

This is the time for the entire industry to come together to arrange for better and more ethical business practises as the post-war era rushes into being.

This is the time, before the new mathines begin to enter the market, to arrange for many formations which have long been wanting in this trade.

This is the time for the creation of a National Board of Trade to enable all the members of this industry to have a common meeting ground so that this business remains a single, solid entity for its own future betterment and protection.

This is the time to start a National Tax Council for such a council would be greatly instrumental in clearing tax obstacles from the path of future progress for this industry.

This is the time for a National Credit Bureau to get under way so that all the members of this industry would be able to adjust their financial standings to gain the greatest possible acceptance in this, and in all the industries allied to this trade.

This is the time to start a School for Coin Machine Mechanics for such trained men will prove of tremendous worth to this industry as it enters into the new and more intricate electronic equipment era.

This is the time to arrange for consideration of many national problems by the manufacturers themselves, who created a nucleus for such consideration at their last Chicago meeting.

This is also the time to arrange for a Public Relations Bureau to assure this industry a cleaner and better path to its future progress by clearing the way of all misunderstanding with the press, politicos, and the public at large.

This is the time for many in this industry to get together to arrange for a better commission basis for themselves with their locations, for only then will they be assured better profit when higher priced machines, larger taxation programs, and other such matters come up to hamper them.

This is the time to make arrangements for the openings of much good territory now closed down thruout the country, so that a vaster market can be created for the products of this industry.

This is the time to make arrangements with all government agencies for more understanding in rulings in regard to this industry, and especially for the removal of much of the present national taxation from this trade.

This is the time to arrange for jobber and distributor recognition and set up a standard whereby all wholesalers will be satisfied.

This is the time to eliminate the deposit grabbers and "direct sellers" from this industry to assure this business remaining in the hands of those men who have made it their means for a livelihood.

This is the time to also arrange to keep all inner-industry workings away from the public limelight, and especially to keep the prices of the equipment of this field from becoming the knowledge of storekeepers.

This is the time to eliminate any misunderstandings and evils which may exist in any territories so that coinmen will be able to work in harmony and in better understanding of each others' purposes.

This is the time to declare this a single and united industry so that all other industries can look up to this one with great respect.

### "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

HOW WILL THE NEW MACHINES BE SOLD?

A great many opinions have been ventured by coinmen thruout the trade as to how the new equipment, when it does at last come to market, will be sold. This is a rather important question. Many are of the belief that the new machines, because they will be so few in quantity, may bring about wholesaling methods which this industry has never before experienced.

For example, one set of coinmen are of the belief that the average distributor would be far better off to operate the first new machines he receives himself. Then, after so amortizing the cost of the equipment, bring it back to his showrooms, renew it, and sell it as reconditioned equipment. They believe that he will get just as much for this sort of reconditioned equipment as he would for the new machines.

Their belief is based on the theory that the average distributor can operate the new machines first, get the wholesale price out of the machine, probably in very fast time, and therefore, with the machine completely amortized, as far as the distributor is concerned, obtain over and beyond what he would ordinarily earn on the re-sale of the machine.

There are many operators who believe that this is just what many distributors are planning at this time. They believe that since the greater majority of former wholesalers have also become operators, these men can now place the new equipment in their own locations and amortize the cost first, before selling the equipment to the operators in their territories.

There is no doubt that this, in itself, is not only a suspicious, but a very vicious thought on the part of some coinmen. The average wholesaler is more concerned with getting a sufficient number of new machines to sell than he is with operating equipment. This The Cash Box can so openly state for it has made a survey in this regard among many leading distributors in the nation.

The distributors reported that they were not interested in operating. A great many of them have even sold whatever routes they have had. This is especially true in the case of the phono distributor. He does not want to operate in competition to the men he is, and will be, selling. The average distributor believes, instead, that the moment the new machines are announced he will have to sell whatever he receives, for competition will force him to get his machines out into the market just as rapidly as his competitor. This, they explain, is reason enough for the average operator to realize that the distributor is there to "sell" and not to "operate".

One problem that has arisen is of a different bent entirely. This deals with whether the distributor will receive enough merchandise, when the new products are announced, to even be able to arrange for "quota" sales to his customers. The distributors explain that they are of the belief that they will receive samples, but that these will be far, far in advance of any regular shipment, even "quota" shipments of machines. And they do not believe that they will even see a sample of their new machines until sometime very late this Fall of 1945.

The distributor is more concerned with the fact that should sample machines arrive too soon before regular shipments can be made, or should samples arrive in the belief of the manufacturers that shipments will soon follow, and then something come along to prevent such shipments, the entire trade would be hurt, not just the distributor. Their reasoning is that the first official announcements of the manufacturers regarding new machines is going to hurt the used equipment field.

They explain that most of their customers have today heavily invested in used machines, most of which have not been completely amortized. Rather than see such investments hurt, they would rather see a delay in shipment of samples to their showrooms, provided of course, that this does not hurt market prices of the used equipment.

The great majority also believe that machines will have to be sold on a very strict "quota" basis. Production will be slow in getting started, they are convinced. This being the case, they reason, the average operator will only be given a very small portion of what he will order. It is therefore best, they state, for the operator to hold onto his present machines and wait until the distributor in his area can guarantee him delivery.

Further along this line, the average distributor is of the belief that all new equipment, at least for the first year or so, will be sold on a cash basis. In short, there will be very little, if any, credit demanded by the operators. They feel that the average operator has sufficient liquid capital at this time to purchase whatever he will require the first year for full cash.

#### "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

Of course, in certain divisions of the field, this practise will be the regular business procedure. But in the phonograph and merchandising machine fields, there has always been a tendency on the part of the operator to take as many months as he could obtain to pay for his equipment. In the first part of the post-war period, prior to the adjustment period, these distributors are of the belief that this practise will not prove common, and that the average operator will purchase for cash instead.

Some coinmen are of the belief that certain distributors will be more anxious to sell to new blood than to former operators. This, too, has been denied by the average distributor. He claims that he will be more happy to sell former, bonafide operators first. He reports he is not interested in new blood when he has such an open and waiting market for his equipment.

He claims that any such distributors, who would, at a time when there is a terrific market awaiting them, instead turn to the expense, time, effort and energy involved in searching for new men to put into this business, would have to be simply anything but good business men. Or as one distributor put it, "They'd have to be nuts".

The biggest problem, the distributors agree, is to get a steady flow of equipment from their factories. The fact that they will receive samples means little to them. Some are even of the opinion that it would be best to hide these samples until their factories advised them as to regular shipments. They would be better off, they state, to work along as at present, than to upset their territories with announcements of new equipment, hurting present market prices, and then not to be able to deliver any of the new equipment for months to come.


The best answer, therefore, to those in the trade who want to know how the new machines will be sold, is simply that they will in all probabilities, be sold for cash first. Former customers will naturally be given preference. Operators who have continued to do business thru this wartime period with the men who will be wholesaling the new machines will receive the first quotas of new machines.

Generally, it is agreed thruout the entire trade, there will not be a sufficient quantity of the new machines produced to vitally affect the used machines market for some months to come. Further, that no real production of new equipment for this trade will be seen until sometime in 1946. This is one point upon which most are agreed.

Some state that such units as slots and counter games may be seen first, and probably in good quantity, as 1946 comes into being. But other equipment, such as phonographs, consoles, one-balls, pin-balls, etc., will not be seen until sometime in 1946, because of the serious lack of motors, transformers, power packs, etc.

Perhaps some cigarette and candy machines may begin to come off production lines late in 1945. Beverage venders will be held up. They require electric motors and other electronic equipment. Manufacture of beverage dispensers during this year can only be possible from present inventories.

The trade need not worry, then, how the new machines will be sold. There is no . doubt that sales will start immediately when the new machines appear and each territory will gradually arrive at some quota rationing sales method to fit its own peculiarities.



# "TALKING OUT LOUD" **EXPECT 75% MUSIC REPLACEMENT**

**Believe 40% of Present Equipment Will Be Replaced for Mechanical** Reasons and 35% Additional to Meet Competition According to Music Leaders

NEW YORK—The nation's lead-ing music men reported to The Cash Box this past week, in a survey just completed, that there is every reason to believe that approximately 75% of the music machines now in operation will be replaced by new equipment, as soon as possible. They base this figure on the fact that average replacement dur-

fact that average replacement dur-

fact that average replacement dur-ing a normal year amounted to approximately 20% of the music machines in operation. But in view of the fact that the present machines have been operating under such strenuous play, and for so long a period, that this "normal" replacement figure can easily be doubled, and that at least 40% of the music machines now operating will be replaced for mechanical reasons alone. alone.

alone. One noted music op wrote, "You can put this down for a definite fact, I'm replacing over 65% of the equipment that I'm operating at the present time for mechanical reasons alone. "These machines are worn out. The parts that we have used dur-ing this wartime period with which to replace the original parts are also showing signs of ereat wear.

great wear. "We get more service calls on these old machines than we have ever had. I believe that this is the case with almost every music machine man in the nation." In addition to the fact that an average of 40% of the music mamachine

average of 40% of the music ma-chines now operating will be re-placed for mechanical reasons, music machine men also estimate that 35% more will be replaced because of competition. They believe that even tho this additional 35% will still be worthwhile operating from a mechanical standpoint, competi-tion will force these units off lo-cations because the new models

tion will force these units off lo-cations because the new models will either be demanded by the location owners, or to keep the spot, the operator will have to get the new machines before his competitor arrives with them. The 25% balance, it is esti-mated, are the later model ma-chines and the music systems now in operation. These latter are

in operation. These latter hard to remove and replace. latter are

The location owners themselves are rather stubborn about seeing their booths and walls torn up once again while cable is removed

once again while cable is removed and boxes taken off to make way for some other system. This 25% is therefore expected to continue in operation for some-time to come. It may be some years before these will all be re-moved from locations.

There are also many rural lo-cations, included in this 25%. Also locations where the take is so low that replacement would have to be at a loss.

What will happen, some be-lieve, is that the later models will find their way into these poorer spots and will remain there for some years to come while new machines are being operated.

Machines are being operated. A 75% replacement of the music machines and music sys-tems in this trade will require more than three years of speedy and consistent production, is the general concensus. Many are of the belief, that this job will take far over three years to accom-plish.

#### MUSIC OPS WILL BE ON TOP WITH OWN RECORD MFG. FIRM

MILWAUKEE, WIS. Noted music machine ops in this city are of the belief that the nation's juke box men should get together to create their own record manu-

facturing firm. "This would", one of these ops stated, "help eliminate direct sales to storekeepers. As long as the retailers realize that to obtain records of the big recording stars, which are the records that bring in the money, they would have to get these from their juke box operator, there would be no in-centive in their buying machines direct.

direct. "At the same time", this op continues, "it would also mean that the juke box ops would get records at a much better price than what they are now paying for them. They could also apply for records to be used for 'com-mercial purposes' and not just for "home use". A great many evils 'home use'. A great many evils would be cured and the trade would be in a much healthier position for the future."

#### CANADA OP FEARS **DEPT. STORE SALES**

MONCTON, N.B., CAN.—L. A. Reid of Reid Amusement Ma-chines, this city, reports that he has just found one of his locations was sold a used phono by the L. Eaton Company, one of the large department stores here. Reid also claims that from knowledge he now has one of the largest distributors of radios in Canada, a firm that was noted for distributing coin operated music

distributing coin operated music machines to department stores in the pre-war years, is again getting ready with a campaign to sell these department stores who, in turn, sell direct to locations. Prior to the war he lost many

Reid therefore asks the trade to arrange for a fair deal to the operator who has worked to keep this business going during war-time to help protect his liveli-hood by not allowing sales to de-partment stores interested only in selling direct to locations.

#### MAI URGES OPS NOT TO SERVICE LOCATION OWNED EQUIPMENT

DUBUQUE, IA.—M. C. Mai of the General Sales Co., this city, urges ops that they should not urges ops that they should not service location owned equipment regardless of what the store-keepers offer them for such serv-

icing. He claims that this would help to tremendously cut down on many location owners purchasing many location owners purchasing direct. From past experiences he has found that certain store-keepers will make such tempting and inducing offers to some ops in their territories that these men will service such direct owned machines and keep them in con-dition dition.

It is his belief that if the ops will not service the machines that the retailers will be forced to get rid of them.

He also urges the elimination of such media which reaches store-keepers whereby these location owners learn prices of the ma-chines and are also able to buy direct.

"The trade should set up a code of ethics in this regard for its own future welfare and pro-tection," he says.

#### SEE EXPORTS TO ENGLAND LONG WAY OFF

CHICAGO-Noted manufacturers here do not believe that there will be any exporting of coin machines to England for a long time to come.

They base this belief on the fact that at the present time the British have very few American dollars with which to allow for clearance of American products. They claim, that because of this, the British are at present engaged in the greatest economic battle in their history.

Should American exporting to England be allowed while no dollar exchange exists, one manu-facturer stated, the English would eventually become so indebted to this country that they would, from an economic standpoint, be con-sidered a "colony of the United States".

#### SEBRING URGES ALL PARTS BE STANDARD

CHICAGO-Al Sebring of Bell Products Company, this city, CHICAGO—AI Sebring of Bell Products Company, this city, urges that manufacturers arrange to standardize the various parts they will use in making their post-war equipment.

He reports that there would be a tremendous saving of money and time to all in the pin-game trade alone if it were possible to replace parts from one pin game with those of another.

Such interchangeability, he claims, would be of tremendous value to the manufacturers, too, for it would bring a standardiza-tion which would eliminate many costs and would also arrange for faster and more efficient manufacture

Some of the items Al believes that should be made interchange-able and therefore standard on all pin games are: legs, cash boxes, rails, backboards, cabinets, ball lifts and plungers.

He explains that plungers. He explains that these are not what the public plays, nor what the average player puts his coin into pin games for. He, instead, puts his money into the game be-cause the playing field intrigues him. Therefore, he is not inter-ested in what helps keep the game in action nor what causes it to stand upright, nor what size bulbs are used to light it up.

"In case a leg gets broken," Al says, "it would only require the operator to use a leg from any old idle game he has in his place. What difference would this make to the man who puts his coin into the machine? He isn't putting that coin into the game to have anything to do with the parts that make the game.

"If all parts are standardized everyone in the business will save time and money."

#### **PHONO DISTRIBS** SHOULD NOT OPERATE HASTINGS CLAIMS

MILWAUKEE, WIS.—S. J. Hast-ing of Hastings Distributing Co., this city, claims that phono manu-facturers should arrange with their distribs that they do not operate phonos.

Hastings claims that such operanastings claims that such opera-tions place the average juke box man at a complete disadvantage. Not only does the distrib have the new machines first and therethe new machines first and there-fore is able to get them out on the best locations, but because of his lower price he is also able to amortize them within a year's time and then turn around and sell them for his original cost, there-by there is no depreciation on the machine, he reports.

Hastings fears that manufacturers, in their hurry to get back into production, may overlook this factor. He feels that such action will hurt all concerned with the music trade.



## **HOUSE BILL SMASHES AT JUKE BOXES**

Rep. Buckley (N.Y.) Introduces Bill to Amend Copyright Act of 1909 Which Claims Music Played by Jukes is for Profit. It Means ASCAP will Collect if Bill Passes. Film Industry's Lobby K.O.'s Reference to Music on Film and gets a Special "Exemption". Fear \$10 Per Year Juke Box Tax.

WASHINGTON - Representative Charles Buckley of New York, who introduced a bill into the House of Representatives wherein amendments to the Copyright Act of 1909 would be affected, seems to be making good progress and winning fine support for his bill.

The bill would strike out the last paragraph of Section 1 which claims that the music played by a juke box is not a public performance for profit. It would therefore make the playing of music by a juke, "a public performance for profit". This would, in turn, mean that juke boxes would have to be specially licensed for such a performance by the holders of the copyrighted music.

The licensing agency which would have to be appointed to collect these licenses would, in all probabilities, be ASCAP. They have fought and lost on three different occasions to get the juke boxes to pay them a yearly license fee for playing the records of the music they control by copyright. The belief is that ASCAP will ask at least \$10 per year per juke box as license fee, if they become the collection agency in this matter.

For sometime juke box ops have feared that the records which they are now using and which are labeled to read that these are not sold for commercial purposes but only for use in homes, would have to come to a head sooner or later. It now seems that this bill by Rep. Buckley is blowing the lid right off this smoldering problem and bringing it right into the hands of the juke box trade.

Those in the juke box field who have already heard of this bill are plenty worried about it. They explain that additional taxation of this kind is sure to hurt continued profitable operation. They ask that the phono manufacturers and other juke box leaders, as well as the record companies, make contact immediately in Washington and learn just what this bill is all about. They hope that this change in the Copyright Act of 1909 can be prevented. Or if a change is definitely on the way then something should be done to ease the burden off the juke box operator directly.


The film industry was originally included in the Buckley bill. But because of their powerful lobby, it is reported, they were able to obtain a special exemption. This exemption excludes payments of any kind on music on film if the film itself is a part of the work of a copyright. Juke box men know that there is no lobby for their field in Washington and therefore realize that this becomes a very severe problem for them.

There is already reported to be much dissension among music publishers regarding this bill, as well as the general copyright laws. Some are of the belief that this change being asked for by Rep. Buckley will probably create a very irritating situation. This would mean paying additional royalties. And, naturally, this cost would be passed on to the juke box operator.

The greater majority are of the opinion that ASCAP is somewhere in this situation and will step in at the proper time to act as the collection agency. They will, it is believed, ask no less than \$10 per year license from each juke box, and they can ask for a great deal more. ASCAP is reported to be plenty jealous of the way Petrillo grabbed himself a chunk from the recording firms and are out to get what they can. They can even ask for a percentage of the collections from juke boxes, it is reported, as their license fee.

Juke box ops look to the phono manufacturers to instantly arrange to do something to halt this bill putting a K.O. punch on them at this time.





Blue Book reports each quotation exactly as it is made and depend on the subscriber to make average price adjustment to fit the peculiarities of his own territory.

The C.M.I. Blue Book is to be read as follows: First price listed is lowest price for the week: Second price listed is highest price for the past week. Where only one price appears this should be considered lowest price.
