"The Coin Machines Merry-Go-'Round" by Bill Gersh

USED MACHINES PRICE CUTBACK

Sometime ago The Cash Box reported that there was a movement afoot, among certain leaders in the trade, to arrange for a general cutback in the prices of used equipment. These men believed that such a cutback would prove of great value to all in the industry at present, and especially of great value for the post-war era. They also believed that such a price cutback could be arranged among the industry's leading sales organizations, regardless of the fact that it clashed with the theory of supply and demand.

Their proposal was gauged along the lines that with the coming of the post-war era there would result a sudden drop in the prices of used equipment. Such a sudden price drop, they believed, might catch a great many sellers short. Losses would be much greater than they would ordinarily be unless prices are cut back, even very gradually at this time, until they reach a level which would be in keeping with the prices which can be expected to come into being with the post-war period.

Also accompanying this proposal was the theory that with unusually high prices prevailing there was certain to be a loss of sales generally, especially to the smaller operators. Many, who would like to purchase certain types of equipment, are refraining from doing so until prices come down to a more economical level.

One of the reasons presented was that the average operator could not afford to pay the high prices asked for the better equipment because of the fact that average collections weren't equal to paying for certain types of equipment in sufficient time to amortize the investment prior to the arrival of new equipment. With loans, too, generally tightening up because of the inflated condition of all markets, the average coinman would find himself gambling against the time element. And since he could not fore see, nor could anyone predict, just when new equipment would again be produced, the odds on such a gamble are too much against him.

These men, very conservatively, believe that they should begin to see the first new machines about a year from today. They explain that regardless of how good a used machine may be that to use such equipment to compete with new machines is much too tough for any coinman. Location owners would most naturally give preference to the new machine, rather than retain used machines in their locations. Certainly the player, too, would want the new machine than continue to play the old one. Therefore, if the price continues so high that the average operator cannot amortize the better used equipment he would like to buy today, within a period of 12 to 18 months, then he just simply isn't going to buy.

At this time a great many are purchasing used equipment to cover as many locations as they possibly can to be prepared for the post-war era. They realize that having locations is most important. The machines themselves mean very little as compared to the location. In short, without a location available, even the best machine in the world is absolutely valueless.

Therefore many of the reasons that were, and are being presented by these men, who feel that all the trade should cooperate in a price cutback, are very sound and logical. Certainly there is every reason to believe that if prices are gradually cut back that the trade will find none, if any, loss of business generally. In fact, this opens the possibility for sales of good equipment to even the smallest operator. These smaller men, too, will purchase machines to cover as many locations as they feel they can safely handle while they wait for the new equipment (and new helpers) to arrive.

A plan of this kind is sound. It means that by cutting back prices now the entire industry is preparing the way more intelligently for the entrance of the new machines. It also means a more gradual return to normal. To a great extent it can also be analyzed to mean that the trade foresees future events in the light of proved past history.

"The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

It is a well known fact that labor is already beginning to go thru a period of decreased earning power. This will become even more emphasized as manufacturers begin to get cutbacks in war materials production. The reconversion period will also have its effect. Labor will begin to be more careful with the dollar. This is already becoming noted in many areas. This past summer lowered collections were most prominent everywhere in the nation. Closing of army camps and entire war boom towns will also have an effect. In short, it is better to take less and sell, than to insist on more - and not sell. At least, as long as the profit factor remains at a very good point - for then trade-ins will have to come in at lower prices to meet this cutback sales scale.

It is now become fact that OPA wants all manufacturers to price new, post-war equipment at the 1942 levels. James G. Rogers, deputy administrator of the Office of Price Administration, speaking before the marketing conference of the Chamber of Commerce of the United States at the Hotel Waldorf-Astoria (October 25, 1944) reaffirmed the OPA objective of 1942 prices for reconverted durable goods production. While OPA recognizes there have been increases in wage rates and some increases in materials costs, Mr. Rogers said it would seem reasonable that gains in productivity would be an important factor in offsetting these increases.

"Our policy, therefore," Mr. Rogers stated, "will be to require a certain amount of absorption of cost increases, recognizing of course, the necessity for having prices which are generally fair and equitable and which, therefore, must reflect at the very least peacetime profits. Our program involves meetings with representatives of the industries which manufacture the two dozen major durable goods items. We will discuss with them their costs increases and arrive at a price as near to the 1942 price as possible."

It is therefore only logical for this industry to begin to return to such levels as will correspond with this policy. There are new adherents to this idea of cutting back prices arising thruout the country each and every day. But, such a plan needs the cooperation of all the leading selling factors in the trade. If these men are willing to forego part of their profits now, they will gradually bring the prices of all used machines back to a more normal level.

This proposal on the part of many of this industry's noted leaders should be given most careful and serious consideration. The it may seem to be against all economic theory of supply and demand, it is without any doubt, a sound and logical suggestion regardless - and can, therefore, prove of great worth to all concerned.

EXPANSION

Gradual expansion of the industry is becoming more and more marked each day. Coinmen from various sections of the nation report the return of many former members to the industry. They also state that instead of hurting present set-ups in the field, these old timers who are once again returning to this business, and even the new men who are purchasing routes, are helping to create a new and stimulating expansion program for the trade.

Most noteworthy of all general expansion movement is in the music machines field. Here there has been much route buying and selling for sometime. These changes in route set-ups are sure to open a great many locations to the post-war machines of the music equipment manufacturers. There is also no doubt that as the men who purchased these routes begin to amortize the cost, they will begin to seek for equipment to replace the machines they now have, and to also enlarge these routes. This again makes for further expansion. It means that the industry generally will benefit from such progressive action.

When the manufacturer can produce in larger quantity he can, by good use of mass production methods, cut down his price, and thereby all the trade benefits.

When the field is expanding it makes large volume mass production possible. This, in an economic sense, is what the trade wants and what will most assuredly help the trade in the forthcoming post-war period.

It should therefore be the first effort of all engaged in this industry at this time to bring whatever possible to further helping this business to expand in proper and intelligent fashion. Not only for the benefits which might accrue from immediate sales - but also for the long pull benefits which will come about to bring lowered prices to all who will remain in this trade, when larger volume production, as well as greater recognition and prestige, come about because of expansion.

INGENUIT

Of most important consequence to this industry has been the ingenuity demonstrated by its members. This ingenuity carried the trade thru one of the toughest, harshest eras in all of its history. It is coming thru this tragic wartime period with flying colors.

The revampers are entitled to a great deal of credit for the renovation work they did, and are still doing, for the trade which helped tremendously to revive the play on a great many machines. The mechanical skill of many members of this industry must also be highly praised for the many ingenious methods they advanced to help continue even the oldest machines in constant action. These machines were, and are receiving, severe abuse because of tremendously increased play action.

Machines that were formerly frowned upon as being mechanically imperfect were brought back to market and actually made to work. In short, the members of this industry proved that they rank among the most ingenious men existing in any business in the nation. They not only proved themselves mechanical wizards in many cases, but also proved that they knew a great many merchandising and showmanship angles. These helped to bring them increased collections. And thereby made many a firm a more solid financial factor for post-war.

Just the other day a letter came to hand from an operator of cigarette machines wherein this man advised that since he couldn't obtain cigarettes in the quantity needed, he had turned to cigars. He was selling these to his locations to give the smokers what he could. At the same time he was developing his locations for another product - cigar venders - while continuing to keep contact, cement friendship and build good will with the location owner and the location's customers.

This is but one, among many, examples brought to light during this wartime period of the ingenuity demonstrated by the men in this business which has greatly helped to stabilize this business to a great extent. This has also created a stronger and more confident backbone upon which all this trade can build for the future.

HOW MUCH LONGER?"

One of the questions consistently asked these days is, "How much longer before new machines will appear on the market?"

This is just as difficult to answer as "When will the war be over?" But, it is demonstrative of the fact that the men in this industry are eager and even anxious to get back to normal, peacetime business action once again.

Most important, of course, is the fact that the used machines field seems destined to go on for months to come, regardless of when the war in Europe ends, in as important and outstanding a capacity as it is today.

It will take many, many months before new machines can cover the entire country regardless of whatever high speed, mass production methods are adopted. After all, raw materials will have to be obtained in quantities never before known to satisfy the demand of all industries. In addition, much new machinery will be needed. Labor is sure to prove a serious problem. There may be rationing of the first new machines coming off the production lines. Transportation of the new equipment to all centers on an equitable basis will also prove a task in itself. In short, there are many, many puzzling problems as yet to be solved - even after the war is finished.

Used equipment will therefore continue to lead for a long time to come even as the new machines come into the market. It will be months before these new machines will begin to arrive in such quantities as to supersede all interest in the used equipment field.

It is therefore extremely foolhardy for anyone to attempt to predict just "How much longer" before new machines will once again be seen. But it is only pure logic that used machines will continue extremely active regardless whether the new machines were to enter into production - tomorrow.

TAX BUG BITES DEEP JERSEY TAX MAKERS SHOOT WORKS. SET HIGHEST LICENSE FEE IN HISTORY ON PINS. HIGH COURT'S **DECISION ACTUALLY WORTHLESS BY THIS ACTION.**

RIDGEFIELD PARK, N. J.-Once again the tax bug has bitten, but this time, deeper than ever before in the history of pin games. The Cash Box has been advising and urging the trade to get together as fast as possible to create a National Tax Council to be prepared for eventualities of this kind for today, and especially for the post-war era. This is only the beginning of the tax bug's fever.

Since the favorable decision given by the highest court in the State of New Jersey, the Court of Errors and Appeals, legalizing a great many types of games (decision of this court was reprinted in full in The Cash Box October 17 issue) being one of the broadest decisions yet granted, the coinmen in this state immediately attempted to get started with pin games.

Bergen County went up almost the same day the decision came down from the Court of Errors & Appeals. Essex County, most populated county in the state, awaits interpretations from its legal department which is expected after election day. Other counties in the state are going up and some waiting for decisions. But it can safely be stated that most of

the state is now operating arcade and pinball equipment. When the decision came thru Prosecutor Walter Winne of Bergen County warned police chiefs that they could no longer interfere with pinball except in cases where definite gambling could be proved. At the same time he warned communities that their only recourse was to fix high license fees so that too many games would not be placed and therefore police supervision and control could function with greater efficiency over a lesser number of machines.

In keeping with this suggestion tax makers thruout the state started planning for high license fees. This past week the first of these was an-nounced. Ridgefield Park, N. J., in an effort (so claimed) to keep ma-chines out of this municipality, has fixed a license fee of \$500.00 per year per pinball machine. This is approximately \$10.00 per week-too much

for any pin game to pay. Lyndhurst, N. J. followed this same line of reasoning to make it unprofitable for coinmen to operate and fixed a license fee of \$250.00 per machine per year. This is topped by the license fee in existence in East Orange, N. J., where \$400.00 per machine per year is already set. Other communities are expected to follow.

There is no doubt that such a license fee is absolutely confiscatory. But without the existence of a Tax Council of coinmen in this state it will become the work of individuals to attempt to get these fees down to a plane where pins can be operated. This being negative legislation, those who have formerly attempted to cure such situations, know what a legal battle is ahead of any coinman.

Many other Bergen townships are reported to also be preparing ordi-nances establishing high license fees for pinball machines, all on the same theory of trying to keep them out.

The Cash Box again urges coinmen to get together at this time and halt the tax maker, who knows nothing of this industry, from licensing this business out of existence. This is the time to create local Tax Councils. This is the time to create a National Tax Council to benefit all this industry.

ONLY 2% LOSSES ON CREDIT GIVEN 1,300 COINMEN

"From my experience, 'A credit Bureau' could be established without a great amount of work, and by charging a small fee for a rating, could be made self sustaining, and give the Coin operating business a much better rating, prestige, and a business standard.

"You have my permission to use any or all of this in your campaign."

OMAHA TAX BUG BITES CITY COMPTROLLER ASKS \$150 PER YEAR ON PINS. \$50 ON PHONOS. 1¢ PER PACK ON CIGGIES. WOULD YIELD OVER \$350,000.

OMAHA, NEB.—The tax bug has bitten here, too, and City Comptroller Charles Stenicka has proposed sharp increases in city taxes on pinball

machines, coin operated phonographs and a city cigarette tax to help off-set an expected \$111,288 deficit in the 1945 city opearting budget. The three tax suggestions were offered for "the consideration of the City Commissioners" as part of a report handed to the commissioners City Commissioners" as part of a report handed to the commissioners for study and labeled "fourth advance estimate of 1945 budget revenue". Mr. Stenicka emphasized that his suggestions are "debatable" and that there are other possible sources of revenue.

are other possible sources of revenue. His three suggestions are: 1) raise the yearly license fee on the 900 pin games now reported operating in this city from \$15 per year to \$150 per year, this is expected to provide \$121,500 for this city; 2) raise the music box tax from \$5 to \$50 yearly, boosting city revenue \$22,500; 3) a 1¢ tax on each package of cigarettes which would yield about \$219,000 annually. Mr. Stenicka also stated, "As to pinball machines. From reports of operators, these machines are considered gold mines for the owners and, since they are a luxury for players an occupation tax of \$150 a year could

since they are a luxury for players, an occupation tax of \$150 a year could be considered as a reasonable charge." He also stated, "Music boxes could be considered in the same class."

Once again coinmen here are seeking information as to what taxes are being charged in other communities, counties and states. This conforms to the statements made by The Cash Box for many, many months, that when trouble breaks in any community regarding confiscatory taxation coinmen run about like bewildered children, for there is no single source in the industry where data, precedents, information, legal action or any other type of materials in regard to taxation is filed and maintained for the benefit of the coinman in such instances. A National Tax Council, if for this one purpose alone, is an absolute

necessity.
