## "'The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round" By Bill Gersh

## THE FATEFUL FALL OF '44



As everyone in the nation realizes, this new Fall season, so rapidly approaching, will probably prove one of the most fateful as far as industry, politics and national welfare is concerned. Not only is a presidential election in the offing, but the war in Europe seems to be rapidly coming to an end, even faster than was believed possible by great military minds. And in addition to all this exciting and optimistic war news is the fact that this industry, too, looks to Fall, 1944, with optimism, some wonderment and yet with grand and great courage; so exemplary of the men in this business.

The conservative element among the nation's industrialists continue along on the theory that the war will go on for sometime to come. The large manufacturer realizes that he will need months to reconvert to former domestic production. He also realizes that the size and extent of the backlog of orders now in his offices means that many months of full blast production will be required prior to even some semblance of normality. Yet he, too, believes that the peacetime production era should be arranged for an early start.

Speeches and demands by politicians, manufacturers, leading merchants and others, have raised havoc with the average man. He doesn't know whether to stop buying and wait for new merchandise, or whether to continue buying in the belief that new merchandise is as yet far off. This problem is also prominently apparent in this industry.

Here there has been a sudden, tho temporary, cessation of buying. This is attributed in the main to the reversal in collections thruout most of the country as well as the possibility for earlier peacetime production. It will be many, many months before coin machines manufacturers will find themselves engaged in former peacetime production.

Therefore, what the Fall season of ' 44 will bring forth is something that everyone in this industry is wondering about. The real answer as to the stoppage of large volume orders at this time is in the news from WPB that manufacturing will again be resumed as soon as all surrounding factors have been completely and carefully accounted for. Once again the trade is reminded - these surrounding factors are the controlling factors in this equation and therefore the industry can rest assured that actual peacetime coin operated machines manufacture is as yet a long way off.

Regardless of the fact that collections showed a decided drop this Summer, the operators did well. The reason, as explained by many, is in the fact that whatever the take it covered overhead and earned a good profit, because no new machines were being purchased. Naturally, then, whatever comes in that is up and above the ordinary overhead expense, is profit.

Even more interesting is the fact that the average coinman now most definitely realizes that the location is the most valuable factor in this industry. The locations make this an industry. Therefore tho some have decided to remain at status quo and do no more buying, except what they will absolutely require to continue their business, these coinmen will find that such action at this time is not good business nor keen judgment.

It must be remembered that new blood as well as former coinmen who will return to this industry, will immediately seek for locations. They will glady pay fancy prices for used machines. They will realize that the price they pay for a used machine is far and above what the machine is actually worth - as a machine. But, as a location holder, which is really what most of the used machines are today, it is worth many times the price asked.

As long as the coinman gets the location he wants and gets any sort of used machine into the spot, he can convince the location owner that he will arrange to get him the very first new machine that comes off the production line - when production of new coin machines starts up again.

The Cash Box is therefore of the belief that the used machines market, where all prices now show a definite crack, will find that this is but a temporary setback. This

market will revive of itself when the average coinman realizes that he still can't get new machines, but desires to keep all good locations in his territory covered with some sort of equipment.

Whether machines will again reach the price peak of six months ago, is extremely doubtful. There is no reason for such high prices. The average phono operator, for example, paying $\$ 600$ or more for a used phono, and averaging about $\$ 7$ to $\$ 8$ per week for himself from the take, is taking a long chance buying the machine, especially in the used and worn condition in which it is today, unless he most definitely needs that machine. This sort of buying may stop. But buying generally, especially to cover locations for the post-war machines, even at the $\$ 600$ price, is bound to again open up with a loud and resounding bang as the Fall season comes into being and the possibility for earlier peacetime production draws ever nearer.

There are also many other factors to be considered for this Fall season of '44. One of these, and possibly most important of all, is preparation for the post-war period. There is no doubt that many wholesalers want to know where they stand with the factories they formerly represented. Who knows but what such representation may prove an actuality sometime late this coming Fall season? Others want to know whether they, too, can enter the wholesaling ranks. All this is today part and parcel of that fateful Fall season of '44.

The trade looks to this Fall season anxiously, eagerly, and yet with great optimism. It is certain in its belief that a great many important and outstanding events are bound to enter into this trade during this Fall season.

Realizing that there will be the possibility of a chaotic rush for machines in this industry, and that some manufacturers are bound to get started before others, especially those others who will still have important and vital war materials to manufacture this, too, is sure to affect this coming Fall season's equanimity.

No one can really advise anyone just what to expect this Fall. The very fact that so many sudden and surprising events have occurred has had much to do with business generally declaring that "the time is almost upon us and let's get prepared for it."

It will still be many, many months before the country will see the return of its young men from the armed services. It will also be many months before actual production gets under way for this industry. This is the time to prepare for the arrival of the post-war period, for only then is the planner assured that he will be ready to greet this new era in somewhat proper fashion.

And the finest and best way to prepare for this fateful Fall season of 1944 - is to get set with all the possible locations in each coinman's territory. This is the job of the coinman in this industry now. The man that kept this industry alive and moving and showed it a new and better progress and certainly the speediest action it has ever known. This is the man to protect. This is the man upon whom an entire new and greater industry will be built for post-war tomorrow. Therefore, it is up to this man - the man that worked and slaved and endured rationing and labor shortage and government agency control - that should go out on the streets of his city, town or village and close every location he can find to himself - so that he will be first to benefit from the new equipment that will come rolling down on the heads of this industry like an avalanche.

## SELLING SPEEDS UP SUDDENLY

A few weeks ago The Cash Box reported that the first cracks in the prices of equipment were becoming discernible. This is due to the weekly market reports conducted by The Cash Box in its issues of The Confidential Price Lists. Prices suddenly began to show more than a seasonal decline. This caused the first notice that cracks were apparent in the present high price wall.

Now selling has again speeded up and all the trade notices the fact that all prices have suddenly become very jittery. Mostly they are in a definite downward decline.

The stability of the music machines field again makes itself prominent. As all prices begin to drop, this division of the industry seems to be much more reluctant than all the rest, to start such a decline.

Amusement games prices are falling, rapidly in some cases. Pin games have come onto the market in ever increasing numbers, which is a sure sign of a price decline in this field. Consoles, diggers and arcade equipment of all types are suddenly appearing on the market once again and prices are lower. Slots of the better kind, as is the case with most of the better equipment anyway, are holding their own. The older units in the slot field are falling down.

Merchandising equipment of every sort is rapidly losing ground. This was more or less expected, especially in view of the fact that the cigarette machine manufacturers are again beginning to take orders for post-war equipment delivery. They are giving their long established customers first preference on post-war manufacture and taking deposits now for future (and unspecified) delivery of machines. But these, as used machines, are not holding up to their former price mark. Of course, with the merchandise itself unusually hard to obtain this, too, has had its effect on the prices of this equipment.

The most noticeable factor which has seriously contributed to the present price drop is that of operators everywhere in the nation suddenly deciding to rid themselves of "excess" equipment. This naturally hurts the market. Coming in all at one time it is bound to widen the price crack and naturally affect others who are still holding on to equipment.

It is generally hoped that this will not prove one of those selling avalanches and that prices will gradually feel their way to a new plane. If too sudden a drop results, the entire market situation is bound to change and instead of a seller's market, which this has been since Pearl Harbor, this is going to again become a buyer's market.

It is also hoped by some that with the abolishment of the Canadian Emergency Conservation Act by Parliament, that this country will be able to assimilate a large quantity of used machines, and to such an extent that the market will remain in balance here. Already Canadian buyers are flooding the U. S. market with requests for used equipment of all types. Many large sales have been made with money on deposit in U. S. banks.

It would not be to the advantage of this trade to demonstrate fickleness and to see the price market drop too suddenly. Too many outstanding firms would be caught short. This would not help the industry. In fact, it would have the opposite reaction for by hurting the powerful factors the industry itself would suffer.

It is therefore hoped by The Cash Box, as it anxiously scans the pages of The Confidential Price Lists each week, that the trade will bear this in mind and attempt at all times to fasten some sort of control over its sales.

## WHAT ABOUT THE RETURNING SERVICEMEN?

All industry is concerned with the returning servicemen. Over $10,000,000$ of these men wil be coming back from foreign shores seeking jobs for good future welfare. It was for this they gambled their lives. This is a problem which this industry, too, will have to face.

Prior to going further into just what effect these returning servicemen will have upon this industry, it is well to remember that trickles of news have already come from various parts of the country reporting losses of locations to servicemen who are entering into this field. This is a problem which each individual coinman will probably come up against in his territory and which can have serious consequences.

But even more important to all this business generally, and to all in this grand nation, is what to do about returning servicemen? What can this industry do? Here is the boy that went into the slimy, stinking heat of battle, and carried on - to victory. What about that kid that went from the average $\$ 15 \mathrm{job}$ and now returns with stripes and bars, accustomed to giving commands?

Will this man want to return to this $\$ 15$ job? Will he again want to be a nonentity in the back of the shop? What's to become of him? What can we do for him? Think of the trigger-edge excitement he's been thru. Do you believe that he can then return to a humdrum existence? The fine clothes and the excellent food and medical treatment that some of these boys enjoyed for the first time - can they go back to a sharecropper existence on some farm? There is, believe me, a tremendously serious problem here for all of us to think about.

Economists state that it is possible for industry to assimilate them. Therefore, we, in this industry, must find some way to take a large share. We must remember that unless we can show these men the right kind of existence - the kind they believe they fought for - a great deal of dissatisfaction can arise. And that can give rise to all sorts of colored shirts and political parties.

Yes, that sounds strange, but, it's true. Let us therefore, all of us, work to prevent the return of the apple boxes. Let us assimilate our share of these men. . . . for God knows - they have been good to us.

# TO BUY OR NOT TO BUY NATION'S COINMEN PUZZLED ABOUT EARLY PRODUCTION RETURN 

NEW YORK, N. Y.-A rapid survey conducted by The Cash Box this past week brought forth the fact that a tremendous majority of the coinmen thruout the nation are wondering whether to buy or not buy used equipment at this time. These men are puzzled about the possibility of an early return to coin machines production. They do not want to get caught short, they report.

Tho the demand for new equipment ("Talking Out Loud", August 15 issue) far exceeds anything ever known before in the August is issue) far exceeds anything ever known before in the
history of this industry, there is no doubt, from what leaders of history of this industry, there is no donbll be seen on the market
the trade report, that no new machines will for a great many months to come.

The average manufacturer, these men state, is not in position at this time to throw his war work overboard and make a demand for a return to former products production.

General Brehon Somervell of the Army Supply Forces has just reported that industry has fallen behind in 322 important just reported that industry has fallen behind in 322 important
items vitally needed for the knockout blow against Germany. items vitally needed for the knockout blow against Germany,
Donald M. Nelson, WPB Chairman reports industry has fallen $20 \%$ behind on war production.

In addition to this, the gauntlet of tests required by WPB prior to even allowing production of their list of 125 essentials, would erase the possibility of most of the factories in this industry entering even such production.

It must be remembered that WPB absolutely specifies that the factory asking to manufacture any of the 125 essential items listed by this agency must be able to obtain the labor and materials necessary without in any fashion whatsoever harming the war effort. With more and still more critical labor areas being designated all over the nation, 69 in all, there is no doubt that very few, if any,
manufactures can seek for a return to domestic production. At orer
manufacturers can seek, for a return to domestic production. At present WPB is allowing expen
build experimental models only.

This in itself makes used machines even more important than they formerly were. These games will be the backbone for this trade to continue on into opening of the post-war era. They will prove themselves the necessary location holders until new machines can
again be delivered in sufficient quantity to gradually pull most of again be delivered in sufficient quantity to gradually pull most of
the used equipment off the market. This will take at least two years and even longer to accomplish.

Most leaders in the trade report that they are continuing buying machines. They believe that the used machines market will continue on in as great if not in greater importance as the war in Europe comes to a close. Tho some of these men state that there is a possibility of an earlier return to new equipment production than formerly thought possible they do not look for this return until sometime in 1945.

There should be no puzzle, then, about whether to buy or not at this time. Those men who desire to retain all the locations they possibly can in their territories realize that the location is worth more than the machine!

## NOTED ECONOMIST ACCLAIMS POST-WAR TAX PLANNING

While the saying that 'the power to tax is the power to destroy' long has been recognized as a possibility, it has been accepted more and more over the years as a real threat to our economy.
"When business men, ecolabor organizations come out for the elimination of taxes on the income of corporations, we realize that corporageous thinking is being devoted to the subject of taxation. Obviously we shain

This past week, according to reports received by The Cash Box from all over the nation a definite from all over the nation is define decline is again apparent in coll
tions from all types of machines. This drop is estimated at about an average of $15 \%$ clear across the country.

The fall in collections this past week was mainly attributed to the unseasonally hot weather from which the nation is suffering.
Operators also complained that beer spots were cleaned out quick. They claim that the drop was more than is seasonally expected.

But even with this drop, they report, profits are still keeping up. This is only due to the fact that they do not have to purchase new equipment to keep their spots going, they claim.
Many complaints also received this past week from cigarette machine operators who report that it is becoming more and still more difficult to keep their equipment even $60 \%$ filled with cigarettes. This is expected to go even lower. In general these men are of the belief that the moment the war belief that the moment will be

The Cash Box "Last Minute News Flash" (issued Aug. 8) regarding the fact that there would most definitely not be any return to coin operated machines manufacture on, or even near, August 16, wes confirmed by the meeting of the Coin Operated Amusement, Gaming and Arcade Industry Advisory Committee with WPB (August I6) in Washington, D.C.

The following are the members of this committee, which in keeping with WPB policy can be enlarged by suggestion from present members: V. G. Wahlberg, Asst. Exec. VicePresident of Mills Industries, Inc.; George Jenkins, representing Lion Mfg. Corp. and Bally Mf g. Co.; J. $\mathrm{H}_{0}$. Keeney of $\mathrm{J}_{4} \mathrm{H}_{4}$ Keeney \& $\mathrm{Co} . ; \mathrm{Wm}$. Rabkin of International Mutoscope Corp.; Max D. Levine of Scientific Nachine Corp.

It is understood that the misic machine as woll as the merchandisc machine manufacturors will meet separately with WPB. It seems now that there will be three Industry Advisory Committeos meeting with WPB represonting the three divisions of this industry.

This meeting with WPB is considered tho most heartening ever yet held. It was reportod by onc manufacturer to have boen, "A real heart to hoart talk and we learned just where we stcod as far as production is concerned."

As reported by The Cash Box for some issues, everything is very properly pushed aside today to continue to give all out effort to win the war. Manufacturers are expected to continuo to give every possible aid they can to producing war materiels. In addition there are today 69 critical manpower areas in the country. One of the most criticel of all being the Chicago scotor. Therefore thero is no doubt that this, in itself, will retard the possibility of any now coin operated amusement games, gaming or arcade machines manufacture for many months to come.

The manufacturers did learn that WPB wants them to be most completely propared so that whon tho cutbacks start coming thru, as soon as the European war is finished, they will bo in position to enter into domestic production.

Most heartening to some of those present was tho fact that this industry, which is considered a non-cssential civilian industry, is now classod with such ossential industries as that of vacuum cleaners, washing machines, oto. Those latter manufacturers hold an AA5 priority. The manufacturers in this industry bolicve that because of tho close classification thoy, too, oventually will roceive bettor priority rating. At least that is their hope.

Most forcefully brought out at this meet was the fact that neither this irdustry nor any other can be considered for a return to domestic production until this war is won. That has been explained time and time again by The Cash Box. The emphasis now placed on this fact by WPB's officials in meeting with this industry advisory committee simply means to the trade that production of new equipment is as yot months away.

Of course, everything is dependent upon the results of this war now so definitely going against the Nazis. If victorios continue to pile up and the war finishes mach sooner than is expected, it will mean that tho date for a return to production will be stoppod up somewhat. The war with Japan must also be taken into consideration at this stage and it must be remombered that noithor WPB nor WMC will for a momont rolax the strenuous efforts thoy are putting forth to get this war WON.

As far as this committeo is therofore concorned, amusemont, gaming-and arcade machine mon may as woll make up thoir minds that continued dealings in usod equipment will be the fashion for sometine yet to come.

Other meets with WPB and this Coin Operated Amsement, Gaming and Arcade Industry Advisory Comittco are indicated for the noar future.
