THE "NATIONAL SERVICE ACT BLUES"

Once again the pessimists are beginning to sing the blues. Just as they did right after Péarl Harbor. And right after each and every nationally critical period.

This time they are singing "The National Service Act Blues". It's a new song, being composed by Congress, which body of learned men seems to be having some trouble with its final composition.

These blues singers, sing, "This is it. This is the end. This means that all of our men will be taken away from us. All our locations will be forced to close."

Sounds familiar, doesn't it? This has happened time after time. Especially with those men who, right after Pearl Harbor, predicted that this business wouldn't last "three months". A few quaveringly said, "Maybe six months." It's funny how these seme men have since earned more and done more than ever before in this industry.

The industry goes on ahead. Cheerfully bearing up under all the restrictions. Keeping its head well above water. Even to the extent of graciously paying heavier, and in most cases, inequitable taxes, than do a great many other businesses.

Funny thing about these people who are so much in a hurry and so eager to tell us we are finished. These are the same people from whom it's so hard to buy routes or machines at reasonable prices. These seem to be the men who want the highest possible price for their machines and the largest amounts for "good will".

After all is said and done, maybe it's a good thing we've got these people in our industry. They are just the contrast we need to keep the rest of us in balance. Just the sort of men who, because of their statements, stir up the grit and fight and optimism and guts of the ordinary man in this business. The fighting sort of business man.

Whatever the business, the man who will continue it, who will fight his way ahead in it, is bound to be the man who paves the way for the greater business to come to him and to all others - after the war. And this will be a greater business than ever after the war.

Sure the National Service Act is bound to affect many firms. Especially those firms located in critical labor areas. But as much as they will be affected, there is no doubt that they will still be able to continue, tho possibly not on as large or powerful a scale as before.

What difference is it whether a firm has 150 or 50 machines operating after these three past grand and glorious business years? Those 50 machines can act as the perfect base - the strong backbone for instant growth - tomorrow. (And it means paying just so much less taxes, anyway.)

The real thing is that the firm who goes on will still be in there punching. It will be there to welcome the growth of a new and greater industry, with a smile and with experience that will be invaluable. Its old locations will be more than happy to have it start doing business with them all over again.

Certainly mechanics will be lost. But we can recall away back in this industry when mechanics were something few people knew about or even thought about. The operator himself did his own repairing and servicing. He can do the very same thing today. And, I'm willing to bet, as long as he realizes that this will help shorten this damned bloody war, he'll be more than happy to do so.

There used to be an old expression in this Dusiness that, "To be a successful coin machine man you mustn't be afraid to get your hands dirty". Smart, promoting salesmen, in the old days, bringing new blood into this business, made heavy use of

this expression. The men they brought to this industry, based on this simple fact, have stuck with the trade. They have, in most cases, turned out to be the best men in this business.

It's a real pleasure to grasp a man's hand in greeting in this business and find that hand tough and hard. A hand that has known how heavy a machine is when lifted. A hand that hasn't been afraid to rip the nails from a crate, to set up a machine and carry it into a location.

Some men in this industry have allowed those good hands to grow soft these past few years. Maybe a National Service Act, should it ever go into effect, will be the very best thing that can happen to them. It may just be that spark that will renew their fight in their own interests.

It may even help them to get a better and closer idea of what the other guy in their territory, who may still be one of the little men and hard working, is doing to just get along. Yes, a lot of old timers seem to have forgotten a lot of things. This may be just the right awakener. This may cure those pessimistic bogey men, too.

But, to even believe for a second that this National Service Act will push this industry out of being - is extremely foolhardy thinking. Industries aren't murdered by acts of this kind. Industries simply remain quiet when such national problems are in the offing.

As yet no national tragedy, thanks to the greatness of those boys you raised and who have proved their fighting ability and then some, has occurred or will occur. You can bet your last bottom dollar on that right now.

Those kids in blue and khaki, your kids, are great fighting men. The best in the world. They've made the world sit up and take notice of that fact. The kid you raised has honored you and his nation. He would feel miserable were he to think that his "old man" or his "boss" were even a teeney bit frightened by a thing called a "National Service Act".

I'll bet, and so will you when you think more about it, that you could even hold a war job, and still run the best part of your route, and keep your business alive, really alive.

So to those now familiar bogey men who have again arisen in the industry and have found something to gloat over and shout about we say - phooey. You can't lick men who won't be licked. And there's too much good, old fashioned rugged, individualistic guts in the men who made this an industry, to be licked by anything.

In 1620 they told the Pilgrims they would never be able to "live" in the American wilderness. They did, and how they did.

In 1776 a king told a small, struggling nation of Americans, "Even tho you have no voice in making taxes - you'll pay them, and like it." Remember that little revolution?

In 1823 some grasping, greedy European nations wanted "in" on this continent. The Monroe Doctrine was the answer.

In 1869 someone told these Americans they could never unite their east and west. So that year they completed a coast to coast railroad.

In the early 1900's they told Americans, "You can't pay laborers \$5.00 a day". They paid labor much, much more than that ever since.

In 1929 they said, "You can't get over the depression". Does any one see any depression around?

And now, in 1945, in a youthful brimming with enthusiasm industry, some bogey men are telling us, "You're finished". WHAT DO YOU SAY TO THAT?

THE CABARETS DO IT AGAIN /// It is extremely interesting to The Cash Box, because this medium has been urging the members of this industry for many, many months to get together into a National Tax Council, a Public Relations Bureau, a National Credit Bureau, a National Board of Trade, and has made many other such suggestions which have met with the acclaim of the trade, to note that when a crisis strikes at such an industry as the cabarets, that these men get together immediately and work for the general welfare of all concerned with their industry.

It is a well known fact thruout this and many other industries that there is a movement afoot to blackout the mightlife entertainment of this country. Naturally the cabarets in the City of New York would be tremendously affected. Many thousands of dollars are at present invested in the nightlife entertainment for which this city is justly famous. Therefore the idea that a blackout might even occur, and that these spots would have to close at 8 P.M., so that no drinks or other entertainment could be sold, has the cabarets up in arms.

A meeting was hurriedly called and a small group of these New York men met at one of the hotels. They are now arranging for a \$50,000 to \$100,000 defense fund. They believe that the entertainment they are selling is vital to continued good morale. They also believe that this 8 P.M. closing is simply another way for the blue-noses and prohibitionists to speak over the same prohibition idea they did during the last war, and when the soldiers returned they found the country as dry as a bone.

One noted nite spot owner got up on the floor at this meeting and stated, "It now rests with the cafe people themselves to convince the public that theirs is no longer a hoodlum industry". (Some coinman could have said the same thing and could have followed this with, "Why don't we adopt The Cash Box idea of a Public Relations Bureau to help us?") This same man continued by calling for a strong organization of top cabarets and hotels to start out with a paid in fund of \$50,000 to \$100,000 and to employ one of the nation's most noted figures to lead them. Such names as Jim Farley, Jimmy Walker, Bob Henegan and Charles E. Tuttle were mentioned. (This, too, should sound familiar to The Cash Box readers.)

What is most interesting to the readers of The Cash Box is the fact that if the taverns are closed down at 8 P.M., and no drinks can be sold after that hour, then the machines located in taverns will have lost about 85% of their play value. And that goes for peanut venders, phonographs, pin games, etc. These are the most popular and prominent coin machine locations in the nation.

It should also be remembered that just because the modern phonograph came into this industry in '34 with amplification and a long life needle still didn't mean that the automatic phono business could have reached the heights it has reached at this present time. A machine can be the finest ever produced - but without a location that machine is worthless. So when prohibition was repealed it only naturally followed that a market had then been created for the phonos. In fact, the first phono salesmen always tied in the thought of beer and music going together.

It is extremely gratifying to note how these cabaret and hotel men instantly get together everytime that a crisis threatens. When the Federal Government tried to slap a 30% luxury tax on all cafe checks, these men, by instantly getting together (and reported at the time in The Cash Box) fought it and had it reduced to the same 20% the movies are paying. Now that they are threatened with a possible blackout of their industry they are coming together into an organization. They know that this is an effort on the part of blue-noses and prohibitionists to stop America enjoying itself the way it wants and likes to.

It is a proved fact that everytime these sort of bills are pushed thru legislative bodies they are always done so with the promise that they will only last as long as the war. They said the same about prohibition the last time. It lasted long after the war was over and forgotten. There is no doubt, then, that if the present bluenoses and crusaders in Congress get this bill thru that this, too, will last long, long after the war is over. Therefore these men, who realize the truth and and know the facts back of such action are going to fight it. And they are going to win because THEY CAN GET TOGETHER.

This industry should kneel down every evening, before it tucks itself into its warm and downy bed and pray that these cabaret men will be successful in preventing this 8 P.M. curfew from going into effect. Every man connected with this industry knows just what this will mean to him. He realizes that the best spots he has are taverns. If they are forced to close at 8 P.M. and not sell drinks - then he can discount a terrific percentage from his present collections and will be forced to sell off a lot of good equipment because it will be worthless to him. Why can't the men in this industry get together? Surely, there's as much fighting blood in this as there is in the cabaret business. The men in this industry are every bit as intelligent and far seeing. They know what an 8 P.M. curfew law applied nationally would mean to them. Then why, for the love of all that is good for each and every coin machine man, can't the men in this trade get together and be prepared to fight down the very thing that will hurt them badly?

"Talking Out Loud"

URGE GREATER USE OF C.P.A.'s

Believe Use of C.P.A.'s Will Bring Better Understanding Of Present Tax Situation. Foresee These Men Helping Toward Creation Of National Tax Council. Urge Ops Stop Being Bookkeepers.

NEW YORK—Many noted leaders in this industry have placed themselves on record these past few weeks urging more widespread employment of Certified Public Accountants. These men, they claim, will bring about better understanding of all tax matters.

These men also believe that employment of CPA's will eventually help create a better understanding of tax matters generally and that because of this the industry will thereby greatly benefit. As these tax problems evolve, these men report, the result will be the eventual formation of a National Tax Council, as proposed by The Cash Box.

This year has seen the sudden arrival of much new and heavier taxation of this industry. Licenses are now being issued in many territories where they were formerly unknown.

If licenses would, in any fashion whatsoever, guarantee that the machines which they tax would remain on location for the term of the license, and would also be accepted with favor by the police and the courts, it would then be more than worthwhile to pay these license fees.

Licenses guarantee nothing. They only act as another method for extracting revenue from industry for the continued performance of governmental functions. They are simply an out and out method of taxation.

The tax situation has actually grown desperate in certain communities. A small town of 400 population reports an increase in its pinball and music license fee from \$3 to \$30 per year. It is time for this industry to sit up and take notice when such tax action occurs.

Many new state bills are being introduced at this time to raise license fees to exorbitant levels. One coinman reports, "They intend to pour it on us this year." Another writes, "If they raise present licenses to the fees they expect to obtain we shall simply be wiped out of business."

Another problem which is now proving embarrassing to many ops is that of being their own bookkeepers. They have felt the lack of expert tax advice when income tax men of the Internal Revenue Dept. of the Treasury call around to make routine checks. This is the time for such ops to employ Certified Public Accountants and learn from them just how their books should be kept. They will find themselves with many less headaches when reliable accountants handle their bookkeeping.

The present income tax rate is sure to go on for many, many years after the war is over. Therefore it is almost imperative for those men who haven't yet learned about expert tax accounting methods to engage such men to handle their business affairs for them for these men can save them a great deal of income tax money.

The belief is that by better understanding of tax problems the trade will, of its own accord, create a National Tax Council.

There is surely no harm in the average coinman, who is now acting as his own bookkeeper, hiring an expert accountant to do this work for him. He will, thru contact with such a man, gain a much better insight into his own as well as the general tax problem of all the nation's businesses. The result is sure to prove of great benefit to him and to all the trade.

The Cash Box believes that this idea on the part of many leaders of this industry that the trade be urged to a closer alliance with Certified Public Accountants is bound to prove of great value. It will surely bring about a better understanding of the tax problems which this industry faces.

It will also bring a better understanding of how these tax problems tie in with the present income tax situation. By such action, it is generally conceded, the members of this industry will create a National Tax Council.

It should also be remembered that CPA's make marvelous witnesses to prove to any legislative body secking higher revenue taxes whether a firm can or cannot stand for further taxation. By employing such expert tax people the individuals in this trade will have a strong weapon to fight any further raising of taxes in their communities. The expert testimony which these accountants can give is acceptable to most courts and certainly to most tax legislators. This may be able to stem the tax tide which is slowly engulfing many members of this industry. At the same time it is sure to lead to creation of a National Tax Council which this publication, and so many members of this industry, so fervently hope will soon become fact.

Fewer Cigs In '45

NEW YORK—Current estimates put '45's cig output at about 330 billions. 39% to armed services. 2% to export trade. 59% to domestic civilian market. This equals about 15 cigs a day for average smoker.

Small Chicago Firms To Get Employment Ceilings

CHICAGO—About 20,000 small firms in this city will have employment ceilings imposed upon them within the next 3 weeks to help relieve the city's critical manpower shortage. Coinmen are watching events very closely.

Jan. 31 Is Deadline For Industry's March Of Dimes Fund

NEW YORK — January 31 is the deadline for the March of Dimes (National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis) fund to be contributed by the coin machines industry.

Bill Rabkin of International Mutoscope Corp., is Chairman of the coin machines industry fund. Leaders are urging all to contribute, so that the trade will be given full credit for an extremely worthwhile showing in this great effort.

Since this industry has been chosen for this Fund as a separate unit, it now has the opportunity to win the greatest respect and prestige. Officials everywhere in the nation will have to commend this trade. By placing its donations into this one central unit and showing outstanding representation at this time, this industry will gain greater recognition.

Release Civilian Ammunition

WASHINGTON—WPB froze all stocks of civilian ammunition held by manufacturers in December and also prohibited production of shell and bullets for civilians after Jan. 1.

The Office of Civilian Requirements of WPB has just announced that essential types of civilian ammunition will be released immediately for ranchers, farmers and law enforcement agencies.

As yet no release is reported to arcades.

Savannah Sets Two Blocks From Schools For Pin-Balls

SAVANNAH, GA. — Coinmen here must keep their pinballs at least two blocks away from schools from now on. News of this order was contained in articles which appeared in the Evening Press (Jan. 15) and the Morning News (Jan. 16) of this city.

Ops here claim that they have already moved their games this distance from the schools. This was brought on by the survey now being conducted here to learn what is fostering juvenile delinquency in this city.

License fces here have been raised from \$50 per pin-ball game to \$75 per game per year. License applications are now in the hands of the city marshall.

Mayor Gamble of this city reported, "The licenses for these machines are issued with the very distinct proviso they are to be used only for trade purposes."

There has also been some agitation to freeze the number of pinball games now in the city along with the liquor licenses now in existence.
