box

Since the complete expose of the methods of the "deposit grabbers" in The Cash Box many months ago, this practice quieted down to a point where it almost became non-existent. But in the past few weeks, due to the tremendous increase in activity the "deposit grabber" seems to have returned. This time he has a new angle. He not only advertises equipment he doesn't have, but adds insult to injury by shipping whatever equipment he does have and places the trusting buyer in such position where he has to take whatever is shipped rather than lose all.

The "deposit grabber" blossomed forth during this war period as equipment became more difficult to obtain. He advertises equipment, usually at prices just sufficiently below the accepted market price to create a rush of "1/3 Deposit" checks to his firm. He uses these deposits to maintain and continue himself in business. A few of the first known "deposit grabbers" now seem to be prospering because of the deposits they held up for as many months as they possibly could while they scoured the countryside for machines. Usually, after obtaining a deposit, the "deposit grabber" will write, only after being dunned by wires and letters from the buyer for many weeks, that he is sold out of the equipment ordered, but will have some more in just a few days. This keeps the buyer quiet for just long enough to allow the "deposit grabber" to see whether he can dig up the machines ordered, regardless of condition, and possibly make a few dollars in the process. In the meantime he has used this deposit money to remain in business.

If he finds he can't get exactly what was ordered, he will ship whatever comes close to the original order. Many times he ships machines with broken glasses and parts missing and always blames this on the freight companies. One of these days, when normal times return, he will get the biggest surprise of his life when the freight company advise him that due to the great many complaints he and his customers have made on his merchandise they just won't handle any of his shipments anymore. In the meantime he always tries to cover himself by cleverly making the receiver of the merchandise complain to the freight firm.

One reason the "deposit grabber" has returned in the past few weeks is due to the fact that he needs more money than ever before to purchase equipment because of the higher prices. He has the habit therefore of every so often splurging with large ads in publications that do not know him nor understand nor seem to care to understand his methods of doing business. With a big smile or a warm letter he praises the publication and its ad taker and places the sort of big ad that the publication and its solicitors so eagerly seek. He then grabs whatever deposits he can as the result of such ad. In this way he can go on doing business. In some cases the deposit is never returned. Many times merchandise of an extremely questionable nature reaches the buyer who howls loud and long and never gets anywhere.

This is one outstanding reason for the necessity of a Better Business Bureau in this industry. The Better Business Bureau in your city would rapidly and with great dispatch handle any local business firm advertising merchandise it didn't have, nor even intend to obtain. In fact, they might, if explanations are weak, hustle the owner of such a firm right off to the nearest clink. The sad part of it all is that there is no Better Business Bureau in this coin machines industry. In this post-war era this would prove of tremendously great benefit to all the trade. Such bad actors as "deposit grabbers" can be rapidly blackballed and perhaps even entirely eliminated from this industry because of their underhanded and ugly business methods.

business, under these wartime conditions, to the very best of their ability and doing so honestly. The Cash Box guarantees to this day to return any deposit given an advertiser in The Cash Box up to \$100.00 provided that prior to mailing or wiring the deposit to the advertiser the buyer first contact The Cash Box and allow The Cash Box to okay the transaction. We haven't a million eyes. We're not infallible. But, somehow we believe that when a coin machines man reaches that stage wherein he becomes a subscriber to The Cash Box that he can most definitely be accepted as one of the real and upstanding and leading men in this industry.

MERCHANDISER BOOM

The merchandiser division of this industry looks forward to the greatest boom pericd in its history after this war is over. Merchandise vendors lost much of their glamour on the entrance of the pin game. This was followed by the one-balls and consoles and other amusement devices which detracted much attention from the fact that the merchandise vendor is the basic backbone of this industry. A great many continued along in this field and many of these are today considered among the most solid and substantial firms in this industry.

The fact that the merchandiser is legal and is economically sound has always captured and attracted the attention of new and old blood alike. But the glamorous profits derived from the amusement field distracted attention from these for some years. When an interested prospect learned that his investment in merchandise machines would be just about as great as in phonographs, and that the latter would earn more for him, it was only natural for him to purchase phonos. This same held true for amusement games.

This war offset this fact. It proved the solidity and staunchness of the merchandiser. The great success of the drink vendor is more due to this war than to anything else. Tho these units blossomed forth long before the war and were gradually beginning to get more and more attention, their success was only spasmodic and really the result of the intensive efforts of the new blood they brought to the field. The older and more experienced coinmen could not see themselves making such heavy investment to obtain so small, even if steady, profits. The war has changed the entire outlook of many in this business toward the drink vendor. This same holds true for other merchandisers - such as the candy bar vendors.

For years there has been a demand for amiltiple selective candy bar vendor which would be capable of replacing the dusty candy bar displays in the average drug and other retail stores. The fact remains that the average retailer, in normal times, hates to invest anywhere from \$200.00 to \$400.00 in a candy bar display and find, at the end of the month, that his profit, if any at all, is negligible compared to the investment made. He would much rather prefer a set-up of multiple selective vendors for his most popular candy bars. He would have no investment in the candy and could use this money for the purchase of profit items more directly concerned with his retailing. At the same time he would be enjoying profit from such automatic sale without waste of his employees' time and salary, eliminate loss from theft, do away with loss because of staleness, and also eliminate unpleasantness due to trust. This need is sure to be filled by some enterprising manufacturer.

There is no doubt that drink vendors, cigarette machines and other merchandisers of an entirely new, better and more simplified design will appear on the market and will attract keen attention. They will bring in the kind of solid new blood that will assure this field greater and better growth. Many are also planning to vend grocery and drug items. For a long time now there have been rumors of certain large, national organizations, identified with nationally advertised and recognized products in the grocery and drug field who have been experimenting with vendors, so as to cash in on their late evening radio programs for one thing, by installing these in apartment house lobbies and other point-of-sale spots in each community. These large, national organizations are sure to introduce new ideas in automatic merchandising. Because of its great advertising display value, its economical operational method, its direct point-of-sale feature, its elimination of dealer time and handling and many other factors, the automatic merchandiser is ideal and basically perfect for nationally recognized products, whatever they are.

The merchandiser boom is a surety. More and more men plan to have a route of one type or another of these to act as a backbone for whatever other operations they might enter into. All feel that the merchandise vendor has come out of its swaddling clothes. Many of the noted amusement machines manufacturers are planning to present merchandisers as a complete and separate division of their business. This is in itself proof that this field will jump into the limelight to enjoy the biggest boom in its history.

Gerber of Gerber & Glass Distributing Company, Chicago, Ill., well known to all the trade for his remarkable efforts in its behalf for a great many years and especially well known to every coinman who ever visited Chicago for his world famed Sherman Hotel penny arcade, passed away in California, according to reports just received, on Thursday morning, February 3rd, 1944.

There is no doubt that many will be greatly grieved at this news. Paul was known from coast to coast as one of the most stimulating and inspiring men in this industry. He was extremely charitable and many times was first to start large donations which won much commendation for all this industry. He made it his business to always win more and still more friends for the cointrade and its many products. He was among the first men to view new products and his opinion was highly regarded by manufacturers.

This is indeed a great and sad loss to all this industry. Those who knew Paul Gerber personally are sure to tremendously miss him. Those that only knew him casually will, too, miss his drive, energy and work for all in this industry. Somehow we, here at The Cash Box, feel that Paul Gerber was too dynamic and too outstanding a man in this industry to feel that he has left us.
