# "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round" by Bill Gersh 

## SCHOOLS FOR COIN MACHINE MECHANICS

It is extremely interesting to note at this time that the majority of the phono manufacturers have decided that they will conduct schools for coin machine mechanics as soon as they possibly can.

Some of the new manufacturers, who are entering into the automatic music field, have also announced to those distributors with whom they have already spoken, that one of the features which they will have, as their production gets under way, will be schools for mechanics. Courses will be given to the mechanics of the distributors they will appoint, as well as to the mechanics of any jobbers and operators who will buy their machines and who care to send their men to these schools.

For many months The Cash Box has been urging the industry to create schools for coin machine mechanics. Not only is this necessary from the standpoint that it will allow for greater progress for the industry, but also from an intelligent manufacturing and sales viewpoint as well.

It is a well known fact today, after these wartime years, that some of the machines which were condemned a bit too soon by the trade, outlasted many others which met with early approval. This only became fact when the mechanics gave these former type machines more complete attention. Thereby proving the value of well trained mechanical skill.

Any manufacturer, therefore, who sends out an entirely new product in the postwar period, and doesn't train the mechanics of his distributors to most completely understand that product, is taking a big chance on losing the confidence of the men to whom his merchandise will be sold.

Instead of the distributors having to write, wire or phone the factory for help regarding some part of the machine going out of order, they can now take care of the repairing themselves. Their mechanics will have been most completely and carefully trained to understand every part of the machine by factory engineers.

This not only means better sales for the manufacturer, but it also means greater confidence in his products. As long as there are factory trained mechanics on hand to instantly correct any faults which may appear in a mechanism, the operator will have more faith in purchasing such units.

The manufacturer can therefore do himself a world of great good if he will create, along with the introduction of each new product, a complete factory course for the mechanics of his distributors, jobbers and operators, so that these mechanics will most thoroly understand that product. And it wouldn't hurt for some of the distributors, jobbers and operators themselves to also attend these schools.

Such manufacturers' schools can also be geared to accommodate much more than just the mechanics of their own distributors, jobbers and operators. They can handle men who want to become mechanics by allowing these men to attend the schools.

Such additional students will prove of tremendous worth to the manufacturer for the future. It will mean that those operators who seek to expand their routes will be in a position to do so. They will be able to obtain trained mechanics to watch over the additional equipment which they will purchase. And that means more sales all down the line from the manufacturer to the jobber.

The fact that the phono manufacturers are preparing to open schools for mechanics, almost the same day they announce their new products, should lend incentive to all the other manufacturers in the vending machine, scale and amusement machine fields to also assure themselves of better understanding of their equipment by the creation of schools for mechanics tutored by their engineers.

## "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

One national beverage dispensing firm are at present having a moving picture made of how they want the machine, which they will operate, serviced and repaired. This picture will be shown to all their servicemen, collectors and repair men thruout the nation. And this picture is only being made possible because of the cooperation of the manufacturer who is devoting much time and effort to it.

As this industry progresses it will find that schools for mechanics created now will prove of great value, great profit and tremendous benefit for many, many years to come.

The average coin machine man reported that "Schools for Coin Machine Mechanics" was the most valuable suggestion ever offered to the trade by The Cash Box. It should therefore be accepted in the same light by manufacturers who desire to please their customers, as well as assure these customers the finest of service and assure themselves great good will and bigger profits.

It would be a great boon to any manufacturer to set aside a room in his factory and allow his engineers to give two and three hour daily lectures on his products for a week or so, whenever a new machine is introduced. In a few short months such schools would become a habit for every mechanic employed by any distributor or jobber handling any manufacturer's line.

The Cash Box most sincerely hopes that all the coin machine manufacturers will create schools for mechanics and thereby help the operators, the basic backbone of the field, to better serve the location because of a more thoro knowledge of the products they operate.
"Schools for Coin Machine Mechanics" are the finest (and the cheapest) insurance for a greater industry for tomorrow.

## JOHN Q. PUBLIC DOESN'T BUY THE MACHINE

It is irritating to a great many coinmen who are engaged in selling equipment, to note that there still are operators who are standing by and waiting for the new machines to be introduced, before they will again think about buying.

It is safe to state that such operators may have a pretty long wait. This is not the time for "standing by". This is not the time for wondering whether there is, or isn't, going to be new machines on the market very soon.

It is well for those operators, who believe that they had best wait, to remember that others are not waiting. These others are purchasing whatever machines they can at this time, to cover as many locations as they possibly can, so as to be completely prepared for the postwar period.

The best way to explain the situation is to probably advise these operators that it isn't the machine, as much as the location, that really counts.

Nor does John Q. Public buy the machine, when he inserts his coin into the coin chute. He is, instead, purchasing the thrills and relaxation of the game he is about to play, or the music he is about to hear.

Johnny Public just doesn't care whether the machine is two days old, or twenty years old. If he likes what that machine gives him in return for his coin, he's going to put his coin into that machine.

Therefore, those operators who are standing by and waiting may be losing a great many good locations and much profit for tomorrow. The man who is buying and placing what he buys, is the man who is going ahead.

Remember-Johnny Public doesn't care about buying the machine. He is only interested in buying what that machine vends-whether it be candy, gum, cigarettes, soft drinks, weight, music or amusement.

This one returned vet has put many juke box men to shame with his understanding of the field. Others, like him, are also coming out of the armed forces, and they, too, have ambitious plans concerning this industry.

# PETITION RECORD MFRS 

Regardless of the fact that Representative Charles A. Buckley's bill (H.R.3190) now in the Patents Committee of the House of Representatives in Washington, D.C., may or may not be killed in that committee, it has become necessary for the juke box industry to take steps for its future welfare and protection. (The complete story and a reprint of the Buckley bill appeared in the July 24 issue of The Cash Box.)

The first, and most important, step is to have the present reading matter appearing on all record labels changed to conform to what this industry requires for its protection.

It is the belief of the leaders of this industry that the record manufacturers, because they are so closely involved in their business dealings with the artists and publishers of music, as well as with the organizations representing these artists and publishers, are therefore in the best and certainly in the most logical position to arrange for a change in the reading matter now appearing on all record labels.

If this entails a few pennies increase in the price of each record, to obtain this change, the juke box operators have reported time and time again that they are more than willing to pay a fair charge in addition to the present cost of the records, for it assures them no further molestation from these people, and at the same time it also assures them of records exclusively designated for their use.

The record manufacturers should have their already experienced legal staffs immediately arrange to make this change. Therefore the presentation of the following petition by The Cash Box to the members of the juke box industry so that they will help to bring about this change in the reading matter now appearing on the record labels for their future better welfare.

ST. LOUIS, MO. - Carl F. Trippe of Ideal Novelty Company, this city, reports that on attempting to renew his arcade licenses for this coning year he was advised that it might be possible the local revenue agent would not further allow licenses wj. th the address as "at large".

Trippe protests this from the standpoint that the arcades ho has in amusement parks surrounding this area are only open for about four months and that this would mean a loss of 8 months revenue cost on the liconse. In former years, he states, the local revenue department issued the licenses with the "at large" address on them so that he could move them into one of the other spots in town after closing his summer arcades.
(This condition has been prevalent in the East and in other parts of the nation where the Arcade Owners Assn., New York, have been fighting in Washington to get a ruling in this direction. The Cash Box reported many times the fact that such action on the part of Federal authorities was ontirely unfair. It is the hope of the members of the Arcade Owners Association that more will help them in their efforts to overcome this situation.)

## NAM ASKS $10 \%$ PERSONAL TAX CUT

WILINGEON, DEL. - H. E. Humphreys, Jr., Chairman of the National fissociation of Manufacturers taxation committce, in an address before the Industrial Purchasing Agents Association offered a four point trx program calling for retention of heavy excess profits until the end of the year, marking the close of the war with Japan, and a $10 \%$ reduction in individual levies for 1946.

The program to aid transition to peacetime production proposed: 1) Reduction in the income tax of individuals for 1946 by 10 percent. 2) Continuation of the excess profits tax until the end of the year marking the close of the war with Japan, with the repeal date to be set now. 3) Reduction of the combined normal surtax rate of $40 \%$ on corporations to $32 \%$ on 1946 income to encourage peacetime production and employment. 4) Repeal of so-called spocialty taxes which yield a return of less than $1 \%$ including the capital stock tax, declared value oxcess profits tax, the penalty tax on consolidated returns and the tax on $15 \%$ of dividends received by corporations.
(What will prove tremendously interesting to the cointrade, aside from the fact that all would like to see this 4 point progran go thru, is the fact that lir. Humphreys is Chaiman of NAM's 'taxation committee'. This can be likened to tho 'National Tax Council' for this industry which The Cash Box has proposed time and tine again. This council becomes ever more pressingly important and should be made the first order of coin machine post-war business so that this trade, too, will find its tax problems greatly eased to allow for more rapid growth.)

## WPB TIGHTENS LUMBER BY REDRAFT

WASHINGTON - The War Production Board has just redrafted lumber quotas once again on the basis that the continuing huge needs of the military in the Pacific dictate such revisions. The Navy has been given a much higher allotment then ever before. The National Housing Administration has also been given more lumber. Nearly all other users have been cut, some considerably.
(This again tightens the present lumber bottleneck in the coin machine industry which was hoping that the successes now being enjoyed by the military in the Pacific would ease the situation, so that lumber for cabinets and other requirements would be made available for the manufacture of machines.)

WASHINGTON - The nearly $6,000,000$ suggestions mado by employees through 5,000 nationwide labor-management committees, are now open to all manufacturers, the War Production Board, which has accumulated these, roports.

This is being colled, "WPB's "Brain Bank". Of these 6,000,000 suggestions over $1,500,000$ have been put into use and have saved manufacturers about $\$ 300,000,000,00$. All these suggestions cane about during the war. It is believed that they will prove of tremendous value to all manufacturers during the coming peacetime years.

## WAR WORKERS OPEN SMALLBUSINESSES

WASHINGTON - There is a suruty that there will be more small businesses booming up during the post-war period than ever before in business history of the nation, because the average war worker will not return to former jobs whero he does not obtain the salary being paid to him by the war plants.

Most outstanding example are those who have lost positions at Ford's Willow Run plant which paid a minimum of $\$ 1.25$ per hour. These workers are not returning to former jobs. Nor will they take jobs paying less wages than what they formerly earned. The situation is becoming alarming according to government investigators and may bring about huge upset in labor situation with much unemployment.

In the meantime those war workers who have saved some money while engaged in war jobs are intent on opening small businesses of their own. This trend is increasing at a groat rate wherever uncmployment now exists. It is generally believed that there will be more small business in operation before 1945 is over than ever before.
(As far as coinmen are concerned, this return to smaller business operation is reported to be of great value to them. These men believe that this will mean more locations for all types of coin operated equipinent. They also feel that many of these small business will continue on to success. In the meantime many coinmen are already arranging to place equipment in spots which have opened and will continue doing this for sometime to come.)

## WAR WORK DROPPED 65\% IN 1944

WASHIITGTON - Interesting to all who wanted figures as to the cutbacks in war production this past year are those which have just been relcased and which show that war work dropped over $65 \%$ during 1944. With even higher percentage of cutbacks already in effect this year, it is generally believed that a return to domestic production is instantly necessary.
