## "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

One of the very first editorials which appeared in The Cash Box at its inception urged the industry to create a "Public Relations Bureau".

Such a bureau, this medium has continually informed the trade since then, would help to assure the future growth and expansion of this business. It would also help to gain for this field the necessary good will of the public, so that whatever growth will ensue in the post-war period, will be upon a more solid and permanent base.

Originally, The Cash Box foresaw a "Public Relations Bureau" as a division of a "National Board of Trade" for the coin machines industry. It felt at that time and still believes today, that a "Board of Trade" has become most increasingly necessary, if even to just help contain all the divisions of this business under one banner.

There is no doubt that the various divisions of this industry are drifting apart. The amusement machine men are today practically a category in themselves. The music machine division stands away from the rest. The vending machine and service equipment divisions have created their own national organization which now features a public relations bureau of its own.

All these divisions of this industry should have a common meeting ground. If for no other reason than that "in unity there is strength". Such a common meeting ground would be a "National Coin Machines Board of Trade".

Here all associations, as well as non-association minded men, manufacturers, jobbers, distributors, operators, and all firms allied to the coin machine business in any fashion whatsoever, could meet. And by such numerical strength help assure the future growth and development of this trade.

The most important division of such an organization should be a "Public Relations Bureau". Such a bureau would then act for all this trade. As the years have gone by since the first editorials appeared here regarding the need for a "Public Relations Bureau"-the members of the trade have come more and more into the open to urge that it be created as soon as possible.

The Cash Box has also recommended the creation of many other such urgent necessities for the industry. It continues steadfast in its belief that a "National Tax Council" is of the most outstanding importance for the field. A "School for Coin Machine Mechanics" should be created as soon as possible. A "National Credit Bureau" will become a great need, especially two or three years after peacetime production is well under way. The Cash Box especially maintains that this field most desperately requires a National Board of Trade. Such an organization would bind together all in the industry.

There now comes word from Chicago that the C.M.I. is going to make the need for a "Public Relations Bureau" the major subject of discussion at their next meeting. It seems that certain prominent members of this organization have come to the belief that such a bureau will prove of great value to the industry.

Ignorance of this industry by the public's press, and among business men generally, continues to be apparent thruout the nation. It is high time that a Public Relations Bureau came into being to cure this pitiful situation. And, until this condition is cured, there is no possibility that this trade can gain the pinnacle it should long ago have achieved.

All the industry should rally behind the efforts of those manufacturers who desire to bring into being a "Public Relations Bureau". This bureau, should it be created by the C.M.I. at their next meeting, should be immediately coordinated with the bureau already functioning for the vending machine organization. It would be a major progressive step forward for all the industry.

# EXPORT 

It is extremely interesting to note that thruout the country there is a belief among many of the leading distributors and jobbers that they will be able to export the greater majority of the used equipment, which they will take in trade against the purchase of the new machines.

Many of these men are going to be sorely disappointed in their belief. The facts regarding export possibliities do not back them up.

In a long trip thruout the Dominion of Canada, The Cash Box did not meet with any operators or wholesalers eagerly and anxiously waiting to purchase used machines from this country. Canada, along with England, and the rest of Great Britain, have always been the best importers of American coin machines of all types.

Canadians are, instead, anxious to see and buy the new machines. They hope that the American manufacturers will arrange to assemble their equipment in Canada, using Canadian labor, so that the price of the machines to them will be much lower than what they will have to pay to import them across the border. (There is a $100 \%$ duty on the completed machines when they cross into Canada.)

Under present market conditions, tho many Canadians would buy some of the later models in used equipment, especially phonographs, prices are as yet so high that when the Canadian duties are added to the cost, these men are most logical in their statements that they would be better off to wait a few more months until they can obtain new equipment which would probably cost them little more than the price now demanded for the later model used machines.

There is no doubt, tho, that there will be importing of used machines into Canada. But only when prices have come down to that point where it will pay these importers to purchase later model used machines in preference to new equipment.

As far as England and all Europe is concerned there are very few American dollars in balance there at the present time to allow these countries to lift their present import restrictions for such merchandise as coin operated equipment.

Right now these nations are in need of too many of life's necessities to allow whatever dollar balances they may have to be used to import coin operated machines. In fact, it is well known that any luxury item is being held back from shipment by the Europeans themselves, until they can clear away many more important and pressing problems. Europe is at present fighting the economic battle of its life.

As far as South and Central America are concerned, the American dollar balance is very, very heavily in favor of these countries. Yet here, too, there are many problems involved before volume shipments of coin machines can be made.

First of all, most of the South and Central American countries do not have the hard coinage necessary to allow for popular use of coin operated machines. As far as most amusement devices are concerned, most of these nations have many officials with which coinmen have to contend and which involves much political wrangling.

Perhaps music machines will get started in South America, as they have in Mexico, in much larger numbers than ever before. But this will require much pioneering effort. This means the kind of expense the average distributor is not too anxious to involve himself in at this time.

It is best, therefore, to remember that as far as export is concerned, Canada, Australia, Mexico, New Zealand, and perhaps England (if and when the dollar restriction in this latter country is lifted) will be the only possibilities in the near future.

But a great many problems have yet to be solved before even these countries will purchase in sufficient quantities to even somewhat decrease the tremendous stocks of used machines which are bound to accumulate when trading towards the purchase of the new machines gets under way.

 our Radio-Phonograph division, a man well known to the music operators over the nation. We know that our product, coupled with Mr. Greenbaum's proven ability, cannot fail to be a winning team, both for us and for all the music operators."

Altho newcomers to the field of automatic phonos, Aireon has a worldwide reputation in the manufacture of all electronic and audio-productive instruments. As prime contractors to both the Army and the Navy during the war, the firm's factories in Kansas City, Burbank, Chicago, Slater, Mo., Greenwich, Conn., Oklahoma City and San Francisco, produced hundreds of thousands of radio transmitters and receivers, all types of radio communication equipment, hydraulic aircraft controls, radio crystal products, radio antennae and radar devices. As a result, the firm is reported to possess a wealth of knowledge and experience on which to draw for peacetime production.

NEW YORK - The Phonette, non-selective wall boxes, adapted to telephone music, it is reported, will be manufactured for the Personal Music Corp., 1697 Broadway, this city, and with offices also at 127 N. Dearborn St., Chicago, Ill., by the C-O Two Manufacturing Corp., Newark, N. J. This latter firm is a subsidiary of the Pyrene Manufacturing Company, also of Newark.

President of the firm is H. F. Dennison, who is at the present time reported to be in California contacting music coinmen there. The report is that the firm will set up their own telephone music studios and will arrange for these services to music machine men who will purchase the Phonettes. Choice of 1c or 5 c wall boxes will be given the purchaser.

As yet no further details have been made public but it is believed that complete information will soon be available.

## ARCADE PRAISED FOR NEWSPAPER ADS

NEW ORLEANS, LA. - Louis Boasberg's Penny Arcade at 620 Canal St., this city, has won much good comment from officials and the public here because of the very liberal donations which this amusement spot has made to every public effort.

During the Red Cross, USO drive and the China Relief Fund drive, as well as all other charitable and community spirited drives, the Penny Arcade has been among the first to offer to donate its receipts from its games for these funds. Not only was the offer made to the charities themselves, but openly advertised at the expense of the arcade in the local newspapers.

Other newspaper advertisements of the Penny Arcade urged joining the Air Forces, buying War Bonds and Stamps, and backed various community causes. It is believed that the Penny Arcade is one of the largest and finest of its kind in the country. It has won much praise from coinmen in this area for the fine work it has done and is doing.

## SKOLSKY TELLS OF PIN-BALL CARTOON

HOLLYWOOD, CALIF. - Sidney Skolsky, widely read and noted movie reporter, in his column, "Hollywood Is My Beat", reports that a cartoon in one magazine shows the big boss talking to thousands of workers in overalls at a plant.

The boss says, "Boys, now we have to put our shoulder to the wheel. Forget airplanes, turn out pin-ball machines the way we used to."

## SUGGESTS METAL PLATES FOR CASH BOXES

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J. - F. McKim Smith of Smith's Gameland, this city, urges that all manufacturers arrange to better protect cash boxes in the new machines by use of metal plates.

Smith writes, "During the past summer our arcade machines were broken into many times and either the money or the entire cash box was taken. This was done during our business hours, and I understand the 'kids' who robbed the machines worked in pairs or groups.
"In most cases only a screwdriver was used to knock a hole thru the wood and then either bend the cam on the lock back or knock it off completely. After 22 machines were robbed we decided to make the machines burglar-proof.
"Accordingly we had two pieces of metal made, $1 / 8$ " thick, $21 / 2$ " by $21 / 2$ " with just enough room for the lock; the top piece $1^{\prime \prime}$ by $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. Both pieces were bolted on and fitted close together where the door joins. This eliminated future theft.
"It is my belief that such pieces of metal can be incorporated into the manufacture of all new machines, fitted in, and when painted cannot be detected from the wood. It would certainly prevent machines being broken into in the above fashion."

## CIGGIES HARD TO GET, OP REPORTS

DOUGLAS, WYO. - Bryan Edwards of Radio \& Electric Service, this city, complains that his firm haven't been able to obtain cigarettes for their vending machines to take care of their route.

Edwards reports, "We do not know what experience other operators of cigarette machines may have had with wartime conditions, but many may have duplicated our own experience.
"We are getting our shipments thru a wholesale grocery firm. When the shortage came they appropriated our quota and we have been getting five cartons twice per month, or less than 2 per cent of our former amount. Why they even send the five cartons we never did understand.
"Our investigation indicates that cigarettes went to whoever bought groceries in satisfactory quantities. We supplied a majority of the cigarettes locally and the result is that this locality has been unusually short on smokes, and still is, even tho in surrounding towns cigarettes are back on the shelves again.
"Looks like the moral here is that we had better get on the direct shipment list for cigarettes. We understand that operators who were on the direct list received very fair treatment."

## PAUL AND PRICE N. Y. DISTRIBS FOR U-NEED-A

NEW YORK - Leo Willens, sales director for U-Need-A-Vendors, Inc., Union City, N. J., announces that Lester L. Paul and Alfred A. Price are New York state distributors for the firm. Their territory also includes the metropolitan New York City area. The new distributors have formed the U-Need-A-Sales with offices at 625 Tenth Ave., this city. (This was reported in the September 24 issue of The Cash Box.)

Paul has had a great many years of experience in the cigarette machine field, going back to the old Stewart \& McGuire firm. He interrupted his activities in the vending machine field by going to Detroit where he represented the Mutual Benefit Co. of Omaha for three years.

Price was formerly associated with the Hudson Cigarette Service as manager. He is thoroly experienced in the operating business. Prior to that he was sales agent for one of the large auto factories.

# C. M. I. OPEN NEW OFFICES OCT. 15 

CHICAGO - The Coin Machine Industry Association will be occupying new offices in the Metropolitan Building, 134 North La Salle Street, Room 508, on or about October 15. James Gilmore continues as CMI's manager.

This is a welcome back to the CMI organization which was inactive during the war. Trade members will now be able to once again visit with Jim Gilmore at the organization's new offices and will also be able to obtain information regarding the various manufacturer members.

## C. M. A. PROTECTING LOCATIONS

NEW YORK - The Cigarette Merchandisers Association, this city, which continues under the able direction of Matthew Forbes, reports that it has devised a plan to protect the locations of all of its members.

Working under the premise that the location is the most important asset of any operation, organization members have agreed to keep all locations covered with machines. Formerly, when a member removed a machine from any location, he simply notified the organization's headquarters and for a period of six months no other member was allowed to take over that location.

Today, with so many newcomers entering the field and with some non-association members now becoming active, the organization has decided to keep all locations covered with machines. If a member decides against one of his machines remaining in any certain location, he immediately notifies the association which, in turn, sends out a bulletin to all of its members and if the member pulling the machine doesn't designate some other member for the location, any of the others who may want the spot are allowed to take it.
"The psychology", Forbes explains, "is that an empty location invites easy placement. And even tho such a spot can be threatened by picketing, etc., when a machine is already in the location, other members who may want it won't have so difficult a problem of selling the location owner."

## POLKAS OUTJUMP JITTER JUMPERS

NEW YORK - Science now reports that the old fashioned Polkas have it all over jitterbug jump music. In a test made on a vibration meter at the General Electric Company, Polka dancers set this meter to jumping at a 30 per cent speedier rate than did the hottest of the modern jitterbugging.

The Polka registered 170 mills per second vibration on this meter, while the most torrid of the hot versions of jitterbugging registered 120 mills per second.

## VAUGHN MONROE WANTS OPS TO CET DISKS

NEWARK, N. J. - Vaughn Monroe, noted ork pilot, now playing at the Adams Theatre in this city, reported while at a gathering of coinmen in celebration of band leader Ernie Krickett's 20 years in the ork biz at Sonny Carroll's nitespot in this city that, "It is my hope the juke box operators will get more records from now on. We have just made a tune which we hope Victor will release in the largest possible numbers to music machine men." Vaughn Monroe believes that juke boxes are the best bet for band leaders to gain them the widest possible fame.

## COLUMNIST ACAINST JUKE IN EATERY

NEW YORK - Robert W. Dana, who writes the column "Tips on Tables" for the World-Telegram of this city, seems to have an aversion against juke boxes in intimate dining spots. In his column (Monday, Sept. 24) he writes about the "Tiger Lily" an intimate eating spot at 141 E. 45 th St., this city, owned by Barbara Kelly, reporting, "Miss Kelly, bless her heart, is not too sold on the virtues of the juke box and intends to get rid of it in the future. In its place she will have some intimate entertainment, perhaps a pianist who can sing the sentimental numbers you love so much."
(Editors Note: Whoever the operator is in this spot, he should have made a much better study of its musical needs, and perhaps used entirely different records than he is using at this time. He should also be sure that the amplification is kept at low pitch. A "Public Relations Bureau", were there one in existence for this industry at this time, could most assuredly convince Mr. Dana that juke boxes do belong in "cozy spots" for they can offer "the sentimental numbers you love so much".)

## CHARLEY ROSEN BACK WITH OHIO SPEC.

LOUISVILLE, KY. - Charley Rosen, who served in the U. S. Navy all during the war, is now reported to be once again rejoining his former firm as manager of the Louisville office. Charley writes that he

## NEWSPAPER VENDER GETS SUBWAY TEST

NEW YORK - A newspaper vending machine, which will handle up to 200 papers and will give change for a nickel will receive its first public test at one of the Independent Subway stations.

The designer of the machine is Samuel Leschin of 425 Fifth Ave., this city, a milliner by trade, but with a long history for inventions. The new machine will be tested by the Interborough News Company and if it passes all tests Mr. Leschin reports that he will go into immediate production. He plans to turn out 40,000 of these newspaper venders in 1946.

The vender itself is made entirely of metal. It is painted a bright red and trimmed with chrome. It stands six feet high, is two feet wide and two feet deep.

This is not the first newspaper vender introduced by Mr. Leschin. Twelve years ago, he reports, he turned one out in his spare time but never attempted to interest anyone in the machine. Among his other creations, he claims, is the first cigarette vending machine which he says he built twenty years ago.

## WURLITZER RELEASES WAR SECRET

NORTH TONAWANDA, N. Y. - With the lifting of the Army-Navy veil of secrecy on "a secret weapon second only to the atomic bomb", the vital role played by this division of The Rudolph Wurlitzer Company has been revealed. The weapon is a radio-operated fuse, for which the power generating unit designed by Wurlitzer engineers was selected by U. S. military technicians as standard for all production of this type of equipment for use in bombs and rockets.

Adoption of the Wurlitzer created power unit was based upon its dependability in operation, suitability for quantity production and less expensive manufacture. Refinements and improvements in the original basic design of the fuse were effected thru Wurlitzer electronics and radar engineers. These contributed substantially to the tremendous volume of production achieved by several manufacturers. Wurlitzer itself held one of the largest contracts in existence at the time government orders were terminated.

## W. VA. MUSIC OPS FIGHT II P. M. CLOSING

CHARLESTON, W. VA. - Juke box men are engaged in a test case to combat the 11 P.M. closing rule for music machines. The constitutionality of this section of the Beer Act of 1945 regulating juke boxes will be tested in the Kanawha County common pleas court. A hearing has been set before Judge Ritchie for Oct. 16.

Judge Chas. Ritchie has directed Magistrate Forest Sevy to show cause why he should not be restrained from trying Roy K. Morris, operator of a roadhouse, who instituted a challenge by filing a petition for a writ of prohibition following his arrest for playing a juke box during prohibited hours.

The new act provides that the juke boxes cannot be operated after 11 P.M. on week days. Morris contended that the law discriminates against one type of musical entertainment while a band or orchestra is free to carry on at anytime.

Juke box operators are watching the case very closely. They believe that the chances for them to overcome this 11 P.M. closing, since orchestras and bands can play after that time, are very good. They also feel that Judge Charles Ritchie will bear with them when he hears all the pleas in this case.

Altho initial versions of the radio-operated "VT fuse" proved effective for military use, certain improvements were found necessary for the fuses used in bombs and rockets. Extremely low temperature conditions imposed by high altitude operations required a power source that would be impervious to extreme cold. In meeting this need, Wurlitzer engineers collaborated in the development of a winddriven generator which is unaffected by atmospheric conditions.

> Also, a part of the fuse is a five tube "radio" tiny enough to fit easily into a tea cup. Production of this device depended upon advanced technical skill and precision which would assure unfailing operation. New scientific apparatus had to be developed, procured and tested, both for the component parts of the assembly and for the thoro inspection of units, before delivery to the armed forces.

A key weapon in combating Jap Kamikaze attacks, as well as knocking out V-Bombs over London and turning back the dynamic Nazi offensive on the Western front last winter, the radiocontrolled VT employs radar principles, causing the projectile to explode automatically within 70 feet of its target.

The Wurlitzer plant here participated in the development and production program of the VT fuse for more than three years. Wurlitzer was one of the first concerns selected by the National Defense Research Committee, a division of the Officき of Scientific Research and Development, to manufacture the weapon.

Approximately 400 VT's were produced daily in September, 1942 and early in '45, 40,000 a day were rolling off the assembly lines of American manufacturers. Concurrently the unit cost of the weapon had dropped from $\$ 40$ to $\$ 18$. A saving to which the developments of Wurlitzer engineers made an appreciable contribution.

Ten members of the North Tonawanda's executive and engineering personnel were recently honored when certificates attesting to their part in the furtherance of the nation's war effort were presented by the Office of Scientific Research and Development. Instrumental in this recognition was the meritorious work done in the development of the VT fuse.

Altho few Wurlitzer employees knew that they were engaged on one of the most vital projects of the war, they accounted for one of the most outstanding production records of American industry. Many workers, whose previous experience involved no more ability than to sew or drive an automobile, became expert assemblers and inspectors on one of the most critical scientific developments in the history of warfare.
