# A BASIS FOR RECOGNIZING BONAFIDE OPERATORS

More than a year ago The Cash Box conducted a very extensive survey among the members of the trade in an attempt to find a standard to act as a basis for recognition of the various divisions of the industry.

For some years there has been open controversy among jobbers and distributors regarding who was, and who was not, to be considered a jobber or a distributor. The same was, and is, true in the case of the operators.

It is now extremely interesting to note that, as the post-war era zooms into being, the members of the trade suddenly realize the great importance of being recognized by other members, either as bonafide operators, jobbers or distributors.

Today, wherever coinmen gather, there is discussion as to who is, and who is not, to be considered an operator, jobber or distributor. And also - how this recognition is to be made effective. So that all three branches of the merchandising division of the industry will be most completely protected.

The operators now realize that something must be done, and done quickly, so that they will be assured of continued good and unhampered operating in the territories where they have given so much of their efforts and energies during this past extremely hectic war period. They certainly don't want to lose what they suffered for and worked so hard to maintain, during a time when things looked blacker than black for all this industry.

Therefore, many leading coinmen have come to the conclusion that there must be some method arranged whereby the industry would be able to clearly and definitely state, "This man is a recognized operator". Or, "This man is a recognized jobber", and likewise be able to designate the recognized distributors.

Operators once again fear complete re-occurrence of what they formerly had to contend with in their territories. They feel that the eagerness now shown by distributors and jobbers to once again get into sales action may mean that some of them will be location-crippled in their territories by the introduction of too much new blood. And, perhaps, too many direct-to-location sales.

They have had to go thru this once before. They have also had to endure the sting of direct sales to many of their locations by certain irresponsible individuals who cared little whether the machine was ordered by a storekeeper or a bonafide operator. They have fought this for years. They now feel that the time has come when this industry has grown up sufficiently to put a stop to such practises.

During the war period only few such sales occurred on a comparative basis. Where they did occur, they were quickly stifled. Repairs, supplies and parts were much too difficult for the average storekeeper to obtain. Therefore, even tho some store keepers did buy machines, most of these went out of order in a very short period of time. The result was that the local operator was then able to come back into the spot stronger than ever.

Now he realizes that with the return of normalcy not only can these storekeepers start ordering direct once more but that a certain few indiscriminate wholesalers in the trade will be more than happy to sell to them. The storekeeper can, and will, be able to follow up his purchase by also obtaining parts and even repairs from these same sources to keep him in business with his one machine.

Yet even this is not the most serious part of what the operators are complaining of at this time. Most important to them is to first somehow ascertain a method for recognizing who is, and who is not, an operator. Once this has been accomplished, they feel, they will be able to go ahead with greater assurance that they will have a chance to remain in business and to offset direct sales.

Most operator complaints have been to the effect that there are jobbers and distributors so anxious and so eager to sell their merchandise, that they will sell even just one machine to a newcomer. In addition, they will actually give this single machine buyer credit or time to pay for the machine. In many cases operators have proved that the single machine buyer, especially if miles away from the wholesaler, is usually a storekeeper.

The jobber and distributor argue that this is not necessarily the case. They find, many times, that the man who purchases this one machine to start with-will eventually become one of the best and largest of their customers, and a truly respected operator. They feel that should they kowtow to the operators' whim, regarding single sales, that this will actually be holding back the progress of the industry.

The operator, in turn, declares that it certainly is not his purpose to hold back the future growth and development of the industry. He realizes that with more operators in the trade, manufacturers can sell more. And therefore with a greater sales volume in prospect, the manufacturer can reduce prices in most instances, making it a much better business for the established operators.

The operators realize that progress must go on, regardless of what a few may believe concerning keeping a list of men in each territory as the recognized operators in that territory. They believe, instead, that the jobbers and distributors have twisted their arguments to suit themselves.

They claim that the average jobber and distributor already knows who the recognized and bonafide operators are in his territory. That these men, when they sell to anyone but the already established operators whom they know, realize that they are stepping out of bounds. But, the operators state, this is fair in certain cases, especially where operators may not be giving certain distributors proper support.

They realize, too, that the distributor cannot afford to hold his machines in storage and wait until some recognized operator walks in and decides to buy. There is usually a quota set for each distributor and it is his buisness to sell that quota, usually in an allotted time. He must, therefore, push for sales.

The operators claim that they realize all this. They accept it as part of the merchandising practise of the industry. What they do ask of the jobber and distributor is that these men arrange for a certain volume method of sales so that the men who purchase in that volume will be considered operators.

Many operators have advanced the following suggestion. The best means for ascertaining the amount that the average recognized operator should purchase of any new number is a minimum of five units. In short, then, the present operator feels that a man is only to be considered an operator when he enters into this business and purchases at least five units to start with, and five unit lots thereafter.

The operators feel that this will eliminate the great majority of direct sales to storekeepers, whether knowingly or unknowingly sold by wholesalers in this business. They claim, from past experience, they have found that the storekeeper will never purchase in lots of five machines. He wants usually but one machine, they state, and holds onto that machine for years, blocking off a location to a bonafide operator. At the same time causing loss of future business for this location to the wholesalers.

Leaders in the field, who have discussed this request on the part of the operators thruout the country, do not believe it too difficult to fulfil by any distributor or jobber. They believe, instead, that this is a very fair minimum sales figure, and that the trade should abide by it.

The average operator is right in his contention that many times, and it may be without any knowledge, sales will come from far away cities into his territory. Usually such sales are of but one machine. And in almost every case, these sales are direct to locations.

If these men, the long distance sellers, would abide by the decision to sell five machines at one time, then the trade would at last reach that point where the beginnings for a basis of recognition could be established.

It certainly is not asking too much from the jobber to carefully check the men who are eager to now enter the field. Millions who are losing war plant jobs are turning to other pursuits. A large number are going into small businesses for themselves. From among these, who seek a business of their own, will be some who will want to enter this field.

A certain portion from among these prospects will probably prove good, upstanding and progressive operators. Some of these may even prove to be the future leaders of this trade. But to protect the operator, who worked so hard to help continue this industry during the war period, and therefore created a strong and solid nucleus upon which the wholesalers in this business can now build for tomorrow, he feels that these new men should be sold only in minimum lots of five machines. And that this should be declared as the method for ascertaining and establishing a man as a bonafide operator.

The operator realizes that he is going to be hurt. He also realizes that he will have to fight harder than ever before to maintain his present locations. He knows that the competition which is entering the field will not be just satisfied with whatever spots are lying around empty. They, too, have acquaintances and they, too, want some of the top spots in the community.

The operator is willing to enter into this battle for survival from competition. He knows that competition will help to engender better business and open more locations in the long run. But he wants clean, open and wholesome competition. He doesn't want to find his storekeepers buying machines direct and force him into a loss of locations by a method which is entirely unfair from all standpoints, as well as against all the tenets of good business practise.

The operator also believes that he will have much to be wary about when some of the new machines are introduced. He knows that not every new machine can be a "hit" number. There must be some bad ones, too. He hopes that he won't have to be the one who will be saddled with these bad machines. Yet this does not deter him from adopting the policy of purchasing in minimum lots of five machines. He still feels that the average operator can purchase in such quantity and still protect himself from too great loss.

In short, the operator is anxious to work out some method which will be acceptable to all in the industry. He feels that the men who worked hard, and persevered, and helped keep the backbone of this industry strong, should not be lightly tossed aside simply because the new machines must be sold.

The operator, as well as the jobber and distributor, realizes that no great rush of new blood will come about within the next six months, or possibly even the next 18 months. He knows that whatever the manufacturer can produce will be gobbled up by hungry operators all over the country.

What he is worried about is what effect these immediate and continued sales will have, after the first flush of business is over, and the trade again settles down to careful purchasing. Then, he believes, is when wholesalers will suddenly once again shoot out to right, left, back and front to get business, regardless from whom this business comes.

Then will be the time, he feels, when he will need protection. And he therefore believes that the method for ascertaining who is, and who is not, an operator should be arranged for now, before this period comes upon the trade.

The operator does not overlook the fact that the average manufacturer more or less takes care of indiscriminate, out of territory selling. He knows that the manufacturer doesn't want one of his distributors selling into another's territory. He also knows that the manufacturer can, if jobbers do such selling, stop his distributor from selling to such jobbers. But, he explains, this was also the case in the pre-war period. Yet such sales went on openly and in larger and ever larger numbers until the war called a halt.

The entire problem resolves itself down to one basic fact. By the jobbers and distributors knowing the operators in their territories, and these operators agreeing that they will only purchase in lots of five each, and the jobbers and distributors arranging to sell new blood in such quantities, too, they have come to the beginning of a basis for recognizing who is, and who is not, a bonafide coinman.

It is now up to the operators, jobbers and distributors in the various territories thruout the nation to get together on this one point. They can work out among themselves a basis for recognition which will probably prove of good value for many years to come.

Those operators, therefore, who are fearful that certain jobbers and distributors may upset the present operating applecart in their territories by promiscuous selling, need but meet with these men and make arrangements for a recognition basis. They must, tho, allow these men to sell to newcomers. This field can only grow great when its numbers are such that it will have the power to swing better understanding, respect and legislation for its benefit.

Operators must remember that they cannot, and do not want to, forestall progress. Instead, the intelligent operator will work to assure the trade greater and better growth. And help bring to it the kind of men who will work with him to make this a greater and better industry for all concerned.

The operator has the beginning for a grand and great era in his demand that the industry recognize the difference between an operator sale and a sale of a single machine. By keeping machines away from direct purchase by storekeepers he will have definitely won a great point for his own future security.

The jobbers and distributors, at least those whom The Cash Box has contacted in this matter, seem to all agree that there should be arrangements made so that bonafide operators will be recognized by all the industry. Many have even suggested that a list, with a serial number for each operator be kept here in the offices of The Cash Box, and that a special card be issued to each operator which could be checked with The Cash Box at any time the wholesaler may so desire.

In short, both sides are willing. Why not, then, talk it over?

# NEW MUSIC LOCATIONS 

## STUDIES SHOW VAST NEW OUTLETS FOR AUTOMATIC MUSIC POSSIBLE. PUBLIC BEING EDUCATED ABOUT MUSIC'S BENEFITS

NEW YORK-Operators of music machines are aware of the possibilities of opening many new outlets for their music equipment. During the past war years, industrial plants were developed to a high degree, and operators found these locations very profitable. With the music machine operation still in its infancy, music men are scanning every possible spot for the installation of their equipment.

The Associated Press, in a story released from New York City, features a conference of doctors and musicians, just concluded, in which they studied the effect of music on the human being. After a three week conference, Dr. Samuel T. Burns, chairman of the musical education department of New York University, announced a dual inquiry will be undertaken immediately.

This is perhaps the most ambitious attempt to evaluate the potentialities of music to date.

The effect of music upon the emotions was known in Biblical dars. However, it wasn't until 1890, as Roy Underwood, head of the music department of Michigan State College, pointed out in the magazine of Music, that scientific research into the influence of music upon the human organism was initiated.
"During the next 20 years," Underwood wrote, "The following effects were definitely proved: Music increases or decreases muscular energy; music increases bodily metabolism; Music produces a marked effect on pulse and blood pressure; increase in cerebral circulation occurs under the influence of even simple music; music produces decided changes in respiration, influences the internal secretions, and lowers the threshold of sensory perception". (That is to say you feel, hear, taste, smell more sharply.)
These findings have provided a springboard for the application of music in a number of fields: to increase the productive capacities of employees in industrial plants; to aid digestion in restaurants; and it has been applied with some success in education of mentally deficient children.

Many psychiatrists have studied the value of music as a therapeutic agent. Dr. Ira M. Altschuler of Eloise Hospital in Michigan has shown that music is 35 percent more effective in calming patients than any of the standard methods, such as wet sheet wrap, ice packs, etc. Many institutions, private and public, have demonstrated various uses of music in treatment of patients.

Music has been found effective in treating organic ills and pains. It has been found useful in operating rooms and dental offices to relieve nervous tension of patients.

Now, with the return of wounded service men to the country, a scientific study of music for the benefit of all is being seriously instituted.
The results of this study will be interesting to coinmen, who in the past have shown great initiative in placing phonographs in a variety of locations. The study may bring into the open various other types of locations for music machines.

## WANT STANDARDIZED PIN GAME PARTS <br> Indiana; olis; Ind. - Continuin: the strong argument that many parts for games be

 standardized, suggested by The Cash Box some months ago, C. E. Armstrong of Business Stimulators, Indianapolis, Ind. writes: "Now is the proper time for a committee of distributors to contact all pin ball manufacturers regaraing new pin ball machines being standardized in many ways (legs, cash boxes, units, glass) in fact any and all items that can be standardized.""It would be real nice to be able to replace a glass in a pin ball game without first having to get the right sizo out of the five or six different ones now used. This is the first and possibly the last chance to work on the manufacturers along this line. It's really important to all parties concerned, distributors as well as operators. Why not settle this matter before the factories go into production now."

## SUGGEST CHEAT-PROOF PIN GAMES

Louisville, Ky. - Lou Boasberg of New Orleans Novelty Co., New Orleans, La, who has just been honorably released from the Navy, and is back on the job anticipating great things for the future of the coin machines business, writes: "The coin machine operators accept a lot of things that persons in other businesses would never stand for. For instance, pin game operators have been robbed continuously of a large share of their collections by unscrupulus persons cheating their games. The most comrion way of cheating a pin ball game is by manipulating a wire either through the coin chute or by boring a hole through the cabinet and the insertion of said wire."
"We sincerely hope", continues Lou "that the coin chute. manufacturers will keep step with the "March of Progress' in this new '\&utopian post-war world' and give us a coin chute which cannot be cheated in any way. It is utterly ridiculous to pay two hundred and three hundred dollars for pin games and use a $\$ 1.50$ coin chute which is an open door for the game to be fitted. It will be a happy day in our life when we can get a cheat proof coin chute and our games will have armour plating and other cheat proof devices as part of their standard equipment".

## MUSIC CHANGES REQUESTED

New Castle, Pa. - Operating music machines, and naturally not aware of what the phonographs now being prepared for the market are like, De Los $H_{\text {. Burnside of The Peerless }}$ Specialty Co., New Castle, Pa makes the following suggestions to the manufacturers: "I. Have all manufacturers make one amplifier and one tone arm to fit all phonographs. 2. Fut extra good looks on all Wall Boxes and not to have them on the bottorn of the box. 3. Simplify and improve the coin mechanism by using three nickel slides instead of the prevailing nickel, dime and quarter." And for the record manufacturer, Burnside, like all music operators, wants "good popular nusic on both sides of the record".

## CANADIAN EXPORT SPONSORED

Ottawa, Canada - Prompt enactment of Adrainistration sponsored legislation to double or triple existing Canadian export credit authorizations is expected after the Parliament opens this week.

Canada is counting upon exports to a great degree to naintain reasonably full employment. These expanded and additional credit facilities will be used to finance exports to The United Kingdom and other European and Asiatic countries. Canada is reportedly prepared to provide broad financial assistance. Probably $\$ 2,000,000,000$, all told will be extended over the next two or three years, which is considernbly larger than pre-war exports. It is reported that large export credits will be provided to promote Canadian trade.

## ODT ENDS MOST TRAVEL BANS

WASHINGTON, D.C. - All major restrictions on railroad passenger travel, except the ban on short-haul sleeper service ( 450 miles or less), will be eliminated by Sept. 16, the Office of Defense Transportation announced this week.

At the same time, all restrictions on the operation by the railroads of special passenger trains, special cars and extra sections will be cancelled.

Space reservations, including sleeping car accommodations, can be made fourteen days in advance, beginning Sept. 9 , instead of the present 5 day limit.

Thile the elimination of the restrictions noted above, and the possibility of all restrictions being eliminated very shortly, the trade canriot look forward to a return to pre-war service. A spokesman for the New York Central claimed that the removal of these restrictions will be of great benefit, but many handicaps will remain until equipment, especially sleeping cars, now in Army service, are returned to civilian use. He pointed out that $65 \%$ of their sleeping cars had been turned over to the armed services.

## FOREWORD


#### Abstract

Many times, wide differences appear in the high and low prices of certain equipment. Like any true reporter The C.M.I. Blue Book can only feature the market prices as they are quoted. The C.M.I. Blue Book acts exactly the same as the market quotation board at the Stock Exchange-posting the prices exactly as they are quoted for the past week, regardless of how much they may seem to be out of line. Some machine prices do not change for months. The C.M.I. Blue Book, rather than show no price, retains the last known quotations for such equipment so that the subscriber at least has the last known quoted prices as a basis to work with.
