## THE PROMOTERS ARE BACK AGAIN by Bill Gersh

As was predicted some months ago, the promoters, those men whose business it is to instantly sense a booming revival period and take full advantage of it, are back in the industry again.

A very short while ago, leading coinmen in one of the nation's largest cities, received letters from a person unknown to them who wrote that he had been offered exclusive distribution for an automatic phono for a territory covering 27 states, and that all he needed was money to back up his share of the deal.

Naturally, the investors were to profit with him to a certain extent, after he obtained the deal. But, this city being rather famous for promotional deals of every nature, most coinmen read the letter and forgot about it.

More and more shrewd manipulators, who have been closely watching the coin machine business all during the wartime period, are going to enter into this field and are going to promote gobs of good cash their way-unless, of course, coinmen continue alert and watch every maneuver made in their direction.

This period, this interim, between the actual manufacture of equipment and official announcements by the firms who will be in this business, is the period when promoters can work their wiles to best advantage. All the trade is hopped up in its belief that there will be dozens of new manufacturers of all types of equipment.

It is therefore very simple for a shrewd promoter to enter into any community, phone coinmen to come to his hotel suite, show official looking papers and blueprints, ask questions and explain that he represents a very large industrialist now planning to enter into the manufacture of coin operated machines.

This may sound far fetched to some of the old timers in this industry-but it actually happened just a short time ago in one city. There are too many men extremely and eagerly anxious to become distributors to make careful and complete investigation prior to becoming entranced by some silver tongued promoter.

This urge to be a distributor will cost many men in this industry much good, hard earned cash, unless they watch their step, as the promoters enter the field. And there are now more and more of these men popping up every day everywhere in the industry.

For example, one noted Midwestern coinman almost fell for a story from one smooth gent who, after calling him to a large suite in the town's leading hotel, showed him all sorts of contracts and papers relative to the creation of a recording firm to make records exclusively for juke box operators.

Naturally, this would interest any coinman engaged in a large music machine operation. And so this coinman was very much interested. But, his common sense prevailed, and he asked his Better Business Bureau to investigate. As this Bureau started its investigation-the promoter disappeared.

Cited here are only two instances which have cropped up in the past month or so. Others are coming in every day. For example, there is now a rumor that a certain "very large and powerful organization" is planning to enter into the automatic phono manufacturing business. According to this rumor -they have already obtained a license, and have even purchased some patents outright.

But, instead of just creating distributors on the regular and recognized basis, they are going to allow these prospective distributors to also invest in the company itself by buying a certain amount of stock, proportionate to the size of the deal necessary for the individual's territory.

In short, the distributor will not only profit from the regular sale of the music machines, but he is also going to be counted in on the manufacturing profits of the firm by his purchase of a number of shares of stock in that firm. "And in this way", as this story comes to us, this promoter stated to a leading coinman whom he wanted to have as an investing-distributor, "we shall all of us be one big, happy family".

Another outstanding example was a visitor to the offices of The Cash Box who entered to receive information relative to the beverage dispensing field. After some discussion he produced papers showing (at least he so thought) that he had just purchased a large interest in one of the leading beverage dispensing machine firms. "In fact", he stated, "I actually own this firm. I put plenty into it."

With the most irritating regularity, these past weeks, have incidents of this type been reported to The Cash Box. It is therefore the suggr.ion of this medium that any men representing themselves as interested in the field from the standpoint of preparing to manufacture, and seeking more information regarding products and distribution and merchandising methods, be first asked to produce credentials before any investments or information of any kind be given them.

It may seem rather innocent to the average coinman to give all sorts of information to one of these men, who will most profusely thank him and usually also advise him that when the firm are ready to make official announcement as to just who they are, as well as show their product, that he will be among the very first to be called to the factory and given every consideration for distribution.

As innocent as this seems, coinmen must remember that this is exactly how these promoters learn just what the members of this industry desire most. They then turn about and enter into the territories where they are more familiar with conditions. And now, knowing just what the trade demands, they call on coinmen with an entirely different story.

More and more of these promoters, seemingly representing secret and powerful industrial interests, are going to be entering into the field and calling on various coinmen. It will be up to the individual who is approached to smell out the foul from the good.

During this interim between the rumors of, and actual production, words spreads like wildfire throuout the trade everytime someone whispers that another new firm is in the field. Certain coinmen actually seem to vie with each other as to how many "new firms" they know are entering this trade. So far coinmen have heard of every large auto manufacturer being in the coin machine business, including dozens of other manufacturing titans engaged in the electrical and radio fields.

It would be much better for all coinmen to wait until these large and reputable organizations actually make official announcements to such effect. One rumor is spreading, with great regularity, and which has not been confirmed, that General Motors is most definitely in the coin machine business. Not only are they going to manufacture an automatic phonograph, but also a drink dispenser, and dozens of other products.

If the story continues to spread any further (and becomes more enlarged with each telling) it will probably have this gigantic organization, this billion dollar industrial empire, giving up their automobile business entirely and becoming completely engaged in the manufacture and sale of coin operated equipment.

Such rumors are bound to capture an audience these days. Coinmen are so close to the time when they believe the new machines will enter into the picture - and even more anxious to see these new machines and the "hundreds of new manufacturers" they believe will also enter into the business - that every little rumor is today magnified to tremendous proportions.

It is the hope of The Cash Box that the members of this industry will continue to remain cool and calm and not ruffle their good judgment with unfounded rumor. Actual production of new equipment in any volume whatsoever, even by the old line manufacturing firms well known to all in the industry, is as yet some months away. Surely, then, any new firms first entering into the process of preparing to manufacture would be a great many more months from production. And, therefore, it would be best for the trade to wait until such firms actually announce themselves.

New firms, especially large and well established organizations, are always eager to publicly announce themselves and their intentions. And until such time-it is best for the industry to remember-the promotors are back again.

## CAL. OPS. ASSN. FIGHTS BUCKLEY BILL

OAKLAND, CALIF. - The music operators of California have been studying the Charles A. Buckley Bill (H.R. 3190) and realize that if passed it could most certainly put the operators of phonographs in a very unfavorable position, and greatly affect their earnings. The only way to defeat this proposed legislation is to take action immediately against the possibility of its passage, and the California operators have opened fire. (The Buckley Bill, which appeared in its complete form in the July 24 issue, would make the music rendered by a juke box "A Public Performance For Profit," and every juke box in the nation would have to pay ASCAP a yearly license fee for the right to play this organization's copyrighted music.)

George A. Miller, President of the California Music Operators Association, 128 E. 14th St., Oakland, Calif., working thru the association, and thru its individual members, is bringing the attention of their Representatives and Senators from California to the bill, and requesting that they help in defeating the measure.

The motion picture industry, thru its powerful lobby in Washington, was able to have a section inserted in the Buckley Bill exempting them from paying this license fee. Surely, a concerted effort by the music machine industry would go a long way to defeat this discriminatory bill.

## TRY REMEDY FOR LOCATION SALES

AKRON, O. - One of the most important problems uppermost in the minds of the operator is the practice of some money-hungry concerns who sell direct to the location. The Cash Box has brought up this matter on various occasions, and warned the trade of the dire results that are bound to follow, affecting the welfare of the entire trade.

The Summit County Automatic Music Operators Association of Akron, O. has taken steps to stop this practice in their territory. Joe Elfant, President of the Association, explains the policy they have adopted. Elfant writes "Many thanks for the fine cartoon and editorial concerning that old skeleton in the closest, 'Direct Sales.' We feel that this editorial will tend to tell the jobbers and other violators in plain language just how the operators feel."
"We here in Akron" continues Elfant "have gone just a step farther and will pass the info on as it may be of help to others. We have obtained definite proof of direct sales by two jobbers in our immediate district. This was submitted as evidence at our association meeting. We then drafted a resolution, signed by each member, pledging not to conduct any business of any kind whatsoever with the offending companies for the period of sixty days. Any violation would immediately invoke a fine of $\$ 100.00$ maximum. This of course followed a statement of our grievance in resolution form. This was sent to the offending companies and we are awaiting the reaction. I personally feel that when these companies weigh the loss of business of fourteen bona-fide operators for 60 days against an occasional sale here and there, even at a long profit, they will think twice, if for no other reason than not wanting our combined business to go to their competitors. We hope that this will minimize if not cure this condition in our zone of influence."

Elfant also writes that the SCAMOA has sent the proper letters of protest to the proper people regarding the Charles A. Buckley Bill. They feel that this is a very important crisis in the industry, and that all others should do the same thing.

## MILLS SALES CO., LTD., BUSY

OAKLAND, CALIF. - The Mills Sales Co., Ltd., of this city, is keeping its entire organization busy answering letters and personal calls from operators who are showing increasing interest in new machines.
Warren H. Taylor writes that particular interest at this moment is centered in the new Mills Slot,
Black Cherry Bell.
A. H. Bouterious, general manager, at the present time is in Chicago, completing arrangements for the speediest possible delivery of these machines, as well as other machines which will be handled by the firm. The firm is also distributing the Pre-Flight Trainer thruout the Pacific Coast.

Meanwhile, the parts and service department of Mills Ltd. is being greatly enlarged. "It is our intention" claims Taylor "to have the most complete selection of parts available so that operators may have the fastest and most efficient service offered by any company in any part of the country."

# A.M.I. BUYS DuGRENIER 

HAVERHILL, MASS. - Arthur H. DuGrenier, Inc., this city, announced this week that all of the capital stock of the company was purchased by the Automatic Instrument Co. from Frank C. DuGrenier and Miss Blanche E. Bouchard.

The new owners, headed by John W. Haddock, President, do not contemplate any changes in personnel, except that Frank DuGrenier and Miss Bouchard retired as officers following the sale of their stock. Mr. DuGrenier will continue his association with the company as a consulting engineer.

The DuGrenier Company will operate as a separate division of the Automatic Instrument Co., and the only announcement that was made was that Burnhart "Bip" Glassgold undertakes the direct


Burnhart "Bip" Glassgold management of the DuGrenier business as Vice-President and General Manager with Paul Kyburg as Assistant General Manager. The other officers are Mr. Haddock, President; Henry Boston, Secretary and Treasurer; and Kyburg, Assistant Secretary and Treasurer. Director include Haddock and Boston, and H. J. Dowd, S. R. Farny, and S. J. Allie.

Automatic Instrument Company made this purchase as a step in the expansion program of its new management because of its strong belief both in the opportunities presented by the vending machine field and in the strength of the DuGrenier position in the field.

Mr. Haddock stated that it was the intention of the new owners to strive constantly to produce finer automatic merchandisers and to stand squarely behind all DuGrenier products in service. ## WURLITZER TO ESTABLISH EXPORT DEPT.

NORTH TONAWANDA, N. Y. - Official announcement has been made by M. G. Hammergren, Wurlitzer Vice-President and General Sales Manager, that the North Tonawanda Division of the Rudolph Wurlitzer Company will establish its own Export Department as of January 1st, 1946. According to David O. Lee, Wurlitzer Export Manager, the Department will render direct support to Wurlitzer customers and associates outside the borders of the United States, and aggressively promote the sales of three major Wurlitzer lines in world markets.

Products to be handled include Wurlitzer Automatic Phonographs and related Auxiliary and Remote Control Equiment, the new Wurlitzer Orgatron, an electronic organ, and a yet-to-be announced line of Automatic Soft Drink Vending Machines bearing the Wurlitzer name.

KANSAS CITY, KANS. - Randolph C. Walker, president of Aireon Manufacturing Corp., announced that they are sponsoring a series of twenty weekly broadcasts by the Kansas City Philharmonic Orchestra, with Efrem Kurtz conducting.

The series will, be known as the Aireon Philharmonic Hour of the Air, and will be heard over station KMBC at 7:30 Tuesday nights, the first being broadcast on October 25. The program is for onehalf hour.

A few days prior to signing up for this series of broadcasts, the Aireon Manufacturing Corp. completed negotiations to lease the Kansas City food market terminal, a site including over a half million square feet, and shall centralize its production activities in one huge area. Wholly-owned subsidiaries of Aireon include its Industrial Electronic Research Laboratory, Greenwich, Conn.; Cinaudagraph Speakers, Inc., and Oxford-Tartak Co., Chicago, and Midco Tool and Supply Co., Oklahoma City. Its hydraulic division is at Burbank, Calif.

In addition to manufacturing an automatic phonograph, the Aireon Mfg. Corp., will manufacture railroad radio communication equipment and radio transmitters and receivers for all types of fixed and mobile equipment.

## HOLAC ASKS TAX REDUCTION

LOS ANGELES, CALIF. - Acting for the Associated Operators of Los Angeles County, Inc. Samuel (Curley) Robinson wired the House Ways and Means Committee, several senators and congressmen at Washington, D. C. presenting an urgent plea to have Section 3267, Internal Revenue Code, repealed so that the special war time tax on pin balls and amusement machines would be lifted.

Seventeen wires to the Washington lawmakers carried this message: "This association represents 15,000 small merchants and tavern owners throughout California who have been paying the Treasury Department $\$ 100.00$ per year for each pin ball machine operated in their establishments. This was a wartime measure designed to help defray wartime expenses. We now understand that the House Ways and Means Committee is going to recommend as to the removal of special tax on jewelry, liquor and automobile use tax, but nothing is recommended as to the removal of special wartime tax on pin ball and amusement machines which is a direct tax on merchants and not consumers. In behalf of our members, we urge your efforts in having Section 3267 Internal Revenue Code repealed so that we may also be freed of this burdensome tax."

## SOLDIERS LIKE LONG HAIR MUSIC

NEW YORK CITY - Peter Witt, for the past three years musical director of the Armed Forces Radio Service, returned to civilian life, and reports on the kind of music the service men liked best.

He said that after the project had flown its millionth record in bombers to wherever the men were, Kiska, Guadalcanal, Europe, Africa, a vote was taken, and high score went to a poem by Elizabeth Barrett Browning, read by Dame May Whitty. That nation's soldiers, he insisted, are not coming back the same men they were when they went away. Now they want Beethoven, Shastakovitch, Schubert

In the beginning, claims Witt, they had to find out what the boys liked. They gave them everything from jive to hymns. He kept the programs balanced, voices and orchestra. And when the final tally was made, the longhair music was given preference.

Roy McGinnis of Baltimore, Md., another horse fancier, was Lew's guest at the show and his enthusiasm was unbounded. "In all my life" raved Roy "I have never seen anything so beautiful and so perfect and I have been fooling with horses all my life."


## TAX BUG BITES 2 OP TOWN

STILLWATER, MINN. - After an open, stormy meeting of the council of this city, a coin machines license bill was written into the books. The two operators of the town, Leo Jewell and Kenneth Ferguson were present, and it was thru their strenuous objections to an original ordinance, calling for a monthly tax on pin balls of $\$ 10.00$, that the council voted a favorable final bill. The tax set is $\$ 250.00$ per year on any number of pin balls up to and including ten machines, plus an additional annual fee of $\$ 25.00$ each for each additional pin ball machine exceeding ten. License for Music Machines was finally agreed upon for $\$ 10.00$ per year on each machine.

Other features written into the bill are: No owner's license shall be transferable from person to person, but the machine with the license tags may be moved by the owner from one location to another; licenses obtained subsequent to the beginning of the license year will be charged pro-rata; All applications shall contain a statement of the list price of each machine; No license shall be granted to anyone who is not a bona-fide resident of the city, and who has not been such a resident for at least three months prior to the making of application; and forbids the playing of any equipment by those under 18 years of age.

Kenneth Ferguson, commenting on the ordinance, writes "As long as all Councilmen wanted a tax of some kind on the machines, it was passed favorably for us two operators here."

## REFUSES TO SELL LOCATION

SAVANNAH, GA. - Last week, John M. Wall, of this city, received an order for some machines, but wasn't satisfied in his mind that the party was an operator. Wall phoned The Cash Box offices in New York City, and a wire was sent to an acknowledged distributor in Spokane, Wash. requesting that they be kind enough to check on this party.

Investigation showed that the buyer was a location. John Wall returned the deposit, and suggested that they get in touch with local operators who would take care of their location.

Writing about the abortive deal, Wall tells us "I have investigated and find that this order was placed by a location operating their own equipment, and I am returning their deposit and declining the order for this reason. I have always advocated the complete elimination of sales direct to locations."

## WANT ADVERTISED PRICES ELIMINATED IN B. B.

WILLIAMSPORT, PA. - Harry J. Miele, Williamsport Amusement Co., this city, passes along some interesting suggestions. Writing about direct sales to locations, Miele claims: "Coin machine companies should not advertise prices in The Billboard. This makes it possible for location owners to be able to dictate prices to the operator." Miele also claims "Manufacturers should not bring out more than one new machine a month; and phonograph manufacturers should not change models more than once a year."
