AST CHANCE

For three weeks now The Cash Box has been featuring a survey to help determine a standard for jobber and distributor recognition. This will be the fourth week to find this survey an integral part of The Cash Box. And the very last week wherein those who are interested in helping this industry to advance, to eliminate if at all possible chaos, confusion and tumult in the merchandising division of this industry during the post-war era, will have the opportunity to completely fill out this survey and mail it to The Cash Bcx immediately.

This survey was only undertaken after long study resulting from conversations with leading coinmen thrmout the country. These men believed that some sort of recognition bureau should be created for the wholesale division of this industry. Operators, too, most definitely want to know the men upon whom they can depend to sell them the kind of merchandise and give them the type of service they need for continued success. And, at the same time, be assured that when purchasing from wholesalers in this industry that they are fully protected.

Among the jobbers and distributors themselves there are a great many differences of opinions. The wholesaling division of this industry is comparatively new. It is as yet in its embryonic stage. Even the some of the older and larger distributors, who conducted what were considered the leading firms during the pre-war era, and who believe that they and their firms are the true standard for the distributor or jobber, are being questioned as to this belief by the coinmen in their own territories, according to survey now being conducted by The Cash Box. There never was a standard set up for the wholesale division of the industry. Caimmen therefore, on their own account, and to meet with the most complete consideration of all this industry, should help to create a standard, so that recognition can be assured.

There are many wholesalers who have worked hard and long giving service, supplies and parts, with little or no machines to sell during this tragic war period. These men should be given every opportunity to retain their status. It is sad but true, that unless these men are in position to continue along these lines, they will lose the status they formerly enjoyed, as far as distributing or jobbing is concerned.

Each new era brings with it a great many revolutionary changes. This is in keeping with the progress necessary to the expansion of an industry. And sad to relate, such progress seemingly is only made over the bodies of a great many who feel that there is little justice in an industry that will neglect to recognize them after all the travail they have been forced thru during a hard and desperate period. Therefore, the only way that these men can assure themselves of continuance in the positions they formerly enjoyed is for a successful completion of this survey, so that all facts are made known and a bureau of recognition or some other method or agency established to help continue them forward in the post-war era.

The large number of survey sheets already received by The Cash Box present many new and extremely interesting ideas on the part of the men comprising this industry today. There is no doubt that when the new blood starts entering into the field it, too, will have a great many new and possibly strangely different ideas and will demand that new courses be followed. This, in addition to the fact that as the time goes on new mer chandising plans because of new products must result, may mean an entirely new and changed era. Therefore some sort of basis for recognition must now be set up for the benefit of all this industry.

This week is the last week that will find this survey included in The Cash Box. This is the last chance, therefore, for everyone engaged in this coin operated machines industry to give their views regarding a standard of recognition for the wholesaling division of this industry. This is the time to act. The post-war era is in all practicality already here. To be better prepared for it as well as to assure better understanding, the completion of the survey by those who haven't as yet filled it out, will assure a most complete cross-section opinion from the trade.

SHIPPING

Complaints have been received regarding the fact that some coinmen are again becoming lax in their sales responsibilities. As usual crating and shipping are stressed as among the biggest of these many faults. It seems that a good number of coinmen do not give careful consideration to long distance shipments of merchandise. Froper crating of equipment is an absolute necessity. There is no doubt that obtaining crates at any sort of reasonable price is long since gone with the war. But crates can still be made from used lumber. Most buyers are willing to pay the extra few dollars required for the crating, especially for long distance shipping.

The crate itself is not the only necessary item in shipping. The machine itself should not only be thoroly cleaned and carefully reconditioned but should be wrapped in corrugated or whatever other paper may prove most useful, and checked all over again very carefully, prior to being placed into the crate. And in putting the machine into the crate these complainants ask that the shipper be certain that it is solidly installed so that it simply cannot be shaken loose. They also ask shippers to be sure that the nails which are driven into the crate to close it up are not also driven into the body of the machine itself, which has been happening with some regularity of late.

DONATIONS

Requests have come thru from Army and Navy officials to many coinmen for more and still more coin operated equipment to be donated to the use of the armed services. As the war progresses more hospitals are being constructed. It is necessary that returned soldiers, who are convalescing, should have this sort of entertaining relaxation to help them to speedier recovery. And at the same time, to benefit this industry because of the respect and affection that will surely develop for this trade and especially for these machines which help these boys to recovery.

It should not require any definite requests from the Army or Navy for donations of machines of every type. It is already well known that they can use all they can get. The Navy alone has written one noted coinman and advised him that they could use 647 machines of all kinds. Any coinman can contact his nearest Army or Navy base and will find that any game donation will be most tremendously appreciated. So much so that he will be honored for many months to come. And that's surely worth the donation of an old pin game or 10 record phono or some ancient arcade piece that's laying around the basement and which can be cleaned up and put into operating condition in a few hours spare time.

"NO CAMELS"

Cigarettes become more and more difficult to obtain in quantity each week. This has hurt cigarette machines operations. And the some have held up, the earning peak would have reached new record highs were it possible for the cigarette machine operators to obtain the quantity of cigarettes they need today.

One of the outstanding complaints of the cigarette machines men is, "Camels are hardest of all to get at this time." This was verified this past week by The Cash Box while going over a cigarette machine route with one operator and constantly hearing, "No Camels", being told to prospective purchasers by the location owners.

(As has always been the policy of The Cash Box, the men writing its editorials have been sent out on routes with operators to become well acquainted with that side of the coin machines picture. The Cash Box men have also been sent on buying and selling expeditions with distributors and jobbers to obtain a better understanding of this picture, too. The Cash Box has always believed that the one and only way that the members of this publication can better understand this industry is to get out into the trade and work right with the men in it.)

The fact that cigarettes become more difficult to obtain each week is certainly not to the liking of The Cash Box, nor to anyone else in this industry, for that matter. But it is one of the vagaries of this war period and tho the machines continue popular (and their popularity continues to increase daily) the cigarette machines operations will have to wait until such time when they will be able to obtain their full quotas so as to gain the greatest possible prominence for their division of the trade.

ROUTES

Many months ago The Cash Box devoted a great deal of space to the reasons why it was almost imperative that every operator cut down the size of his routes. It was suggest ed that he concentrate his machines into an economically efficient operating area so

as to save gas, oil and tires and to eliminate the need for too much help. These facts have proven themselves.

Today, it seems, routes are again being cut. This time, in preparation for the forthcoming new equipment. A great many coinmen have turned much equipment into cash. This cash, it is hoped, has been placed away as a financial reserve for the post-war era. Some have been forced to cut down routes because of lack of manpower. Many have lost valued mechanics and servicemen to the armed forces. The average operation today is condensed to its best paying locations.

This also means, of course, that today there are more locations without equipment of one type or another, than ever before in the history of this industry. This assures that upon entrance of new blood, or new equipment for those now engaged in this industry, that many locations will be available. These spots are expected to be rapidly covered when the new equipment arrives.

Cutting down further on routes at this time has its advantages as well as its disadvantages. First of all, if help is lacking, then it is but logical to cut off the poorer locations. Where help is still available it is best to retain as many locations which show a profit as possible and thereby retain control of an impressive number of locations which can instantly be utilized for the new equipment.

This is most definitely the time to make the best possible commission arrangement with location owners. Those who have already followed this suggestion by The Cash Box - to adopt the 70%-30% commission basis - now find themselves completely and perfectly geared for the post-war era.

KEEP GOING

Keep going - that's the one way to assure this becoming a grand and great industry. The moment you begin to doubt in the future greatness of this business - we are all lost. Have faith in this industry. Your success in this business hinges on the faith you have in it. Keep going.

Remember how all those pessimists in this industry, at the start of the war, cried that this business was finished? Remember how they pointed to all the young men who were leaving for the armed services and claimed that all locations would therefore be destitute of players? Remember how they howled because no new machines would be produced and claimed that because of this the industry could not last another year? How some of them even said that the government would stop all shipments of machines? Well, most of these guys are doing better than they ever did before in all their careers in this business.

The men that keep going, thru thick and thin and bad and good, are those men who have faith. Keep going. Have faith - believe - don't hesitate. All present circumstances are building to help you to a bigger and better business. Keep going.

NEEDLES

One of the problems confronting the music operator these past months has been the phono needles. A letter received from a Pennsyvlania music operator is to the effect that the needles he purchased a short time ago, from one of the leading needle manufacturers, were cutting his records to ribbons. Other music ops report that they have instructed their service men to change the needle in each machine at each servicing, regardless of how many plays it has received.

But the fault is not all in the needle. The records being manufactured today, because of the scrap shellac that is being used, show more wear in ten plays than they did for 100 or 200 plays in pre-war days. Many machines are also still featuring the old 6 ounce pickup which, in itself, is absolutely injurious to any record, and especially injurious to the new type scrap shellac records being made. If such pickup arms could be changed today, as they were rapidly being changed by many music ops in prewar days until the war caught up to them, much needle and record trouble would be entirely eliminated. It is unreasonable to expect any needle to compensate for all these deficiencies.

It is also known today that needle orders have attained the greatest sales records in their history for all phono needle manufacturers. This is attributed by the leading music men to the fact that the poor quality of the records how being used require more constant heedle changes. This is logical, especially when consideration is given to the fact that there are less phonos in operation today than in pre-war days, and yet needle orders are greater today. This is considering the coin operated music machines field only, not including the home sales market where many needle manufacturers are now selling in tremendous quantity. The average music man does not blame the needle entirely. He instead blames a combination of circumstances. Poor quality records, heavy pickup arms and deficient mechanisms, because of their age and the hard wear they have already received and continue to receive each day.

It is the hope of The Cash Box that the music op will continue to carry on as courageously as he has during this war period so that when the post-war era arrives he will once again enjoy the quality and the craftsmanship which he always expects from all music machines supplies manufacturers.



NEW MARKETS

Vast new markets for American industry and increased prosperity for American families in the post-war period were predicted this past week by George W. Bacon, one of the nation's leading engineers.

Mr. Bacon stated, "Post-war prosperity in the United States, if not the world, will far exceed during its first quarter of a century any business activity for a like period the world has ever witnessed.

"Normal inventories having become nonexistent during the war, the post-war period will involve tens of billions of dollars of production and distribution. I foresee credit facilities such as our people have never known, and vast sums will be spent to overcome present enormous volumes of depreciated facilities and equipment of all kinds in the United States and beyond our borders."

(This prediction of at least 25 years of tremendous prosperity for the nation after the war, coming from so noted an engineer as Mr. Bacon, has created a great deal of optimistic comment. It certainly bodes well for this coin operated machines industry because of the fact that labor will be earning as much or even more than at present, and with about 10,000,000 men from the armed services also at work, the prospects for continued high revenue from the equipment of this industry are extremely great.)

CHEAP CREDIT

A great many coinmen have been pondering the credit angle. The survey being conducted by The Cash Box (to determine a standard for jobber and distributor recognition) has brought forth some rather interesting statements from coinmen regarding the granting of credit.

It is therefore all the more interesting to note that L. S. Crowder, general manager and treasurer of the National Retail Credit Assn. reports, "All indications point to the largest credit volume in the history of retailing during the post-war period. This record volume may also be done on the cheapest credit ever known.'

He explains, "It will be illegal for retailers to frame agreements among themselves to limit terms or set minimum payments on credit purchases as such action would be restraint of trade. It will, however, be feasible to adopt sound credit policies and recommend that they be carried out on a community basis."

Everyone in the trade at this time realizes that some sort of credit arrangements will have to be made to accommodate much of the new blood that is expected to enter into the operating picture after the war. Just as the National Retail Assn., the members of this industry should also get together to adopt sound credit policies. Whether some like it or not, there are a great many who eagerly look forward to a certain percentage of their profits coming from the interest on time payment credit they will issue for the purchase of new equipment.

EXPORT

Many months ago The Cash Box predicted that export would prove to be one of the most profitable and outstanding fields for this industry in the post-war period. The Cash Box also believes that the manufacturers in this industry will cover foreign markets, after the war, with just as much thoroness as they will cover the domestic field. Salesmen will fly thousands of miles with as much ease and nonchalance as if entraining from Chicago to New York. The export business of this industry is sure to more than quadruple within 5 years after the war is over.

Philip Young, assistant to the administrator of the Foreign Economic Administration urged exporters to use the "instruments of Government" to insure the nation's full participation in world trade opportunities. Mr. Young spoke before the Export Manager's Club "get-together" at the Hotel Pennsylvania in New York, this past week.

He also stated that most of the foreign exporters were working very closely with their Governments. And the present U.S. controls over exports may seem harsh, he said, they have been found to be of great value to exporters.

It is therefore more or less assured that when export once again starts for the products of this industry that Government control will be exercised. But, in the case of this trade, it is believed that such control will work to the full advantage of this industry's exporters.
