A new racket has come into being in the Metropolitan New York area, the hijacking of automatic phonographs. Complaints have been received by The Cash Box daily for the past few weeks advising that phono after phono has been boldly and openly removed from locations in this area.

The usual method is for someone to phone the location advising, "This is the company calling", and stating, "we are sending over our men to pick up the phonograph in your place for repairs. We'll have a new phonograph there in a few hours."

The average storekeeper has naturally believed the caller, and almost before he hangs up the phone - there are men in his place removing the phono. When the operator calls around he finds his machine gone and the truth comes to light.

Phono operators are warned to advise their locations that their machines are not to be removed without their personal appearance at such time. All those who have been urchasing phonos of late are asked to check serial numbers and see whether these have been defaced or removed.

If the serial number has been tampered with, please advise The Cash Box quick. By immediate action you may help to kill this racket.

# "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-'Round" by Bill Gersh

### A MORE PRACTICAL COMMISSION BASIS FOR POST-WAR

For a great many months The Cash Box has been urging coinmen to adopt a new commission basis as a protection to themselves for the forthcoming post-war era. There is no doubt anymore of the importance of a more equitable and practical commission basis for the post-war period whereby the average coinman can more rapidly amortize the cost of the equipment he installs in his average location and thereby realize profits faster than ever before.

#### WILL HELP PREPARE FOR POST-WAR

This is a great necessity. The post-war period is speedily approaching. And the members of this industry want to be as well prepared for it as will the retailers, and all others with whom they will come in daily contact. All leading national organizations in every industry are at work completing plans to help their members to be prepared for post-war.

#### MACHINES TO COST MORE

First of all, there is no doubt that machines will cost more, regardless of the fact that OPA will attempt to have the manufacturers in the two dozen leading consumer durable goods lines maintain prices somewhat similar to their 1942 prices. It is generally believed that OPA will probably learn, when meeting with representative groups from these industries, that these manufacturers cannot produce even the very same products they manufactured in 1942 at the same prices. It is an accepted fact, openly publicized, that materials and labor costs have risen anywhere from 25% to 35% and even more in some cases, during this wartime period.

#### COSTS OF ALL PRODUCTS TO RISE!

The fact that OPA claims that increased productivity on the part of the manufacturers during the first opening part of the post-war period because of the huge backlog demand will allow for a decrease in their costs, eventual production runs, after the readjustment period (which is expected about two years after the reconversion) also have to be taken into consideration. The cost of all products, especially in the consumers durable goods fields, will have to rise to meet these higher materials and labor costs. The manufacturers in these industries need higher prices to assure their profitable continuance after the readjustment period, as well as during the lush reconversion era.

#### NEW MODELS TO BOOST COST

The members of this industry, especially, should get ready to see costs of the products which they formerly purchased increased by much, much more than 25% or even 35%. The reason is simply that this industry is dependant upon continuously producing new models of greater beauty and value and therefore cannot build similar products, as do other consumer goods fields, and must obtain prices 50% and 100% and even more above the '42 prices for this new (and probably) radically designed equipment.

#### LONGER AMORTIZATION PERIOD

This higher equipment cost which will face the coinman will mean that he will have to plan on a much longer period to amortize the cost of his equipment, and especially to enjoy profit from this equipment. He must, as an intelligent business man, prepare himself now to ease that burden.

#### PRESENT COMMISSION BASIS OUTDATED

The 50%-50% commission basis now generally in effect thruout the country is as old fashioned as the horse and buggy. This percentage arrangement came into being because of the keen competition during the pin games boom era. It should never have reached this point. Surely phonographs and much other equipment should not now be paying any such commission. Games were plenty good enough when they cost around the \$16.50 mark in 1931 and 1932 to take care of a 50%-50% commission basis. Now, with the average game likely to cost around the \$250.00 mark, there is a greater need for a better and more practical percentage basis than ever before. This old horse and buggy percentage basis of '31 and '32 does not take into consideration the many taxes which have since come into being for this industry, and which continue to increase with alarming regularity.

#### LOWER LABOR INCOME

The very fact that the general public, at the present time; has so much money to spend, must definitely not be taken into consideration for the post-war period. The average man in this industry should, instead, think of the days when the public will not be enjoying such bountiful salaries. He should think of the time when labor will

once more be plentiful. And regardless of how hard labor unions are attempting to reach and maintain a definite high wage scale, there is bound to be a break in labor costs. Furthermore, machinery developed during this wartime period, makes possible unusually high mass production with a minimum of labor.

#### VARIED COMMISSION SCALES

This, therefore, is also a problem that ties right in with the need for a new and better and much more practical commission basis for the average coinman. Let us consider the average community, where more than one location is featuring coin operated equipment, and where more than one operator is in existence. These coinmen, in this single community, are today paying all sorts of varied commission scales to locations. The cigarette machines man is probably paying about the lowest commission of all. Next in line comes the man who is operating drink and bulk merchandisers. Yet the location owner is satisfied with the commissions being paid to him by these men.

#### ADDITIONAL EXPENSES

After these come the music and amusement equipment operators. These men pay the highest commissions and on equipment that earns a great deal more money. Not only do they pay a 50%-50% commission, but they also make loans, and gifts, etc., etc. etc., ad infinitum, to maintain these locations. Yet, if the community is carefully analyzed, there are only about 2% or 3% of the locations that should be catered to on such a handsome commission basis. The rest are only average locations and these pull down collections to lower points.

#### KEENER COMPETITION ARISING

The operator simply must intelligently prepare himself if he wants to continue to be in this business and prosper during the post-war era. He already realizes that he will come up against more and keener competition than he ever has before in his career in this industry. He also knows that many old timers are returning to this business each and every day, and tho most of these old timers do not hurt the average set-up in any community, yet it is only logical that they, too, should grab off a few of the better locations for themselves, rather than attempt to develop all new locations.

#### ALL MUST COOPERATE

New blood, that is already gradually coming into this industry, knows nothing of these headaches and problems. These new men step right in and try to grab everything in sight. Whether thru friendships, thru a uniform, thru whatever means they use they, too, get some of the locations, and the result is that the average coinman finds himself in a puzzling predicament, to say the least. When he arranges to get down to a better and more practical commission basis, he must also arrange to instantly acquaint these old-timers and this new blood with this fact so that all can work on a more harmonious plane.

#### FIRST PROBLEM TO CURE

This is only part of what the average coinman faces. There are more and still more serious problems. But, one of the very first problems that should be cured, and that can be cured rapidly, is to arrange for a new commission basis.

#### NEW COMMISSION BASIS

The Cash Box has urged and will continue to insist that the least the coinman can do is to get his average locations (those that he does not necessarily have to cater to, for it is well known that there are a certain few locations that he can continue on a 50%-50% commission basis and which will still earn good profits for him) down to a 70%-30% commission basis. (30% to the location and 70% to the coinman.)

#### CAN BE MORE EASILY DONE NOW

Only if he will adopt this new commission basis will he better assure himself success in the post-war period. This additional 20%, which he will obtain from such a commission basis (70%-30%), may mean the difference between profit and loss in the post-war period. He can do this now more easily than he will ever again be able to do it. He must take immediate advantage of the general business situation existing today to arrange for a 70%-30% commission basis.

#### OVERHEAD INCREASED

His overhead is already tremendously increased, and it is also well to remember, that he does not have all the help he would like to have. He is surely going to hire many more men to work for him the moment he can get them. He cries today because of the salaries he pays to his men. Then what about tomorrow when he will have even more men at work for him? Surely he does not imagine that he will be able to clean out all of his old help and bring in new help in increased numbers at less cost to himself?

#### MORE OVERHEAD EXPENSE ON WAY

The average coinman reports that he is going to increase his operations. He is also planning to open more elaborate quarters. He is thinking about promotional stunts that will help him get more locations. Does he, for even a moment, believe that all this will cut down his overhead?

#### TO BUY NEW EQUIPMENT

In addition, the average coinman plans to buy as many new machines as he possibly can, so that he will be able to insure his locations remaining his locations by

overcoming any competitors who will present new machines to his spots. He now realizes that new machines are going to cost a lot more than they ever did before. This, then, will mean a further increase in his overhead expense. And such an increase again means that he must earn more money to take care of his business - or get out of business.

MORE COMMISSION NEEDED

The one and only way that he can help increase his earning power, especially when th general public begins to tighten up its purse strings and carefully watch its expenditures, is to get more commission from his locations.

SUMMARY OF OVERHEAD EXPENSES

He will need this additional commission percentage to more rapidly amortize his investment in the equipment he will buy. He will need it to cover the increased servicing costs which he will find himself undergoing due to competition. He will need it more than ever to assure himself continuing on a profitable basis in this business and being in a position where he will, for once, have cash instead of lumber as his collateral for years of work. He will need it to help pay for licenses and occupational taxes, and these are increasing all over the country. He will most assuredly need it to build a good financial reserve for the leaner years. In fact, he most definitely needs it to stay in business.

ARRANGE NEW COMMISSION BASIS NOW

The Cash Box once again urges each and every man who now has machines on locations - to bring his commission basis down from 50% to the average location to 30%, so that he will be assured every opportunity to continue on successfully in the postwar period.

HOLDING LOCATIONS

At the present time there is a movement afoot in the trade, at least by the average coinman, to get into as many locations as he possibly can so that he will be well set, with a larger number of spots, to greet the new products of the manufacturers when they can once again enter into former products production.

To do this, and to capitalize on these additional locations, he must, at the present time, purchase used machines. Used machines are therefore becoming an ever more important factor on the present sales market.

The Cash Box has explained many times in the past that the one sure way the average coinman can protect himself in his territory for the post-war period is to obtain for himself the largest number of locations he can efficiently operate today.

The average coinman realizes that machines will come off the production lines, during the post-war era, the like of which he has never before enjoyed. Locations which he gives little thought to today, may prove to be the outstanding locations of tomorrow. The new equipment which will be produced may help to make average locations the outstanding money-makers of tomorrow.

Therefore the used machines field is important from more than just the stand-point of a sales market for this industry. It is the supplier of a very definite and essential need for today which acts as insurance for tomorrow. It covers a great many important factors that the average coinman should give a lot more consideration to at this time.

Used machines will hold locations until the new machines arrive. They will not only satisfy the average location owner, who also realizes as does the coinman that new equipment is as yet far from actual production, but it gives him something to help maintain and even build up play action.

The sales of used machines continue to increase daily. This is one of the big reasons for this increase. Perhaps it is the major reason. Surely those who read this will agree to the importance of the used machine to maintain locations so that these locations will remain theirs when the post-war period comes into being and when locations will count most.

In a few days every community in the nation will be urging its citizens to enter into the 6th War Loan Drive with all possible vigor.

The money, all that you can possibly scrape up, that you will put into this drive may help bring home - your boy - the sons of your friends - the kids from your home town.

#### WILL HIGH TAXES LEAD TO DIRECT SALES?

Will Only Storekeepers Be Able To Operate And Pay Taxes For Equipment As Coinmen Are Forced To Let Locations Go Because Earning Power Will Not Be Able To Cover Excessive Taxation? Will This Create New Era Of Wholesalers Selling Direct To Storekeepers?

NEW YORK—Since appealing, just a few weeks ago, urging coinmen to get together into a National Tax Council, not only because this would create an agency which would have records, data, precedents, legal aid and information at one central headquarters to help benefit coinmen who are suddenly bitten by the tax bug, there have arrived many letters and newspaper clippings about city commissions who are proposing that coin machine taxes be tremendously increased. (Typical examples were the stories about the City of Omaha and the State of New Jersey, which appeared in this past week's, November 14, issue of The Cash Box.)

Since then, and from some of these letters, comes the belief that if communities thruout the nation begin to spread the idea of severely taxing coin operated equipment, that coinmen will find themselves left with only such locations that are capable of producing sufficient revenue to help pay for \$3, \$5 or \$10 or even higher taxes per week demanded

Should this happen, these men write, the average coinman will have to seek for a new business. He will not be able to continue in this industry and pay the sort of license fees being proposed by many communities at this time.

These men also advise that they have tried to get the location owner to share the cost of the license with them. In some cases they have been successful, and in others they have failed. An extremely good location will not share the license fee. The average location that will, they report, is not too good a spot, but desperately wants to have the games and the music and other equipment remain on the premises.

The problem, these men claim, is that should higher and still higher taxes come into being, this will force the storekeeper to buy his own

equipment and this would eliminate the operator.

With the fact that the operator has been proved to be the most logical man to handle the operation of routes of equipment on a percentage basis and therefore continue on as the basic source for the sales of machines he must be helped to continue and to maintain himself as an individual and highly specialized business so as to preserve the success already being enjoyed, and help continue the progress of this industry. Will high taxes, these men ask, bring about an era of direct sales to storkeepers? Will this eventually eliminate the operator because he

will find it unprofitable to operate under such excessive license fee conditions? Will the post-war period then become an era of direct selling to storekeepers who, because they will not have to share the collections from the machines, be able to pay such higher taxes and still continue

Will this mean the creation of a new type of wholesaler, like the average tobacco jobber, who will call directly on storekeepers and convince them to purchase new machines? The locations can pay for the machines from the income and enjoy profit at the same time. These men are worried. They are asking many questions which are extremely diffi-

cult to answer.

For example, one man writes, "What difference would it be for the average jobber to have his men call on storekeepers instead of operators? Have his repair men charge to fix the machines for storekeepers when they go out of order just as they charge the operator. Work on the basis of allowing locations to pay for the machines directly from the incomes of the machines themselves and build up a unique and different sort of business in this fashion. Surely this would be a much bigger business for the wholesaler than he now enjoys with operators. Eventually it would be practically ally similar to the busines he now conducts with operators anyway. What difference would it be if the wholesaler in this business sells to us operators or directly to the storekeepers if we operators can't

operate on those locations?

"How are we going to pay \$3 per week license fee for a pin game, pay our overhead, and buy new machines all out of the 50% we get from the average \$10 per week gross spot? In the first place we only have \$5 to work with. If we are left with \$2, after putting aside for the \$3 license fee, how can we continue on in such a spot? Yet, the location wants the machines in the place for

it means better business to him.

"Someone must then supply the machine. A rental basis would be unprofitable for the storekeeper could not afford to pay the average rental necessary, the amount we would need to amortize the machine in plenty of time prior to buying another new machine, and proving at the same time that the machine are put in the control. and praying at the same time that the machine we put in the spot isn't a flop, and still pay the license fee and also pay for other

overhead the machine creates?
"Will we operators become salesmen? Will we go from location to location, where we cannot afford to operate ourselves, and sell these locations the newest machines? In this way the storekeeper would keep all the money coming into the machine and might be able to pay us for repairs and pay his license fees, etc. But, wouldn't this spread to the good spots, too? And then where

would we be?

"All this can become fact because of the higher license fees being demanded by one community after another. In our town we have twice fought and won against an extremely high, actually a confiscatory, license fee. But even in winning, the license was increased some each time. Maybe the next time we'll lose the fight and they will slap us with a \$200 or \$300 or \$500 per year license fee on pin games alone, as they have already done in New Jersey, not to speak of phonographs and other equipment.
"A National Tax Council, such as you propose, is absolutely nec-

essary. It's the best idea ever presented to this industry. It's on a par with the other great ideas you have given to the men in this business. In fact, we believe that it is the one and only thing that can save the operator in this business being taxed out of business. It should be started at once."

DENVER, COLO.-C. J. Fendrick, of this city, who has been engaged in the coin machines business for over 40 years, and who has continued to work hard to bring the prestige level of this industry to the highest possible plane, proposes that The Cash Box publish the names of all those who signed the "pledge", originated and instituted by this publication in an effort to cure shipments of poor equipment, for all to

Mr. Fendrick is of the belief that this will help all buyers in this industry to instantly note the firms who have come into the open to state to the trade that they will only sell equipment whose condition they specify in advance and will so crate their shipment so that damage will be minimized or completely eli-

This past week he wrote, "I have noticed in recent issues that you have been writing up about bad machine shipment increases, also The Cash Box pledge, and I am unable to understand with all the compliments that you are getting, why you do not advertise the names of the firms who signed the Pledge so that every operator or distributor will know who to deal with. I have sent you several letters of com-plaint myself on bad shipments.

"I have no objection to your writreal nave no objection to your writing my name that I signed the Pledge and I hope to see it in the next issue of The Cash Box. If firms have signed Pledges they should have no objection to your advertising their names as it is good advertising for them."
