# "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round" 

## NO MINORS ALLOWED

## By Bill Gersh

With the excitement of V-J Day still rankling, with various Government agencies continuing to make important announcements, with all business men looking forward to new products, a great many may have passed by the report of FBI Chief Hoover, published during the first announcements of the Jap surrender.

In his report, Hoover stated that there was a major crime being committed by juveniles every 22 seconds thruout the U.S. He feared that a very large percentage of these juvenile delinquents would eventually become hardened adult criminals. In addition, with the possibility of more crime resulting, as it usually does after every war, this would severely tax every law enforcement agency in the nation.

To escape from the stigma, of in any fashion whatsoever helping to foster juvenile delinquency, this industry, as it always has in the past, should work with the authorities to help prevent its further growth and development.

The trade has always made it a practise to inform its locations that minors are not allowed to play some of the amusement devices. This should be even more impressed upon the storekeeper's mind at this time. It should become the duty of every operator in the country to cover his locations, and his equipment, with the sign, "No Minors Allowed".

Every location owner should be notified of the law regarding allowing a minor to play certain instruments. This should be pounded home to the storekeeper stronger than ever. It may save many heartaches and headaches in the future.

One large Southern city is closed today because its coinmen became negligent about minors being allowed to play their equipment. These men were suddenly made the butt of a juvenile delinquency drive. And tho they proved that their machines did not foster juvenile delinquency, the drive had gained so much momentum by that time that they were forced to remove equipment from locations.

Possibly the greatest exponent of keeping storekeepers in line, as far as minors playing machines are concerned, is the AOLAC (Associated Operators of Los Angeles County). Here Samuel (Curley) Robinson has continued to conduct an ever reminding and vigorous campaign to acquaint every location owner with the penalties involved for allowing minors to play certain amusement machines.

He has furnished the members of his organization with framed signs of many kinds. Some of these completely reprint the penalties involved. Other simply read, "No Minors Allowed" and refer to certain sections of the law regarding minors. This work on the part of "Curley" Robinson and the AOLAC has won good comment from many leaders thruout the industry.

Now, with the possibility of the juvenile crime wave growing to extreme proportions, it is up to all good citizens to help to curb it at its source. In this way coinmen would protect themselves and their equipment from the crusades of those who would like to hang upon them the stigma of "aiding and abetting in the creation of juvenile delinquents". (This quotation actually comes from the speech of a politician in one city referring to coin games.)

Some coinmen have relaxed their efforts, tho they were formerly leaders in this drive, to prevent minors from playing games. These men must now intensify their efforts. They must see to it that minors stay away from certain machines. In this fashion the law enforcement committees, which are arising everywhere in the nation due to Hoover's report, will give them a clean bill of health.

## "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

Without a "Public Relations Bureau" to protect them, in the event some coinmen feel the lash of the fanatics who are always first to take advantage of such situations, as well as have such a bureau hold off the press or politicos who may use this as an opportunity to jump down the throats of coinmen, and have such a bureau explain that this industry, in no fashion whatsoever tends to help create, or even cause to be created, juvenile delinquency, each and every member of the trade must now work harder than ever to protect himself.

The juke box men are in a favored position in this instance. The youth clubs created by local community organizations all feature juke boxes. These have been found to be sufficiently entertaining to attract and hold the average youth so that he does not care to roam the streets. And it must be further stated, to the credit of the juke box men, many have gone far out of their way to help in the creation of such clubs in their communities. In many cases, music operators have donated juke boxes to these community youth gathering spots.

The average father in this industry knows and fears juvenile delinquency. Being a good business man, he also knows that it not only affects him and his business, but affects the future of the entire trade, unless it is rapidly curbed at its source. Those men who have helped win respect for this field in their communities are also the men who have worked hard to keep juveniles away from certain types of equipment.

It is up to the average coinman today to work hard to prevent the stigma of juvenile delinquency blackening his personal record or that of his equipment. He can do this with a vigorous and consistent campaign. He can have printed the local laws for the storekeeper and the minor to read. And post these near his equipment. At the same time he can also have stickers printed and pasted on each and everyone of his machines with the phrase, "No Minors Allowed."

In addition, he can advise his location owners, preferably by letter, so that he retains a record of this fact, that it is up to them to work with him to prevent minors from playing certain equipment. He can further explain to his location owners that juvenile delinquency is on the increase and that by working together they can help curb it.

The arguments here are not intended, in any fashion whatsoever, from having coinmen halt the youth of the country from playing amusement machines. But there are certain types of machines which coinmen themselves don't want their own children playing. These are the machines which they certainly don't want their neighbor's children to be found playing by any law enforcement officer.

Coin machines have definitely helped in the campaign to prevent the spread of juvenile delinquency by keeping youth off the streets. The average arcade, which is completely and carefully supervised, is certainly a better place for a youngster to spend his time than hanging around some street corner.

The same can be stated for the corner ice cream parlor, where youth meets and perhaps invests a nickel or two in a coin machine. But, the trouble is that there are the sort of people in this world who like to make capitál of such situations. These are the people from which this industry must protect itself.

In short, the men in this trade must actually lean backwards tho they know in their hearts and souls that, in most instances, they are doing youth much more good by holding it together in one supervised location, than allowing it to hang around street corners.

Here is a great need for a "Public Relations Bureau." The Cash Box has urged, and continues to urge this industry, that such a bureau be created. Here is the type of work for which such a bureau should be specifically formed. Quick work now would help to prevent trouble in the future.

A "Public Relations Bureau" would would act as the "ounce of prevention" now - while it could act. It would be able to explain to any bluenose or publicity seeking politico (as difficult as this might prove) that this industry was doing a tremendous amount of good in helping to prevent juvenile delinquency.

Because the members of this business are rugged individualists, it is difficult to get them together into a move of this kind without many years of great and untiring effort. Eventually, such a bureau will come into existence in this industry. But it will only come into existence after much heartache and much monies have been spent doing small, individual jobs, which a well organized "Public Relations Bureau" could have prevented long before the heartaches occurred and the money was spent.

This industry should now intensify its efforts and arrange a program which would convince the nation that no juvenile delinquency results from youth entertaining itself with amusements machines or other equipment of this trade.
"No Minors Allowed" signs should be placed everywhere. They should be replaced where operators have forgotten about them. Laws and penalties in regards to minors should be prominently posted. Location owners should be strongly reminded of the fact that the members of this industry are anxious to curb the growth of juvenile delinquency.

And the best way to judge what machines could be regarded as helping in the creation of juvenile delinquency (at least in the minds of blue-noses and politicos) would be for fathers, who are members of this trade, to stop and consider what machines they would not want their own children to play.

# sss TAXES 

All look to the balance of this year and especially to 1946 to eliminate a great many war emergency taxes, which were placed upon business and the public generally, by the necessity to pay for the greatest war bill in the history of the world.

Many coinmen are of the belief that because of this they will not find states or cities hounding them in an attempt to increase their license fees. This may, tho rather doubtfully so, prove to be the fact during the coming Fall and Winter of ' 45 and perhaps even the early part of ' 46.

But with more and more people losing their jobs (over $7,000,000$ expected to be out of work by Xmas) there will surely come a demand for public works projects which will once again bring back the tax bug. He will, as usual, demand increased license fees for the equipment of this industry.

There is already a demand, and it is more or less assured of getting thru, that personal income taxation be cut. Some propose an out and out $10 \%$ reduction. Others propose a gradual reduction starting with about $3 \%$ and going down as the need grows less. But, whatever form it takes, there is no doubt that before the year is finished Congress will have cu! down on personal income taxation.

The excess profits tax is sure to be cut off entirely as well as a great many of the luxury taxes. These luxury taxes never did work out anyway. So cutting them off means very little to the Treasury Dept. But cutting these taxes off will help business all over the nation. It will act as an incentive to many to enter into new fields of business endeavor.

The problem that will now come into being for this trade will be whether, with so many millions of people out of work temporarily while manufacturers reconvert back to peacetime production, this may act as the wedge some politicians will use to bring about higher license fees and perhaps also demand a percentage of the take.

It is well known in the trade that this past year many legislators proposed that not only license fees be increased on the equipment of this industry but that a percentage of the collections also be obtained. Some of these bills, tho shelved for the time being, may pop into the light again this Fall of ' 45.

This industry is therefore in a peculiar position. Tho taxation seems sure of being cut down by Congress in its coming Fall session, there is a great possibility that higher coin machine license taxation, and perhaps an additional percentage taxation of the gross receipts from coin machines, can come into effect.

To prevent this there is needed a "National Tax Council" which The Cash Box has proposed come into being in this trade, time and time again. There simply must be created some central source where all tax matters, all data relative to coin machine taxation, as well as tax experts can be gathered together to benefit each and every coin machine man. Such a "National Tax Council" would be of incalculable worth to the industry.

Just a week or so ago one coinman from Wyoming frantically called for help. He advised that his community, a city of only 2500 people, was demanding a very high tax on coin machines. There was no one place where he could obtain complete information to combat this measure.

It is well, then, to remember that tho general taxes will probably be decreased by Congress this Fall, and perhaps by many states, too, the fact remains that coin machine taxation may continue on just as harsh, and perhaps even harsher, than at the present moment.

It will be to the advantage of the industry to carefully study this matter in the ensuing weeks. It should somehow arrange to protect itself should taxation take a turn against it, because of the monies that will be needed by states and cities for public works projects, as more and more people continue to lose their jobs.

There must come into being a "National Tax Council" for this industry. This has grown to such importance, that unless such a council is soon made part of this business, few will understand the ramifications of the many and varied taxes that will be imnosed upon the men in this business.

Each day these taxes grow more and more intricate. Almost every day coinmen write or wire asking for some sort of method, as well as complete data, with which to combat them. And there continues to be no source where information can be gathered.

The average coinman who has won against an inequitable tax attempt is more than willing to give complete information on how he achieved this victory. But he doesn't know where to send such information. Yet he knows that it will benefit many others in the trade who may at sometime fall into a similar situation.

A "National Tax Council" grows ever more important. It should be created NOW.

"There is no need", one manufacturer stated, "for coinmen to come rushing to the factories here. We are hard at work at this time trying our best to get ready with new machines. Naturally, we are just as anxious as are any operators, jobbers and distributors to get our new equipment to the market.
"But, by rushing into our factory and taking up the time of our men who should be working to complete plans for the announcement and introducion of our new equipment, coinmen are
simply delaying the time when we simply delaying the time when we

"We believe that it is up to the trade papers to advise coinmen to relax and take it easy. As soon as we are ready, we shall make official announcement of what we with whom we want to discuss territories. At the same time, territories. At operators will know jobbers and operators will know

It is well known thruout the trade that for the past two weeks the factories in Chicago have been literally jammed with callers. These men have been rushing to Chicago's coin machine factories in the belief that new machines are already on production lines and that it is just a question of a week or two before they will apweek or the market.

ber is eager to know where he stands in the wholesaling picture. But rushing the factories at this time, as certain manufacturers have stated, is simply holding up their men from completing plans which they have already prepared.

## EXPECT 20\% PRICE INCREASE ON NEW MACHINES

## GREENBAUM GETS MUSIC TRADES' OPINION

## Climaxes Nationwide Trip With Showing at Waldorf-Astoria Asks Music Men to Choose Cabinets and Features

NEW YORK-Climaxing a nationwide display with a showing at the Hotel Waldorf-Astoria in this city this past week, R. R. (Rudy) Greenbaum of Kansas City, Kans., gave music coinmen here the opportunity to vote for five cabinet designs they most desired to see for post-war.

The showing was by invitation and to a limited number of music machine operators, jobbers and distributors. In addition, Greendistributors. In addition, Green-
baum stated, people were called baum stated, people were called
up from the lobby of the hotel, up from the lobby of the hotel,
picked at random by the firm, picked at random by the firm,
and were also asked to choose among the 32 designs which were featured in a large display room. Location owners were also invited to attend and to vote for the type cabinet they would like to have in their places of business.
Members of the trade who attended the showing were very enthusiastic over the display. One Canadian coinman stated, "This is the first time I can recall when a music machine manufacturer allowed the operators and distributors to decide on what type machine they would like to buy. I believe that this is a great advancement. It definitely proves that the trade is advancing with greater rapidity than many imag. ined it ever would. This is really post-war."
Along with Greenbaum to help handle the display were, Ben Palastrant, Fred Mann, Murray Dutkin, Roy Culp, Bill Roberts and others who have traveled with him and set up these displays in Chicago, Los Angeles, San Francisco and other centers thruout the nation.

Greenbaum, before leaving, stated, "In about a month we shall make known the result of the voting which occurred and we believe that this will prove of great interest to all who attended.'

## WHOLESALERS PREPARING FOR SPEED SALES ACTION

Belief among leading distributors and jobbers is that by the first of the new year they will be ready to talk business with the coinmen in their territories.
These men claim that with all restrictions off and with manufacturers being urged to get their new equipment on production lines that the coin machine factories will be ready to start delivering early in 1946.
Some distributors are adamant in their belief that they will have samples before December ' 45 is samples before December '45 is
over. "These will be followed by regular shipments," they state.
"In the meantime," one distrib states, "we are continuing to sell and buy used machines and believe that either way, whether or not new machines are ready by early 1946 for quantity shipments, we may as well prepare ourselves for the new business that is on the way."

## MUSIC OP TEACHES ATOM BOMB MAKERS TO PLAY JUKES

KNOXVILLE, TENN.-In a letter to the Rock-Ola Manufacturing Corp of Chicago, Bess D. Dollard of Standard Products Co., this city, writes, "Since Oak Ridge, Tenn. is playing such an impor tant part in today's news, we thought you might be interested in seeing the picture showing a Rockola Commando in use. This is in one of their many Recreation Halls, all of which also have Rockola phonographs. (Picture Rockola phonographs. (Piter.)
was enclosed with this letter
"We set two Supers in the first cafeteria built on the area two days after it was opened and have continued to place more and more as fast as locations were built. We have used only Rockola equipment.
"Being in this construction area, where all classes of people have been gathered (and believe it or not, some have never seen a juke box and had to be shown how to play one) the machines have been subjected to a great deal of abuse.

NEW YORK-Mayor F. H. La Guardia of this city in his regular weekly radio talk (Sunday, Aug. 26) forcefully stated that he was getting rid of every type of gambling.
He said, "Many letters indicate that some people are not watch ing the calendar. It is still August not January, and I'll be here until the end of the year.
"You home-breakers and judgemakers don't be placing orders in Chicago for slot machines. And don't think that after January you are not going to be watched. you are not going to be watched. never again stand for slot machines in the corner cigar or drug store."
"We really needed steel cases to protect them and in several places did build heavy wooden ones around them. Locks were broken, even padlocks, backs re moved, wires cut, various parts taken out, records and trays stolen, plugs cut, plastics broken and all kinds of slugs used.
"It has been a great experience and we are proud to have been able to satisfy all the Government requirements necessary to operate in such a secret area. We have seen Oak Ridge built, in fact, pioneered with it. For six months we had a service man liv. ing there for it was the only way we could keep the machines in operation. Even now we have a man there every day."
The rest of the letter is also extremely interesting. The above in regard to the center where the atom bombs were built will probably thrill many music coinmen. It is certainly of interest to note that Miss Dollard actually had to teach some of the workers how to play juke boxes.

And note what vandalism re sulted, to the point where the firm found it necessary to keep a serviceman right on the ground to protect their equipment and keep it in operation. Government recognition of juke boxes for the people of Oak Ridge should also please coinmen
Miss Dollard finishes her letter with the following, "It has been tough, and at times most discouraging. We still have many problems and considerable destruction. But now there is less construction and a higher type of personnel. We hope that we will have fewer difficulties."

MFRS FACE BIG SUPPLY PROBLEMS.
CANT GIVE DATES FOR SHIPMENTS
OF NEW MACHINES YET. MEETING ON
SEPT. 6 MAY BRING OFFICIAL NEWS.
CHICAGO - With more and still more coinmen from all over the nation rushing into this city to visit with the manufacturers and attempt to ascertain the approximate dates whon the now machines will be shipped, the entire trade continues jittery and market conditions prevailing at this time reflect the same attitude.

The present lull, so noticeable thruout the market, is occasioned by the belief that the new machines may start appearing on the scene almost any minute. And this belief persists regardless of the fact that no official announcements of any kind from any of the manufacturers have as yet been publicly made to warrant such belief.

The manufacturers are working harder than ever before in an attempt to get their reconversion problems completed and out of the way and see shipments of their new equipment going forward, as the trade desires. Once shipments are started, it is generally believed, the present merchandising lull is expected to come to a very rapid halt.

Certainly no manufacturer wants to hold back production. As the days pass, without any machines coming off his production line, expenses continue on and, in fact, get greater every minute. But he cannot avercome the supplies problem he is faced with in just a week or two. He must be given time - as other industries are being given time by their dealers.

With the fact that lumber is still tight and will only be completely released on September 30 , and the further fact that coin machines use large quantities of lumber, this one problem alone is holding back any real production.

Other problems, just as great, are also facing the manufacturer. He is trying with $2 l l$ might and main and skill to get the market situation righted so that his friends - operators, jobbers and distributors alike - will face little lost time.

The meoting of the coin machine manufacturers called in the Grey Room at the Hotel Sherman on September 6 is expected to bring the question of official announcements regarding shipment dates to the fore. Porhaps official announcements will be made by the manufacturers, either as a group or individually, after this meot.

Coinmen are urged to continue on with their present business dealings just as if no reconversion problem was under way for the manufacturers. Surely, John Q. Public does not care whether the machine into which he inserts his coin was manufactured in 1935 or 1945. He still gets the same thrill.

Rushing to Chicago at this time is simply delaying many manufacturers from completing the work which confronts them to get into production. Holding manufacturers in conversations for hours at a stretch withholds production efforts. This is the time for the trade to remain calm, cool and collected. TAKE IT EASY::

## WURLITZER TO MAKE BEVERAGE VENDER

## WILL EXPAND PRESENT SPACE BY QUARTER MILLION FEET 

 Rudolph \%urri t tzer company, ropor tod that production space at the iurrit tzer plant in this city will be oxpanded noxt fall, "nore than a quartor million square foet" and nev production items added. Mr. Nohnson also stated, "Expansion will in no way affect the speocd of reconversion."Re-employment of all workers due to the termination of the firms war contracts will begin within the next thirty days and employment is expected to increase gradually during the following twelve months to approximately 1,000 more workers than the average prewar figure.

Mr. Johnson also roported, "Whereas our pre-war production was devoted exclusiveIy to the manufacture of coin operated phonographs and auxiliary equipment, the future activities of this division will include manufacture and distribution of our new electronic organ and a complete line of soft drink vending machines."

This is the first time Wurlitzer have publicly announced that they will produce a beverage dispensing machine.

## WANTS MFR FOR AUTOMATIC DART. BOARD

FT. LAUDERDALE, FJA. - Leon E. Moss, service man for the Dixie Music Coo, this city, reports that he has patented a game called, "Skill Dart". He writes, "I have patented a game called 'Skill Dart', which is a coin operated electrical dart board, which registers the scores of the players sinilar to a pinball machine when the darts are thrown at the moving targets."

Mr. Moss would like to have one of the manufacturers produce his game for him in volume. In former years, as is known in the trade, there was a demand for dart boards from tavern owners and other locations. Mr. Moss also reports, "I can assure you that this game is real precision workmanship and a good quality construction."

## ATTY. MOHR GETS FAVOR ABLE TREAS RULINC

 LOS ANGELES, CALIF. - Arthur Mohr, attormey for the A.O.L.A.C. (Associated Operators of Los Angeles Co., Inc.)received a favorable ruling from D.S.Bliss, Deputy Commissioner of Internal Revenue, Treasury Department, Washington, D.C., on whether a gaming machine featuring more than one coin chute, yet operated by only one lever or handle, should pay more than the $\$ 100$ gaming device tax.Mr. Mohr advised Deputy Commissioner Bliss that Internal Revenue Departnent agents in San Francisco were holding that more than one Federal gaming device tax was required whore there was more than one coin chute on a gaming machine.

Mr . Mohr wrote, "I have never understood the intention of the Act to be in accordance with such an interpretation and I would appreciate receiving a ruling from your office in this respect, as I feel my clients are being compelled to pay taxes on the coin chutes rather than on the machine, which is contrary to the wording of the section relating to such matters."

Deputy Commissioner Bliss answered Mr . Mohr, "Reference is made to your letter of June 28 , 1945, regarding a ruling on a coin operated gaming machine incorporating but one mochanism and operated with one handle although it has multiple coin chutes. You state you have been advised that agents from the San Francisco office are holding that $\$ 100$ tax is required for each coin chute.
"A coin operated gaming device, such as described, operated by only one lever or one handle is considered one gaming device within the meaning of the law:"
SEALED CASH BOXES AND METERS MERRICK, N.Y. - Earle C. Backe of National Novelty Co., this city, reports that it is his belief all of the post-war music machines should feature sealed cash boxes and meters which will print the total. Backe writes, "I firmly believe that music machines should be operated with sealed cash boxes and meters which print the total. In this mannor the dumping of money on the bar could be eliminated and a considerable saving would accrue to the operator. Both the sealed cash boxes and the printing meters should be standard equipment for all manufacturers."

"We have also added exclusive distributorship of the 'Pre-Flight Trainer' for the states of Washington, Oregon, California, Nevada and Arizona for the entire amusement field which covers arcades, carnivals, parks, air ride stores, amusement centers, playgrounds and all places where an individual fee is charged for each ride. This PreFlight Trainer' has been usod by the fir Forces during the war in ground training schools for air pilots. We believe that it is something entirely new and unique in our business, offering not only education, but also amusement."

## OFA CIVES SMALL MFRS PRICE HELP

WASHINGTON - Liberal price incentives, denied to larger concerns as a result of OPA's generally tight pricing policies, will be offered to new, smaller manufacturers as an inducement for their establishment.

Under this policy, new manufacturers who expect that their sales in the next six months will be less than $\$ 100,000$ can actually write their own ticket, insofar as price ceilings are concerned, under OPA's new order applying to small concerns.

Order No. 4332 under MPR 188, effective Sept. 5, also applying to small manufacm turers who started civilian operations under WPB's "Spot Authorization Plan" as of Sept. 1, 1944, permits eligible manufacturers to use oither costmplus pricing in determining their own maximum prices, or a comparability method, with the manufacturer making his own comparability determination.

## DIRECT NY SHIPPING TO PACIFIC OPENS

NEW YORK - Direct shipping services between Now York and the Hawaiian Islands, the Phillipines, Australia, Now Zoaland and other parts of the Pacific will be resumed via the Panama Canal during September and October, several steamship lines here have just disclosed.

A limited resumption of cargo movements in the coastwise and intercoastal trades also appears imminent following advices from Washington that the War Shipping Administration has formally applied to the Interstate Commerce Commission for authority to engage in these services up to the ond of the year.

## CONVENTION SPACE HARD TO FIND

CHICAGO - The CMI is reported to be finding it extremely difficult to get space for the forthcoming coin machine convention. Belief was that this meet would take place this coming January '46. Coinmen, as well as the manufacturers, seem to favor January as the month for the convention.

Reports here are to the effect that the Sherman Hotel, by moving its own offices, closed off much former display space, and room for the show is therefore not avilable. It is also reported that the Stevens Hotel is booked solid with conventions for the months of January and February of ${ }^{\prime} 46$. Most other hotels are said to be too small to accomodate the number of coinmen and exhibits the convention usually has.

There has been a suggestion made that the Stadium or the Coliseum in this city be used for the show. This would allow coinmen to stop at whatever hotels they desired and come to the convention hall during exhibiting hours.

Another suggestion has been for the CMI to take three or four floors of rooms and suites at some prominent hotel and use these for individual display by removing most of the furniture. This is done by dress and shoe manufacturers. This would also keep the showing private and would allow coinmen to stop right in the same hotel.

The trade eagerly awaits the reports of the manufacturers after their meeting Sept. 6 in the Grey Room of the Hotel Sherman. It is understood that the convention will be the paramount issue discussed at this meeting.

## VICTOR TO PRESENT UNBREAKABLE DISK

NEW YORK - The first non-breakable, high fidelity record for home use will appear on October 10, it was announced this past week by J. W. Murray, general manager of the RCA-Victor Record Division. Murray claims that this new record is the grecitest improvement in home phono disks in 45 years, since records began to replace the early cylinders.

Tho this is of great interest to the juke box trade the Victor announcement is to the effect that the disk will be sold to homes only and will be called their Red Seal Deluxe Record. It will retail at $\$ 2.00$, instead of the former $\$ 1$. which Red Seal sells for at this time.

The new record is a flexible disk made of a synthetic plastic material that greatly reduces surface sound, is easier to handle, and is more attractive to look at, too. It is ruby red in color and transparent. It can be hurled against the floor, hammered against the tables, etc., and won ${ }^{\prime} t$ break, according to Victor execs.

There is no doubt that as this new disk gets into full production it will also begin to appear in juke boxes. The trade has long sought for just such an unbreakable record. During the early days of the war, Libby-Owens-Ford announced they had dovelopoped a glass record which was also unbreakable, eliminated all surface scratch and could never wear out. Tests made of this glass record by radio transcription proved it to be extromely satisfactory. The trade has since been waiting to hear more about this glass record and whether some of the leading record manufacturers were going to adopt it.

## URGES DISTRIBS TO FORM ASSN. <br> TOLEDO, O. - Rose Knollmiller of Toledu Coin Machine Exchance, this city, writes, "I

 agree with Tony Mangano of Howard Sales Company, Omaha, Nebr. (Mangano's item appeared in the August 27 issue of The Cash Box) that manufacturers should not sell to clubs, bars, etc."In fact, all distributors and jobbers should have the same selling price. It would be a very good idea if the distributors would get some kind of an organization started and be on friendly terms, instead of trying to cut one another's throats. As far as I am concerned, 'Live and let live', is my motto. It's a very good plan and it works wonderfully well."

## ARCADES EXPECT BIG LABOR DAY BIZ

NEW YORK - Eastern arcade owners believe that this Labor Day we ekend will prove one of the biggest in their history. Coney Island's many arcades have had a very good season and believe that the Labor Day woekend will clinch ' 45 as one of the best in their history. In ftlantic City and at the Jersoy shore generally, where most of the arcade owners expect to close after Labor Day, the general belief is that the weekend should prove the best yet. Mountain resort arcades are also looking for big business and believe that they will match anything that will be done at the shore this Labor Day.
