



## WHAT ABOUT THE RECORDS? By Bill Gersh

For a great many months The Cash Box has been active in pointing to the truth of the record situation as it exists today in this trade. This has been the one and only publication in this industry with the courage to publicly bring to the fore the truth of the record situation. The fact that this has cost The Cash Box much revenue is of little consequence. This publication believes in telling the truth. For only by such methods can industries and that which forms industries—the human element —progress and become great.

When The Cash Box first brought into the open the fact that coinmen were no longer able to obtain the number of records they had always received and what they required, there were a few who came to the defense of the recording companies with the statement that the war had prevented complete quantity manufacture of records. This was agreed to. But, what The Cash Box explained was that the juke box men were not getting the quota of records which they were supposed to receive and which the recording firms said they were receiving. Juke box men did not ask for more records. There were no juke boxes sold during the war period. And, just as certainly, there were no more home recording units of any kind being sold to the public.

The fact remains that the juke box created a tremendous demand for records. Just as the juke box lifted the recording firms from the depths of the very worst depression in their history—so did this industry suffer the consequences. It never asked for anything in return for what it had accomplished for the recording firms. This business should, at that time, have made an agreement with the record manufacturers to make certain that an equitable allotment of their production would always come to the juke box industry at dealer's prices, regardless of conditions.

It was noticeable, during the war period, while record distributors claimed they were not creating any more dealers set-ups, that more record retail stores arose thruout the nation than ever before in record selling history. It was also noticeable that more and still more coinmen lost the benefits of dealer's prices which were so gladly given to them by the recording firms when they so much needed the juke box field to save them from falling out of business history altogether.

It was also noticeable that when the first complaints came out in The Cash Box for all to read, that those men whose complaints were published, were rapidly and most completely take care of and suddenly received all the records they needed. This definitely proved that they could have been given a fair share of records right along. (The case of the Savannah, Ga. operators is a pertinent one to remember in this instance.)

How many juke box men have again relaxed, in the belief that because the war is over, they will once again begin to get all the records they need. And that, at the same time, many rival, competitive companies will come into existence, forcing the old line, big three manufacturers, to cater to all of their whims.

They seem to forget that there is a tremendous demand for radio-phono combinations from the public generally that far eclipses the demand for new coin operated phonos on any comparative basis. This demand for radio-phonos runs into millions. They also seem to forget that the general public will purchase complete albums and classical records as well as popular music. The purchases of the general public will naturally be so great that it may pay the recording firms to cater to them.

All these things must be taken into consideration by juke box men. In some of the nation's largest metropolitan areas coinmen have of late been complaining very vigorously. They claim that collections are bound to fall to new lows because they simply cannot obtain the records they need to keep their machines going.

From Florida came a report that juke box men there were going to ask the music machine manufacturers to go back to 12 record machines because they cannot get sufficient records to efficiently take care of 20 and 24 record machines.

#### "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

The record is the vital heart of the juke box business. And until something else, with a sufficiently impressive library to back it up, comes along to displace it, it is of paramount importance to every juke box man in the nation that he arrange to get the number of records he requires from continued profitable operation of his machines.

The retailers of records in one section of the nation came together some time ago and met with leading record manufacturers. They asked that they be given more equitable distribution. Yet this industry, which also uses a very great share of the records now being made and which helps to act as a free advertisement for every record manufacturer, has never yet come together to ask the record makers for more equitable distribution methods.

In fact, this trade has not even asked the big three record manufacturers to investigate their distribution outlets to learn why dime stores, dry goods palaces, cigar stores and even furniture emporiums can get records and the juke box men, the men who have given them business and more business year after year, who helped popularize and make their records great, have not been able to get the records they need.

It is only fact to once again report that the average juke box man must purchase from 75% to 90% of his records from retail stores and pay the very same price that the public pays. Furthermore, he is a very lucky juke box operator indeed who can purchase these records in retail establishments in his own community without having to send his money many miles away from his home town and wait until shipment, at full retail price, plus freight and loss on damaged records, is made to him.

It is also noteworthy to record here and now that a great many juke boxes thruout the nation are continuing to play only because their owners have been able to purchase "used records". That may be a shock to some coinmen thruout the country to know that juke box operators in a great many towns are actually in existence today only because of the used records they have been able to obtain.

This is the case against the record manufacturers: that they have not, and do not seem to be inclined, to cure their distribution set-ups so that the juke box trade can have the number of recordings it requires to continue to do business. They will not, or at least so it seems, investigate their sources of distribution to juke box men to learn why these men have to go to retail stores to purchase records.

They absolutely do not seem to care whether the juke box man continues in business, regardless of their statements to the contrary, and regardless of the surgary words with which these statements are covered.

It is a known fact, thruout the entire juke box industry, that in any city in the nation there have been more record outlets created during this war period than whatever existed before the war. The telephone Red Books can be used to check this at any time. In some communities in the nation there are over 200% more record outlets in operation at this time than ever existed before the war.

And this, mind, while the record distributors continue to vociferously deny that they are creating any more dealers. While the manufacturers cried that they simply couldn't get sufficient materials to manufacture enough records to satisfy the demand. (A demand that far, far exceeded what juke box men asked for from them.) It is really, therefore, very pitiful to believe that so great and popular an industry as the juke box field has become, has had to sit back and do nothing about a situation which would have raised the roof off any other industry.

Each juke box man, individually, has complained feebly to the distributor in his area regarding the fact that he needs more records. An industry that, in its present powerful stage, is but a tiny infant compared to what greatness it will assume within a few more years, cannot get together with three firms— Columbia, Victor and Decca—and arrange for more equitable distribution for itself on a vital necessity for its continued business success.

And this isn't all. What about the wording on the record labels themselves? What about the Buckley Bill now in the Patents Committee of the House of Representatives which would never have been able to hang over the heads of juke box men were this wording to read, "For use in coin operated instruments"? What about that?

What is it that holds back the juke box men? What is it that makes them seem so weak and feeble? What is it that makes these men, who pioneered so great and grand an industry from such small and humble beginnings, crawl beneath the very feet of the men whom they hoisted to greatness? What is it that holds back the juke box field from asserting its rights with these record manufacturers and obtaining from them the equitable distribution to which it was always entitled?

Now is the time, before this field enters into its speediest action era, for the juke box men to settle the most pressing problem confronting them. Have the record manufacturers create special distribution outlets for the juke box trade exclusively and allot a complete and fair share of their records to this field.

# "TALKING OUT LOUD"

#### WELL BUILT MACHINES WILL GET THE PRICE

(Editor's Note: Mr. Fendrick has been operating machines for over 48 years. His observations are very timely for they answer the problem of higher prices for the new equipment. At present Mr. Fendrick is located in Denver, Colo.)

Manufacturers of arcade and amusement machines should give more attention to the operator's

requirements in building old model as well as new model machines. If each manufacturer would send a letter to each of his customers, he would probably be surprised to learn the difficulty the operators in the field have with his equipment.

Many manufacturers, before the manufacturing of new machines prior to 1942, had only one idea. That was to build a machine, as a rule, as cheap as possible. Many were in the habit of forgetting to perfect the idea for which the machine was built.

The main thought seemed to be a new idea, a new flash. Get the cash from the operator, instead of building a machine to stand the operating gaff. A machine built to operate with the least amount of service calls. And to eliminate the bugs in the machine.

If machines were built today like the old money machines were built in the early days to withstand abuse, continue to run and make money for the operator day in and day out, more operators would be in better position to increase their routes and buy more machines.

However, with poorly built machines, the operator is kept so busy trying to keep his machines working that he finds he has no time to spare to increase his route. The manufacturer as well as the distributor and operator suffer in such case.

Machines for arcades and all amusement types, should be built with metal cabinets, not wood. All doors should be made as near burglar proof as possible. Cash boxes should be well protected from petty thieves breaking into them.

Above all manufacturers should see to it that a new idea in a new machine is *perfected*. That all bugs are eliminated in machines they manufacture. They should keep in touch with their customers and find out how their new machines hold up and the results these are getting for the operator.

If manufacturers would do this I am sure they would be surprised at the increase in volume of business they would receive from operators.

The trade does not require a new model machine every 30 or 60 days. This has been proved during the past four year war period. Old model machines have been, and are today, getting big returns for their owners.

Let's hope the manufacturers will put more effort in building new machines with perfected ideas. Durable machines from an operator's standpoint.

Many new ideas were presented to the trade during the war period, in reconverting machines built out of old mechanisms, such as pin-ball machines, etc. Some of these machines were originally very poorly constructed. While all operators realized this, on account of the labor and material conditions during the war, nevertheless these machines were sold for good long prices.

This proves, or should have proved to the manufacturer, that operators will pay good prices for equipment. It should also prove to the manufacturers that if they built good machines with proved and perfected ideas, machines that will stand the public abuse and above all build such machines petty thief proof, or as near burglar proof as possible, so cash box receipts cannot be stolen from the operator, the manufacturers will find the operators ready to buy and willing to pay the price.

### **GREENBAUM ELECTED AIREON VICE-PRES.**

KANSAS CITY, KANS. — The Board of Directors of Aireon Manufacturing Corp., this city, have just voted into their organization as vice-president, R. R. (Rudy) Greenbaum.

This announcment was made by R. C. Walker, president of Aireon, who stated at the same time that the company was starting to manufacture an automatic phono and that they planned to soon be in full production. Greenbaum has been setting up the music division with showrooms, sales offices, and an advertising campaign beamed to the introduction of Aireon's completely different phono using, "Sensationally new principles".

Greenbaum was born in Toronto, Can., and educated in Kansas City, Mo. He is a well known and national figure in the automatic music industry. In 1939 he was general salesmanager for Packard Mfg. Corp. of Indianapolis. From 1942 until his appointment with Aireon, Greenbaum served as Regional Chief of Manpower Utilization with the War Manpower Commission in Kansas City, Mo.

He is a Mason and also a charter member of the "Dapper Dan Club" of Pittsburgh. He is also a charter member of the American Management Assn., and a member of the Executive and Salesmanager's Club of New York.

Of special interest to phono ops was Greenbaum's recent swing around the country for the purpose of giving the trade an opportunity to select the type of phono cabinet they would like to see Aireon build. Thirty-two designs were shown at displays in leading hotels from San Francisco to the Waldorf-Astoria in New York where the tour ended.

Known as Aircraft Accessories before the war, Aireon spent the past three and one-half years building radar and electronics equipment on prime contracts for the Army and Navy. The corporation has now expanded to include these subsidiaries: Industrial Electronics Research Laboratory at Greenwich, Conn., Cinaudagraph Speakers, Inc. and Oxford Tartak Co., Chicago. Also Midco Tool & Supply Co., Oklahoma City and its Mexican division in Mexico City, as well as offices in New York and San Francisco.

## LA GUARDIA WARNS NO SLOTS IN NEW YORK

NEW YORK — Mayor Fiorello H. LaGuardia of this city, in his regular weekly broadcast over this city's radio station WNYC (Sunday, October 13) warned manufacturers of slot machines in Chicago and Michigan not to be so quick to ship their products here.

He stated that "Anything they will ship will be dumped into New York Bay, if they get here before January 1". (By the way, the Mayor's term of office ends on Dec. 31.)

#### HIGH PRICE OF NEW EQUIP'T PUZZLES HAL MARCH

BRATTLEBORO, VT. — Hal L. March of this city, who just returned from an auto trip to Chicago where he viewed the World Series games reports that the he has been out of baseball for forty years, he believes that he could have done just as well as some of the players he saw in action there. (March shares this belief with many others in the trade who viewed the games in Chicago.)

But most important to the trade are the impressions which he received during his Chicago visit as well as while driving thru the rest of the states on his way to and from Chicago. He writes, "Was much disappointed with my visits to some of the factories. In fact, became so disgusted looking for new stuff, that I simply quit calling on them.

"Saw only one piece and that was priced so damn high that I wonder if the operators are going to pay this price. Talk about paying thru the nose, boy, the price was so high that I can promise you right now that I will not buy the piece.

"Went into a great many cities where no machines were operating. Some with not even free plays. The take must be very low on a great many locations. I just can't see how operators are going to pay the price. Possibly that is the reason for the high price of the piece I saw. Evidently the manufacturers figure that less sales result in higher prices to get the same profits, that's the way it looks to me, anyway. The next 365 days will tell the story, so let's see what happens."

### WONDERS WHY MFRS. HAVEN'T ANSWERED

INDIANAPOLIS, IND. — C. E. Armstrong of Business Stimulators, this city, who has been suggesting many improvements in machines to the manufacturers, directly and thru these pages, is somewhat surprised that none of the manufacturers have answered him to date.

Armstrong writes, "For many weeks you have printed suggestions from jobbers and distributors to the manufacturers regarding changes for the post war machines. To date no replies from the manufacturers. Have the manufacturers given any consideration to these many suggestions, or will they?"

### BITTEN BY DEPOSIT GRABBERS, WANTS CZAR

OMAHA, NEBR. — Sam Nocita of Central Vending Co., this city, who has fared rather badly at the hands of some "deposit grabbers" believes that this is the time for the industry to take a more firm hand in this matter. (The Cash Box published some very strong articles in this regard and this practice seemed to ease off after these appeared. It seems now that it has returned with just as much viciousness as ever.)

Nocita writes, "Right at this moment my biggest gripe, and believe me it is a big one, is that some firms are still advertising equipment for sale which they do not have on hand. I recently gave an order to two different firms. Both firms stated the equipment was available for immediate shipment, and on the strength of this statement, I sent the required deposit.

"One firm shipped the equipment after a delay of four weeks. I have not as yet received the equipment from the second firm altho the order was placed via airmail Sept. 1st. The deposit check was cleared thru my bank on Sept. 7th. On Sept. 15th I talked to this firm via long distance and was promised the equipment was being shipped that day.

"Despite letters, wires and phone calls, at this writing I have not as yet received the equipment, nor have have I received a bill of lading showing the equipment as being shipped. I propose an association where a substantial deposit would be required from its members and where a 'czar' would would act as referee. The 'czar' having the power to fine the guilty member, along the same line as the movie and baseball 'czars'." **News and Views**
