CONSIDER THE BUYER

All during the war years coinmen continued on ahead regardless of the hardships encountered in lack of men, materials, supplies, gas and tire rationing, etc., with the thought in mind that some day there would again be new equipment—which would build for a new and better business.

Jumping from this to the fact that never before in Chicago's history have there been so many visitors interested in purchasing equipment, clears the point that will be made as this item goes along. And almost everyone of these Chicago visitors are all ready to do business with cash in hand. All are eager to get going again. And all are predicting that the coming years will be the very greatest in the history of the coin machine industry.

Yet there is still noticeable an undercurrent return to some former poor business practices. There is that certain something in the atmosphere which seems to say, "For the first year or so the boys will buy anything. Get it on the market and let's get the cash." This is a reversion to former methods, which those who worked so hard and diligently to outlast the war, had hoped would be forgotten.

It must also be stated, in all fairness to those firms who are planning ahead further than just a quick clean-up—that such firms are entering into the new era with the one outstanding thought in mind — "the long pull".

This is just what the men in this trade want. They must have manufacturers, distributors, jobbers and operators who are planning far ahead — not just for tomorrow — but for many years to come. And in this way the average man in this business will be assured of the greatest possible progress.

It is poor business to believe that those men in this industry who outlasted this war want to once again contend with the sort of men who are only interested in a quick clean-up. These men have come to the point where they have solidified themselves, both financially and commercially. Today, the average operator is in control of better locations and more territory than ever before in his career. Nor is he going to allow this control to get out of his hands.

This is therefore the time when the leaders in this business must recognize the fact that this industry is at last beginning to grow up. Those men who continued thru the darkest period in the history of this nation have proved that they have the gumption to make this a greater business. They have also proved to all this industry that they have the ingenuity and the intelligence to continue this business thruout so dark and dismal a period—and naturally can do much better during better times.

The rush is on—to Chicago. But this rush should not be allowed to become a stampede. It should, instead, be carefully held back and controlled so as to protect the basic sales factor, just as is being done today in every industry.

In this industry the basic sales factor is the operator. The man who must get the machines to locations. He should not be overlooked in this rush. In fact, he should be given the most complete consideration. His rights should be protected in every possible fashion. He should get the new machines before any other newcomers receive them.

The manufacturers are completely occupied with the creation of good merchandising organizations. This is no more than right. But in the creation of these sales organizations the manufacturer should also give more consideration to the outlets which he will create and which will protect his many operator friends thruout the entire industry. Be it stated here and now that almost every manufacturer, without exception, is doing this with every appointment he is making.

The buyer is being considered. He is being given all the cooperation and help which the manufacturers can arrange for in advance by appointing the proper distributors and jobbers to handle his business and to help him in every possible fashion. The operator must receive this sort of consideration—he is the backbone upon which this industry is building for its greatest future — he is the customer. And — the customer is always right.

L. A. OPS. WARNED ABOUT SLUGGERS

LOS ANGELES, CAL. — Samuel (Curley) Robinson, director of the Associated Operators of Los Angeles County, Inc., has just rushed a bulletin to all members warning that due to the wave of chiselers, drillers and reamers operating in Los Angeles County, coinmen had best defend themselves.

The organization advises its members to: "1) Shield games on the inside with thick glass or heavy sheets of metal that cannot be drilled. 2) The doors on certain games can be manipulated in such manner that locks can be opened. As an added precaution, double locks should be used for these types of games. 3) Acquaint your proprietors with the importance of securing motor vehicle license numbers whenever they are suspicious of any individuals".

Enclosed with this bulletin was the following paster which can be glued underneath the glass of the machines. It looks and reads exactly as follows:

WARNING

\$1000.00 fine or five years imprisonment is the penalty for using slugs or any substitute for money in this machine. Section 5462, Revised Statutes of the United States; Section 282, Title 18, United States Code, Annotated. This also is a violation of Section 640a, Penal Code of the State of California.

Any theft or attempt at theft of the contents of this machine will be criminally prosecuted under authority of People vs. Walker, 33 Cal. App. (2d) 18.

WANTS SCALES LISTED IN "BLUE BOOK"

DURHAM, N. C. — L. F. LeStourgeon of Southern Music Co., this city, suggests that The Cash Box include a listing of all scales and their prices in its "Coin Machine Industry Blue Book".

MARCUS TELLS ABOUT OP PROTECTION IN '34

CLEVELAND, O. — Meyer M. Marcus of The Markepp Co., this city, sends in some articles he wrote in 1934 wherein he stressed protection for bonafide operators so that locations would not be sold directly.

In July, 1934, Marcus wrote an article, "Pioneering a Movement to Protect Operators", wherein he discussed his reasons for protecting the bonafide operator by not selling to location owners. Prior to selling to some unknown firm, or some person who had written to him and whom he had never heard about in the trade, he would contact coinmen in the same vicinity and learn just who the inquirer was. In this way he was able to keep from selling direct to location owners in almost every case.

In August, 1934, Marcus wrote an article entitled, "Operators Must Help to Protect Locations". In this article he stated, "The trouble has been that jobbers thruout the country are so eager for business that they will sell a used machine to anybody who writes in with cash enclosed. Of course I don't blame the jobber when he has no way of knowing whether this is an operator or a location.

"At this time I am going to ask the support of the operators thruout the United States who are in the field all of the time and whom the jobbers are hurting every day unwittingly. If Mr. Operator will cooperate with the jobbers thruout the country I am positive that they will return the cooperation by getting these storekeepers off their lists entirely and refusing to sell them."

(Ed Note: It seems that ten years isn't long enough to get some of the men to stop advertising and selling where location owners will get the equipment and know its prices.)

PHONO PRESENTED AS MEMORIAL

NASHVILLE, TENN. — Searching for a suitable memorial in honor of Theodore E. Chandler, first executive officer of the famed cruiser USS Nashville, who died on the Bridge of his Flagship during the naval action at the Lingayen landings as a result of a Kamikaze attack, the Nashville Banner, on



behalf of the citizens of Nashville, Tenn. recently presented the crew of the Nashville with a Wurlitzer phonograph and more than one hundred of the latest records.

The machine bears a handsomely engraved plate embellished with naval insignia, and is inscribed "In Memory of Rear Admiral T. E. Chandler, U.S.N., USS Nashville. Presented by Nashville Banner, 1945."

Lowell E. Matthews of G. & S. Distributing Co., Wurlitzer distributors in this city, who worked with the Nashville Banner in obtaining the phono claims "This is the first time that an automatic phonograph has served as a memorial to a naval officer, and no member of the Nashville's crew can ever play the machine without seeing the plate inscribed on its front, honoring the memory of the one-time commander who so gallantly died in action."

DENTIST USES RECORDED MUSIC

NEW YORK — Miss Lillian Callif, Staff Writer for the World-Telegram, after a visit to a mid-town dentist, reports on the use of music installed for the benefit of the patients. Dr. Norman Green, an exsoldier, evolved the technique of working while his patients listen to recordings or radio programs about four months ago.

After experimenting with various systems, this dentist finally hit on the plan of installing easily adjustable head-phones. The patient, concentrating on the music is entirely relaxed, and the dentist isn't disturbed by the program.

Each patient selects the type of recordings they desire: light classics, operettas, tunes with special lyrics for children, etc.

This type of operation would fit in easily with telephone music, and could prove to be a very profitable operation on a rental basis.

1st POST-WAR GAME IN TWIN CITIES

MINNEAPOLIS, MINN. — Ken C. Willis of the Bush Distributing Company, Minneapolis, Minn. writes "I am not much of a hand to blow my top, but I must let you know about the reaction to the first machine to hit the Twin Cities that was manufactured in Chicago since the war ended. We immediately sent out 100 telegrams to our operators in our distributing area. The response was immediate, which goes to prove that the post war market is and will be tremendous. This particular machine is wrapped in the most beautiful cabinet you can imagine, and if this is a true example of what all machines are to be like, we can have no doubt in our mind that the coin machines business will be better than we ever estimated."

In Vancouver, B. C. quite a few Game Lands (Arcades) are doing very well, but have to contend with an inflation of population and store keepers. Arcades have been notified to move when their leases expire, and cannot find any new locations. Wire music operations are doing very well, and two new studios have been installed recently.

Victoria, B. C., which is situated on the Island of Vancouver, is one of the best operating territories in Canada. One-balls and Consoles get a big play all year round, due to the ideal climate which brings as many tourists during the summer months as visit during the winter months.
