



"The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

LOOKING AHEAD INTO 1946

Probably the most fascinating characteristic of this industry is the fact that it continually looks ahead.

What happened yesterday may be a subject for reminiscing. But, what all want to know in this industry is, "What about

Perhaps here is the answer to why this business has grown greater each year. Perhaps, too, this is why this industry will continue to expand.

As many have come to realize, this industry isn't as yet out of its swaddling clothes. It is still an infant, tho a rather experienced one, and a much plagued one, from the standpoint of taxation and general legalities.

This is only due to the fact that this business is so completely misunderstood. The men who comprise this industry never do seem to find the necessary time to erase this misunderstanding.

The war has helped this industry. It has placed coin operated equipment of every kind all over the world. It has installed automatic equipment from in the Pacific Islands to far up in the bleak Arctic. It has brought a new conception of what a coin operated machine can mean to many thousands of peoples everywhere in this world.

By spreading the gospel of the coin machine, the armed services have tremendously advanced the day of recognition for this industry. That day can be brought even nearer by those in this trade who will work hard for it. Which means only working harder for themselves.

It is up to this industry's leaders to preach a new kind of inspiring gospel to help this industry spread its wings over an ever wider area of this globe. And, by so doing, gain great and lasting recognition.

At this very moment the men of this trade are enjoying the thrill of looking ahead into the future of this business. They foresee equipment of which they never before dreamed. And such dreams have stimulated the inventors and designers in this industry to such a point that there is now a certainty that many of these dreams will come true.

With the entrance of such equipment there should also arise a new type of coin machine man. The type of business man who will be proud of this industry and who will so much value his own name, as well as his profession, that he will work hard to bring about a better understanding of his business. This is what is sorely needed as 1946 comes into being.

There are some who believe that such statements are idealistic. They are not. They are only the essence of what has already been accomplished by many other industries in this

It must be remembered that for years the moving picture industry was looked upon as anything but a great business. In fact, for many, many years, certain states continued to ban the showing of a great many pictures—and many still do.

It is also only in the past few years that the smudge of notoriety has been somewhat removed from the film colony. And even to this day there lingers many a vicious whisper about the people who make pictures.

Therefore, the men in this business, basing themselves on what the moving pictures have gone thru and have been able to accomplish, can certainly foresee a great many advantages accruing to themselves if they will continue to fight for greater recognition thru a better understanding of this industry.

Certainly, all will admit that the equipment of this trade has helped, to a great extent, to revolutionize a great part of American industry. This field has a deep and tenuous hold on the imagination of the public. This can be many times enhanced by good public relations effort beginning this year of 1946.

As long as this trade will continue to look ahead, it has before it greater possibilities than any other industry in this nation. It will, eventually, whether the men in this industry at present believe so or not, reach a point where it will be recognized and accepted wholeheartedly by all American business.

This is the big job for 1946-a "Public Relations Bureau"for the coin operated machines industry, for which The Cash Box has been pleading for more than three years.

Already the CMI has made, and is continuing to make an effort to arrange for a "Public Relations Bureau". This effort has been highly applauded by this publication and widely acclaimed by all the industry.

Men from every division of this business are today of the belief that the greatest necessity facing this industry for 1946 is the creation of a "Public Relations Bureau". Only such a bureau can help this industry to gain the recognition it so rightfully deserves.

There are many more needs of this trade. There is today a tremendously urgent necessity for the instant creation of a "National Tax Council".

All will agree that there is also a great need for a "School for Coin Machine Mechanics".

There is also a pressing demand for a "National Credit

Superseding all these, is the general belief that there should come into existence in 1946 a "National Coin Machines Board of Trade". Such an organization would crystallize all these urgent needs into one strong force. It would give this industry a common meeting ground (non-political and non-profit) for all of its divisions, all of its associations, all its rugged individualists who do not believe in associations and the members of all those industries who are allied to it.

With such a "Board of Trade" this industry can face the great, booming future of America tomorrow with complete confidence and know that there is at work for it those forces that can make it most outstanding.

UMBER SUPPLIES EXPECTED TO

Forest Products Assn. Makes Encouraging Report. Announcec New Wood Products

NEW YORK - As is well known thruout the coin machine industry production of most machines have been delayed due to lack of cabinets. Therefore, the report of the American Forest Products Industries, this past week, that many new wood products and derivatives would become available in 1946 is extremely encouraging to this trade.

The Forest Products Assn. reported that the lumber industry faces its biggest job in 1946. Altho lumber yard stocks are now at an all time low, leaders in the lumber field are confident that 1946 will see a substantial improvement. While the main interest is for raw lumber because of the housing shortage, considerable consideration is being given to the use of new wood products.

Actually, this organization declared, tho the lumber situation was in very bad state by mid-summer of '45, it improved considerably toward the close of the year, with the result that production had stepped up to 27,000,000 board feet. Soft-wood plywood production, most of which is on the West Coast, amounted to about 1,300,000,000 square feet.

Happel reports that he will distribute these lines exclusively and will handle no other equipment except coin machine supplies. He is exclu-

sive distributor for Compas coin machine parts and supplies in this area.

Due to territory conditions, Happel will announce a new, legal type amusement device which can be used in this area and in similar closed territories.

Carl Happel has had many years of experience in the coin machine industry and believes that the Keeney and Rock-Ola lines will prove of tremendous value to the trade in this territory.

He stated, "We are concentrating all of our sales efforts on these two lines, along with our parts and supplies line, for we believe that to really do justice to these manufacturers and their products that we must put all of our energies back of what they produce."

Among the new products which the organization announced are: "Compreg", described as a hard, tough product, formed by impregnating layers of wood with synthetic resin and then compressing them into a solid under great heats and

"Staypak", is a product resulting from the subjection of raw wood to heat and pressure, giving it certain qualities of dimensional stability.

Also so-called "Sandwich Boards" built thru a combination of wood or plywood with metals, papers and other materials in sandwich fashion.

Also available in '46 will be "Papreg", used extensively in the aircraft industry during the war, which is formed of paper sheets impregnated with resin and can be moulded into intricate shapes and has high strength qualities.

The fact that there has been a lack of lumber in local yards, according to the association, does not mean a lack of wood or a dwindling forest resource. The principles of scientific management of forest areas continued to be practised, despite reduced manpower and failing equipment.

MARTINSBURG, W. VA. — James K. Hutzler of 900 Winchester Ave., this city, urges every music machine operator to enter into a "record manufacturing cooperative" and to make records exclusively for the juke box trade.

Hutzler believes that this will, once and for all time, solve the problem of obtaining sufficient records, especially for the coming year and for the years to follow when, he believes, the automatic music industry will boom to its greatest heights.

He says, "I believe that a record manufacturing cooperative, formed by the music machine operators of the United States, will not only earn good profit for everyone who invests in it, but will assure every operator getting as many records as he will need at the lowest possible price.

"We will always give the operators first choice. After that, whatever surplus records might be left over, would be sold to the present thru regular retail channels.

"All the employees of the firm would be appointed by an elected board of direc-The directors to be elected by the from the sales of the records to the operators have been set aside for improvements and expansion, the surplus should be divided equally among all the stock-



KANSAS CITY, KANS. — R. R. "Rudy" Greenbaum revealed some astounding information for a group of new Aireon distributors who were visitors to the firm's factories and offices

After their preview of the new Aireon phonograph the visitors were intoroduced to some of the Aireon "past"—which until recently was withheld by Government request.

According to Mr. Greenbaum, "Aireon can now tell the story of its part in making thousands of airborne and shipborne radar jamming devices during World War II.

"During the war, Aireon's jamming devices flew with the Liberators, the Forts and the Superforts, and rode with the Navy's ships and invasion craft. Aireon made over 1,000 transmitters for the Army airways communication system, many more thousands for the signal corps.

"But this story is about radar jamming devices, more properly called radar countermeasures because they distort the enemy's radar scope so he can't seen when he's attacked.

"Aireon made countermeasure equipment from bread-board or prototype models supplied by Radio Research Laboratories and Aircraft Radio Laboratories, both governmental agencies. The devices proved so useful that similar equipment was shortly being supplied to the Bureau of Ships, United States Navy.

"Aireon received its first prototype model for an airborne countermeasure from Radio Research Laboratory in October, 1943. This was a low frequency device of which an improved model was developed for production by the Aireon engineering staff. Several thousands of these were made shortly after the delivery of the first production model in February, 1944. This first contract was followed by subsequent orders for other equipment designed to operate on a higher fre-

In concluding his story, Mr. Greenbaum said, "Certainly a company which can so effectively do its part to combat the enemy can and will exert every effort to produce the finest automatic phonograph the country has ever seen. It gives me the greatest pleasure to know that our distributors share in my enthusiasm for our equip-

TAVERN PAPER TELLS STORY OF CHICAGO'S \$50 JUKE TAX

Tells How Tavern Owners Met With City Council's License Committee to Help Phono Ops. Claims Tax Wipes Out Take for the Taverns. City's Revenue Over \$350,000

CHICAGO-"The Union Server", well known tavern paper, printed in this city, gave a most complete report, in its last issue, regarding the \$50 juke box tax imposed by Chicago's City Council License Committee.

The paper made this a front page story and ported it most completely. It told how the Chicago City Council in a special meeting on December 8 voted a tax of \$50 on each automatic phonograph in operation in that city.

It reports that the action was taken to circumvent the recent State Supreme Court ruling which voided the city ordinance which had imposed a \$50 license fee on tavern owners having juke boxes in their premises. The Supreme Court held that the fee was exorbitant and that the ordinance was therefore invalid.

A public hearing on possible revisions of the ordinances was held by the council's license committee on December 6. Representatives of the tavern and juke box industries offered testimony against the proposals. But this had no effect on the council which seemed determined to retain the revenue being collected from the juke boxes.

The revenue for the city will be the same under the new law but will now be collected from the operators of the machines instead of from the tavern owners. This paper reports, "However the tavern man will undoubtedly suffer in the final outcome, because at least part of this sum will come from his share of the profits."

"It is estimated", The Union Server reports, "that the taxes on the approximate 7,000 juke boxes, at \$50 per year, would net the city \$350,000."

This paper also stated, "Juke boxes have been operated in the past to provide a small degree of revenue for the overhead of the tavern establishments and to provide reasonable entertainment for its customers. The new tax would practically wipe out the 'take' to be applied to anyone of the many overheads of an establishment. A Federal tax of \$10 has always been required on each machine."

The new tax, as defined in the ordinance, is as ollows: "A juke box means phonograph, music ox, combination motion picture and sound mafollows: chine or other instrument capable of producing or reproducing any vocal or instrumental sounds, and which is governed or controlled by the deposit of a coin or token."

The paper also reported that among the prominent men of the tavern and juke box trades who fought, and are still fighting the tax, are: Martin Moran, president of the Illinois Tavern Owners Assn., and State Tavern Owners Council; Joseph O'Brien, West Side Tavern League; Roy A. Bloomquist, president of the Metropolitan Amusement Co.; Ray Cunliffe of Automatic Amusement Co.; V. J. Moravec of the Retail Liquor Dealers Pro-V. J. Moravec of the Retail Liquor Dealers Protective Assn. of Illinois; John Pahr, president of Local No. 2, Frank J. Weber, executive secretary and Anthony Intravartolo, president of the Chicago Tavern Owners Assn.; Joe Hoss, president of the United Beverage League.

NEW ORLEANS, LA .- Ed. Ponder, Louisiana Coin Machine Service Co., this city has been appointed distributor for Munves' "Super Skee Roll" for the states of Louisiana and Mississippi.

"STOP BUCKLEY BILL" CRY OPS

NEW YORK — Wires, phone calls and letters have been received by *The Cash Box* this past week commending this publication on the article which appeared in its last week's issue regarding the fact that the Buckley Bill (H.R.3190) which is at the present time in the Patents Committee of the House of Representatives in Washington, has all the opportunities of being passed thru since there is a move afoot in Congress to shove thru all pending bills.

The cry among the juke box men is for the immediate formation of a committee to get down to Washington and keep its eyes on the Buckley bill so that there will not be any possibility of this bill becoming law. The bill, as the trade knows, was originally intended to "amend the Copyright Act of 1907". Instead, it is now completely directed at juke boxes

and claims that the juke box is no different than a nite club, restaurant or any other institution which gives, "a public performance for profit".

This would mean, should the Buckley bill become law, that every single juke box in the country will have to be licensed by both ASCAP and BMI for playing their copyrighted music just as they license anyone else who plays their music. And since there are already rumors that the license will be approximately \$100 per year, this would mean paying to these organizations approximately \$40,000,000.00 per year by the juke box industry.

In short, this is not a grandstand play for peanuts. It's for big money. The kind of money that will make any organization go into a long and extensive battle to win. Therefore, it is up to the members of this juke box industry to get into this fight before it is too late and halt Representative Charles A. Buckley's proposed amendment to the Copyright Act of 1907 right where it is—in the committee. It must be shelved and shelved so that it will never see daylight again or never come up for another reading.

To do this the entire trade must organize itself into a mighty fighting unit so that this Buckley bill will die before it can ever become law. There isn't too much time left. Congress will return from its holiday and will be advised to push thru all pending legislation so as to make way for the many important bills which are going to be placed before it in 1946.

The time to act is NOW.

Prices continue to be very widely divergent these days. Someone on the West Coast may feel a certain machine worth \$150.00 whereas someone on the East Coast may think it worth but \$75.00. Of course, condition, serial, appearance, demand, territory, quantity, etc., must all be taken into consideration. The C.M.I. Blue Book reports each quotation exactly as it is made and depend on the subscriber to make average price adjustment to fit the peculiarities of his own territory.

The C.M.L Blue Book is to be read as follows: First price listed is lowest price for the week: Second price listed is highest price for the past week. Where only one price appears this should be considered lowest price.
