

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

"I'm in the cigarette business", say cigarette machine men.

"I'm in the candy business", say candy vending machine men.

"I'm in the scale business", say woighing scale men.

"I'm in the nusic business", say music machine men.

"I'm in the novelty business", say pinball men.

And so it goes. There just doesn't seem to be any one name that can describe the men in the entire field. Suggestion such as "automatic merchants", is vague and not fully descriptive.

"I'm in the coin operated machines business", comes much closer, but is not at all specific.

This industry should find a name it can popularize. A name that will convey dignity and yet be completely explanatory.

A few years back the music division of this industry attempted to popularize the name, "music merchants". But instead the press has switched this around to "juke box operators". There it seems to remain, regardless of the attempts which have been made to kill this misnomer.

There are many in this industry who are extremely backward about admitting their connection with this field. They are evasive when questioned. Some attempt to becloud the situation by covering up with, "Oh, I'm in the novelty business". Yet this does not mean that they are in any fashion whatsoever ashamed of this business. They just haven't the right word or phrase to clearly describe this business so that others, especially outsiders, will understand.

Few, if any, like to say, "I'm in the slot machine business". Yet to the general public, because possibly there hasn't been any real effort made to correct this misunderstanding, anyone who owns machines that operate by the use of a coin, is in the "slot machine business".

The press continues to call a peanut vender, a candy or cigarette machine, a phonograph, a gum vender, and all other coin operated equipment, even scales, "slot machines". For example, "slot machine scales"; "slot machine phonographs"; "cigarette slot machines", etc.

And why only blame the press? For years one noted chocolate bar manufacturer ran car card advertising in the New York Subways reading to the effect that the public could obtain his lø size chocolate bars from the "candy slot machines" in each subway station. He actually showed an illustration of a penny candy bar vender in this car card advertisement. Yet, he termed the vender a "candy slot machine", because he believed that only in this fashion would the public better understand what he meant.

Just the other day a newspaper clipping arrived from a small town concerning coin operated phonographs and the newspaper referred to these thruout the article as "music slot machines". Even in such large cities as New York, Chicago, Cleveland, Detroit, St. Louis, Dallas, Los Angeles, San Francisco, etc., the coin operated phonograph is either a "juke box" or a "phonograph slot machine", depending on the mood of the writer as well as his knowledge of this field.

In short, according to the press and perhaps the general public, too, anything that is coin operated is a "slot machine", whether it vends cigarettes, sanitary nap-kins, peanuts, amusement, music or even a service like a weighing scale.

There is no doubt that this mistaken conception will continue as long as there is no "Public Relations Bureau" in this industry to coin the word or phrase to correct

this misapprehension. Eventually all concerned with this industry, in the years to come, will continue to be known as one sort or another of "slot machine operators".

There is certainly nothing wrong with slot machines. The U. S. Government has recognized them, as such. The Federal government has so far done the best descriptive job where coin operated equipment is concerned by most specifically describing the coin operated units on which it arranged yearly license fees. But even the government doesn't seem to have been able to find the proper name to lend dignity to the man engaged in this industry or to this trade's equipment.

There's a great deal in a name. It can bring prestige. It can, similarly, degrade. "Junk" dealers have worked hard to get away from the word "junk". This war, with its many scrap metal drives, has helped them tremendously.

Other industries have actually set up Public Relations Bureaus to help eliminate misunderstanding and incorrect impressions of their businesses. For example, many furriers have now become, "fur stylists". The old fashioned "dressmaker" has adopted the French "coutourier", and some "dress originators", others "dress stylists", "dress modes", "dress designers", etc., etc., All to escape "dressmaker".

This industry, too, needs a new and better and more fully descriptive name for its members. A name it can proudly popularize with the general public. A name that will lend the dignity and prestige coinmen deserve.

With complete regard to the grand old slot machine (which was, and still is, responsible for creating a great many leaders for this industry and which all coinmen would like to see legalized everywhere, as it is in Nevada, and thereby openly operated by all) the fact that it has captured the imagination and won such popularity over the years with the public, so that today even peanut venders are described as "peanut slot machines" by the press, doesn't help the trade in those areas where the name "slot machine" is considered anything but good.

Possibly, and regardless of whatever this industry may do now or in the future, the name "slot machine" may never leave it. But if the trade believes that it can and should attempt to arrange for a better, a more dignified, a more specific and a more fully descriptive name for its members and its equipment - then surely this is the time to bring that about.

Now, before the post-war period gets under way, is the time to start popularizing a new word or phrase which will more completely evaluate and describe the men, as well as the equipment, of this industry.

In writing this item it is the hope of The Cash Box that its readers will understand that a new name for this industry and its many divisions is only being sought for in the belief that it will bring about a better and closer understanding with the press, civic leaders, public authorities and the public itself.

SCHOOL FOR COIN MACHINE MECHANICS

The Cash Box suggestion, offered some weeks ago, that a school for coin operated machines mechanics be created now, prior to the post-war era, continues to meet with great approval and interest. This past week letters from mechanics themselves arrived asking where they could enter into such a school. The trade's leaders continue to also write, inquiring whether any progressive coinman has already started such a school.

There is no doubt that the demand for schools of this kind continues to grow in importance daily. The need for such schools is unquestioned. One of the greatest shortages today, and certainly what will prove an even greater shortage tomorrow, will be correctly trained mechanics.

Greater expansion and growth of this industry is more certainly assured when a sufficient supply of good mechanics are available. The new equipment being planned by the factories will be rushed out in great haste so as to get to the market first. Present forces of mechanics are not large enough to handle the repair and installation work which will ensue. At the same time there is no doubt that electronics will also enter into this field. This will require more and better trained mechanical minds.

Tho this need for schools for mechanics may seem premature to some at this time, it should be taken into consideration that the creation of such schools takes time, and starting now will still be many months before schools of this kind can get under way. Even those well known and established trade schools to be found thruout the country would require some months of preparation to be completely prepared to train mechanics for this field.

The Cash Box realizes, therefore, that tho this suggestion may seem somewhat premature to some in this business, it is also convinced that these same men will agree that because of the time required to start such schools, that this is the proper moment to get them under way.

Also to be taken into consideration is the fact that over 100,000 men are being released from the armed forces each month at this time. Many of these are being taken into present industries. This industry, too, can use these soldiers who have developed great mechanical ability due to the new and highly complex mechanical equipment of this present war. Many of these men would be happy to enter such schools, especially in view of the fact that the Federal government will be more than happy to make them the necessary loan to pay for their tuition.

A school for coin machines mechanics is therefore an all important issue the leaders of this industry should help to create now, prior to the reconversion period, so that the trade will be prepared to advance forward with great efficiency and speed when the war is won.

PRICES OF MACHINES

Prices for all types of equipment have again entered into that "jitters" stage which seems to come along at seasonal intervals. Some coinmen are of the belief that this is the time to sell off equipment.

It must be remembered that it will be many months yet before new machines will be manufactured. This will have the effect of maintaining present used machines prices or possibly even raising them to higher levels. As one noted coinman stated, "When the boys who have left this business return, they will buy any sort of machine to again get locations. We expect prices to go even higher at that time because demand will more greatly increase."

In the same vein, it must also be remembared that the world's finest new machine means absolutely nothing to any coinman if he hasn't a location in which to place that machine. In short, the location is of first and greatest importance. Following obtaining the location, he can hold off the owner with the promise that he will deliver one of the first new machines produced. Therefore the jitteriness that is now noticeable in the market is sure to steady itself once the trade is definite on when it will see new machines once again on factory production lines.

"TALKING OUT LOUD

HELP VETERANS ENTER BUSINESS

Over 3,000,000 Expected To Enter Into Small **Businesses For Themselves After The War**

WASHINGTON, D. C .- A great many coinmen are interested in just how many of the returning veterans will enter into businesses for themselves after the war. Quincy Adams, Chief of the Division for Small Business, Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce, predicted that as many as 3,000,000 veterans might go into businesses for themselves when the war is won.

He reported that at the Army's request the Commerce Department was preparing a series of books on how to operate 20 kinds of small business enterprises. The books are expected to be in the hands of servicemen many months before their discharge.

The Army's educational program, plus the Veteran's Administration counseling service and the advice available from the Commerce Department would help to provide veterans with the proper background to go into business for themselves. Veterans who will take advantage of these facilities will have a much better chance for success than those who start out without

In keeping with the above, M. Adams, former editor of Dun's Review and manager of the sales and research division of Dun & Bradstreet, Inc., reports that there will be an unprecedented rush into small businesses after the war, both by veterans and by war workers who have accumulated savings.

Adams warned that many will fail because, after the 2,900,000 concerns now operating are increased to the 1941 level of 3,500,000 there would be no more room and a tense, competitive struggle will ensue, during which the number of failures will equal the number of new ventures. This may bring about the old rate of 1,000,000 new ventures and 1,000,000 failures yearly.

With the national incomes sure to decline, Adams stated, as it will after the war, leaving people with less money to spend, "only the best can survive, whether the proprietor is a veteran, an ex-war worker or an old-time

The above is definitely in keeping with what The Cash Box has been predicting for sometime. There is no doubt that the rush of new blood to enter into this, as well as into all other industries, will in the beginning create a veritable hysterical and chaotic condition.

It is the general hope of the leaders in this industry that no rash preproduction promises will be made by sellers. It is also their hope that coinmen will be extremely careful as to future development, after the first rush has brought about a more or less pre-war expansion condition.

* The industry can expect a definite percentage of these 3,000,000 veterans, as well as a great many war workers, to enter into this business. This trend is already most definitely noticeable. The trade should therefore anticipate the entrance of these men into this field by preparing to greet them with the proper sort of merchandising that will assure their success, and thereby this industry's growth.

DEFINITE NOT CANADIAN SALES

Await Ruling From Dept. of National Revenue **Prior To Resuming Coin Machine Shipping**

OTTAWA, CAN .- Even tho the ban list, which went into effect in 1940 on shipment of American goods into Canada will be removed on August 1, 1944, coinmen are urged not to ship into Canada immediately, contrary to the rumors now circulating thruout the industry. Definite information in this regard is being awaited

from the Department of National Revenue, Customs Division, this city, as to whether complete coin machines can once again be shipped into Canada and merican dollars received in payment.

This ban list was originally placed into effect, it is reported, to accumulate American dollars in Canada. Thereby equalizing the trade balance between the countries. The list is reported to have originally included complete coin machines. As yet, tho, Canadian officials have not expressed themselves in regard to whether or not coin machines are also considered removed with the lifting of this ban list.

U. S. CHECKING COIN SHIPPING

ALBANY, N. Y. - Jules Olshein of 1100 Broadway, this city, reports that in calling on one of the freight companies here he found that government men had been checking coin shipping.

He states, "While in a freight house recently, the man in charge informed me that government men were checking up on coin machine shipments. They were making inquiries of him with regard to what shipments of this type of equipment had gone thru here recently. I don't know just what this means, so just draw your own conclusions."

BUSINESS URGE TAX CUT MEN

Present Plan To Encourage Use Of Private **Capital Needed For Peacetime Recovery**

WASHINGTON, D. C .- A group of business men from Minneapolis and St. Paul, Minn., offered a tax program designed to meet revenue obligations and at the same time encourage use of capital for private venture which is needed for peacetime recovery and prosperity.

The points of their proposals as presented to the Ways and Means Committee of the Senate Finance Committee are: (1) Reduction of the individual income tax by onehalf. (2) Reduction of the corporate tax by two-thirds. (3) A 5% general sales tax. (4) Exclusion from "gross" income and thus from taxation of 40% of an individual's income from dividends.

Tho generally considered a very ambitious plan it has already met with much comment pro and con. Beardsley Ruml, father of the "payas-you-go" tax plan, and treasurer for R. H. Macy & Co., leading New York department store, opposed the plan. He claimed, "This plan underestimates the extent of technological improvement before and during the war and seems to assume that there will be as many men in the armed forces as there were in the year 1942."

As far as coinmen are concerned, this proposal by the Twin Cities business men is the opening gun to lower taxes to a reasonable and equitable status so that business can again operate with freer volition.

The "tax plague" that has hit at coinmen, not only from the Federal government but also from local community and state governing bodies thruout the country at this time; should now be stringently approached to bring down license fees and general taxes to a much more equitable basis so that this industry, too, can develop with much greater freedom after the war is

ART TAKVIN HAS **MECHANIC READY**

HUTCHINSON, KANS. — Art Tarvin of this city writes that he is extremely much impressed with the suggestion that a school for coin machine mechanics be created now.

FIRST FIRM TO RECONVERT

NEW YORK, N. Y. - Columnist Leonard Lyons (New York Post, July 10) reports that this week will see the first firm to enter into peacetime reconversion. No mention of the firm name nor of the products to be manufactured was made.

With the battle now on between WPB Administrator Donald M. Nelson and Army and Navy leaders regarding an early return to conversion, this comes somewhat as a surprise.

It is understood tho that Jimmy Byrnes and Senator Truman are backing Nelson for an immediate and early return to peacetime production.

BRADSHAW TO MANUFACTURE

DENVER, COLO. — Gib Bradshaw of Denver Distributing Co., this city, advises that he is planning to manufacture or distribute or both in the post-war period.

He writes, "We have several items built which we think will startle the industry and prove sensational to both music and arcade operators."

He also stated, "We are planning to move into ultra-modern quarters about five times the size now occupied as soon as the war is over, or even before."

IRBY OPENS MAN'S SHOP

DALLAS, TEX. - A unique announcement from Collis Irby of Walbox Sales Company, this city, to the effect that he has just opened a super deluxe man's shop in the Mercantile Bank Building, this city.

The firm is known as Irby-Thompson, and is composed of J. Sid Thompson, Collis Irby and Count Mayes as manager.

THE VAUGHN GENERAL HOSPITAL PRESENTATION

■ I have just returned from being present at the presentation of over 60 coin operated machines to the Vaughn General Hospital in Maywood, Ill., by manufacturers and distributors of our industry. I have been given to understand that the total valuation of this equipment runs somewhere in the neighborhood of \$20,000.00.

What a thrill it gave me to see the grand turnout from our industry for this presentation, and especially how happy and pleased Brigadier General P.J. Carroll and all his staff were over this marvelous donation. It would have made any coin machine man feel proud to be affiliated with this grand industry to learn how much these wounded and sick soldiers appreciated all these machines.

The Vaughn General Hospital is adjacent to the Hines Veterans Hospital in Hines, 1ll. The buildings are new and occupy 79 acres. The hospital will have 1,525 beds. It will be used only for the ill and wounded returning soldiers. The Hines hospital has only discharged vets from the last war.

Brig. General P.J. Carroll who is in command of this hospital, received the DSM (Distinguished Service Medal) for evacuating the wounded from Manila to Australia. He was Chief Surgeon of the American forces in the Southwest Pacific and the Far East prior to his return to the United States last December. In February of this year he was placed in charge of the Vaughn General Hospital.

General Carroll thanked all present for coming out to the hospital and told us how deeply grateful he was for this very generous contribution. He said he planned to carefully distribute the machines about the hospital. He would place some in the recreation room and others in the various wards, so that these convalescent soldiers would derive the fullest possible benefit from the relaxation and entertainment afforded by the various machines.

Dave Gottlieb answered the General, and told him that after he had placed the machines about the various rooms, that if he found he could use still more, not to hesitate to call him up and let him know and he would do his utmost to see to it that the General received what he needed. The General thanked him and all the group present again and again for this kindness and thoughtfulness.

A photo was then taken by the Public Relations Department of the hospital after a phonograph had been hooked up and the entire group placed around it. They also took pictures of the men in uniform playing the various games. And talk about "variety" here is some idea of the games donated: phonographs, pin games, radio rifles, hockey games, strength testers, target machines, bowling alleys, and many others.

All in all, this was one of the most thrilling and heartwarming affairs I have ever attended in this business. There is no doubt in my mind that if other coinmen thruout the nation will get together to do the same sort of job, wherever veterans hospitals are located, that they, too, will feel most fully repaid when they note the cheering gladness that comes to these wounded and sick soldiers when they see these games donated for their use.




