



Three years fly hurriedly by. Even tho these past three years have been somewhat discolored, as far as normal business conditions are concerned, by the greatest war this nation has ever fought, and is still fighting, they have opened an entirely new vista as to the greatness and permanence of this coin operated machines industry.

Few believed, at the inception of this weekly medium, that this industry would outlast the war. There were some who had arranged plans to close out their businesses. Others who felt that the demands of this war would force every man in this trade either into the armed services or into essential war industry. The fact that this business outlasted these dour predictions, is alone proof of its greatness and its place in the American way of life.

It is the belief of The Cash Box, therefore, that its many predictions have been proved true. Each of these was openly reported to the trade. The Cash Box has continued to have faith in this industry and hasn't wavered from this faith for a moment. It believes that all the great things which this industry has already seen will seem but picayune to what greatness will accrue to it after this war is over and and the post-war years are well under way.

This industry faces its greatest future - tomorrow. It has learned to respect itself because of its dynamic earning power. It has come to realize its importance as an entortainment factor. It now knows its value as a merchandising force. It is certain it can continue to offer service equipment of such new cast and variety that all industry will look up to it with great respect. Its music has becon a byword thruout the nation. Everywhere in the country the words "juke box" are well accepted. And gradually these words are assuming the important status to be included in the dictionaries of the future. Much growth, and progress, and greatness faces this indus-try for tomorrow - but only for those who will continue to have faith in it.

A great and noticeable change has come over the same people in this trade who formerly believed that this industry had seen its best days. These are the very men who are already planning for, and predicting, the greatness of its future. Some of these are men, who disappeared from the ranks of this trade when the demands of war became so great that it seemed very few, if any businesses would outlive it. But today these men look forth upon a field where the possibilities are practically limitless.

It is well known to those men who remained at their posts, and who have been more than pleased with this choice, that The Cash Box came into being because it foresaw that a new type of medium was needed by this trade, especially while the war was in progress, to keep the members of this industry completely informed.

The Cash Box was created as a confidential and speedy weekly medium using First Class mailing. It allows the men of this field a complete interchange of news and ideas. Just what was needed in every sector of the nation. Not only has this worked out to true fulfillment, but the very fact that this medium has grown to its present proportions, definitely indicates that this business has always wanted a true, fearexclusively devoted to its own best less and confidential trade medium of its own interests,

The Cash Box has worked hard in a sincere endeavor to help bring greatness to this industry. It has made many suggestions which have met with the approval of all the trade. For example: the proposal that a "National Board of Trade" be created. Such a board to include all the various elements of this industry. And thereby arrange for a common meeting ground for every division of this business. A place where all could meet and discuss the general needs of the field. This has met with complete approval of all tho members of this industry who are interested in secing greater progress result for this business, and who know that such progress is dependent upon the most complete cooperation of all elements of this field.

A "School for Coin Machine Mechanics" was also proposed, and met with complete and instant approval of the trade. Many manufacturers are planning such schools right in their own factories in the post-war era. They roalize that their oquipment is more sure of better acceptance thruout the trade if mechanics have complete knowledge of this equipment. This is certainly a lot botter than just sending out equipment helter-skelter and allowing it to be judged in some haphazard manner by men who little understand it. All this is today considered one of the resultants of the terrific and constant battle which this medium made to help benefit the future of this great industry. It continues to urge that this highly specialized trade create a "School for Coin Machine Mechanics" for its own future welfare.

A "National Tax Council" was proposed because such a council is of outstanding necessity to this business. All in this trade now realize this to be one of the very greatest needs. Every day, somewhere in the nation, some community is inequitably taxing coin operated equipment by discriminatory license fees. Not only are the local coinmen hurt by such actions, but the whole industry suffers, for such news rapidly spreads among politicos and the result is that taxation continues to grow with leaps and bounds. It hurts everyone engaged in this business. A "National Tax Council" is of utmost necessity. The Cash Box will continue to urge that such a council be created until one of good value does come into being.

Then there was the proposal that this industry arrange for a "National Credit Bureau". This is now very important. When the new equipment comes into being there will be a great need for new credit arrangements thruout the trade. Men who would be sure of operating or wholesaling success may be held down to low ebb unless some sort of credit organization can vouch for them. This "National Credit Bureau" is therefore needed by this trade for more than one reason. The number of finance firms now catering to this business is enough reason in itself that such an organization c^ome into being as rapidly as possible. The present coinman must be protected and must also be assured an era of continued prosperity.

All these, and the many other proposals by The Cash Box urged upon this industry in the past three years, are only equalled by the work which has already been accomplished by this medium. For example: The Cash Box first brought to light the fact that automatic phonos could operate after the midnight curfew hour. This met with great and instant acclaim. Thousands of reprints of the letter from WMC Chairman Paul V. McNutt, which first appeared in The Cash Box, were mailed all over the nation by enthusiastic coinmen and manufacturers.

This has only been eclipsed by the work which The Cash Box has done quietly and confidentially with the Office of Price Administration. The report that this industry would be removed from MPR-429 and would again be placed completely under the GMPR was first printed here. In due time, it is the belief of The Cash Box, coin controlled equipment will be completely exempted from further price control. (The coin machine has always had the best automatic price control - the coin chute. Officials of OPA are today well acquainted with this fact.)

The fight to gain more equitable record distribution to the automatic music machine men is still being carried on fearlessly and courageously by The Cash Box, regardless of the loss of advertising revenue which this entails. The Cash Box made it a policy right from its very inception not to be subsidized. It will never be subsidized. It would much rather bow its head if this trade is willing to allow for subsidization to rule it, instead of catering to the truth. This medium will continue to present the truth with the same sort of fearlessness with which our forefathers pioneered this nation.

This record battle will continue. It will go on until an equitable distribution plan is evolved by the outstanding record manufacturers to assure the music machines division of this industry that it will be able to continuo the great progress it made when the war brought this growth to a temporary halt, by giving it the number of records it needs on the basis it deservos.

The Cash Box will continue to fight against open-to- the public publication of the prices of the equipment of this trade. This has been known to knock out one good operator after another from locations he could ill afford to lose. This must stop. This industry's prices for equipment, and its inner workings, must be kept as much a trade secret as the inner working of other businesses. The men who sell directly to locations must be eliminated. Otherwise this business will be forced to stop its growth right where it is at this moment. All must join in this work. All realize how important this is to their future welfare. All know that only The Cash Box has made it its policy to keep the inner workings of this industry extremely confidential.

This industry must also eliminate from its ranks the "deposit-grabber". And the type of individual who enters into this business to make a quick gain and then leave

as fast as he can run. These are the kind of persons who bring black eyes to this trade. And these black-eyes are hard to eradicate. The Cash Box fearlessly came to the front in the case of the "deposit-grabber" (a designation of its own) and also in the case of the lewd and filthy film user, brought about by the new peek machines, to crash these men off the map of this industry. It still believes that a few exist here and there, but that the majority have been frightened back into their rat holes.

The Cash Box does not, and never will, set itself up as a crusader. It feels that this trade needs and wants an exclusive medium of its own. It will continue its fight to give this trade the sort of fearless and confidential medium that it wants and needs. To do so it will continue to offer constructive criticism and propose cures for whatever evils may exist, or suddenly appear, in the trade. It will continue to help guide the men in this industry to the best of its ability. It will fight for what is right, for what is true, for what will bring progress and recognition and respect, and let the chips fall where they may.

The manufacturers, at their last meet in Chicago, were most completely supported by The Cash Box. This medium realizes that these leaders getting together into a single and solid unit will be of tremendous benefit to this industry. Such a unit could more rapidly bring about the culmination of a great many constructive ideas. They could arrange for plans which would take years for others to complete and place into execution.

The Cash Box pulled off its front "Cointoon", and dedicated this page to the manufacturers who had so progressively come together for so outstanding a purpose. In fact, it devoted most of its editorial section to this great plan for complete union of all the manufacturing elements of this industry. It eagerly waits to hear further from the manufacturers that this union is at last a completed and long desired fact.

The fact that The Cash Box is better read than any other medium that ever existed in this trade is simply because it dares to tell the truth. It is one medium that is sincere in its purpose. It wants to help make coin operated amusements the most outstanding division of the great American entertainment industries. It looks forth to automatic music becoming the greatest and most respected network of music in the world. It wants to help bring to the merchandise machine men the credit and acclaim they deserve. This medium believes that eventually all the nation will become automatic merchandising conscious. Such merchandising is the culmination of forceful, true and great efficiencey.

Correct analyzation of every report that is made to this industry is also one of the outstanding credits due to The Cash Box. This medium unscared the scare that came to this trade with the first OPA news flashes. It called meeting at its own expense. It analyzed the entire situation to such completeness that even OPA has used this analyzation time and time again in its own work with this industry.

It helped this industry to better understand the revocation of the L-21 limitation order by the War Production Board. It brought out the fact that the the revoking of this order meant that machines could be manufactured, materials for such manufacture were still restricted. It stopped an avalanche of cut prices and prevented many from tremendous business losses by not understanding the complete meaning of this revoke order.

It has continued to analyze one important situation after another, and many of these analyses are still adorning the bulletin boards of firms thruout the trade. Many will also recall, almost three years ago, the analysis The Cash Box made in regard to the gas and tire rationing. These statements came true to the very last word, proving that this medium is carefully and logically thinking out whatever problems occur, as well as getting exclusive news beats.

The year that now opens before The Cash Box, its fourth year, will probably be more exciting and more thrilling than the three that have already passed. Once again this medium will continue its fearless and confidential work for this industry. As always - it will tell the TRUTH.

And in this coming fourth year, a great many surprises are due the trade. The Cash Box now starts on its post-war path. Covers will appear each week. A new digested, concentrated news service from cities all over the nation will become one of its outstanding news features. Photos will be rushed here from everywhere in the nation. "TALKING OUT LOUD" **ARE YOU GETTING MORE RECORDS**

Perhaps the most outstand-g, most irksome and most iring, most irksome and most in ritating problem to the music machine division of this industry is its constant battle to obtain a sufficient number of records. This problem was supposed to have bettered itself after open publication of all the facts in this medium.

For a short time some musie men report, after The Cash Box openly publicized letters of vig-orous complaint from various nation regarding the troubles they were having obtaining rec-ords, the situation did better itself.

The old, old story of the necessity for music machine operators to buy records anywhere they can in the nation, and pay top consumer's prices for these consumer's prices for rds (and sometimes records even records (and sometimes even more than these prices) is again coming to the fore. Long ago the fact was reported from a survey conducted by The Cash Box: that from 75% to 90% of the records purchased by music machine operators were from retail sources, usually miles from their own territories, and at full consumer's list price.

Operators have had to cate to the record distributor in di cater to the record distributor in di-vers ways to get what records they could. One coinman re-ported that he had to purchase over 2.000 of one firm's needles to get records. He even offered these needles right back to the manufacturer at a cut price, 4c below the market price, to get rid of them. Others have been forced to purchase lamps, lumi-line bulbs and various other supforced to purchase tanget, line bulbs and various other supplies to get the records need.

The problem continues. And it goes on, The Cash Box will as it goes on, The Cash Box will continue to fight for some sort of solution from the "big three" record manufacturers, namely: Victor, Columbia and Decca. Victor, Columbia and Decea They should be more than happy to bring about more equitable record distribution to the juke box industry. This is the trade record distribution. box industry. This is the trade-that hoisted them to the exalted business position they occupy to-day. This is the industry that is helping to make them more helping to make them more popular and niore powerful each day. They should stop biting the hand that has been and that is, feeding them.

teeding them. This problem goes beyond just the juke box operator. It enters the precinets of the jobbers, dis-tributors and manufacturers of music equipment, too. In fact, it even enters into the realm of the finance firms who are today placing lars in many thousands of dolplacing many thousands of dol-lars into financing music ma-chines. Why? Simply because if the operators of music equip-ment cannot obtain the quantity of records they need to continue in business and to assure their collections remaining at a high peak point, then this business will find its sales slowly falling down, and serious loss is then bound to occur for all concerned with the juke box industry. In some parts of the nation

In some parts of the nation there is already a movement afoot by some juke box men to ask the music machine manu-facturers to build 12 record ma-chines once again. They do not believe that they are going to believe that they are going to get the number of records they need to be able to fully and cor-rectly service 20 and 24 record machines. These men, thru The Cash Box, have asked the music

machine manufacturers cede for them with the "big three" recording firms. They big three" recording firms. They have asked for this cooperation so that they can continue to progress. The time has come when such cooperation is vitally needed by the music machine

operators. The Cash Box proposed that these record manufacturers, who claim that they are shipping their distribution outlets the regular quota of records they can allot, to have their record labels changed to a different color so changed to a different color so that the records bearing such colored labels will become known as "coin machine recordings". Then these record manufactur-ers, if they mean what they say, will be able to trace any record diversion, especially if they find these colored labels appearing in any but a juke box outlet. Every leading juke box man in the nation has arisen to acclaim the nation has arisen to acclaim this plan. All, but the record manufacturers themselves, It is a well known fact that the record manufacturers are

the record manufacturers are playing up to the possibility that the home phono market will be the greatest in this nation's his-tory, some years after the war is over. They want to completely capture this market. It is high time, then, that they advise the juke box trade what they intend to do about future distribution to this industry. Many claim that after the war with Japan is over there will be plenty of record manufacturers popping up everywhere in the

plenty of record manufacturers popping up everywhere in the nation. To such an extent that they will be able to supply what-ever demand will ensue. But, will these new (and some of them will be "fly-by-night") manufac-turers of recordings be able to also provide the stars that are needed to keep juke box earn-ing at top peak? Only by such top earning capacity will the ma-chine distributors, manufactur-ers and finance firms be able to continue doing top business.

ers and finance firms be able to continue doing top business. The "big three" record manu-facturers still remain the "big three". These are the firms whose policies act as a guide for the smaller organizations. These will be the firms who must either make or break further progress with the juke box industry. If an agreement can't be reached with the "big three" it will mean that the juke box men will have to the "big three" it will mean that the juke box men will have to start all over again from scratch helping to popularize bands, vocalists and instrumentalists. Either this, or the cooperation of the "big three" to give them the number of records they need on the basis they deserve. There is no doubt that new stars will arise on the recording firmament. Many of these will be from among returned service-men. But will these be enough to take care of the demand of the

men. But will these be enough to take care of the demand of the coin operated machines indus-try? Will they be placed in the "star" category in sufficient number, and in quick enough time, to make possible their ex-tensive use? Eventually there is no doubt that these new stars will bring about a new type of no doubt that these new stars will hring about a new type of post-war music and, therefore, a new type of recording. But the problem that exists—exists today—and what will come to-morrow is up to the men of the industry who are engaged in the operation, sales, manufacture and financing of juke boxes now. now.

Certain juke box manufac-Certain juke box manufac-turers have openly stated that the operator will have to again come back to the \$4 and \$5 gross weekly take. He will have to operate his music machine business as he would any other "legitimate" business. The av-erage nusic nuchine operator is operator is h "normalge musie machine erage music machine operator is willing to accept such "normal-ized" conditions, and is willing to earn a net of \$2 or \$3 per music machine. But, he won't even be able to earn that much if he desen't even here all

even be able to earn that much if he doesn't get the records he needs to continue to attract the public to play his instruments. The question today is: How to come to some sort of agree-ment with the record manufac-turers which will result in more emutable distribution of records equitable distribution of records equitable distribution of records to the juke box industry? The trade is eager and willing to work out any logical agreement with the recording firms. The trade wants and needs new records, in larger and larger quantity. quantity.

There are a few in the in-dustry who answer all questions with a shrug of their shoulders and the statement that, "When the war is over the trade will get all the records it needs." But these mends not take interthese men do not take into con-sideration the fact that almost every radio manufacturer has today arranged a high powered sales campaign for home sales campaign for home phonos, and that these will be phonos, and that these will be purchased in ever larger quan-tity by the public, thereby ne-cessitating that the public re-quire more and still more of the records manufactured. It is high time that this in-dustry went to bat to obtain what is rightfully its own. It asks no favore It simply wants come

no favors. It simply wants some sort of assurance from the pressort of assurance from the pres-ent "big three" record manufacent turers that its needs will be as

completely filled as is humanly completely filled as is himmanly possible, and that the distribu-tion outlets of the "big three" will be told to take care of the needs of this trade. Regardless of the fact that many record distributors claim that they are not statice

many record distributors claim that they are not setting up any more "dealer" outlets since the war, the Classified Red Books in each city disprove them. These Red Books show increases of over 250% in new record retail outlets in many cities.

ontlets in many cities. The large number of com-plaints The Cash Box has alplaints the Cash Box has al-ready received was a grand sur-prise. There are dozens upon dozens of juke box operators who frankly admitted to The Cash Box that they were afraid to, "stick their necks out", for they found they if their set they feared that if their names appeared in print, complaining about the inequitable distribu-tion methods of the record man-

tion methods of the record man-ufacturers, they wouldn't get even what they were getting at present; which is little enough. It is well for this industry to remember that the juke box, re-gardless of how well huilt or how beautifully designed, is simply a medium for a music how beautituily designed, is simply a medium for a music expression which has always been popular with this nation. Even if a juke box should be sold for \$10,000.00 it would sold for \$10,000.00 it would nican no more to the public than the records it plays. In short, it isn't the outer shell—it's the inner kernel—the meat of the situation—the records which are important.

important. And, therefore, it is up to him, the juke box operator, so that he may be assured con-tinued prosperity, to do some-thing about this record situa-tion. And do something quick— before the music machine manu-forctures begin to meduce new facturers begin to produce new equipment.

"TALKING OUT LOUD" WPB GIVES MFRS. NO PRIORITIES

INDUSTRY ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEET WITH WAR PRODUCTION BOARD RESULTS IN GO AHEAD SIGNAL — BUT NO PRIORITIES TO OBTAIN MATERIALS AND MACHINERY GRANTED. ALL FREEZI ORDERS WITH EXCEPTION OF ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT REMOVED WAR WORK SCHEDULES MUST BE MAINTAINED. CAN ONLY PUR CHASE FOR 60 DAYS IN ADVANCE. WASHINGTON, D. C.—This Industry's Advisory Committees met with the War Production Board this past Friday (June 8) as first made known to all the trade by The Cash Box, and the result of this meet of all the various divisions of the trade with WPB was to get the go ahead signal, but in such fashion that the manufacturers who were present do not believe that it is anything to get excited about.

One of the things which did please certain of the manufacturers who were present, was the fact that WPB made no distinction between the various groups that were represented. They considered this industry as one group regardless of whether the phono, vending or service machine manufacturers may have thought that they would be handled differently than the slot and amusement games makers.

Most of the manufacturers present had hoped that WPB would also grant them, as in the case of 70 other industries, an AA3 priority, so that they could obtain the machinery and material they needed to reconvert to former products production. WPB would not grant this industry any priority.

WPB advised the manufacturers that they could go ahead, where they could obtain materials, labor and machinery, without in any fashion whatsoever hurting the war effort or causing any stoppage of their own war work. The old law regarding purchasing only enough material for 60 days in advance applies even here where the manufacturers are told to obtain materials without priorities.

At present all freeze orders, with the exception of electronic equipment, have heen revoked. This electronic equipment order includes tubes. This is one of the vital parts for phonographs. Therefore, this creates a great difficulty for the phono manufacturers to be able to get into production without being able to obtain tubes. Especially in view of the fact that WPB has not given them, and will not give them, a priority to obtain tubes. At the same time, electric motors are also one of the hottlenecks for the phono manufacturers.

Most of the manufacturers present stated that this would mean, since they will not he given any priority, that there will he no production to speak of this year. There may be some samples manufactured from inventory on hand. But that's all, according to these manufacturers who are somewhat sorely disappointed over the fact that they have the "go ahead" signal and yet have no priorities with which to make that signal mean something to the trade.

It is expected, tho, that some manufacturers of smaller equipment, which does not require many parts, may produce a few machines during this year. But even if such production is started, manufacturers claim, it will be of such insignificant quantity as to have very little effect on the general market.

One manufacturer stated. "Just tell the boys to keep right on going with their used machines. It's going to be a long time before they'll see now equipment."


SHIPPING CRATES BOTTLENECK Wood Boxes And Fibre Containers Becoming Scarcer Every Day

CHICAGO—Reports 'from wood hox and fibre shipping container manufacturers are to the effect that these items are getting scarcer every day as far as domestic manufacturers are concerned.

Regardless of the fact that some civilian production is already under way in certain industries, these manufacturers cannot obtain shipping containers due to the fact that they are being taken up by the war, lend-lease and other high priority users.

The general belief is that this condition will grow even more critical as the re-shipment of equipment from European centers to the Pacific gets under way and as high priority manufacturers demand boxes and containers for shipment to the war front.


Even used hoxes and containers are also becoming scarce. Manufacturers who have some civilian production under way are using whatever they can obtain to ship merchandise, but anxiously look forth to extremely critical shortage very soon, even in the used shipping container field.



100,000,000 POUNDS OF ALUMINUM FREED

WASHINGTON - The War Production Board officially announced this past week the "open-. ending" of the CMP (Controllod Materials Plan) as it relates to aluminum. Only Aluminum extrusions will be exempted from the release which permits the acceptanco and delivery of civilian orders for upward of 100,000,000 pounds of aluminum per quarter.

This action precedes by almost three weeks the July 1 date set for the general "open-ending" of CMP, which would also include steel and copper. A similar step was taken for brass mill products last menth. The action is accomplished with Amendment 4 to CMP Regulation 1.

This sudden release of aluminum, it is believed, will start many electrical appliance manufacturors to use this material instead of others in a return to civilian production. At the same time wide use of aluminum in the cein machine field is forecast.

PIANO MFRS PROTEST TO OPA ON PRICING METHODS

NEW YORK - The National Piano Manufacturers Association, in a meeting at the Walderf Asteria, this city, this past week, protested that present pricing policies of OPA adversely affect the reconversion of their industry, according to a resolution adepted by these present.

The latter firm will maintain offices at their present address, 409 N. Broad St., this city, where they have large storage facilities, service and parts departments as well as outstanding showrooms.

The East Coast Sales & Distributing Co., Inc., will open now offices at 625-27 Tenth Ave. in New York City, right in the heart of "Coinrow", where they will maintain sales offices and showrooms.

Members of these firms report that they intend to present the trade with outstanding post-war products. They will also feature new and used machines for the industry nationally. Repair work and reconditioning will be continued in their Elizabeth plant, where they have fine facilities for such work.

WPB'S "SPOT AUTHORIZATION" PROGRAM VIRTUALLY ENDED WASHINGTON - The "spot authorization procedure", a key regulation in the Government's program to aid industrial reconversion, was brought virtually to an end today by the War Production Board. WPB disclosed that it had instructed field offices to deny further preference ratings and allotments of materials beyond July 1 to those applying under normal provisions of the ruling.

The action is in preparation for an amendment to the "spot" order, PR-25, which will officially eliminate priorities or material assistance at the end of this month. WPB field offices will not authorize production schedules for the rest of this year, except for highly essential civilian products listed in Directive 1 to PR-25.

LONGER DELAY SEEN ON RECONVERSION BECAUSE OF STEEL MILLS NEEDS

NEW YORK - Longer than expected delays in conversion of war industry to peactime production are seen in the survey just completed by the National Industrial Confer-ence Board. A major setback will be encountered in steel mills and other rolling mills and foundries. Previously it had been expected that reconversion here would be a minor task.

It is now reported, the study brought out, that the steel industry will spend over \$200,000,000 on their conversion job, much of it to change mills back to plate.

WLB WILL POLICE INDUSTRIES ON WAGE CUTS DURING RECONVERSION

WASHINGTON - Theodore W. Khell, executive director of the War Labor Board reported that the same watchful policing which was in effect to prevent industries from hiking salaries of employees during wartime will be in effect when conversion sets in to see to it that no industrialists cut salaries.

Manufacturers switching from war output to peacetime production will very likely be unable to seek wage adjustments under the war prosecution clause, Mr. Kheel stated. However, some companies returning to civilian production may find themselves in a difficult competitive position and can appeal for wage adjustments under the plea of "gross inequities".







FOREWORD
