# **LOCATION PROTECTION NECESSARY**

Among noted coinmen thruout the country one of the most prominent subjects these days is protecting present locations. It is generally agreed that when the post-war period gets under way, and this may happen with surprising suddeness, much new blood is expected to enter into this field. This will naturally cause a rush for locations.

Coinmen who have operated thruout this war period want their locations to remain their locations. The Cash Box has many times in the past urged coinmen to protect their locations by legal agreements and by any other logical methods they feel will work best in their territories.

These men who continued thruout the war are the men who will be the backbone for the future growth of this industry. These men should therefore protect their locations as much as they possibly can at this time.

Economic experts agree that with the armed services now in control of the nation's production, reconversion to former products will be a slow and somewhat painful process. With the great Russian successes and the possibility a drive from the West is already under way, has caused many leading military men to believe that the European war may come to a very sudden end.

It is also believed by many business and military experts that the armed services will be very reluctant to relinquish control of the nation's production even when the war in Europe ends. They may insist on the country continuing its present all out drive until the war with Japan is finished.

Regardless of what does occur it is now believed that there will be a longer unemployment period after the war in Europe is finished than would have been the case if the armed services had not gained control of production.

This means that the period of reconversion by large and small industry will take many months longer than at first planned. And while these workers are idle they will, many of them, begin to seek for businesses of their own. And this in addition to the many service men who have already returned and are being returned each day and are seeking for a business.

This industry may not be among the first allowed to return to former products production. Yet it may find itself growing even before new machines are available. There is no doubt that many will want to enter into this field. Starting with used equipment will not deter these new people. This has already been proved in many centers where new blood has already entered into the ranks of this industry with used machines.

This means the beginning of competition even before the average coinman believed it would start. It also means that those who have good locations want to assure themselves that such locations will remain theirs, regardless of how much competition may suddenly enter into the picture. It is therefore up to these men to get their locations to sign up with them.

In addition it is a well known fact that a certain few engaged in this industry at present are of the belief that the coinman of today has outworn his usefulness as far as they are concerned. They are seeking for new blood. They want to get the new man to start their products rolling. This, too, means that locations must be protected to offset such methods.

For many, many months The Cash Box has urged coinmen to protect their locations by entering into legal and binding agreements with location owners. In this fashion they will at least have some surety of retaining the locations they worked so hard to maintain during the war. These locations will act as the backbone for the new equipment they will buy.

This is the time to prepare. Those men who haven't formerly paid much attention to this suggestion should do so now. The post-war period is drawing nearer every day.

The average man in this industry realizes that the competition which will enter this field will be much keener and of greater power, because of larger financial investment, than he has ever before been faced with.

Protect locations by legal agreement and by better service and greater courtesy than ever before. And when arranging for agreements be sure to obtain a new commission basis - 30% to the location - 70% to the operator. That's real protection for the post-war period.

# THE RECORD SITUATION

Since The Cash Box first courageously stepped forth, in an effort to help bring about some cure for the present inequitable distribution of records to this coin operated music machines industry, a great many facts have been brought to light in regard to the present record situation.

One of the most important is that the average music coinman believes that the record manufacturers are more interested in the future home market, because they believe that the home field will be the greatest consumer of their merchandise, than they are in him at present or for the future.

This belief is based on the fact that phono-radio combinations were being sold in ever increasing volume to the homes as the war started. The demand for such combinations for post-war is claimed to be so great that there is every possibility there may be more of these found in homes than ever before in history.

This, the average coin machines music man claims, is the reason for the neglect of the automatic music man and the greater attention being paid to the retail outlets that sell to home owners.

The present rate of records purchased by automatic music men, conservatively based on the fact that instead of 450,000 phonos that were supposed to be in operation when the war started there are now only 350,000 in operation thruout the country, and that the average operator buys (or rather, would like to buy) five new records per phono per week; this would mean that 1,750,000 records per week are ready for purchase by this industry today.

With the general belief thruout the trade at the present time that there will eventually be over 1,000,000 automatic phono outlets in operation post-war, this will mean that approximately 5,000,000 records per week will be purchased by the music men of this industry.

The record situation today requires more equitable distribution. The record manufacturers have not given this industry proper consideration. Their sudden greed for a home market whose future is entirely ethereal, overemphasized and exaggerated has created this unfair and inquitable distribution.

They are not only neglecting the present - but also the future of this industry. They are not even trying to correctly remedy the situation now existant thruout the nation. They have not offered to meet with the leading coinmen and come to some agreement for equitable distribution. They are, instead, raising the ire of the men in this business to such a point that they will find themselves saddled with unnecessary and probably vicious competition.

It is therefore up to the record manufacturers to decide whether this industry which uses such a large percentage of the records they manufacture at this time, and will use many, many times that amount when the post-war era gets into full swing, is worthy of their closer attendance and better consideration.

# MFRS READY TO GO AHEAD

in this industry are prepared to enter into production the moment they are given the green light to go ahead.

This can be answered with a very decided and definite affirmative. Not only are the manufacturers prepared but they have, in most cases, planned well and logically for a revival of their former products production.

There is no doubt anymore, as most coinmen know, that many great machines will appear in the post-war period. This may not happen within the first few months after production again gets under way, but it will become apparent as the months go by.

The average manufacturer is wondering how the governmental agencies will decide on the return to domestic production. If the decision is made to allow the most neces-

sary consumer industries to return to production first, then there is no doubt that this trade will be far down at the bottom of the list.

But if WPB, or whatever government agency will make the decision, decides that a return to production will be gauged by the number of people an industry can employ immediately, so as to stymie the unemployment period which is bound to follow the finish of the European war, then there is every belief that most of the manufacturers in this industry will be back in production with the very first of the durable goods producers.

The average manufacturer is prepared to enter into production of the equipment for which he is best known almost immediately. Or rather, just as soon as he can obtain the materials and permission from WPB.

It is also believed that the average manufacturer will, to get back into the swing of production, probably build that product which won most comment and stood up best during this war period. Some will probably start right off with the last machine manufactured. Others may build a combination of two or more units, and may probably feature an entirely new cabinet and some other improvements which were made manifest during this war period.

But as far as the manufacturers are concerned, they are not only ready to swing back into production of their former products, but are more than eager to do so immediately they receive the green light to go ahead.

#### MUSIC MEN WANT TAX COUNCIL It is interesting to travel about the country and to learn that the greatest demand

of this industry for the future is music. Trade leaders everywhere bring this out most prominently.

Most are of the belief that there will be somewhere around a dozen manufacturers of music equipment. And that music will be the leading field of this industry immediately after the war and for years thereafter.

Leaders therefore believe that it is up to the men in this business to clear the way for tomorrow's music. They claim that a special music tax council should now be created to watch the tax bills that are being presented in many communities thruout the nation.

They explain that this new taxation on wall and bar boxes is opening a new path to the revenue grabbers. They believe that tho some of the tax bugs are at present asking but \$1 and \$2 per wall or bar box yearly license that this, if not halted now, will grow to many, many times that amount in the future. They also feel that the demand by so many tax makers to obtain \$50. per year per phono may somewhat affect the rapid growth predicted for the music field.

To help clear the way for the music of tomorrow, these men believe, a tax council should be created in the music machines field which will study every bill introduced and which will be able to give good advice and counsel to all music men who may suddenly befaced with exorbitant tax demands.

At the same time, they claim, a tax council would be able to gather together much information which would prove of tremendous value to all the field. Such a council would also be able to help the men to better understand all personal and business tax ramifications and save them large amounts on their income tax, too.

In addition to this special music tax council, is the need for a body of the leaders in this field to make a complete study of it for better public relations effort so as to offset any serious matters which may arise in the future. These two organizations could work hand in hand.

A special music tax council and a public relations bureau for this field may come into being much sooner than expected if the plans of certain leaders in this industry are placed into effect. The need grows greater constantly. The members of the music trade should make it their business to help clear the way for these necessities.

Many also believe that these bureaus should first be created from among the manufacturers and distributors because these men know the field so much better than do local operators. They have all the national and local facts at hand and would be able to give such organizations a good and proper start to success. "Talking Out Loud

## FLOOD OF NEW VENDERS POST-WAR

#### Trade Buzzes About Boom In Beverage, Frosted Foods, Cigarette, Candy And Many Other Type Venders

NEW YORK—Thruout manufacturing circles in the trade there is much conjecture at this time regarding the possible return to automatic merchandisers, post-war, on a greater scale than ever before known to this industry.

The word has spread to distributors, jobbers and operators. Tho these men aren't as enthused as are certain manufacturers, regarding these new post-war merchandisers, they are still keeping close touch with the situation.

The gossip in the trade is to the effect that some of the nation's largest industrialists will be found in the automatic merchandising machines picture when the war is over.

There will be beverage dispensers of all types. There will be large automatic frozen food venders (as reported in this past week's issue of The Cash Box) and there will also be many other types of refrigerated vending machines.

The old stand-bys, cigarette, candy, gum, etc., will appear in new modernized and highly styled vending machines which, it is generally believed, will create an entirely new era of merchandising for these products.

But thruout all these stories there runs an undercurrent of belief that the average manufacturer is interested in selling his vender in conjunction with some nationally known product, or to the manufacturer of that product.

For example, there is a belief prevalent at this time that certain beverage firms, who are close on the heels of Coca-Cola, will announce venders of their own. Possibly along the lines of the Coca-Cola bottle machine.

The belief is also that eventually, to make the beverage dispenser successful, it will have to feature a variety of three or more kinds of drinks.

Also interesting is the fact that refrigerated venders of all types to vend every known sort of merchandise which requires refrigeration will appear on the market.

Many noted coinmen are of the belief that the larger merchandisers will not be offered to the trade. They feel that these may go thru the wholesaling outlets of those new manufacturers who will enter into this field.

They also believe that the present operators will not want to invest heavily in such equipment. They claim the profits are too small in comparison to the investment.

Therefore, the consensus seems to be, that tho there will be a boom the first few years after the war in automatic merchandisers of all types, that this boom will be directed at new blood, and that much new blood is sure to enter into this industry because of these machines.

LOUIS, MO. — Joining whole-heartedly into the effort The Cash Box is making to gain more equi-table distribution of records for coin operated music machines men, Carl Trippe of Ideal Novelty Company, this city, one of the nation's leading distributors sent a complete file of correspondence to The Cash Box to prove that he could not get any action to the protest that he had made to Capitol Records regarding paying someone named Johnny Traum \$1.00 each for these records. someone named Johnny

Carl wrote the following letter to P. A. Brunswick of Capitol Records Distributing Co., Inc., Chicago:

"Why don't you stop beating around the bush and answer the questions we ask you?

"1. Why don't you answer our question about Johnny Traum who comes in here and wants \$1.00 each for records?

"2. Are we, who are in the phonograph business, supposed to pay re-tail prices for records? Everybody else sells us at wholesale.

"Answer us again. We want to

show the letter to our phonograph association and have it read at the next meeting. In fact, we would rather have you address the letter direct to the phonograph association.

The only letter Carl has been able to obtain from Capitol has been a regular form asking that he fill this out to apply for trade prices and also advising him that because of shortage of records no new 'dealers" were being created.

But, the big answer that Carl wants, and what everyone else in the trade wants to know, is how such people as "Johnny Traum" come into the coin machines music picture and can ask music operators to pay \$1.00 each for records?

This, again, is an example of what the music machines operator is go-ing thru these days. This is the time the record manufacturers, such for as Capitol Records, to come into the open and explain these methods as well as arrange for more equitable distribution of their product to the operators who helped put them in the limelight.

In 1929 he was appointed a Justice of the Peace in the City of Baltimore by the late Governor Albert C. Ritchie. He served in this capacity for four years, until he moved his family to Washington, D. C.

He is the owner of the Hirsh Intercommunication Systems. He also owns a finance firm in Baltimore, Md.

He was commissioned by the Army and Navy to buy coin ma-chine venders for the Waves and Wacs. He has just again been commissioned by the armed services to buy coin operated equipment for shipment overseas.

The Hirsh Coin Machine Company have built up a very extensive export department and the firm holds an Export License from the Custom House in Washington.

Here, again, is a crying need for a Public Relations Bureau in this industry which would instantly send trained men to such cities for consultation with the press and authorities so that such harmful publicity would be halted quickly.
