# "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round" by Bill Gersh 

## "GREATIR LIBERALITY"

For sometime there has been a belief current among many in the trade that an era of greater liberality was coming to the fore thruout the country, as far as the equipment of this industry was concerned.

As yet no distinctly discernible signs of any such great liberality have made themselves apparent. Perhaps here and there, thruout the nation, there have been statements made by certain civic leaders and politicos that coin operated equipment was not the 'ogre' they had formerly believed it to be.

But, in the main, the average office holder is still of the belief that, for some reason or other, coin controlled machines are harmful to the good and welfare of the average community.

This is one of the misunderstandings which many in this industry hope will be cured and overcome in the post-war era. Yet, there hasn't been any concerted move on the part of any coin machine leaders to help make this a fact.

Many good territories have been closed off to various types of machines. None in these territories were given the necessary aid of an organization in this industry to prevent such closings. Some of these areas have been closed for a very long period of time.

It is a well known fact in the trade that such cities as New York, Cleveland, Birmingham, Detroit, Atlanta, Milwaukee, Chicago, and many others thruout the nation, will not allow the operation of any type of coin operated amusement device, aside from certain types of arcade equipment which are so closely related to what is generally accepted as 'sports-type' equipment, that these cannot be adjudged anything but a coin controlled method for playing a noted type of well known sports amusement, such as bowling, etc.

Pinballs have long ago been condemned by these cities. There was no inner-industry organization that came to the fore to help offset such condemnation. There was no one in the trade, in fact, who could or would arrange for a better understanding with the civic leaders of these communities, with the newspapers, politicos, and all others who were against this type of amusement.

Yet the operators themselves, as well as the jobbers and distributors in these communities, wanted to fight and fight hard to bring better understanding to these civic leaders and the authorities for this amusement business.

Therefore, the thought that 'greater liberality' is going to ensue after this war is over, had best be forgotten. As should the fact that present taxes are going to be cut down be forgotten. Neither greater liberality nor lowered taxes will become fact as easily as that. But they can become fact in one way.

And that is-if the members of this industry will arrange for the organizing of a Public Relations Bureau, which has been urged upon this trade time and time again by this publication. Such a bureau is a most definite necessity. All in this industry will agree such an organization is needed to help bring about better understanding. And perhaps thru such better understanding, greater liberality from the average publican for the products of this amusement business will eventually result.

Only a Public Relations Bureau, staffed by experienced and capable men, can arrange for helpful discussion to overcome whatever factors there are against any division of this industry in any community. Such an organization can work on a national scale. It can help enter into local effort to prevent the closing, and to also bring about the opening, of certain valuable territories to further the future progress of this business.

The manufacturers of amusement machines, when they can again get into production, will need all the territory they can possibly obtain. This will prove of value to all the trade. First of all, with manufacturers able to continue to produce in volume, more will be attracted to the field, and this sort of competition is bound to bring about better equipment.

In the second place, with better equipment brought about by competition among those who desire to sell a good volume market, operators will earn more and the wholesalers likewise will profit. Therefore, from every standpoint, it is of value to continue to have volume markets for the products of this industry.

But volume markets cannot be had by just wishing for them. Nor can they be enjoyed by the leading factors in any field waiting for the small component parts of an industry, in local areas, to open these markets for them. Yes, the operators in the area will profit. But a good portion of the profit will also go to the jobbers, distributors and the manufacturers.

Only a Public Relations Bureau, fostered by the leaders in the field, can help to bring about better understanding, better knowledge, and therefore the opening of territory which has been closed, and also prevent closing of any further territory. This bureau should be put into action as soon as possible. It should be part of every present association. It should, most naturally, become the most important division of the manufacturers' organization.

No one man, nor any one division of the field, can completely carry the load for such an organization, if it is to be a unit of distinction in this industry. Just to call together two or three or more men, and announce that a Public Relations Bureau has been created, is of little value. Properly trained men, with good experience in such work, are the backbone needed for such an organization. Such men can gradually surround themselves with whatever help they will require.

To bring about this 'greater liberality' which all dream about in this field definitely requires that a Public Relations Bureau be put to work now. It will take some time to win the necessary recognition from the public. This may take longer than many even dream about at the present time. But it will eventually become fact, if the work is continued, and not hampered.

Surely, the situation could never be any worse than it is now. Surely, even the most desultory effort will be better than none at all. And just as surely, some good must result if experienced public relations men are at work to help build good will and understanding for this industry.

The most important fact is that everyone in this industry is most desirous that such a bureau be created. All know its worth. All believe in it. All agree that it is the one and only intelligent method to pursue to assure this business a better future. Therefore the creation of such an organization is up to the leaders in this field. They will find that the industry will flock to their banner and will help them with its creation.

Manufacturers realize the need for a Public Relations Bureau, for they are the basic factor in all the components which make this an industry. They are the men upon whom this industry completely depends for its future. The trade looks to them to start the most progressive action everytime. Therefore the manufacturers starting such a bureau, in their post-war organization, will inspire all to follow their lead.

The Public Relations Bureau which they create will naturally want to work with other units of like ilk created by operators' organizations thruout the country. This will be the beginning for complete public relations effort on a national scale. It will probably lead to one nationally recognized bureau, which will be of tremendous value to the trade at present, and of inestimable value for the future.

It is strange to note that in other industries, where it is believed there is no great need for a Public Relations Bureau, such bureaus do exist. The food people of the nation are benefitting today from the organization they created many years ago to help them present their side of the story to the press, magazines, radio and all other media that reaches the public. Aside from the advertising they are doing, their greatest effort is their public relations work. And they continue to pour more and still more into this work.

The same is true of many other outstanding industries, such as the automobile field, the steel trade, the drug business, and many more that could be mentioned by any man who has watched industries progress. Yet this trade, which has won a firm place for itself in the nation, is doing nothing to insure its position, and to make this position more firm for the future.

## "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

Greater liberality will not arrive of its ow.. accord. It is only brought about by the good actions of the men in any community, any state, and in the nation. These actions win acclaim, respect and recognition. After much such good action these men and their businesses are at last looked upon with greater benignity by the public. After this-greater liberality ensues.

Such is the case of the moving picture industry. The public continue to patronize the movies because they have a liberal belief in them. A belief that remains unshaken regardless of how many poor pictures may be foisted upon them. The great Public Relations Bureau of this industry is constantly at work to make sure that the public continues to retain its faith and belief in the movies.

It can safely be stated that almost every single movie goer in this nation has also patronized one or more types of coin operated equipment, whether peanut or gum vender, whether juke box or pinball, whether slot or arcade piece. And the greater majority seem to have liked coin operated equipment. It has relaxed, and it has also exhilarated them.

Why doesn't this industry, too, continue to strive for better understanding, for greater liberality, for more certain and growing patronage, for faith and belief, from the same people, by working to this end thru the good offices of a Public Relations Bureau, just as the moving picture industry does?

Those few who believe that greater liberality is coming to the fore regardless of any or no effort which this industry may put forth, have much to think about as yet. The State of Wisconsin's latest drives against this business are a complete and pertinent example as to how the general public's lack of interest will react when politicos, crusaders and blue-noses, decide that they can gain more renown by closing down on something, that cannot hit back at them with any more punch than a baby has.

Remember, too, that in the closing down of the state of Wisconsin to the amusement devices of this industry, many a solid citizen was hurt. Many a storekeeper will suffer. A great many members of this state's citizenry, not directly connected with this field, are going to find that the lack of the coin operated entertainment they were formerly able to offer, is going to affect their business adversely.

Where the average Wisconsin resort was able to accept a very fair rate for a day's room and board and sports, it will now have to practically double this charge, because the income from its many coin operated amusements will be lost to it. Eventually, it is hoped by many in the state of Wisconsin, that these influential real estate holders and tax payers will holler loud enough to overcome what the state's legislature in 1945 made into law. But as all in this field know, negative legislation is extremely difficult and very, very expensive, as well as one of the most torturous of all long drawn out legal processes.

The best thing that this industry can do for itself today is to urge and work for the creation of a Public Relations Bureau, whether this become part and parcel of the manufacturers' post-war organization, or whether it be created as an individual unit by the leaders in this field who desire to see this business continue on for many years to come-and continue on with better understanding from the public.

Already the NAMA (National Automatic Merchandisers Assn.) as reported by The Cash Box in its July 3, 1945 issue, have such a unit as part of their effort. Mr. Nathaniel M. Leverone, who is president of this organization, so stated to a reporter of "The New York Times", and this most noted newspaper published his entire statement at that time.

Mr. Leverone is to be complimented. His organization and each and every member of that public relations unit should be complimented for the effort which they have started, the work they are already doing, and they should especially be acclaimed for the fact that they already have a Public Relations Bureau right in their own association.

The music and amusement machine men of the nation have this same job to perform. It is hoped that they, too, will follow the lead of the automatic merchandising machine men. It is also to be hoped that after they have created their own Public Relations Bureaus as part of their organizations, that they will combine these with any others which might be in effect or might be created in the meantime and thereby combine these into a Public Relations Bureau of a National Board of Trade for this entire industry.

Thereby making it possible for all this industry, as a single and solid unit, to be able to wield a mighty influence for the future good and welfare of all concerned with this business.

# "TALKING OUT LOUD" 

## MUSIC DEMAND SWINGS 'WAY UP

NEW YORK - Demand for music equipment of every type has sharply swung upward has sharply weeks. This demand is reported to be greater than is reported to be greatime since the war at anytime since the war
started. The average music man reports that machines are at such premiun that it is humanly impossible to supply the demand which has resulted.
Thruout the country leading music coinmen report that they have been trying desperately ment as they possibly can to cover locations in their territories, regardless of prices, so that they would be completely that they would be completely arepared when them.

The average music man is first asking for the latest model phonos and also for as many wall boxes as he can obtain to go along with these. With cable extremely difficult to obtain, many have been forced to cut down on use of wall boxes in locations, according to reports.
Regardless of the fact that in some territories there are rumors that new machines may be seen right after the first of the new year, the juke box men are paying little attention to these statements and are ar-
ranging to buy whatever they ranging to buy wh
The following letter more or less explains the present situation, "There is no doubt anymore that the demand for music machines is greater than the supply. We have been trying to get as much music equipment as possible, and we can only report that we were able to buy just a few pieces here and there.
"We believe that the best thing we can do, before the new music machines come to market, is to cover our territory thoroughly and thereby be prepared with locations for the
new equipment. We don't benew equipment. We don't be-
lieve that we will lose any money, working in this fashion.'

The average juke box man also believes that it will take many months for the new machines to make any dent in the large market that has feels that whatever he buys now will be amortized before $h$ has to replace it with new equipment.

Demand continues unabated and prices are again on the in sales on the present market.

"Operators should guarantee to buy a certain amount of equipment from a dealer each year and should have said guarantee backed up with a
deposit before expecting and deposit before expecting
getting operators' prices.
"Should the operator be unable to do so he should be referred to another operator who, in turn, could if he felt like it, sell him a smaller amount of equipment, at the same time considering where the pieces would be used.
"The smart operator will never sell equipment to a location as it only welcomes competition in his territory. If he has used equipment which he doesn't intend using he should turn same into a dealer tho he may get a little less for his used pieces."

Goodness knows at the prices being paid today for revamps, they can be gold-plated.
"Music machine manufacturers should standardize all tubes and all parts as much as possible on all models. Some manufacturers change every model. In a great many instances these changes aren't necessary. A mechanic actually needs a trailer to carry enou
parts to service all models. parts to service all models.
"Manufacturers should buil "Manufacturers should build
machines for the mechanics. machines for the mechanics.
Some parts are so inaccessible Some parts are sors it takes hours to at them. My mechanics have proved that some parts are put into a machine without any regard for servicing.
"Every music manufacturer should have a 'tone leveler' so that all records could play at the same volume. This is very important in my opinion."

# NOW'S THE TIME TO ASK OPA TO REMOVE PRICE CEILINGS FROM USED EQUIPMENT 

## OES Directive 68 Allows OPA to Suspend or Exempt Commodities from Price Control. Creation of Committee of Leading Used Machine Dealers Urged to Ask Exemption.

WASHINGTON—Plans of the Office of Economic Stabilization and the Office of Price Administration to suspend or exempt commodities from price controls crystallized with the issuance of OES Directive 68, outlining methods OPA is to follow in removing price ceilings.

Under this Directive, Price Administrator Chester Bowles is authorized to remove controls when, in his judgment, the action will not result in an increase in the general level of prices of the item involved.

These are the three conditions which must be met prior to allowing for suspension or exemption of further price control:

1) The commodity or service does not enter significantly into the cost of living or into business costs.
2) Continued control involves administrative difficulties out of proportion to the effectiveness of control or the contribution to economic stabilization.
3) Suspension or exemption presents no threat to diversion of materials, plant facilities or manpower from war production or production of other commodities, and does not impair effective price control on other items.
There is no doubt, after reading the above conditions, that price ceilings can be removed from coin operated used machines. This is the time, therefore, for the trade to once and for all remove the specter of possible prosecution from the used machines field, by arranging for a committee of leading used machine dealers to meet with OPA's officials for this industry in Washington, and ask for exemption from further price control.

The Cash Box for some time worked with the officials for this industry at OPA and asked that price control on used coin operated machines be suspended, so that this division of the trade could proceed with greater efforts and be in position to enter into the post-war period fully prepared to purchase and handle the new equipment when it would again be produced.

It must be remembered that this industry labors under two price regulations. These are: 1) GMPR (General Maximum Price Regulation) which applies to wholesalers, and 2) MPR-429 (Maximum Price Regulation No. 429) which applies on sales to the consumer.
The Cash Box has argued that the operator is to be considered a "wholesaler" because of his unique merchandising position in this industry. OPA desired that the operator be considered a "consumer". This was a point of contention and remained such.

Furthermore, this industry has the finest sort of price control which could ever have been originated-that of the coin chute-which is "automatic" price control in itself.
The Cash Box further argued that regardless of the fact the cost of materials, parts, supplies, labor and general overhead had tremendously increased since the war started,
the cost of entertainment or merchandise via coin operated equipment, had remained the same as long before the war.
In short, tho records, needles, service, labor, etc., cost more today, the public can still put a nickel into any juke box and get its tune. This is exactly the same price the public paid long before any OPA was ever in existence.

It must also be remembered that this industry is rapidly arriving at that point where new machines will soon be in production. This can happen early in 1946.

That being the case, then price exemption should be immediately arranged for from the standpoint that it will allow for unhampered action on the part of those dealers who will want to rid themselves of equipment to foreign countries as well as to the domestic market.

In short, then, elimination of price controls over the used machines of this industry will allow for this industry to better prepare itself for the post-war era.

At the same time, studying the above three conditions which must be met by any product or commodity prior to exemption or suspension from further price control, it can very easily be proved that:

1) Used coin operated machines do not enter signif. cantly into the cost of living or other business costs.
2) That continued control over coin operated used machines, as exercised by the Office of Price Administration, involves administrative difficulties out of proportion to the effectiveness of control or the contribution to economic stabilization. This can be even better proved by asking this same question of the former heads of the Consumer Durable Goods Division, George Toomey and Ellis G. Bishop, who made long studies of the coin operated used machines field and admitted that effective administration was "practically impossible".
3) Certainly suspension or exemption of price controls on used coin operated machines will in no fashion whatsoever act as a threat to divert materials, plant facilities or manpower from war production, or especially the production of any other commodities, or impair effective price control of the latter.
It is now up to the leaders in the used coin operated machines field to come together and appoint a committee from among themselves. This committee should proceed to Washington and meet with the new head of the Consumer Durable Goods Division. The committee should ask for exemption or suspension of used coin operated machines from further price control.
Not only because such exemption or suspension will meet with the above three conditions outlined by Price Administrator Chester Bowles, but because such exemption will once, and for all time, cure the problem with which OPA has labored with regard to price control of used coin operated machines, and thereby allow an industry to proceed with greater effort for its own better future welfare.
 OPA, this past week, issued the first of its industry-wide "price increase factors" and also issued "profit factors" for 17 specific industries, among which was the coin operated machines industry.

Under the industry-wide reconversion pricing formula (which was reported some weoks ago in The Cash Box) OPA offers industries an alternative to their 1942 ceilings. They may request ceiling revisions based on 1941 costs, plus legal increases in materials prices and basic wage rate schedules for factory employees, plus the industry's average prewar profit margin for the years 1936 to 1939.

The ceiling revision is calculated on the basis of average costs and profits and sets an "increase factor" which each individual manufacturer in the fiold may apply to his own ceiling price.

Manufacturers of coin operated machines (as issued in OPA Supplementary Orders Nos, 118 and 119) can now increase their "profit factors" by 2.4 percent. (Manufacturers of phonographs and radios can incroase their profit factor by 3 percent.)

This means that the manufacturers, either basing themselves on their ${ }^{4} 42$ price or using the 141 pricing method, cun now add an additional 2.4 percent profit margin on their individual ceiling prices.

The trade's belief that machines would cost more than prewar now proves true. With materials costs and wages approximately $20 \%$ to $30 \%$ above prewar, and with the additional profit factor allowed the manufacturers, prices of postwar equipment are expected to range anywhere fron $25 \%$ to $40 \%$ above pre-war, according to leaders.
 awarded the Army \& Navy Production Award for the fourth time, according to notifica tion received from Robert P. Patterson, Under Secretary of War.
"By maintaining the distinguished record which previously brought you distinction," Secretary Patterson wrote, "you are once again proving your leadership on the production front."

In acknowledging the award, Carl E. Johnson, Vice-President and General Manager of Wurlitzer's North Tonawanda Division stated, "Our employees have worked diligently to support the needs of the Armed Forces. We are united in a firm resolve to continue with every resource at our command the task of supplying the finest in quality and the maximum in quantity in the shor test time possible."

Constantly increasing doliveries of vital war equipment are being made to all branches of the military service by the Wurlitzer factory here. Emphasis is currently placed on production of electronic devices, altho extensive schedules of aircraft and communication parts and accessories are also boing carried out. Employment continues at wartime peak with further growth anticipated for the balance of the year.
NEW ORLEANS PAYS USS. reported this past week that revenue from amusement taxes have more than trobled in the past three years.

Slots, pin games and other coin operated machines, according to Hernandez, paid off $\$ 1,107,100,18$ in taxes for this year. (Coin machine taxes in 1944 amounted to $\$ 936,377.76$ and in 1943 totalled $\$ 433,751.27$.)

The cashier's division of the Collector's office reported that the increase in the number of slot machines accounted for almost the entire increase in the number of coin operated devices now oporating in this state. He also repurted that juke boxes remained at about the 1943 level.

Coinmen here predict that they will pass the million dollar tax mark again next year. They also believe that there will be an increase shown in other types of machines and that slots will show very little increase, if any.

Juke box men believe that the greatest increase which will be shown in this state will be the larger number of juke boxes once the new machines start coming off production lines. Distributors here report many large advance orders for jukeboxes.

## WPB GIVES MORE COPPER TO REPAIRMEN

 WAGHINGTON - The amount of copper repairmen may pur chase in a calendar quarter, without WPB authorization has been increased from $\$ 75$ worth, or $1 / 10$ th of what they used in making repairs in 1941, to $\$ 150$ worth, or $1 / 8$ th of 1941 usage. This action was taken by WPB on amendment of CMP regulation 9 A. Specific repairmen for whom purchases of copper wire have been relaxed are repairmon.The amended regulation also removes the prohibition against use of new cord and other materials obtainod under the regulation for certain specified types of maintenance and repair work.

## FORCED TO SELL JUKE ROUTE-NO RECORDS LOS ANGELES, CAL. - Louis Olson, formerly of Austin, Minn., writes that he was for ced

 to sell his route in Austin last October due to the fact that he had such difficulties obtaining the records he needod.He reports, "I had to buy $75 \%$ of my records at retail. I would have an order for 50 to 100 records and walk. out with 10 or 20 . And then stop at some retail store in my territory, "Woolworth' or some others, and buy all that I needed.
"Since then I bought a route here in Los Angeles and have been getting fair troatment from tho three record distributors."

## TOWN OF 2500 TO UP LICENSE-OP ASKS HELP <br> DOUGAS, WYO. - This town of 2,500 population has decided that it should receive $\$ 25$

 per year from each phono as annual license fee and an additional $\$ 1$ per year fee for each wall and bar box. In addition to this a lot of red tape has been added to the methods of obtaining, changing and renewing licenses.Bryan E. Edwards of Radio \& Blectric Service, this city, writes, "This means we
will have to take out most of our machines except from the most profitable locations. Possibly we could cut comissions, but some operators like to give $50 \%$ to keep good will of the locations for other businoss.
"Any literature or other information on how to combat this tax, which is sure to spread all over our territory if not stopped, surely would be welcome at this time. We don't see how small towns get the idea of such stringent regulations."

## FEDERAL TAX DECLARATION DUE JULY 31 <br> WASHINGTON - The Federal Special Tax Declarations must be made before July 31 on all

 types of coin operated machines. Coin operatod amusement devices, such as pinballs, music machines, ray guns, etc. belong in the \$10 tax category. Slot machines, consoles, etc., machines involving the element of chence, belong in the \$100 tax category, Bowling alleys are in the $\$ 20$ tax category.
## WPB ALLOWS 5\%RADIO MFR-BUT NO JUKES WASHINGTON - Production of certain radio equipment for civilian use under a type of spot Authorization will be approved soon by the War Production Board and is expected

 to ease a few shortages.It is believed that under new $\mathbb{V P B}$ regulations governing the radio industry about $5 \%$ of the total output, based on 1941 figures, will be available for civilian users and $95 \%$ will go for military purposes.

Such electronic equipment as radio broadcast receivers and transmitters and automatic phono $r$ raphs using electronic tubes will remain under restrictions.

## FEW VETS PLANNING

NEW YORK - Vets returning from World War II are more interested in reestablishing their homes and resuming their ordinary occupations than they are in starting up new businesses, according to the Mational City Bank of this city. The pank reached this conclusion after analyzing the first 1,000 loans to former service men made by its personal credit dept. Only $6.3 \%$ were made for business purposes; Medical and dental expenses accounted for $46 \%$; Furniture and household $21.2 \%$; Clothing $9.2 \%$ Insurance and taxes $8.5 \%$; Miscellaneous 7.9\%.

Of course, condition, serial, appearance, demand, territory, quantity, etc., must all be taken into consideration. The C.M.I. Blue Book reports each quotation exactly as it is made and depend on the subscriber to make average price adjustment to fit the peculiarities of his own territory.
