


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Guest Editorial: Black vs. Urban

One of the raging controversies in Black Music circles today is the usage of the terms "Urban" and "Black" to describe black-ori-ented radio formats. The debate persists not only on the programming side, but on the sales side, too. Those PD's, GM's and SM's who are anxious to show that more than blacks listen to their radio stations fervently defend the "Urban" logo. Equal amounts of the same, plus black community groups and individuals decry the homogenization of one of the few remaining bastions of ethnic identity. Who is right?

The heart of the disagreement centers around the fact that to many people "Black" is a negative term. They perceiveor perceive people to perceive-that black people are second class, powerless, unemployed, MONEYLESS! Or..to label a music or format as "Black" is a vestige of racist thinking. Hence, the term "Urban." Bland. Non-controversial.

In their best-selling book, Positioning: The Battle For Your Mind:, Al Ries and Jack Trout advance an interesting observation. In discussing the power of a name, they state, "Take margarine, for example. Even though the product has been around for decades, it is still perceived as an imitation butter. (It's not nice to fool Mother Nature). The same principle is involved in the shift from "colored" to "Negro" to "black-""Negro" is a margarine name, forever relegating Negroes to second-class citizenship. "Colored" doesn't sufficiently polarize the situation. The implication is, the less col-

ored the better. "Black" is a much better choice. It allows the development of "pride of blackness," an essential first step to longterm equality. (You might prefer to be white, but I prefer to be black.)

As I see it, "Urban," like "Negro," is a margarine name. It implies that, somehow, all those blacks listening aren't black. All of the "Urban" advocates are overlooking a major factor — the importance of being first in the mind of the prospect - be it advertiser or listener. In the overall media market, radio ranks number three behind TV and newspaper. However, in the black community radio ranks number one! Arbitron studies show black listen to radio 20% more than do overall listeners. Why? Because black radio provides it's audience with generally the ONLY consistent, daily stream of entertainment, news and consumer information that reflects the black community's lifestyles, aspirations and identity. This is a community that spends \$240 BILLION annually! Becoming "Urban" forces black radio onto a mental ladder below other forms of radio, newspapers, and the Coca-Cola of media-television. It destroys the community base of listeners (there are no communities made up of "Urbans"). History has shown us those market leaders that abandoned their bases lost their strategic advantage (Volkswagen comes immediately to mind).

Black radio should position itself as the Uncola of media, selling the fact that it is dominant and important to its audience, thereby making the advertiser dominant and important also. It should compare itself to TV and newspapers, not other radio stations. By maintaining positive, communityoriented programming, black radio maintains a loyal, stable base of listeners whose economic impact increases every year. Black radio - like Coke, it's The Real Thing!

CBS Launches "Free CD" Promo

New York-CBS Records is launching an ambitious "buy five, get one free" compact disc promotion which is expected to produce a dramatic surge in CD sales. From October 1 until January 31, 1987, CBS will send comsumers a free CBS CD of their choice for every five CBS CD's purchased.
"We spent all summer working on this,"

says Paul Smith, senior vice president and general manager, marketing, CBS Records. "Because of the difficult logistics involved, no one should be able to copy us this year.'

This move may signal an alleviation in CD supply shortages for CBS. "We know that CD sales have been held down somewhat by product shortages and high retail prices.

The offer is redeemable only by mail. With he exception of Chrysalis Records titles, the promotion includes all CBS-distributed product available on CD. Consumers must complete and return a special coupon (available at most retail and mass-merchandiser record outlets) with the UPC (bar code) symbols including serial numbers from the outer cardboard boxes of five CBS compact discs. Cash register receipts with purchase prices circled must accompany each order, along with one dollar per disc for freight and handling. Order fulfillment will be handled by CBS Records' Pitman, New Jersey facility.

Because supplies of some titles are limited, consumers must list a first choice and three alternate choices for each free disc ordered. Smith pointed out that the consumer will have several options if his first choice is not filled. "We will correspond directly with the consumer." Although heavy demand for Bruce Springsteen CD's as a first choice for many consumers is expected, Smith says, "We're confident about our inventory and we'll be in good shape.'

While five CD's may be purchased at any record outlet, CBS hopes that "agressive" retailers will run concurrent promotions to encourage consumers to purchase five CBS CD's at one location.

When news of the promotion circulated, Smith says, "No one had been aware we were going to spring it." Smith attributed this to CBS' staff who apparently prevented any "leaks."

CBS will utilize broad-based print and broadcast advertising, special point-of-purchase kits for retail and rack accounts, and "event" posters linking the promotion to Halloween, Thanksgiving, Christmas and after-Christmas sales.

Bill To Prevent Unauthorized D.A.T. Taping Introduced In Senate

NEW YORK-A bill was introduced in the Senate, Sept. 19, designed to prevent foreign manufacturers of digital audio tape recorders from exporting machines to the U.S. that are not equipped with "copycode" scanners to prevent unauthorized duplication of copyrighted recordings. The bill-introduced by Senators John C. Danforth (R-MO), Lloyd Bentsen (D-TX), John Chafee (R-RI), Pete Wilson (R-CA), Alan Cranston (D-CA), and Al Gore (D-TN)-suggest posing a 35% duty on DAT machines that do not contain the scanners. The cur-

rent tariff of 4.1% would apply to machines that are equipped with scanners.

DAT is expected to allow home-tapers to produce CD-quality duplicates. In his introductory statement, Senator Danforth, who chairs the International Trade Subcommittee of the Senate Finance Committee, stressed that the measure was not intended to solve the audio home taping problem but, rather, to "preserve the status quo until Congress has an opportunity to consider a comprehensive response to the home taping problem."

Roulette's Levy Charged Wi **Extortion**; 20 Others Indicte

NEW YORK-Morris Levy, president of Roulette Records, and Roulette Controller Howard Fisher were arrested last week and charged with extortion and racketeering. 19 other individuals have been charged with a variety of crimes, ranging from drug trafficking to extortion. The charges were made by a federal grand jury in Newark, New Jersey after a two-year probe. Levy was arrested last Tuesday (23) in Boston and was released after posting \$500,000 bail.

The 117-count indictment is the result of a racketeering investigation of various organized-crime activities in New Jersey. During the investigation, information began linking organized crime to the record business. The extortion charges involving Morris Levy stem from the case of John Lamonte, who owned Out of the Past Limited, a record distributorship in Darby, PA. The indictments alleged that Lamonte ordered \$1.25 million worth of cut-out records and cassettes from MCA on credit and that Levy and Gaetano Vesola, who has been linked with the DeCavalcante organized crime family, guaranteed LaMonte's payment. Lamonte refused to pay for the shipmentclaiming that the best material ha removed from the order-and MCA quently billed Roulette. Allegedly threatened Lamonte in order to get pay, and after a meeting with Levy, Vastola, and Dominick Canterino, w been linked with the Genovese or crime family, Lamonte was severely After the beating, Lamonte offered erate with the investigation, and ha been placed in the federal witness tion program.



ECM Leaves Warners; Pacts With PolyGram

NEW YORK-ECM Records, the German jazz label, has concluded its nine-year-old distribution agreement with Warner Bros. Records and has signed a new distribution deal with PolyGram Records. ECM will join PolyGram under the aegis of PolyGram Classics, the department that also houses PolyGram Jazz. ECM has, for several years, had two U.S. distributors: Warner Bros. distributed selected product from the label, while PolyGram Special Imports imported most of the remainder of the company's output. This arrangement will remain similar at PolyGram, with PSI still importing a percentage of the label's releases. All of ECM's records will now be manufactured in Germany-Warners had manufactured the LPs it distributed domestically-and, after a six-month sell-off period, the entire ECM catalogue will revert to PolyGram's control. The first releases under the agreement are due Nov. 17: albums from Keith Jarrett, Jon Hassell, Lester Bowie's Brass Fantasy, and Chick Corea.

Police Your Holiday

LOS ANGELES - Not to be outdone by Columbia's announcement of the Christmas release of Bruce Springsteen's box set, A&M Records last week announced that it will simultaneously release LP, cassette, compact disc and home video versions of The Police's "Every Breath You Take—The Singles" on November 3.

The album will include 11 singles from the Police's five studio albums, as well as one new track, a newly-recorded version of "Don't Stand So Close To Me," which will be released as a single on October 7.

'Don't Stand So Close To Me" was rearranged and updated. Laurie Latham, known for his work with Paul Young, served as producer. A video of the new single was shot under the direction of Godley and Creme. Both the new and original video versions of the song will be included in the home video Every Breath You Take-The Singles.

A&M's marketing strategy for the album includes a special all-configuration product bin, designed to accommodate the LP, cassette, compact disc and video package at once. The special bins have been dubbed "Police Departments." The cassette will be available in both Norelco and 4x12 formats. Production steps have been taken to ensure that CD availability will be good well beyond the holiday season.

Holman's background is now combining to make him a well-rounded producer. His early days as a musician (keyboards) and his extensive knowledge of the recording process makes him the perfect producer. Holman can easily bridge the gap between the artist and the technology, not losing sight of the former, while using the latter to maximize the end product.

In the high-tech world of sampling keyboards, SMPTE and digital drum machines, Holman is right at home—literally. He has transformed his basement into a dizzying blur of state-of-the-art electronic gizmos. In what has to be considered an extraordinary environment—given the industry standard of working in pricey, posh downtown studios— Holman has been producing albums that even after eight years, stand up to scrutiny.

The advantage for Holman, and thus for his production clients, is that in this little laboratory he has absolute control. He knows every bell and whistle—every capability—of his studio. "Having a room like this available all the time is really a good situation for making records and producing records. Also, because I work in this room so much its really easy to use. When I go running off to new studios there's just so much time wasted just checking it out, seeing how it goes."

An engineer's role in the recording process is fairly well defined. Even the artist's role is more or less understood before the whole thing gets going. But what about a "producer?" The work of producers on records varies almost as widely as the personalities that assume the moniker.

"I take a very strong role as producer," stresses Holman. "I don't sit around and have people tell me how to make the record. I will use pretty much any means. Whatever is necessary to accomplish a record I will do. If that means I have to engineer the goddamn thing I will do that."

Windham Hill Shifts Summit

LOS ANGELES — Windham Hill Records, responding to its phenomenal 10-year growth, last week announced a realignment of senior management staff. The shift affects co-founders of the label, Will Ackerman and Anne Robinson. Also affected by a change is Dawn Atkinson, whose role in the newly expanded A&R department has increased. The announcement was made last week at Windham Hill's Palo Alto, CA headquarters.

Effective immediately, Anne Robinson will assume the responsibilities of chief executive officer of the corporation. Robinson retains her title as president and will have responsibility and authority in all matters regarding Windham Hill Productions and the Windham Hill Records Group.

Co-founder Will Ackerman is appointed chairman of the corporation while continuing as the company's head of A&R. Ackerman cites his desire to focus on his original function in Windham Hill, namely that of its musical architect; this shift will enable him to devote the majority of this energies to acquiring new and developing artists for the Windham Hill labels.

In a related appointment, Dawn Atkinson has been promoted to director of A&R, managing that department for Windham Hill and its subsidiary labels. In her expanded role, Atkinson will supervise ongoing recording projects by the company's existing artists while coordinating new artist signings with Ackerman.

It is expected that the shifts in responsibility will streamline operations. Both Ackerman and Robinson characterize these changes as evolutionary in nature, representing a logical step in the company's continued growth. Ackerman points to Robinson's historically active role in the company's business planning and corporate development as dictating her expanded authority.

These changes augment the recently announced change which brought Sam Sutherland into the company as vice president/managing director. The Windham Hill Records Group now encompasses Windham Hill, Open Air, Hip Pocket, Magenta, Lost Lake Arts and distributed labels including Dancing Cat Records and the group's most recent addition, Living Music.

In an unrelated incident, a man was fatally shot while watching a performance. Another man died of an apparent drug overdose, according to reports.

Due to Saturday's violence, Sunday's crowd was reported by police to have been drastically reduced, though the police estimates are said to conflict with those of festival organizers. Total attendance has been variously reported at nearly 1 million for both days to 500,000 on Sunday, while police are said to hold firm to an estimate of 70,000 on Sunday.

Cunliff told Cash Box that last year's total for the weekend topped 1.3 million, and that this year's draw appeared to be much larger. "Sunday's crowd was the biggest crowd I've ever seen! I don't know where the press is getting their figures."

Cunliff also expressed concern over limiting the kinds of music to be performed at the festival. "Who are we to say what's good or bad?"









THE SCENE-The recent Los Angeles Street Scene. Hmmm. Music filled the air, but so did rocks and bottles. Not only was it a pimple on the sundapled face of L.A., it didn't do much for the image of the music industry, either. Most of the violence took place Saturday night, when the Ramones failed to show up. Well, according to reports, the Ramones were never even supposed to show up (a mistake in the booking list). At least one person was shot and killed, and many were stabbed. Others were brained by all those flying objects. Even policehorses were hurt.

All in all, 40 people were injured (15 horses) and 35 arrested, reports say, and as a result, Mayor Tom says he's had enough of the Street Scene, says he wants to discontinue it altogether. You can't blame the guy for getting grumpy. Despite all the hoopla about keeping violent factions from showing up, such as telling rap group Run-DMC to take a hike, the festival was riddled with violence. And speaking of Run-DMC, on to the next item:

BAD RAP-Remember when Run-DMC vowed never to play L.A. again after gangs went on the rampage at their Long Beach Arena show? The band even held a press conference to complain about the violence here, saying they'd avoid L.A. until we solve our crime problems. (They even went so far as to say that other cities - New York included - don't have gangs. Needless to say, Points West was intrigued by this). It was surprising, then, to learn that Run-DMC had ever even considered playing the Street Scene, much less that they'd been barred from doing so. Now they're bellyaching about it. Geez Leweeze! According to reports, the duo wanted to use the L.A. event as a platform to tell gang members directly that gangs aren't cool anymore, but Street Scene organizers weren't willing to risk a public uproar on par with the Long Beach fiasco, despite the band's honorable intentions. Points West considers it bad form to renege on an invitation! Think first, then act - knowhutImean, Vern? (Run-DMC didn't ask to performe. They were invited). Points West also wishes the popular rappers would make up their minds about L.A., and guit talking to reporters about the issue until they do. Anyway, with or without Run-DMC, the Los Angeles Street Scene turned out to be exactly what it's organizers so jealously strove to circumvent - a dangerous place to spend your weekend.

WALKING IN L.A.—Tina Turner finally got hers a few weeks back, and October 2, The Everly Brothers finally get theirs - a star, that is, on Hollywood's Walk of Fame. (Jeepers, some people really go out of their way to get 'walked on"). Presenting the piece of sidewalk to the duo will be Tom Petty, and the word is that Everly Brothers fans from around the globe will attend the ceremony, which takes place at 12:30 in front of the Hollywood Roosevelt Hotel. OOPS-Pamela Des Barres' book, I'm With The Band, has yet to debut, contrary to what I told you last week in this space. The publisher thinks it might arrive late next year.

MORE TATTLETALES—Speaking of books about the music biz, you've probably heard about the battling tomes written by L.A.'s "Papa" John Phillips and "Mama"Michelle Phillips ("Mama" Michelle to photographers upon her arrival at the recent L.A. AIDS benefit: "Where's the party?!"). Each book tells its own side of the Mamas and Papas California psychodelic experience, to say nothing of the authors' marriage. Attentive readers of this column are certainly aware of Sweetie, Baby, Cookie, Honey, the tell-all novel by exentertainment lawyer Freddie Gershon. But are you ready to hear from an ex-Supreme? Glendale, CA, resident Mary Wilson, the only person alive other than Diana Ross who could tell this story, spills the beans October 20 with Dreamgirl - My Life As A Supreme, from St. Martin's Press. Wilson describes her tale as a "real-life Cinderella story and a tragedy deeper than anyone ever knew."Evidently, Wilson and the late Flo Ballard were victims of some treacherous spotlight heists. Seems Diana kept a firm grip on the lead microphone.

Scruffy The Cat's "High Octane Revival" (Relativity) album is a catchy and promising debut EP. Hawkes of The Cars plays keyn "This Side Of Paradise" and his hiarascuro brackets the album and ternately jumpy and moody songs. rlaine's guitar impressionism confectively with G.E. Smith's chordal is Steve Stevens gives the whole fuel injected kick. The first one up

the charts is "Emotion in Motion," a heartfelt ballad that explodes Ocasek's undeserved reputation as being cold and calculating.

"'This Side Of Paradise' is about what I've been going through emotionally for the last year and a half, what's come into my life and what's gone out of it," he says. "It's moodier than any Cars record I've ever done."

Though it is something of a departure, there are similarities to The Cars. The first three tracks—"Keep On Laughing," "True To You," and "Emotion in Motion"—are sequenced with the same intuitive kapow that made The Cars's first album such an unmatched knock-out, while "P.F.J." sounds like a "Heartbeat City" track.

One reason the album sounds different is that Ocasek has been living in Manhattan for the last couple of years. "I've been living in New York and my environment has always had a lot to do with it. Every record I've done has always been in a different place, a different environment." Nowhere is this change more evident than on the title track when Ocasek sings: "Broadway windows and cubicle cages/Where escape is fairly rare."

But Boston is where Ocasek first started playing music. "I was going the route of Patti Smith before The Cars," he says. "I used to do everything from play with an acoustic guitar player in little clubs to a band that basically destroyed its equipment onstage. Maybe it was just a natural evolution but I just sort of got it together in around 1978 to focus in on one kind of thing. It was a matter of having the right people in the band and that was The Cars."

Does Ocasek still consider the music he makes 'pop'? "There's not a band that makes a record that's really not a pop band," he says. "As soon as you have a single it's a pop band....Basically it's for people to hear and if it's available on public radio for free, it's pop. So I really don't mind being a pop songwriter."

"When we make a Cars record I always know what it's going to sound like before I do it," he says. "But when I work with other people I really don't know what I'm going to get." It's this very sense of mystery and discovery that pervades this album and puts its solidly on this side of paradise—and this side of chart success.

EAST COASTINGS

WORK IT ON OUT—"It's getting rough," joked Rodney Dangerfield. "My wife only gives me sex once a month now. But that's nothing: two other guys she cut out completely." Dangerfield played it fast and furious in the last of four sold out Radio City Music Hall shows September 21. He worked the hall like a club, demolishing hecklers, and showing us how raunchy he can get when Standards and Practices isn't around.

MIRACLES AND WONDERS-Paul Simon's "Graceland" (Warner Bros.) album is causing a big stir. And no wonder: it's Simon's most groundbreaking and perhaps his most enjoyable solo album to date. Director Gary Weiss and producer Lorne Michaels have made an amusing video for "You Can Call Me Al," in which Chevy Chase lip syncs the lyrics conversationally (shades of Chase's Great American Dream Machine days) with Simon joining him for the chorus. Sidenote: no video has ever been applauded at the MTV press screenings, but that's exactly what happened after The Talking Heads's clip for "Wild Wild Life" was shown. The video is an edit from the upcoming David Byrne-directed film True Stories and it's a must see.

FOR METAL POOR BLOOD-

"You are a legend, Lemmy," said a bizzer to Lemmy Kilmister of Motorhead. "It takes some living up to, believe me," Lemmy responded. Motorhead's new album, "Orgasmatron" (GWR Records/Profile), their first in three years, goes a long way to living up to that legend. "We don't compromise with the music at all," says Lemmy. "I'm gonna come off like a broken down biker no matter what I do." Lemmy sounds biker-angry about the nuclear arms race, particularly in the killer title track. "The world's gonna go fooomm one day-I see no way around it. 'Cause we're not gonna stop the arms race," he says. But until the apocalypse, Lemmy's going to keep turning up the volume. "I think we're in the Guinness Book Of World Records for doing 177,000 watts at a concert in England." So what becomes a legend most? "Frantic bursts of activity followed by crushing boredom. Then I usually go to bed for three days."

COMMUNICATION!—You've gotta hear "Communicate" from **The B52's** "Bouncing Off The Satellites" (Warner Bros.) album. With just a little bit of airplay and clubplay, this one could be the surprise dance hit of the year. And

dig those lyrics: "Don't bottle it up like a bottle of 7Up/let loose" - which is advice psychiatrists charge you fifty bucks for. From the dreamy "Girl From Ipanema Goes To Greenland" to the irresistable "Housework," this is one of the year's best. (Dedicated to the memory of Ricky Wilson, one of the greats.) EAST CLUBBINGS-The Greg Trooper Band, a promising rock quartet, played the Lone Star Cafe September 21. The best song of the show was "We Won't Dance" (from "We Won't Dance"/Wild Twin), which builds tension effectively and sounds ready-made for college radio. Instrumentally, the band is steady and country-tinged, and Larry Campbell's masterful fiddle and guitar playing allows them to rise above the ordinary. If they aren't ready for prime time now, they may be soon.

Meanwhile, Speakeasy recently celebrated its fifth anniversary with two nights of performances by rising folkies. Two of the best, Lili Anel and Peter Stampfel, have been written about in past issues. David Massengill, a top N.Y. songwriter, premiered a touching ballad he had written some six hours before called "These Friends Of Mine." Frank Christian, perhaps the most virtuosic of the new folk bunch, played with considerable feeling and Paul Simon-like quietude. Also of note: Jack Hardy's catchy "A Year and A Day," and Eric Frandsen, whose humorous tunes sounded like Loudon Wainwright gone haywire.

SHORT STUFF-A&M's Double has been seeing some exciting chart action with its debut album "Blue." "The Captain Of Her Heart," the first single, has crossed over to the pop top 20, and the new single, "Woman Of The World," promises to do the same....The best bet for pop crossover on James Ingram's "Never Felt So Good" (Qwest Records) is a sizzler called "Red Hot Lover." The album runs the gamut from quiet storm balladry to experimental funk, and Ingram admits that, "I like all kinds of music." Quincy Jones, who discovered Ingram and is executive producer of this album, has been a major influence on him. "Quincy hears textures and colors. He has a dimension of listening that I never heard other producers speak about," says Ingram. Though "The Wings Of My Heart" and "Lately" are his faves, "Tuff" seems to represent a new direction. "I'm going in many directions," he says. "I'm always experimenting, reaching out"

There is something about reggae music. It has this groove that makes you feel good. Those who have been fans of the infectious beat and socially relevant lyrics of Bob Marley and Jimmy Cliff know what it is. Although several pop and reggae hybrids such as the Police and Eddy Grant have emerged over the years, some of them have been able to reach wider audiences than others.

Among the newer crop of reggae-pop purveyors, England's UB40 have been struggling to find a sound which will truly showcase the band's talent. Their sound has always been willfully lightweight, but always melodic. Fortunately, they have taken steps to rectify this problem with their latest release, "Rat In The Kitchen." This was manifested in the festive performance the band delivered at their September 16 show here at the Greek Theater. With an expanded horn section for this tour, UB40 is realizing a stronger, punchier sound. Opening with the absolutely catchy ode to the plight of all us working stiffs, "All I Want To Do," the first cut on their new album, the band kept the packed, lively crowd dancing in their seats throughout the entire show.

The multi-racial band includes brothers Ali and Robin Campbell (vocals, guitars), James Brown (drums), Earl Falconer (bass), Norman Lamont Hassan (percussion, trombone, vocals), Brian Travers (saxophone, lyricon), Michael Virtue (keyboards) and Astro (trumpet, vocals). The brothers Patrick (trumpet) and Henry (trombone) Tenyue are accompanying the band on this tour and also appeared on the new record. Two female background singers were also on hand for the live show, one of them replacing Chrissy Hynde's vocal on the Sonny and Cher remake, "I Got You Babe," which featured two dancers on stage wearing Reagan and Thatcher masks. That song, a U.S. hit single, lends itself perfectly to UB40's reggae treatment.

Focusing mostly on their new material which juxtaposes upbeat, melodic music with biting social commentary, they kept the crowd moving with the politically charged anti-Apartheid numbers, "Tell It Like It Is," and "Sing Our Own Song," yet, they didn't preach onstage. All attendees received a informational leaflet about Amnesty International when they entered. UB40, along with many other artists, is taking a stand on the violation of human rights. Their new album even contains an Al-sponsored postcard addressed to South African President P. W. Botha. But the music made this concert a joyous occasion which was especially evident with Bob Marley's classic "Keep On Movin'," from their "Labour of Love" LP which contains only cover tunes. The brothers Campbell, both possessing smooth, melodic voices, provided most of the vocals with symbiotic harmonies that really soar. This was especially noticeable on their performance of the U.S. hit single, Neil Diamond's, "Red, Red Wine," which drew an enthusiastic response from the heterogeneous, slightly trendy crowd. Singer trumpeteer, Astro, who sports wild dreadlocks, has a more traditional reggae-rap delivery, often interjecting yelps and squeaks while he flops about the stage.

The "Ready Steady Go" influenced stage, which consisted of a three-tiered set up with the horn section and keyboardist on top, the drummer and the background singers in the middle, and the two brothers in front with Astro moving about the stage, gave the performance a nostalgic feel. It was difficult to analyze this show. I was too busy dancing

The show opened with the Fine Young Cannibals who delivered a fine set of their soulful, danceable compositions with flair and style. They performed a heartfelt rendition of their U.K. hit single, "Come back Johnny" along with the well-received KROQ added version of Elvis' "Suspicious Minds," and the most unbelievably tasty cover choice I have ever heard performed live, the Buzzcocks classic, "Ever Fallen In Love," which I hope they record. Singer Roland Gift's unique Otis Redding influenced style paired with the songwriting talents of two English Beat Alumni, bassist

David Steele and rubber-legged guitarist Andy Cox, make them a band to watch.

MADISON SQUARE GARDEN, NYC—The first time I saw Bob Seger was in 1972, and he had a hit, "Lucifer," which sounded surprisingly like Creedence Clearwater Revival. His show was workman-like and gritty, just like his native Detroit, and in direct contrast to the mellow fashion of the day. Today, however, Seger fits right in; his brand of rock neo-realism is in fashion and he represents the industrial end of the platinum Springsteen/Mellencamp axis.

But where Springsteen and Mellencamp got more hard-edged as they developed, Seger has essentially remained the same. His songs still fall into three basic categories: the semi-acoustic, slow-building songs like "Night Moves" (not performed here); galloping rockers like "Hollywood Nights"; and swaggering rock 'n' roll like "Horizontal Bop." Each type is effective in its own way though the galloping rockers created the most excitement in concert.

Two songs—"Old Time Rock 'n' Roll" and "Hollywood Nights"—brought down the house. Two others—"Turn The Page" and "Feel Like A Number"—were the most emotionally satisfying. Seger sang the latter with uncharacteristic rage; coming from Detroit, the land of assembly lines, one sensed that he knew what he was singing about on that song.

"Like A Rock" (from "Like A Rock"/ Capitol) also hit some nerves as Seger sat on a speaker and sang it storytelling style. And "Tightrope," one of his chancier new songs, worked better than the vinyl version largely because Seger let loose the screamy vocal abandon that has always been his strength.

But it was the simplicity of "We've Got Tonight" that took many by surprise as Seger played it solo at the piano and was later joined by his nine-piece band. Unfortunately, his two-hour-plus show didn't include enough of the "We've Got Tonight" mega-hits many came to hear. In their place were minor hits and obscure oldies, and when the house lights went up there was audible disappointment. On balance, however, the show was a crowd-pleaser, generating a remarkable level of intensity, and the thrill of what he did play outweighed the letdown of what he didn't.

OUR MAN IN PARIS --- No motion picture in the annals of jazz has been more eagerly awaited than Bertrand Tavernier's Round Midnight, which opens this Friday after two screenings at the New York Film Festival. A fictional film, Round Midnight stars Dexter Gordon as a great jazz tenor saxophonist-which he is-who, in the late '50s, moves to Europe to work-as Dexter himself did in 1962. Dexter's character, Dale Turner, is a composite of Bud Powell and Lester Young, and the basis of the movie is the relationship that Bud Powell had with Francis Paudras, who befriendedpractically adopted-the bebop piano giant in Paris. Dale Turner is not saddled with the emotional problems that plagued Bud Powell, but he is given a serious drinking problem. Dexter Gordon, for somewhat mysterious health reasons of his own, has not performed in public in several years and, in any case, is a rather unique figure-he talks, walks, smiles, and laughs unlike any

There is a scene in Round Midnightbased on an anecdote about Bud Powell- where Dale Turner walks to the bar just in time to watch an inebriated patron fall flat on his back. "I'll have the same," says Turner. That scene is brought to mind by Tavernier's remarks about the casting of Dexter Gordon.

"I went to New York...to meet with him," says the director. "I had to wait because he was sleeping, but when he entered into the room, I was really affected, just by the way he walked. Watching him come into the room, I had the impression that he was going to fall down and die on the spot. I don't know who else could project that.'

Who else indeed. About Dexter's usual unusualness, Tavernier says, "He's an old 62 and an enigma for all the doctors. He has no liver, a case of diabetes, and the percentage of alcohol in his blood is absolutely confounding. The average amount of alcohol content in the bloodstream is measured at 33. When it's over 150, they take your driver's license away. If it's over 250, you are considered clinically insane. And Dexter registers at 1200 when he hasn't drunk anything."

Incredibly, Dexter Gordon gives a beautiful performance in Round Midnight. Jazz fans who are familiar with

Gordon, Powell, and Young might be uncomfortable hearing Dexter talk Lesterese, but that quickly becomes irrelevant-Dexter commands the screen. Oddly, the film is quite good where I expected it to fail and something of a failure where I expected it to succeed. After years and years of inane Hollywood treatment of jazz, I am delighted to report that Round Midnight treats the music exceptionally well. The life of the expatriate jazz musician is nicely detailed, the relationship between the jazz great and the adoring Frenchman, Francis (played very well by Francois Cluzet), is touching and realistic, the sets recreating the Blue Note club in Paris and New York's Birdland are impeccable, and the music-played and recorded live on screen by Dexter, Herbie Hancock (the film's musical director), Wayne Shorter, Bobby Hutcherson, John McLaughlin, Billy Higgins, Cedar Walton, Freddie Hubbard, Ron Carter, Tony Williams, and several other real jazz players--is unexpurgated and marvelous (Columbia has just issued the first of a possible two soundtracks). Jazzwise, this is a first-rate picture.

Round Midnight falters when it strays from the characters of Dale and Francis. Tavernier, who displayed a Renoirish flair for human human beings in his French films, peoples Round Midnight with characters that are not fully fleshed out. The owner of the Blue Note, the woman who acts as the musicians' keeper in Paris, the owner of Birdland (played by Martin Scorsese), Francis' wife, Dale's daughter, a Billie Holidayish singer (played by Lonette McKee), and the various parts played by musicians, are stereotypes and cartoons. Francis' daughter, Berangere (Gabrielle Haker), is the only other character in the film that

Round Midnight treats jazz with love and respect-the music is allowed to stand on its own and the casting of Dexter Gordon was bold and inspired. If it had been trimmer, if the relationship between Francis and Dale was allowed to stand on its own, if its ridiculous ending and opening were jettisoned, if it was a little, well, smaller, Round Midnight might have been a masterpiece. Still, it deserves your attention.

Charlotte: This is not a crusade for Mr. Blackwell, but mare af a nervous reaction to an industry he loves. It's olsa o cry ta get us all aff aur "fuds" and start acting and nat reacting to the call out there. Here it is the answer to oll problems - living to fail! What on exceptianal cancept ta have. Hawever, when you get bared easily and like ta mave . . . a lat (and not from city ta city), you take on the oppearance of Reggie Blackwell. This same aspect is found in the programming over-view in America today. Boring, needing something new, wanting something fresh, looking for an innovotive idea. Here we have this urgency to find answers ta these categorical phases, and yet, we seem to be without the inspiration and intestinal fortitude to find the answers. What's out there? What om I missing? Where will I find it? These are the questians mare ond mare af us are asking aurselves, especially Reggie. It's a matter af getting out on "the streets", the same streets that everyone talks about getting out on but never da. . . seeing what's around. Everyone says they're laaking, hawever, na ane is seemingly finding what those innovations are. In hearing what people want, Regaie has found out excoctly what they dan't want. His findings, far him, are that peaple dan't want ta hear aldies, they want new. Here, it loaks like, is the ultimate chance. to help an audience find thase selections, information, gomes, etc. All agree that it takes o great deal of hard work and dedication in arder to pracess this information, but also reliable pragrammers chaase to do nothing about it. Each time a cantest is run it must have a new "twist," flow or concept in arder far it to sound fresh. It's certainly fine to use old cancepts, in places where they have never been heard, but all taa often this is not the case. The philasaphy that Tap 40 needs ta address itself with, is ta feel and find thase exciting social changes that are just an the "brink" in arder for them to augment the airwaves. There should be this constant search for anything on the brink of breaking. Dan't be selective in where you find it. It could be faund in your local paper, Time Magazine, clubs, at retail ar on the proverbial bathroom wall. We've gone back in time, and kids are finding great satisfaction in the trends of the '50s, alang with that it may have brought about the stagnation of music. Since there is na revolt ar rebellion gaing an - and everything is calculoble and predictable - we also become stagnant and camplacent. "This is certainly nat gaad," says Reggie. "We pragrammers must stap playing fallow the leader. We have to stir the juices and get all this energy inside, out." Perhops, this is why this

sauthern gentleman is sa gaad about handling the pressure and stress - he finds exterior autlets ond pours this cambustible element into his radia statian. Since fallaw-the-leader doesn't really work. . .do what your radia station does best, what your listeners want; but da not da it because sameane else is (ar isn't) doing it.

Charlotte, and probably every other city as well, is the some as it hos been historically. In this case, it's the same ald sauthern tawn it always has been. Built of primarily blue callar workers, liking primarily the same taste in R&B music. The outsides moy look different, but we still have pretty much the same needs and dreams that aur grandparents had. We have to be aware of these things. Now enters the pd'er with spunk.

Since Regaie is at a music radio station, he is canstantly laaking far that music which will set him apart fram the athers. The need to find it before someone else does, the excitement of finding it ond making a cammitment ta da samething with it, lends itself to personal excitement and reward. Reggie has faund such recards as "Shake Me Down" by Gregory Abbott released on Columbia, one of thase acts that should do really gaad - o very talented yaung mon. Then there's The Far Carparatian, faund by Reggie an a German import and, incidently, a really great song rendition of Led Zeppelin, he claims it will be huge. Another group that he particularly laves is Bon Jovi and onather prediction that it will be huge. Sa there's aur pal Reg aut there first and without fan-fare to the autside world, but a areat deal of fan-fare to his inner self.

SHOP TALK

WEA CONTINUES TESTING-At the recent meeting of the National Assn. of Recording Merchandisers (NARM) advisory committees, the WEA Corp. reported that they will continue to test possible impact of the 4x12 cassette package as a new marketing tool for retailers. With LP sales plunging faster than anyone would have thought, and cassette sales comprising roughly 60% of sales, WEA is obviously committed to giving the industry some statistics regarding the 4x12 package. The results of a test conducted earlier this year proved inconclusive because of two chains who participated, one was unable to meet test requirements which rendered it impossible to combine findings for a valid statistical analysis. Many sources reported erroneously that for one of the chains, the 4x12 had little effect. A new test beginning this week, which will run for five weeks, will track the sales of the new Ratt and Howard Jones releases in the 4x12 configuration alongside other competitive pieces not in 4x12's. While WEA was only able to get one chain, Musicland, to participate because the others were unable to meet the stringent list of requirements for the testing, Russ Bach, executive vice president/marketing development for WEA, is still optimistic. "The hope is to get reliable data for one group of stores." Bach says they will test a variety of factors including how 4x12's fare in high visibility areas with and without LP's. Some stores will display tapes in the plastic security boxes only. While there are so many different variables in-

volved that Bach says, "You can't get them all," the results, which should be out around Thanksgiving, will probably give manufacturers and retailers plenty of food for thought.

RHINOS RELEASE MORE MON-KEES-After a successful national tour (sans Michael Nesmith), their popular 60s TV show back in syndication and two certified Gold Lp's to add to their list now totalling seven, the Monkees are back and demand for their catalogue is at an all-time high. The folks at Rhino Records, purveyors of out-of-print and eclectic recordings as well as some excellent new artists, are releasing yet another classic hard to find Monkees collection. The album. "Changes," which contains their last hit, "Oh My My," was the Monkees' final studio album which Rhino says is their most sought after album, often fetching over \$50 on the collector's market. New releases also include, "The Best Of ... WOODY MAKES OUT-Woody Allen recently won his suit against National Video for the use of an Allen look-alike in one of their ads. The damages brought against the company? \$425,000, which probably amounts to something on the order of car fare to Allen, but I'm sure his lawyers made out like bandits. Anyway, the filmmaker/ actor reportedly said he wasn't particularly pleased with the low penalty. He wanted millions, just to deter people from using look-alikes without disclaimers to that affect. Phil Boroff, the look-alike in question here, has been ordered not to appear as Allen without such a disclaimer. Ron Smith, who owns the look-alike agency that provided National with Boroff, reportedly tells all of his clients to be wary of failing to attach disclaimers when using his models. A tough goof for National.

BORN AGAIN-Ben E. King's chestnut tune "Stand By Me"has made it into the video age, thanks to its rebirth in the Rob Reiner film of the same name. A video for the tune, directed by Nigel Dick, has spun out of the song's resurgence, and features King along with the film's young leads, River Phoenix and Wil Wheaton. Also included in the clip are black and white segments of King performing the tune on Dick Clark's Where The Action Is back in the early '60s.

LAUPER ON THE BIG SCREEN-Cyndi Lauper has finally returned to the business of making videos. Her True Colors clip is already in Power Rotation on MTV (while the single ascends the upper reaches of the Cash Box pop singles chart). Moviegoers are also getting their share of Lauper. True Colors is going out to 1000 movie theatres nationwide as a "music zap." (You know, those oversized music videos that precede the main feature? Surely you've seen them. The Jagger/Bowie Dancing In The Streets video is the most successful example of this). The company responsible is New York-based Music Motions, with Kadak VRG Film sponsoring the thing.

THE SISTERS TAKE TO THE SMALL SCREEN-The Pointer Sisters have gone the way of broadcast tv with their first-ever broadcast network special, entitled The Pointer Sisters - Up All Night. They've got celebs joining them, natch. (Bruce Willis and Whoopi Goldberg). Michael Peters (the guy responsible for Michael Jackson's video dance sequences) is choreographing the show, which follows the

sisters on a nocturnal foray through Los Angeles, including stops at such clubs as the Palomino and the Palace. The special is still taping, and no airdate has been set at press time.

HOME VIDEO REVIEW: The Last Radio Station - MCA Home Video

\$29.95 This Motown Productions home video is the last in a series of four home videos produced in conjunction with MCA, and encorporating classic Motown hits from yesteryear into loose plots. Of those four, this last offering is by far the best. Directed and co-written by Dominic Orlando, the tape is a futuristic view of the last night of the last radio station, presumably in the entire world, which is about to go video, told in series of well-directed vignettes. What sets this cassette apart from the others in the series is its engaging design, strong casting and unique concept. Dominic's 1990s (where the story is set) is a decade that doesn't tolerate throwbacks to another era, which his protagonist, the last DJ (weakly portrayed by Thomas Guzman-Sanchez) embodies. And while Guzman's performance is barely believable, the tape is more about music (oldies from at least ten top artists) and visuals than anything else, and both are impressive. Futuristic sets take the current obsession with ironic use of 1950s designs a step further. A wacked-out housewife (Charlotte McGinnis) is given full reign with this look, and delivers a kooky performance to match. Cameos abound in this tape, including appearances by such reckognizables as Smokey Robinson, Thelma Houston, Mark Blankfield and Jake Steinfeld (Blankfield, who plays a foot fetishist shoe salesman, is funniest). An enjoyable backdrop for ageless Motown

number of other artists have pulled nloads of the little buggers, including Man, Johnny Cash, whose 1969 reng of "A Boy Named Sue" helped o haul off five: Entertainer, Album, e, Male Vocalist and Vocal Group of ear (the latter with June Carter). Aninvolved in a total of five is the Im, whose 1980 single of "He ped Loving Her Today" took top e honors and also became the first ever to nab Song of the Year honors years running. Jones also scored ('80 and '81) as Male Vocalist.

ne Hag then struck for six, with his ear being in 1970 (remember "Okie h Muskogee?"). That year he almost icated Cash's feat as he also took rtainer, Single, Album and Male Vo-- but not Vocal Group (hope he 't feel lonesome). However, he came for his 5th in '72 for the LP "Let Me You About A Song" and another for Il Duo, along with Willie Nelson, in Willie, by the way, has won or been ected with 7: Entertainer ('79), Aland Single ("Always On My Mind"three Duos (with Waylon in '76, gard in '83 and Julio in '84) and ght in a pair for songwriters Johnny stopher, Wayne Carson and Mark es for "Always On My Mind," the nd song to win two years in a row ('82 '83).

harlie Rich and Dolly also have

scored for six. Dolly's taken Entertainer, a pair of Female Vocalist trophies and three Vocal Duo crowns (along with Porter), while Charlie has won Entertainer, Single ("Behind Closed Doors"), a pair of Albums ("A Very Special Love Song" and "Behind Closed Doors"), Male Vocalist for himself and also Song of the Year for writer Kenny O'Dell ("Behind Closed Doors").

Like Willie, Kenny Rogers also has taken seven. Top Single ("Lucille"), Album ("The Gambler"), Male Vocalist, a duo of Vocal Duos (with Dottie West) and he also nailed a pair for some happy songsmiths ("Lucille" for Roger Bowling and Hal Bynum and "The Gambler" for Don Schlitz)

Another with 7 is Milsap, who won Entertainer, a trio of Albums ("A Legend In My Time," "Ronnie Milsap Live" and "It Was Almost Like A Song") and then took Male Vocalist in '74, '76 and '77, becoming the only male vocalist to pull off a hat trick (both Tammy and Loretta have done it on the distaff side). Loretta, by the way, has taken a whopping 8 Awards. She was the first female to grab the Entertainer crown, then took three Female Vocalists and *four* Vocal Duos with her favorite singing partner Conway Twitty. (Conway, by the way, has never won a *solo* award.)

Rack up another eight for Chet Atkins, who just about owns the Instrumentalist of the Year trophy.

Speaking of big hauls, incidentally, can you name the only act that has won *nine awards in the same category?* No, not Alabama. Try again. The answer, of course is the Statlers who carved their names on the Vocal Group award in the '70s ('72, '73, '74, '75, '76, '77 and '79) and who bounced bounced back a couple of times in the '80s ('80 and '84).

Yes, Alabama also took 9 prizes, but there's have been in a variety of categories. Country's Fab Four have hit the Entertainer mark three times ('82, '83, '84), Album of the Year ("The Closer You Get" in '83), Vocal Group three times ('81, '82, '83) and Instrumental Group twice ('81 and '82).

And, finally, the all-time award-winning line (attributed to Don Schlitz after "The Gambler" won in '79): "...it's the first song I ever wrote. This is very encouraging."

THE OPRY TURNS 61

The Granddaddy of Country Music-WSM's Grand Ole Opry - celebrates its 61st Birthday this year, Oct. 9-11, at Opryland USA in Nashville. The Opry Birthday schedule of activities will again precede the CMA television show on Monday night, Oct. 13.

The invitation-only affair will include a Bluegrass Concert Thursday afternoon from 2-5 p.m., followed Thursday evening by the Music Country Radio Network Show from 7-11 p.m. at the Opry House, with host Charlie Douglas and live performances by some of country music's best artists.

Friday afternoon will give DJ's an opportunity to tape interviews with artists from 1-4 p.m. at the Opryland Hotel, and that session will be followed by a cruise on the General Jackson.

This year, once again, broadcasters will be setting up tables and broadcasting their shows live from the Opryland Hotel lobby during the activities. A new event this year is a Celebrity Miniature Golf Tournament from 12.2 p.m. on Saturday.

Guests will also be able to enjoy the Opryland entertainment park from 10 a.m.-7 p.m. on Saturday, followed by the Grand Finale event of the 61st Grand Ole Opry Birthday celebration show, which begins at 9:30 p.m. at the Opry House.

USP SALUTE TO COUNTRY

The United Stations Programming Network will present "The Country Music Month Salute" during the month of October featuring daily special program vignettes on the top names in country music.

Each program will be five minutes long and will feature brief comments from the artists on their music and careers, along with musical excerpts from their most popular hits.

The series is hosted by Buzz Bowman, morning air personality on WXTU radio in Philadelphia. Bowman also hosts the special "Country Six Pack" series on USP.

TNN SPECIALS IN OCTOBER

The Nashville Network celebrates Country Music Month with six concert specials from Saturday, Oct. 11 through Saturday, Oct. 25.

Grand Ole Opry Live - An especially heavy lineup of country music stars, along with their families and guests, is traditional at the Grand Ole Opry's birthday party. The 61st birthday celebration, including the cutting of the cake, will be covered in an expanded 60-minute telecast of "The Grand Ole Opry Live" on Saturday, Oct. 11 at 8 p.m. (EST).

Hank Williams Jr. and Friends - This 60minute special will also be telecast on Oct. 11. Taped in the Grand Ole Opry House, it features the Forester Sisters, Randy Travis, Pam Tillis and Merle Kilgore.

Country Rock-Taped in the Convention Center at Pine Bluff, Ark., this is a 60minute concert by three artists of the more contemporary country genre. The Oak Ridge Boys, Charlie Daniels and Rosanne Cash star in the special, which airs Monday, Oct. 13 at 9:30 p.m. and 1:30 a.m., and Tuesday, Oct. 14 at 12:30 and 5:30 p.m.

Gilley's Saturday Night - One week later, on Saturday, October 18, TNN will take viewers to Pasedena, Texas, for a night at Gilley's. Mickey Gilley, naturally, will host this visit to his sprawling after-hours establishment which was the inspiration for the





Michael Omartian, most recognized for his production credentials for pop artists such as Donna Summer and Christopher Cross, has recorded an instrumental LP. He wrote, arranged, performed and produced all of the material on the project, which contains easy listening, jazz and classical songs. Titles such as "The Call," "The Soldier" and "Homelands" are expounded in the imagery of his music.

"The real definition of a producer is the guy who guides the situation," states Holman. And what that's meant for him "is losing a lot of sleep." Holman has found the producer's chair is situated half-way between the studio control room and record company executive offices. No one is ever satisfied.

The producer is liaison, seeking to accommodate the wishes of the artist, the record company and the often-forgotten part of the balance, the record buyer. "You're not making a record for the people, which you should be, but you're making a record for the next guy over your shoulder, and the guy behind him all the way down the line."

IDEA Responds To Court Ruling

(Editor's note: Cash Box received the following release from Industrial Design Electronic Associates, Inc. (IDEA) in response to a recent court ruling regarding the Arachnid versus IDEA patent infringement suit. The U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit in Washington, D.C. ruled in favor of Arachnid (Cash Box, Sept. 27, 1986)

"We were naturally quite disappointed in the opionion rendered on our recent appeal in Washington, D.C. However, what remains now is for the court to decide what damages are to be awarded for an 'infinitesimal recess' that existed for an infinite period of time. Our segments were re-designed not once, but twice last fall, successfully to eliminate that 'infinitesimal recess' and we ship non-infringing dart games with the full knowledge of the court. If this were not so we would be in contempt of court which, of course, we are not.

"Meanwhile, back at IDEA, we are taking orders and shipping dart games as well as preparing for a big tournament this October in Germany, which will be the first of its type. Our European distributor, NSM-Lowen, and we have been planning this for some time and lots of excitement is building.

"Last, but most importantly, our Engineering Department has designed new, major improvements to our dart games, which we will show off in our booth at the AMOA show this November."

The above statement was issued by Bonita J. DeVale, vice president of IDEA.

Vending Company Profits Were Up In 1985

CHICAGO-The average net profit for vending companies showed a satisfactory increase over previous years in 1985, according to an annual study released by the National Automatic Merchandising Assn.

Compiled for NAMA by Price Waterhouse & Co., the Operating Ratio Report shows net profits as a percent of sales averaging 3.2 percent, up from 1.8 percent in 1984 and 1.5 percent in 1983.

The 158 operating companies which furnished data for the study had a combined vended sales volume of \$1.32 billion in 1985.

Net profits for the smallest participating firms—those with sales under \$750,000averaged 6.3 percent of sales before income taxes, nearly double the average for all companies. Companies with sales from \$750,000 to \$5 million averaged below the 3.2 percent mark.

NAMA president G. Richard Schreiber said the return on assets also improved to 13.4 percent from 13 percent in 1984.

The largest decrease in operating expenses was achieved in depreciation of vending machines which dipped to 2.6 percent of sales from 3.7 percent in 1984. Over-

head expense also was reduced to an average of 1.8 percent from 2.3 percent in

Total operating expenses as a percent of sales were lower for the second year in a row and averaged 51.5 percent of sales, down from 53.3 percent in 1984 and 54.8 percent in 1983.

Non-vending sales for the participating companies totaled \$1.53 billion. Conventional foodservice operations (manual foodservice), showed an increase in operating margins coupled with a decrease in operating costs. But a drop in management fees and cost reimbursement held profits before income taxes at 2.8 percent, almost identical to the 2.7 percent in 1984.

Average sales per machine generally trended higher in 1985, especially for soft drinks, although the average hot beverage machine volume declined slightly from

attached to any goodwill an operator can bring into play.

One of the most rewarding activities to explore is a working relationship with the local school board. The opportunity, which many locations have already taken considerable advantage of over the years, is to offer special incentives to those students who achieve exceptional grades or attain perfect attendance. This could be translated into a dollar, or two dollars worth of free play every grading period.

Obviously, once the student is in the game room and has used up the 'free' tokens/red quarters, he/she will then spend their own money, with the potential being to capture that player on a more regular basis.

Fund raising activities are another activity that can be entered into with very little down-side risk and the possibility of generating some very good publicity as well as community goodwill. Whether you can tie in with the local scout troops (boy scouts, cub scouts, girl scouts, etc.) or a local Kiwanis association - these organizations are always trying to raise money for any number of causes. It would mean opening up the doors of your business and providing the machinery on a free play or some percentage basis.

One scenario could be the provision whereby for every quarter/token taken in during a specific period of time — you would give back 15 cents to the cause. This could also be done for charitable endeavors in much the same way. And as the operator you could set up the parameters so that it wouldn't interfere with your peak business

Young people are also always entering into marathons for national charities where other merchants might want to sponsor a teenager based on pennies per thousands of points scored on a video game or pinball machine. This would be similar to what you yourself might have encountered when swim teams pledge a certain number of laps, or runners promise a given number of miles, or roller skaters offer a certain number of hours.

It is a community affair and one that can help solidify a coin-operated amusement game business' place in the town or city. These are just some of the activities that any business can implement during the year, and especially in the fall/winter time frame. The financial rewards aren't immediate, however, the long-term goodwill is priceless as is the publicity that any involvement can generate.

On another front, there are some very viable options for boosting current business using regular promotional activities. Some, which could be inexpensively started, might include "happy hours" similar to bars and taverns. Let's say that you have a location that gets traffic during the rush/commuter hours. You could "extend" this time frame by an hour with discounted tokens or quarter redemption that might be above and beyond your standard going rate.

The purpose here would be to keep this clientele in your establishment longer than they would normally stay. After all, once you've got them you want to keep them. A different approach would be something borrowed from supermarkets and mass retailers where you could announce 'specials' randomly during the day. The possibility here would be a tie-in with some premium items such as t-shirts, posters, jackets, etc., as well as the potential of joining forces with another local business such as a fast food restaurant, donut shop, etc. The end result

would be some pre-selected machine v the high score for the day, hour, or would entitle the winner to a free pri discount from another vendor.

These types of activities are a ne part of other businesses and industrie all too often we fail to transfer over benefits for the coin-machine industri they are just as valid in stimulating along with existing business.

A more intensified alternative is the cept of 'renting out' your location or ; of it for parties, graduations, other ce tory functions. The intent here would gather together groups of individuals v set prices have been established along a specified amount of time. For exa let's say that a party of 20 children wo charged at a rate of \$3 each for one hi free play in the game room. That woul guaranteed \$60 and you could even with a local eatery where you could interested parents in a package deal. your location can support it, bring in and party favors for the children at a r about \$5 per child to offset your cost ly's Aladdin's Castles have been doin for years along with many other locat

A last enterprise would be the esta ment of organized league play for you ball machines, some video games (simulations especially) bowlers or shull leys. One individual who has champ this is Steve Epstein of The Broadwa cade in New York City (featured in a issue of Cash Box). In this instance would revolve your leagues around s hours and offer trophies and other prize those interested individuals. Compar tournaments, where all you get ar same hard core players competing, le have the potential to add to this main of your audience and potentially around those individuals who need a prompting to become more steady in

There aren't any new ideas form here for promotion, rather than just n cations of activities that have worked other fields. Maybe the coin-machine try can learn for watching what has successful elsewhere and try a few programs mentioned above as a way the waters and see what the impact overall business and profitability. In cases, all you have to lose is the tim effort to put it together. But the benefi be considerable in a day and age wh ery quarter and token brought in has ing and worth for staying ahead game.
