Is The Music Biz On The Brink Of A Major Change?

Is the music business on the brink of a major change? There seems to be a growing undercurrent throughout the trade which is cumulatively saying "Something's gotta give!"

Exactly what it will be, no one can definitely say. But the most talked about subject is a price change. Representatives from all phases of the industry arc saying that if the manufacturer-distributor-retailer structure of the record business is to continue to operate as we know it today, manufacturers will have to cut retail prices to a 69% or 79% level.

One of the major factors causing this talk is the effect free records, better known in the trade as "freebees", have on record distributors.

It has been reported more and more frequently in recent months that distributors are hurting because of "freebees", called by some "the greatest cause of transshipping." Transshipping eventually comes back to haunt the distributor making him compete with outlets selling at prices lower than he, himself sells.

Many manufacturers during recent weeks have indicated that they will discontinue the practice of offering "freebees" in order to stabilize the business at the distributor level. If that happens, most manufacturers will be able to cut the price and make almost the same profit. And, with a lower price on singles, business must increase.

The effect of "freebees" on distributors has not been an overnight phenomenon. However, in the past few months, with singles business soft, it has become a major irritant to distributors, many of whom feel "freebees" cause an extremely unhealthy business situation.

At the ARMADA Convention, the subject burst into full bloom, and at present it seems to be the trade's most intense topic of discussion.

Exactly when a change will come about and what that change will encompass only time will tell. Perhaps a price cut will come first and force the disappearance of the "freebee". Some say a price cut is a must to bring the single record into line, pricewise, with the ever increasing package merchandise selling for \$1.49 and \$1.98.

Trade discussion on price reduction and "freebecs" is too strong at present for nothing to happen.

The feeling from where we stand is that something is going to give soon. he Cash Box TOP 100






# Sid Nathan's Open Letter To Trade

Sub Natural S Open NEW YORK — Sydney Nathan, president of King Records, Cincinnati, last week sent a letter to the trade in which he expounded his views on 'why the soft singles market.' Reprinted below is Nathan's letter. "Let's all let our hair down, if not on everything, at least on one thing— the record business today is in a pre-carious position. Records any com-pany brings out today, which to me are far superior to those of two or three years ago, are not selling. Sales are off—way off. Some of the larger one-stops tell me they find their sales off as much as 70%! "Has anyone ever stopped to think why the record business has fallen to such depths? Believe me, the whole thing has boomeranged. The house has fallen in. Why . . because the dealers, the one-stops, the manufac-turers, have all gone hog wild on LPs. It is wonderful and fine to make a lot of LPs and we admit that we make our share, too, as we have some 270. "However, the single record busi-ness is the backbone of our entire rec-ord business and the larger dealers, who, we have long known from experi-ord business and the larger dealers, who, we have long known from experi-ous singles. They have some and probably have a good stock of the hits and near-hits, but you cannot find them. A customer has to walk in and ask for them. "This reminds me of a simile that

them. "This reminds me of a simile that

them. "This reminds me of a simile that I have used many times wherein I say that if I make a beautiful Cadillac (regardless of the price) and hide it, then make a Chevrolet and promote and display it, I will sell only the Chevrolet and very, very few Cadil-lacs. However, if I were to make Chevrolets and also Cadillacs and dis-play and promote both of them, then I would sell my share of each. "The dealer is doing himself a grave injustice (which was caused by the manufacturer) and may find himself in a position where eventually, he will have to go out of the record business, if he does not realize and if the record business does not make him see that he must promote and sell and push singles. He must do it with the same enthusiasm that he has in selling LPs. Too many dealers figure 'Why sell a single on which I make 35¢ to 50¢ when, at the same time, I could sell an LP and make \$1.00 or \$1.50 or more?' "Well, you and I know this is not true, that there is a definite market for singles, providing someone will realize it in time. There is just as much market for singles as for the Rambler automobile. If you will read the June issue of "Readers' Digest," you will find that the Rambler has zoomed from 1.2 sales to approxi-mately 6.3 sales. This is the reason why the Big Three are going to make small cars. They are hurting and hurting bad. "We in the record business are also

"We in the record business are also hurting and hurting bad, for the rea-son that the manufacturer and the dealer are doing nothing to promote and sell and push 45s. Woe be the day that they will have to reckon with themselves and say, 'I wish I had been alerted to the importance of the little 45s', which are, and I say it again, the backbone of the record business and without it we shall perish. "This is a sickness, and unless it is quickly changed, it will destroy the entire record industry. The people who are responsible for the newness


and the crudeness in the record busi-ness today cannot live with 45s being promoted as little as they are now. 'Singles built the record business,

"Singles built the record business, singles keep the record business going. Singles are the long profit. "Without singles, the record indus-try cannot sustain itself . . . because, it is from the singles that we create the excitement and the new stars that make it possible to produce and mar-bat package merchandise

"It is the rare exception, where a new star has been born or a lot of excitement has been created from an album. Sure, there have been several cases—but at that, not too many— where an artist has been released first on albums and then released on singles when one particular track in the al-bum starts to take and makes a little when one particular track in the al-bum starts to take and makes a little noise. However, in almost every case where this has been true, the artist did not get hot, nor did the album really get big until the single, which had been lifted from the album, started to move and got big. For example, look at Julie London and "Cry Me A River" and most recently, Martin Denny with "Quiet Village".

"We, too, feel that the big single brings people into the stores and once they come in to buy 'the' single, they will be subject to all the merchandis-ing, promotion, impact and impulse selling that we can throw at them. But—until the buyer walks into the store or into the record department we have no chance to even expose him to our merchandise. It has been our experience over the years that when there is not at least one really big record single going, the entire busi-ness falls off, and the only thing that seems to bring business up fast is to get one or more "hot" singles moving. "We say the only way we can really get excitement and create new stars for our industry is to bring out new and good singles and get proper store exposure, and you, the dealer, must also do his part," concluded Nathan.

"It is our contention that we in the record business cannot afford to lose sight of the primary aspect of all show business—and the record business is show business—you must create new talent and new stars. It is the up and coming new artists, who in their own right become the stars of tomorrow, which is the future of the business. Most all the biggest and consistent sellers in albums must have singles to get the needed exposure and the push and keep looking for a "big one", for only in this way will they continue to sell albums. "We, too, feel that the big single







### Merc's "Pageworth" Extended

CHICAGO—Mercury Records' "Operation Pageworth," has been extended from its original June 30 expiration date until July 18. "The distributors wanted it, the dealers wanted it, and the public wanted it—" stated Irwin S. Steinberg, Mercury treasurer. Steinberg ascribed a part of the sales impact of the "Pageworth" coupon plan to the fact that dealers were provided with store-counter coupons in addition to those which appeared in the national newspaper and Life magazine campaign.

"The additional coupons have been responsible for repeated consumer ac-tion and return traffic," he said. Moreover, many of the dealers have been inspired to do additional merchandising on their own initiative, using their own mailing lists and customer contacts for repeat sales. It s gratifying to have dealers tell us that in a summer period when sales are normally soft, they have enjoyed mounting returns because of the Mercury 'Pageworth' promotion. Many of them have requested this July 18 extension to allow them to get full coupon return on their individual merchandising efforts."

### **Sheldon Offers Master Plan**

CHICAGO-Sheldon Recording Stulios last week announced a plan whereby it would make available to ndependent recording studios its lacquer mastering facilities. The plan provides for the accepting of tapes for mastering by the independent stulios and forwarding of the tapes to Sheldon's Chicago office for master utting. The independent studio will be billed by Sheldon at a discounted ate, such that it would be to the inie's advantage to accept mastering rders which in the past it had been orced to turn down. When completed, the lacquer masters and the tapes from which they were cut, will be either returned to the indie, forwarded directly to the client, processed or shipped to a processing plant, whichever the indie specifies.

Jack S. Wiener of Sheldon stated that this plan "will be a boon to the medium size recording studios and adio stations in helping them to compete with the larger studios.'





A completely satisfying program.

BRAHMS: Symphony No. 3 in F-major; "Varia-tions on a Theme of Haydn"—Erich Leinsdorf conducting the Philharmonic Orchestra—Capitol P 8483 & Stereo SP 8483 Brahms' third symphony is a classic example in moderation, combining traditional symphonic forms with the intense romanticism of his period. It is given brilliant reading by Leinsdorf—adher-ing to classic principles. Occupying a large part of side two are eight variations of a Haydn theme, with a stately finale. Solid classical fare.

BEETHOVEN: Symphony No. 2 in D-major; "The Ruins of Athens"—Incidental Music—Sir Thomas Beecham conducting the Royal Philhar-monic Orchestra — Angel 35509 (Monaural & Stereo)

Although Beethoven's later symphonies are more popular, his earlier works, the second sym-phony here, embody charm and gracefulness. This lightness of spirit is brought out fully by the distinguished conductor. The Beecham Choral Society, chorus master Denis Vaughan, performs the "Ruins of Athens" backed by Beethoven's incidental music. Delightful package.

"THE COMPOSER AND HIS ORCHESTRA"— Howard Hanson conducting the Eastman-Roches-ter Orchestra—Mercury SR 90175 (Monaural & Stereo)

Composer-conductor Howard Hanson presents a lesson in the appreciation and understanding of combining of orchestral colors in composing. Utilizing excerpts from his "Merry Mount Suite" he systematically introduces various instruments and groups of instruments and explains how they are used to depict moods and expressions. A very clear and explicit insight into orchestration— should be a study boon to the classical minded.





### **ASCAP** Consent **Order Filed**


Order Filed NEW YORK — A Consent Order carrying out the provisions of the Consent Decree of March 14, 1950, wes filed last week (6/29) in the United States District Court in New York City. The proposed Order has been consented to by the attorneys for the Department of Justice and ASCAP and will be submitted to Chief Judge Sylvester J. Ryan for approval on October 19, 1959, after notice to all of the members of ASCAP and a hearing before Judge Ryan. "The policies and procedures of the Society must be continuously re-viewed in the light of the growth and development in the use of music and changing conditions in mass commu-nication media. In 1950, a Consent Decree was worked out with the De-partment of Justice, under which we have been operating since that time, containing certain basic rules, in-cluding rules governing distribution and voting. "For some time the Society has been reviewing and has been discus-sing with the Department of Justice the policies and procedures concern-ing surveys and performances, dis-tribution to members, weighting of performances, voting and other inter-nal procedures. The result of these discussions has been embodied in the consent Order which is being sub-mitted to Judge Ryan for approval. "Within the next few days the So-ciety will send to each of its members a copy of the proposed Consent Order and distribution formulae, together with a memorandum explaining its provisions and advising them con-cerning the hearing to be held before. "The Society intends to hold mem-bership meetings in Los Angeles and New York during the month of July



# What is: Public Relations?

Because of the volume of terribly adverse publicity, news and air stories directed at the coin machine industry, particularly during the past year, coinmen have become keenly aware of the necessity of projecting the true story of the coin machine business to the world at large.

They wish to inform, not only the newspapers and air reporters, public officials, bankers, et al, but the general public that what they have been reading and hearing concerns only a small segment of the industry —and that the smear of all because of the faults of a few has been magnified away out of proportion. They wish to tell the public that the very large majority of coinmen are hard working, honest, law-abiding citizens—who can match their records and business ethics with any other business in the world, large or small.

The big question is—HOW CAN IT BE DONE? The obvious answer, of course, is START A PUB-LIC RELATIONS PROGRAM!

What is Public Relations? One of the foremost public relations experts states "There are almost as many definitions of 'public relations' as there are spaceship rumors, and some definitions are equally out of this world."

What is "Public Relations" for the coin machine industry, and how can it be best utilized? Many believe that the "specialist", the experienced, well established public relations firm can help solve the problem for this business. In the past few weeks, we've read several presentations by public relations firms. They attack the coin machine problem as they would any other business. Every one of them calls for the expenditure of around \$100,000 a year—with the prime purpose being to "plant" favorable stories and news items in the press and on the air. We would agree with this

premise. Anything that is done constructively is bound to help. But is this the practical immediate answer?

Not everyone agrees with this suggestion. It is pointed out that it would be most difficult to raise any such large sum of money—even on a national basis. Then, the question is raised: will all territories thruout the vast United States benefit without establishing a public relations program of its own on a local "grass roots" level?

Many coinmen feel that a public relations program should be started in local areas first—with a definite, progressive program of cooperation with local charities, projects and community drives. In this way, they say, they can impress those people with whom they come in daily contact. These programs, they feel, will be comparatively inexpensive, and yet the most effective. A number of coinmen have been associated with local programs for years (many of which have been reported in *The Cash Box.*) Still others claim they are so close to their local people they don't need a public relations program. However, they recognize a program is needed, as what affects the industry nationally, reflects down to the local level.

The Cash Box is interested in overcoming all the adverse publicity—and building the industry to the respectability it deserves.

Public relations efforts are needed, and needed badly.

Manufacturers, Distribs, Ops and **MOA Directors Meet In Chicago** 

## **Select Temporary National Public Relations Committee For Inter-Industry Program**

CHICAGO — George A. Miller, president and general director of Music Operators of America, and MOA directors Lou Casola, Les Mon-tooth and Clinton S. Fierce hosted a luncheon in the Venetian Room of the Morrison Hotel, July 1, to discuss the projected industry wide public re-lations program with manufacturers, and Bob Slifer of NCMDA, who rep-resented distributors from all over the country at the meeting. Miller opened the meeting by greet-

Miller opened the meeting by greet-ing everyone present. He stressed the fact that this particular meeting did not only concern members of Music Operators of America, but the entire coin machine industry, to help final-ize a good, sound public relations program for all.

"We hope to delve into many problems here today," he declared, "and in that way determine how we can attack them through sound public relations. We must soon effect a strong approach towards reaching the national press, radio and television."

Miller proceeded to call on members of the MOA committee present to give their views, and the results of their recent meetings with manufacturers to probe the possibilities of such a program. Lou Casola stated that it was his opinion that all of the manufacturers impressed him with their desire to cooperate with such a plan, financially and in every way possible. He made it quite plain, however, that success can only be attained through complete cooperation in all phases of the industry, including manufacturers, distributors, and operators working together diligently to accomplish the end result, through a sound inter-industry public relations program.

Les Montooth and Clinton S. Pierce reiterated Casola's statements, stressing the need for immediate action as well. Miller then proceeded to call on the manufacturers present for their views on the subject.

Art Weinand, sales director, Chicago Dynamic Industries, commenced by looking about the tables and commenting on the fact that much of the real power of the industry was present. This, he said, laid the groundwork for immediate action. He further stated that only through such power, inclusive of the executive branch of MOA, can such an ambitious program be consummated. He asserted that there must be no cleavage in the industry at this time, when there is so much adverse publicity. In fact, everyone must-and should pull together. We must, he concluded, all heave together for the long haul.

John Haddock, president of AMI, and president of the Phonograph Man-ufacturers Association, stated that much is being accomplished at this meeting, since a meeting of the minds has been accomplished. He lauded all manufacturers and officers of MOA, as well as Slifer of NCMDA for put-ting aside all differences, and pulling together for the betterment of the entire industry. He closed by stressing that the necessary funds must not be over-looked, and that provisions for these funds must be discussed at the ear-liest possible time. He strongly urged this aggregation to start working, and assured one and all that others in the industry will follow suit. Herb Jones, vice president of Bally

Herb Jones, vice president of Bally Manufacturing Company, reiterated the urgent need for funds and added that there is no discounting the necessity of good professional help.

"Only in this way can we bring the message across to the general public that the people in the coin machine industry are hard-working individuals who serve a definite pur-pose in our economy," stated Jones. "Sound concrete thinking is very vital at this time," he concluded.

Miller interspersed at this point to advise Jones and the entire aggregation that the MOA is in full realization that all media-including newspapers, radio, and television-must be eventually won over through the long haul; and, that this will probably take anywhere from 3 to 5 years to accomplish.

NCMDA's general director Bob Slifer, expressed the necessity for this committee, which will be formed, to cover all facets of the coin industry, including NAMA (the automatic vending association). He asserted that in his opinion the ultimate goal is to remove all of the stigma that is harming the industry; and this can only be achieved by properly educating the public through all available media. Also, he concluded, we should concern ourselves with an increased stimulus of sales-otherwise it will have all been in vain.

Other concurring opinions and remarks, falling into a similar vein throughout the discussions, were iterated by Herb Oettinger, vice president of United Manufacturing Company; Tom Herrick, Seeburg; Donald C. Rockola and Art Ehlert, Rock-Ola Manufacturing Company; Al Lloyd, Wurlitzer; Ed Ratajack, AMI, vice president in charge of sales; tax consultant Leo Kaner, for MOA; Hilmer Stark representing Billboard, and Lee Brooks of The Cash Box.
