"The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round" by Bill Gersh

"IN UNITY THERE IS STRENGTH"

It was with great pleasure that The Cash Box learned that the manufacturers had decided to meet in Chicago in an effort to conceive, and if possible, create an organization whereby this entire industry would be united under one banner. This medium has proposed this for so long a time that the possibility of it actually happening left it more or less breathless with expectation.

Behind the scenes, which is the theme of the report The Cash Box writes about this meeting to evade the prosaic generality of a common and usual report, there is now a movement afoot, among leading manufacturers, to appoint an outstanding man as "General Manager" for the organization which the manufacturers hope to create. This would be the culmination of the fondest hopes that all students of this trade have had for many years.

A general manager for the manufacturers' organization would be able to bring to the fore the need for much greater effort than has ever before been demonstrated by any association in this industry. There are so many, many problems facing this industry today, and especially for tomorrow, that only the one word "unity" can cover the need that is so widely apparent.

For example, taxation is growing with leaps and bounds everywhere in the country. Some sort of National Tax Council must come into being to help the trade to offset this menace. The manufacturers, by creating a single, solid organization may, because of their power to obtain and ascertain the facts, make this a part and parcel of their own organization; having in that organization someone who will work with the men of this industry to help them with tax problems.

The Cash Box is therefore elated, and even enthused, over the possibility that the manufacturers have come together to form a national organization. The Cash Box believes that such an organization would be most logical for this business from more than one standpoint. These are the men who deal, not only with the problems that cover the heads of this industry, but also with the very basic problems necessary to the continued good and welfare of all concerned with this trade. They are in the most logical position to do this industry the most good.

There are so many other things which the manufacturers, as a single and solid group can do for this trade, that to attempt to enumerate them would necessitate endless pages. The fact that a School for Coin Machine Mechanics has become a crying need is something that a manufacturers' organization could place into action instantly. And this is not all. What about a Credit Bureau? What about complete interpretations of all the present and future WPB regulations, and also OPA orders? And what about the hundreds of other problems that persist in arising daily?

The very fact that behind the scenes of this meeting there was a most sincere and earnest desire to get together, and even to finance a single and solid coin machine manufacturers' organization, is sufficient proof of itself that this trade has reached that stage where it seeks greater progress for the future.

TThe manufacturers, not only because they are faced with certain government demands that they come to them as a unified industry, but also because they realize that as a loose and disbanded group they are losing much value to themselves, are today ready to get together because they now know that value is certain to accrue to them where unity is assured.

The trade is all set for such unity of action, and of purpose. It needs the manufacturers as a complete group. It requires that the manufacturers join themselves together into a National Board of Trade. Such action will assure them better relationships for the future with all concerned.

The post-war world has already started into action. It is a new kind of world. It is the kind of world many have dreamt of for years. It means the beginning of

better business for all men generally. This can only become so if all the divisions of this trade, too, recognize the need to ally themselves into a unit that will make certain of future progress.

The Cash Box is therefore, at the very last second, removing the editorial which it had scheduled for this issue and, instead, replacing this with a dedication to the manufacturers who see the need for a national body so that this industry will have the one great group it has always needed to assure its post-war progress.

There is no manufacturer in this industry today who will state that without unity there is strength. It is admitted that each and every man is an entity in himself. And that each and every man who comprises this industry is also a rugged individualist. But, what does this all mean when government agencies demand that this industry appear before them as a unified whole?

The smallest operator and the largest distributor pray for complete unification. All feel its need. All know what it means to this trade to be assured such an organization for their future welfare. Everyone believes, too, that this business will only grow great when unified action is placed behind each and every move that is made by this trade.

Perhaps there are thousands upon thousands of words that can be written about this move of the trade's manufacturers, who have at last decided to come together, not only for their own good, but for the good of all this industry, to create a single, solid, national organization which will, once and for all time, bring about what all the members of this industry have wanted for so many years.

Perhaps, too, it would be best for everyone in this trade to allow themselves plenty of time to see what will happen as a direct result of this meeting. But, this is the second such meeting on the part of the manufacturers, and therefore, it is hoped, this will be the time when the ideas and ideals expressed will show a logical and conclusive result.

Everywhere in this nation, at this present time, there is a demand that this industry get together. And why not? Is this or is this not an industry? Is this again something that must be hushed up, passed up and quieted down? Or will the men who are earning their livelihood from this business at last come to the front and realize that only by the creation of an organization that will most completely represent their interests are they assured of what they want and need for tomorrow?

In unity there is strength. And in unity there is also that progressiveness which accounts for much more than strength when the fate of an entire industry is at stake. There does not have to be 100% representation to bring about the creation of an organization. There does not have to be 100% agreement to all the tenets that will eventually formulate that organization. There isn't that sort of agreement at the peace conference in San Francisco. And there won't be in this industry.

But that, in itself, is the sure sign of progress. The very fact that there will always be men who will contest certain proposals means that there will always be constructive criticism to assure the men of this industry that there will be nothing railroaded thru the channels of this trade. There must be those staunch independents. And there must also be those men who will most completely and unselfishly, and with complete faith, work for the betterment of the trade, even if the finances come from their own pockets. But, in the long run, these will be the men to whom all this industry will pay great homage.

RECOGNITION DUE INDUSTRY FOR WAR WORK

Among all the industries in the nation that instantly and voluntarily complied with the request to give up former products production and plunge into war work, this coin operated machines industry deserves outstanding recognition.

This is the only industry which has not listed the many war products it has manufactured in aggregate volume as well as in dollar and cents value. It has not listed the huge numbers of employees it has on its payrolls. It has not brought before the public the honors it has received from the Army and Navy and from all other government sources.

Such information is of extreme value to the trade. It would help to bring about better public relations for this industry were the mothers and fathers of this nation to know the extent of the war work program of this industry. There is no doubt that this would create a kindlier feeling toward the equipment of this business.

The manufacturers, because of their many brilliant war work achievements have actually covered this industry with glory. Their war work has won the praise of many of the nation's leaders. They have produced in such volume, that on a comparative basis, this industry ranks among the nation's war work leaders. Therefore this trade should receive its full and due recognition for this great effort.

It is the fond hope of The Cash Box that the manufacturers will compile a list of their war products. At least those products which the Army and Navy will agree they can publicly list, and add to this list those items which they also manufactured and which they can list as "X" products.

It would also be to the advantage of this trade were the manufacturers to list the financial value of these products. The these figures can now be obtained in Washington, after much research, such a listing at this time, directly from the manufacturers themselves, in compliance with all provisions of the various government agencies, would even surprise this industry itself, and certainly the public generally. The amount is sure to run into many millions of dollars.

The importance of this great war work effort on the future of this industry and its resultant strengthening effect on the trade's future industrial role is not to be overlooked. Here is something which definitely lends itself to the first truly great public relations effort for this industry as a whole. This is something of which this industry can be proud and which will, at the same time gain it great acclaim.

This recognition for its war work is something which this industry richly deserves. It will tremendously help to raise the level of this trade to a plane consistent with its accomplishments. Therefore to overlook this opportunity would be a grave loss. It is the hope of The Cash Box that the manufacturers and all others connected with this business who have done war work will plunge into this effort and bring to the fore the tremendous amount of work already done.

There are many thruout the nation who have been working quietly for sometime in their own small factories doing important jobs for the war effort. For example, there is a former jobber in Brooklyn who, for the past three years, has been completely engaged in war work in his own place with his own machinery. There is another jobber in Singac, N.J., who for the past two years has been doing war work only. There is a well known operator in Indianapolis who turned his place into a small war plant. A noted distributor in Cleveland has his own war plant. A former distributor in New York has a marvelous war factory.

The same can be said for dozens of unlisted others thruout the country. These, added to the total of what the larger, better known manufacturers have accomplished, would help make for one of the most impressive war work records from a financial and volume standpoint that any industry would be tremendously proud to present.

This war work record added to the future potentials of this industry, such as an estimated national payroll, number of employees, number of families dependent on this trade for a livlihood, would prove of immeasureable value to this business. In addition the estimated total investment risk in this industry, broken down to operator, jobber, distributor and manufacturer segments, and then totalled as a whole, would also be sure to prove impressive to all the nation.

For example, the estimated net worth of the phonograph division of this industry alone in 1939 was around the \$80,000,000.00 mark. These are Government figures by authority of the Department of Commerce. This gives the trade some idea of what the grand total for this trade can run into when all divisions are gathered together into one solid whole.

All this is only a partial idea of what this great war work effort, now that it draws to a close, can mean for this industry if all the members of this trade and especially the public are fully acquainted with it. It is the hope of The Cash Box to publish these figures in the near future in a form whereby they can be openly displayed by everyone in this business.

Such figures and facts would prove of grand value to all. Newspapers and many others who never miss an opportunity to smash away at this business might give momentary pause when they note what this industry has done to help the war effort and what this trade means to the welfare of many thousands of people thruout the nation.

Here is something so valuable that it simply should not be overlooked at this time as the possibility of war work ceasing becomes an assured fact. Before people forget, when domestic production and the post-war period gets under way, is the time to present the facts and figures to gain the recognition for its war efforts which this industry so richly deserves.

Let us, therefore, all of us, make it our business to help obtain these facts and figures on what this coin operated machines industry has accomplished for the war effort and what this industry means to many thousands of people thruout this nation, so that these figures can be publicly reported for the benefit of this business as a whole.

OPA CONSIDERS SHIFT FROM MPR-429 BACK TO GMPR

NEW YORK — Tremendously important to all the trade is the possible switch now being considered by the Office of Price Administration from the present Maximum Price Regulation No. 429, which was put into effect for this industry September 1, 1943, back to the General Maximum Price Regulation, the basic regulation written for all industries and based on prices as of March, 1942.

As soon as this becomes fact many of the problems now confronting certain coinmen may be cured. At present this trade is laboring under two clashing restrictions in the MPR-429 and the GMPR. Wholesalers continue to sell and buy under GMPR when they sell or buy for "re-sale". They sell under MPR-429 when they sell to operators or "consumers" as the operator was interpreted by OPA sometime ago.

The difficulties of operating under these two widely divergent regulations was apparent to members of OPA who are in charge of this industry. They realized that at one moment an operator could be considered a "wholesaler" and the next a "consumer" and that the price variations were so great, in most instances, that the trade would be operating at a loss. The belief is therefore general that placing the trade back under the GMPR will cure this problem and thereby effect better control.

(There are also many who believe that within 30 to 90 days after V-E day there may be even further relief for non-essential industries. This is in keeping with the belief that OPA will revoke many restrictions on free movement of trade to offset any possible unemployment which may occur during the adjustment and the following post-war period.)

"TALKING OUT LOUD"

LIFTED CONTROLS PEP UP TRADE

WPB Lifts Restrictions on 65 Items. Revives "Spot Authorization" Program for Civilian Goods Production. 40 War Controls Revoked by WLB. Orders limiting Civilian Manufacturing Scheduled for Scrap Heap. WPB to "Eliminate restrictive controls on business as rapidly as war conditions permit." Steel, Copper and Aluminum Still Critical, WPB Reports.

WASHINGTON — With conversion reports emanating from WPB, WLB and other government agencies with machine gunlike rapidity, the coin machine trade was greatly pepped up this past week.

Many lenders with the conversion of the conv

Many leaders believe that these actions on the part of the War Production and War Labor Boards are the first glimmerings of the go-ahead signal to all the nation's industries, especially in areas where labor and materials are obtainable and which are therefore applicable to the "spot authorization" program of WPB.

authorization" program of WPB. The auto industry bas already been given the go-ahead signal on construction of tools and obtaining of steel under an AA-3 priority rating. The auto men believe that they will require at least 1,250,000 tons of steel, but feel that this will be available. This means, they claim, that new cars may be seen by Fall, 1945.

The impetus given domestic production was so great that many noted manufacturers have already rushed to Washington, and just as many are in conference with their local WPB and WLB directors to ascertain just when and how they will be able to return to domestic products production.

Newark N. I. was given a

Newark, N. J. was given a good break by its local WPB director who reported that those factories which had been cutback on war production could now seek to get back into at least partial domestic products manufacture under the "spot authorization" plan. He believed that materials and labor would be available.

The textile industry was the only trade set back. They have been told that the Army and vavy will need everything they can produce. Their return to domestic manufacture is therefore held up for sometime.

Thruout all the lifted controls no mention was made of coin operated machines of any kind. This sort of dampened the glee that was at first apparent thruont the trade. The further fact that James A. Krug, Chairman of WPB, announced that steel, copper and aluminum are still on the critical list, also tended to bold down coinmen's elation.

These three metals are vital in the construction of coin ma-

These three metals are vital in the construction of coin machines. But with the possibility that Army and Navy requirements of these metals may soon be cut down, this industry, too, may see some glimmerings of possible production in certain types of equipment, provided that further controls are lifted as promised by WLB and WPB within the next few days. OPA is still to be heard from in regard to the lifting of controls so that manufacturers can go shead.

NEW PHONO RECORD PLAN ACCLAIMED

Music Ops Want Record Mfrs To Adopt Plan Immediately.

Acclaim Special Labels and Separate Sales Organizations as

Logical Answer to Record Distribution Problems.

NEW YORK — Long distance phone ealls, telegrams and special delivery letters acclaiming the plan, proposed by Tbe Cash Box in this past week's issue in its "Coin Machines Merry-Go-Ronnd" section, began to arrive early this past week, and continued to come in in ever increasing quantity all week long.

Everywhere in the music trade there was enthusiasm for this new plan. Simple in scope, it would involve slight change on the part of the present record manufacturers. Such change would be sure to bring about more equitable distribution of records to music men, provided the manufacturers are just as anxious as they claim, to see to it that the music industry receives fair and equitable distribution.

The proposal was: 1) that only the color of the present labels be changed by the record manufacturers so that these special colored labels would be recognized everywhere in the music trade as used only on records for juke box sales; 2) that separate organizations be created within the present record firms to exclusively handle sales and distribution of records to the juke box industry.

The lifting of controls gives credence to the editorial which appeared in last week's (May 8 issue) of The Cash Box, "The Post-War Period Is Here". This editorial urged coinmen to consider themselves already in the post-war era and to aet accordingly.

Announcement of the termination of the war in Europe may come at any moment. In fact, even while this article is on the presses. Should this happen, James A. Krng reports that his agency will be ready to lift even more restrictions. This will bring about at least 15% domestic products manufacture and within the 4 periods designated to follow, will increase by 5% for each period, until all controls are abandoned.

As controls are lifted, the industry is urged to take it easy by leaders of the trade and to await official announcements from coin machine factories as to further developments. Manufacturers have men contacting the government agencies and will make announcements regarding return to coin machine manufacture just as soon as this becomes possible.

This would once and for all time put a halt to any complaints regarding inequitable record distribution and unfair treatment of the juke box operator.

The "big 3" manufacturers of the record business, namely, Decca, Victor and Columbia, are urged to adopt this new plan.

At the same time, these manufacturers, because they are supposed to be designating a fair and equitable share of the records they manufacture for the juke box industry could also manufacture special records decidedly only for juke boxes. This industry can use many special types of recordings which would win great play for the phonos. This would prove of great value to the record manufacturers.

Since the trade feels that this proposal by The Cash Box will help bring about a solution to the present distribution problem, by the creation of special colored labels for this industry and special organizations to handle this industry's business—it is up to the record manufacturers to answer this request.

The use of special colored labels for the juke box industry would eliminate a great many present arguments from coinmen who claim that record distributors advise them they have no records from their factories and that the best thing the music coinman can do is get out to dime stores, dry goods emporiums, smoke shops, etc., and bny whatever he can get for whatever price he bas to pay.

It is a well known fact today

It is a well known fact today that thrnout the nation anywhere from 75% to 90% of the records used by phono coinmen are purchased from retail stores, at retail prices, regardless of the fact that most of the operators are designated as "dealers".

If the factories are playing ball with this industry, as they claim, then should a juke box operator come across a hardware store where records with the colored label of the juke hox trade are being sold, he would then know (and so would the record manufacturer) where these records, which the manufacturer claims are supposed to be going to juke box coinmen, are actually sold. This would cure one of the real problems facing the record manufacturers.



MFRS MEET TO UNIFY FOR POST-WAR

Appoint Planning Committee. Seek to Bring All Divisions of Industry Under One Banner. Stress Need for Complete Trade Representation Before Government Agencies.

CHICAGO, April 30 - What was one of the most progressive attempts to create a unified group among all the divisions of this industry, occurred this evening in the Crystal Room of the Sherman Hotel when the trade's leading manufacturers came together in an effort to arrange for a program whereby they would have complete trade representation before all government agencies so that their reconversion program could get started as soon as possible.

Aside from just reconversion, which includes the obtaining of materials, machinery, easing of labor restrictions, revocation of WPB and OPA orders, the manufacturers eagerly seek to join themselves together as a single group for the general welfare of all this industry.

There is already a movement afoot among some of the leading manufacturers to arrange for the services of a General Manager. Two names are outstanding. It is hoped that one of these will be chosen and made known to the trade so that an active, working manager will bend every effort to bring about unification of all divisions of this industry.

Any complete report of this meeting, the various speeches made, etc., would only recall a similar meet to get this entire industry together into a strong organization, or a 3 and of Trade, held at Groetchen's Restaurant some months ago. Rather than go into a complete report, the behind the scenes action, as a result of this meet, are most important to the trade.

There is a sincere desire, behind the scenes, for all the divisions of this industry to come together as a single, solid unit. Those leading manufacturers who have already offered to make financial donations are leading the way for the creation of such a body. The amusement machines factories want the music and merchandise manufacturers to enter into this organization with them.


At this meet some of the music and merchandiser manufacturers were present. Prectically everyone of the amusement factories were represented. It can be liberally stated that about 80% of the industry's manufacturers attended. Some wired in and others wrote in regarding the formation of an organization. Most outstanding in this regard is the letter Dennis W. Donohue, executive vice-president of Mills Industries, Inc., wrote to Dave Gottlieb. (This letter is repeated in this issue for the odification of all readers.)

What is most important is the fact that there now exists a sincere effort on the part of a great many leading factories to get together into an organization that will, once and for all time, unify this entire industry. Such an organization could become a National CMI Board of Trade. This organization would be in a position to help all coinmen because of its power to gather and ascertain the true facts in all cases.

The committee appointed at this meeting, and in which some of the most outstanding men in this industry are engaged, it is sincerely hoped, will come forth with great plans for the future welfare of all this trade. Those men have much thrust upon them.

All the industry should therefore band together at this time to help gather whatever information may be required by this committee to enable it to present facts and figures to all government agencies for the benefit of this business. This is the time for all engaged in this trade to get back of this attempt by the manufacturers to group themselves together into a single and solid unit for the future welfare of this industry.

LETTER TO GOTTLIEB ON ASSN

The following letter was received by Dave Gottlieb from Dennis W. Donohue, Executive Vice-President of Mills Industries, Inc., who was suddenly called away and did not attend the above meeting. The letter was read by Mr. Gottlieb to the assembly and won much good somment. It is repeated here in full for it points the way to the future for all now engaged in this industry.

"Those in the industry will readily recall the situation in which we found ourselves at the start of 1933 when the National Recovery Act was passed. The industry in the years preceding 1933 had grown numerically, but no concerted effort had ever been made to bring it together and create a trade association from which all would benefit equally. But when the necessity faced us we did get together, organized and were successful in promoting:

"1. A fine, friendly relationship between the manufacturers and the industry. "2. An industry code, a bigger and better yearly convention, and for a period of years we were able to successfully combat unfair licensing and tax legislation.

"Since the start of the war there has not been any opportunity or need for a trade association, but I believe the time is now ripe for the industry to get together and intelligently plan and work for the future of the industry.

"It can be truly said that every member of the industry is on his toes and is keeping track of trends and regulations, and that each member of the industry is naturally interested in converting to his own products as quickly after V-E day as possible. It would seem, therefore, that the first thing to analyze is whether the individual manufacturer can accomplish as much by himself as could be accomplished by the entire industry banding together. My opinion is that we can accomplish much more together.

"There is nothing unique in this thought as practically every industry of any size is following the same thought. Recently we learned that the automotive industry thru their association has established the essential need for automobiles and expectation is that they will produce two million cars the first year after the war. This group has succeeded in having a Task Committee appointed by WPB to study their specific problem in connection with the production of motor cars. Another thing worth noting, on account of the progress they have made to date, is the refrigeration industry. In fact, it would be possible to name many more industries who, thru proper organization, carefull planning and right representation have been successful in getting their products up toward the top of the list for release immediately after V-E day. Chairman James A. Krug of the War Production Board has announced that the plans which have been approved for the automotive industry will be followed with releases for other industries.

"Now, these things just don't happen; they are the result of careful industry planning. All of us will recall September and October of 1944. Everyone has a definition of what was going to be called "essential". WPB and OPA set up Advisory Committees and plans were made for further cooperation between Government and industry, but the war took a change and the whole thing was abandoned. I do not think, therefore, that it is to be believed that Government again will take the initiative: I believe



that it is up to industry to take the initiative and this, of course, puts it right back into our laps. What are we going to do about it?

"For the purpose of discussion I suggest the following: 1) That a committee be appointed from the industry with each division of the industry represented on the committee. 2) That the committee be financed thru voluntary contributions from the whole industry. 3) That the committee be empowered to formulate a plan which will embrace the following: (2) Presentation of industry plans for reconversion to WPB. (b) Distribution to the industry of digests covering interpretations of WPB regulations now in effect and the continuing digests and interpretations of new regulations as they are issued. (c) Analyses of digests and interpretations of OPA regulations.

"In order to accomplish a plan of this kind, it would be necessary, of course, that the committee employ a full time secretary. I do not believe the employment of legal talent either at Washington or at Chicago will secure for us the results we seek. The job must be done by the industry itself and I think this can be very well accomplished after a proper committee is appointed and a proper plan made. I firmly believe that if all of us will adopt the belief that our industry is just as essential and important to the welfare of the country as any other industry and follow that thought with intelligent planning, we will be one of the first to effect reconversion."
