## "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

## TAXAIION HIIS POST-WAR FIINACL

As the post-war era becomes more clarified to the average business man, there is a growing general demand that taxes be lowered to a point where once gain good, old-fashioned American competitive free enterprise can come into being.

This was most noticeable in President Truman's statements the first week after he had taken office. The Treasury Department agreed with him. And now thruout various Government agencies there is a move to lower taxes.

Taxation came to this industry when it first began to expand in the early thirties, and because of this national expansion, attracted the attention of various legislative bodies.

These lawmakers noted the growing popularity of coin operated equipment, and foresaw the possibility for taxing this industry for additional revenue. Since then licensing coin machines, whether slots, scales, juke boxes or merchandise venders, is the regular procedure of every village, city, county, state as well as the Federal Government.

With the need for taxes to produce more income growing greater in every community thruout the nation, these communities feel that this is the time to prepare public works projects to take up any possible unemployment slack, so that the men who made possible peace will be able to learn a living. This is highly commendable and completely in favor with every member of this coin operated machines industry.

Yet, there has come into being, in various legal bodies here and there thruout the country, one sort of legislator who feels that certain industries, because they lack the power of huge lobbies and cooperative action, should be taxed to a fare-thee-well. And in the case of this industry this is today an outstanding fact. Not a week goes by but what some community, somewhere in the country, is seeking to overtax and thereby hinder the growtil of this business.

It was this reason which prompted The Cash Box to urge that a "National Tax Council" be created. So that the members of this business would a least have a board of appeals of their own, in their own industry, to which they could turn when their communities attempted to discriminately tax them.

Tho this suggestion has met with marvelous acclaim from all in the trade none have as yet stepped forth to help make this a possibility. And every day that goes by as this post-war era goes deeper into new horizons, brings about a greater need for a National Tax Council.

There is no one agency to which this industry can turn today to get expert tax advice to help prevent heavy taxation. There is no one source where complete data, files, information, precedents, procedure and former cases can be had. Only a "National Tax Council" staffed with, and guided by, men who have had tax experience, can help cure the present taxation situation of this industry, or at least hold the line where it now is.

As all the industry knows, there is a growing movement thruout the nation to bring about taxation which will obtain a percentage of the gross income of this industry. Many states have already experienced these proposals in their legislatures.

Texas, Tennessee, Oklahoma, and other states, have heard legislators arise to demand not only a heavy annual license fee be placed on coin operated machines, but that in addition, a percentage of the gross income from these same machines be paid to the state.

## "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

For example, the state of Texas demanded that phonos pay $\$ 50$ per year as well as $15 \%$ of their gross income. This same state wanted $\$ 100$ per yearly license fee from pinball machines plus $15 \%$ of the gross income. Tho this bill is dormant at prescent, the general belief is that it will some day become fact.

This sort of legislative thought and action is spreading. $U p$ to the present time, the men of this business have been sufficiently interested to help prevent such taxation from becoming a fact. But even these men believe that eventually some of the politicians will be successful. After that the idea will spread with as much speed as did the plan to tax co:n machines when it was first broached. There is no doubt, too, that every coinman knows the effect such taxation will have on his income.

To help offset this sort of taxation, and the further fact that this industry is now being more highly taxed each year, The Cash Box proposed that the members of this business arrange for a $70 \%$ $30 \%$ commission basis with their locations instead cf the present $50 \%-50 \%$ commission basis.

This $20 \%$ differential is necessary today because of overhead increase. It will surely be needed if machines will be much higher priced than they were pre-war, and doubly important if taxation grows greater.

Therefore, the suggestion that a new and better commission basis become fact, that is, a $70 \%$ to the operator and a $30 \%$ to the location commissicn basis (at least in the average locations) is of growing import to the trade to help offset higher taxation drain of present income.

All this now leads back to the fact that because the members of this industry haven't as yet come together into a "National Tax Council", the various financiers who have become tremendously interested in this trade, are now beginning to plan their future loans on what taxes the coinman asking for the loan is paying.

In short, an operator of phonographs will row have to advise the firm from whom he is making a loan just what taxes he pays each year to his community, his county and state for the right to continue to operate.

This will be figured against the average net income from his machines as well as against the market price of equipment he buys. The loan will probably then be based on the differential which results. In short, many who formerly figured on obtaining large loans, might find their figures considerably cut down because of the heavy taxes they pay.

With the finance organizations in this industry now recognizing the fact that taxation plays an ever more important part in the future coin machine picture, then surely this is the time for the members of this industry to decide whether or not they should urge the immediate creation of a "National Tax Council" to help protect this business and to keep legislators, who know nothing, or very little, of the earning power and prospects of this industry, from tossing obstacles in its path whereby growth will be tremendously curtailed.

All are anxious to see this industry rise to the highest possible peak. All are eager to help make this business the most outstanding division of America's entertainment industries. But this cannot become the case if some one organization does not come into being to help protect the operator from being overtaxed in his own community. And only a "National Tax Council", with knowledge of what is happening thruout the country at its finger tips at all times, can do so.

The fact that the large financing figures are investigating taxation all over the nation, as far as this industry is concerned, is proof in itself that this is the time for this trade to make certain that the tax line is at least held at its present point. It is extremely difficult to reduce taxes in any community, and will continue to be difficult for many years. But, at least the line can be held at its present point, so that the trade can continue with a more clear conscience as to its future possibilities.

The need for a "National Tax Council" grows greater each day. Even the finance firms now believe that such a council should should come into being. The trade needs great financing during this new era. It must, then, stop the growing tax menace so that it will be able to proceed on so much more smoothly than ever before in its history. It must have the combined cooperation of all factors in this trade to assure the creation of a "National Tax Council". All will benefit from such a Council.

## SEATTLE HSKS ONLY 2,000 LICENSES

SEATTLE, WASH. - This city will ask that only 2,000 licenses be issued for coin operated amusement games. There are almost that number issued now.

Some coin machine leaders are contesting this move on the basis that it is holding possible future growth and progress of the coin operated aumsement machine industry down. There are soze who also claim that this bill will curtail returning vets who desire to enter the industry from coming in, thus depriving them of the opportunity of earning a livelihood.

There is a strong fight under way from both sides, with general opinion among coinmen pretty much divided.

At the present time the license fee here is $\$ 12.50$ to the location and $\$ 25.00$ to the operator for each machine. This makes a total of $\$ 37.50$ per yearly license per machine. At the hearing held by the License Committee on Wednesday (Nov. 21) there were many small ops, veterans, tavern and restaurant owners who protested the limitation of the licenses. There will now be a General Council hearing Friday (Nov. 23) wherein the Council will listen to all sides and make a recommendation to the License Committee who will then decide on whether there is, or is not, to be any limitation on licenses of pin games here.

They should educate the operator to take the necessary fair commission, pointing out to him the various hidden costs that the small operator doesn't consider. By keeping the operator prosperous the manufacturers will be prosperous. They should not sell to every Tom, Dick and Harry that wants to go into the business."
