# DIRECT SALES ALL OVER AGAIN?

Once again The Cash Box is in receipt of many letters claiming that there is a definite trend apparent, now that a lull has come about in the purchase and sales of used equipment, to clear machines out of warehouses and showrooms by direct sale to locations.

There are reported to be many contributing factors which bring this about. One of the most prominent is that the storekeepers of the nation are again being made more completely acquainted with coin machine equipment-as well as the prices of such equipment.

Another report is that many wholesalers in the trade, who held off from selling at lowered prices, even as the government agencies began to lift production restrictions, are now anxious to sell. In their eagerness to get rid of equipment, they pay little or no attention, these coinmen claim, to where the machines are being sold. In fact, under such stress, some of these coinmen report, few of these wholesalers seem to care where they ship machines.

In the majority of cases there is little, or no use, today for any seller to try and hoodwink coinmen into believing that he does not know that the machines are being shipped directly to location owners.

Location owners who inquire about machines use little, if any, camouflage. Their letterheads are completely open and fully explanatory of their businesses. All know, without much investigation, that this is a "location owner", and therefore some operator is losing a location when such a sale is made. It also means that all the trade is losing one more spot for future sales.

The letters which have been received by The Cash Box refer also to the former evils which infested this industry regarding direct sales.

One noted coinman writes that any location owner, because of the information which he is today receiving, can write directly to the manufacturer. Usually, this writer claims, the manufacturer will send this inquirer a form letter along with a circular which contains the price of the machine. In almost every case, he writes, this is also the operators' price.

The writer of this letter speaks up for the methods used by the music machine manufacturers in such cases. In most cases, he writes, where the music machine manufacturers receive such inquiries, these are referred directly to their distributors. A letter does go to the inquirer advising him that his inquiry has been forwarded to the distributor who will probably contact him very shortly.

In such cases, this writer goes on to report, the music machine distributor will, in almost every case, rapidly squelch the inquirer if he is a location owner and play along with the operators in the territory.
"In fact", this coinman writes, "in the case of one noted music machine distributor in our territory, he has even helped the operators to retain such locations by calling these storekeepers and explaining to them why it pays to deal with the operator directly, instead of trying to buy a machine direct."

But, this and other coinmen report, is not the case where most of the amusement equipment firms are concerned. They not only send the location owner a circular of their machine, completely describing it and listing the price, but also send along a form letter, wherein even further detailed information is given to the inquirer.

One coinman writes in to report that tho some of the manufacturers are getting ready, in his estimation, to use this same method of answering all inquirers without investigation, that the greatest offenders are the jobbers and distributors. He further reports, the jobbers and distributors who care little about who is purchasing their equipment are usually many miles away from the territory into which they make such sales.

Tho these letters, which have been received by The Cash Box, complain bitterly of this practice, none of these offers any suggestions as to how it may be cured. Of course, all state that advertising the equipment of this industry in such fashion that it might been seen by location owners should be condemned by all in this trade.

These writers must remember that the manufacturer is just as anxious to move his equipment into the market as are any of his jobbers or distributors. The average manufacturer does not sell to location owners. He usually doesn't have to. He realizes that such sales are of little cumulative value. Otherwise he could have been selling direct to locations for many years now.

But, it is agreed, that what the average manufacturer can do to help eliminate direct sales is to simply write the inquirer, especially the one he does not know nor have any knowledge of, that his inquiry has been referred to the firm's distributor, and let the distributor contact him and decide whether he is, or is not, an operator.

Then it is entirely up to the distributor in the territory to be sure that, if the inquiry comes directly from a location owner, it will stop right at that point. Either the distributor will help the local operator by showing the storekeeper that it doesn't pay him to buy his own equipment, or he will leave this up to the operator who may have the location.

These coinmen who have written to The Cash Box have done so in the hope that their cry will be heard thruout the industry and that the manufacturers will arrange to eliminate any possibility of further information regarding the inside facts of this business, as well as details of the equipment and its prices, from reaching location owners.

These men also believe that the manufacturers can further help by sternly reminding their distributors (and these distributors, in turn, passing the word along to their jobbers) that direct sales will simply curtail the further growth and development of this trade.

There is little benefit to be gained by any coinman selling to location owers. Not only does the location owner nurse the machine he purchases until it is long gone out of fashion in this trade, but this is simply one more location which is blocked off from further progress of the industry.

What is more, such sales stimulate that outer fringe of men, those hangers-on to this trade, who believe that they are better off to sell directly and get what they like to call "the long price" than try to convince the average operator of the worth of the equipment they have on hand.

Be it stated here and now to the credit of the greater majority of the members of this trade-that they do not allow their salesmen to sell to location owners.

It has been the pleasure of representatives of The Cash Box to be present many times in the headquarters of both large and small jobbers and distributors when persons unknown to them have entered and questioned about equipment, to note these men turn these people away, especially if they could not answer the very simple question of where they had formerly purchased their machines.

Direct sales hurt all divisions of this trade right down the line from manufacturer to operator. It means that one more location is removed from the province of the trade. It means that one more spot, which would probably continue on as a customer for all in this business, has been completely eliminated.

How can anyone, then, in this industry believe that because he is getting the "long price" for one machine that none in this trade will be hurt? Does any jobber or distributor actually believe that he will find his financial position so tremendously much bettered by the sales of a few single machines to locations?

## TAKE IT EASY

Some months ago, when the first false glimmerings of the "green light" was being announced, the trade rushed headlong into excited ferment. At that time, The Cash Box suggested that the industry-"Take It Easy", for there was as yet plenty of time before such excitement need prevail. The same is as true today, as it was then.

Regardless of the fact that the trade definitely has the green light to go ahead, the manufacturers are trying as hard as they can and as fast as they can, to reconvert back to former products production. No one is more anxious than the coin machine manufacturer to get shipments started once again.

It is truly expensive for a factory to be shut down on war orders and maintain a huge staff of employees doing nothing while engineers tinker and merchandising minds ponder as to when the manufacturer can start shipping. The manufacturer is just as anxious as the most eager distributor in the trade to once again get on the market with his products.

The fact that many coinmen are flocking to the factories at this time is not helping the manufacturers complete their plans. Some of these coinmen are important as operators, jobbers or distributors. The manufacturer does not want to offend them. He certainly does not want to give the impression that he may have gone "high-hat" in any fashion whatsoever.

But, unless some of the coinmen who are now flocking to his offices and keeping him from the very important task of reconversion, take all this into consideration, they are simply going to keep the manufacturers from getting their products to them as speedily as they would like to receive them.

The average manufacturer, even tho he may not as yet have made any announcements in this regard, is reported to be pretty well set about whom he will appoint as his distributors. Usually the average factory already has some distributors from pre-war years. But this is only one of the minor problems today.

The really big and important problem is to get machines started off the production lines. And unless the manufacturer is allowed to devote his time to this effort, he is simply going to be delayed further and still further from the date when he hopes to produce his first new machines.

Those in the trade who are rushing to the Chicago factories and holding the manufacturer from his work for hours at a stretch aren't to be blamed too much either. Most of these men are ready to make large expenditures for new showrooms, offices, etc., acquire new help, start advertising campaigns and do the one and a hundred other things that are necessary to get sales started-as distributors.

There is only one way in which the manufacturer can stop this and that is to make official announcements regarding a showing of his product and at that time extend invitations to those men whom he has under consideration for distributorships of his machines. By making such announcement in advance-he will eliminate much of the irritation which has now been caused.

The entire situation reverts back to the three worded phrase which The Cash Box urged upon the trade some months ago-"Take it easy".

This is the time, while everyone is so much excited and so intense about getting back to normalcy-for the men in this industry to control themselves and to give the manufacturers the opportunity to calmly, coolly and carefully think out all of their production and distribution problems.

Therefore, before you, too, rush on to Chicago, and along with so many others clutter up the waiting rooms of the manufacturers, demand to be seen, irritate engineers and designers, upset many appointments and meetings, delay other necessary work - remember this - "Take It Easy"-you will be called if you are on the list for distributorship consideration. A letter can do just as well right now.

# "TALKING OUT LOUD" 

## REPORT ON THE NEW MACHINES

Concensus of Manufacturers' Opinions as to When the Trade Will Once Again See New Equipment

NEW YORK-From all over the country since V-E Day, and especially after V-J Day, there have been constant and numerous requests received regarding when the trade could expect the new machines to appear on the market.

The Cash Box has attempted many times, because of its contacts with the manufacturers, to answer the trade.

Once again, because so many letters have lately been received by The Cash Box will it attempt to give the industry the answer to this question in the form of a concensus of the opinions of various manufacturers who were contacted this past week.

Most manufacturers believe that volume production of new machines will not become fact until sometime during the first quarter of 1946. That is, anywhere between January and March, 1946.

The likelihood is that March, 1946 (or possibly even later) should be the date which the industry can look to for expecting to see something like prewar volume production once again. This means that there are as yet six full months prior to when the trade can expect to obtain new machines in any quantity.

There is every likelihood, according to the majority of the manufacturers, that samples will be shown to the trade on or about January 1, 1946. Private showings to distributors may come about before this date. A few manufacturers are even of the belief that they will be able to start deliveries of equipment right after this date.

Mr. Optimistic Manufacturer reports, that he will have samples ready to show to the trade on or about January 1, 1946. And will be able to meet first delivery schedules (probably on a ration or quota basis) between that date and March, 1946.

Mr. Conservative Manufacturer reports that the production of new equipment, "is as yet a long way off". He says, "We may, we only say 'we may', be able to show samples on or after January 1, 1946. But from what our suppliers tell us, and with strikes growing thruout the nation, we don't believe that it will pay us to even show samples on that date, for this won't mean that we can make any delivery commitments.
"We doubt very much whether there will be any real production in effect by March, 1946. We can't see how this can come about with the present materials and labor shortages and with the strikes with which every factory is faced."

## NO TOUGHER ASSIGNMENT

CHICAGO-To one who has personally devoted more than forty years to the design, development and production of coin operated equipment it was not at all surprising when the government entrusted our industry with some of the most exacting types of war pro-duction-intricate mechanisms whose perfection might mean the difference between life and death for American service men.
Nor was it surprising to me that so many of the largest coin manufacturers received highest production honors in the form of ArmyNavy "E" awards.
When you can build a coin machine capable of withstanding WILFUL ABUSE you should be capable of meeting any other assignment in the field of design, engineering development or production.

Automobiles, typewriters, calculating machines and all types of office, shop and farm machinery, are naturally abused by users who may be negligent or careless or without proper understanding of their operation and maintenance. But a coin machine, in addition to such normal types of abuse, must also be engineered and constructed to successfully withstand the continual mistreatment of a wilful nature by persons seeking to cheat such de-
vices, as well as the occasional shaking and pounding by those who may not have read the instructions before depositing their coins.
I believe that a coin machine is the only complicated mechanism that is wilfully abused.

I also believe that the average coin machine contains more individual and specifically different parts than any other kind of a machine I have personally examined. A Jennings Chief, for example, contains nearly 1,000 parts, more than we have found in the calculating machines, typewriters, sewing machines, etc., that we have studied in our experimental laboratories in our search for a mechanical device that might be considered comparable to a Chief-type machine.

Furthermore, there is almost no duplication of parts, that is, multiples of the same identical parts, in a Chief-type machine, whereas typewriters and calculating machines contain many multiples of parts of the same kind.

Here at Jennings we have all enjoyed a deep sense of pride and satisfaction in our Army and Navy production awards for successfully producing a variety of intricate equipment, but we have yet to find a tougher assignment than that of designing and producing Chief-type machines that can withstand wilful abuse year after year without serious damage or breakdowns.
To build a good coin operated machine requires imagination, experience, sound planning, expert technical skill and proper materials, plus the desire of the manufacturer to do a good job.


NET YORK - In the July 24, 1945 issue of The Cash Box there appeared a complete reproduction of Representative Charles A. Buckley's bill (H. R. 3190) which was introduced into the House of Representatives in Washington about a month prior to that day. This bill. is now in the House Patents Committee.

The bill was completely explained to the music machine trade in that issue of The Cash Eox. Juke box men were advised that this bill intended to make the music rendered by a juke box - "A PUBLIC PERFORMANCE FOR PROFIT". (The bill itself is intended to amend the Copyripht Act of 1909.)

Should this bill clear the House Patents Comittee, enter the Senate and go thru the Senate, thereby becoming FEDERAL LAW, it would mean that every juke box in the nation would then have to pay ASCAF (American Society of Composers, Authors and Fublishers) a YEARLY LICENSE FEE FOR THE RIGHT TO FLAY THIS ORGANIZATION'S COPYRIGHTED MUSIC.

In the meantime, IPPA (ifasic Fublishers Protective dssociation) can also ask for greater royalties. They owm the songs. lnd, all this additional charge would, most naturally, be slapped onto the juke box operator.

While Congress was on its vacation $2 l l$ seem to have completely forgotten about the Buckley bill. Now that Congress is back in session, it is well for the juke box industry to remember that Rep. Charles h. Buckley's bill is still in the House Patonts Comaittee and wating for an order of business call.

What has the juke box industry done to squelch this bill? The film people got themselves exempted fron this bill. There the entire bill is now directed at the juke box fjeld. HAS THERE BEEN ANY COICERTED ACTION ON TFE PART OF THE JUKI BOZ TRIDE TO WITHHOLD THIS BILL FRON BBCOMIIIG FEDERAL LAW?

## OCT. 4 IS DALLAS' "JUKE BOX DAY"

DALLAS, TEX. - This coming October 4, 1945, is being called "Juke Box Day" by this city's officials and the public generally. On this day the juke box oporators of Dallas will donate the entire proceeds of their machines to the Dallas Nar Chest.

Location owners, too, have entered into the spirit of the occasion and it is believed that this day will provo one of the best for the War Chest. Cards now adorn all juke boxes in this city and the same cards also appear on all the music machines here.

These cards were given to the Dallas music operators by the distributors who called them in and explained the reason for them. The cards road, "Every nickel you put into a juke box will be given to the Dallas War Chest by the music operators and the merchants on October 4, 1945."

There are approximately 1,000 juke boxes in this city and therefore the trade arc of the belief that when the sum total is in it will prove to be one of the biggest donations the War Chest will receive.

## NEW ORLEANS OPS USE TAX PAID SEALS

NEW ORLEANS, LA. - Operators here are using very impressive seals which are being attached to their machines and which read, "All city, state and federal licenses have been paid on this amusement gerne".

This idea is reported to be spreading thruout the entire city and more and more operators are adopting this secil. Coinnen here are of the belief that this seal will help to gain them greater aspect of legality for their equipment in view of the fact that all licenses are paid.

At the sone time this is proving very impressive to the general public who wore quite elated over the large amount of monies collected by this community in coin operated machines licenses. This amounted to well over $\mathbb{W} 1,000,000.00$ this past year.

Some coinmen believe that a drive should be made by distribs here to get all operators to adopt the scal.

ATLANTIC CITY COMPLETE TAX DATA ATLATHIC CITY, N.J. - F. JicKin (Smitty) Smith of this city, who is a firm believer in a "National Tax Council" for the coin machine industry, sends in the complete schedule of taxes for coin operated equipment of all types as now in effect in this city.

The following tax set-up may prove of value to all in this trade. According to Smith, "The $\$ 500.00$ blanket license was put over by the Boardwalk Arcade issociation as we believed a blanket license to be better than $\$ 10.00$ on each machine. There was also a limitation placed on the number of arcades to bo allowed on the boardwalk. The $\$ 500.00$ tax is slightly in excess of the former tax, there being 16 arcades now on the boardwalk."

The list of taxes are as follows: 1) Coin operated amusement arcade consisting of 10 or more coin operated machincs $\$ 500.00$ license required. 2) Individual machines up to 9 at $\$ 10.00$ each per yearly license fee. 3) Bagatelle games (pinball gemes) with 54 coin chutos 25.00 each. 4) Lhasic mechines $\$ 30.00$ per yearly liconse feo. 5) Scales $\$ 1.00$ per year. 6) Cigarette machines $\$ 3.00$ per year. Tho way the ordinance roads - "Any 5 द or more slot machine $\$ 10.00$ per year."
(It is suggested that coinmen who aro always wary of new tax bills being introduced in their commenties should clip this out and save it for future roferonco.)
OPS SEEK OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE
NILES, MICH. - Operators rusiding in this communty are attempting to get a license bill through which will arrange for an "occupational tax" around the $\$ \mathrm{~F}, 000$ mark. These men believe that in this fashion only those who actually reside in this community will then be able to operate here.

Coinmen here are much upset over this and are attempting in evcry fashion possible to squelch this entire drive on the part of these out of state men.
