"The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

"SCHOOL FOR MECHANICS"

By Bill Gersh

One of the most popular suggestions ever made by The Cash Box was that a "School for Mechanics" be created by the members of this industry so that the speedy progress which this trade is expected to make, as new equipment starts rolling off its production lines, will not be halted in any fashion whatsoever.

It is a well known fact, thruout the trade, that the average operator can only expand as fast as his men (and himself) can handle and completely control the new machines he purchases.

In short, if he is lacking mechanics, then he cannot expand as much and as fast as he would like to. Mechanics are, therefore, among the most important necessities for the average coinman.

To insure his having sufficient mechanical skill at his beck and call, The Cash Box continues to urge that a "School for Mechanics" be created by the industry in a central location where the majority of the manufacturers' new products will be at hand for these men to study, to experiment with and to work upon.

There is no doubt that even the Federal Government would be happy to help in such a program. It would then be offering many returning G.I.'s the opportunity to enter into such a school and learn a trade which would prove profitable to them for their future years.

Such men are sure of getting better and steadier positions instead of just taking chances on returning to their home towns and seeking for whatever work might be available to them.

Distributors and jobbers are as much in need of good mechanics as are the operators.

Furthermore, even those mechanics who have been working for some years now find themselves falling behind as the new equipment is presented.

The new machines are featuring many electronic and mechanical principles discovered during the wartime era. Older mechanics should therefore take "refresher courses" to get them right into line with these new developments.

From everywhere in the nation letters have come to The Cash Box commending this publication on this suggestion. These letters have urged that it continue its efforts so that the trade will come together to create a "School for Mechanics."

Many of the coinmen who wrote offered to pay for the tuition and expenses of men who would attend the school and who would come to work for them the moment the course was finished. Some suggested that such schools be created in various metropolitan centers in the nation and that experienced mechanics and factory engineers teach in these schools.

Some urged that already accredited trade schools, now offering electrical and mechanical courses, be asked to open a special course to teach men to become mechanics of coin operated equipment.

This suggestion for a "School for Mechanics" has gained the greatest and most enthusiastic support of the trade.

It is a great need. Few realize how great a need this is until they have traveled thruout the nation. Leading operators, jobbers and distributors admit that one of their greatest problems is the lack of good mechanics.

Many complaints regarding slow deliveries of equipment are due to the fact that the firm taking the order lacked sufficient mechanical help to get the equipment out in the promised time.

Many a complaint in this direction would have never come about were there a "School for Mechanics" in existence where these firms could call for men who were completely trained in the work necessary to them.

Operators have reported that they would have purchased many routes if they only had the mechanics necessary to handle the additional machines.

In fact, many an operator, jobber and distributor has been forced to let good deals get away from him for the lack of mechanics to service the additional equipment he would like to purchase.

Most important is the fact that the average coinman wants to progress and to expand his operations so that he will be all set for the boom times which he knows are on the way. To do this he must have mechanics with complete knowledge of all the new machines.

Therefore, from the standpoint of the manufacturer, it is good business to arrange for a "School for Mechanics."

This will mean greater and better sales. It will, more than anything else, assure better attention for the new equipment.

It is the hope of The Cash Box that the trade will get together to create a "School for Mechanics." It is tremendously important from the standpoint that it will help to ease and to speed the growth of this industry.

FEAR TAXATION DRIV

Many Communities Seeking More Revenue As New, Bigger Budgets Are Proposed. Reported Planning To Increase License Fees. Expect Ordinances Asking For Percentage Of Collections. Games And Phonos Will Be Hardest Hit According To Reports.

Coinmen Urge Trade to be **Prepared by Creating a National Tax Council**

NEW YORK — With open publication of the fact that communities thruout the nation are seeking more revenue, as city councils propose new and bigger budgets, letters have been reaching The Cash Box in ever growing number to the effect that cities from which these letters are received are planning to greatly increase their license fees to obtain as much income as possible from all industry.

Many coinmen who have written in have advised that word has already reached them that their city is planning to obtain as much as they can from music and amusement equipment, which seem to be the two divisions of this field that are going to be hardest hit in this new revenue seeking drive.

Already Omaha is fighting a tremendously increased license fees ordinance on both its pin games and phonos. Chicago has just undergone a \$50.00 per year phono tax ordinance. Philadelphia is also in the throes of attempting to overcome an increase to \$25 for phonos and also an increase on its pin games. Los Angeles faces the prospect of a \$25 per year per phono license as well as an additional \$1 for each wall box.

Other cities thruout the nation are reporting similar attempts. But what is frightening most coinmen is the fact that many of these communities are planning to follow along the lines of the proposed Texas bill and get a percentage of the collections from the phonos and pin

The Texas bill, which was shelved this past year in Austin, asked for \$50 per phono and 20% of the gross receipts from each phono; the same bill also asked for \$100 per pin game and 20% of the gross receipts from the pin games. This is now reported to be spreading to communities in the country and where the states aren't attempting to get this sort of a bill thru, local ordinances are being proposed in an attempt to get a percentage of the take.

In each case those coinmen who wrote The Cash Box urged that this publication continue its efforts to get the trade to create, as soon as possible, a "National Tax Council". The Cash Box has urged the creation of such a council for more than three years. It has pointed this out as one of the most outstanding necessities in the field. These coinmen are eager and anxious to have such a "National Tax Council" come into being immediately.

GAME MFRS. WORKING HARD TO SPEED PRODUCTION

Backlog Demand Keeps Growing Greater

CHICAGO — A rapid survey taken among the leading games manufacturers here produced the fact that the these firms are enduring a great many hard-ships because of lack of supplies and materials of all kinds necessary to the production of their products they are, at any rate, continuing on to arrange for speed production when these supplies materialize.

It is also explained by some of the manufacturers that, in view of the fact they have not been able to sufficiently fill the orders which they have received, the backlog demand for machines has risen to unprecedented heights. It is believed that this backlog demand is now at its highest peak.

Some of the manufacturers are in hopes that lumber and general supplies will sufficiently loosen up so that they may help out their customers as best as they can at this time. But, with the overpreponderance of strikes now in effect in industries which cater to their supply needs, it does not seem that they will be in any position to completely take care of the orders which they have been receiving.

Tho some manufacturers are suggesting that the trade continue to have patience and wait for supplies to increase, when they shall be able to speed up their production of machines, other manufacturers are optimistic in their statements, that regardless of all these surrounding factors, they are going ahead as fast as they can and hope to be in full speed production even earlier than expected.

In general, tho, the average games factory is hard at work attempting with all possible effort to get into production. Purchasing agents are out every day contacting one supplier after another getting some supplies here and some there. These manufacturers are to be complimented on their very extensive efforts to get their games into production as fast as they can to satisfy the trade's demands.

NEW VENDOR MFG. BEING HELD UP

NEW YORK - Production of the new merchandising machines is being held up, according to available and current reports, in view of the fact that the strikes now in effect have crippled obtaining sufficient supplies for any sort of normal output.

The trade has been eagerly awaiting new type multiple vending candy machines to replace those now on the

Even more eager are the cigarette machine operators thruout the nation to get the new ciggy venders. These are especially being held up in production, the reports state, because of the quantities of steel required in their manufacture.

The beverage dispensers, to which the entire trade is looking for tremendous progressive developments, will also be held up for sometime to come, these reports say, because of the supplies and steel required and the fact that many of the larger factories are not able to make deliveries of required units.

Many other types of vending machines are also being held up from appearance on the market until suppliers can take care of the manufacturers in this field.

FIRST CLASS MAIL MAY BE AIRMAIL

WASHINGTON — The reported here some two years ago that plans were under way in the Post Office Department to make First Class Mail as Airmail after the war, this seems to now gain ever greater credence with the reports, which have come from the Postal Department this past week, that investigations are already under way to make First Class Mail ride the airlines of tomorrow. And, it is reported, that this may go into effect very soon.

twelve years I've had a pet gripe that's still in my system today.

"During Xmas I was in one of our leading cities all week calling on numerous coinmen and I noticed that things haven't changed a bit as far as my gripe is concerned.

"What is this terrible thing bothering me? Well, simply, why does the coin machine industry, as a whole, maintain that secretive, old-time custom of the early days—of hiding behind painted windows and thereby encouraging the public to believe that the entire field is syndicate controlled?

'Almost every distributor, jobber and operator seems to have a painted-over store front. This seems to at once stamp the place as some sort of a 'secretive

DROUGHT DUE SOON FOR SOFT DRINKS

NEW YORK — Beverage vendor ops were much upset by the news, issued this past week by the Metropolitan Soft Drink Board of Trade and the New York State Bottlers Assn., that the most severe drought of soft drinks ever to hit this city was on its way.

"This is the worst time in our history", reported Morris Kirsch, president of the Metropolitan Soft Drink Board of Trade. Sugar allotments from OPA are granted on a quarterly basis, according to the amount used in '41, he reported. "The figure is high for every quarter but the first", he stated.

Last summer allowances were cut from % of 1941 use to 50%. "A lot of 80% of 1941 use to 50%. plants are going to have to close down for a week, two weeks or a month", Kirsch claimed.

Anticipation of the cut in sweetening was indicated by the Coca Cola Bottling Company of New York. James Connor, assistant to the president, said that its operations had been suspended from December 22 to January 2 to permit continuous work this quarter.

WRITE CONGRESSMEN ABOUT BUCKLEY BILL

Nation's Music Leaders Urge All Ops To Write Their Congressmen. "We must stop Buckley Bill immediately." Juke Box Ops Cry.

NEW YORK - From all over the nation leaders are writing in to declare that it is imperative for all juke box men to instantly write to their Congressmen so that the Buckley Bill (H.R. 3190) now in the House of Representatives Patents Committee will be chelved right where Committee will be shelved right where it is.

One coinman writes, "We can see no benefit, after reading this bill, which the Federal government can derive from its passage in the way of increased revenue -or, in fact, anything else. This bill", he continues, "is simply and wholly directed against the juke box industry with the intention to make this business pay ASCAP and BMI and any others who may enter into the music copyrighting picture a yearly license fee.

Dr. Ruth Alexander in The New York Sunday Mirror (Jan. 6) in a column headlined, "Write To Your Congress-man", says, "We in the United States have the priceless privilege of writing letters to public persons on public policy. But it won't be long now till we lose that right unless we exercise it. The essence of Democracy lies in the phrase, 'write your Congressman', but most of us laugh it off and say, 'Who, me? What good would that do?'"

Dr. Alexander in her column brings out a very great truth to every juke box man in the country. Unless these men will immediately give their own Congressmen, and especially those Congressmen who are on the House Patents Committee, some reason why they should kill the Buckley bill, this bill is bound to continue on and can be pushed right thru to become a Federal law.

That means that every single juke box in the nation will then be liable to a tax of whatever figure BMI or ASCAP decide is fair, as a yearly license fee, for an instrument which will then be giving "a

public performance for profit".

Who is there to tell ASCAP or BMI that they should not charge \$200 or \$500 or even \$1,000 per year for the license which will give each individual juke box the privilege to play their copyrighted music? Even if they were to feel ex-tremely lenient (and they have already indicated this is their figure) and charge only \$100 per year per juke box per license for the right to play their copyrighted music they would be obtaining \$40,000,000 per year from the 400,000 juke boxes now on locations thruout the nation.

They are not playing for peanuts. \$40,000,000 per year is something any organization will fight to obtain. And, therefore, this industry must start fighting now and fight with all its might to stop this bill right where it is.

Reproduced here once again is the Chas. A. Buckley bill just as it now appears in the Patents Committee of the House of Representatives. Also repeated here for the third time are the members of that Patents Committee.

Whether your Congressman is a member or not, get a letter off to him immediately. Get letters from your locations, your friends, your family, your mechanics, your suppliers and everyone else even remotely connected with you and mail them to your Congressman to-day! KILL THE BUCKLEY BILL!

MR. BUCKLEY (by request) introduced the following bill; which was

referred to the Committee on Patents

A BILL

To amend the Act entitled "An Act to amend and consolidate the Acts respecting copyright", approved March 4, 1909,

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Act entitled "An Act to amend and consolidate the Acts respecting copyright", approved March 4, 1909, as amended, be amended as follows: Amend section 1 by adding the following new subsection (f): subsection (f):

subsection (f):

"(f) To make or to procure the making, if the copyrighted work or any component part thereof be an acoustic recording, of any duplicated or recaptured recording thereof on a disc, film, tape, wire, record, or other device or instrumentality, by or from which, in whole or in part, the sound recording on the copyrighted work may in any manner, or by any method, be reproduced or communicated acoustically; to publish and vend such recordings of sound; and to communicate and reproduce the same acoustially to the public, for profit, by any method or means utilizing any such recording in, or as part of, any transmitting or communicating apparatus: Provided, however, That, except if the recorded sound be part of a copyrighted motion picture, no exclusive right other than contained in this subsection (f) shall exist in respect of any acoustically recorded work."

Amend section 1 of such Act by strik-g out the last paragraph thereof which ads: "The reproduction or rendition of reads: "The reproduction or rendition of a musical composition by or upon coin-operated machines shall not be deemed a public performance for profit unless a fee is charged for admission to the place where such reproduction or rendition occurs."

Amend section 5 by striking out the present subsection (1) and substituting therefor the following subsection:

"(1) Motion pictures, with or without sound."

Amend section 5 by striking out the preesnt subsection (m) and substituting therefor the following subsection:

"(m) Recordings which embody and preserve an acoustic work in a fixed permanent form on a disc, film, tape, record, or on any and all other substances, devised, or instrumentalities, by any means whatever, from or by means of which it may be acoustically communicated or reproduced."

Amend section 6 to read as follows:

That compilations or abridg-"Sec. 6. That compilations or abridgments, adaptations, arrangements, dramatizations, translations, or other versions of works in the public domain, or of copyrighted works when produced with the consent of the proprietor of the copyright in such works, or works republished with new matter, shall be regarded as new works subject to copyright under the provisions of this Act; but the copyright secured in any such new works shall not affect the force or validity of any subsisting copyright upon the matter employed or any part thereof, or be construed to imply an exclusive right to such use of the original works, or to secure or extend copyright in such original works: Provided, however, That acoustic recordings of any copyrighted musical work made pursuant to the provisions of subsection (e) of section 1 upon payment to the copyright proprietor of the royalty specified in such subsection whenever the owner of such musical copyright has used or permitted or knowingly acquiesced in the use of such copyrighted musical work upon the parts of instruments serving to reproduce the same mechanically, shall not be regarded as new works subject to copyright under the provisions of this title unless the proprietor of such musical copyright has consented to the securing of copyright in such recording." not affect the force or validity of any sub-

Amend section 11 to read as follows:

Amend section 11 to read as follows:

"Sec. 11. Copyright may also be had of the works of an author, of which copies are not reproduced for sale, by the deposit, with claim of copyright, of one complete copy of such work if it be a lecture or similar production or a dramatic, musical, or a dramatico-musical composition; of a title and description, with not less than five prints taken from different sections of the film, accompanied by corresponding portions of its acoustic recording, if any, if the work be a motion picture with or without sound; of a photographic print, if the work be a photograph; of a title and description, with the record or instrumentality containing the recorded sound, if the work be an acoustic recording; or of a photograph or other identifying reproduction thereof; if it be a work of art or a plastic work or drawing. But the privilege of registration of copyright secured hereunder shall not exempt the copyright hereunder shall not exempt the copyright before the reprietor from the deposit of copies, under sections 12 and 13 of this title, where the work is later reproduced in copies for sale."

Amend section 12 by adding the fol-

"For the purpose of this title, any duplicated or recaptured recording on a disc, film, tape, wire, record, or other device or instrumentality, by or from which, in whole or in part, the sound recorded on the copyrighted work may in any manner, or by any method, be reproduced or communicated acoustically, shall be deemed a copy of the work."

Amend section 15 by adding the following:

"Of the acoustic recording, except if such recording be part of a copyrighted motion picture with sound, any duplicated or recaptured recording thereof given protetion under section 1, subsection (f), of this title, shall be manufactured by a process wholly performed within the limits of the United States."

This Act shall take effect as of July 1,

MEXICO DOUBLES TARIFF ON LUXURY IMPORTS

MEXICO, D. F. — The Treasury Department here disclosed this past week a new tariff schedule designed to virtually double duties on imports of luxury goods. Details of this new tariff, which becomes effective on January 13, were not as yet divulged.

In announcing this action the Treasury Department pointed out that only a small part of its trade with the United States would be affected. Goods included in the new tariff are cosmetics, cameras, electrical equipment, toys, decorations, porcelain, billiard tables, jewels, jewelry, etc.

Coinmen here are wondering whether this will also affect Juke Boxes under the label of "electrical equipment" as well as pin games and other machines which could also be interpreted as "electrical equipment". And, if not interpreted as "electrical equipment", would the interpretation come under the "toys" designation?

Coinmen are therefore eagerly awaiting complete details of these new tariffs.

NEW BOTTLE VENDER



CHICAGO — The General Vending Machine Corp., Chicago, is showing their new bottle vending machine which will be sold to bottlers thru about 75 franchised distributors thruout the country.

The firm report that no committments have as yet been made on any franchises but that final agreements are scheduled for January 31.

The machine itself is reported to be in two sizes. These will sell to bottlers for \$335 and \$485. First models, the report states, will be available in March.

W. U. STRIKE HOLDS UP COIN NEWS

MINNEAPOLIS, MINN .- Once again, as has happened practically every year, this city has decided that the time has come to raise the license fees of pinballs and phonos.

Since there is no license fee for phonos in this city, juke box coinmen were stunned to read that a \$50 per year phono license had been requested.

Pinball men also were much upset to learn that an increase from \$50 per year per game to \$150 had been proposed.

This time, tho, the city did not exact the increase in the form of an ordinance, but as a regulation. This regulation is based on the fact that 40 more policemen are needed by the city to maintain and regulate its pinballs and music machines.

In short, the additional revenue which will be obtained from this huge increase in the license fees will pay for the salaries and expenses of these 40 more policemen who will be needed to take care of the juke box and pinball regulations.

Coinmen here are much upset for this is the first time that the increase has been placed before them in the form of such a regulation.

A meeting was already held and the next meeting will be held on Thursday, January 17 with the license officials and coinmen here in an effort to break down this unusually excessive and inequitable tax demand.

JERSEY ASSN. ATTY. TO WASHINGTON WITH CONGRESSMAN ON BUCKLEY BILL

Claims it is "Special Class Legislation"

NEWARK, N. J. — Sol Kesselman, who was re-engaged as attorney and executive secretary of the Phonograph Operators Assn. of New Jersey, 60 Park Place, this city, on January 3rd, reported the following in a letter to The Cash Box.

"I explained to the members at that time (Jan. 3) the importance of the Buckley Bill in that this was the latest attempt to change the Copyright Law of 1909 so as to permit ASCAP and BMI to exact an assessment or fee for the privilege of operating their music machines.

"Each of the members was asked to immediately communicate with his Congressman and Senator to raise his objection to the bill. I have specifically asked them to write the three New Jersey Congressmen on the Patents Committee of the House, viz: Congressmen Hartley, Wolverton and Hart.

"The bill is strictly class legislation in favor of a particular group. It certainly does not in any way amend the Copyright Law in any of its provisions, nor does it in any way benefit the Government of the United States.

"Its sole effect is to give to a particular class, in this case principally ASCAP and BMI, the right to exact a fee or levy upon the privilege of operating a music machine in public.

"It apparently is doing by indirection, what the law says it cannot do directly, that is, special class legislation.

"In accordance with the expressed will of the association, I have arranged to personally see Congressman Fred J. Hartley and give him a complete summary of the entire matter.

"I am also, and through the good offices of Congressman Hartley, arranging to see Congressmen Wolverton and Hart in Washington next week and discuss the subject with them.

"These men do not frequently have the background of the proposed legislation of Congress and it is the duty of our citizens to write them on the subject under discussion and explain the situation.

"I know that after the true picture is given to the Congressmen, they will have a better understanding of the subject matter and will more intelligently be able to vote on it.

"If this action would be taken by other associations and groups throughout the United States, I am sure that the chance of the bill passing would be considerably

PIN LICENSE IN RECORD INCREASE FROM \$5 TO \$2000 PER YEAR

IRVINGTON, N. J. — Probably setting the all time record for a high license fee proposal for pin games are the two ordinances now before this community's Town Commission which would raise the present license fee of \$5 paid by the operators, in the form of an occupational tax, to \$2,000.00 plus an additional \$10 per machine for location owners.

The ordinances were tabled for two weeks by the Town Commission on protests of the operators who appeared before it this past week.

Benjamin Ratner, Newark attorney and a resident of this city, speaking for several of the operators called the \$2,000 fee, "Definitely discriminatory, confiscatory and unreasonable". He said that it would drive out the small operator.

Ratner contended that one machine netted about \$800 annually to an operator and that, while the \$2,000 fee would drive out the small operator, "The one man who, fortunately, is wealthy would be given the opportunity to control the business on his own", he said.

Ratner also stated, "If the ordinance is for the purpose of driving the machines out of Irvington, I'm with you, for this would be in the interest of society."

Ratner argued for a fixed fee for each machine. He cited court decisions holding similar licensing measures illegal and indicated he would contest the ordinance in the Supreme Court if it were adopted.

Advancing similar arguments were Morris Prince of Newark whose son has three machines licensed in this community as well as Sam Waldor of Newark who talked for other operators.

Public Safety Director Balentine, sponsor of the ordinances, termed the machines "nuisances" and said that his ordinances were designed to "do away with them". He said that with release of materials many new types of machines would be produced and that he was guarding against "an influx of these machines in the town".

"No one can argue that they are a good thing for the town and you, yourself, Mr. Ratner," Balentine said, "have agreed with this. My object is to do away with these machines. If the \$2,000 fee isn't high enough to get rid of them, maybe we'll make it higher."

Supporting Ratner's monopoly arguments, Public Works Director Hausmann suggested a \$100 or \$500 fee per machine. Balentine said under such an arrangement "the fee would be paid and they would still be here."

Blue Book, rather than show no price, retains the last known quotations for such equipment so that the subscriber at least has the last known quoted prices as a basis to work with. Prices continue to be very widely divergent these days. Someone on the West Coast may feel a certain machine worth \$150.00 whereas someone on the East Coast may think it worth but \$75.00. Of course, condition, serial, appearance, demand, territory, quantity, etc., must all be taken into consideration. The C.M.I. Blue Book reports each quotation exactly as it is made and depend on the subscriber to make average price adjustment to fit the peculiarities of his own territory.

METHOD

The C.M.I. Blue Book is to be read as follows: First price listed is lowest price for the week; Second price listed is highest price for the past week. Where only one price appears this should be considered lowest price.
