MANUFACTURERS APPOINT POST-WAR COMMITTEE
In their meeting on Wednesday evening, April 26, 1944, the CMI appointed a committee of manufacturers to plan a method of procedure for arranging to meet with WPB in Washington, when the time arrives, so as to get into reconversion as soon as possible.

The committee consists of the following: Walter Tratsch of $A$. $B$. T. Manufacturing Corp., George Jonkins of Bally Manufacturing Co., Dennis Donohuc of Mills Industries, Inc., R. W. Hood of H. C. Evans \& Company, James E. Broyles of The Rudolph Wurlitzer Company, W. E. Bolen of Northwestern Corp., John Chrest of Exhibit Supply Company, and Burnhart Glassgold of A. H. DuGrenior, Inc.

It is understood, of course, that WPB, like OPA, form their own official committees. But they are always receptive to an industry suggesting men to be appointed to such committees. In the meantime this committee is expected to formulate the proper plans for whatever committee will be officially appointed by WPB when the time comes to appear in Washington on this matter.

Going back to the meeting. The dinner was a huge success and drew the most complete membership. Richard Groetchen was highly complimented on the fine food his restaurant serves. The entertainment was excellent. David Gottlieb of D. Gottlieb \& Co., president of CMI, acted as cheirman of this meeting. He plunged right into the work that was nocessary immediately after the dinner was served. First he colled for a review of the past two years. Then he called for suggestions and open forum discussion as to what preparations this industry should undergo at this time to be prepared for the post-war ern.

Al. Silverman of Rockola Manufacturing Corp., offered the suggestion that this industry create a committee to go on to Washington and thereby be on the ground floor and ready with plans and proposals for a return to manufacture when the proper time arrived. He was followed by George Glassgold, noted attorney, who is in Washington quite often and who gave those present some idea of the Federal workings taking place there. Mr. Glassgold was favorable to Mr. Silverman's suggestion. Jack Kelner also arose and pointed out that in his belief all the various divisions of the industry, which he termed, "legitimate and illegitimate", be called together into one group so that all will work together.

After listening to other speakers, Mr. Gottlieb then offered the motion for the formation of a committee to a vote and this was unanimously agreed to by all those present. Wi th the help of Goorge Jenkins, Mr. Gottlieb then proposed the men who now compose this committee.

Conversations with some of the leaders revealed constructive thoughts such as the following:
"The CMI should follow the trend of all leading manufacturers in all other industrios and appoint a committee to study post-war conditions and the possibilities for carly re-conversion. This committee should be given access to all possible valuable information so that they can appear at the proper time and place and speak for all this industry. They should be able to present the following, among other facts, and back these up with vital statistics for the benefit of all this industry.

1. Number of people employed at present on war work in their fectories and the number they expect to employ when the war is over.
2. Number of people who will be affected by their ability to turn out equipment, such as their own employees, operators, jobbers, distributors and their employees, as well as the number of retailers and associated workers who will also be affected.
3. Number of peoples and factories that will be affected thru their purchase of materials for the manufacture of coin operated equipment.
4. Quantities and varieties of materials they expect to use.
5. They should also embellish all this with an illustrated volume showing the number of people thruout the nation who will be seeking popular priced amusement, as well as the relaxation which coin machines offer to the average civilian, the efficient ond economical merchandising

made possible by the automatic merchandising equipment of this industry, and what fine effect the service equipment of this business has on commercial life.

Then recall to the proper officials what fine work this industry accomplished in helping to maintain and bolster the morale of the armed forces as well as civilians during this tragic war period. This volume, completely illustrata ?, will have a valuable effect.

The Federal government at this time, realizing the value of post-war planning and encouraging it among all industries, has created a committee in Congress called the 'House Post-War Committee', whose business it is to study these problems.

At the same time it is now well known that the Smaller War Plants Corp., will probably be continued after the war to assist small business to continue profitably."

There is no doubt that all this industry will be jubilantly pleased with the creation of this post-war planning committee by the manufacturers for it definitely points out their will to be well prepared to reconvert back to the products they for merly manufactured and thereby shows they have the best interests of this trade at heart at all times.

Tho a great many inner industry problems as yet remain to be solved, this first fine step in the proper direction is definite proof that eventually all other industry problems, now that this planning committee is in action, will be approached just as intelligently and just as rapidly.

## ONE-BALLS IN WASHINCTON

Without giving rashington's coinmen a chance to get set or even to fight the appeal just made by the District Attorney's office for a review of the decision just obtained, which permits free play pin games to run, outside coirmen have rushed in and placed one-balls thruout the town.

Vashington coinmen phoned The Cash Box to advise that there is no doubt that this will have a ruinous effect on the decision just granted and will be especially used by the D.A. to prove his point, that the coinmen really intend to run other than the type of equipment as specified in this decision. (Not that Washington's coinmen wouldn't run one-balls were they given half a chance, but they realize that this will not be accepted at the present time and are therefore eager to work cautiously and carefully to once again get the town open).

They are of the belief that this is just what the Police Department is waiting for and that the first one-ball game that is picked up, whether or not this is a free play game, will throw all the years of work that they have put into getting this favorable decision into the ash can.
"And what'smore", one Washington coinman stated over the long distance phone, "this time Washington will close down so tight that it will never be opened again."

The greediness of a few who had nothing to do with the great amount of work and the financial expenditure involved in obtainine this decision, once ggain points to the need for some sort of organization of outstanding national character, in the amusement field, that will be able to restrain men of this type from harming both themselves and the industry.

RESULTS OF THE SURVEY TO HELP DETERMINE A STANDARD FOR JOBEER \& DISTRIBUTOR RECOGNTICN FOREWURD


The exceptionally large response to the survey to help the trade to arrivo at a standard for jobber and distributor recognition was ono of the most surprising yet encountered. Replies were received from every section of the country. Not one territory was missing. Jobbers, operators and distributors, both large and small, earnestly and even eagerly entered into this survey. The opinions expressed, the answers given, can be safely stated to cover a most complete cross section of the entire industry. This is, without any doubt, the most complete and interesting survey ever conducted. The results are from coinmen who have the future of this industry at heart, as well as a keon desire to conduct their businesses, especially in the com. ing postwar era, under the most profitable and healthy conditions.

Like any other survey, the results do not necossarily mean this is oach individualistic opinion, but must be accepted instead as the general collective opimion of the trade. From these collective opinions, it is hoped, the industry can obtain a basis for postowar guidance. Here can bo noted the desires of the trade as to a line of demarcation between the wholesaling and operating factors for the postawar period, so as to eliminate any future chaos in this direction, and perhaps at last establish the necessary distinction between operutors, jobbers and distributors. The results which follow are offered to the trade for its keon study and judgment and for its own decision as to its future course in this direction.
$80 \%$ belicved that jobbers should have financial assets of $\$ 25,000$ or more, 8\% answerod "no".
$7 \%$ offered suggestions ranging from $\$ 10,000$ to $\$ 100,000$ as to the financial assets they believed a jobber should have.
$5 \%$ gave no opinion.
$75 \%$ believed that distributors should have financial assets of $\$ 50,000$ or more.
$12 \%$ offered suggestions ranging from $\$ 10,000$ to $\$ 150,000$ as to the financial assets they beliөved a distributor should possess.
$6 \%$ answered "no".
$7 \%$ gave no opinion.
$72 \%$ agreed that jobbers or distributors in territories of 25,000 population should employ at least 2 people in their service and repair force.
$6 \%$ did not agree.
$12 \%$ offered suggestions ranging from 1 to 5 persons as territory roquired.
$10 \%$ gave no opinion.
$64 \%$ agreed that jobbers or distributors in territories of 50,000 population should employ at least 3 poople in the ir service and repair force.
$20 \%$ offered suggestions ranging from 1 to 5 persons.
$5 \%$ did not agree.
$11 \%$ gave no opinion.
$70 \%$ agreed that jobbers and distributors in territories of 100,000 population should employ at least 4 people in their service and repair force.
$10 \%$ did not agree.
$8 \%$ offered suggestions ranging from 1 to 8 people.
$12 \%$ gave no opinion.

## "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

$46 \%$ agreed that jobbers and distributors should employ a similar number of salesmen and trouble-shooters as service and repair men.
$33 \%$ did not agree to this.
$12 \%$ gave no opinion.
$8 \%$ offered suggestions ranging from 1 to 5 persons or "subject to territorial requirements" or "whatever the factory thinks right".
$81 \%$ agreed that a jobber should have four, five or more years of experience in this industry.

This $81 \%$ was divided as follows:
$21 \%$ believed 4 years sufficient.
$25 \%$ believed 5 years.
$35 \%$ be lieved more than 5 years necessary.
$14 \%$ suggested anywhere from 1 to 10 and even more years necessary.
$5 \%$ gave no opinion.
$83 \%$ agreed that a distributor should have five, ten or more years of experience in this industry.

This $83 \%$ was divided as follows:
$42 \%$ believed 5 years sufficient.
$26 \%$ believed 10 years best.
$15 \%$ believed more than 10 years necessary.
$9 \%$ offered suggestions ranging anywhere from 1 to 20 years of experience. $8 \%$ gave no opinion.
$64 \%$ agreed that jobbers and distributors should issue semimannual or annual statements.

This $64 \%$ was divided as follows:
$5 \%$ believed in semi annual statements.
$30 \%$ believed in annual statements.
$29 \%$ agreed to statements but did not care whether these were semi=annual or annual.
$28 \%$ did not believe that statements were necessary.
$8 \%$ gave no opinion.
$82 \%$ agreed that jobbers and distributors should have warehouse facilities.
$6 \%$ did not agree.
$12 \%$ gave no opinion.
$82 \%$ agreed that jobbers and distributors should stock a minimum number of the games they handle at all times.
$5 \%$ did not agree.
$13 \%$ gave no opinion.

83\% agreed that jobbers and distributors should carry a full line of parts, supplies and accessories for all equipment they handle.
$8 \%$ did not agree.
9\% gave no opinion,
$40 \%$ believed that jobbers should be allowed to operate.
$46 \%$ believed that jobbers should not be allowed to operate.
$8 \%$ offered various suggestions, the majority of claims being, "this depends entirely on the torritory".
$6 \%$ gave no opinion.

21\% believed that distributors should be allowed to operate.
$68 \%$ believed that distributors should not be allowed to operate.
4\% offered suggestions, in most cases claiming that this would depend on the factory represented and the territory of the distributor.
7\% gave no opinion.
$78 \%$ agreed that jobbers and distributors should be allowed to decide who is and who is not a bonafide operator.
$12 \%$ did not agree to this.
$10 \%$ offered suggestions including, "count the manufacturer in this, too, along with the jobber and distributor" or "a Board of Trade should be set up to do this job" and many others of like ilk.

## "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

$48 \%$ believed that jobbers and distributors should post bond of $\$ 5,000$ or
$\$ 10,000$ to guarantee all shipments made and all merchandise sold. This $48 \%$ was divided as follows: $9 \%$ suggested a $\$ 5,000$ bond. $17 \%$ suggested a $\$ 10,000$ bond. $22 \%$ left the amount of the bond open.
$39 \%$ did not agree to this bond.
$13 \%$ offered suggestions ranging from, "only if required to do so" or "if this will help the buyer feel more confident", etc.
$70 \%$ agreed that jobbers and distributors should join operators' organizations if allowed and if they so desire to.
$18 \%$ did not agree to this.
$12 \%$ gave no opinion.
$\mathbf{7 1 \%}$ believed jobbers and distributors should not give credit to operators without financial statements from the operators or without collateral from them.
$13 \%$ believed that such operators should receive credit.
$9 \%$ offered suggestions ranging from, "if we know the man well" and "sometimes it pays to take a chance" or "this is up to the seller himself".
$7 \%$ gave no opinion.
$58 \%$ believed that a jobber's or distributor's service and repair facilities and other organization factors should be made public annually.
$27 \%$ did not agree.
$15 \%$ gave no opinion.

CONCLUSION
After studying the answers to the questions asked of the trade in this survey, it is interesting to note that in all the major questions, such as financial responsibility, the answers were exceptionally and emphatically definite. For example, as to the financial assets a jobber should have $87 \%$ definitely believed that jobbers ahould have a certain financial standard. Proposals ranged from $\$ 10,000$ net worth to $\$ 100,000$ net worth. A like high percentage are in agreement as to the financial assets of the distributors.

Opinions varied somewhat in regards to the number of persons to be engaged in service and repair forces and as salesmen and trouble-shooters. But generally, the trade did agree that these are necessary, tho a definite figure could not be obtained. This is no doubt due to the fact that territorial conditions in this regard vary so greatly. Some firms in a territory of 25,000 population may need 5 or more men where other firms can get along very well with only 1 or 2 in the same sort of population territory. Yet some sort of standard should be set so that the buyer can be confident of the service he will get after purchasing the equipment. This is one point which should be carefully studied for the future.

Also interesting to note is how definite the answers were in regards to the years of experience the trade feels jobbers and distributors should have. Such experience is invaluable especially in helping to correctly guide new men who may enter into the business and to continue the man who is already in the business on an assured and profitable basis. In the case of the jobbers $95 \%$ agreed to a definite number of years of experience. In the case of distributors $92 \%$ indicated their belief in this direction.

There was a variance of opinion as to the desirability of issuing financial statements. Yet a great many in this industry have campaigned for this for years, so as to gain a better credit basis for all this business, and at the same time, to let the trade know just how solid its wholesaling base really is. Certain menufacturers have their distributors issue semi-annual statements. To gain further crodit, this will probably prove the genoral practice in the futuro.

Many have been complaining about the poor equipment which is being sold and shipped about the country. Yet only $48 \%$ voted to bond sellers to keep their word. This is a contradiction. It must be faced with greater practicality. Some sort of assurance is necessary to eliminate this practise. The trade should study this problem thoroly.

Thruout the answers given in this survey will be found an undercurrent of opinion to definitely strengthen the wholesaling base of this industry. The trade emphaticallydesires to draw a line of demaroation between all divisions. Perhaps, with the answers to this survey at their finger tips, a group of the leaders in this industry can get together, eventually gain the complete, national support of the trade, and start a Recognition Bureau which would help cure a great many outstanding problems, as well as assure a better and more stabilized future.

guests appetizing food in an interesting atmosphere.'
Mellus goes on to explain how Charley rented a store on Waco's Main Street and turned it into sone of the most outstanding and interesting spots in the country. He also tells about the two books that Charley has written, "Hoodoo, Voodoo and Bugaboo" and "For Love of Money.
Mellus also explains that Charley's place became a sensation overnight and that it continues to be one of the most patronized spots in the nation.

## NEW SCREENING PROCESS

Fred C. McClellan of General Products Company, Sacramento, Calif., writes, "We are now running into heavy production on the conversion units for arcade equipment and there is every evidence that these original changeovers are filling a definite need in the industry.
"With new machines unavailable, it has been felt right along that someone should come to the aid of the operator with ways and means of revitalizing old arcade equipment, so that it would virtually have all the appeal and interest of a brand new machine to the playing public.
"The ideal conversion is one that can be easily and quickly installed, without a lot of mechani. cal and electrical changes in the basic operation of the machine. We have constantly kept this thought in mind and confined our changeovers to simplified designs that the operator can install with a minimum of time and effort.
"Existing material shortages have presented many production problems, many of which have been solved, others still being worked on. For instance, silk screening is difficult to get done these days in large quantity, so a method was developed of using a multicolored litho sheet, with a die-cut backing. This has all the appeal of a good screen job, with the added advantage of a good screen job, with the added advantage
that the operator can replace a broken glass by that the operator can replace a broken glas
simply visiting the nearest hardware store.
"As far as is known, this method is something new in this industry and once its merits are recognized, may introduce a post-war trend that will outmode silk screening for many applications."

## MILWAUKEE CIVEN TO MAY 6 TO REMOVE PINBALLS

The adverse ruling on free play pin games handed down by the Wisconsin Supreme Court seems to have instantly affected the city of Milwaukee，where case is reported to have originated．Police are going about here，on authorization of the District Attorney＇s office，advising location owners that they must remove games by Saturday， May 6th．

At present Milwaukee coinmen are standing pat and not removing games，tho they are receiving calls continually from their locations asking what to do．They claim that their machines are not affected by this ruling，which is against games featur－ ing free play units and meters．

Milwauke coinmen declare that these units are out of their machines and that they are being operated strictly as＂novelty＂games．At the same time their present （\＄10．）license runs to July 1．They await pick－up of any game by police so that they can obtain a restraining order and bring case to court for definite ruling in regard to legality of games with free play units and meters removed．If they lose on this in local court，they claim，they will continue on up to Supreme Court．

This case dates back to arrest of tavern owner making single nickel payoff to cop．Tavern owner was fined $\$ 25$ ．in local District Court．Case was appealed to the Circuit Court and jury trial asked．During the course of this trial District Attor－ ney received permission of the court to open machine，examine electrical insides， and explain，with aid of electrician，these insides to the jury．He laid great stress on the free play unit and meters．Circuit Court judge refused to allow this in evidence and also refused to instruct jury that the se features made the game a gambling device．Tavern owner was then found＂not guilty＂by the jury．

District Attorney then appealed case to Supreme Court．He is reported to have put six months study on this case．Based his case on the adverse Gravenhorst decis－ ion in New York regarding free play units and meters．He has just won his case in the Supreme Court．Meantime new D．A．now in Milwaukee is adamant on enforcing this victory．

Kenosha，where one－balls are running，reports no police molestation since Supreme Court ruling．Racine，where five－balls are in operation，also reports no trouble．

Wisconsin coinmen explain that it will depend on local authorities thruout the state whether this Supreme Court decision，regarding free play units and meters in pin games making them gambling devices，will be enforced．

## U．S．SENATOR ASKS SLOT INVESTIGATION IN ARMY CAMPS

Senator Bridges（ $\mathrm{R}_{0}-\mathrm{N}_{\bullet} \mathrm{H}_{0}$ ）hes asked the War Department to investigate roports that some soldiers are losing a large part of their pay in slot machines located in Army Camps．The request for investigation was directed to Brig．Gen．Wilton B．Parsons， Chief of the War Department＇s legislative and liaison division．
＂The complaint reaching me＂，Senator Bridges stated，＂is that the slot machines have been placing some service men in financial difficulties．I have asked the de－ partment whether their use at the camps has been officially sanctioned and if so， who owns or controls the machines．＂

The Senator also stated that he has relayed to the War Department one complaint that Camp Patrick Henry，Va．，was＂one place where the situation was extremely bad．＂ Senator Bridges also said，＂The ownership and control of these machines is in the hands of a very small and select clique close to the administration．＂

A War Department spokesman stated that Arrny regulations forbid slot machines or any gambling devices in post exchanges，service clubs or auxiliary facilities avail－ able to enlisted personnel．

All the above statements of Senator Bridges were denied by Brig．General J．R． Kilpatrick，Commanding Officer of the Hampton Roads port of embarkation．
