## "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

the ricordid situation

## By Bill Gersh

For a long time now The Cash Box has been bringing the facts of the record situation to the juke box trade. All music coinmen realize, that instead of growing better, the record situation has become worse.

It was the belief of many in the field that the moment the war was over the "Big Three" record manufacturing firms, namely: Decca, Victor and Columbia, would be in a position to press many more thousands of records than ever before in their history. And the all music coinmen would then receive records in the volume and on the same terms as they did pre-war. This has already been proved erroneous.

The record situation has definitely not bettered itself for the automatic music operators. Instead of records coming in at a faster clip than during the war period, they have continued on at the same pace and, in some instances, have even slowed up. The saviours for the operator have been the many small, independent record manufacturers who have jumped into this breach. And some of them are producing records which are clicking with the trade.

How can it be possible for the juke box operator to get more records when such firms as Bendix jump into the radio-phono field and announce, thru their New York sales manager, that they intend to sell $1,000,000$ units for home use during their first full production year? It must be remembered that General Electric, Philco, Stewart-Warner, Motorola, Admiral, RCA-Victor, Emerson, and all the other manufacturers of radio-phono combinations, will not sit by and allow Bendix to do all the selling on this American market.

Therefore, if so many, many more radio-phono combinations will be sold to homes, how will it be possible for the average juke box operator to obtain more records with the large department stores and record retailers yelling for more and still more records with which to supply this home trade? The operator is therefore placed in the position where he must find some new method for obtaining records and at the former dealers' prices he used to pay.

The Cash Box has made many suggestions in this direction. It pointed right at the "Big Three" record manufacturers and asked that they create separate distribution departments in their own organization exclusively devoted to music coinmen. It asked that such departments be created because this would then arrange for the juke box operator to receive an equitable share of the records which they are manufacturing.

The Cash Box further urged that each and every music man in the nation, regardless of the size of his present quarters, assume that he, too, was a record retailer-even to the extent where he would have to purchase classical albums whether they were, or were not, salable. Just so long as he could get the average record manufacturer to also recognize him as a dealer and treat him as such, so that he could obtain dealers' prices for the merchandise he purchased as well as the same large shipments that other record retailers receive.

There are, thruout the country, a great many coinmen interested in entering into the record manufacturing business, for no other reason than that they must keep their own large routes of music equipment supplied. And they cannot do so today with the small shipments they are receiving from the "Big Three" record manufacturers.

It is also to be noted that in the past few months these record manufacturers have been addressing their advertisements to the general public on the classical records which they are producing and which bring them the best sort of profits. This, too, has hurt the juke box operator to some extent for he cannot use this type of recording which they are popularizing thru their national advertisements.

There is a great fight on the hands of the juke box industry to get the records it needs. This trade will grow with tremendous leaps and bounds within a few more months. It will need many, many times the records it is now obtaining from record manufacturers.

## "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

There is no doubt that within the period of a few more years this nation will have approximately $1,000,000$ coin-operated music installations. These installations will be made in all sorts of locations which the juke box operator never before dreamed about, but which have been brought into being by the war.

It must always be remembered that the record is the vital, pulsing heart of the automatic phono. Without a sufficient supply of records there is no use even buying new phonographs. The record makes the juke box. Good records bring money into the operator's pockets.

Johnny Jones and Mary Smith care very little about the beautiful plastics and the gorgeous cabinet or the marvelous mechanism when they drop their nickels into a juke box. They want Bing Crosby singing "White Christmas"-if that is the record they want. And, if they don't get that record-they just don't play the machine.

Therefore, since the record is definitely the heart and soul and earning power of the juke box, then it is up to those men who compose this juke box industry to see to it that the men who are out on locations trying to earn more money to buy more juke boxes-GET THE RECORDS THEY NEED.

Of what use is the most beautiful phonograph ever manufactured if there are no records the public want to hear-in that phono? Regardless of all the fine tonal achievements of the manufacturers -regardless of the marvelously beautiful designs and the general mechanical and electrical improvements which are forthcoming for post-war operators of music equipment-there is really no furtherance of the field unless there are records to make that juke box attractive and interesting to the general public.

This trade simply must get together with the record manufacturers and get them to arrange a plan for more equitable distribution of their recordings if this business is to grow greater.

There are dozens of operators in the automatic music field today who thank the Lord that they can even obtain used records. There are others who will purchase any sort of recording from anywhere in the nation, even thousands of miles away from their headquarters and pay full retail price, plus cost of shipment, and even say nothing about damage-just so they can get enough records to continue in business.

Surely this is not wanted by the average manufacturer of automatic music equipment? Surelyhe, too, knows of this situation and realizes that the man he is going to sell to, whether he be an old time music machine operator-or a new music merchant, will need records to popularize the new music machines and to pay for the notes which he will have to assume.

The fact that thruout the country there is now a crusade under way to change the commission basis from the present $50 \%-50 \%$ to $70 \%-30 \%$ as suggested by The Cash Box for more than three years -is also much due to this record situation. Yet, even with this new commission basis in effect, the operators still need records to go on earning the profits necessary to pay for the new machines and to build themselves a financial reserve so that they can continue to purchase more and still more new equipment.

The trade believes that the automatic phono business will become similar to the cigarette vending machine business. Their reasons are simply that during the war large routes of music machines were created in all major cities thruout the country-just as there are large routes of cigarette machines. In short, wherever the traveler in this industry now goes he finds only one or two large operators of music machines in each city and like cigarette machine operating business-smaller men hanging on to the fringes.

This being the situation, then records become even more important. This means that to maintain a controlled music operating business the trade must have the medium which makes such control possible, and in the quantity and quality that is necessary. This industry cannot lay down for a moment and believe that the record manufacturers will give it a better break as normalcy returns. This cannot be possible with so many of the radio-phono combination manufacturers planning to sell millions of such instruments to homes.

To be completely dependent on the smaller record manufacturers is still too great a risk for the trade. The big names are as yet tied up and controlled by the "Big Three". These are the names the public wants to hear. These are the records, therefore, that the automatic music operator needs.

It is up to this juke box industry to get into immediate action and demand from the present "Big Three" record manufacturers that some sort of equitable distribution method be arranged whereby this industry-the industry which made these people what they are today-gets the records it needs when it needs them, at the prices it used to pay.

It is extremely important for the juke box operator that he back up the smaller, independent record manufacturer so that this manufacturer has what he needs to continue production and bring about hit records. But, at the same time, something must be done and done immediately to insure getting records in more sufficient quantity from the "Big Three".

# OMAHA OPS OFFER CITY COUNCIL COMPROMISE 

## Willing to Pay $\mathbf{1 5 0 \%}$ Increase Over Present License Fees

OMAHA, NEB. - Juke Box and pinball ops here offered the City Council its first compromise on the huge license taxes asked (as published in the December 10, 1945 issue of The Cash Box) thru their attorneys Fred White and Bernie Boyle.

The ops agreed to an increase in their present license fees, but they held that the tremendous increase which the City Council wanted was not only excessive but actually confiscatory.

Pinball ops at present pay $\$ 10$ per machine yearly license fee. The City Council proposed that this be increased to $\$ 150$ per machine per year. And also $\$ 1,000$ occupational tax for each pinball distributor (which, it seems, would also mean "operator"). Omaha's pinball ops have countered with a proposal that they pay $\$ 20$ per yearly license per machine and $\$ 100$ per year occupational tax per distributor

Juke Box ops now pay $\$ 5$ per machine per year. The City Council asked an increase to $\$ 100$ per machine per yearly license fee, and $\$ 1,000$ per year occupational tax for each distributor of the machines. Juke Box ops, thru their attorneys White and Boyle, are offering to pay $\$ 10$ per machine per yearly license fee and $\$ 50$ per year occupational tax for each juke box distributor.

The ops' attorneys claimed that there are approximately 500 juke boxes in Omaha and about 900 pinball machines. There are 8 juke box distributors and 22 pinball distributors, they stated.

Occupation and license fees from the machines now total about $\$ 9,000$ per year for the city. Under the ops' proposal thru their attorneys this would total $\$ 23,000$ per year.

The Commissioners did not agree to this proposal as yet, but they expressed appreciation for the compromise offer.

At the present time Omaha's business men are fighting the high tax revenues being asked. A meeting of 50 leading business men has already been held here. Another meeting is scheduled. It is believed that business will put up a big fight thefore paying the high revenue taxes being asked by the City Council.

## GENERAL BUSINESS HIGHLIGHTS NEW RECORD

The Administration has started an allout drive for extension of price controls beyond the June 30 expiration date. Expected deflationary forces have not materialized and psychological forces have combined with economic factors to bring inflationary pressures to a peak.
Stepped-up production will be necessary to meet industry needs for strategic materials. Government stockpiles have been pledged by CPA to help industry meet its requirements for minerals and metals during the reconversion period. Tin, lead and antimony stockpiles are among those which may not last through the third quarter of 1946.

President Truman asserts it is the duty of democratic government to assure jobs "for those who are able and willing to work." He urges support for housing and health programs.

Detroit negotiations with the General Motors' strikers continue today. The nationwide strike vote of General Electric employes Thursday will include 17,000 salaried employes as well as 215,000 hourly workers.

Hearings start today on President Truman's proposals for establishment of factfinding boards as a means of handling labor disputes. John L. Lewis, whose union termed it a plan to "enslave labor," is scheduled to be the first to speak.

SEC may rule on which items constitute proper charges against postwar reserves and which should be charged against peacetime operations. If the ruling is made before Dec. 31, it is expected to cover the treatment of tax refunds and accelerated amortization.

Investment bankers expect corporate financing this week to exceed $\$ 300,000$,000.

Resumption of private trading with Holland will accompany unfreezing of blocked balances in this country. Items traded must be listed as essential by the Netherlands Government, and individual transactions would have to be completed through a government mission.
Speedy resumption of coastwise shipping activity may be delayed. While some operators are said to favor operating under WSA control, most indicate they would prefer ICC reconsideration of cargo rates before trading gets under way. The narrow profit margin that prevails may quickly change to a deficit under existing cargo and shipping conditions.

The Civilian Production Administration is using new methods to end reconversion bottlenecks. With prime consideration given to end products, priorities are given to firms for items needed to break production jams.

Increasing inflationary pressures have slowed the OPA decontrol program. Reinstatement of ceilings on citrus fruits is being sought. The prospects of quick price relief have diminished as a result of reversal of the expected decline in consumer demands.

Rulings by the Supreme Court of the United States permit creditors to sue the Alien Property Custodian for recovery on claims against enemy assets held or disposed. The court also upheld withholding by the Navy of war contractor payments deemed "excessive profits" by the Government under the Renegotiation law.

The "helping hand" of OPA was denounced as "a kiss of death" by small steel companies which rejected an offer to raise price ceilings on steel products. The relief was offered because, according to OPA, small producers must make their living off few products in competition with large companies having integrated lines.
A plan for integrated Governmentindustry co-operation in disposal of surplus property is being considered by the RFC. Three industry groups of product consultants, technicians and industry advisors would help determine sales programs.

The OPA does not have to approve price increases because of increased costs due to wage rises approved under the new wage-price stabilization regulations. OPA must, however, give immediate consideration to applications based on NWLB approved wage increases.

Tax relief is barred by a United States Tax Court ruling to companies which had a chance in the character of their business as a result of the war. A definition of "normal" earnings for the base period was given.

The Government plans to use priorities and price controls to speed bousing construction. About half of all building materials will be allocated for building of multiple dwellings and homes selling for up to $\$ 10,000$. Revision of "obsolete building codes" and other actions directed towards stimulating building activity will be sought through Washington conferences starting Monday.

A six months' extension for OPA by Congressional action early next year was urged by Civilian Production. Administrator Small at hearings before the Senate Small Business Committee. This would discourage producers who are withholding goods and speed reconversion, he said.

Government experts are now admitting that their unemployment forecasts for 1946 were wrong, 5,000,000, not 8,000,000 may be looking for jobs in March, with the employment picture brightening after mid-year.

Industry-wide price-relief for steel was not recommended by the General Steel Products Advisory Committee to OPA. Instead, limited exemption from ceilings or application for individual price relief was suggested.

A plan to establish industry advisory committees and councils is being considered by the Department of Commerce. A council would be a co-ordinating center for all Government activities relating to a particular industry. The groups would make the Commerce Department the clearing house for Federal agencies and industries in the development and execution of policies and program.

Northeastern States shippers will pay about $\$ 15,000,000$ more next year if the 10 per cent increase in class freight rates ordered effective by ICC Jan. 1 goes into effect. It would also adversely affect reconversion in New York, according to affidavits presented in an effort to secure an injunction against the ICC order.
