# GROWING PAINS 

 By Bill GershAs the industry enters into the new machine era many growing pains become openly apparent. For example, one territory in the nation is now faced with a bill which will allow only 2,000 machines to operate. Another faces the problem of how its distributors are going to sell to operators who say they will boycott all new merchandise because they still want to continue operating what they already have and do not want to buy new machines for they claim that new equipment will start cutting up their profits.

All sorts of problems suddenly appear on the horizon. There is no doubt, among the intelligent merchandisers in the trade, that all of these will disappear just as rapidly as they appeared, when the new machines come rolling into warehouses in the sort of quantity which can be expected from the manufacturers when material and supplies become available-and labor stops striking.

All these are but the growing pains of an industry on its way to its greatest era.
The old timer realizes that he will have to compete with new and younger men. He will be beset with many new kinds of problems. He will once again have to get down to his offices early and work late. And even get around to visiting his locations to keep them happy and satisfied.

There are many coinmen who have become accustomed to letting their employees continue to cry to locations about no supplies, no materials, no parts, etc., etc. But gradually, the location owners, regardless of union affiliations and associations, know that they will be able to get new and more attractive machines. They also know that they can begin to expect better service. And they are sure that the time has come when they should be earning even more from the new coin-operated equipment.

Growing pains are only a hardship for a short period. These adjust themselves very easily especially when full production gets well under way. The trade realizes that there is nothing like a new machine to stimulate the play on any location. It also realizes that because the cost of the new epuipment is higher than pre-war that it must change its present commission basis.

What should be more carefully watched by those coinmen, who believe that no new machines should be allowed in their territories-is the dissatisfaction which this can bring about from the average location owner. Storekeepers are accustomed to extremely fine service from the firms with whom they deal. They know that the automobile firm from whom they purchase their trucks and cars will give them service which will be far above that which they ever formerly received.

Should the operator create a bad taste in the mouths of location owners thruout the country, he will then absolutely encourage direct sales. There are a great many men in this industry today who believe that the trade may eventually see direct selling on a great and efficient scale.

These men argue: 1) Why can't a large organization enter into the field and set up service centers just as good, if not better, than what the average operator can offer? 2) Why can't such firms also rent machines to locations? 3) Why can't they even sell these machines to the locations on a time payment plan so that they can collect for the machines as they come around to service them? 4) And, furthermore, why can't they make an overall service charge to cover whatever servicing will have to be done and do this on a national scale, while including it in the sales agreement they will sign with the location?

There is no doubt anymore that location owners know the value of coin-operated equipment in their places of business. There is also no doubt that the average tavern keeper realizes that he could not conduct a profitable tavern business without a juke box-and perhaps without a cigarette and gum and candy vender-as well as amusement devices. He has been educated to this very fact by the operators. He has been taught the need for coin-operate equipment to bring him extra profits efficiently and speedily-and without any investment of time or money on his part.

All this the operator has already taught him. And in so teaching him has encouraged him to also buy direct when he finds that the money he earns from the machines in his store is of sufficient quantity to actually pay for a machine speedily-on his own account. The operator must therefore take into consideration the fact that if a manufacturer does decide to sell direct to location owners the greatest part - the pioneering part - of his sales work has already been accomplished for him by the present operators.

Surely some of the large auto manufacturers could make this a very profitable division of their business. Like Firestone, who along with his tires included all sorts of toys, hardware, dishes, etc. in his stores, so that enterprising men would be encouraged to open such stores-perhaps many an auto manufacturer might be thinking that the large service organizations which his dealers have created to handle his lines would also prove capable of handling coin machine servicing and sales within an efficient radius of that dealer's offices.

Therefore, the modern operator must keep step so that he can protect himself from any such competition. He must purchase the new equipment and keep everyone of his locations pleased and happy with his service. He must make sure that he is protected on these locations with leases, or with location agreements, or with legal contracts, so that he can offset and even forestall the time when some of the larger of the nation's industrialists might decide to try direct selling in this field on an easy-time-payment plan.

Those operators who believe that they are now strong enough in their own territories to keep out the new equipment, on the theory that they "don't want the manufacturers again making us machine poor", had also best remember that there are many other factors at work beside the coin-operated machine manufacturers who have been most carefully studying the coin machine field-and who like the way this industry earns good profits with an average investment. These men should think twice before they decide to retain a machine in one of their locations which will most completely dissatisfy that location.

The days of poor service and inefficient planning are numbered in this coin-operated machine industry. The days when an operator could "just let the guy squawk" are over. He must now plunge into his business like a really modern business man and make his business just as outstanding as the leading auto dealer or radio or department store does in his town. He must be on the job 24 hours per day to make his business a really efficient, modern business so that his locations will believe that they just couldn't get anything better. And that purchasing their own equipment would be a waste of money and time.

Perhaps, too, many coin machine men have had their noses pressed too close to the trees to be able to see the great forest that lies beyond. There is no division of America's musical entertainment industry that today compares in power and attraction to the juke box business. And the juke box industry is as yet only an infant.

It was actually thrown together. It grew in spite of itself. It will become a truly great musical industry when this post-war period gets well under way. And when deliveries of the new machines come thru in the quantity that men now dream about. The new improvements in this field are truly awe inspiring. Some of these are so outstanding that every location owner will be amazed at the ingenuity demonstrated to get him to sell more music and earn greater profit.

The same is true of the merchandising machine field. And in this field there is already an outstanding lesson for coin machine men. This lesson is in the large theatre chains thruout the country who first started with individual operators and who gradually found that they were better off with their own candy counters, for they could then give the public a larger and more complete selection and at the same time earn more profit.

At first they were worried about the dirt the sale of candy would cause. Today there isn't a theatre chain in the nation that doesn't have its own candy counters with its own pretty little girls completely uniformed and selling many thousands of boxes of candies of all kinds.

The merchandise machine man therefore learned that the education which he had given to the chain theatre owner had resulted in these theatres setting up their own sales organizations for the very same products which he had sold them on using.

In the amusement field many other problems enter into consideration for operators. Not only have they many inner problems but they realize that they have the fastest moving division of this business on their hands and that profits can be like quicksilver unless they operate their businesses to the very highest point of super efficiency. This is one division wherein the operator knows the value of new equipment and of constant change of that equipment.

The operator mustn't for a moment believe that he can continue without new machines. If he does he will find interest falling in his equipment and eventually disappearing.

These are the growing pains which the field is now undergoing. They should be tempered by long range planning and thinking, so that those who are in the field will remain in it completely protected and enjoying the greatest possible prosperity.

## OMAHA WANTS WALLOPING COIN TAXES

## New Ordinance Wants Juke Distribs to Pay $\$ 500$ Per Year Occupational Tax. Amusement Game Distribs $\$ 1,000$ Yearly. Juke Ops to Pay $\$ 100$ Per Year Per Phono. $\$ 150$ Per Game Each Year.

OMAHA, NEBR. - What is probably an indication of what will be forthcoming from other city, county and state legislatures during 1946 is the proposal just passed by the City Council here.

After a meeting of the City Council on Tuesday, November 27, proposals were made for a series of ordinances levying new sales and amusement taxes, as well as new and higher occupational taxes and increasing a great many taxes now in force.

It is expected that an open, public hearing will be held on these new ordinances in the very near future and that all business men will be given the opportunity to argue against this present high tax proposal. This city is intent on raising an additional $\$ 2,500,000$ to help pay off its help.

An additional gasoline tax, even a wheel tax on trucks, new and higher taxes on movies, stage shows, floor shows, cigarets, cigars, soft drinks, hotels, bus and truck terminals, natural gas, and it is expected on the Ak-Sar-Ben race track, will also be asked.

Operators of juke boxes will pay $\$ 100.00$ per year tax for each machine instead of the present $\$ 5.00$ per year. Operators of pinball and other mechanical amusement devices will pay $\$ 150.00$ per year per machine instead of the present $\$ 10.00$ per year.

Distributors of juke boxes will pay $\$ 500.00$ per year occupational tax and distributors of pinball and other mechanical amusement devices will pay $\$ 1,000.00$ per year occupational fee.

Coin machine leaders in this city are appealing to the trade everywhere to immediately send in whatever information may be at hand to help them offset this confiscatory taxation.

This once again brings to the fore the great importance of the suggestion which The Cash Box has been making to the trade for over three years now that it create a "National Tax Council" where experts would be available to help coinmen and where all former precedents, data, records, etc. would be on hand to present to any authorities when such need arose.

This demand on the part of the city of Omaha is expected to be followed by other and even greater tax bills thruout the nation. Such taxation can definitely hamper the growth of this entire industry.

It is up to coinmen everywhere to come together at this time into a "National Tax Council" (as suggested in this issue by Earl E. Reynolds of Dallas, Texas, who is president of the Texas Coin Machine Operators Assn.) and be prepared to offset such severe taxation demands from an industry which is just in the formative stages.

## WILL BUYING STOCK GET OPS MORE RECORDS?

BOSTON, MASS. - Sidney A. Wolbarst of the New England Exhibit Company, this city, offers a suggestion to all music machine ops which may have some real merit to it.

Wolbarst writes, "Whether or not this thought is practical, I don't know, but would like to receive opinions.
"All music ops know the record problem. I notice that the Decca Company is listed on the New York Stock Exchange. If ops thruout the country would buy $10,20,50$ or 100 shares each in the company and then, as a group of stockholders, request the executives of the company to recognize and give more consideration to ops, rather than other trade, could results be obtained in at least one company that would be better than the past performances of this firm?
"The company is substantial and does pay dividens, so the stock is no lemon. If satisfactory results were obtained it could also be done with other manufacturers. Of course, group action is essential for results. What do you think?"

## MUSICAL SALES TO OPEN RICHMOND BUILDING

BALTIMORE, MD. - Max B. Lesnick of Musical Sales Co., this city, reports that the firm have at last found a building in Richmond, Va. to house their branch offices. The address will be 415 No. Broad Street. This is a four story building with over 25,000 square feet of space. Musical Sales Company will take possession of this building on January 1st but due to the fact that they are completely remodeling they will not be settled until about January 20 to the 25 th.

Lesnick also reports that the firm have hired two ex-service men, Capt. Herbert R. Wilson who will act as salesmanager, working out of the Baltimore office, and Lt. Richard F. Lawrence who will act in the same capacity out of the new Richmond offices.

The firm also reports that they have taken on the distribution of the Pfanstiehl needle for Maryland, Washington, D.C. and Virginia.

## CALIF. MUSIC OPS ACT TO DEFEAT BUCKLEY BILL

OAKLAND, CALIF. - George A. Miller, president and business manager of the California Music Operators Association, this city, advises that his organization is hard at work to help defeat the "Buckley Bill" (H.R. 3190) now in the Patents Committee of the House of Representatives in Washington, D.C. In a letter written to his members, Miller advised them of the following.
"I have just received a letter of a confidential nature from one of the congressmen who is very friendly to our cause, stating that the people who are sponsoring the Buckley Bill are trying to compromise whereby they will receive a license of $\$ 100.00$ a year for each and every phonograph in the United States.
"I think that each and every operator knows that the writer and the Association as a whole has been putting forth every effort possible to defeat this very dangerous bill. However, I am quite sure that many of the operators have neglected to either write in or send a telegram stating the reasons that they are opposed to such legislation.
"I have a letter from three of the congressmen in this district who state that they have received very few letters from the operators; in fact not enough to give them anything to hang their hats on. You fellows must realize that for a congressman to oppose a bill there must be a reason more than just the fact that he doesn't like the particular bill.
"I held a membership meeting in Stockton last Monday night and each and every operator sent at least four or five telegrams the following morning. These telegrams actually went out because they were handed to me and I sent them from Western Union myself. Now this is actually what you fellows are going to have to do if you expect to get by without paying the Copyright Owners and Composers some kind of a license.
"There is an article in The Cash Box I just received from Johnny Ruggiero giving you the complete picture, and as far back as July 24 they were offering a compromise of $\$ 100.00$ a year per phonograph. I might further state that the manufacturers themselves are concerned-especially the jobbers and distributors and they are supporting us for the defeat of this particular bill.
"I have notified each congressman and senator in the State of California of the California Music Operators Association's opposition and will continue to do so, but you fellows must help. Don't blame anyone but yourselves if this license goes through. It is pretty discouraging to work as hard as we have here in the office against such legislation and then find that many of the operators don't take enough interest in their own business to write one or two letters or send a telegram that might be very necessary to their business.
"Now in closing just let me also say that there is a move at the present time to get a special label made on records, stating that these records can be used for commercial uses and especially juke boxes. I just received this information so I am adding it to the letter. You can see where there are many complications arising out of this proposed Buckley Bill, so, fellows, do your part by doing everything that you possibly can to cause the defeat of this legislation."

## ARCADE OWNERS ASSN. NOMINATES OFFICERS

NEW YORK - The Arcade Owners Association of America, at its meeting last Thursday evening, November 29th, approved the appointment of Mr. Barnett R. Berkens as its executive secretary. A motion was made and seconded at the meeting wherein a committee was created, composed of H. Betti, H. Pearl, B. Sugerman, S. Mittelman, Carl Rudy and Sol Kesselman, who would meet with the IBEW and discuss with the union what course would have to be followed by this organization. The committee is to report their findings back to the members this coming week, where another meeting will be held at the Essex House Hotel in this city.

The Buckley Bill now in the Patents Committee of the House of Representatives in Washington was brought to the floor by counsellor Kesselman who explained its meaning and its threat to the phono trade.

Sidney H. Levine also explained the work done by the New York phono ops association in defeating ASCAP in New York and brought forth that if this organization had not defeated ASCAP that music ops would now be paying from $\$ 100$ to $\$ 150$ per machine per year to this organization, a possible $\$ 40,000,000.00$ per year from the entire trade.
